

# Is It An End Or A Break For The Reds?

yderabad, Oct 19: Once, names of fallen comrades reverberated through villagesmartyrs of encounters and underground struggles. In recent years, those echoes have grown faint. The movement that began in Naxalbari and evolved under the Maoist banner has visibly contracted. The red banner still flies in scattered patches, but the unity and momentum that once defined it seem to have faded. Why?

Second, changes in land ownership and the rise of new political actors altered the terrain. Traditional landlordsthe early targets of agrarian revolt-entered politics and business, blurring lines of conflict. Third, the Maoists' own missteps deepened their decline. In many areas, the movement drifted from its roots—the everyday struggles of farmers, tribals, and workers—

sation, migration, and new aspirations transformed rural India, the promise of a revolutionary future lost resonance. Worse, internal purges, targeted killings, and ideological rigidity alienated

sympathisers. Even when introspection came, it was too late to

rebuild trust. If the Maoists are indeed fading, what does that mean? One hopeful view is that governance has improved and justice now reaches onceneglected corners. But reality is rarely so neat.

#### There are several intertwined

reasons.

First, public readiness for armed struggle is no longer what it once was. For a guerrilla movement to thrive, it needs mass support. When the population is unwilling to endure conflict, the movement becomes geographically confined—able to dominate only a few pockets but never the nation's imagination. Over time, state strategies evolved: suppression was not just brute force, but a blend of targeted operations, co-option, and shifting political and economic structures.

Where police apathy, judicial inaccessibility, and local exploitation persist, a vacuum remains—and history shows such voids seldom stay empty. When grievance meets opportunity, new forms of organised resistance

policing, swift justice, and political space for dissent are essential to lasting peace.

Ultimately, the Maoist story is a mirror held up to Indian democracy—it asks whether the republic can deliver justice to its remotest citizens. ## **480 Drunk Drivers Nabbed** in Cyberabad Night Raids

POINT

Hyderabad: The Cyberabad Police, during rigorous Drunken Driving Checks conducted on Saturday Night, apprehended 480 Persons for driving under the influence of alcohol. The enforcement drive targeted various types of vehicles, resulting in the capture of 371 Two-Wheelers, 19 Three-Wheelers, 85 Four-Wheelers, and Five Heavy Vehicle Drivers. This high number of arrests highlights the persistent issue of drunk driving across the metropolitan area, necessitating continuous and stricter road

safety enforcement. A detailed break-

shows that the highest number of offenders, 82, were caught by the Miyapur Police. This was closely followed by the Jeedimetla Police with 54 arrests, Shamshabad with 44, Rajendranagar with 40, and both Shadnagar and Gachibowli recording 38 cases each. The statistics indicate a widespread problem, not confined to specific zones but prevalent across different sectors under the Cyb e r a b a d Commissionerate.

Age-wise analysis reveals that the majority of the offenders belong to the younger and mid-age groups, considered the most productive segment of the

workforce. The highest figure, 180 individuals, fell within the 21 to 30 Years age bracket, while 177 persons were aged between 31 and 40 Years. Troublingly, the severity of intoxication was particularly high for a small group: 19 Individuals were recorded with a Blood Alcohol Content (BAC) Level Above 301 mg/100 ml, which is significantly higher than the legally permissible limit, highlighting instances of extreme reckless driving. The ongoing crackdowns are intended to serve as a strong deterrent and enforce road safety regulations strictly.

# **Liquor License Deadline Extended After BC Bandh Disruption**

Hyderabad: The Prohibition and Excise Department has extended the last date for filing applications for Liquor Shop Licenses to October 23rd, following an appeal from officials due to the BC Bandh. Accordingly, the subsequent Draw of Lots for the licenses would now be held on Oc-

tober 27th. As per the initial schedule issued by the department, Saturday (October 18th) was set as the final day for submitting applications. However, Deputy Commissioners from key districts, including Rangareddy, Warangal, Nizamabad, Mahabubnagar, and Medak, informed the department that the BC Bandh on Saturday significantly disrupted Public Transport and Banking Services across the state. They urged the department to grant an Extension for filing applications to ensure a Fair Opportunity is provided to all prospective applicants who may have been prevented from completing the process due to the widespread disruption. The Excise Department accepted this appeal, acknowledging the impact of the Bandh on public services. It is noted that while the number of applications received for the licenses this term has Dropped Sharply compared to the previous term, the Higher Application Fees levied by the government have resulted in a notable Increase in Overall Revenue generated through the application process.

ships with allies of the US, creating new value-chain alliances.

