The Venkateswara temple disaster at Kasi-

bugga town in Srikakulam district on Saturday claimed nine lives and injured over two dozen others, when a staircase railing collapsed, causing people to fall on one another in a packed crowd.

Before this, seven people were killed in April when a rain-soaked wall collapsed at the Sri Varaha Lakshmi Narasimha Swamy temple in Simhachalam near Visakhapatnam. Earlier

had died and nearly 40 injured during a stampede at Bairagi Patteda in Tirupati, where hundreds had gathered for tickets to the Vaikunta Dwara Darshanam at the Sri Venkateswara Swamy Temple on Tirumala hills.

The last week of October which extended into November, proved to be one of the deadliest for the southern state in recent times, with natural disasters and temple accidents claiming dozens of lives and leaving wi despread dest ruction.

# Survivors blame poor crowd management

urvivors of t he Venkateswar a Swamy temple tragedy in Srika kulam district blamed the use of a singe narrow gate for both entry and exit and the la ck of crowd management, which resulted in a stampede-like situation that killed nine people and injured several others on Saturday.

At least nine devotees--eight women and a boy--were killed at the temple in Kasibu gga town. Many sustained injuries or suffered breathlessness and were admitted to local hospitals.

According to the su rvivors, chaos broke out when the only gat e was abruptly open ed, allowing those w ho had compeleted their darshan to come out, while another gr oup waiting below tr ied to enter. This resulted in people falling on one another an d a weak steel grill giv ing way, trapping man y devotees undern eath. "The approach to the temple is narrow. There were many people and only single entry and exit point. As people jostled, we fell down. The steel

grill was also very weak. The grill people were holding onto broke and everybody fell," an autorickhaw driver, who survived the accident, told media.

He said around 20 devotees from his Dharmapuram village had travelled in two autorickshaws to the temple.

"A boy who was also standing under the grill died. He was about 12 years old...' he said.

Another survivor, a woman undergoing treatment at the hospital, said the temple management first allowed some people for darshan and closed the gate, and then suddenly reopened it.

"Opening the gate at once led to those coming out pushing against us," she said adding she fell down and three people fell on her.

A second male survivor said so many devotees were pushing against the closed

"Then the door opened suddenly from the other side. Those returning came down with force. Because of their pressure, the people standing by the door and on the staircase could not stand. They all fell over one another," he said.

He said the tragedy could have been averted if separate routes

had been arranged for entry and exit. "There were provisions, but they did not use it."

A woman who broke her legs in the incident, said she visited the temple for auspicious 'Ekadasi'

day.
"As people fell on me, my leg got stuck in a rod and broke... My husband is a kidney patient undergoing dialysis and now this has happened," said the woman, breaking down.

Another woman from Tekkali mandal, attending to her injured husband at the hospital, said devotees are also to blame for the tragedy.

"We saw the crowd and went ahead. But the temple authorities should have stopped us," she said.

Criticising the poor arrangements at the temple, the devotee said even basic facilities like drinking water were not availab le. "This is very unfortunate. We go to see God to seek blessings. Had the police been deployed this might have been prevented," she added. Meanwhi le, a doctor treating the injured said nearly 30 people were adm itted. "Most came wit h injuries and breathlessness. Many with broken limbs. We gave first aid to all of them," he said.



NOV 1ST The CBI Court In Hyderabad, Telangana, Has Convicted And Sentenced V. Chalapathi Ra o, A Former Computer Operator At SBI, Chandulal Baradari Branch, Hyderabad, To Two Years Of Rigorous Imprisonment (RI) And Imposed A Fine Of \$36,000 In A Bank Fraud Case. The CBI Registered The Case On May 1, 2002, Against Rao And Three

Others—Including Then Branch Manager PP Krishna Rao, Rao's Wife Viraja, And Kaleem Pasha. The Allegations Were That Between 1996 And 2000, Chalapathi Ra o Entered Into A Criminal Conspiracy With The Other Accused To Illegally Sanction And Release "Big Buy Loans" Based On False And Fictitious Documents, Resulting In A Pecuniary Gain Of Approximately 50 Lakhs. Following The Investigation, Three

