## CM REVANTH REDDY SLAMS MODI-KCR NEXUS, **DEFENDS AZHARUDDIN'S CABINET POST**

hief Minister A. Reva nth Reddy delivered a fiery speec h at Paramou nt Colon y in the Shaikpet Division, forcefully addres sing criticism, asserting his secular credentials, and launching a sharp attack on both the BJP and the BRS leadership. He accused PM Modi of protecting KCR, pointing out that the Central government has ignored the request for a CBI inleged 1 lakh crore corruption in the Kales hwaram project. In a sig-

nificant accusation, he claimed that the Governor is deliberately delaying permission for the arrest of KCR's son, K. T. Rama Rao (KTR), in the alleged Car Race case, stating the relevant documents have been with the Governor for two months. He noted the hypocrisy that while Modi's agencies (ED, Income Tax, CBI) harass others, they avoid taking action against KCR and KTR. ### **BEAVER SUPER MOON DAZZLES ON KARTHIKA POURNAMI**

New Delhi, Nov 5

he skies offered a spectacular celestial show on We dnesday, November 5, coinciding with the auspicious day of Karthika Pournami, as a Super Moon illuminated the night sky. Th e phenomenon, official ly known as the Beaver Super Moon, was prom inently visible at exactly 6:49 PM on Wednesday evening, captivating sky-gazers across the region. During this event, the Moon appeared significantly larger and brighter than it does during a regular full moon. Specifically, the Super Moon was visible at an enhanced size, appearing 13 per cent larger and shining 30 per cent more brightly than an average full moon. Thi s awe-inspiring spectacle occurs when the Moon, while orbiting the Earth, reaches the point in its path that is closest to our planet. The Moon's orbit aro und the Earth is not perfectly circular but elliptical (oval-shaped). When the Moon reaches the nearest point to Earth in this elliptical orbit—a point known as perigee—and this ali gnment occurs during the full moon phase, it

results in a Super Moon. On this occasion, the Moon was approximately 3,57,000 kilometers away from the Earth, which is much closer than its average distance, thus making it appear larger. This particular Super Moon was noted as the second one to occur this year, making it a special astronomical event for the public to witness on the religiously significant day of Kart hika Pournami. The confluence of the astronomical wonder with the sacred full moon day added an extra layer of spiritual and visual beauty to the night.



#### **BRS CADRES PROTEST AT BJP MP'S HOUSE OVER COTTON PROCUREMENT RESTRICTIONS**

Hyderabad, Nov 5

ension escalated at the residence of BJP MP G. Nag esh in Adilabad after cadres of the Bhar at Rashtra Sam ithi (BRS) staged a veh eme nt protest demanding that the central gov ernment immediately remove the stringent restrictions imposed on cotton procurement in the state. BRS leaders and workers organized the demonstration in front of the Adilaba d MP's house, with protestors attempting to force their way into the premises, leading to a chaotic situation. Police personnel rushed to the scene to interve ne, resulting in a scuffle between the officers and the protesting BRS workers. Subsequently, the police detained former minister Jogu Ramanna and several other BRS leaders who were spearheading the agitation. The protest was specifically target-

Corporation of India (CCI) for its recent imposition of procurement limits. The CCI has restricted the procurement limit to a mere seven quintals per acre from the farmers, a drastic reduction from the previous 13 quintals per acr e. Jogu Ramanna stron gly criticized the Central government for introducing these new conditions and capping the total quantity to be procured. He also slam med the CCI for its refu sal to grant exemptions for cotton with a higher moisture content, compounding the difficulties faced by far mers. Adilabad distric t, which shares a border with Maharashtra, is recognized as a major cotton production hub, and farmers at the local agricultural market yard have already been staging protests over the CCI's restrictive policies. The BRS leaders were demand-

ed agai nst the Cotton ing that MP G. Nagesh exert immediate pressure on the Centre to lift these damaging restrictions. Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao has officially addressed the issue, writing a detailed letter to Union Textiles Minister Gir iraj Singh and CCI Ma naging Director Lalit Kumar Gupta. The Minister highlighted reports from District Collectors indicating that the average cotton yield in Telangana is approxima tely 11.74 quintals per acre. He argued that reducing the procurement limit to just seven quintals per acre would inevitably cause heavy financial losses for the state's farmers. Minister Rao further urged the CCI to show leniency and procure cotton with up to 20 per cent moisture content, reasoning that farmers have already suffered significant losses due to recent heavy and unseasonal rainfall.

# HYDERABAD-BORN GHAZALA HASHMI SCRIPTS HISTORY, WINS VIRGINIA LT GOVERNOR RACE

Hyderabad, Nov 5

yderabad-born Democrat Ghazala Hashmi has created history by winning the race for Lieute nant Governor of Virginia. She has become the first Muslim, the first South Asian American, and the first Indian-origin woman to ever hold the post. Six years after making history with her election as a Virginia state Senator, the 61-yearold politician set another record by defeating Republican John Reid. She is set to succeed Republican Winsome Earle-Sea rs, who was the first wo man to hold the position. Ghazala Firdous Hashmi was born in Hyderabad



ly childhood at her maternal grandparents' home in the Malakpet area. Her maternal gra ndfather served in the Finance Department of the Andhra Pradesh government. At the age of four, she relocated to the United States with her mother and older brother to ioin her father, who was pursuing a PhD in Georgia. Growing up in a sm all college town during the desegregation of public schools, she witness ed firsthand the intentional efforts to bridge cultural and socioeconomic divides. Hashmi earned a Bachelor of Arts in English from Georgia Southern University and a Ph D in American literature from Emory University in Atlanta. After moving legislative focus includes to the Richmond area in 1991 with her husband, Azhar, she dedicated ne arly 30 years to academia, teaching first at the University of Richmond and then at Reynolds Community College, whe re she founded and led the Center for Excellence in Teaching and Learning (CETL). Her decision to enter politics was significantly motivated by Donald Trump's travel ban on several Muslim-majority countries, driving her to advocate for inclusion and equality.


