CM directs officials to focus on grounding of industries as per schedule

he twelfth State Investments Promotion Board meeting headed by Chief Mi nister N Chandrababu Naidu today approved investments to a tune of Rs 1,01,899 crore of 26 indus tries creating employme nt opportunity to 85,870 people. With this, the st ate so far attracted total investments of Rs 8,08, 899 crore, providing employment opportunity to 7,05,870 lakh people.

Addressing the meeting, the Chief Minister directed the officials to see that all the industries grounded as per schedule. He said 15 industrial zones should be formed for cluster wise industrial development. At the same time officials should focus on utilizing central government incentives to promote industries. He stressed the ne ed for land bank to promote indus-

AP cancels tender process for Polavaram-Banakacherla project DPR

mid fierce back las h from Telangana, spe arheaded by the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BR S), Andhra Pradesh ha s abruptly cancelled th e tender process for the Detailed Project Rep ort (DPR) of the contentious Polavaram-Ba nakacherla link project (PBLP), which was aimed at diverting Godavari waters to Krish-

na basin and beyond. Irrigation officials confirmed on Friday that AP had withdrawn the tender notice issu ed on October 11 after reviewing technical and financial parameters. The tender, which invited consultancy services for preparing the DPR, was expected to pave the way for designing the Banakac harla link project aime d at transf erring over 200 TMC of what was claimed as unutilised flood flows in Godavari to Krishna basin enhancing irrigation coverage in Rayalaseema. Sources indicated

that the decision to can cel stemmed from the need to re-evaluate the project scope as its integration with the mai n Polavaram dam system was strongly opposed by Telangana.

The government of AP reportedly intends to adopt a more comprehensive approach to address the issues ra ised by other riparian States and to optimise interlinkages between the Banakacharla existing canal networks, officials claimed.

A revised notification is likely to be issued after the updated feasibility study is com pleted. The expert Appraisal Committee (EA C) of the Central Water Commission had denied environmental clearance to the Polavaram-Banakacherla Link Project, returning the proposal to Andhra Pradesh for revision. The EAC cited objections that the project potentially violates the 1980 Godavari Water Di sputes Tribunal (GW DT) award and raises unresolved submerge nce concerns for neighbouring States, specifically Odisha and Chha ttisgarh. Additionally, the panel advised And hra Pradesh to first obtain a complete study on Godavari surplus waters from the CWC before reapplying.

The proposed project involves a multi-stage infrastructure networ k spanning about 416 km, including canal up gradation to increase the capacity of the Polavaram Right Main Canal from 17,500 cuse cs to 38,000 cusecs, and the Thatipudi Lift Canal from 1,400 cusec s to 10,000 cusecs besid es construction of a ne w reservoir at Bollapalli for water storage.

The project is estimated to cost Rs.81,900 crore, but has sparked a major inter-state dispute, primarily with Telangana. Telangana contended that it would violate the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act, 2014, and ignore the Godavari Water Disputes Tribunal's allocation of 968 TMC to Telangana (out of 1,486 TMC total), potentially depleting its reservoirs and irrigation schemes.

Kurnool bus fire tragedy: Owner of private travel agency arrested

wo weeks after 19 passengers of a bus were charred to dea th near, the police on Friday arrested the owner of the private tra vel agency. Vemuri Vinod Kumar, owner of V Kaveri Travels, was arrested and produced before a court, which remanded him to judicial

Vinod Kumar is named as accused number two in the First Information Report (FIR). Bus driver Mirivala Lakshmajah.



who is accused number one, is already in judicial custody. They were book ed under Bharat Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) Sections 125(a) and 106(1) for causing death by rash or neg-

The bus was operating between Telangana and Karnataka through An dhra Pradesh, but was registered in Daman and Diu in 2018 and re-registered in Odisha this year. The bus travel operator had also altered the bus meant for seating to a sleeper coach in alleged violation of rules.

The bus, which was carrying 46 people, including two drivers, and was on its way to Bengaluru from Hyderabad. met with the ghastly accident near Chinnatekur village on the outskirts of Kurnool early morning of October 24.



While 19 passengers, including two children, were charred to death, 27 passengers, including both drivers, escaped by breaking glass windows.

