

Amaravati Set to Attract 50,000 Crore Investments at CII Partnership Summit 2025

VIJAYAWADA: The Andhra Pradesh Capital Region Development Authority (APCRDA) is set to draw investments exceeding 50,000 crore at the CII Partnership Summit 2025 in Visakhapatnam. The proposed investments span key sectors including tourism, hospitality, healthcare, education and infrastructure, marking a major step toward transforming Amaravati into a model of sustainable urban growth and international collaboration.

"Amaravati is not just a city, it is a symbol of development, sustainability, and inclusivity," said K. Kanna Babu, Commissioner, APCRDA. "With new partnerships forming at the CII Summit, the Capital Region will strengthen its position as a leading investment destination in South India."

The APCRDA delegation will highlight the region's investor-friendly environment, single-window clearance system, and plug-and-play infrastructure, showcasing Amaravati's readiness for industrial and service sector expansion.



Several reputed companies have already shown interest in developing premium hotels, convention centres, riverside projects, and wellness resorts along the Krishna River. In healthcare, proposals for multi-specialty hospitals, medical institutions, and tech parks are under consideration. An APCRDA official noted that the 50,000 crore investment target reflects "strong investor confidence in the state's governance and

the potential of Amaravati as a global city." ReNew to Invest US\$ 9.3 Billion (82,000 Crore) in Andhra Pradesh's Green Energy Portfolio

VISAKHAPATNA M: In a major boost to Andhra Pradesh's renewable energy ambitions, ReNew Energy Global Plc, a leading global decarbonisation solutions company, announced a landmark investment of 60,000 crore (US\$6.7 billion) in the state to develop a diversified portfolio of green energy projects.

With this, ReNew's total investment commitment to Andhra Pradesh now stands at 82,000 crore (US\$9.3 billion), including 22,000 crore (US\$2.5 billion) announced in May 2025. These initiatives collectively aim to create a fully integrated clean energy value chain in Andhra Pradesh, advancing both India's and the state's clean energy transition goals.

Speaking at the event, Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu said, "Andhra Pradesh is committed to emerging as a national leader in renewable energy, and partners like ReNew play a crucial role in advancing this vision. ReNew's continued investments reinforce the confidence that global industry leaders have in the state's policies, infrastructure, and talent. This collaboration will accelerate clean energy deployment, attract high-quality jobs, and contribute meaningfully to sustainable and inclusive growth for the people of the state."

Sumanth Sinha, Founder, Chairman, and CEO of ReNew, said the company's expanded footprint in Andhra Pradesh will strengthen India's self-reliance in the renewable energy ecosystem. "ReNew has a long-standing presence in Andhra Pradesh, and with this expansion, we are bringing a fully integrated clean energy val-

ue chain to the state—from wafer to large-scale renewable projects and storage deployment. This will strengthen domestic supply chains, create skilled jobs, and advance India's Aatmanirbhar Bharat vision," he said.

In May 2025, ReNew announced an investment of 22,000 crore (US\$2.5 billion) to establish one of India's largest hybrid renewable energy projects in Anantapur district. The 2.8 GW project, comprising 1.8 GW solar and 1 GW wind capacity with a 2 GWh battery energy storage system, is among the largest renewable installations at a single location in the country. ReNew currently operates 717 MW of wind capacity and 60 MW of solar capacity across ten sites in Andhra Pradesh. With the new projects, the company will generate over 10,000 direct and indirect employment opportunities, further propelling the state's clean energy mission.

Andhra Pradesh has set ambitious targets of developing 78.5 GW of solar, 35 GW of wind, and 25 GWh of battery storage capacity. The partnership with ReNew marks a significant stride toward positioning the state as a national leader in green energy and sustainable industrial growth.

AP, A Gateway to India's Market, Says CM Chandrababu Naidu at India-Europe Business Round table

VISAKHAPATNA M: Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu reaffirmed the state's position as India's premier investment destination, calling it the "Gateway for India's Market" and a region "gifted with abundant opportunities for global investments." He was speaking as the Chief Guest at the CII India-Europe Business Partnership Roundtable, held as part of the 30th CII Partnership Summit 2025 in Visakhapatnam.

Praising Visakhapatnam as one of India's most beautiful, green, and safest cities, the Chief Minister said it is poised to emerge as a global IT and innovation hub. Highlighting a major upcoming project, he said Google will establish a US\$15 billion AI Data Centre in Visakhapatnam, supported by the laying of subsea cables connecting Singapore, which will significantly boost global connectivity and digital infrastructure.

The Chief Minister said Andhra Pradesh is promoting industries in a big way under a "Speed of Doing Business" model, ensuring quick clearances for investors within 45 days. Citing recent examples, he mentioned that Premier Energy received approvals within 45 days after a single phone call, and Reliance obtained clearances within a month to set up the world's second-largest brewery, which will begin production in two years.



AP Signs MoUs Worth 2.94 Lakh Crore in Renewable Energy Sector at CII Partnership Summit 2025

VISAKHAPATNA M: In a major boost to India's green energy transition, the Government of Andhra Pradesh has signed and exchanged Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) and Government Orders (GOs) worth 2.94 lakh crore in the renewable energy sector. The landmark agreements were formalized on the first day of the CII Partnership Summit 2025, held in Visakhapatnam, in the presence of Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu.

Announcing the details, Chief Secretary GoAP, K. Vijayanand, said these MoUs mark a record level of investment in clean energy projects, spanning pumped hydro storage, green hydrogen, solar, wind, biofuels, and energy storage. Together, they are expected to generate over 69,800 employment opportunities across multiple districts.

"These investments reflect Andhra Pradesh's emergence as a national leader in renewable energy and our

firm commitment to accelerate India's clean energy mission through strategic partnerships and rapid implementation," said the Chief Secretary.

Prominent companies participating in these MoUs include Navayuga Engineering Company Ltd., Chinta Green Energy Pvt. Ltd., ABC Cleantech (Evren) & Axis Energy Ventures, ReNew Group, Four Square Green Energy Pvt. Ltd., Indosol Solar Pvt. Ltd., and Hero Future Energies Pvt. Ltd. The agreements were exchanged between NRED-CAP, the Energy Department, and the respective investors, in the presence of Energy Minister Sri Gottipati Ravikumar; Chief Secretary Sri KVijayanand, and NR EDCAP VC & MD Sri M. Ka malakar Babu.

During the summit, the Visakhapatnam Economic Region (VER) Growth Hub Plan was also unveiled, positioning the region as a key driver of Andhra Pradesh's economic transformation. The Chief Secretary said that under the visionary leadership of Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu, the State has set an ambitious goal to become a USD 2.4 trillion economy by 2047.

