Azharuddin's Induction: A Game Changer for Jubilee Hills Bypoll?

Azharuddin, who has been associated with the Congress Party for over a decade, previously served as a Member of **Parliament from Uttar Pradesh.**

ormer Indian cricket captain Mohammad Azharuddin has once again come into the political spotlight — this time as a potential game changer for the Congress Party ahead of the Jubilee Hills Assembly bypoll. The Congress high co mmand's decision to elevate Azharuddin to th e state cabinet has sp arked sharp political re actions and fresh controversy across Telangana's political circles. Azharuddin, who has

been associated with the Congress Party for over a decade, previously served as a Member of Parliament from Uttar Pradesh. Later, he contested from the Jubilee Hills constituency in Hyderabad but was defeated. Despite the setback, he remained loyal to the party and was recently being considered for a Legislative Council (MLC) nomination. However, sources indicate that his inclusion the allegations, stating

in the cabinet was planned much earlier by the Congress high command. Party insiders reveal

that the decision was not merely political but also aimed at ensuring social and communal balance within the stat e cabinet. As a promine nt figure from the Muslim community with na tional recognition, Azh aruddin's appointment is expected to resonate with minority voters, particularly in Hyder abad and surrounding regions. The timing of his induction, however — just days before the Jubilee Hills bypoll has led opposition parties to cry foul.

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the Bharat Rashtra Sa mithi (BRS) have both lodged formal complaints with the Election Commission (EC), alleging that the Congress move violates the Model Code of Conduct. They argue that Azharuddin's sudden elevation is a deliberate attempt to influence voters. Congress leaders, however, dismiss that the cabinet expansion was already in process and that the timing is purely co inc idental.

Political observers

believe that, intentional or not, the move has stirred significant discussion among minority groups. The Congr ess already enjoys support from the All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM), and Azharuddin's entry could further consolidate minority votes in Hyderabad. However, despite this strategic advantage, it remains uncertain how much this will translate into actual electoral success in the Jubilee Hills bypoll — where sympathy for the Maganti family, following the death of former MLA Maganti Gopinath, remains

Meanwhile, the BJP and BRS appear to be coordinating their attacks on the Congress. Interestingly, BJP leaders have avoided directly criticizing the BRS or its candidate, leading to speculation that both parties might be working in tandem to counter Congress influence in urban constituencies. The Congress has repeatedly accused the two opposition parties of having a covert understanding ahead of the next general ele

ctions The bypoll is expected to be closely fought, with Jubilee Hills' predominantly urban electorate likely to play a decisive role. Analysts say that while Azharuddin's induction brings renewed energy and minority focus to the Congress campaign, dissatisfaction among sections of urban voters toward the government could still pose challenges.

Whether Azharuddin's cabinet entry turns out to be a tactical masterstroke or a symbolic gesture will be known only when the ballots are counted - but one thing is certain: the Congress has successfully turned the Jubilee Hills bypoll into a political spe

BJP Cries Foul Over Azhar's Cabinet Pitch

he Telangana BJP has lodged a complai nt with the State Chief Electoral Officer (CE O), alleging that Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy's reported proposal to induct former Indian cricketer Mohammed Azh aruddin into the Cabinet violates the Model Code of Conduct (MCC) and is aimed at influencing voters in the Jubilee Hills bye -election.

In a letter, BJP MLA Payal Shanker stated that the proposal was intended to woo voters and urged the CEO to take immediate action to withdraw the announcement. Azh aruddin had contested from the Jubilee Hills constituency in the 2023 Assembly elections.

The BJP said that th e move, if confirmed, would adversely affect the bye-election and requested the CEO to take cognisance of the alleged violation. Telangana BJP president Ramchander Rao termed the decision an act of "app easem ent." Voting for the Jubilee Hills by-election is scheduled for November 14, with counting also on the same day. The bypoll was necessitated following the death of sitting MLA and BRS leader Ma ganti Gopinath. BC leader V. Naveen Yadav is contesting for the Congress, while BRS has fielded Gopinath's widow, Sunitha. BJP has nominated Lankala Deepak Reddy as its

them. The Congress currently has no Muslim MLA or minister in the state cabinet. With Azharuddin's induction, the number of ministers in the Revanth Reddy cabinet would rise to 16, while the sanctioned stre ngth is 18 including the Chief Min ister.

The timing of the proposed expansion has stirred controversy, with BJP arguing that promising a cabinet berth to a former candidate associated with the campaign in the same constituency undermines the electoral process. They termed it a blatant attempt at communal polarization for electoral gain.