Charge Sheets Were Filed On December 31, 2004. Rao Had Been Absconding Since 2005, Leading To The Splitting Of Cases Against Him. After Meticulous Efforts, Rao Was Traced And Apprehended On August 4, 2024, In Tirunelveli, Tamil Nadu, While He Was Attempting To Flee The Country Under An Alias. ### **KTR Slams Congress** on Broken Promises

HYD, Oct 9th—BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR), while welcoming T-TDP General Secretary Srinivas Naidu and several other leaders into the party, launched a scathing attack on the ruling Congress government over its failure to implement election promi ses and its conduct during the Jubilee Hi lls by-election campai gn.1 KTR praised a ca ndidate named Prave en for withdrawing hi s nomination to suppo rt the BRS, highlighting party unity. He rid iculed the defection of the current Hyderabad Mayor to the Congress, suggesting that she is powerless as CM Revanth Reddy is failing to deliver.

KTR likened the state's current administrative chaos to the film "Aha Naa Pellanta," accusing the Congress of showing "heaven in the palm" by distributing guarantee cards and making false promises.2 He specifically attacked CM Revanth Reddy for failing to deliver the promised 'Tula Gold' (one tola of gold) for women's marriages, a promise he added to the BRS's existing Kalyana Lakshmi scheme.3 KTR sarcastically claimed the Congress is now "snatching the chains" from women's necks. Furthermore, he criticized the 'Free Bus' scheme, alleging that the government is compensating for the free travel given to women by imposing "double charges" on male passengers.

He emphasized that the BRS under KCR had implemented numerous successful

welfare programs, including Kalyana Lakshmi, Shaadi Muba rak, KCR Kit (with financial assistance for newborns—13,000 for a girl and 12,000 for a boy), and free provisions like Bathukamma Sarees and Ram zan Tofa. KTR slamm ed the Congress for "bundh" (stopping) all these schemes, including the KCR Kit and Nutrition Kit, within two years.

KTR questioned the

CM's aggressive rhet-

oric, noting that while

election campaigns should focus on promises, Revanth Reddy is resorting to threats, warning of further cuts if people do not support the Congress.4 He reminded the CM that the people granted him the position and warned him against acting like a "King" instead of a public servant. KTR accused the Congress of destroying the real estate sector and perpetrating violence against the poor by demolishing their homes under the na me of "Indiramma Rajyam" using Hydra and Bulldozer tactics.5 He called on the Jubilee Hills public to "cut the Congress's tail" in the Nov 11th bypoll. KTR defended BRS candidate Magan ti Sunitha, whose husband's death necessitated the poll, against Congress leaders who allegedly called her mourning a "drama.' He concluded by rallying the party faithful, asserting that a BRS victory in Jubilee Hills is the necessary start to the "Jait ra Yatra" (victory procession) to bring KCR back as Chief Minister with the blessings

# **Mahesh Kumar Goud Attacks BRS-BJP Nexus, Demands Action Against KTR**

Oct 9th—TPCC President Mahesh Kumar Goud utilized a media meeting to fiercely attack the BRS leadership, asserting that KTR's commentary fits the title "Aha Naa Pellanta." ### **BJP Releases Charge Sheet Against Congress Government's** 'Bhsmasura Hasta'

TPN BUREAU, HY D, Oct 9th—The Bhar atiya Janata Party (BJP) intensified its attack on the ruling Congress governme nt in Telangana by officially releasing a "Charge Sheet on Con gress Failures" at the state BJP office. This move comes as the Co ngress government completes 23 months in power, during whi ch time the BJP clai ms the government has demonstrated a "severe failure" in fulfilling its electoral promises. Addressing the media, BJP Telangana St ate President N. Ramchander Rao highlighted the massive disparity between the promises made and the actions delivered. Rao recalled that the Congress party, in its 60page manifesto for the 2023 elections, gave 420 assurances, 13 key promises, and guaranteed the implementation of its Six Guarantees within the first 100 days. Rao pointed out that after nearly 1,000 days (23 months) in office, the

Prabhakar criticized the Prime Minister for speaking ill of Nehru while demonstrati ng a profound lack of understanding regarding the history of the Indian freedom struggle and the nation's integr ation.