Covering nine coastal districts and nearly 38,000 sq. km, the VER will serve as the state's economic powerhouse. The VER Master Plan focuses on seven key growth drivers—industry, logistics, services, urban development, clean energy, tourism, and innovation—and aims to ensure spatially balanced, inclusive growth across all districts. Highlighting the regional potential, Vijayanand said Visakhapatnam and Vizianagaram will emerge as knowledge and service hubs, while Anakapalli, Kakinada, and Sri-kakulam will evolve as major manufacturing and logistics corridors driven by port-led industrialization. The East Godavari, Alluri Sitharama Raju, Parvathipuram Manyam, and BR Ambadkar Konaseema districts will continue to lead the agri-economy through food processing and technological innovation.

"As we launch this master plan today, we reaffirm our collective commitment to building a Swarna Andhra Pradesh—prosperous, inclusive, and sustainable—contribution meaningfully to a Visit Bharat by 2047," the Chief Secretary said.

98 MoUs to Boost Andhra Pradesh's Tourism Sector

VISAKHAPATNAM: Andhra Pradesh Minister for Tourism, Culture and Cinematography, Kandula Durgesh, announced that the state is paving the way for a new era in tourism by attracting major investments and expanding opportunities across various segments. TTD to Launch AI Chatbot Services for Devotees; AWS to Provide Technology Support

Tirumala: The Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD) is taking forward several digital initiatives to enhance the experience of devotees visiting the sacred shrine of Lord Venkateswara. As part of its modernization drive, TTD has inaugurated an advanced Integrated Command and Control Center at Vaikuntham Queue Complex to improve crowd and service management. In a major step toward offering tech-enabled services, the TTD Board of Trustees has recently approved the introduction of Artificial Intelligence (AI)-based chatbot services.

Following the approval, the temple ad-

ministration invited tenders from reputed global technology providers to develop and operate the system. Leading firms such as Amazon Web Services (AWS) and Google Cloud participated in the bidding process. Among these, AWS was selected to provide the chatbot services at a cost of Rs. 50 lakh per annum, offering a cost-effective yet highly capable solution.

The AI chatbot is expected to become operational soon, providing devotees with instant responses to queries related to online darshan bookings, seva schedules, accommodation, donations, and other temple-related services. The system will allow devotees to

receive real-time information and even submit feedback or complaints directly through the chatbot interface. Notably, the service will support around 13 Indian languages, ensuring accessibility for devotees across the country.

Women's Commission Chair asserts strict action against insults to women

Penugonda (West Godavari): Andhra Pradesh State Women's Commission Chairperson Dr. Rayapati Shailaja asserted that the Commission will not tolerate any form of behavior that demeans or disrespects women, stating that even verbal insults constitute a form of harassment. Dr. Shailaja made these remarks during her visit to the Sri Vasavi Kanya Parameswari Temple in Penugonda on Thursday. After offering special prayers to Goddess Vasavi, she held an exclusive meeting with local women devotees who brought to her attention several incidents of misconduct within the temple premises. The devotees complained that a pri-



ivate individual named Ganesh, a relative of a senior temple employee, had been performing priestly duties without authorization and was behaving rudely with women devotees. They alleged that he frequently used abusive language, causing distress to visiting pilgrims. The women also expressed concern that such behavior could discourage devotees from visiting the temple, thereby tarnishing the sanctity of the revered shrine. The com-

ficer, and the Penugonda Tahsildar, instructing them to take immediate measures to ensure the safety and dignity of women devotees. She emphasized that the Endowments Department carries the responsibility of protecting devotees, particularly women, in all religious establishments. Condemning the reported misconduct, Dr. Shailaja said that misbehavior and foul language toward women in sacred spaces were deplorable and unacceptable. She directed temple authorities to remove individuals whose actions disturb the spiritual atmosphere of temples and inconvenience devotees. "The sanctity of temples must be preserved."

In response, Dr. Rayapati Shailaja convened a discussion with the temple chairman Satyababu, the executive of-

Establishment of laughing clubs in every village; monthly interactions with senior citizens

VIJAYAWADA: Highlighting the significance of mental health, NTR district Collector Dr G Lakshminisha instructed officials to promote the establishment of laughing clubs in every village. "Organise monthly interactions with senior citizens at the village and ward secretariat level, and ensure similar initiatives at divisional and district levels," he said. "Elderly people should never be treated as insignificant. If we share love and affection with them today, we will receive the same warmth from our children in the future," said Dr. G. Lakshminisha. He underscored that the essence of the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act must be reflected in tribunal

orders.

Presiding over the District Senior Citizens Welfare Committee meeting at the Collectorate on Thursday, Dr. Lakshminisha reviewed claim resolutions from the tribunals under the Vijayawada, Tiruvuru, and Nandigama revenue divisions and the appellate authority. Of the 433 claims received, 395 have already been settled, while steps are being taken to resolve the rest. Dr. Lakshminisha observed that everyone eventually faces old age and should, therefore, recognise the importance of treating elders with dignity. He said the law acts as a vigilant safeguard for senior citizens and urged strict enforcement against any violations. He directed the Revenue, Police, and Welfare de-

partments to coordinate their efforts for effective welfare implementation.

Dr. Lakshminisha also discussed the "Gen Alpha" project, aimed at enabling seniors to share their experiences and life lessons with children to foster discipline and moral values. He advised launching the programme initially in Gurukula schools before its expansion. DCP K.G.V. Saritha, DRO M. Lakshminarasimham, AD for Senior Citizens Welfare V. Kamaraaju, Vijayawada RDO K. Kaavuri Chaitanya, DMHO Dr. M. Suhasini, and representatives from senior citizens' associations and transgender communities attended the meeting. Nandigama RDO K. Balakrishna and Tiruvuru RDO K. Madhuri participated virtually.

Pawan Kalyan, who holds the environment and forest portfolios, directed officials to publish the names of all forest land encroachers on the department website and take strict legal action against forest land grabbers without exception. He issued the orders after an aerial survey of the forest.

According to the Deputy Chief Minister's office, the aerial survey "exposed" 76.74 acres of illegal encroachment inside the protected Mangalam Peta forest lands in the eastern ghats, linked to Ramachandra Reddy. Pawan Kalyan

visited the site, reviewed the violations and briefed Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu and Cabinet ministers.

He directed officials to publish the names of all forest land encroachers on the department website, reveal the extent of encroachment and the status of cases on each individual and take strict legal action against anyone who grabbed forest land, without exception.

The Deputy CM also directed officials to investigate discrepancies in land records, including inflated Webland entries and false claims of "ancestral land" inside protected forest areas.

He asked them to act, based on vigilance reports and legal expert guidance, and to digitise all land records to prevent manipulation and ensure transparency. "Forest lands are national assets. Those who encroach upon them, mis-

use them, or violate forest laws, no matter who they are, will be held accountable. The government will not tolerate the grab of protected forest areas or wildlife zones," reads a post on 'X' by the Deputy CM's office.