The CEO's response to this formal complaint is now highly anticipated, as it may set a precedent for defining the limits of government actions during election0s.

he Bharat Ras htra Samithi (BR S) has filed a com plaint with the Election Commission of India (ECI) aga inst Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy for allegedly violating the Model Code of Conduct (MCC) while campaigning for the Jubilee Hills Assem-

bly bye-election. The BRS alleged that the Chief Minister tried to influence film workers by making promises during a meeting in the constituency. A delegation led by senior BRS ML A and former minister Gangula Kamalakar submitted the complaint to Chief Electoral Officer Sudharshan Reddy. The party demanded that the Chief Minister be removed as the Congress's star campaigner and barred from further campaigning. They stated that the

Districts Reel Under Flood Fury As Cyclone Batters Telangana

orrential rains under the impact of Cyclone Montha left vast stretches of Telangana inundated on Thursday, with Warangal, Hanamkonda, and Khammam districts bearing the brunt of nature's fury. The deep depression, which weakened after crossing the Andhra Pradesh coast, triggered flash floods, submerged roads and colonies, and caused extensive damage to crops and infrastructure. Incessant downpour over the last four days turned

Warangal and Hanamkonda corded more than 11.5 cm. towns into virtual islands, with stormwater gushing through streets and overflowing lakes inundating residential colonies. Traffic came to a standstill in several parts of the tri-city area of Warangal-Hanamkonda-Kazipet as drains overflowed and roads caved in under the relent-

According to the Telangana Development Planning Society, Bheemdevarapalle in Hanamkonda district recorded 41.9 cm of rainfall, the highest in the state. As many as 35 locations received extremely heavy rainfall above 20.5 cm, while 68 others re-

Hunter Road, connecting Warangal and Hanamkonda, was completely submerged after the Bondhi stream overflowed, paralysing vehicular movement. Floods also snapped road connectivity to the historic Bhadrakali temple as the adjoining lake breached its banks and flooded surrounding colonies. The Warangal-Mulugu road was rendered impassable due to overflowing drains.

Warangal Mayor Gundu Sudharani said about 45 localities under the Greater Warangal Municipal Corporation (GWMC) limits were inundated. "Around

1,200 people have been evacuated from low-lying areas and shifted to rehabilitation centres," she said, adding that rescue efforts were being carried out by seven teams comprising the State Disaster Response Force, engineering, and sanitation staff. Boats were pressed into service, and drones were deployed to deliver food, water, and essential supplies to stranded reside

Endowments and Forests Minister Konda Sur ekha, MP Kadiyam Kav ya, and District Collector Satya Sharada visited flood-hit areas and interacted with affected people, assuring them of immediate relief meas

Meanwhile, the Warangal–Hanamkonda bus station was submerged, and an RTC bus heading to Warangal got trapped in floodwaters near Upperpalli village in Wardhannapet mandal after water from an overflowing lake inundated the road. Fortunately, all passengers ma naged to escape safely.

In rural Warangal, villages in Nekkonda, Parvathagiri, and Sangem mandals were cut off after roads and culverts were washed away. Agricultural lands remained under several feet of water, and electricity poles and trees were uprooted in many areas. Authori-

ties cautioned people against crossing overflowing streams and lowlying bridges.

Elsewhere, Khammam district too witnessed massive flooding as the Munneru river swelled to 24.7 feet, prompting officials to issue a third flood warning. With heavy inflows from upstream Chhattisgarh and Maharashtra, the river continued to rise, inundating colonies in Khammam town and cutting off the Khammam-Bonakal road. Several cars were washed away, and nearly 100 families were moved to relief camps.

In Bhadradri-Kothagudem district, heavy rain lashed Bhadrachalam, Dummugudem, Aswaraopeta, and Charla mandals, where rainfall exceeded 100 mm. Strea ms and canals overflow ed, isolating several villages. Officials warned residents near the Godavari river to remain alert as the water level crossed the 80-foot mark, flooding low-lying habit ations.

Flooding was also reported from parts of Karimnagar, Siddipet, and Nalgonda, where canals breached their embankments and inundated fields and roads. In Saidapur mandal of Karimnagar district, a breach in the Venkapalli canal flooded roads and cut off access to multiple villages.

Revanth to Survey Flood-Hit Warangal, Husnabad Today



India's Constitution guarantees formal press freedom, but the real challenge today is a media landscape largely captive to partisanship and deference—one that silences scrutiny and stifles meaningful debate. At a time of domestic upheaval and global uncertainty, India urgently needs a press that holds power accountable, encourages honest discourse, and signals when change is necessary. Instead, conformity narrows perspectives, weakens oversight, and blinds the public to critical course corrections. Two recent incidents

ter the tragic Pahalgam massacre and India's subsequent military response under "Op Sindoor," the domestic media narrative was triumphant. However, internationally, the reaction was far less supportive, with global coverage focusing on the loss of Indian jets rather than the strategic impact of the strikes. Unverified reports about strikes deep inside Pakistan circulated without confirmation, projecting jingoism that cost India credibility. Limited government briefings and restricted foreign media access only worsened the situation. Most worrying was the mainstream media's reluctance to question the



government on security failures that led to the massacre. Accountability was noticeably absent.

A similar pattern emerges in coverage of tariff disputes with the U.S. While India must de-

fend its strategic interests firmly, effective diplomacy requires realism and agility. Yet main-

stream media shy away from critically assessing India's handling of negotiations, choosing in-

stead to echo commentary that supports India's stance or criticizes the U.S. This one-sided coverage undermines deeper understanding and reflection.

Though India boasts courageous journalists and independent digital voices working often at personal risk, these are exceptions. Concentrated media ownership, advertising pressures, and threats-both legal and online-discourage investigative scrutiny. Sensationalism often trumps in-depth reporting.

Diaspora communities must also reflect on their role. While enjoying media freedoms abroad, many support narrow, uncritical media consumption about India, fostering echo chambers rather than pluralism. True patriotism means demanding the same high standards of accountability and fact-based reporting for the India we cherish.