Domestic innovation is central to this vision. Investments in semiconductors, EV batteries, aerospace, defense, and high-end manufacturing are crucial, allowing India to move up the value chain beyond low-cost labor competition. Digital Swadeshi initiatives, including homegrown fintech, social media, AI, and quantum platforms, can reduce reliance on foreign technology while fostering a robust tech ecosystem. Green Swadeshi efforts in solar, hydrogen, and EV technologies further strengthen self-reliance.

Agriculture and food security also form key pillars, as India can reduce imports of items like edi-

ble oil and simultaneously emerge as a global food exporter. MSMEs and startups will be critical drivers, generating employment and fostering innovation, leveraging India's demographic advantage of a youthful workforce.

The modern Swadeshi movement is a strategic response to uncertainty in global trade. It is not merely a policy direction but a national necessity, ensuring that India remains resilient, self-reliant, and positioned to convert challenges like US tariffs into long-term economic strength and global influence. By focusing on domestic capability, innovation, and diversified trade, India can safeguard its economic sovereignty and emerge stronger in the

## **IT Giants Prioritising Short-Term Gains Over Long-Term Innovation?**

The Indian IT services sector faces a critical crossroads. Just days ago, US President Donald Trump signed a decree imposing a \$1,00,000 fee for each H-1B visa used for onshore work, raising costs and threatening the traditional labour arbitrage model that has long powered India's IT giants. Meanwhile, Infosys announced an unprecedented Rs 18,000 crore share buyback, signalling a preference for rewarding shareholders rather than investing in long-term innovation. Buybacks and high dividends can indicate a lack of profitable growth opportunities, undervaluation of shares, or a strategy to boost earnings per share. For promoter-led companies like TCS. Wipro. and HCL Technologies, dividends largely benefit promoters rather than minority shareholders, underscoring the short-term orientation.

The competitive landscape is shifting. Global capability centres (GCCs) are expanding rapidly, growing at 40 percent in FY24, compared with just 5 percent growth among India's top five IT firms. These GCCs retain intellectual property rights inhouse, compete for talent, and threaten margins of traditional IT services. TCS's recent announcement to cut

This raises a cri tion: Are India's IT services companies over-reliant on labour arbitrage, at the expense of products, platforms, and intellectual property (IPR)? Surplus cash could be better deployed in developing platforms, investing in AIdriven language models, or making strategic acquisitions—areas that generate sustainable revenues without a proportional increase

in labour costs. India's IT giants must also confront five key challenges: geographic concentration risk, overemphasis on margins over volume, dependency on software services, risk-aversion in cash deployment, and short-term shareholder focus. Companies like Berkshire Hathaway demonstrate that longterm value creation often outperforms dividend-cen-

Ultimately, India's IT firms must nivot toward creating enduring value for shareholders, employees, customers, and the broader ecosystem. By investing in innovation, IPR, and homegrown platforms, they can reduce reliance on labour arbitrage, compete globally, and secure sustainable growth—transforming from service providers to product and technology leaders in the AI era.

### Free Speech: The Lifeblood of Public Reason and Democracy



One of the most vulnerable domains of public life today is free speech. As US Supreme Court Justice Louis Brandeis famously stated, public discussion is a political duty: the remedy to falsehood and harm is more speech, not enforced silence. Free speech is essential because it makes the Public, enabling citizens to participate in shaping ideas, policies, and societal norms. Yet, both totalitarian and democratic regimes increasingly curtail this freedom, revealing a worrying convergence in practice.