It also posted a video of Pawan Kalyan's aerial survey, and the map showing the extent of the forest enclosure. A total of 32.63 acres were earlier occupied and evicted. He is seen taking pictures of the forest enclosure and the structures built on it. Early this year, Ramachandra


Reddy had rubbed the allegations made by a newspaper and a television channel that he grabbed forest land.

Reddy had called it an "orchestrated negative campaign" by the media organisations owing allegiance to the ruling Telugu Desam Party (TDP), and dared the media house to prove its charges. He claimed that the 75 acres of private property had been purchased in 2001. According to him, the Director of Settlements had declared in 1981 that the said piece is not forest land.

The former minister also claimed that the

road leading to his estate, though falling in the middle of the forest, had been laid with the permission of the Central government. Ramachandra Reddy said that N. Kiran Kumar Reddy and later Chandrababu Naidu, during their respective terms as Chief Minister in the past, had ordered a probe into the same issue, but could not prove anything incriminatory.

The case filed in the High Court by a TDP leader was also dismissed as the same property had been shown in the forest gazette as private land in 1968, the YSRCP leader said.



YS Jagan Slams Chandrababu's 'Credit-Chor' Scheme as Shameful and Unprecedented

VIJAYAWADA: Former Chief Minister and YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) President YS Jagan Mohan Reddy launched a scathing attack on Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu, accusing him of running a "credit-chor" scheme a brazen attempt to claim credit for housing projects conceived and largely executed during the previous YSRCP government.

YS Jagan alleged that during the last 18 mont

hs, the current TDP-led administration has not acquired even a single square yard of land for the poor, sanctioned or granted title deeds by the current government. He detailed that 1,40,010 houses were in the finishing stage, 87,380 houses had reached the slab level, and 66,845 houses were under construction during the YSRCP tenure. YS Jagan also recalled the historic "Gruha Pravesam" held on October 12, 2023, when his government facilitated 7,43,396 house-warming

ceremonies in a single day. Highlighting YSRCP's welfare achievements, he said the previous government had issued 31.19 lakh house site pattas to poor women, covering 71,800 acres, sanctioned 21.75 lakh houses, and completed over 9 lakh houses despite the COVID-19 pandemic. He accused the present regime of now trying to lock up remaining vacant sites meant for the poor while using "yellow media" to falsely claim credit for

YSRCP's accomplishments.

Terming such acts as "political theft," YS Jagan said the current government's conduct — from seizing land meant for the poor to spreading false propaganda — was "utterly shameful." He concluded that Chandrababu's so-called "credit-chor" scheme symbolizes the theft of ideas, efforts, and rights of the poor, warning that such deceit will not go unchallenged.

SADAREM Slot Booking for Differently-Abled to Resume from Nov 14

Minister Satya Kumar Announces Major Reforms

VIJAYAWADA: The Andhra Pradesh government has announced that slot bookings for the SADAREM (Software for Assessment of Disabled for Access, Rehabilitation and Empowerment) program will resume from Friday, November 14, after being temporarily halted since the end of September due to technical issues. The slots will remain open until the end of December, said Minister for Health, Medical and Family Welfare Satya Kumar Yadav.

The Minister stated that priority will be given to nearly 10,000 individuals already on the waiting list for disability assessments. Once their assessments are completed, new applicants will be allotted available slots with specific dates and times.

In a significant welfare move, the Minister announced that the

government has decided to waive all fees for slot booking and certificate printing, which previously cost 40 each. "Considering the financial conditions of differently-abled individuals, the government has decided to provide these services completely free of cost," he said.

Under SADAREM, disability assessment camps will be conducted every Monday at Community Health Centres and every Tuesday at district, area, and teaching hospitals. The Minister added that 31,050 individuals will undergo disability assessments by the end of December. While 112 hospitals previously conducted these assessments, an additional six hospitals have now been added to the network.

Doctors will evaluate applicants across various disability categories—locomotor, visual, hearing, mental, and intellectual disabilities—and issue

certificates based on the percentage of disability, which determines eligibility for pensions and government welfare schemes.

Addressing appeals, officials stated that out of 1.04 lakh individuals who appealed for reassessment after receiving lower disability percentages earlier, 19,235 have already been re-examined, and the remaining will be tested soon. These assessments are being held every Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday at hospitals selected by district collectors.

Furthermore, reevaluation tests for 1.87 lakh pension beneficiaries will commence from January 2026, said Dr. KVN Chakradhar Babu, Director of Secondary Health. The government aims to complete all appeal and reassessment processes within the stipulated timelines to ensure timely welfare benefits for all eligible differently-abled individuals.

Illegal cases will not stop protests against privatization: Ex-Min

He reminded that YS Jagan Mohan Reddy established 17 government medical colleges and completed 7 of them with the clear aim of ensuring free, quality healthcare and medical education for the poor. But after coming to power in 2024, Chandrababu Naidu began a systematic effort to hand these colleges to private players under the guise of PPP, destroying the very purpose for which they were built.

Nagarjuna stated that the One-crore signature movement led by YSRCP in the past month has

form, Jyothi went on to clinch the individual gold medal, overcoming her teammate Prithika Pradeep 147-145 in an all-Indian final.



Husband kills wife on the road in broad day light



TPN BUREAU | nov 13 Vijayawada: Man Murders Wife in Broad Daylight Amid Family Dispute In a shocking incident that unfolded at Suryaopeta in Vijayawada, a man brutally murdered his wife in the middle of the road on Thursday. The victim has been identified as Saraswati, who was employed as a nurse at a private hospital in Vijayawada. The horrifying act took place in full public view, leaving residents deeply disturbed. According to preliminary reports, domestic disputes are believed to have led to the crime. Sources said Saraswati and her husband had been living separately for some time due to ongoing family conflicts.

Their strained relationship reportedly intensified over recent weeks, culminating in this tragic event. On Thursday, the accused husband allegedly intercepted Saraswati on her way to work and attacked her with a sharp weapon, slitting her throat on the spot. Shocked passersby immediately alerted the police and emergency services, but she succumbed to her injuries before any medical help could reach her. Local police teams rushed to the scene upon receiving information from witnesses. The accused was taken into custody within minutes of the incident and is currently being interrogated at the local police station.

The murder weapon has reportedly been seized, and a case has been registered under sections related to murder and domestic violence. Police officials have assured a thorough investigation into the incident. The body was shifted to the Government General Hospital in Vijayawada for postmortem examination.

Meanwhile, the incident has sparked outrage among residents and healthcare workers who have demanded stringent punishment for the accused. Authorities appealed to the public to seek legal help and counseling in cases of domestic disputes instead of resorting to violence.