A responsible press is not anti-national—it is democracy's watchdog. It highlights both successes and failures, enabling citizens to hold leaders accountable. Without genuine inquiry and independent questioning, public access to information shrinks, and democracy suffers.

For a truly developed India, we need media that informs and challenges, not inflames. Honest reflection-not flattery-is the path forward.

Let the Era of Post-Dollar Power Begin-India Must Lead It

The U.S. dollar, once a symbol of global trade stability, has morphed into a strategic weapon of economic coercion. Instead of tanks or troops, Washington now uses financial sanctions, SWIFT bans, and punitive tariffs to control nations—just ask Iran, Russia, Venezuela, and now India.

Recently, the U.S. imposed a 50% tariff on Indian exports, punishing India for buying cheaper oil from Russia—a country still deeply entwined economically with the U.S. through secret tech deals and uranium trade. This blatant hypocrisy underscores a larger truth: India remains trapped in an economic system designed to sustain American dominance.

Despite being the world's fifth-largest economy and a major geopolitical power, India still settles over 60% of its for-eign trade in U.S. dollars. Whether trading with Russia or importing machinery from China, payments flow through New York's invisible "toll booth," enriching American banks and reinforcing dependence. This system is not about efficiency but control. The dollar's status as the world's reserve currency lets the U.S. print money freely, finance endless military ventures, and impose its will on sovereign nations

Prime Minister Modi's call for "Atmanirbhar Bharat" (self-reliant India) is commendable, but true self-reliance is impossible as long as India's trade remains dollardenominated and SWIFT-dependent. One American bureaucrat can freeze payments to Indian importers or deny liquidity to Russian banks, quietly auctioning India's strategic autonomy.



The solution lies in bold, systematic de-dollarization, starting with India's largest trading partners—China and Russia. With annual trade exceeding \$135 billion with China and critical imports from Russia, India must shift to settling transactions in rupees, yuan, rubles, or even barter arrangements like rare earths for

technology.

Forming a Rupee-Yuan-Ruble triad and championing alternative clearinghouses such as a BRICS+ system would diminish dollar hegemony and establish a truly multipolar financial order one where trade isn't weaponized and national sovereignty respected.

Modi has resisted Western pressure admirably by continuing to buy Russian oil, but this moment demands reinvention. India can lead a new era of economic dignity by building an independent financial ecosystem—one that chips away at the dollar's false supremacy and lights the fuse for a post-dollar world.

The New Battlefield: WhatsApp **Groups and Everyday Conflicts**



In today's digital age. wars are no longer confined to geopolitics or economics—they have found a new, unexpected battleground: WhatsApp groups. Once celebrated as a quick and convenient way to stay connected, WhatsApp has evolved into a zone of social tension, petty conflicts, endless misunderstandings.

Take a simple morning walk and you might overhear heated debates sparked by WhatsApp disputes. In one instance, a group member faced backlash for buying designer outfits on sale but not sharing the news with the group. The irritation? She frequently forwards messages but kept this exclusive. Meanwhile, just a few steps away, another group fumed over a member who constantly flooded chats with mundane photos from feeding her dog to wa-

tering plants—clogging up everyone's phone storage.

These seemingly trivial quarrels underscore a deeper social dilemma: WhatsApp's ease of communication blurs boundaries between private space and public sharing. One delayed reply to a long-lost friend's message was enough to end a friendship, while an acquaintance's persistent calls and follow-up messages turned interactions into a source of stress and

withdrawal. WhatsApp groups span diverse circles—schools, families, apartments—and while they theoretically offer a platform for helpful information and camaraderie, reality often falls short. Apartment groups, for example, start with polite exchanges but quickly devolve into finger-pointing over unpaid maintenance, garbage issues, and disputes about repairs. Just when the tension peaks, someone might innocently ask about a plumber, briefly breaking the hostile

The constant pressure to monitor and respond to messages can be exhausting. Whether engaging enthusiastically or replying with indifference, users risk judgment and criticism. The safest response some suggest, is a neutral one: "Nothing, just WhatsApp.'

This digital battlefield reveals the complexities of modern communication where convenience collides with social expectations, and every notification can become a small war. For many, WhatsApp is less about connection and more about navigating fragile egos and endless drama. In the war zone of instant messaging, sometimes the best defense is simply a quiet retreat.

US Pharma Tariffs: Challenge and Opportunity for India's Drug Industry



Trump recently announced that starting October 1, 2025, a 100% tariff will be imposed on branded or patented pharmaceutical imports into the US—unless foreign companies build drug-manufacturing facilities on American soil. Marketed as a nationalist "produce in America or pay" policy, this move aims to bring supply chains home but effectively acts as a blunt instrument protectionism.

India, known as the 'pharmacy of the world," produces about 20% of global generic medicines, supplies nearly 60% of vaccines worldwide, and hosts the largest number of US FDA-approved manufacturing sites outbillion pharmaceutical exports account for 90% of US prescriptions. This tariff threatens to disrupt this vital trade relationship.