The principle of Public Reason asserts that laws harming communities, driven by prejudice, sectarianism, or ideological motives, are illegitimate. Restrictions are justified only when speech produces actual

harm, such as hate speech inciting violence. What is unacceptable is viewpoint-based suppression—proscribing speech simply because it challenges the state's official stance. Legal scholar Geoffrey Stone empha-sized: "The government may not restrict expression simply because it disagrees with the speaker's views." Similarly. Justice Thurgood Marshall insisted that governments cannot limit speech based on its content or ideas, for doing so undermines democratic debate.

Yet, governments often justify curbs on speech citing "national interest" or "national good," ironically undermining the very public whose participation defines these concepts. Paternalistic regulation privileges certain majority interests

over the broader public, skewing discourse and shaping citizens to conform to ideological lines. Historical examples are stark: Nazi Germany's propaganda machinery and Rwanda's radio-fueled ethnic mobilization show how viewpoint suppression and orchestrated hate speech paved the way for

Countering harmful speech is central to preserving Public Reason. As political scientist Katherine Gelber observes, citizens must respond to disagreeable or harmful speech, engaging in reasoned rebuttal to prevent the public from being manipulated. In Habermasian terms, the Public emerges not only through debate but through active counters to misinformation, bias, and hate speech. Silence, or non-engagement, enables manipulation and diminishes democratic life.

Nobel laureate Toni Morrison reminded us: "There is no time for despair, no place for self-pity, no need for silence, no room for fear. We speak, we write, we do language. That is how civilizations heal." Speaking back—continually, logically, and purposefully—is not just a civic duty; it is what sustains Public Reason and qualifies our life within a democracy. Free speech, therefore, is not merely a right—it is the lifeblood of an informed, resilient, and participatory society.

## India Attracts Record Foreign Investment Despite Rupee Weakness

Global central banks are no longer moving in unison, creating a fragmented monetary landscape. The United States Federal Reserve recently cut its policy rate by 25 basis points, bringing it to a range of 4-4.25 per cent. In contrast, the European Central Bank (ECB) remains cautious, holding rates steady as it balances inflation concerns with sluggish growth. Japan continues its ultraloose monetary policy with near-zero rates and extensive bond purchases, while China is aggressively easing policy rates to support its slowing economy. This divergence marks a clear departure from the postpandemic trend when most central banks tightened policies collectively to combat inflation. Liquidity is now being injected in some regions while withdrawn in others, creating yield differentials that scatter capi-

tal flows rather than channeling them uniformly.

Amid this global monetary complexity, the Indian rupee is under pressure, recently slipping past Rs 88 to the dollar, marking a historic low. Conventional wisdom would suggest that a weakening currency deters foreign investors, yet paradoxically, inflows into India continue unabated. Foreign portfolio investments (FPIs) surged, crossing \$14.6 billion in equities and nearly \$9-10 billion in debt in FY25. Momentum is expected to accelerate with India's inclusion in JPMorgan's Emerging Market Bond Index, which began in June 2024 and will reach full weight by March 2025, potentially attracting \$20-25 billion in debt inflows.

Why do investors remain bullish despite the rupee depreciation? Three key factors stand out. First, India's relative growth advan-

2025 inflation moderated to 4.9 per cent, within the Reserve Bank of India's target range, reflecting steady and credible policy management. Combined, these factors explain the paradox: despite the rupee's weakness, India remains a magnet for capital. It offers relative safety compared with emerging peers like Tur-key, South Africa, or Brazil and delivers higher re-turns than developed markets such as the US or Eufragmented global liquidity, India stands out as a preferred investment destination, underpinned by growth, stability, and









## Air India to Operate Special Milan Flight to Repatriate Stranded Passengers

TPN Correspondent | Delhi Air India announced on Sunday that it will operate a special flight from Milan to Delhi to bring back over 250 passengers stranded in Milan following the cancellation of flight AI138 on October 17 due to a technical issue with the Dreamliner aircraft.