Secretariat Staff Absconds with 20 Lakh in Kadapa

Kadapa: In a shocking case of financial misconduct, a Secretariat employee from Ankalamma Gudur in Kadapa district has reportedly absconded after allegedly misappropriating nearly 20 lakh meant for government agricultural subsidies. The accused, identified as Praveen Kumar Reddy, was working as a Horticulture Assistant at the local village secretariat.

According to preliminary reports, Praveen Kumar Reddy handled various welfare and agricultural subsidy schemes



under the horticulture department. He is suspected to have collected large sums of money from farmers and local beneficiaries under the

pretext of providing subsidized seeds and fertilizers. Instead of channeling the funds into official accounts, officials allege that he diverted them for

personal use. Villagers raised suspicions after noticing delays in the distribution of seeds and fertilizers despite having paid the required amount.

By that time, Praveen Kumar Reddy had already gone missing, prompting officials to file a complaint with the local police. Police have launched a manhunt to trace the absconding employee. Senior officials from the Department of Horticulture and the District Administration are closely monitoring the case and have initiated disciplinary measures.

Authorities are also reviewing internal financial controls at village secretariats to prevent similar incidents in the future. This incident has created widespread outrage among farmers and local residents, who are demanding strict legal action and recovery of funds.

This case underscores the growing need for stronger oversight and accountability mechanisms within the village secretariat system, which plays a critical role in implementing grassroots-level government schemes across Andhra Pradesh.

Islamist Groups Hijack Bangladesh Student Movement



Bangladesh's student-led quota reform movement, initially celebrated as a peaceful campaign for equality and meritocracy, has been revealed to have been infiltrated by Islamist groups, leading to violent clashes and political instability. What began as a protest against systemic dis-

crimination morphed into an armed insurrection with ideological overtones, experts say.

The movement erupted as students demanded reform of job quotas and fair access to opportunities in public institutions. Widespread support came from university teachers, profes-

sionals, laborers, and ordinary citizens, creating a perception of a grassroots, non-violent struggle for justice. However, recent confessions by movement leaders indicate that the protests were far from peaceful. Coordinators openly admitted to orchestrating attacks on govern-

ment buildings and public infrastructure, including the Seti Bhaban and metro rail systems, resulting in the deaths of numerous police officers.

Intelligence reports and investigative journalism suggest that Jamaat-e-Islami and its militant student wing, Islami Chhatra Shi-

bir, played a key role in steering the movement toward armed confrontation. The groups reportedly recruited students, spread propaganda, and provided weapons to ensure escalation. Public statements by Jamaat operatives confirm their strategic involvement, highlighting how the move-

ment's original anti-discrimination message was used as a cover for ideological extremism aimed at undermining Bangladesh's secular foundations.

The violence has left a lasting toll: at least 44 police officers were killed during clashes, while many others were injured. Mean-

while, the deaths and injuries of students have been highlighted in political narratives, overshadowing the sacrifices of law enforcement and creating a complex moral and legal dilemma for the government. Questions remain about the source of the weapons used, with allegations of smuggling and external funding, raising concerns of broader regional involvement.

The interim government formed amid the unrest faces criticism for exceeding its mandate and curbing democratic processes. Opposition parties report intimidation, arrests, and disruptions of rallies, raising fears that the elections scheduled for February may lack genuine inclusivity and fairness. Analysts warn that without free, fair, and inclusive elections under a neutral caretaker system, Bangladesh risks further political fragmentation and erosion of public trust.

Experts and regional observers, including India, have expressed concern over the resurgence of Islamist influence and anti-India rhetoric, which could destabilize not only Bangladesh's internal governance but also regional security. The hijacking of a legitimate student movement underscores the urgent need for impartial investigations, accountability for violence, and a restoration of secular democratic principles.

Bangladesh's future stability depends on reclaiming the original spirit of the student movement—rooted in equality, justice, and non-violence—while confronting the ideological manipulation that threatens to rewrite the nation's democratic trajectory.

Delhi Red Fort Blast: Unraveling a White-Collar Terror Conspiracy



A high-intensity explosion near Delhi's Red Fort on 10 November 2025 claimed at least 12 lives and left the area in chaos, marking one of the deadliest terror attacks in recent years. Initially suspected as a cylinder blast in a car, subsequent investigations confirmed it was a well-planned terror strike. The blast coincided with the discovery of nearly 2,900 kg of explosives in Faridabad, including IED components, ammunition, and electronic triggering devices, hinting at a coordinated, larger conspiracy.

Intelligence agencies, the Delhi Police, the National Investigation Agency (NIA), and the National Security Guard (NSG) quickly swung into action. Home Minister Amit Shah visited the site to assess the situation, while Prime Minister Narendra Modi, during a visit to Bhutan the following day, vowed stern action against the perpetrators. The Cabinet Com-

mittee on Security convened on 12 November to deliberate on national security measures in light of the attack.

Delhi has witnessed multiple terror incidents in the past, from the 2000 Red Fort attack by Lashkar-e-Toiba (LeT) to the 2008 serial blasts in commercial areas and the 2001 attack on Parliament by Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM).

Current investigations suggest the recent attack was part of a broader scheme, aimed at spreading terror across India. JeM and Ansar Ghazwat-ul-Hind (AGuH) modules, operated by radicalized professionals and students with Pakistan-based handlers, were identified as the main orchestrators.

The Red Fort attack underscores a shift in terror dynamics—terrorism is no longer confined to conventional militants but increasingly involves radicalized, educated professionals, posing a complex challenge to national security.

Warm Bhutan-India Ties Reinforced By Modi Visit



Prime Minister Narendra Modi's two-day visit to Bhutan from 11–12 November 2025 has reinforced the deep and longstanding ties between the two nations, highlighting both strategic and developmental cooperation. Despite the recent terror attack in Delhi's Red Fort area, Modi's visit went ahead, symbolizing India's commitment to its close Himalayan neighbor.

During the visit, PM Modi and Bhutan's King Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck inaugurated the 1,020 MW Putnatsangchhu-II hydroelectric project, marking a significant milestone in the India-Bhutan Friendship Project initiative. This project is expected to boost Bhutan's hydroelectric power capacity by 40%, reinforcing the kingdom's position as a renewable energy powerhouse with a negative carbon footprint. India also pledged a new concessional line of credit of ₹4,000 crore for Bhutan's further energy projects and development initiatives.

Bhutan, strategically located between India and China, has traditionally benefited from India's non-predatory support through concessional loans, electricity purchases, and a defence protection pact. During Modi's visit, the two countries signed three MoUs covering renewable energy, mental health services, and healthcare. These agreements strengthen cooperation across multiple sectors while reflecting Bhutan's emphasis on sustainable development and Gross National Happiness. India had earlier contributed ₹10,000 crore to Bhutan's Five-

Year Plan in 2024 to support infrastructure, agriculture, finance, and healthcare development.