The Minister urged PM Modi to "know the history," clarifying the complex historical contexts of two key integration events handled under Nehru's leadership. Prabhakar noted that in Hyderabad, the Muslim Nizam desired to join Pakistan, whereas the majority of the populace (Muslims and Hindus) wanted to be part of India. Conversely, in the Jammu and Kashmir region, the Hindu ruler Hari Singh wished to join India, while a signif-

icant portion of the pop-



ulace, who were Muslim, desired to join Pakistan.6 He stressed that it was due to the vision of Nehru and the efforts of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel that these two contrasting situations were successfully navigated and the regions were integrated into India.

Prabhakar vehemently condemned PM Modi, whose political lineage was absent from the Independence movement and who never contributed to the framing of the Indian Constitution, for stooping to the level of criticizing Nehru. He accused the Prime Minister of speaking out of a

deep-seated hatred for the Gandhi family, including Mahatma Gandhi, who secured indepe ndence through non-violence, and the "Iron La dy" Indira Gandhi.

Prabhakar warned that if the Prime Minister continues to make such insulting and humiliating remarks, the people of India will not tolerate it, and "history will not forgive" him. He concluded by challenging PM Modi, demanding the immediate withdrawal of the comments to prevent him from becoming a historically disgraced figure.

### **KTR Warns Revanth Reddy, Predicts Congress Defeat in Jubilee Hills**

D, Oct 9th—BRS Wor king President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) issued a press note asserting that the people are ready to "cut the Congress's tail," accusing CM Revanth Reddy of intimidating the public out of fear of defeat.9 KTR lambasted the CM for acting like a "King" after forgetting that the people granted him the position, and for allegedly running the state into ruin in just



What began as a complex tax system has evolved into a live, verifiable digital ledger of the economy, enabling businesses and authorities alike to leverage real-time data. Mandatory e-invoicing and the GST Network (GSTN) turned every invoice into a trusted financial footprint, creating a foundation for credit access, financial inclusion, and datadriven governance. For small and medi-

um enterprises (MS-

MEs), GST filings became a financial passport. Lenders could now assess a firm's health instantly, unlocking loans and invoice financing. Yet, this digital advantage is uneven. Only 12% of MSMEs are fully digitalised, leaving many reliant on paper records or outsourced accounting. This digital divide risks creating a twolag behind.



speed economy, where businesses in digitally advanced states like Karnataka, Maharashtra, and Tamil Nadu thrive, while those in less-connected regions

GST Reform 2.0 aims to bridge this gap. The 56th GST Council meeting introduced peoplecentric reforms, including a simplified two-rate tax structure and reduced levies on daily es-

sentials. For businesses, the changes are transformative: provisional, risk-based refunds cover 90% of claims, easing cash-flow constraints, while a streamlined, automated

GST registration scheme promises onboarding of low-risk entrepreneurs in just three days. The establishment of the GST Appellate Tribunal (GSTAT) by December

2025 adds a credible, rules-based enforcement layer.

The convergence of the initial digital engine and these deliberate reforms creates a powerful synergy. Realtime GST data not only empowers businesses with financial tools but also enables authorities to detect fraud efficientlv. However, for the system to achieve its full potential, digital literaprove. Experts advocate a three-pronged approach: scaling practical digital training, promoting affordable tech platforms for micro-enterprises, and using policy incentives to encourage adoption.

Looking ahead, GST is poised to become more than a tax mechanism—it could emerge as a cornerstone of India's economic strategy. Recognising the GST data infrastructure as a national public good, similar to UPI, could stimulate private innovation in finance and supply-chain management. The next phase will test whether GST 2.0 can drive inclusive growth, ensuring that every MSME, regardless of location or size, benefits from this digital transformation.

GST's journey-from chaotic rollout to digital backbone and now to a tool of empowerment—could redefine India's economic landscape, shaping competitiveness and inclusivity for the decade ahead.