The flight, designated AI138D, is scheduled to depart Milan at 7:00 PM local time and arrive in Delhi on the morning of October 20. The airline expedited the aircraft's repair and secured necessary approvals to operate the additional commercial flight to ensure passengers could return home in time for the Diwali festival.

The cancelled flight had left many passengers stranded in Milan, sparking complaints on social media about inadequate facilities and concerns over missing the Diwali celebrations in India. Air India responded by rebooking affected passengers on alternative flights, both with Air India and other airlines, though many faced

post-Diwali arrival dates.

In a proactive move, the airline reached out to all affected passengers, offering them the choice to either keep their current bookings or switch to the special Milan flight. One notable case involved a passenger with a Schengen visa expiring on October 20, who was rebooked on a different airline's flight on October 19 to avoid visa issues.

The original flight AI138 was operated using a Boeing 787-8 Dreamliner, which faced technical problems, prompting the cancellation. Air India assured passengers that the rectification process was expedited to minimize disruptions.

This special flight highlights Air India's commitment to addressing passenger concerns and ensuring safe and timely travel during the festive season. The airline continues to monitor the situation closely and aims to provide smooth travel experiences amid ongoing operational challenges.

## Friendly Fire Likely on Bihar Seats as Congress Holds Back on Tejashwi Yadav

TPN Correspondent Delhi With the Bihar Assembly elections drawing near, the Opposition Grand Alliance is facing internal conflicts, setting the stage for "friendly fire" - multiple candidates from alliance parties contesting the same seats. The Congress party, in particular, is digging in its heels, withholding support for Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) leader Tejashwi Yadav as the alliance's Chief Ministerial candidate. Senior Congress leader Pawan Khera acknowledged that overlapping nominations are already occurring and suggested that while one candidate may withdraw eventually, such clashes could become the norm rather than an exception this election. "In constituencies where more than one Grand Alliance candidate has filed nominations, one will be withdrawn within a day or two," he said, adding that the Chief Ministerial candidate announcement will come "at an appropriate time."

The friction is palpable in the reserved Kutumba constituency in Aurangabad district, a stronghold of Congress state president Rajesh Ram. Both Congress and RJD have fielded candidates there, with Ram contesting for Congress and former minister Suresh Paswan standing for the RJD. Both plan to file nominations on October 20, highlighting the brewing dispute.

Congress has been demanding over 70 seats in Bihar, aiming for constit-



uencies where they believe they can win, contributing to the deadlock over the seat-sharing arrangement. The party's reluctance to back Tejashwi Yadav as the alliance's face reflects deeper tensions within the Grand Alliance.

Despite assurances from Congress that a Grand Alliance government will be formed in Bihar, these internal conflicts risk undermining the opposition's chances by splitting votes in key constituencies, potentially benefit-

ing the ruling coalition.
As election day approaches, the opposition's ability to resolve these disputes and present a united front will be crucial to challenging the ruling NDA in the politically crucial state of

Pakistan has strongly criticized the International Cricket Council (ICC) and the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) for issuing what it calls "selective and biased" condolence statements following the deaths of three Afghan cricketers in an aerial attack in Afghanistan's Paktika province.

On October 19, 2025, the ICC and BCCI both released statements expressing sorrow over the tragic deaths but failed to mention Pakistan, which has been accused in regional media reports of being linked to the airstrike. This omission sparked outrage in Islamabad.

Pakistan's Federal Minister for Information, Ata Tarar, condemned the ICC's message, calling it "politically motivated and deeply irresponsible." Speaking in Lahore, Tarar said, "The ICC's silence on the broader context and failure to acknowledge Pakistan's perspective is not only unjustified but harmful to the spirit of international

sports diplomacy." The minister further accused the ICC of bowing to pressure from the BCCI and Indian authorities, saying that cricket's global governing body should maintain neutrality, especially when commenting on sensitive geopolitical issues. "The ICC should be a platform of unity, not division. Its current posture appears to be aligned with a specific narrative," he added.

While the ICC had described the loss as a "tragedy for the cricketing world," and BCCI extended support to Afghanistan Cricket Board (ACB) and fans, neither body addressed the cause of the airstrike or the rising tensions in the region.