In November 2019, she was elected to the Virginia state Senate, becoming the first Muslim-American woman and the first Indian-American to achieve the feat in that chamber. Her

crucial Democratic priorities such as public education, reproductive freedom, voting rights, gun violence prevention, environmental protection, housing, and affordable healthcare. In 2024, she was named Chair of the powerful Senate Education and Health Committee. Meanwhile, Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) Working President and former Telangana minister K. T. The list of approved alternative documents is extensive and designed to accommodate various forms of government-issued identification. It includes the Aadhaar Car d; MGNREGA Job Card; Passbooks issued by Banks or Post Offices containing a photograph; the Health Insurance Smart try of Labour or Ayushman Bharat Health Card; Driving License; PAN Card; Smart Card issued by the Registrar General of India (RGI) under the National Population Register (NPR); Indian Passport; Photo-Affixed Pension Documents; official Employee ID Cards issued by Central/State Governments, PSUs, or Public Limited Companies; Official Identity Cards issued to sitting MPs, MLAs, or MLCs; and the Unique Disability ID (UDID) Card issued by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment. Commissioner Karnan emphasized a crucial distinction: while Voter Information Slips have been distributed to inform voters of their polling station details, these slips are not valid as identity proof for casting a vote. He stressed that voters must present either the EPIC card or one of the 12 alternative photo ID cards to be permitted to vote, underscoring the Election Commission of India's commitment to a secure and accessible



#### **CISF Seizes 22 High-End Drones** Worth 26.7 Lakh at Hyd Airport

TPN Bureau | Oct 5, 2025 — The Central **Industrial Security** Force (CISF) successfully seized 22 highend drones valued at approximately 26.7 lakh at the Rajiv Gandhi International Airport in Hyderabad. The major seizure occurred on Tuesday after personnel from the CISF's specialized Crime and Intelligence Wing (CIW) identified and intercepted a suspicious passenger based on advanced profiling and behavioral indicators. The passenger had arrived from Singapore, and the CISF team noted a highly suspicious exchange of two bags with another individual in the airport's arrival area, which immediately raised red flags. Given the sensitive nature of the airport environment and the potential security risks associated with unverified equipment, the CISF acted swiftly. The luggage was immediately escorted and subjected to screening at a city-side X-BIS point, where the CISF personnel recovered the en-

tire consignment. The seized items included 22 DJI mini 5 pro drones, along with their 22 remote controllers and related accessories. The DJI Mini series is known for its compact size yet highend features, making it a valuable target for illegal smuggling to evade customs duties and taxes. The estimated value of the recovered items is a significant 26.7 lakh. The items, strongly suspected to be part of a commercial smuggling operation, were subsequently handed over to the Customs Department for the necessary legal action under import and customs laws. The CISF reiterated its firm commitment to maintaining stringent security protocols, preventing the illegal smuggling of high-value and potentially sensitive technology, and safeguarding the nation's aviation gateways against both economic and security threats. The use of behavioral analytics by the CIW proved critical in disrupting this substantial smuggling

# 192 Bottles Illegally Imported **Liquor Worth 5.76 Lakh Seized**



TPN Bureau | Oct 5. 2025 — The Ranga Reddy Enforcement Team successfully intercepted and seized a consignment of illegally imported liquor, valued at approximately 5.76 lakh, as part of a targeted special enforcement drive. Acting on specific intelligence reports indicating that individuals were attempting to smuggle liquor into Telangana from other regions for illegal sale and tax evasion, the enforcement team set up strategic vehicle checks near Sharif Pahad. The intelligence suggested that smugglers were capitalizing on the significant price difference of alcohol between states like Telangana and regions with lower excise duties, such as Delhi, Goa, and Puducherry. This difference makes it profitable for illicit trade, with high-end brands often being transported by air before being channeled into the state's black market.

During the inspections, the enforcement team intercepted multiple vehicles and found a total of 192 liquor bottles being transported illegally, a quantity that significantly exceeds the personal consumption limits permitted by the drive, underscores the

scale of smuggling clearly indicated commercial intent rather than personal use. The Enforcement Team, led by AES Jeevan Kiran, promptly issued notices to the 20 individuals involved in transporting the illicit consignment. The Director of Excise Enforcement, Shanwas Qasim, and the Ranga Reddy Enforcement Assistant Commissioner, R. He then accused the Congress administration of effectively halting or reversing many projects,

to contest from Kamareddv in 2023 to defeat a Muslim leader and his actions to strip him and Dalit leader Bhatti Vikra marka of the Leader of the Opposition posts by engineering party

Shabbir Ali enumerated the detrimental effects of BRS rule, noting that over 80% of minority colleges had been shut down and no Muslim held a key administrative position, such as Vice-Chancellor in any of the eleven state universities or a position on the TSPSC or Information Commission. He also accused the BRS of neglecting Urdu education and failing to recover even an inch of encroached Waqf lands, despite making promises. In stark contrast, he showcased the transformative work of the

Congress government under Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, emphasizing that welfare is now inclusive and data-driven. Key achievements highlighted include the sanctioning of 2,200 additional engineering seats for minority students, alongside new law and pharmacy colleges. The government has launched the ambitious Young India Integrated Residential Schools initiative, allocating 225 crore for 76 new schools on 25 acres each, with minorities now being treated on par with SC, ST, and BC students. Furthermore, the government has significantly increased diet charges (40%) and allowances for girl students (200%), distributed fine rice to all households, and issued thousands of new ration cards (including 40,000 in Jubilee Hills).

