JUBILEE HILLS BYPOLL CAMPAIGN HITS CRESCENDO

he campaign for the Jubilee Hills Assembly by-election has reached its peak intensity, with top leaders from the three principal contestants—Congre ss, BRS, and BJP—making all-out efforts to secure victory just three days before campaigning concludes. The constituency, which has a substantial 4.01,365 voters, is witnessing a high-voltage, three-way contest to fill the seat left vacant by the death of sitting BRS MLA Maganti Gopinath in June. The ruling Congress party's campaign is being personally led by Chief Minister A. Revan th Reddy, who is holding numerous corner meetings and road sho ws. He is supported by about a dozen state ministers actively engaged in door-todoor canvassing. CM Red dy is fiercely attacking the opposition, specifically accusing the BRS and BJP of having a "tacit understanding" and claiming the BJP is im-



plicitly backing the BRS candidate. His strategy focuses on highlighting the welfare schemes implemented by the Congress government while criticizing the BRS for the perceived lack of development in Jubilee Hills during their tenyear rule. The Congress has fielded Naveen Yaday, a former AIMIM can didate, and has secured the crucial official support of the Asaduddin Owaisi-led AIMIM, an endorse ment that significantly boosts their prospects in the constituencv's diverse demo grap hic. The BRS campaign is helmed by Working President K. T. Rama Rao, wh are united in their effor ts to target the Congress, focusing on the ruling party's allegedly unfulfilled promises and the perceived lack of development over the last two Adding a celebrity dimension, the former In-

nkala Deepak Reddy, Bot h the BRS and the BJP

dian cricket captain and recently inducted state cabinet minister, Mohammed Azharuddin, is actively campaigning for the Congress candidate. Azharuddin, who was the Congress runner-up in the 2023 election, was nominated to the Legislative Council and given the portfolio of minorities welfare and public enterprises, a move widely seen as an effort to pacify him and leverage his popularity. With 58 total candidates in the fray, the election requires four ballot units and one VVPAT in each polling booth. However, the main political battle remains concentrated between the candidates of the Congress, BRS,

and BJP.



irector General of Police B. Shiv dhar Reddy IPS addressed the largest-ever batch of Probationary Deputy Superintendents of Police (DSPs) at the RB-VRR Telangana State Police Academy, emphasizing their crucial role in maintaining the state's position as the number one police force in the country. The special training commencement ceremony on Thursday welcomed 112 Probationary DSPs, a batch nota bly including 38 women officers, which the DG P highlighted as a sou rce of pride and a sign of the future of Telangana policing. DGP Reddy was joined by senior officials, including Police Academy Director Smt. Abhilasha Bisht, ADGP Law and Order Mahesh M. Bhag wat, and Commissioners V.C. Sajjanar (Hyde rabad), Sudheer Babu (Rachakonda), and Avinash Mohanty (Cybera bad). DGP Reddy stres sed that the intensive ten-month training period at the academy will lay the foundation for their journey in leadership, instilling

and a necessary shift in attitude. He advised the officers that their role extends beyond merely enforcing the law; they must understand its "soul" by embodying virtues such as impartiality, patience, and empathy. He pointed out that the public views them not just as officials but as "representatives of justice. While acknowledging the rigorous nature of the training, the DGP explained that every disciplinary measure, including drill, exercise, and collective effort, serves to build self-control, clarifying that discipline is not punishment but prepar edness.

He proudly detailed the state's pioneering efforts in modern policing, citing specialized units like Greyhounds, Octopus, CI Cell, TGC SB, and Eaglenet, whic h have made Telangana a model for the nation. Furthermore, community-focused initiatives such as the Command Control Cen ter, She Teams, Bharosa Centers, and various Community Policing programs are a testament to the department's commitment to engaging with the public. Addressing the 38 women officers, the DGP said the future of the force

rests with them and urged that respect and equality must start within the academy itself. He defined true leadership not by rank, but by an officer's conduct, integrity, empathy, and positive attitude toward colleagues. He reminded the trainees that the enormous confidence the people of Telangana place in their police force is hard-earned, encapsulated by the motto 'Respect through Service.

DGP Reddy conclud-

ed by outlining three core values for the probationary officers: Integrity, Empathy, and Professionalism. He advised them to remain truthful even when unseen, to understand the sentiment of the citizens, and to strive for mastery in their work. He offered a powerful closing statement: the true authority of a police officer comes not from the stars on their uniform, but from the trust reflected in the eves of the people. The academy Director, Smt. Abhilasha Bisht, confirmed the comprehensive 42-week initial pha se of the ten-month trai ning program, aimed at preparing the officers to uphold security, dignity, and justice with professionalism.