Pakistan's Foreign Office also weighed in, urging global sporting bodies to avoid making statements that could worsen diplomatic relations, particularly amid an already fragile security environment in South Asia.

The attack, which killed three domesticlevel cricketers in Afghanistan, has fueled tensions between Islamabad and Kabul, with both governments trading accusations over airspace violations and cross-border militancy.

#### LDP, Japan Innovation **Party Agree to Form Coalition Government**



In a major political shift, Japan's ruling Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) and the opposition Japan Innovation Party (Ishin) have agreed to form a coalition government, according to Kyodo News. The alliance marks a significant development as it could lead to Japan appointing its first-ever female prime minister — LDP leader Sanae Takaichi.

The deal was reportedly finalized following intense negotiations after the LDP failed to secure an outright majorin recent parliamentary elections. The agreement sets the groundwork for a new coalition cabinet, replacing the previous long-standing partnership with the Komeito

party.
While the coalition ensures parliamentary stability, analysts suggest the alliance may be less stable than the earlier LDP-Komeito partnership. Policy differences, particularly on fiscal and social reforms, could test the unity of the new government.

Takaichi, a conservative lawmaker and staunch supporter of constitutional revision. is expected to face pressure balancing Ishin's reformist agenda with the LDP's traditional policies. Nevertheless, both parties have signaled a shared commitment to revitalizing Japan's economy and addressing pressing issues such as national security and demographic challenges.

This political realignment could reshape Japan's domestic and foreign policy landscape. The Japan Innovation Party, known for its populist stances and calls for deregulation, brings a fresh dynamic to the national leadership.

The potential swearing-in of Sanae Takaichi as Japan's first female prime minister would mark a historic moment in a country where women have long been underrepresented in top political

# **US strike on drug-laden submarine: 'Saved at** least 25,000 Americans,'s ays Trump

US President Donald Trump announced a successful military strike on a drug-laden submarine headed toward the United States, claiming the operation "saved at least 25,000 American lives." The vessel, reportedly carrying large amounts of fentanyl and other illegal narcotics, was intercepted along a known drug trafficking route in the

Trump made the announcement on his social media platform Truth Social, stating that two "narcoterrorists" aboard were killed during the strike, while two others — from Ecuador and Colombia — survived and will be returned to their countries for prosecution. "It was my great honor to destroy a very large drug-carrying submarine," Trump wrote. "Under my watch, the United States of America will not tolerate narcoterrorists trafficking illegal drugs, by land or by sea.

The submarine was targeted on Thursday, and the surviving suspects were rescued by US forces via helicopter and taken

to a nearby Navy warship. No US personnel were harmed in the operation.

According to reports by Al Jazeera, this marks at least the sixth such strike since September on suspected smuggling vessels in the region, many believed to be originating from Venezuela. While US officials claim the campaign has dealt a significant blow to drug trafficking networks, critics have raised concerns over the lack of transparent evidence linking the casualties to actual smuggling activities.

Trump's remarks emphasized the deadly threat posed by fentanyl, a synthetic opioid that has been a major contributor to the US drug overdose crisis. "If I allowed this submarine to come ashore, at least 25,000 Americans would die,'

## 'We Love America, Not Trump': Millions Rally In US 'No Kings' Protests

Millions of Americans took to the streets on Saturday in a massive wave of "No Kings" protests aimed at President Donald Trump's hardline policies and increasingly authoritarian stance. From New York to Los Angeles, over 2,700 demonstrations were held nationwide, with organisers estimating participation in the millions.

The protests, branded "No Kings," are a sharp rebuke to what critics call Trump's growing disregard for democratic norms. The movement unites over 300 advocacy groups opposing recent federal actions, including the deployment of National Guard troops in cities like Washington and Memphis, attacks on the media, prosecutions of political opponents, and the on $going\ government\ shutdown$ - now in its third week.