While framed as promoting domestic production, the tariff is essentially a demand for market access through forced relocation. History shows that tariff costs are typically absorbed by consumers and importers, not exporters. The US healthcare system's heavy reliance on affordable Indian generics means any supply disruption or price hikes could severely impact patients, insurers, and government programs. Complex drug manufacturing can't

be quickly shifted to the

vestment, and logistical

Many Indian firms, like Dr. Reddy's and Zydus, derive 30-45% of their revenues from the US market, making this tariff a serious financial threat. Moreover, Indian-made medicines are often rebranded and repackaged abroad, with profits accruing to foreign firms rather than Indian producers.

However, this challenge can become an opportunity if Indian pharma companies act strategically. They should promote their own brands directly in markets like Latin America, Africa, and Southeast Asia to bypass rebranding by foreign companies. Building

US President Donald side the US. India's \$30 US due to regulatory, in-regional manufacturing and regulatory hubs in partner countries can help sidestep US tariffs. Continued focus on regulatory compliance, backed by diplomatic support and export financing, will strengthen India's global pharma presence.

Finally, India must engage multilaterally to challenge protectionist tariff rules at the WTO and other forums, and accelerate R&D investment to move into higher-value drugs like biosimilars and specialty injectables.

If approached proactively, India can turn this tariff threat into a strategic opportunity to reinforce its position as a global pharmaceutical







'RJD, Congress like oil and water, out for power at any cost': PM Modi in Bihar

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday launched a sharp attack on the opposition alliance in Bihar, saying the Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) and Congress had come together out of "lust for power" despite being fundamentally different. Speaking at an election rally in Muzaffarpur, Modi described their alliance as "oil and water" — entities that "are in one glass but not merging.

"The real news of this election is not the abuses being hurled at me," Modi said. "It is the scale of differences between RJD and Congress. Their workers are fighting each other for dominance.

Taking aim at opposition leaders Tejashwi Yadav and Rahul Gandhi, Modi called them "two royal scions out on bail," questioning whether voters would "allow these scions to plunder Bihar again." He accused the alliance of underestimating the wisdom of Biharis and said the opposition had united only "to capture

India Gets 6-Month US Sanctions Exemption for **Chabahar Port**

India on Thursday confirmed that its investments and operations at Iran's Chabahar Port will be exempt from U.S. sanctions for six months, allowing work on the key strategic infrastructure project to continue uninterrupted.

Affairs (MEA) said the exemption ensures that American restrictions announced in September will not apply to the port.

The announcement comes amid intense India-U.S. negotiations to finalize a major bilateral trade deal. "We continue to re-The Ministry of External main engaged with the

U.S. side on finalising the trade deal. Both sides are continuing to hold discussions," MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said, noting that the Commerce Ministry is leading talks on trade issues.

India signed a 10-year agreement with Iran in 2024, under which staterun India Ports Global Ltd (IPGL) pledged \$370 million in investments to develop and operate the Shahid Beheshti terminal at Chabahar. The port, located in Iran's Sistan-Balochistan province, is a crucial link for India to Afghanistan and Central

Asia, providing a trade

route that bypasses Pakistan.

This is not the first time Chabahar has received a U.S. waiver. In 2018, the Trump administration issued a similar exemption recognizing the port's importance for regional connectivity and Afghanistan's access to global markets.

The MEA also said India is evaluating the implications of new U.S. sanctions on Russian oil companies. "Our position on energy sourcing is well-known," Jaiswal added. "We are guided by the imperative to secure affordable energy from diverse sources for our 1.4 billion people."

External Affairs Mini ter S. Jaishankar has previously defended India's energy decisions, noting that its Russian oil imports remain modest com-

pared to Europe's. Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal meanwhile said trade talks with Washington are progressing, expressing optimism for a "fair and equitable" deal while emphasizing that India "will not sign any agreement in haste.'

"Don't Trigger Me": 17 **Children Rescued in Mumbai Hostage Incident**

At least 17 children were rescued unharmed on Thursday after a man held them hostage in the Powai neighbourhood of Mumbai, police said. Responding to a circulated video in which the suspect identified himself as Rohit Arya and made chilling threats, authorities mounted a rapid operation that ended with the children being removed and the suspect arrested at the scene.

In the pre-incident video, the man said he had chosen hostage-taking instead of suicide to force conversations with unspecified individuals. "I am Rohit Arya. Instead of dying by suicide, I have made a plan and am holding some children hostage here," he said, listing what he called "simple demands,

moral demands, ethical demands, and a few questions." He warned officials that "the slightest wrong move from you will trigger me," threatening to set the location on fire and insisting he was not seeking money and was "not a terrorist."

Mumbai police said they acted quickly after the video began circulating on social media, deploying tactical teams and negotiators to the Powai site. Officers established a secure perimeter and engaged with the suspect while prioritising the safety of the children. According to authorities, the swift response and coordinated efforts by local law enforcement led to the children being evacuated without physical harm and the perpetrator being taken

Medical teams evaluated the rescued children at the scene and arranged for further care and counselling where needed. Police declined to disclose detailed motives pending further investigation but said Arya's statements suggested he sought attention and engagement rather than

material gain. The arrest comes amid renewed calls for vigilance over online content that may herald violent acts. Local officials urged parents to cooperate with investigators and asked anyone with information about the suspect or the circumstances leading up to the incident to come forward. Authorities said they will continue probing the case to determine the full chain of events and any wider

Bihar Assembly Elections | Litmus test for Tejashwi Yadav's 'solo show'

As Bihar heads toward Assembly elections, questions are mounting within the I.N.D.I.A. bloc over the strategy to turn the campaign into a one-man show centered around Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) leader Tejashwi Yadav. While he has been projected as the alliance's chief ministerial face, several allies are uneasy about the shift from collective leadership to personality-driven

Tejashwi's emergence as the focal point came after weeks of internal wrangling. The Congress hesitated until the last moment before endorsing him, while Vikassheel Insaan Party (VIP) chief Mukesh Sahani reportedly sought assurances of being named deputy chief ministerial candidate as a bargaining chip.