## India Pushes for Globalised Rupee Ecosystem



India is taking significant steps to reduce reliance on the U.S. dollar and strengthen its financial sovereignty amid an increasingly uncertain global trade environment. Geopolitical tensions, sanctions threats on Russian oil, and inconsistent U.S. tariff policies have accelerated efforts to develop a rupee-led international settlement system.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has spearheaded key initiatives to promote rupee internationalisation. In October, the RBI allowed authorised dealer (AD) banks and their overseas branches to extend rupee-denominated loans to residents. businesses, and financial institutions in Nepal, Bhutan, and Sri Lanka. This is facilitated through Special Rupee Vostro Accounts (SRVAs), which now number around 200, up from 156 in February. The expansion allows bilateral trade settlements in rupees, bypassing the U.S. dollar, reducing conversion costs, and limiting exposure to dollar volatility. Surplus SRVA balances can also be invested in corporate bonds and commercial papers, enhancing liquidity and attracting foreign participation.

In parallel, the RBI has launched the Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC), or Digital Rupee (e₹), a blockchainbased, fully regulated digital token. The digital rupee supports atomic settlements via Delivery vs Payment (DvP) protocols, ensuring efficiency, privacy, and transparency. The RBI will also publish reference exchange rates for major trading partners' currencies, starting with UAE dirhams and Indonesian rupees, to streamline INRbased trade settlements.

GIFT City in Gujarat has emerged as a hub for these developments. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman inaugurated the Foreign Currency Settlement System in October, enabling faster and safer transactions in major currencies, starting with the U.S. dollar and expanding to the euro, ven, and pound. Meanwhile, BRICS countries are exploring integration of their digital currency systems, aiming to reduce intermediary costs and promote de-dollarisation. The New Development Bank plans its first INR-denominated bond issuance to encourage local currency financing.

India is also planning onshore rupee bonds worth \$400500 million with three- to fiveyear maturities by March 2026. These moves could expand investment opportunities in masala bonds and reinforce India's role in global financial markets. Future plans include linking SRVAs with the Unified Payments Interface (UPI) for international settlements and integrating with central bank digital currencies, potentially enabling GIFT City to operate as a 24×7 global financial hub.

Analysts say these steps mark a strategic shift from a globalised outlook to transactional diplomacy, prioritising national financial sovereignty. By reducing dependence on offshore financial centres. India aims to enhance regional stability, attract investment, and strengthen the rupee's global

# Trump's Trade Power, India's Missed Opportunity



U.S. President Donald Trump's recent Asia tour has highlighted the growing influence of trade as a tool of geopolitical power an area where India appears to have missed the memo. Analysts note that while China has leveraged both its seller and buyer power. India has vet to fully exploit its potential in global trade.

Trump, who often emphasizes the U.S. as the world's largest importer, has used this economic leverage to shape relationships with exporting nations. During his interactions with China, he demonstrated how import dependence can translate into bargaining power, particularly in commodities like soybeans and corn, vital for Chinese agriculture. By contrast, India's imports of U.S. soybeans, corn, and edible oils—totaling over \$18 billion annually—remain underutilized in diplomatic strategy.

China's success, experts say, stems from a mix of for-

ward planning, technological adoption, and strategic patience. The nation has invested in genetically modified crops, improved yields, and diversified import sources, ensuring it can negotiate from a position of strength. India, meanwhile, continues to rely heavily on trade protectionism and domestic lobbying pressures, limiting its ability to wield similar influence.

The recent events underscore the shift in global power dynamics: reputation, moral authority, or political history no longer dee r m i n e leverage—economic power does. Trump reportedly showed condescension toward India's leadership, emphasizing that hard power is measured by what nations can offer rather than what they expect. Analysts argue that India's hesitancy to strategically use its import capacity has cost it potential influence in bilateral negotiations.

Experts point to lessons from history: like Deng Xiaoping's dictum to "bide your time, hide your power," nations must exercise patience and deploy strategic leverage rather than celebrate economic size prematurely. India, while the world's fifth-largest economy, has yet to convert its market size into tangible diplomatic influence.

Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal has urged Indian entrepreneurs to adapt. innovate, and move beyond tariff protections. Observers say this moment resembles India's 1991 balance-ofpayments crisis, signaling that reform may now be necessary, driven not by financial collapse but by geopolitical imperatives.

As global trade reshapes power structures, India's challenge will be to align domestic policy with strategic opportunity, ensuring its buying power becomes a currency in international diplomacy rather than a missed chance.