In New York, hundreds gathered early in Queens, holding signs that read "Queens Say No Kings" and "We Protest Because We Love America." Demonstrators chanted, "We love our coun-



try, we can't stand Trump!' In Los Angeles, where

100,000 people were expected, a giant "Trump Baby" balloon floated above the crowd. Protests also took place in major cities including Chicago, Boston, Atlanta, and Washington, as well as in small towns across all 50 states and even internationally in Canada, Spain, and Sweden. Despite the scale of the pro-

tests, Trump's response remained restrained. "They're saying they're referring to me as a king. I'm not a king," he told Fox News. However, his allies struck a combative tone, labeling the rallies as "Hate America" events and branding participants as radicals.

Activists stressed the protests were about defending democracy. "We are a country of laws that apply to everyone," said Deirdre Schifeling of the ACLU. Senator Chuck Schumer urged Americans to "speak out" and resist intimidation.

The protest marked a pivotal moment in what many are calling a battle over Amer-

## Napoleonic Jewels Stolen From Louvre In Paris In Daring Sunday Heist

In a brazen daylight robbery, priceless Napoleonic-era jewels were stolen from Paris's iconic Louvre Museum on Sunday, prompting an emergency closure and a full-scale investigation.

The heist occurred around 9:30 am, with thieves using a hydraulic ladder to gain access through the under-construction Seinefacing side of the building. Once inside, they targeted the Apollo Gallery — home to a selection of the French Crown Jewels — and executed the theft in just seven minutes, according to France's Interior Minister Laurent Nunez.

The robbers reportedly used a disc cutter to slice through the gallery's windowpanes, suggesting thorough prior planning and possible surveillance of the museum's layout and security systems. Nine pieces from the "Napoleon and the Empress" collection were stolen, though one jewel was later discovered abandoned just outside the museum.

The Louvre, the world's most visited museum and home to over 33,000 historical artefacts including the Mona Lisa, Venus de Milo, and Winged Victory of Samothrace, cited "exceptional



reasons" for its sudden closure on Sunday. Crowds gathered outside were met with barricades and heavy police presence, while traffic in the area was regulated.

France's Culture Minister Ra-

chida Dati confirmed the robbery and said no injuries were reported. She visited the scene alongside museum officials and police. The Paris prosecutor's office has launched an investiga-

tion to assess the damage and

identify the culprits.

The Louvre has a long history of thefts, most famously the 1911 theft of the Mona Lisa by Vincenzo Peruggia, a former worker, who smuggled it out under his coat. It was recovered two years later in Florence.

As authorities work to track down the missing jewels, the daring heist has once again raised questions about the security of the world's most treasured artefacts.





## **SEBI Introduces Joint Inspection Framework** For Brokers, DPs

In a significant regulatory move aimed at improving efficiency and strengthening market supervision, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has introduced a Joint Inspection Framework for stock brokers and depository participants (DPs). This new framework will replace the existing practice where stock exchanges, depositories, and clearing corporations conduct separate annual

Currently, these market infrastructure institutions inspect brokers and DPs independently, often leading to overlapping efforts, duplication of resources, and a fragmented view of compliance. The introduction of a joint inspection system is expected to streamline the process, minimize redundancy, and ensure more comprehensive monitoring.

Under this framework, SEBI will coordinate a unified inspection of brokers and depository participants, with representa-



tives from the stock exchanges, depositories, and clearing corporations conducting joint visits. This collaborative approach will allow for a consolidated assessment of regulatory adherence. operational risk management. and the financial health of these market intermediaries.

SEBI's move aims to enhance transparency, reduce compliance burden on entities, and provide regulators with a holistic understanding of brokers' and DPs' functioning. By pooling resources and expertise, the joint inspection framework is expected to identify gaps more effectively and enforce regulatory standards consistently across

Market experts believe that this framework will also speed up the inspection process, reduce costs, and improve the overall governance of market participants. Brokers and depository participants will benefit from clearer communication and consistent regulatory guidance, helping them maintain better compliance.