Connectivity between Bhutan and India also received a boost during the visit. Plans are underway to connect Bhutanese border towns Gelephu and Samtse with India's railway network, enhancing trade and mobility. India will set up an immigration check post at Hatisar, near Gelephu, and support infrastructure development on its side of the border.

ED Attaches Rs 61 Crore Assets of Bhupesh Baghel's Son in Chhattisgarh Liquor Scam

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has provisionally attached assets worth Rs 61.20 crore belonging to Chaitanya Baghel, son of former Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel, under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), 2002, in connection with the ongoing investigation into the Chhattisgarh liquor scam.

The attached assets include 364 residential plots and agricultural lands valued at Rs 59.96 crore, alongside movable assets such as bank balances and fixed deposits worth Rs 1.24 crore. The ED said the action is part of its continuing probe into the liquor syndicate that allegedly caused massive losses to the state exchequer.

The investigation was initiated following an FIR by the Anti-Corruption Bureau/Enforcement Wing (ACB/EOW), Raipur, under sections of



the IPC and the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988. Police and ED investigations revealed that the liquor scam resulted in over Rs 2,500 crore of illicit proceeds, with Chaitanya Baghel positioned at the top of the syndicate.

According to the ED, Chaitanya Baghel controlled and managed the accounts of all illicit

funds collected by the syndicate and directed key decisions regarding the collection, channelization, and distribution of the proceeds. The probe further revealed that he laundered a portion of these proceeds through his real estate business, notably the "Vithal Green" project under his proprietorship, M/s

Baghel Developers.

Chaitanya Baghel was arrested by the ED on July 18 and remains in judicial custody. Earlier, the ED had arrested several high-profile individuals linked to the case, including former IAS officer Anil Tuteja, Arvind Singh, Trilok Singh Dhillon, Anwar Dhebar, Arun Pati Tripathi, and MLA Kawa-

si Lakhma, who was the excise minister at the time.

This latest attachment of Rs 61.20 crore comes in continuation of previous actions by the ED, which had already seized immovable properties valued at around Rs 215 crore, highlighting the scale and seriousness of the investigation.

"I Will Use My Conscience And Decide": Ajit Pawar On Resignation Demand

Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar on Wednesday responded to calls for his resignation over a controversial land deal involving a company linked to his son, saying he will "use his conscience and take a decision."

The controversy centers

around a now-cancelled Rs 300-crore deal concerning a government-owned plot in Pune's Mundhwa area. Allegations of irregularities surfaced after it was revealed that a private firm associated with Pawar's son, Parth, had attempted to acquire the land. Following opposition

criticism, the state government scrapped the deal and ordered a formal inquiry led by a senior IAS officer from the revenue department.

Social activist Anjali Damania has publicly demanded Ajit Pawar's resignation over the alleged land scam. Addressing re-

porters in Pune, the deputy CM stated, "I will use my conscience and take a decision," while defending his son, asserting that Parth was unaware that the land belonged to the government.

The incident has intensified political scrutiny in Maharashtra, with the op-

position demanding accountability and transparency. Analysts note that the matter could have implications for the ruling coalition, particularly as the inquiry progresses and further details emerge.

Separately, Ajit Pawar addressed security concerns following a car blast in Delhi on November 10. He confirmed that a security review meeting was held in Mumbai on Tuesday, with Maharashtra placed on high alert. "The Chief Minister instructed all police officers to be on high alert. We have spoken to everyone concerned. After such incidents, the security situation in major cities is reviewed," he said.

As investigations into both the land deal and security issues continue, the deputy CM's stance suggests he is weighing his options carefully, balancing political accountability with personal and familial considerations. The situation remains under close observation by the media and opposition parties.

Delhi Chokes as Severe Air Pollution Persists Amid Spike in Farm Fires

Delhi continued to grapple with hazardous air quality on Wednesday, as the city recorded its second consecutive day of 'severe' pollution, with the 24-hour average Air Quality Index (AQI) at 418, according to data from the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB).

The deteriorating air quality is largely attributed to stubble-burning in neighbouring states, which contributed 22.4 per cent to Delhi's PM2.5 levels on Wednesday — the highest share recorded from farm fires this winter. Additionally, 15.5 per cent of the pollution was transported from outside the city, as per the Decision Support System (DSS) data.

A 'severe' AQI poses serious health risks

even for healthy individuals and can significantly affect people with respiratory or cardiac conditions. Delhi had recorded its first 'severe' day of the season on Tuesday, with the AQI reaching 428, after several days in the 'very poor' category due to stagnant weather and local emissions.

Satellite imagery showed 312 farm fire incidents in Punjab, 72 in Haryana, and 322 in Uttar Pradesh on Tuesday, highlighting the scale of crop residue burning affecting the capital. DSS projections for Thursday indicate that stubble-burning will contribute around 10.1 per cent to PM2.5 levels, while transport-related emissions are expected to rise slightly to 19.3 per cent.

The Air Quality Early Warning System (AQEWS) has predicted that pollution levels are likely to remain in the 'very poor' category from Thursday onwards.

On the weather front, temperatures in the city continued to dip, with Wednesday recording a minimum of 10.4°C, 3.1°C below normal, and a maximum of 27.7°C, slightly below average.

Thursday is expected to witness shallow morning fog, with temperatures ranging between 11°C and 26°C.

Authorities have urged residents, especially children, the elderly, and those with pre-existing health conditions, to limit outdoor activities and take precautions amid the ongoing air quality crisis.

Tamil Nadu Raises Dearness Allowance by 3% for Govt Employees and Teachers

In a major pre-election move, Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin on Thursday announced a three per cent hike in the Dearness Allowance (DA) for state government employees, teachers, and pensioners. The revision raises the DA from 55 per cent to 58 per cent, effective from July 1, 2025, bringing it in line with the central government's DA rate.

According to an official release from the Department of Information and Public Relations, the increase is expected to benefit nearly 16 lakh state employees, teachers, pensioners, and family pensioners. The move will cost the state exchequer approximately Rs 1,829 crore annually.

Speaking about the hike, CM Stalin emphasized the vital role of government staff and teachers in implementing welfare schemes at the grassroots level.

"The state remains committed to the welfare of its employees, recognizing their efforts in ensuring that schemes reach the intended beneficiaries, even amidst fiscal constraints," he said.

The DA revision comes at a politically sensitive time as Tamil Nadu prepares for the 2026 Assembly elections. The ruling DMK government has faced growing dissatisfaction among government employees, particularly over its previous unfulfilled promise to restore the Old Pension Scheme (OPS). Analysts note that the

increase in DA may be an attempt to appease employees and teachers ahead of the polls.