# Congress Itself Is Electricity: Deputy CM Hails ₹1.6 Lakh Cr Welfare Push

2025 — Telangana Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka, spe aking at a public meeting in the Parigi constituency, equated the Congress party with reliable energy, declaring, "Congress itself is electricity, and electricity itself is Congress." He challenged opposition leaders who had falsely claimed that power supply would cease if the Congress assumed office, asserting that they would now "realise the truth when they experience both Congress and current." The Deputy CM leveraged the address to provide a comprehensive report on the government's welfare and development commitments across the state, with a specific fo-

nounced that a massive 1,000 crore worth of electricity development works have been sanctioned for the constituency, which includes the establishment of nine new substations, including 33/11 kV, 220 kV, and 400 kV substations, to support future industrial expansion.

Highlighting the success of the Gruha Jyothi scheme, Vikramarka noted that the government is providing 200 units of free electricity to 53 lakh families statewide, including 44,500 households in the Parigi constituency alone. He revealed that the state government is currently remitting 2,830 crore every month to the Electricity Department to



cover the costs of this scheme for poor households. Vikramarka also announced the launch of "Prajabatha" (public outreach), a dedicated program where Electricity Department officials will conduct door-to-door outreach three days a week

vehicles, promoting accessibility and respon siveness.

The Deputy CM relentlessly criticized the previous BRS government for its 10 years of neglect, accusing them of letting systems collapse and neglecting key projects like the 3,000 crore Naivel project and the long-pending Manneguda-Bijapur road, which the Congress government swiftly secured NGT clearance for. He slammed the BRS for unfulfilled promises like the 3-acre land scheme, a job for every household, and the construction of double-bedroom houses. In contrast, he stated that the Congress gover nment has already sanctioned 4.5 lakh Indiramma houses statewide at 5 lakh each. Summarizing the administration's commitment, Vikramarka disclosed that the government has already spent a colossal 1,60,310 crore exclusively on welfare initiatives, including Rythu Bharosa, loan waivers, crop bonuses, and fine rice distribution to 93 lakh families. Furthermore, he noted the sanctioning of 100 Integrated Schools across the state at a cost of 200 crore each—including one in Parigi—to provide world-class education. He concluded with a defiant message, stating, "No opposition can stop Telangana Rising," and reassured the public that the Congress government is working for them "every moment."

The BRS asserted that an individual holding the

high constitutional office of Chief Minister must adhere to the highest standards of public discourse, especially during an electoral period. The complaint accuses CM Rev anth Reddy of openly defying the Model Co de of Conduct (MCC) by engaging in personal, derogatory attacks against an opposition leader. The BRS leaders argued that such politically charged, inflammatory language not only compromises the dignity of public office but is also explicitly designed to prejudice the electoral process and incite hatred or negative emotions among the voters of the Jubilee Hills constituency, which constitutes a clear and severe violation of the election code. They specifically referred to remarks where the CM

questioned the propriety of KTR's family property and publicly linked him to ongoing investigations. The BRS delegation dema nded that the Returning Officer take strict and immediate action against the Chief Minister. TPN Bureau | Oct 5, 2025 — An escalating environmental crisis in the Quthbullapur area, specifically within the limits of the Dundigal Municipality, is fueling local residents' outrage as municipal authorities are being accused of actively turning a blind eye to illegal chemical waste cleaning operations. Local residents are expressing grave concerns that the unchecked dumping of chemical effluent is systematically destroying green fields and will imminently lead to the severe contamination of groundwater. Despite the local media highlighting the issue, the response



from officials has been condemned as a mere formality: the municipal authorities issue notices but reportedly fail to follow up with any substantive action, allowing the illegal activities to resume the very next day.

The chemical waste cleaning units, operating openly amidst agricultural land in the Baoorampet village limits, have been running their illegal activities with blatant disregard for the official notices.

Local critics are openly questioning the authority and effectiveness of the municipal administration, suggesting that the operators' brazen defiance of the notices—in effect, throwing down a challenge to the officials—indicates a severe breakdown in regulatory enforcement. While Subhash Naidu, the Dundigal Municipal Sanitation Officer, conducted a site inspection and subsequently issued notices following reports by True Point News, local residents note that 20 days have passed without any concrete punitive measures being taken. This prolonged

inaction has naturally led to suspicions regarding the potential involvement or complicity of local municipal officials in allowing the illegal operations to continue. Residents pointed out that the area, especially the nearby Jeedimetla Industrial Area, already suffers from widespread groundwater pollution, where all borewells yield only contaminated water. They warned that if the situation in Baoorampet is allowed to persist, their green fields will soon face the same fate, with all borewells yielding only polluted water instead of potable water. Furthermore, the absence of Pollution Control Board (PCB) officials and the seemingly indifferent local Environment Department staff have compounded the situation, leaving the residents feeling abandoned. The community is demanding that the authorities immediately and effectively crack down on these chemical waste cleaning organizations and have publicly stated that if the Dundigal Municipal and PCB officials do not take swift action, they will escalate the matter to the attention of the Medchal Collector to ensure the protection of their environment and health.