The framework is part of SE-BI's broader efforts to modernize the capital markets infrastructure and reinforce investor protection. It aligns with global best practices where regulatory bodies increasingly favor coordinated supervision to enhance market integrity.

SEBI has yet to announce the exact implementation timeline for the joint inspection framework but assures stakeholders of a smooth transition to the new system. This initiative marks a progressive step toward a more efficient and effective regulatory ecosystem in India's

#### **Supreme Court to Hear Vodafone Idea AGR Plea** on September 26



on Friday agreed to hear on September 26 a fresh plea filed by telecom major Vodafone Idea Ltd seeking to quash additional adjusted gross revenue (AGR) demands for the period up to 2016-17. A bench comprising Chief Justice B.R. Gavai and Justices K. Vinod Chandran and N.V. Anjaria scheduled the hearing after taking note of submissions by senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi for Vodafone Idea and Solicitor General Tushar Mehta representing the Centre.

The Supreme Court

Vodafone Idea has requested the Department of Telecommunications (DoT) to "comprehensively reassess and reconcile all AGR dues for the period up to FY 2016-17" in accordance with the Deduction Verification Guidelines issued in February 2020. The company argues that there were arithmetical errors and duplicate entries in the earlier calculation of AGR dues, which, if corrected, could significantly reduce the liability.

This plea comes after the Supreme Court earlier this year refused to years.

review its 2021 order, which had rejected similar requests from telecom majors including Bharti Airtel and Vodafone Idea. The top court had held that the DoT's demand regarding AGR dues was final and barred any re-assessment or dispute by telecom operators.

The AGR issue dates back to the Supreme Court's October 2019 verdict, which held telecom companies liable for ₹93,520 crore of dues. To ease the financial burden, the court allowed a staggered payment over ten years, starting with 10% of the total dues by March 31, 2021, and annual installments from April 2021 to March

## Rupee Dips to 88.27 **Amid Dollar Strength, Equity Decline**



The Indian rupee slipped 7 paise to 88.27 against the US dollar in early Friday trade, reflecting broad dollar strength and a weak trend in domestic equities. The rupee opened at 88.22 in the interbank market before hitting the day's low of 88.27, continuing the modest decline seen on Thursday when it fell 35 paise to 88.20.

Forex traders attributed the depreciation to a recovery in the US dollar and concerns over potential US tariffs on Indian goods, which weighed on investor sentiment. CR Forex Advisors MD Amit Pabari noted that while the rupee has stumbled after recent gains, supportive trade developments and firm domestic confidence could provide room for appreciation. Key support is placed at 87.70, with further levels at 87.50 and 87.20 if the downtrend continues, while resistance is seen around 88,40

Globally, weekly US jobless claims fell sharply by 33,000, surpassing market estimates and boosting the dollar index toward the 97 mark after briefly dipping below 96. The dollar index, which measures the greenback against a basket of six currencies, stood at 97.34, down 0.01%. Brent crude futures edged lower by 0.09% to USD 67.38 per barrel.

Domestic equities mirrored the cautious sentiment, with the Sensex falling 264.36 points to 82,749.60 and the Nifty dropping 65 points to 25,358.60 in early trade. Foreign Institutional Investors bought equities worth Rs 366.69 crore on a net basis on Thursday.

Meanwhile, India-US trade talks are progressing, with Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal highlighting discussions with Assistant US Trade Representative Brendan Lynch in New Delhi on September 16. The talks are seen as crucial following the US decision to impose a 50% tariff on certain Indian goods, and positive outcomes could ease pressure on both trade and the currency.

The rupee's movement will remain sensitive to global dollar trends, oil prices, equity performance, and ongoing trade negotiations, with traders keeping a close watch on developments in


## GST 2.0 to Benefit Rural, Urban Households with Lower Rates

From September 22, over 75% of items purchased by rural Indians and 66% of items bought by urban households will attract either a nil Goods and Services Tax (GST) or a 5% rate, according to a new analysis by the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FICCI). The report, prepared by the Thought Arbitrage Research Institute (TARI) for FIC-CI's Committee Against Smuggling and Counterfeiting Activities Destroying the Economy (CASCADE), highlights a significant simplification and relief in the GST structure.