The official unveiling of Teiashwi as the CM face on October 23 highlighted the alliance's internal imbalance — banners at the event featured only his image, omitting other I.N.D.I.A. bloc leaders. Similarly, the joint manifesto released on October 28 carried Tejashwi's picture prominently under the title "Bihar ka Tejashwi Pran" (Tejashwi's Re-

solve), reducing the

presence of other lead-

ers — including Con-

gress's Rahul Gandhi

and even RJD founder Lalu Prasad — to minor photos.

At rallies, Tejashwi has positioned himself as the youthful, forward-looking leader who can take on Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's NDA. RJD strategists believe his 2020 near-win and image as a former Deputy Chief

Minister give him credibility and voter appeal. However, unease per-

sists among allies over the RJD's dominance in seat-sharing and campaign messaging. Some within the bloc feel sidelined and worry that Tejashwi's personal projection could alienate smaller partners, undermining the alliance's claim of unity.

Despite the dissent, RJD insiders remain confident that Tejashwi's solo pitch will consolidate anti-BJP votes, framing him as the face of Bihar's future generational alternative to the long-standing po-

Vietnam Floods Kill 10, River Hits 60-Year High

Severe flooding in central Vietnam has claimed at least 10 lives this week, as rivers swell to levels not seen in six decades, authorities reported on Thursday, October 30, 2025. The disaster has inundated more than 128,000 homes across five coastal provinces, with water depths reaching up to three metres in some

The flooding, triggered by relentless heavy rainfall since the weekend, has wreaked havoc on communities and infrastructure. Some areas recorded a staggering 1.7 metres (5ft 7in) of rain within 24 hours, overwhelming drainage systems and triggering landslides. The ancient town of Hoi An, a UN-ESCO World Heritage site and major tourist destination, was particularly hard hit, prompting emergency

evacuations. Tourists and residents were rescued by boat from submerged streets in Hoi An, with images showing water lapping at historic buildings and disrupting daily life. Local authorities warned that river levels were con-

tinuing to rise, surpassing records last set six decades ago, and called for heightened vigilance in vulnerable

Emergency services and the military have been deployed to assist with evacuations, deliver relief supplies, and support stranded residents. Officials have urged communities to move to higher ground and adhere strictly to safety advisories.

The economic impact is expected to be significant, with agriculture, tourism, and local businesses facing extensive losses due to inundated farmlands, damaged infrastructure, and disrupted commerce. Authorities are assessing the damage and mobilizing national and international aid to provide immediate relief.

Climate experts have noted that extreme rainfall events in the region have been increasing in frequency and intensity, raising concerns about longterm flood resilience. Meanwhile, residents continue to navigate the rising waters, as the government works to prevent further casualties and mitigate ongo-

Trump Cuts China Tariffs After Xi Meeting

U.S. President Donald Trump announced a significant easing of trade tensions with China following a highprofile summit with Chinese President Xi Jinping in Busan, South Korea, on Thursday, October 30, 2025. Trump described the face-to-face meeting as "roaring success," highlighting agreements on trade, rare earth exports, and agricultural purchases.

One of the key outcomes of the summit is the reduction of U.S. tariffs on Chinese goods. Tariffs imposed earlier this year as a punitive measure on China's sale of chemicals used in fentanyl production will be cut from 20% to 10%. This adjustment lowers the overall combined tariff rate on Chinese imports from 57% to 47%, signaling a major step toward de-escalation in the ongoing U.S.-China trade disputes.

Trump also revealed that Beijing had agreed to increase the export of rare earth elements to the United States and to resume buying American soybeans. These developments are expected to boost U.S. agricultural exports while securing critical supply chains for technology and manufacturing

On the technology front, Trump said both leaders discussed the export of advanced computer chips to China, with Nvidia set to enter talks with Chinese officials to facilitate the process. The discussions mark a cautious but notable thaw in technology trade restrictions, which had been a major source of tension between the two countries.

The summit, held at Gimhae International Airport in Busan, drew global attention as both leaders posed for photographs, signaling a willingness to engage directly on economic and strategic issues. Analysts suggest that the measures agreed upon could stabilize trade relations in the near term while leaving room for further negotiations on technology transfers, market access, and intellectual property

protections. Trump framed the summit's outcome as a win for American workers, farmers, and tech industries, emphasizing that the U.S. remains committed to fair trade while pursuing closer cooperation with China.

India's Been "Very Good" On Russian Oil Issue: Trump

U.S. President Donald Trump praised India for significantly reducing its imports of Russian oil, calling New Delhi "very good" on the issue amid his administration's continued efforts to isolate Moscow economically over the war in Ukraine.