#### **Labourer Killed After Asking For Lift, 4 Held**

TPN Bureau | Oct 5, 2025 — The Hyderabad Police have cracked the brutal murder case of a laborer that occurred within the Nacharam Police Station limits, revealing a shocking crime of extreme cruelty committed by a group of four inebriated youth. The victim, identified as Muralikrishna, had merely asked for a lift, which led to approximately four hours of horrific torture culminating in his violent death. According to Nacharam CI Dhanunjaya, the primary accused is Mohammed Junaid alias Zafar (18), a ninthgrade dropout from Raghavendra Nagar with a history of delinquent behavior, including a previous case registered against him under the POCSO Act at the same police station five months ago. Junaid had taken his father's shift car to drive around the city with his friends. The co-accused were identified as Shaik Saifuddin (18) from Indira Nagar, Pon na Manikantha (21) from Karthikeya Nagar, and a 16-year-old minor boy from K.L. Reddy Nagar, Mallap ur. The incident began in the early hours of Sunday. The four accused, heavily intoxicated, reached L.B. Nagar at around 2:00 AM after leaving Nacharam at 1:00 AM. Murali krishna, who was trave ling from his brother's residence in Jillelaguda to his home in Chilkanagar, asked the gr oup for a lift near L.B. Nagar and got into th eir car. A minor quarrel quickly erupted between the victim and the inebriated, criminally-inclined youth. When the victim, who was also reportedly under the influence of alcohol, retaliated and resisted, the argument escalated into a violent physical confrontation. The accused viciously assaulted Muralikrishna inside the car. Later, feeling hungry, the group stopped for tiffin near the NTR Circle in Habsiguda. When Muralikrishna tried to seize the opportunity to escape, the four immediately overpowered him, forced him back into the vehicle, and locked him inside. They then drove to a desolate area near the Nacharam Industrial Area. The torture continued in the car for approximately four hours as Muralikrishna fiercely resisted the relentless assault. Finally, around 5:00 AM, the principal accused, Mohammed Junaid, retrieved a knife he had brought with him. He then perpetrated the final, fatal act of stabbing the victim multiple times in a "most barbaric and ruthless manner," leading to Muralikrishna's instantaneous death. The police have successfully arrested the four individuals, closing the case that highlights the alarming rise in youth-involved crimes and severe lack of empathy.

#### **STF SEIZES 425 GRAMS OF GANJA AND OG KUSH IN TWO RAIDS**

TPN Bureau | Oct 5, 2025 — The Special Task Force (STF) Detention Team (DT), led by CI Nagaraju, has delivered a significant blow to narcotics distribution in Hyderabad by successfully seizing a total of 425 grams of Ganja in two separate, intelligence-led operations. These actions underscore the Hyderabad Police's ongoing, concerted anti-drug drive aimed at curbing the illegal peddling of contraband across the city. The first major operation targeted a gang near the DMR Mills under Lower Tank Bund, acting on specific intelligence regarding ongoing Ganja sales in the vicinity. The STF team conducted a swift raid, resulting in the apprehension of two individuals, identified as Arogva Rahul and Nandakisho re. From their possessio n, the police confiscated a substantial quantity of 400 grams of Ganja. Both arrested individuals were subsequently handed over to the Musheerabad Police Station for the formal registration of a case under the

Narcotic Drugs and Psy-




chotropic Substances (NDPS) Act and the commencement of further investigations.

The same highly active STF DT team conducted a second successful raid in the western part of the city. This operation took place near the Botanical Garden on Road Number 3 in Kondapur. This area is known to be a hotspot for the sale of high-value and exotic cannabis varieties. The team intercepted an individual identified as Mylarishetty Sai Varma. In this instance, the police seized 25 grams of a highly potent strain of cannabis known as OG Kush, which commands a significantly higher street value due to its quality and rarity. Sai Varma was promptly arrested and transferred to the Serilingampally Excise Station for the necessary legal processing under the relevant Excise laws pertaining to the possession and sale of controlled substances. The total value of the seized drugs is substantial, indicating that both arrests have disrupted key elements of the local narcotics supply chain. These back-to-back seizures highlight the police department's increased reliance on specialized intelligence units like the STF to combat the growing drug menace in educational and residential areas of Hyderabad. The police have also issued an appeal to the public to remain vigilant and report any suspicious activities related to drug sales to law enforcement, reinforcing their commitment to maintaining a drug-free environment in the city.

### Citizens Rally Behind HYDRAA, **Credit Agency for Flood Relief**

The demonstrations began with morning wa lkers near Bathukamma Kunta in Amberpet and escalated with a major rally near the Ma rri Chettu (Banyan Tre e) in Manikonda, organized by residents from approximately 15 colonies. These citizens pro udly held placards proclaiming "HYDRAA Zindabad," emphasizing the body's critical role in rescuing over 1,000 crore worth of park lan ds in the Manikonda Municipality, thereby safeguarding the city's essential green spaces

#### **Balanagar SOT Raids Illegal Nizampet Hookah Center,**

Seizes 1 Lakh Contraband TPN Bureau | Oct 5, 2025 — The Balanagar Special Operations Team (SOT) police executed a targeted raid on an illegal hookah center operating within the limits of the Bachupally Police Station, delivering a sig nificant blow against the unauthorized sale and consumption of restricted substances. Acting on credible intelligence, the SOT team targeted the "DI Coffee Shop" in Nizampet, which was found to be operating as a full-fledged hookah center without the necessary legal permissions. The police investigation revealed that the establishment lacked all requisite documentation. including GST registration, a Labor Certificate, and crucially, any official permission from the High Court or related statutory bodies to legally run a hookah center. The owner's failure to secure these mandatory clearances—whi ch are typically stringent due to the health and safety risks associated with hookah consumption, particularly among minors prompted the decisive