Police investigation revealed that the bus ran over a motorcycle lying on the road after the rider rammed it into the ro

Police concluded that the bike rider, B Shiva Shankar (22), died after hitting the divider, while his friend Erriswamy alias Nani, who was riding pillion and escaped with minor injuries, fled the scene in panic after watching the bus in flames. After establishing the presence of a second person and identifying him with CCTV footage recorded at a petrol pump a few minutes

police arrested Erriswamy from his native village, Tuggali, in Kurnool district, and he revealed the cause of the accid ent. Shiva Shankar, who was riding the bike and was drunk, died on the spot after the two-wheeler skidded and rammed into the road divider. Erriswamy told the police that he shifted Shiva Kumar to the roadside and was about to move the bike lying in the middle of the road when the speeding bus hit the bike and dragged it some distance. As the fire engulfed the bus, he panicked and fled the scene.

At the heart of the project lies integration: a 4 GW TOPCon solar cell facility co-located with a 5 GW silicon ingot and wafer plant, ensuring full backward integration and reduced cost-toserve. This co-location strengthens process efficiency, quality control, and export competitiveness while complementing Premier Energies'

existing module capac ities. The project is expected to create around 3,500 direct jobs, with significant indirect employment across ancillaries, MSMEs, logistics, and services. Accompanied by irrigation experts, Ramanaidu inspected the feeder canal that was recently damaged by the Montha cyclone. He instructed officials to expedite the dewatering operations in the twin tunnels and emphasized the need to enhance the canal's structural resilience. "Considering the possibility of future floo ds, the Center for Irrigation Design must ap-



prove new CC wall lining plans for the feeder

canal," he said. The minister also co nvened a review meeting with department officials and agency representatives to assess the progress of the pending works. He revealed that the rehabilitation of displaced families under the project remained incomplete, with compensation payments of over Rs. 900 crore yet to be disbursed. "Jagan's statement that he completed Veligonda is nothing short of the eighth wonder of the world," he remarked sarcastically. Ramanaidu asserted that the revival of the halted works began only after the coalition government led by Chief Minister N. Cha ndrababu Naidu assumed office. Hands Off the Clues, Until the Blues Arrive

TPN BUREAU | NOV 7 Amaravathi: Public Ur ged Not to Disturb Crim e Scenes After Home BurglariesIncidents of house burglaries often cause panic and anxiety among victims, leading them to search frantically through cupboa rds, lockers, and furnitu re to check what has been stolen. However. police caution that such actions can destroy vital evidence and make it difficult to identify the actual culprits.

According to officials. whether a theft occurs at a residence, bank, or business establishment, the crime scene must remain untouched until the police complete their inspection. The first responding officers and forensic teams use fingerprint scanners and other scientific tools to collect clues. These fingerprints are cross-verified with existing criminal databases to detect if known offenders are involved. If family members or residents move around the premises before evidence is gathered, their own fingerprints or footprints may replace those of the thieves, delaying the investigation process.



Police also advise citizens to preserve purch ase bills and photographs of gold orname nts and valuable items. D etails such as hallma rk certification, weight, carat, and serial numbers should be kept safely. These records play a crucial role in recovery operations. Often, stolen jewelry is sold or pledg ed in shops. Hence, business owners are urged to

remain alert and verify the authenticity of sellers

Details of stolen items should be circulated th rough bullion merchan ts' WhatsApp groups and trade associations so that merchants can quickly report any suspicious transactions to the police. In addition, homeowners are encouraged to check CCTV footage from their homes and surrounding areas immediately after a burglary and hand it over to the investigators. Insurance claims should be filed promptly if theft protection policies are in place. Installing motion-detection security cameras can also be an effective preventive step.

Such systems, priced between Rs. 5,000 and Rs. 10,000, can alert homeowners by sending an

instant message with the intruder's photo to their mobile phones, helping authorities respond faster. Conventional CCTV cameras, in contrast, cannot provide real-time alerts.Police stress that maintaining the integrity of the crime scene and adopting preventive technologies are essential for speedy detection and recovery in theft cases.

Fatal Road Accident Near Chinna Aitamvalasa: Woman **Killed, Husband Injured**

VIJAYAWADA: A tragic road accident occur red near Chinna Aitamvalasa village under Gadabavalasa panchayat in Garividi mandal on Friday evening, resulting in the death of a woman and serious injuries to her husband. The incident took place when an RTC bus collided with a motorcycle on which the couple was traveling.

According to police reports, the deceased has been identified as Srilatha, a resident of Perumali village in Therlam mandal, Vizianagaram district. She was traveling with her husband, Koraganji Sangam Naidu, on a two-wheeler towards Cheepurupalli. While they were passing near Chinna Aitamvalasa village, an RTC bus heading from Bondapalli towards Merakamudidam allegedly hit their motorcycle.