African Snail Outbreak Triggers Emergency in Secunderabad TPN Bureau | Nov 6,

2025 anic and anxiety have gripped residents of Hyderab ad, particularly in the Secunderabad Cantonment area, due to a severe infestation of invasive African Snails (Achatina fulica). These large, fast-spreading mollusks, known for their destructive capabilities, were recently discovered in a three-

acre stretch of lush gr eenery belonging to the military in New Boiguda, Secunderabad Canto nment. Experts are sou nding the alarm, warning that the snails are so virulent that they can cause even large trees to collapse by consuming not just leaves, sprouts, s tems, flowers, and fruits, but also entire plants and woody structures. Local residents fear that if the snails spread acro ss the city, the few parks and household plants

that exist could be entirely wiped out. The sudden appearance of a species typically found in Kerala has caused considerable astonishment and concern in the region.

The African Snails are notorious for their rapid proliferation. With a life span of five to six years, each snail can lay hundreds of eggs per month, leading to a massive and uncontrollable growth in population. The species has a history of causing

widespread agricultural damage in India; previously, in Andhra Prade sh's Srikakulam district. the snails were reported to have decimated crops like papaya, oil palm, and chili, leaving farmers friendless and helpless. Experts at the time recommended emergency control measures, including the application of salt solution, copper sulfate, and dedicated snail killer pesticides. which were used in spray campaigns to bring the

situation under control. The snails thrive in environments with high atmospheric moisture. leading experts to theorize that they may have been introduced to India via cargo ships from Africa. Given the imminent environmental hazard, the Cantonment authorities responded immediately by implementing emergency pest eradication measures. They authorized the large-scale spraying of chemicals and salt solutions across

the three-acre affected area. The treatment targeted the perimeter walls, the trees, and the earth mounds where the snails congregate, successfully eliminating the pests to contain the outbreak. Experts emphasize that while the infestation can be managed using specialized pesticides, the snails are an extreme threat to the ecosystem. They also noted that high temperatures typically reduce the population naturally,

Court conducted a crucial hearing on Thursday regarding the Public Interest Litigation (PIL) filed by the Act Public Welfare Foundation (APWF), challenging the construction of Phase-II of the Hyderabad Metro Rail in the Old City. The PIL specifically focuses on the Corridor-VI alignment, which runs from MGBS to Chandrayangutta, arguing that the development poses a severe threat to the area's rich historical and archaeological monuments.1 The petitioner's counsel contended that construction activities are proceeding without the necessary statutory approvals, particularly the clearance from the

Archaeological Survey

of India (ASI), and that the project alignment violates rules prohibiting work near designated historical structures. They emphasized that the authorities have failed to conduct a mandatory Heritage Impact Assessment (HIA) as required by the relevant state and central legisl ation. The government, represented by Additional Advocate General (AAG) Imran Khan, vigorously defended the project, stating that the Metro Rail is "crucial" for the socio-economic development and improved connectivity of the Old City. The AAG argued that the PIL was filed primarily to obstruct legitimate development works intended to benefit the local population. Howled by the Chief Justice, probed the AAG regarding the project's design and the status of construction near sensitive areas. The AAG confirmed that the second

phase work is underway. After hearing arguments from both sides, the Court took serious note of the petitioner's concerns regarding the threat to historical sites like the Charminar and Falaknuma precincts. The court demanded that the government provide complete details of the construction works and specifically ordered the submission of a detailed map showing the exact Metro alignment in relation to the designated historical structures. This requirement under-

to scrutinize the adherence to conservation norms and heritage protection laws. Given the complexity and the need for detailed documentation, the High Court adjourned the matter for further hearing to November 18. The ruling party has previously given assurances to the court that no declared heritage structures would be harmed, but the court's latest directive seeks concrete, official proof of complian ce.2 The case pits critical urban infrastructure development against the imperative of cultural heritage preservation, making the court's eventual ruling a landmark decision for Hyderabad's future planning

Congress Pitches Welfare Numbers to Woo Jubilee Hills Voters

Congress Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy released critical data points for party workers, urging them to integrate these facts into their campaign speeches for the Jubilee Hills by-election. The data serves as concrete evidence of the ruling Congress government's commitment to welfare and its successful implementation of flagship schemes, directly contrasting its performance with that of the previous BRS administr ation. wThe three key takeaways focus on the Public Distribution System (PDS) and the quality of essential supplies. First, the Congress government has issued 14,230 new ration cards within the Jubilee Hills constituency since taking office. Second, this issuance has extended free ration rice benefits to an additional 67,354 persons, bringing the total number of beneficiaries receiving subsidized essential goods in Jubilee Hills to a massive 2,39,88 6 persons. Crucially, each eligible beneficiary is now entitled to 6 kilograms of good quality fine rice, marking a significant improvement over previous standar ds. Third, and most powerfully, the data highlights a major upgrade in the quality of the distributed rice. Under the BRS government, the ration was comprised of 13,880 metric tonnes of 'doddubiyyam' (coarse/thick rice). In stark contrast, the Con-



gress government is now supplying 17,648 metric tonnes of good quality fine rice. This is a massive qualitative and quantitative leap, showing a direct correlation between the new administration and improved living standards for the constituency's poor. Uttham Kumar Reddy's message to the cadre is to emphasize this shift from lower-quality 'doddubiyyam' to 'fine rice' as a fulfillment of the party's pro mise to provide genuine social justice and quality welfare to the citizens.