The announcement has been welcomed by many employees and pensioners, though some continue to press for a full restoration of OPS. Trade unions representing state staff have called the DA hike a positive step but indicated that further dialogue would be needed to address broader concerns about pension reforms and pay parity.

With the new DA rate now official, state employees can expect enhanced monthly remuneration, reflecting both the government's commitment to staff welfare and its strategy to consolidate support ahead of the upcoming elections.

UK PM Says BBC Should 'Correct Errors' As Trump Mulls Lawsuit

British Prime Minister Keir Starmer on Wednesday urged the BBC to "get their house in order" after US President Donald Trump threatened to sue the broadcaster for \$1 billion over a misleading edit of his speech. The edited footage, aired in a BBC documentary last year, suggested Trump encouraged "violent action" ahead of the January 6, 2021, Capitol attack.

Speaking in Parliament, Starmer emphasized his support for a "strong and independent BBC" but stressed that it must uphold high standards and correct errors promptly. "Where mistakes are made, they do need to get their house in order," he said, responding to calls to ask Trump to drop the legal threat.

Trump's legal team sent the broadcaster a letter on Monday, warning of a billion-dollar defamation lawsuit. In a Fox News interview recorded the same day, Trump said, "I guess I have to, why not?" and described the editing as fraudulent, asserting he had an "obligation" to act. He also criticized the British government's stake in the publicly

funded BBC.

The controversy has already prompted significant leadership changes at the BBC. Both the director-general and the top news executive resigned Sunday, while BBC chair Samir Shah publicly apologized on Monday for the "error of judgment" in editing the footage. The corporation has said it will review Trump's legal letter.

Public opinion in Britain is divided. A YouGov poll found 57% of Britons believe the BBC should formally apologize to Trump, while 25% opposed. The dispute comes at a sensitive time for the BBC, which is preparing to renegotiate its Royal Charter, the governance framework due to expire in 2027.

The row adds to Trump's history of legal threats aimed at US media critics since returning to office, raising questions about media accountability and international defamation standards. Starmer's government faces a careful balancing act: defending the broadcaster's independence while ensuring public trust in its reporting remains intact.

Defence Minister Khawaja Warns India, Afghanistan

In a fresh provocation, Pakistan's Defence Minister Khawaja Asif has claimed that the country is "fully prepared" to face a two-front war with India and Afghanistan. His remarks come amid heightened regional tensions following a recent terror attack in New Delhi, allegedly linked to Pakistan-based group Jaish-e-Mohammed, which killed at least 13 people.

Speaking to a local news channel, Asif declared, "We are ready; we are prepared to face both the eastern (India) and western (Afghanistan) borders. Allah helped us in round one, and He will help us in round two. If they want the final round, we have no option but war."

The statement follows a blast in Islamabad earlier this week that killed 12 people. While the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) claimed responsibility, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif had accused groups "supported by India" of involvement — a

claim New Delhi has firmly rejected in the past.

Asif also warned both India and Afghanistan against "any misadventure," saying, "Pakistan will never initiate aggression, but we will respond forcefully if provoked." He further alleged that the Taliban-led government in Kabul was fragmented, accusing some factions of maintaining links with India.

"Some are linked with India, and some have their strings pulled elsewhere. These incidents are preludes to aggression that could happen from the Afghan side — in reality, Indian aggression waged through Afghanistan," Asif claimed, without offering evidence.

This is not the first time Asif has accused Afghanistan of fighting "India's proxy war" along the Durand Line. His comments have sparked strong reactions across diplomatic circles, with observers warning that such rhetoric could further destabilize an already volatile region.

Trump Signs Funding Bill, Ending 43-Day Government Shutdown

US President Donald Trump signed a government funding bill on Wednesday night, officially ending a record 43-day federal shutdown that caused widespread disruption across the country. The prolonged closure left federal employees without pay, stranded travelers at airports, and created long queues at food banks.

The bill was passed by the House earlier in the day on a mostly party-line vote of 222-209, following Senate approval on Monday. The legislation funds three annual spending bills and extends government operations through January 30, 2026. It also reverses Trump administration firings during the shutdown and ensures federal workers are paid and protected from layoffs until the new deadline.

The compromise emerged after eight senators broke ranks with Democrats, agreeing

that Republicans would not attach an extension of enhanced health care tax credits to the funding bill. Republicans promised a separate vote by mid-December on the issue, though success is uncertain.

The shutdown highlighted sharp partisan divides. Trump blamed Democrats for the stalemate, urging voters to remember the disruption ahead of next year's midterm elections. "Don't forget what they've done to our country," he said during the signing ceremony. Democrats, meanwhile, criticized the bill for failing to extend the Affordable Care Act's enhanced tax credits, warning that premiums could soar and millions might lose coverage next year.

The legislation also includes funding for key food assistance programs, security enhancements for lawmakers, and \$28 million for Supreme

Court justices' security. Some last-minute provisions allowing senators to sue over federal searches of their records drew criticism from both parties.

Despite ending the shutdown, lawmakers acknowledged the battle over health care subsidies is far from over, with debates on affordability and eligibility expected to continue in the coming weeks. The deal, while ending immediate crisis, leaves significant policy disputes unresolved, particularly regarding the ACA tax credits.


Moody's also highlighted India's policy reforms, including initiatives to attract

ESA Explores Insects as Future Space Food for Astronauts

European scientists are exploring an unconventional yet promising food source for astronauts on long-duration space missions: insects. The European Space Agency (ESA) has partnered with experts in food science, biology, and space research to assess whether crickets, mealworms, and other edible insects could become a regular part of astronaut diets.

While the idea may seem unusual, insect consumption is widespread on Earth, with billions of people eating over 2,000 species globally, according to the UN's Food and Agriculture Organization. Crickets, in particular, are a complete protein source, providing all nine essential amino acids, while mealworms are rich in protein and healthy fats. Both are also high in vital minerals such as iron and zinc.

"Insects seem to cope quite well in space environments. They have a good ability to withstand physical stresses," said Asa Berggren, Professor at the Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences and lead author of a recent study published in *Frontiers in*

Physiology. "These small animals efficiently convert materials that humans cannot consume into nutritious food for astronauts."

In addition to their nutritional benefits, insects require significantly less land, water, and feed compared to traditional livestock. They also produce fewer greenhouse gases, aligning with ESA's commitment to reducing the environmental footprint of space exploration.

The ESA has already approved house crickets and yellow mealworms for human consumption, and researchers are now optimizing their growth in microgravity conditions. Past experiments with fruit flies, the first animals to survive space travel, demonstrated that insects can complete their full life cycle in space, highlighting their adaptability to extraterrestrial environments.