The sudden collision



threw both of them onto the road. Srilatha reportedly died on the spot due to severe injuries, while her husband sustained multiple fractures and serious wounds.On receiving information, Garividi Sub-Inspector Lokeshwar Rao and his team rushed to the spot. Police carried out a preliminary investigation and shifted the injured man to a nearby hospital for treatment.

The body of Srilatha was later sent for postmortem examination. Traffic on the route was briefly disrupted following the accident, as locals gathered in large numbers expressing shock over the tragic incident. The damaged motorcycle and bus were removed to clear the road. The Garividi police have registered a case and initiated an inquiry into the circumstances leading to the accident.

Investigators are examining whether the cause was overspeeding or negligence on the part of the bus driver. Authorities urged motorists to exercise caution, especially on rural roads prone to such collisions.

Minor Girl Delivers Baby at Kadapa **Hostel; Officials Under Scrutiny**

KADAPA: A shocking incident has come to light in Kadapa city, where a 17-year-old girl staying at a Tribal Wel-fare Girls' Hostel gave birth to a baby girl. The authorities allegedly failed to notice her pregnancy even though she had been living in the hostel throughout the nine months. The girl, a student of a nearby vocational junior college, had reportedly stopped attending classes regularly in recent months.

On Wednesday night, she experienced labor pains and went alone to RIMS Hospital, where doctors conducted a normal delivery. Tribal Welfare Department officials reached the hospital after learning of the incident, and her parents arrived later that night. Preliminary informa-



tion suggests that the girl was in close contact with a senior student from her college, who is suspected to be responsible for the pregnancy. Department officials, including ST Corporation in-charge ED and Social Welfare DD Saraswathi, have stated that the matter has been reported to the District Collector. An inquiry is underway to determine whether hostel staff attempted to suppress information

about the girl's condition. RIMS outpost police have also registered a case. In a separate but related incident in Tirupati, a hostel watchman, K. Harigopal, was arrested for showing obscene videos to children and engaging in inappropriate behavior at a Social Welfare Integrated Hostel in Chennareddy Colony.

Police registered cases under the POCSO and SC/ST Atrocities Acts and remanded him to cus-

tody. District Collector Venkateshwar expressed anger over the misconduct, ordering Harigopal's dismissal and suspending Welfare Officer Munishankar. An explanation notice was also issued to Assistant Welfare Officer Shyamsundar Rao.These back-to-back incidents have raised serious questions about surveillance, safety, and accountability in government welfare hostels across Andhra Pradesh.

Supreme Court AGR Order Raises Telecom Policy Questions

recent order allowing the Union government to reexamine Vodafone Idea's (Vi) adjusted gross revenue (AGR) dues up to FY 2016-17 has triggered fresh debates over the future of India's telecom sector. The November 3 ruling broadened the scope of relief from an earlier October 27 order, which focused only on an additional demand of Rs 9,450 crore, potentially impacting Vi's total AGR liability of Rs 83,400

The government,

which holds a 49% stake in Vi. now faces critical questions. Will it waive part of Vi's AGR dues in public interest to stabilize the struggling telco? Could it take on additional equity, effectively becoming the majority owner in the joint venture between the Aditya Birla Group and UKbased Vodafone? The ruling also raises questions about handling Bharti Airtel's AGR dues of around Rs 38,604 crore, while Reliance Jio, which began operations in Sep-



tember 2016, has no pending dues.

Any government intervention to relieve Vi could spark concerns

over market competitiveness. Private players currently dominate over 92% of the telecom market, with public sector telcos Bharat Sanchar Nigam Ltd (BSNL) and Mahanagar Telephone Nigam Ltd (MTNL) holding just 8%. Some experts argue that state-run telcos could provide sufficient bandwidth to prevent a duopoly, similar to other

consumer sectors like aviation, which already show near-duopoly conditions.

The potential level-

playing field issue may also extend beyond telecom. Relief to Vi but not Airtel could prompt other players to demand parity in areas like satellite broadband, where spectrum allocation is still under discussion. Legacy telecom operators, having invested heavily in 3G, 4G, and 5G, could contest competition from newcomers like Starlink and Project Kuiper, raising broader regulatory questions.

The telecom scenario mirrors challenges in ecommerce, where Indian companies can run inventory-led models, but foreign players are limited to marketplace formats—a distinction under review in trade discussions with the United States.