Speaking aboard Air Force One on Thursday, following his bilateral meeting with Chinese President Xi Jinping at the APEC Summit in Busan, South Korea, Trump reiterated that India had scaled back purchases of Russian crude. "India's been very good on that front," he said, while noting that China continues to buy large quantities of Russian oil.

Trump added that the two leaders did not discuss oil specifically but focused on working together to bring an end to the war in Ukraine. "It doesn't affect China, it doesn't affect us, but I'd like to see it done," he remarked.

His comments echo previous claims since mid-October that Prime Minister Narendra Modi assured him India would

either halt or drastically cut Russian oil imports, a key source of revenue for Moscow's military

campaign.

Earlier this month, India's Ministry of External Affairs responded to

Trump's remarks, asserting that the country's energy sourcing decisions are guided by national interest and consumer protection. MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal stated that India's energy

policy aims to secure stable prices and diversified supplies while broadening its energy partnerships, including with the United States.

"India is a significant importer of oil and gas,'

Jaiswal said. "Our import policies are guided entirely by the objective of safeguarding the interests of the Indian consumer in a volatile energy scenario.'

Florida Ends H-1B Visa Hires in State Universities



"Universities across the country are importing foreign workers on H-1B visas instead of hiring Americans who are qualified and available to do the job," DeSantis stated. He emphasized that Florida leads the nation in higher education, producing thousands of highly-qualified graduates annually.

By enforcing these measures, Florida aims to set a precedent in U.S. higher education, emphasizing accountability, workforce prioritization, and alignment between academic output and local employment opportunities.



Sensex, Nifty Rise on US Fed Rate Cut; IT Stocks **Lead Gains**



Indian equity markets extended their positive run on Thursday following global cues after the US Federal Reserve cut interest rates by 25 basis points, bringing the benchmark rate to 4-4.25%. The S&P BSE Sensex surged over 350 points to trade above 83,000, while the NSE Nifty50 crossed 25,400 in early trade. Broader market indices also recorded gains, with volatility

remaining stable. Dr. VK Vijayakumar, Chief Investment Strategist at Geojit Investments, described the Fed's 25 bp rate cut as a "risk management cut," highlighting uncertainties around economic activity, unemployment, and inflation. He added that with the US labor market cooling and GDP growth projected at 1.6% for 2025, further rate cuts are possible, creating a favourable environment for global and domestic markets. Despite this, Indian stocks are largely driven by expectations of corporate earnings revival and positive developments in India-US trade negotiations.

On the domestic front, Nifty50 closed Wednesday at 25.330. marking gains in 11 of the last 13 sessions and recovering over 900 points from its recent low of 24,404 on August 29. Analysts noted that the Nifty remains in an uptrend, with support near 25,150 and resistance levels at 25,550 and

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) is reviewing a proposal to allow foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) to trade in non-cash settled, nonagricultural commodity derivative contracts, SEBI Chairman Tuhin Kanta Pandey said on Wednesday. The move is aimed at committee to suggest measures

enable FPIs to participate in derivative contracts beyond cashsettled agricultural commodities, potentially enhancing market liquidity and offering international investors broader avenues in India's commodities market. Currently, FPI participalargely restricted, limiting foreign inflows and investment opportunities.

Pandey emphasized that expanding FPI access to non-agri commodity derivatives aligns with SEBI's broader goal of deepening financial markets while maintaining robust regulatory oversight. The regulator is also exploring other measures to improve transparency, risk management, and market participation across commodity segments.

Market participants expect the potential approval to provide a boost to metals and energy derivatives trading, attracting foreign capital and increasing comnetitiveness. Analysts say this could also help Indian commodity markets integrate better with global commodity flows, while giving domestic investors more hedging and investment options.

The SEBI chairman reiterated that the proposals are under review and would be implemented with appropriate safeguards to protect market integrity, risk management, and investor interests, signaling SEBI's ongoing efforts to modernize India's commodity derivatives ecosystem.

GST Inversion Eases, But Input-Output Rate Gaps Worry Industry



The recent GST rate rationalisation in India has eased the inverted duty structure (IDS) across many sectors, but wide gaps between input and output tax rates continue to raise concerns for industry, particularly regarding working capital and refund processes. The removal of the 12 per cent slab and consolidation into two main rates of 5 per cent and 18 per cent has addressed most anomalies, yet items such as bicycles, tractors, fertilisers, and certain textiles still face inversion. For example, steel inputs attract 18 per cent GST, while final products like bicycles and e-bicycles are taxed at 5 per cent, creating potential capital blockage.

In the textile sector, GST cuts on manmade fibres and yarn have largely corrected inversion, with about 80 per cent of the value chain now aligned. However, minor inversions remain in polyester fibre raw materials and textile machinery, where input tax at 18 per cent exceeds the final product's 5 per cent rate. A textile industry executive noted that the wide rate difference, though smaller than before, continues to pose working capital challenges and highlighted the importance of a smooth refund mechanism.

Similarly, in the fertiliser sector, GST on key inputs such as sulphuric acid, nitric acid, and ammonia has been reduced from 18 per cent to 5 per cent. Yet packaging costs and government subsidies can still result in inversion, as final product prices may fall below input costs. Officials involved in GST rationalisation acknowledged these transitional issues but emphasized that majority of IDS cases have been corrected, with expected savings for the fertiliser sector reaching Rs 5,000 crore annually due to lower refund outgo.