The SOT team prom ptly took three individuals into custody in connection with the illegal operations. The arrested were

identified as Arivalli Chaitanva Kumar, the owner of the premises; Banavath Jay Singh Rathod, the manager responsible for daily operations; and MD. Bashu. The police registered a case and seized a substantial cache of materials us ed in the illegal trade, totaling an estimated value of 1,09,500. The confiscated items included 17 hookah pots valued at 50,000; 13 boxes of hookah flavors (containing both nicotine and herbal substances) valued at 8,500; 9 packets of specialized charcoal worth 2,100; silver foil, and three mobile phones used to facilitate the illegal business, valued at 30,000. Following the raid, the SOT police reiterated their commitment to public safety and warned that they would continue to intensify raids on all establishments found operating illegally or compromising the health of the public,

particularly youth.

# 20,000 Devotees Throng Chandippa Shiva Temple for Karthika Pournami

# **BRS Slams Congress Over Fatal Chevella Bus Accident**



TPN Bureau | Nov 5. 2025 — The Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) party delivered a scathing condemnation of the Congress government and Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, following the tragic Chevella bus accident that resulted in 12 fatalities, many of whom were from the Tandur area. Addressing a press conference at Telangana Bhavan, BRS lea ders-including Rajendranagar In-charge Patolla Karthik Reddy and former MLAs Metuku Anand and Pilot Rohit Re ddy—accused the ruling party of gross negligenc e, particularly concerning the maintenance of the Bijapur National Highway. Karthik Reddy highlighted that the highway project, which is crucial for safety, was sanctioned in 2021 but remains stalled due to an NGT stay sought over the protection of banyan trees. He laid the blame squarely on the current administration, stating that the Project Director failed to submit the necessary proposals to the NGT to get the stay vaca ted for two years, leading

to catastrophic delays

and, ultimately, the accident. Reddy questioned the government's priorities, noting the irony that the Speaker and the Chief Minister themselves use this very road, yet display a clear lack of

responsibility. The leaders escalated their criticism, focusing on the lack of compassion and humanity shown by the Congress government. Former MLA Metuku Anand fiercely questioned the Chief Minister's focus, suggesting his entire attention is on the Jubilee Hills by-election rather than on the lives of the people. Anand condemned the shocking and insensitive act of transporting the bodies of the deceased in a towing vehicle, an action he called proof of the government's lack of humanity. He posed a fundamental question to the administration: "Are the lives of trees more important than the lives of people?" Anand also reserved strong words for the CM's alleged use of indecent language, demanding to know if the Chief Minister considers himself a "street rowdy or a goonda." Furthermore, he derided the state cabinet, labeling the ministers as mere "Palli Batanis" (peanuts) for their perceived incompetence.

The BRS leaders also targeted Congress MP Konda Vishweshwar Reddy, accusing him of politicizing the tragedy while bereaved families were still grieving. They demanded that the MP, who has served for two vears, account for his contributions to the Vikarabad constituency, suggesting that individuals like him are the reason the BJP has failed to gain public trust. Pilot Rohit Reddy expressed profound sorrow that no Congress leader had bothered to visit the affected families in Tandur even two days after the tragedy. He warned that if the government does not immediately initiate the road works to prevent further fatalities, BRS leaders and activists from the Tandur and Vikarabad regions would mobilize a foot march to lay siege to the Secretariat, vowing to fight for public safety and accoun

# **Excise Seizes 51.9 Kg** Ganja in Khammam, **Two Arrested**

A highly effective operation by the Khammam Excise Enforcement team has led to the seizure of a massive consignment of illicit drugs, successfully disrupting a major inter-state smuggling network. The operation, conducted as part of a strategic Special Drive directed by Excise **Enforcement Director** Shanwas Qasim, resulted in the confiscation of 51.9 kilograms of Ganja with an estimated street value of 26 lakh. Sub-Ins pector Srihari Rao and his team intercepted the drug traffickers at the Bhadrachalam Kunavaram Cross Road after receiving specific intel ligence. The smugglers were transporting the large consignment illegally in a car from Odisha with the ultimate destination being Kerala, highlighting the sophisticated geographical

reach of the illicit trade.

cials executed a thorough inspection of the vehicle, which revealed the cunning method of concealment: the Ganja packets were tightly packed and hidden within the car's engine bay. This strategic location was clearly designed to evade routine police and excise checks, underscoring the professionalism of the smuggling

operation. The team suc cessfully recovered the entire 51.9 kg consign ment. Following the seizure, the police promptly arrested two individuals who were in the vehicle and are residents of Kerala: Zakariya Paryal and Nasira Purtiya Vettal. However, a third person involved in the network, Kandula Ravi from Sur yapet, remains at large, and a case has been registered against him. The enforcement team also

seized the car used for

the transport, as well as an associated bike, as part of the evidence. The two arrested individuals, the Ganja, and the vehicles were subsequently handed over to the CI of the Bhadrachalam Excise Station for formal processing.

Assistant Commissioner Ganesh commended the Excise staff for their dedication and professionalism in successfully intercepting the significant shipment. He confirmed that Assistant Excise Superintendent (AES) Karam Chand has been assigned to conduct the detailed investigation into the case. This major bust is a testament to the intensified efforts by the Telangana Excise Enforcement Wing to crack down on the trafficking of narcotics across state borders, sending a strong warning to drug smugglers utilizing Telangana's highways.