Experts suggest a uniform regulatory framework across sectors is essential to avoid disputes over fairness. The Supreme Court's ruling should be seen as enabling the government to rationalize taxes and duties, rather than mandating a write-off, and could serve as an opportunity to strengthen the telecom sector's financial and operational health in the long term.

Zohran Mamdani's Victory Sparks Debate Among Indians



Zohran Mamdani's landslide win in New York City has not only marked a milestone for Indian-origin politicians abroad but also triggered intense debate among Indians over his political stance and identity. While Indian-origin successes are often embraced enthusiastically, Mamdani's politics and outspoken criticism of Prime Minister Narendra Modi have made reactions more complex.

A coalition of Indian-American and Hindu diaspora groups openly criticized Mam-

dani in an October 10 letter, accusing him of promoting "bigotry and bias" against Hindus. They described his remarks as "divisive, discriminatory and unbecoming of a leader seeking to lead such a diverse city." His statements about Modi's alleged involvement in the Gujarat riots, including claims about the Muslim population in the state, were widely circulated and condemned in Indian circles. Congress leader Abhishek Manu Singhvi tweeted that Mamdani's remarks were

damaging to India's image, suggesting that Pakistan benefited from his rhetoric.

BJP Rajya Sabha MP Rekha Sharma even supported former US President Donald Trump's cautionary stance on Mamdani, emphasizing that Indian origin alone does not guarantee alignment with India's interests. Such reactions reflect a hesitant embrace of Mamdani, contrasting with typical Indian pride in diaspora achievements.

Yet, other observers and public figures have praised

Mamdani's politics. Human rights activist Harsh Mander noted that the Indian National Congress could learn from his inclusive political vision. Chennai-born consultant Ramya highlighted Mamdani's connection to the Indian Ocean world, rooted in multiculturalism, global yet familiar, and far from conventional diaspora success narratives. Congress leader Shashi Tharoor also congratulated Mamdani and his mother, filmmaker Mira Nair, calling the victory "wonderfully apt," echoing Mamdani's speech quoting Nehru on stepping from the old to the new

from the old to the new.

Mamdani represents a political vocabulary India has largely lost: cooperative economics, secular belonging, pride in diversity, working-class dignity, and cultural confidence without chauvinism. His unapologetic foregrounding of Muslim identity and critique of big capital contrasts sharply with India's current political climate, where space for dissent and inclusive political charity in the company of the compan

tics is shrinking.
For many Indians, Mamdani is not merely a symbol of diaspora pride but a mirror of India's suppressed political imagination, reminding them of values and debates that India once nurtured but has grown weary of. His victory, therefore, is a story of diaspora politics intertwined with India's evolving political consciousness.

India's Services Exports Set to Cross \$400 Billion

India's services exports are on track to surpass the \$400-billion mark for the first time ever, a milestone that signals the growing significance of the sector in the country's economic land-scape. On a Trailing Twelve Months (TTM) basis, which measures exports over the past 12 months, India had already crossed this threshold by August 2025.

While merchandise exports like smartphones and pharmaceuticals often dominate headlines, services exports have quietly become a major driver of India's economic progress. In the financial year 2024-25, India exported services worth \$387.54 billion, against imports of \$198.14 billion, generating a services trade surplus of \$189.40 billion, an all-time high. This surplus offset nearly two-thirds of India's merchandise trade deficit, which stood at \$283.81 billion. bringing the overall trade deficit down to \$94.41

The growth in services exports is not a one-year phenomenon. Over the past decade, India's services surplus has risen steadily—from around \$51 billion in 2011–12 to nearly \$190 billion now. The evolution reflects a shift from traditional IT and ITenabled services to high-value offerings, including R&D, analytics, cybersecurity, design, and professional services such as consulting, legal support, and accounting.



Global Capability Centres (GCCs) of multinational corporations have been pivotal in this transformation, moving India's exports up the value chain from labor-intensive services to expertise-driven solutions.

The persistent goods trade deficit, by contrast, remains structural, driven by heavy imports of crude oil, LNG. coal, gold, and capital goods. While government initiatives like production-linked incentives (PLI) aim to boost domestic manufacturing, any reduction in import dependence is expected to be gradual. Without the services surplus, India's trade deficit would hover around \$280–300 billion, straining the current account and putting pressure on the rupee. The services sector thus acts as a macrostabiliser, cushioning the economy from external shocks.

Looking ahead, India's services exports face potential challenges from international policy shifts. The proposed U.S. HIRE Act, which imposes a 25% tax on overseas service delivery, could alter outsourcing economics and affect Indian IT and GCC operations. Indian firms may need to reassess their global strategies depending on the final legislation.