## **Amazon Layoffs Highlight Al Transition Challenges**

Global tech industry trembled last week as Amazon announced the layoff of 14,000 employees, part of a broader wave that has seen over 1,72,000 jobs cut across American tech giants, including Meta, Microsoft, Salesforce, and Google. These reductions have sparked concerns about the human cost of automation, especially as artificial intelligence continues to transform workplaces worldwide.

The layoffs contrast sharply with the soaring market value of AI hardware and software leaders. Nvidia, whose chips power AI data centers, recently reached a staggering \$5 trillion market capitalization, while OpenAI, in partnership with Microsoft, plans to develop 30 gigawatts of computing resources at a cost of \$1.4 trillion. Such figures underscore a growing divide between AI-driven wealth creation and workforce

Jensen Huang, Nvidia's CEO, recently highlighted the future demand for skilled trades like electricians and plumbers as AI infrastructure expands. His comments illustrate the duality of the AI revolution: while some jobs are replaced by automation, new roles emerge that require technical, adaptive, and hybrid skill sets. Analysts emphasize that long-term success depends on the ability of workers to reinvent themselves, adapt to new tools, and blend core skills with technological fluency.

The rapid rise of AI has also amplified demand for cybersecurity, data management, and AI-specific roles, as automation tools proliferate. "Agentic AI." which integrates intermediate technologies to enhance automation, demonstrates the need for professionals who can combine coding, industry knowledge, and problem-solving skills. As AI-generated content grows, so does the need for human oversight to manage misuse, maintain trust, and ensure quality. Historical parallels offer lessons for today. The late Sitaram Kesri, former Congress treasurer, was known for his impeccable trustworthiness—a quality still vital in the AI era. Similarly, past technological revolutions, such as electrification or

industrial mechanization, created fears of job losses but ultimately gave rise to new roles. Roy Amara's law, which notes that people overestimate short-term impacts and underestimate long-term change, remains relevant: AI may disrupt now, but it also generates opportunities for those prepared

Experts advise tech professionals to focus on continuous learning, cultivate human-centric skills like trust and teamwork, and maintain financial prudence to navigate this transition. While AI is reshaping the workplace, the combination of human judgment, adaptability, and resilience will remain indispensable in the new

# **India To Launch Heaviest Satellite for Naval Ops**

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is set to launch its heaviest Bahubali rocket, technically known as Launch Vehicle Mark-3 (LVM-3), tomorrow at 5:26 pm from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh. The mission will deploy CMS-03, a satellite dedicated to enhancing the Indian Navy's communication and maritime defence capabilities.

This will be the eighth launch of the LVM-3, which has maintained a 100% success record in its previous seven missions. The rocket stands 43.5 metres tall, equivalent to a 15-floor building, and

liftoff, comparable to 150 fully grown Asian elephants. Its 16-minute flight will employ India's homegrown cryogenic engine.

CMS-03, weighing 4,400 kg, is India's heaviest communications satellite sent to a geosynchronous transfer orbit. It will replace the GSAT-7 (Rukmini) satellite, which has served the Navy since 2013. CMS-03 will provide secure communication links within 2,000 km of India's coastline, connecting naval vessels and assets across multiple frequency bands, strengthening network-

centric operations. Each LVM-3 launch costs around Rs 500 crore, reflecting the high-tech capabilities weighs 642 tonnes at and strategic impor- maritime security.

tance of the mission. During previous naval operations, such as Operation Sindoor, satellites like Rukmini helped maintain maritime security and keep

adversary navies at bay. Additionally, the human-rated version of LVM-3 is designed to support India's crewed space missions, including the upcoming Gaganyaan Mission. The CMS-03 launch underscores India's growing prowess in defence and space technology, combining heavy-lift capabilities with strategic maritime communications.