Under the blazing floodlights of DY Patil Stadium, history was rewritten on Sunday night. India's women's cricket team lifted the 2025 Women's World Cup, delivering a performance that has already been hailed as the sport's own "1983 moment." The echoes of that legendary triumph at Lord's rang out once again — this time led by captain Harmanpreet

Kaur, whose running catch sealed a win that sent fireworks blazing across the nation.

More than a sporting milestone, this victory represents a cultural transformation. For

decades, Indian women's cricket has battled neglect, patriarchal doubt, and institutional apathy. The journey from being ignored to inspiring millions has been long and often lonely. Stories abound of past struggles — from inadequate support to outright hostility. In 2011, then BCCI president N. Srinivasan reportedly remarked, "If I had my way, I wouldn't

allow your women's team to play cricket." That sentiment, once emblematic of official indifference, has now been buried under the roar of 50,000 fans celebrating India's world

Captain Harmanpreet Kaur's own career mirrors that struggle. Despite global success, she once failed to secure a police job through the sports quota, a privilege easily granted to lesserachieving male athletes. Her resilience, and that of her teammates, reflects a generational defiance — women who refused to yield despite systemic bias, poor infrastructure, and financial insecurity.

Sunday's triumph also marks the democratisation of Indian cricket. This is no longer a sport of privilege or metro elitism. The team's composition tells a story of India itself players hailing from Moga, Kadapa, Rohru, Siliguri, Sangli, Ghuwara, Golaghat, and tribal belts. Fast bowler Kanti Goud, from a remote tribal region, stands as a symbol of a new India where talent trumps background.

The seeds of this revolution were planted in 2017, when India reached the World Cup final in England. Though that campaign ended in heartbreak, it ignited a nationwide passion for women's cricket. It built an audience and earned respect that set the stage for the triumph of 2025.

Behind this success

families who invested everything — financially and emotionally — in their daughters' dreams, often facing ridicule and resistance. Their sacrifices, combined with the growing media coverage and the rise of the Women's Premier League (WPL), have provided the visibility, sponsorship, and legitimacy the sport desperately needed.

The presence of massive crowds and live broadcasts underscores how far the game has come. Young girls will no longer be "the only one among 500 boys," as batter Jemimah Rodrigues once described her early days. Instead, they now have role models, infrastructure, and viable professional paths across domestic and global leagues.

India's victory is not just a celebration; it's a turning point. Like the men's team in 1983, the women's triumph will redefine the country's sporting culture and economic landscape. The Women's World Cup 2025 is not an anomaly — it is the dawn of enduring Desi dominance in world cricket, and the beginning of a half-century where Indian women will lead the global game with pride, power,

From navigating government forms to coding websites or managing small businesses, large language models are flattening the learning curve. As AI lowers entry barriers across professions, India's population often viewed as an underutilized resource — could become its most valuable economic engine.

This transformation is al-

ready visible online, where the distinct "ChatGPT-style" syntax appears in countless Indian social media posts. It's proof that Indians are rapidly absorbing, adapting, and applying AI in creative and professional contexts.

As analyst Mihir Sharma argues, infrastructure isn't only about chips or power grids — it's about people. And in the AI age, India's billionplus population could serve as the largest human infrastructure base in the world.

If language models truly democratize access to knowledge and capability, India's millions of informal workers may emerge as the most consequential beneficiaries and drivers — of the global AI revolution. The government has long struggled to skill its citizens; perhaps, this time, artificial intelligence will do what policy could not - unlock the real potential of India's people.

# "Army Has No Religion, Caste": Rajnath **Singh Snaps Back At Rahul Gandhi**

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh strongly criticized Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Wednesday after Gandhi claimed that the Indian Army is "under the control of 10 per cent of the country's population," referring to uppercaste dominance. "This is an institution

that upholds discipline, patriotism, and integrity. It should not be dragged into politics," Singh added, emphasizing the importance of maintaining the Army's neutrality.

Gandhi's statement has sparked a political row, with critics accusing him of trying to polarize the armed forces along caste lines, while supporters argue it raises questions about representation in India's military leadership.

The Defence Minister's firm response comes amid a politically charged environment in Bihar, where the BJP is campaigning for the Assembly elections, and caste and community issues remain sensitive topics. Observers say the exchange highlights the ongoing tension between political narratives and the institutional integrity of India's armed

# **NDA** government in Bihar neglected women's safety, health: Congress

The Congress on Tuesday accused the BJP-JD(U) government in Bihar of neglecting women's safety, health, and dignity over the past two decades. Party president Mallikarjun Kharge targeted both Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, questioning their track record on women's

security. Kharge highlighted statements by Modi acknowledging that in Bihar, "daughters-in-law and daughters are not safe," calling it a selfadmission of failure after 20 years of governance. The Congress leader stressed that the NDA government had consistently ignored key issues affecting women, ranging from personal safety to access to healthcare and basic

Speaking at a press briefing, Kharge said, "The BJP-JD(U) government has systematically neglected women's welfare, leaving them vulnerable to crime and poor health infrastructure. The citizens of Bihar have waited too long for safety and dignity."

Kharge also underlined the Congress-led Mahagatbandhan's commitment to empowering women, promising focused initiatives aimed at improving safety, healthcare, education, and economic participation for women across the state. "Our alliance is fully committed to uplifting women in Bihar and addressing their long-standing grievances," he added.