Overall, India's services exports highlight the country's transition toward high-value knowledge work, reinforcing macroeconomic stability and gradually reshaping the trade landscape, even as merchandise imports continue to reflect structural dependencies.

Bangladesh Banking Crisis Deepens Amid Rising Bad Loans

Bangladesh, once celebrated as one of Asia's fastest-growing economies, is now grappling with a deepening banking crisis. Persistent inflation, tight liquidity, weak governance, and escalating non-performing loans (NPLs) are weighing heavily on the nation's economy, analysts say. Experts attribute the financial strain to mismanaged loans during Sheikh Hasina's tenure and poor oversight under economist Mohammad Yunus's ear-

According to the Asian Development Bank's (ADB) 2025 report on Nonperforming Loans in Asia, by December 2024, Bangladesh had the region's weakest banking system, with 20.2 percent

of total loans—Tk 3,45,765 crore-classified as nonperforming. By June 2025, the NPL ratio surged to 27.09 percent (Tk 5,30,428 crore), marking a 28 percent year-on-year increase in distressed assets, valued at \$20.27 billion. In comparison, India's NPL ratio stood at 2.5 percent, Pakistan at 6.3 percent, and Sri Lanka recorded a decline, highlighting Bangladesh's uniquely fragile position.

The crisis stems from a spiraling growth of bad loans, which rose from Tk 22,481 crore in 2009 to Tk 2,11,000 crore by June 2024, just before the July uprising that toppled the Hasina government. Economists point to widespread misuse of the



banking system, with politicians and business elites treating banks as "personal wallets." Unscrupulous borrowers allegedly overstated collateral values—sometimes inflating Tk 10 crore properties to Tk 500 crore—to secure massive loans, much of which was siphoned abroad.

"Now, when the central bank tries to recover these loans, they find the assets are worthless. The money has left the country, making recovery extremely difficult," said Mustafizur Rahman, Distinguished Fellow at the Centre for Policy Dialogue (CPD). Despite the severity of the crisis, Rahman stressed that the financial system remains "in bad shape, but not

collapsed."

Bangladesh's economic growth has also slowed, with real GDP growth estimated at 4 percent in FY25, down from 4.2 percent in FY24. High inflation, heightened vulnerabilities in the banking sector, and slowed investment growth underscore the challenges the country faces in sustaining its economic momentum.

While the nation's rise from a "basket case" to a regional growth story over the past decade is undeniable, the fragility of its banking system now threatens to undermine these gains, with experts calling for urgent reforms, stronger governance, and tighter oversight to restore stability and investor confidence.







People Of Bihar Going To Bless BJP-Led NDA: PM Modi On 64.66% Voter Turnout

Prime Minister Narendra Modi praised the people of Bihar for their record voter turnout in the first phase of polling on November 6, calling it a reflection of growing confidence in the NDA government at both the Centre and the state.

Addressing a large gathering in Aurangabad, PM Modi said nearly 65 per cent of voters participated in the first phase, marking the highest polling percentage in Bihar since Independence. He highlighted the enthusiasm of youth, farmers, and women, describing it as a blessing for the BJP-led NDA.

Recalling the region's past struggles with Naxal violence, Modi said Aurangabad had long been a

victim of Red terror during previous RJD-Congress rule. He credited Nitish Kumar's government and subsequent BJP-led central initiatives for restoring safety and securi-

The Prime Minister also underscored NDA's track record of fulfilling poll promises, citing landmark achievements such as the construction of the Ram Mandir, abrogation of Article 370, and implementation of One Rank, One Pension for armed forces. He evoked nationalistic sentiments by recalling Bihar as the place where he pledged action against the Pahalgam terror attack perpetrators, emphasizing that the armed forces had delivered justice.

Delhi Assembly Panel Summons Kejriwal, Sisodia Over'Phansi Ghar'

The controversy over Delhi Assembly's so-called 'Phansi Ghar' has escalated, with the Committee of Privileges summoning former Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, former Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia, former Speaker Ram Niwas Goel, and former Deputy Speaker Rakhi Birla for questioning. The committee, led by BJP MLA Pradyumn Singh Rajput, will meet on November 13 to examine the authenticity of the structure inaugurated by the AAP government in 2022

The BJP has labelled the chamber a "fabricated site", accusing the previous regime of distorting history and misusing public funds. During a September Assembly session, Speaker Vijender Gupta claimed the AAP spent ₹1 crore renovating the site to resemble a gallows, installing murals of freedom fighters, iron bars, and nooses. Chief Minister Re-



kha Gupta called it a "gross distortion of history" and directed officials to file an FIR over the alleged misuse of funds.