### **Billionaires Surprise Diners With Fried Chicken Treat**

Seoul diners got an unforgettable surprise Thursday when three global billionaires walked into Kkanbu Chicken, one of the city's most popular spots for chimaek—the Korean pairing of fried

chicken and beer. The trio included Jensen Huang, CEO of AI chip giant Nvidia; Lee Jae-yong, chairman of Samsung Electronics; and Chung Euisun, executive chair of Hyundai Motor Group. Before attending the APEC summit in Gyeongju, the billionaires stopped at the casual eatery to enjoy a re-

laxed evening together. Huang, livestreaming his arrival, said, "I love fried chicken and beer with my friends, so Kkanbu is a perfect place, right?" The restaurant's name, meaning "close friend" in Korean slang, seemed fitting for the informal gathering. The three tucked into cheese balls, cheese sticks, boneless chicken, and fried chicken, washing it down with Terra beer

and soju. Local media captured the billionaires linking arms in a traditional Korean drinking gesture and sharing food

with curious bystanders. Huang rang the restaurant's "golden bell," signaling he would cover everyone's bill. Yonhap News reported that Lee paid the first round, while Chung generously covered a second.

The outing occurred against the backdrop of high-level diplomatic talks at the APEC summit, where Chinese President Xi Jinping and US President Donald Trump were also present. Access to advanced AI chips, like those produced by Nvidia, remains a key issue in ongoing UStrade China negotiations.

On Friday, Huang met South Korean President Lee Jae Myung and announced Nvidia will supply over 260,000 GPUs to South Korean companies, including those led by Samsung, Hyundai, Naver, and SK. The partnerships aim to advance "physical AI" technologies, integrating AI into real-world applications such as autonomous vehicles.

The informal dinner highlighted both the human side of global business leaders and the growing ties between technology, industry, and diplomacy in South Korea.

### **Pakistani Forces Accused** of Torturing Mother and **Daughter in Balochistan**

Pakistani troops have been accused of detaining and torturing a mother and her daughter in the Panjgur district of Balochistan, leaving both critically injured, according to local sources and human rights groups. The incident reportedly took place in the Panchi area, where security forces raided a residence and took the women into custody, later abandoning them at Panjgur Hospital in a semi-conscious state.

Residents claim that the daughter was sexually assaulted by the personnel during the detention. The Human Rights Council of Balochistan (HRCB) condemned the attack as a "horrifying reflection of the impunity and moral decay embedded in Pakistan's security operations in Balo-chistan." In a statement, the council demanded independent inquiry, punishment for the perpetrators, and justice for the victims.

Pakistani authorities have not issued any official statement, fueling public outrage and deepening concerns over the continued pattern of human rights abuses in the region. Human rights defenders describe the act as part of a systematic campaign of violence against Baloch

This case follows a series of similar incidents in recent months. In September, a woman named Safia Bibi was allegedly abducted during a military raid in Khuzdar's Zehri area before being released days later. Earlier this year, 23-year-old student Mahjabeen Baloch disappeared from her hostel in Quetta, five days after her brother was taken into custody.

Activists warn that the cycle of violence and impunity in Balochistan continues to escalate mistrust between the state and the Baloch population. Without transparent investigations and accountability, human rights groups fear further deterioration of civil rights in the province.

# "You'll Find Out Very Soon": Trump Keeps World **Guessing On Nuclear Test Order**

President Donald Trump has reignited global uncertainty by signaling plans to test U.S. nuclear weapons, without specifying whether the tests would involve live detonations. Speaking to reporters aboard Air Force One, Trump said, "You'll find out very soon, but we're going to do some testing... Other countries do it. If they're going to do it, we're going do it.'

Trump first announced the move via social media Thursday, just before a summit with Chinese President Xi Jinping in South Korea. The comments follow Russia's recent tests of a nuclearpowered cruise missile and an underwater nuclear-capable drone.

The announcement drew immediate criticism internationally. Iran called the plan "regressive and irresponsible," while Japan's Nihon Hidankyo, a group of atomic bomb survivors, condemned it as contradicting global efforts for nuclear disarmament.

Domestically, Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth defended the plan, calling it "a pretty responsible, very



responsible way" to maintain a credible nuclear deterrent. "We need to have a credible nuclear deterrent," he said, suggesting that testing could reduce the risk of nuclear

China urged the United States to honor global nuclear testing bans, and UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres warned that nuclear tests "can never be permitted under any circumstances." The U.S. has

been a signatory to the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty since 1996, which bans all nuclear detonations.

Russia also pushed back, emphasizing that its recent weapons tests should not be considered nuclear detonations. Moscow hinted that any U.S. return to live testing could prompt a similar response.