The Congress has raised questions over the state government's response to rising crimes against women, lack of effective law enforcement, and inadequate health services. arguing that Bihar lags behind other states in women-centric development indicators.

With Bihar heading to assembly polls, the issue of women's safety is expected to become a key point of debate, with Kharge and the Mahagatbandhan positioning themselves as champions of women's rights, in contrast to what they describe as the NDA's decades-long inaction.

The party's criticism comes amid growing public concern over women's safety and access to essential services, making it a central theme in the upcoming electoral battle in

## 'You're Not Sikh': 14 Indian Hindus Denied Entry By Pak On Guru Nanak Jayanti

Fourteen Indian pilgrims were denied entry into Pakistan during visits to mark the 556th birth anniversary of Sikhism founder Guru Nanak, after officials reportedly rejected them for being Hindus.

The pilgrims, part of a larger group of about 2,100 people cleared by India's Home Ministry to visit Pakistan, were initially allowed to cross but were turned back because they were not registered as Sikhs in official records. The 14 included individuals from Delhi and Lucknow, many of whom were Pakistani-born Sindhis with Indian citizenship, traveling to meet relatives. Sources told NDTV they were told, "You are Hindu... you can't go with Sikh devotees," forcing them to return humiliated.

Apart from this, 300 people applying independently for visas were also



of the border due to lacking the necessary Home Ministry approvals.

On Tuesday, around 1,900 Sikh pilgrims crossed the Wagah border into Pakistan, marking the first people-to-people movement since Operation Sindoor, a four-day military conflict in May. Leading delegations inbarred at the Indian side cluded Akal Takht leader Giani Kuldeep Singh Gargaj, the Shrimoni Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee, and the Delhi Gurdwara Management Committee.

The pilgrims will visit major Sikh shrines during their 10-day stay, including Gurdwara Janamasthan near Lahore, Gurdwara Panja Sahib in Hasan Abdal, Gurdwara Sacha Sauda in Farooqabad, and Gurdwara Darbar Sahib in Kartarpur.

Tensions remain high between Delhi and Islamabad following Operation Sindoor, India's military response to the April 22 terrorist attack in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir. in which 26 civilians were killed by The Resistance Front, an offshoot of the Pakistan-backed Lashkar-e-Taiba.

The incident has sparked concerns over religious discrimination at the border, as Hindu pilgrims seeking family visits were denied despite proper documentation, highlighting the sensitive context of India-Pakistan relations during cross-border religious exchanges.

## Vijay TVK Names Actor as **CM Candidate, Alliance Authority**

to a fully empowered political leader within his party. Analysts say granting him sole authority on electoral alliances reflects TVK's strategy to present a unified leadership image ahead of the high-stakes 2026 Assembly polls.

This development also indicates the party's intent to consolidate voter support across diverse social groups by leveraging Vijay's widespread popularity and the activist measures proposed in the resolutions.

With the announcement, TVK has set the stage for a potentially high-profile electoral campaign, where the actor-turned-politician will lead strategy, alliances, and policy priorities for the coming

## Rahul Gandhi's vote manipulation claim in Haryana unfounded: EC source

amid the fragile Israel-Hamas ceasefire, which began on October 10, 2025, following the deadliest conflict between the two sides. The ceasefire has included a reciprocal exchange of remains: Hamas has returned 21 Israeli hostages, while Israel has released the bodies of 15 Palestinians for each hostage returned.

Militants in Gaza have been handing over one to three bodies every few days, though Israel has urged faster returns in some cases. Hamas has cited the widespread devastation in Gaza as complicating efforts. Identification of the remains remains difficult due to a shortage of DNA testing kits, with the Health Ministry posting photographs online to help families recognize the deceased

The current exchanges follow the October 7, 2023, Hamas-led attack on southern Israel, which killed approximately 1,200 people and saw 251 taken hostage. Israel responded with a large-scale military offensive, which according to Gaza's Health Ministry has killed over 68,800 Palestinians, including civilians and combatants. Israel disputes these figures but has not provided an alternate toll.

Forensic work and identification remain ongoing, with fewer than half of the returned Palestinian bodies confirmed. The process reflects the broader challenges of post-conflict reconciliation and humanitarian management in Gaza, where resources remain strained and infrastructure heavily damaged.

The return of bodies, while small in number, marks a continuing step in the ceasefire process and highlights the delicate and ongoing negotiation between Israel and Hamas, even as tensions and humanitarian crises persist across the

His win also underscores a growing wave of Indian-American political leadership in U.S. local and state offices, alongside figures such as Virginia Lieutenant Governor Ghazala Hashmi and New York City Mayor Zohran Mamdani, reflecting the community's expanding influence in American politics.



# Coca-Cola bottler SLMG beverages targets Rs 9,000 cr revenue

SLMG Beverages, India's largest Coca-Cola bottler, expects high single-digit sales growth in FY26 despite facing headwinds in the June quarter due to unseasonal rains and geopolitical concerns, said Joint Managing Director Paritosh Ladhani on Monday. The company anticipates its gross revenue to cross Rs 9,000 crore, aided by festivals and GST concessions on its nonaerated drinks portfolio, which contributes around 30% of total

"The June quarter was below expectations, with 35-40% higher rainfall affecting sales. However, we anticipate strong growth in the December quarter and may even achieve doubledigit growth," Ladhani told PTI. He added that fizz-based drinks will also see a rise as consumers have discretionary spending

SLMG Beverages plans to invest around Rs 8,000 crore over the next six years for expansion, funded through internal accruals and debt, including greenfield plants in Buxer, Bihar and Gorakhpur, UP. The company's current bottling capacity of 22,000 BPM is expected to in-



crease to 27,000 BPM by yearend. Ladhani highlighted that 65-70% of the investment will go into plant capacity, while the remainder will support market development, warehousing, fleet, and new product launches.