The AAP, however, accused the BJP of politicising the issue, calling the panel summons legally unsustainable. "Elections are long over; it's time for governance, not politics," the party stated. AAP leaders also cited Supreme Court rulings limiting successor assemblies from acting on previous term matters.

The controversy stems from a tunnel discovered beneath the Assembly building in 2016, a Britishera structure from 1912. The AAP later renovated it as a 'Phansi Ghar' showcasing British-era shackles, a purported noose, and artefacts linked to freedom fighters. The inauguration, led by Kejriwal, was held alongside a Covid warriors memorial.

AAP MLA Sanjeev Jha defended the project, asserting the site's historical significance and calling for Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) verification. while warning against attempts to "whitewash British tyranny." Historians remain divided on the chamber's original purpose, with some maps indicating a double-storev structure consistent with a hanging chamber.

The upcoming Assembly panel meeting is expected to deepen the political debate over history, heritage, and governance

ED Arrests Third Person in Reliance Power Fake Bank Guarantee Case

torate (ED) has made its third arrest in the ongoing money-laundering investigation linked to fake bank guarantees (BGs) submitted by a Reliance Power Ltd subsidiary to the Solar Energy Corporation of India Ltd (SECI).

Amar Nath Dutta, a Kolkata-based consultant in trade financing, was taken into custody under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), 2002. Dutta is accused of playing an active role alongside Ashok Kumar Pal, the former CFO of Reliance Power, and Partha Sarthi Biswal, managing director of a shell company, in providing forged BGs worth over Rs 68 crore, fake endorsements, and SFMS confirmations to SECI.

Dutta was produced before an additional sessions judge at Patiala House Courts on November 6 and sent to four days' ED custody until November 10.

The ED initiated its probe based on three FIRs, including one filed by SECI with the Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of Delhi Police. Investigators found that SECI suffered losses exceeding Rs 100 crore due to the fraudu-

lent submissions. The forged BGs included spoofed SBI email endorsements and manipulated domains of other major banks, such as Indiabank.in, lndusindbank. in, and pnblndia.in, designed to mislead SECI into accepting the fake guarantees.

The ongoing investigation is examining the enduse of funds, tracing assets acquired from the proceeds of crime, and uncovering the wider conspiracy and roles of additional individuals and entities involved.

This case follows the earlier arrests of Ashok Kumar Pal on October 11 and Partha Sarthi Biswal, signaling the ED's focus on dismantling complex financial frauds involving major corporate entities. Reliance Power, part of Anil Ambani's group, is at the center of this highprofile investigation, which highlights the continued scrutiny of corporate financial malpractice

Indian Envoy, U.S. Diplomat Discuss Bilateral

India's Ambassador to the United States, Vinay Mohan Kwatra, met senior U.S. diplomat Paul Kapur on Thursday to discuss "common interests" and ways to strengthen bilateral relations. This marked their second meeting in a week, reflecting growing engagement between the two countries.

PoK Erupts as Gen Z Protests **Education Policies**

Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir (PoK) has erupted in unrest as Gen Z students take to the streets to protest the Shehbaz Sharif-led government's education policies. The protests, initially peaceful, were sparked by rising university fees and inconsistencies in exam results following the introduction of a new digital assessment system at the matriculation and intermediate levels.

The movement began earlier this month at Muzaffarabad's University of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (UAJK), where students voiced concerns over unfair grading, delayed results, and the financial burden of steep fee hikes. Demonstrators demanded reforms in the exam process and greater transparency in the education system.

Tensions escalated when a man reportedly opened fire on the students, injuring at least one protester. This incident pushed the demonstrations into a more volatile phase, with security forces deployed to contain the crowds. Eyewitnesses report clashes between students and police in several areas of Muzaffarabad, with tear gas and baton charges used to

disperse protesters. This unrest is the second major wave in PoK in recent months, following earlier demonstrations over economic grievances, including calls for tax relief, cheaper electricity, and accelerated completion of stalled development projects. Analysts note that the current protests bear similarities to youthled movements in Nepal, where students rallied against corruption and lack of opportunities after government-imposed social

media restrictions. Student leaders have called for a dialogue with the government to address their concerns, warning that continued neglect could worsen unrest. Parents and civil society groups have expressed support for the students, urging authorities to implement reforms while ensuring public safety.