With long-term missions to the Moon, Mars, and beyond on the horizon, edible insects could offer a sustainable, protein-rich, and environmentally friendly solution for feeding astronauts, potentially transforming the future of space nutrition.

World's Largest Spider Web Found in Romanian Cave



Scientists have discovered what may be the world's largest spider web in a sulfur-rich cave near the Greece-Albania border, a find that has both amazed and unnerved arachnophobes worldwide. The discovery, documented in the journal *Subterranean Biology*, features a colossal web housing approximately 111,000 spiders from two rival species coexisting peacefully.

According to researchers, the web stretches along the walls of a narrow, low-roofed tunnel deep inside the cave, in a permanently dark zone near the cavern's mouth. The spiders have built thousands of interconnected funnel webs, forming a sprawling colony that scientists describe as a "silky tent city." A video accompanying the study shows a researcher gently touching the web, revealing its dense structure as the strands ripple under the glow of his headlamp. The sheer scale of the web, combined with the high number of arachnids living in close proximity, has drawn widespread attention online.

Experts note that the coexistence of the two rival species is particularly unusual, as such species typically compete aggressively for territory. The stable environment of the cave, with its constant temperature, high humidity, and rich sulfur content, appears to support this rare phenomenon.

"This web is extraordinary not just in size, but in the harmony displayed by the spiders," said one researcher. "It gives us new insights into arachnid behavior and the ways ecosystems can support unexpected biodiversity."

The Romanian cave web adds to growing evidence that subterranean environments can host complex and previously undocumented communities. Scientists hope further study will shed light on how these spiders cooperate and maintain such an enormous structure without significant conflict.

The discovery has quickly gone viral, with videos of the web sparking fascination and horror in equal measure among social media users.

Scientists Identify Earth's High-Risk Zones for Interstellar Object Impacts



Scientists have identified regions on Earth that are at higher risk of impacts from interstellar objects (ISOs), mysterious visitors from outside our solar system. The study, led by Darryl Seligman of Michigan State University, used simulations to model the paths, orbital elements, and velocities of potential Earth-impacting ISOs.

According to the research, low-latitude regions near the equator are the most vulnerable, with a slight preference for the Northern Hemisphere, where nearly 90% of the global population resides. These objects are twice as likely to approach Earth from the solar apex—the Sun's path through the Milky Way—and the galactic plane, the dense flat region containing most stars.

The study also found that ISO impacts can vary by season. The highest velocity collisions are more probable

during spring, when Earth moves toward the solar apex. Slower ISOs, which are more affected by the Sun's gravity, are generally more likely to hit during winter, when Earth is aligned toward the solar ant apex.

While NASA has confirmed that the recently discovered interstellar comet 3I/ATLAS poses no threat to Earth, the research highlights the importance of understanding ISO behavior. Previous interstellar visitors include 'Oumuamua in 2017 and 2I/Borisov in 2019, both of which passed through the solar system without incident.

The study emphasizes that while the number of ISOs is currently unconstrained, understanding their kinematics—especially those from M-type stars, which are the most numerous in the Milky Way—can help identify high-risk zones and improve preparedness for future interstellar encounters.

Researchers hope

that ongoing monitoring and simulations of these objects will enhance Earth's readiness for rare but potentially hazardous impacts, providing crucial insights into planetary defense strategies.

France Commemorates 10th Anniversary of Deadly Paris Attacks



France marked the 10th anniversary of the November 13, 2015, Paris attacks on Thursday, remembering the 130 people killed and hundreds more injured when Islamic State gunmen and suicide bombers struck multiple locations across the city. The attacks, the deadliest on French soil since World War Two, left deep scars on the national psyche and prompted sweeping emergency security measures, many of which remain in place today.

The coordinated assault began with suicide bombings outside the Stade de France stadium, where then-President François Hollande and Germany's foreign minister were attending a soccer match. Gunmen then opened fire at cafes, restaurants, and the Bataclan concert hall, creating chaos and horror across central Paris. Survivors

still recount harrowing experiences, with many suffering long-term trauma.

Sebastian Lascoux, a Bataclan survivor, described being trapped in the crowd as gunfire erupted. "People ended up all squashed together

and collapsed as one... the smell of blood," he recalled. One of his friends was shot while shielding another attendee. Lascoux, now 46, continues to experience post-traumatic stress and plans to attend the commemorative

events alongside other survivors.

President Emmanuel Macron joined officials, relatives, and survivors in memorial ceremonies, beginning at the Stade de France and moving through

the restaurants, cafes, and the Bataclan hall. Historian Denis Peschanski highlighted the attacks' indiscriminate nature, saying, "Everyone was a potential victim... either old enough to be there or with children who could have been."

Survivors like Catherine Bertrand, vice-president of a victims' association, emphasized resilience: "We are deeply traumatized, but life goes on. There are concerts at the Bataclan, we meet with friends... life goes on."

While the threat of large-scale attacks in France has diminished due to Islamic State's weakened capabilities, online propaganda still poses risks of radicalization. French anti-terrorism authorities recently launched an investigation related to the former partner of the presumed sole surviving attacker.

Russia's First AI Humanoid Robot Takes a Tumble on Stage

Russia's first AI-powered humanoid robot, named Idol, made an ungraceful debut when it fell face-first on stage at a Moscow technology event, leaving developers scrambling and social media in stitches. The incident occurred on Monday, November 10, as the robot walked gingerly to the soundtrack of the film *Rocky*, waved to the audience, and immediately toppled, prompting staff to rush in for assistance.

The fall forced the developers to temporarily remove Idol from public view while engineers examined its balance mechanisms and control software. Vladimir Vitukhin, CEO of Russian robotics firm Idol, described the mishap as a learning opportunity. "This is real-time learning, when a good mistake turns into knowledge, and a bad mistake turns into experience," he said, attributing the tumble to calibration issues.

Despite the embarrassment, the incident has sparked a mix of humor and admiration online. Social media users shared the viral video widely, with some poking fun at the robot's awkward gait. "They did a great job of emulating the shuffle of a geriatric that's had too much vodka," joked one viewer. Others acknowledged the challenges of humanoid robotics, praising the team's

efforts to push technological boundaries despite the public stumble.

Idol's fall highlights the difficulties inherent in creating fully autonomous humanoid robots capable of navigating real-world environments. Experts note that

maintaining balance, coordinating movements, and processing real-time feedback in dynamic conditions remain among the toughest hurdles in robotics.

Vladimir Vitukhin expressed optimism that the mishap would help improve

Idol's design. "Mistakes like these provide invaluable insight into refining the robot's software and mechanics," he said. The team plans to resume demonstrations once adjustments are made, signaling that innovation often comes with public lessons—and occasional tumbles.