Industry experts caution that while progress has been made, residual inversions could incentivize evasion if refunds are delayed or capital remains blocked, underscoring the need for efficient implementation and monitoring. Nvidia Invests \$5 Billion in Intel to Boost Al Infrastructure and PCs

Leading chipmaker Nvidia announced on Thursday that it will invest \$5 billion in Intel to develop AI infrastructure and personal computing solutions. The investment involves purchasing Intel common stock at \$23.28 per share, slightly below Intel's Wednesday closing price of \$24.90. Upon completion, Nvidia will become one of Intel's largest shareholders, holding roughly 4% or more of the company. The transaction is subject to customary regulatory approvals.

This move follows increased interest in Intel from major investors, including the US government, which acquired a roughly 10% stake in August, and Japan's SoftBank, which invested \$2 billion. Intel has also been raising funds by selling assets to support heavy investments required for advanced semiconductor development amid declining market share.

The collaboration will integrate Nvidia's AI infrastructure and accelerated computing with Intel's leading CPU technologies and x86 ecosystem. Intel will develop Nvidia-custom x86 CPUs for data centers, which will be incorporated into Nvidia's AI



platforms. For personal computing, Intel will create x86 systemon-chips (SOCs) integrating Nvidia RTX GPU chiplets, enabling high-performance PCs combining top-tier CPUs and

A viral Reddit post has reignited the debate on Bengaluru's traffic crisis, calling it a "hidden tax" that drains time and productivity from lakhs of commuters. Shared in the r/Bengaluru community on Friday, the post narrates the ordeal of an Oracle employee living in JP Nagar, who says the city's gridlock costs him nearly two and a half months of his life every

According to the post, the techie earns Rs 28 lakh annually, excluding stock options. Out of this, he pays Rs 6.5 lakh in income tax and another Rs 1.4 lakh through GST on daily expenses—already surrendering over three months of work to the exchequer. But the bigger loss, he argues, is time. His office, just 14 kilometers away, should be a 30-minute commute. Instead, it takes an exhausting 90 minutes each way. Over the course of the year, this adds up to 2.5 months lost—time he believes is equivalent to another hidden tax paid not to the government, but to the city's poor infrastructure.

The post has struck a chord with thousands of Bengaluru residents who face the same grind daily. Many echoed the frustration that India's "Silicon Valley" may be powering global innovation, but its broken roads, endless traffic jams, and inadequate public transport force professionals to pay with their most valuable resource—time.

Experts say such urban inefficiencies also take a toll on mental health, family life, and the city's economy. While civic authorities have announced metro expansions, road upgrades, and tech-driven traffic management systems, citizens argue change is too slow to match the city's exploding population and vehicle density.

For Bengaluru's workforce, the message is clear: the real tax isn't just in paychecks—it's the endless hours wasted in

Meanwhile, Russia secures fifth place with 2,329.63 tonnes, nearly doubling its long-term average and reflecting its aggressive push to build reserves in recent decades

These figures not only underline the global gold hierarchy but also signal how countries use gold as a hedge against economic uncertainties. While Western economies dominate the top ranks, nations like Russia have been catching up rapidly, using gold as a shield against sanctions and currency instability. For emerging economies like India, which also features in the top 10, gold reserves remain a crucial part of financial security and

long-term strategy The bottom line: gold is still king, and the countries that hold it the most continue to wield significant influence in the world

Charlie Kirk's Anti-India Visa Remark Resurfaces Amid H-1B Shakeup

Conservative US leader and staunch Trump supporter Charlie Kirk, who was shot dead on September 10 in Utah, is back in the spotlight after his controversial post on Indians and immigration resurfaced. Just days before his death, the 31-year-old Turning Point USA founder declared that America does not need more visas for Indians.

On September 2, Kirk wrote on X that legal immigration from India had displaced American workers more than any other. insisting that America was "full" and should put "its own people first." His remarks were in response to Fox News host Laura Ingraham, who argued that any US trade deal with India would involve more visas. Kirk's post sparked backlash, with critics calling it xenophobic and damaging to innovation and bilateral ties, since most Indians in the



US migrate as skilled professionals in the tech

The controversy has resurfaced now because former President Donald

Trump, back in the headlines, has announced sweeping changes to the H-1B visa programme. From September 21, 2025, expected to drastically reduce Indian tech migration. The H-1B visa has long served as the backbone of Silicon Valley's workforce, powering giants like Google, Microsoft and Amazon with Indian talent.

Kirk, known for his fiery podcasts and youth outreach, built a strong base in conservative circles, aligning with Trump's "America First" agenda. His critics, however, saw his stand as part of a broader push within the MAGA movement to curb legal immigration, even at the cost of America's competitiveness.

With his death, Kirk leaves behind a polarising legacy. But his last words on visas highlight a growing fault line in US politics—whether America should remain open to Indian talent or shut the door in the name of nationalism.

Internet Shocked Over Sky-High iPhone 17 Prices in Pakistan

Apple's latest iPhone 17 series has just hit global markets, but in Pakistan, it's the jaw-dropping price tags that have caught everyone's attention. While Indian fans queued up outside Apple stores in Mumbai and Delhi to grab the new device on launch day, social media in Pakistan is buzzing over how expensive the phones are across the border.