As PoK grapples with this surge of Gen Z activism, the protests underscore growing discontent among young citizens over education, economic issues, and governance, signaling a potential shift in how the region's youth engage with political and social

Sheikh Hasina Admits Security Mistakes During Uprising

Fifteen months after fleeing Dhaka amid widespread unrest, former Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has acknowledged that "mistakes were certainly made" by security forces during last year's student-led uprising. In an exclusive written interview with The Hindu, Hasina reflected on the chaotic events of August 2024, when violent protests forced her to leave the country.

Hasina described the situation as rapidly evolving and disordered, saying security personnel faced "fastchanging and violent circumstances." She clarified that while some mistakes occurred at the operational level, senior government officials acted in good faith, making decisions aimed at mini-

mizing loss of life. The former Prime Minister also expressed doubts over Bangladesh's upcoming elections, scheduled for February 2026. She stated that even if the polls go ahead, their results would not be recognised as legitimate, noting that her party, the Awami League, remains banned. Despite her skepticism, Hasina stressed that she has not called on supporters to boycott the elections and urged caution against further violent uprisings.

Reflecting on her tenure, Hasina highlighted the challenges of managing nationwide



protests and criticized the way the situation escalated despite government efforts to maintain order. She emphasized the need for political dialogue and reforms to restore stability and public trust in the country's institutions.

Observers say Hasina's statements mark a rare admission of operational shortcomings by the former leadership, while maintaining that the overall government response was proportionate. Analysts suggest her comments could influence the political discourse ahead of Bangladesh's February elections, as the nation remains deeply divided over governance and demo-

cratic legitimacy. As the country approaches the 2026 polls, questions about election credibility, public safety, and political reconciliation remain central to Bangladesh's fragile political landscape. As the situation unfolds, the international community will be closely watching Moscow's response to U.S. policy signals. Putin's order for contingency planning signals that Russia intends to remain strategically vigilant while leaving the door open for future actions depending on U.S. decisions.

'PM Modi a great man': Trump says he 'could'visit India next year

US President Donald Trump has indicated that he could visit India next year, praising Prime Minister Narendra Modi as a "great man" and noting that talks and trade discussions between the two countries are "going good." Speaking at the White House, Trump highlighted Modi's recent decision to reduce oil imports from Russia as a positive step in bilateral cooperation.

Trump recalled his previous visit to India, describing it as "a great trip" and emphasizing his personal rapport with Modi. "He's a friend of mine, and we speak... He wants me to go there. We'll figure that out. I'll go," Trump said when asked about a potential trip in 2026.

The announcement comes ahead of the Quad summit in New Delhi, where India will host leaders from Australia, Japan, and the United States.



While the exact dates for the summit are yet to be announced, Trump's comments signal ongoing en-

gagement between Washington and New Delhi on strategic and trade

In his remarks, Trump also revisited his previous claims about mediating conflicts, including a sup-

frontation in May, which he said he resolved using trade tariffs. "If you take a

look at India and Pakistan... they were shooting each other. I said, 'Listen, if you guys are going to fight, I'm gonna put tariffs on you.' Within 24 hours, I settled the war," he claimed, emphasizing tariffs as a form of "national defense.

Trump's comments underscore his continued focus on trade-driven diplomacy and the importance he places on personal relationships with global leaders. Analysts note that a potential visit to India would reinforce the strategic partnership between the two countries while highlighting ongoing discussions on trade, energy, and regional security.

With US-India relations increasingly centered on economic cooperation and Indo-Pacific security, a Trump visit in 2026 could be a significant event ahead of the next Quad summit and in the context of global geopolitical developments.

Tesla Shareholders Approve Elon Musk's \$1 **Trillion Pay Package**

Tesla shareholders have approved a historic stockbased compensation plan for CEO Elon Musk, which could make him the world's first trillionaire if the electric vehicle giant meets ambitious growth targets. "I super appreciate it," Musk told shareholders, expressing gratitude to the board and investors as the results were announced to cheers and chants. Unlike most CEOs, Musk does not take a salary; his earnings come entirely through stock options. Under the new plan, he could receive up to 423.7 million Tesla shares over the next decade, with a potential value of around \$1 trillion if Tesla's market capitalization reaches \$8.5 trillion. Major Carmakers Slash Prices Ahead of Navaratri, **GST Cut Benefits Customers**

Buyers are in for a bonanza as leading automakers Maruti Suzuki, Tata Motors, Hyundai Motor India, and luxury carmakers like Mercedes-Benz and BMW announce significant price cuts effective from September 22, coinciding with the start of the auspicious Navaratri period. Two-wheeler makers are also joining the trend, passing on GST benefits to customers.