The U.S. last conducted a nuclear test in 1992, following which a moratorium control.

# "She Is Not Christian, Has No Plans To Convert": **JD Vance On Wife Amid Row**

Vance explained that his wife played a role in



encouraging him to reengage with his faith years ago. He said, "She is not a Christian and has no plans to convert, but like

many people in an interfaith marriage—or any interfaith relationship—I hope she may one day see things as I do." He also

condemned social media posts criticizing his statements, saying they "wreaked of anti-Christian bigotry."

At a Turning Point USA event in Mississippi, Vance noted that Usha joins him and their children at church. "Do I

hope, eventually, that she is somehow moved by the same thing that I was moved by in church? Yeah, I honestly do wish that because I believe in the Christian gospel," he said. He added, however, that her personal choice is respected: "If she doesn't, then God says everybody has free will, and so that doesn't cause a problem for me. # Obama Rallies Democrats Ahead of Election Day

Former US President Barack Obama is set to headline rallies in Virginia and New Jersey this weekend, energizing Democratic voters ahead of Tuesday's elections. The campaign appearances come amid a high-stakes political climate, 10 months into Donald Trump's second presidency and a year before the midterm elections.

The gubernatorial contests are heavily influenced by economic concerns, rising costs, and federal issues such as the ongoing shutdown. Spanberger and Sherrill emphasize economic relief and criticize Trump's policies, while Republicans argue Democrats bear responsibility for energy prices and federal gridlock. Social issues, including abortion and transgender policies, are also part of the campaigns.

## FPIs Net Buy ₹14,610 Crore in October After Three **Months of Outflows**



Foreign Portfolio Investors (FPIs) made a strong return to Indian equities in October, net buying shares worth ₹14,610 crore, marking the first inflow after three consecutive months of heavy selling. This represents the largest monthly FPI inflow since July 2025, according to market data from the Bombay Stock Exchange

Despite this positive trend in October, FPIs have sold a cumulative ₹1.39 lakh crore in Indian equities so far this year, making it the worst annual outflow in three years. Ana-

lysts point out that while the recent inflow is a relief for domestic markets, the broader trend indicates cautious sentiment among global investors due to economic uncertainties and geopolitical factors.

Comparatively, FPIs sold about ₹1.68 lakh crore during the first 10 months of 2022, and in 2024, global funds still managed to net buy a marginal ₹6,593 crore. However, on a year-on-year basis, the situation has slightly improved: October 2025's inflow contrasts sharply with the same month last year, when FPIs sold a record ₹94,017 crore.

Market experts attribute the return of FPIs to a combination of factors, including attractive valuations in Indian equities, easing global interest rate concerns, and improved corporate earnings. They caution, however, that continued inflows will depend on sustained macroeconomic stability and investor confidence.

The inflows also provided a boost to key indices on the BSE and National Stock Exchange (NSE), reflecting renewed foreign interest and stabilizing market sentiment. Analysts believe that while short-term volatility may persist, October's FPI activity indicates that India remains an attractive destination for global investors seeking long-term growth.

## Maruti Suzuki Q2 Profit Rises 7% to Rs 3,293 Crore

Maruti Suzuki India on Friday reported a 7% increase in consolidated net profit to Rs 3,293 crore for the September quarter, up from Rs 3,069 crore in the same period last year.

The company's revenue from operations grew 13% year-onyear, reaching Rs 42,101 crore, compared with Rs 37,203 crore in Q2 FY2024-25. Total income for the quarter rose to Rs 43,014 crore from Rs 38,678 crore in the corresponding period last

EBITDA for the quarter stood at Rs 4,434 crore, slightly higher than Rs 4,417 crore a year ago, while EBITDA margin softened to 10.53% from 11.87% YoY, reflecting higher input costs and operating expenses.

For the first half of FY2025-26 (April-September), Maruti Suzuki recorded total sales of 1,078,735 units, comprising 871,276 domestic sales and a record half-yearly exports of 207,459 units. The company's total volume grew 1.4% YoY, primarily driven by a 39.9% surge in exports.

The automaker also achieved its highest-ever half-yearly net sales of Rs 76,760.6 crore, up from Rs 69,464.4 crore during the same period last year, highlighting sustained demand across domestic and interna-



tional markets.