Currently, 56% of rural household expenditure and 50% of urban household expenditure is taxed at either nil or 5%. Under GST 2.0, the nil-rate slab will cover 29.9% of total items, accounting for 36.5% of rural expenditure and 32.9% of urban expenditure. The 5% slab will see a major expansion, comprising 40.5% of items and representing 38.8% of rural and 33.3% of urban household spending.

The 12% slab will be completely removed, while the 18% rate will reduce slightly, covering 23.1% of items and accounting for 12.3% of rural and 14.1% of urban spending. High-tax items, including those in the 28% and 40% slabs under GST 2.0, will account for a minimal share—0.5% of items and just 0.2% of rural and urban expenditure.

The study compared current GST rates with monthly per capita expenditure data, showing that the new structure ben-

# **New Curiosity Discovery Points to Mars' Watery Past**

In a groundbreaking discovery, NASA's Curiosity Rover has uncovered new evidence suggesting that liquid water once existed on Mars, potentially supporting life in the planet's distant past. The find was made using the rover's Mars Hand Lens Imager (MAHLI) — a camera located on the end of its robotic arm which captured a striking image of a coral-shaped, winderoded rock in the Gale

NASA scientists believe the flower-like rock formation, roughly 1 inch (2.5 cm) wide, was created by minerals deposited by ancient water flows, later shaped by billions of years of wind erosion. This unique structure resembles ocean-bottom corals found on Earth, prompting further interest in Mars' ancient, possibly habitable environment.

The rover recently entered a region on Mount Sharp, the towering 5-kilometer-high mountain within Gale Crater, filled with boxwork formations — hardened ridges formed by underground water activity billions of years ago. NASA says these formations



may offer vital clues about whether microbial life once thrived below Mars' surface.

Curiosity, which landed on Mars on August 5, 2012, has spent over 13 years exploring the Martian landscape. Its


mission centers on answering the pivotal question: Could Mars have ever supported life? Despite the rover's age, engineers are continually enhancing its capabilities to en-

valuable scientific data.

This latest discovery not only strengthens the hypothesis that Mars had liquid water, but also pushes the boundaries of how long the Red Planet sure it continues to deliver might have remained habita-

ble as it slowly lost its atmosphere. With each finding, Curiosity brings humanity closer to understanding the mysterious history of Mars — and whether it once had the right conditions to support life.

## OpenAl's GPT-5 Nears Release, Smarter Al But Smaller Leap



OpenAI is preparing to launch its next-generation AI model, GPT-5, the successor to the powerful GPT-4 that helped make ChatGPT a global phenomenon in 2022. The model's release is said to be imminent, raising anticipation across the tech world for what could be another step forward in genera-

tive AI capabilities. OpenAl CEO Sam Altman

has hinted throughout the year that GPT-5 will bring together the strengths of large-scale models and test-time compute, a technique where more computing resources are allocated during inference for improved results. This combination could make GPT-5 more adaptive and accurate across a

broader range of tasks. According to two early testers

who spoke to Reuters on condition of anonymity due to nondisclosure agreements, GPT-5 has shown notable improvements in coding, mathematics, and scientific problem-solving. However, they noted that while it is more capable and refined than GPT-4, the leap in performance and intelligence may not be as dramatic as the jump

GPT-4, launched in 2023, was praised for its multimodal abilities and more accurate reasoning. It powered the premium versions of ChatGPT and was later integrated into Microsoft products and numerous enterprise tools. GPT-5 is expected to expand on these capabilities, potentially with enhanced memory, better real-world grounding, and in-

creased reliability.

While OpenAI has not announced an official release date, the testing phase suggests that a public launch could happen soon. With AI safety, alignment, and regulation becoming central concerns globally, GPT-5's release will also likely reignite debates about responsible AI development and the pace of

Despite a bright start in the second game, where Tanvi led 6-1, Phichitpreechasak's deceptive play and tactical control turned the match in her favour.