Maruti Suzuki India, the country's largest carmaker, has reduced vehicle prices by up to ₹1.29 lakh. Wholesale Price Inflation at Two-Year



India's factory gate inflation, measured by the Wholesale Price Index (WPI), stood at a two-year low of -0.58% in July, continuing the deflationary trend observed in June. Analysts attribute the recent change in the wholesale price trajectory to an upswing in food prices after months of decline.

Paras Jasrai, Associate Director at India Ratings and Research, noted that food prices played a significant role in reversing the deflationary trend. In August 2025, food prices rose 0.2% compared with the same month last year, while the decline in vegetable prices slowed to 14.2% yearon-year—the slowest pace in six months. Edible oils recorded a sharp increase of 22.9% in August, marking the highest surge in three months.

Jewellery prices also climbed significantly, rising 32.6% year-onyear in August, contributing to a rise in core inflation, which reached a five-month high of 1.6%. Experts expect core inflation to remain around 1.8% through the end of 2025 due to a low base effect, keeping overall price pressures in check.

Food items accounted for 73 basis points of the 110 basis points uptick in the headline WPI between July and August, highlighting the dominant role of essential commodities in inflation trends. Nonfood manufactured items, which make up the core WPI, added 27 basis points to the headline print, according to Rahul Agrawal, Senior Economist at ICRA.

While deflationary pressures have eased, the rise in essential commodity prices indicates that inflation dynamics remain sensitive to changes in food and commodity markets. Policymakers and analysts will continue to monitor WPI and core inflation trends closely as India navigates supply-side pressures and prepares for the upcoming festive season, where consumer demand is expected

India's Forex Reserves Cross USD 700 Billion, Third Weekly Rise in a Row

India's foreign exchange reserves rose by USD 4.698 billion in the week ending September 12, reaching USD 702.966 billion, according to the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) latest 'Weekly Statistical Supplement.' This marks the third consecutive week of gains and sees the much-anticipated USD 700 billion milestone crossed.

The largest component of the reserves, India's foreign currency assets (FCA), increased by USD 2.537 billion to USD 587.014 billion. Gold reserves also contributed to the rise, climbing USD 2.12 billion to reach USD 92,419 billion.

RBI Governor Sanjay Malhotra, following the latest monetary policy review, emphasized that India's foreign exchange reserves are sufficient to cover approximately 11 months of the country's imports. This provides a strong buffer to manage external shocks and sup-



port the stability of the Indian rupee.



World's Largest Spider Web Found in Romanian Cave



Scientists have discovered what may be the world's largest spider web in a sulfur-rich cave near the Greece-Albania border, a find that has both amazed and unnerved arachnophobes worldwide. The discovery, documented in the journal Subterranean Biology, features a colossal web housing approximately 111,000 spiders from two rival species coexisting peacefully.

According to re-searchers, the web stretches along the walls of a narrow, lowroofed tunnel deep inside the cave, in a permanently dark zone near the cavern's mouth. The spiders have built thousands of interconnected funnel webs, forming a sprawling colony that scientists describe as a "silky tent city."

A video accompanying the study shows a researcher gently touching the web, revealing its dense struc-ture as the strands ripple under the glow of his headlamp. The sheer scale of the web, combined with the high number of arachnids living in close proximity, has drawn widespread attention

Experts note that the coexistence of the two rival species is particularly unusual, as such species typically compete aggressively for territory. The stable environment of the cave, with its constant temperature, high humidity, and rich sulfur content, appears to support this rare phenomenon.

"This web is extraordinary not just in size, but in the harmony displayed by the spiders,' said one researcher. "It gives us new insights into arachnid behavior and the ways ecosystems can support unexpected biodiversity."

The Romanian cave web adds to growing evidence that subterranean environments can host complex and previously undocumented communities. Scientists hope further study will shed light on how these spiders cooperate and maintain such an enormous structure without significant conflict.

sume, the DLS method came into effect. India's total proved just beyond Pakistan's par score at that stage, giving the Men in Blue a narrow two-run



With the momentum on her side, Sabalenka broke Gauff early in the second set and never looked back, sealing the match in straight sets. Gauff later acknowledged her missed chances, saying, "I had a lot of opportunities in the first set. It was disappointing not to take them. She raised her level, and I couldn't match it.'