A viral post on X revealed that a resident in Pakistan will need to shell out between PKR 3.65 lakh (Rs 1.14 lakh) and PKR 5.74 lakh (Rs 1.79 lakh) for the new lineup. The iPhone 17 Pro Max alone costs around PKR 547,000—or roughly Rs 1.70 lakh. The iPhone Air comes in at PKR 483,680 (Rs 1.51 lakh), while the iPhone 17 Pro is priced at PKR 531,680 (Rs 1.66 lakh).

Reactions online have been hilarious and exasperated in equal measure. Some users quipped that "flats mil javenge iss daam mein" (you can buy an apartment at this price), while others joked that buying an iPhone in Pakistan now requires taking out a loan. Many pointed out that with the country already struggling with inflation and economic challenges, these luxury prices make the iPhone 17 an unrealistic dream for the average consumer.



seca 6-1, 3-6, 6-3 and will meet Australia's Alex de Minaur in the round of 16.

McGrath placed Sachin Tendulkar third on his list, with MS Dhoni and Yuvraj Singh rounding out his top five. Notably, explosive opener Virender Sehwag was absent from the ranking.

McGrath praised Rohit's incredible numbers in oneday cricket, calling them "unbelievable." "Three double hundreds and the highest score of 264 is just unheard of. 11,370 runs in 276 matches—probably a little bit unfortunately earmarked as a one-day specialist. His stats in Test cricket should have been better because he was a class player," McGrath said. On Kohli, he added, "At No. 1, it's hard to go past Virat. You look at the runs, average, and strike rate—unbelievable."

Rohit Sharma recently made history by becoming the oldest Indian to reach the top spot in the ICC ODI batting rankings at 38 years and 182 days, surpassing India captain Shubman Gill.



His rise came after a stellar performance in the recent ODI series against Australia, where he amassed 202 runs in three matches at an average of 101, earning the 'Player of the Series' award.

WI Clinch 2-0 Lead After 14-Run Win Over **Bangladesh**



A brilliant 61 from Tanzid Hasan went in vain as West Indies secured a 14-run victory over Bangladesh in the second T20I on Wednesday, taking an unassailable 2-0 lead in the threematch series. Three-wicket hauls from Akeal Hosein and Romario Shepherd proved decisive as the visitors restricted Bangladesh to 135/8 while chasing 150.

Hosein (3/22) made history by surpassing Dwayne Bravo's tally, becoming the second-highest wicket-taker for West Indies in T20Is with 81 wickets in 83 matches, including a five-wicket haul. Shepherd complemented the effort with 3/29 and also contributed a quick 13 runs in the lower order, earning him the 'Player of the Match' award.

West Indies, elected to bat first, were powered by Alick Athaneze (52 off 33 balls) and skipper Shai Hope (55 off 36 balls). The duo stitched together a 105-run second-wicket partnership after an early loss of Brandon King (1), setting the platform for a competitive total. Mustafizur Rahman (3/21), Rishad Hossain (2/20), and Nasum Ahmed (2/35) managed to restrict further damage, but late contributions from Roston Chase (17* in 15 balls) and Shepherd (13 in 16 balls) took West Indies to 149/9.

In the chase, Bangladesh struggled to build partnerships despite Tanzid's resilient innings, which included three fours and three sixes. His dismissal at 117/4 in 17.1 overs triggered a collapse as Shepherd, Hosein, and Jason Holder (2/20) took quick wickets. Bangladesh lost four wickets for just 18 runs and ended their innings at 135/8.

With the series now sealed, West Indies can look forward to the final T20I with confidence, while Bangladesh will need a strong performance to avoid a

Oman Replaces Pakistan at Junior Hockey World Cup



Oman will join the lineup for the upcoming FIH Men's Junior World Cup 2025 in Tamil Nadu, following Pakistan's late withdrawal, the International Hockey Federation (FIH) announced on Wednesday. The tournament is scheduled from November 28 to December 10, with matches to be held in Chennai and Madurai.

Oman earned the spot as the next highest-ranked team from the Junior Asia Cup 2024, stepping in after Pakistan decided not to participate despite qualifying through last year's continental championship. The Pakistan Hockey Federation informed the FIH that the team would not accept the invitation, citing internal consultations with their government before

Pakistan had been placed in Group B alongside India, Chile, and Switzerland. With Oman taking their place, the group composition has been updated ahead of the tournament. This late withdrawal marks the second recent instance of Pakistan pulling out from a major hockey event in India, after the Men's Asia Cup in Rajgir, Bihar, where Bangladesh replaced them. The withdrawal also cost Pakistan a chance to qualify for next year's World Cup, as the Asia Junior Cup served as a qualifying event.

The FIH had initially postponed the official draw for nearly a month to accommodate Pakistan's decision-making, eventually holding the ceremony at its headquarters in Lausanne. The Men's Junior World Cup 2025 will feature 24 teams for the first time, alongside the Women's edition, reflecting the FIH's Empowerment and Engagement strategy aimed at promoting wider participation.

Germany enters the tournament as the defending champions, having won the 2023 edition in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. The inclusion of Oman ensures the tournament maintains full participation and competitive balance, while giving the Middle Eastern nation an opportunity to showcase its growing hockey prowess on the global stage.