While Idol's debut may have been clumsy, it underscores the complex, trial-and-error nature of robotics development, where even setbacks provide critical learning opportunities.

Coco Gauff, Taylor Fritz Back For United Cup Against Iga Swiatek's Poland

Coco Gauff and Taylor Fritz will headline Team USA's campaign as they gear up to defend their United Cup title in Australia, tournament organisers announced on Thursday. The mixed-team event, scheduled from January 2 to 11, will take place across Sydney and Perth, bringing together some of the biggest names in tennis for an early-season showdown ahead of the Australian Open.

World No. 3 Gauff and sixth-ranked Fritz were instrumental in securing the United States' victory at the inaugural edition earlier this year, edging out Poland in a thrilling finale. Gauff defeated world No. 2 Iga Swiatek in the deciding match, while Fritz overcame Hubert Hurkacz — both of whom will return this year as Poland seeks revenge.

The 2026 United Cup will feature 18 nations, with each team comprising three men and three women. Every tie includes one men's singles, one women's



singles, and a potentially decisive mixed doubles match.

Tournament director Stephen Farrow described the lineup as "world class," expressing excitement for the official draw set for next Monday. Among the

marquee names participating are five of the world's top 10 men and four of the top 10 women.

Germany will once again rely on world No. 3 Alexander Zverev, teaming up with Eva Lys, while Japan will debut with four-time

Grand Slam winner Naomi Osaka alongside Shintaro Mochizuki. Hosts Australia will be led by Alex de Minaur, with Greece represented by Stefanos Tsitsipas and Maria Sakkari, and Great Britain by Jack Draper and Emma Raducanu.

Meanwhile, stars like Jannik Sinner and Carlos Alcaraz have opted for an exhibition match in South Korea ahead of the Australian Open, while Novak Djokovic is yet to confirm his early-season plans.

India Brace for South Africa's Spin Challenge in First Test at Eden Gardens

South Africa, traditionally known for their pace battery, now boast one of the most effective spin line-ups in world cricket. Their trio of Keshav Maharaj, Simon Harmer, and Senuran Muthusamy took 35 of 39 wickets in their recent 1-1 series draw in Pakistan, underlining their dominance on turning tracks. India's assistant coach Ryan ten Doeschate even described them as a "subcontinent-style attack."

Veteran off-spinner Simon Harmer, who first toured India in 2015, returns with experience and recent form — including an eight-wicket haul against Pakistan in Rawalpindi. His partnership with the consistent Maharaj could pose major challenges to India's batters.

The Eden Gardens pitch, closely monitored by captain Shubman Gill and batting coach Sitantha Kotak, is expected to offer early seam movement and some turn later on. CAB president Sourav Ganguly has confirmed it "won't be a rank-turner," a relief for India's pace spearhead Jasprit Bumrah. Local pacer Akash Deep is also likely to feature alongside Mohammed Siraj.

India's middle order looks stronger with the return of Rishabh Pant and Dhruv Jurel's inclusion as a specialist batter. Washington Sundar's all-round abilities will add balance.

With just two Tests in the series, India cannot afford a slow start. As ten Doeschate noted, "You've got to be mentally ready for 16-17 days of really tough cricket." The series opener promises a fascinating contest of skill, patience, and spin mastery.

Cristiano Ronaldo's Remark On Dublin Crowd Ahead Of Ireland Clash

Cristiano Ronaldo has once again made headlines with his trademark confidence and humour ahead of Portugal's crucial World Cup qualifier against Ireland in Dublin on Thursday. The Portuguese captain, who is just one win away from leading his nation to the 2026 World Cup finals, said he hopes the Irish crowd boos him — believing it could help ease the pressure on his teammates.

"The stadium will boo me, I'm used to it, I certainly hope they do — maybe it will take the pressure off other players," Ronaldo told reporters on Wednesday. The five-time Ballon d'Or winner, now 40, remains a key figure for Portugal, who top Group F with a five-point lead and have two matches remaining in the qualification campaign.

Ronaldo, currently playing for Al Nassr in Saudi Arabia, admitted that the match would be "difficult," expecting Ireland to adopt a defensive approach and deny Portugal space. Still, the veteran forward emphasized his determination to continue contribut-



ing to the team's success.

When asked about the possibility of scoring his 1,000th career goal in the World Cup final, Ronaldo laughed off the notion: "You've been watching too many movies — that would

be too perfect."

With an incredible 953 career goals and 143 for Portugal — the most by any male international player — Ronaldo said his focus remains firmly on qualification rather than

personal milestones.

"I want to play in the next World Cup, otherwise I wouldn't be here. But let's take it step by step," he said.

While hinting that the 2026 World Cup could be

his last, Ronaldo declined to elaborate on retirement plans.

"There's no point in being repetitive and losing focus," he added. "Portugal has another opportunity to be in another finals — that's what matters most."

Lakshya Sen Cruises Into Second Round at Japan Masters



India's ace shuttler Lakshya Sen began his Japan Masters campaign in fine style, advancing to the second round of the men's singles with a commanding straight-game victory over Japan's Koki Watanabe on Wednesday.

Seeded seventh in the tournament, Sen displayed excellent control and sharp shot selection to dominate the proceedings.

He defeated world No. 26 Watanabe 21-12, 21-16 in just 39 minutes, marking a confident start to his Kumamoto Masters Japan campaign. The world No. 15 Indian will next face the winner of the clash between Singapore's Jia Heng Jason Teh and Victor Lai of Canada.

However, it turned out to be a mixed day for the Indian contingent as Kiran George and the mixed doubles pair Rohan Kapoor and Ruthvika Shivani Gadde bowed out of the tournament after closely fought matches.

Kiran George couldn't sus-

tain his early momentum, going down 20-22, 10-21 to Malaysia's Jing Hong Kok.

In the mixed doubles event, Kapoor and Ruthvika fought valiantly before suffering a narrow loss to the American duo of Presley Smith and Jennie Gai. The Indians took the match to three games but ultimately fell short 12-21, 21-19, 20-22.

The tournament, part of the BWF World Tour Super 500 series, continues to see intense competition among top international shuttlers. Later in the day, HS Prannoy will face Malaysia's Jun Hao Leong, Ayush Shetty will take on fourth seed Kodai Naraoka, and Tharun Manepalli will meet Korea's Hyeok Jin Jeon in their respective first-round encounters.

With Sen leading India's charge, the spotlight now turns to whether the country's top shuttlers can maintain momentum and advance further in this prestigious badminton event.

With strategic retentions and smart auction planning, Sunrisers Hyderabad aim to address their weaknesses and emerge stronger in IPL 2026, blending experience, firepower, and young talent to mount a serious challenge for the title.