Industry experts noted that while domestic demand remains stable, strong export growth is emerging as a key

driver for Maruti Suzuki's performance. The company's focus on new model launches, enhanced production efficiency, and expanded international

presence is expected to further bolster revenue and profitability in the coming quarters.

### **GST Collections in October Hit Rs 1.95 Lakh Crore**



India's Goods and Services Tax (GST) collections for October 2025 reached Rs 1.95 lakh crore, marking a 4.6% year-on-year (YoY) increase, according to official data released on Friday. The growth reflects continued economic activity and compliance across sectors despite global and domestic economic challenges.

After accounting for refunds, the net GST revenue stood at Rs 1.69 lakh crore, registering a modest 0.6% increase compared to October 2024. The numbers underscore the government's efforts in streamlining tax administration and widening the taxpayer

Finance analysts said the rise in GST collections was largely driven by robust performance in fuel, telecom, and consumer goods sectors, alongside strong contributions from manufacturing and services. They noted that the collection trend indicates steady domestic consumption

and business activity. The government has been emphasizing the use of digital platforms and e-invoicing to improve compliance and reduce tax evasion, measures that appear to have positively influenced revenue growth. Additionally, refunds processed during the month were in line with previous years, ensuring liquidity for export-

ers and businesses. GST revenue continues to play a key role in India's fiscal health. funding infrastructure projects, social welfare schemes, and state allocations. Officials noted that maintaining consistent growth in collections is critical as the government works to achieve its fiscal deficit targets.

Economic experts believe that the current trend reflects resilience in India's economy, with gradual recovery in sectors impacted by global supply chain disruptions. Boa Constrictors, native to Central and South America, are non-venomous constrictor snakes that can grow up to 13 feet. They give birth to live young and are generally considered non-threatening to humans. Experts note that many fears around these snakes stem from misunderstandings, particularly during skin shedding, known as ecdysis.

Lopes explained that her snake was shedding its skin at the time of the incident. "During shedding, a snake's eyes are covered by a protective layer that temporarily impairs vision," she said. "Their body also becomes more opaque, which can make them feel vulnerable and defensive.3 The clouded eyes and duller skin visible in the video were indicators of this natural

The content creator emphasized that the snake's reaction was defensive, not aggressive. She also stressed the importance of regular, careful handling to acclimate snakes to human interaction. Supervision and proper safety measures are crucial during any close encounters, especially when snakes are shedding, feeding, or

Wildlife specialists advise that while snakes can coexist safely with humans under controlled conditions, owners must understand natural behaviors to prevent accidents. Lopes' video serves as both an entertaining moment and an important reminder of the responsibilities involved in keeping large reptiles as pets.

# Why We Don't Feel the Earth Moving



Even though the Earth is constantly spinning and hurtling through space, we don't feel any of this motion — and that's because everything around us is moving along at the same steady pace. The Earth rotates once every 24 hours, which means someone standing on the equator is travelling at about 1,600 km per hour due to the planet's spin. At the same time, the Earth orbits the Sun at an astonishing 1,07,000 km per hour.

Despite these immense speeds, we don't sense any movement because it's smooth and constant. Our bodies, including our inner ears — which help detect balance and motion — can only feel changes in speed or direction, known as acceleration. For example, when a car suddenly starts, stops, or turns, we feel it immediately. But once the car cruises smoothly at a constant speed, that sensation disappears unless we look

The same principle applies to the Earth. Since its rotation and revolution are stable and unchanging, there's no acceleration for us to detect. Everything - the air, oceans, buildings, and even our bodies — moves together with the planet, maintaining a constant relative position.

We only notice Earth's motion indirectly, through natural phenomena like day and night, caused by the planet's rotation, or seasons, resulting from its orbit around the Sun and tilted axis. Without these clues, there's nothing in our everyday experience to suggest we're moving at such extraordinary

In short, the reason we don't feel the Earth move is not because it isn't moving — it's because it moves perfectly smoothly, carrying us along with everything else on its surface

But when the viewer does not know it's fake, then you are crossing a line." Tyson emphasized that many public figures have been deepfaked in ways that distort their words or harm their credibility.