On a mid-term outlook, Ladhani stated the company aims to cross Rs 20,000 crore in gross turnover over the next five to six years. Regarding an IPO, he emphasized the focus will remain

fore considering public listing. SLMG Beverages is part of

the Rs 10,000-crore Ladhani Group, which has interests in hospitality, real estate, and energy, with 70% of its revenue on strengthening operations be- coming from the bottling business. # China Unveils 'Ghost Jellyfish' Drone for Underwater **Missions**

Chinese scientists have developed an innovative jellyfish-like robot, dubbed the "underwater phantom," designed for covert underwater operations. Created by Tao Kai from Northwestern Polytechnical University, the compact robot closely mimics a real jellyfish, allowing it to monitor aquatic environments without disturbing marine life, according to the South China Morning Post.

The robot measures 120mm in diameter and weighs just 56 grams. Its transparent body and hvdrogel-based tentacles replicate natural jellyfish movements, making it almost indistinguishable from its living counterpart underwater. An electrostatic hydraulic actuator mimics jellyfish neural signals, enabling smooth motion while operating at only 28.5 milliwatts, ensuring minimal disruption to its surroundings.

Equipped with a camera and AI chip, the robot can autonomously identify underwater targets using machine learning, making it ideal for longterm surveillance, deep-sea monitoring, and precise inspections of fragile ecosystems or submerged structures. Tao highlighted the robot's low power consumption, near-silent operation, and lifelike design, emphasizing its suitability for

sensitive environments. The bionic jellyfish was showcased in August on CCTV, alongside other bio-inspired robots, including a robotic bird,

mechanical locust, gecko robot,

and robotic fish. During dem-

onstrations, the robot hovered

steadily in varying water con-

ditions and accurately identi-

fied objects such as the school emblem and clownfish. The presentation underscored the potential of nature-inspired robotics to sense and respond to complex environments independently.

Northwestern Polytechnical University is globally recognised for pioneering research

in robotics and aerospace, especially in developing hybrid systems capable of navigating both air and water. Tao's lab, part of the Ministry of Education's Key Laboratory of Micro and Nano Systems for Aerospace, continues to push boundaries in micro-electromechanical systems and autonomous

bio-inspired machines.

The "ghost jellyfish" represents a breakthrough in deepsea exploration technology, combining stealth, energy efficiency, and adaptability, offering new possibilities for environmental monitoring, underwater research, and covert operations.

# Pakistan Women's Coach Muhammad Wasim Sacked After World Cup Debacle

The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) has sacked Muhammad Wasim, head coach of the national women's cricket team, following the team's disastrous performance in the recently concluded ICC Women's ODI World Cup. The decision comes after Pakistan finished last in the eightteam tournament, co-host-

ed by India and Sri Lanka. Pakistan, led by Fatima Sana, endured a forgettable campaign — losing four matches, while three others were washed out due to rain. Despite having topped the qualifying rounds in Lahore earlier this year to secure their World Cup berth, the team failed to register a single win in the main event, playing all their matches in Colombo.

In a statement, the PCB confirmed that Wasim's contract expired at the end of the tournament and would not be renewed. The board is now on the lookout for a new head coach, with sources indicating that a foreign candidate is being considered. If no suitable option is found, former Pakistan captain Bismah Maroof could be appointed to



the role.

Wasim, a former Test cricketer and ex-chief selector of Pakistan's men's team, had taken over the women's side last year. His tenure saw a string of un-

derwhelming results, including Pakistan's Asia Cup semifinal exit and an early league-stage elimination in the T20 World Cup

earlier this year. A PCB insider revealed that the entire support staff would also be replaced soon as part of a broader overhaul aimed at rebuilding the women's

The changes come amid

India's triumphant Women's World Cup victory, which has further highlighted the contrasting fortunes of the two neighboring cricketing nations on the global stage.

In T20Is, he amassed 4,188 runs at 48.69 with a strike rate of 137+, including a T20 World Cup victory in 2024 and multiple Player of the Tournament awards. His unmatched consistency in ICC events cements his reputation as a clutch performer.

Kohli's IPL journey with Royal Challengers Bengaluru spans 18 years, where he became the tournament's highest run-scorer (8,661) and century-maker (8). His record-breaking campaigns in 2016 and 2024 highlight his ability to dominate in franchise

The 24-time Grand Slam champion, who recently relocated to Athens, described playing in the Greek capital as a special experience. "It feels really at home, playing in Athens," he said. "A few months ago, when I came here with my family, I was very excited because I have al-

ways loved Greece. Serbians love Greece, for sure. Historically, culturally, and religiously, we have a lot of things connecting us. Athens is in my heart, no question about it."

Djokovic dominated the opening set in a tiebreak and secured two breaks in the second to reach his 225th tour-level quarter-final. He will face Portuguese sixth seed Nuno Borges next, who defeated American qualifier Eliot Spizzirri 5-7, 6-3,

The world number five had opted out of the Paris Masters after his semi-final defeat at the Shanghai Masters 1000 to Valentin Vacherot on October 11. His participation at the upcoming season-ending WTA Finals in Turin was confirmed on

Djokovic's smooth return in Athens signals his intent to end the season on a strong note, and fans in Greece are clearly excited to have the tennis icon competing on their home turf.