This data is strategi-

rectly addresses the 'cost of living' and food security, which are vital concerns for the electorate, particularly in low-income bastis and neighborhoods within the Jubilee Hills constituency. By highlighting the increased volume and superior quality of rice, along with the massive expansion of the beneficiary base, the Congress party aims to demonstrate that its welfare guarantees are not mere rhetoric but tangible realities. The campaign workers are instructed to use these hard num-

bers—14,230 new cards, 67,354 additional beneficiaries, and the transition to 17.648 MT of fine rice—to substantiate the claim that the "Praja Palana" (People's Rule) government is actively working for the betterment of the poor and vulnerable sections. This narrative effectively seeks to cement the loyalty of the electorate by linking their immediate daily needs to the electoral outcome, portraying a vote for Congre ss candidate Naveen Yaday as a vote for continued and enhanced welfare benefits.

Fee Reimbursement Row: Colleges' Strike Hits Day 4

The indefinite strike initiated by private professional colleges across Telangana, demanding the immediate release of pending fee reimbursement dues, entered its fourth consecutive day on Thursday. Approximately 2,000 professional institutions, encompassing engineering, pharmacy, MBA, MCA, B.Ed, and nursing colleges, remain shut down, severely disrupting academic schedules for thousands of students across the

The Federation of Associations of Telangana Higher Institutions (FA THI), leading the protest, has intensified its de-

mands and tactics. FA THI is demanding the government release 5.000 crore immediately. representing half of the total 10,000 crore in fee reimbursement arrears owed to the colleges. FA THI has demanded that the remaining balance be cleared in manageable monthly installments of 500 crore over the subsequent ten months. FATHI President Rame sh Babu stated that the non-release of these substantial dues has created an impossible financial strain, forcing managements to struggle to pay staff salaries and maintain operations, even though their intent is not

to oppose the govern ment. In a move to escalate the pressure, FATHI announced the boycott of pharmacy exams scheduled under the Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University (JN TU) and demanded their postponement.

Although the government has extended an invitation for talks, FATHI has categorically ruled out withdrawing the strike until its primary demand for the immediate release of 50% of the

dues is met. Furthermore, while FATHI welcomed the gov ernment's formation of a committee to explore a sustainable "Trust Ban

k" model for the fee reimbursement scheme, they firmly rejected the proposed three-month deadline for the committee's

FATHI insisted that th e committee must be directed to submit its recommendations within one month to ensure a swift resolution.

To demonstrate the widespread support and seriousness of their agitation, FATHI has scheduled a massive mobilization effort.

A large meeting of the colleges' faculty members is set to be held at the LB Stadium in Hyderabad on November 8, with an anticipated attendance of 70,000

Ramesh Babu issued a stern warning that if the government fails to meet their demands, the association will escalate the protest further by staging a massive demonstration involving 10

lakh students. FATHI leaders also pointed out a failure of promise, noting that the government had committed during September talks to release 1,200 crore before the Diwali festival, but has so far disbursed only 300 crore, further fueling the frustration and mistrust that underpin the ongoing shutdown.









Maganti Family Feud Erupts Over Inheritance as By-election Looms

The family dispute of former MLA Maganti Gopinath intensified ahead of the Jubilee Hills by-election, focusing on property and inheritance rights. Mahananda Kumari, Gopinath's mother, voiced her distress, stating she was not informed by either the party or Maganti Sunitha, Gopinath's second wife and the BRS candidate, that Sunitha was contesting. Mahananda Kumari emotionally declared that while she is still alive, no one cared for her.

Her main concern is the future of her grandson. Pradvumna Taraka Gopinath, whom she refers to as Gopinath's

Hyderabad Cops Crack Instagram-Linked Drug Network

Hyderabad | Nov 6, 2025. DCP Yogesh Gautam of Rajendra Nagar reported a successful joint operation conducted by the Rajendra Nagar SOT (Special Operations Team) and local police, leading to the arrest of several individuals involved in drug trafficking and consumption. The operation revealed an inter-state drug network originating from Bengaluru and extending its supply chain into the city of Hydera bad. The arrested traffickers were identified as Santosh, Sandeep, and Shiva Kumar, who were responsible for procuring the narcotics from Bengaluru and selling them in Hyderabad. The police also apprehended three buyers: Sai Babu, Vishal Reddy, and Sameer. A critical aspect of the investigation uncovered that the accused were

primarily using the so-



cial media platform Instagram to operate their illegal supply network, leveraging the app's wide reach and discreet communication features to connect with both suppliers and customers across the region. Further investigation into th e origin of the seized dru gs pointed towards an international connection, with the narcotics being traced back to Nigeria. However, poli ce are currently facing ch allenges in locating and apprehending the Nigerian nationals responsible for the international supply. DCP Gautam stated that the location of these foreign drug supplier s has not yet been traced, but special teams are de dicated to tracking them down. The case is being investigated from multiple angles, including sc rutinising digital footprints, transaction histo ry, and call data records, to dismantle the entire chain of suppliers and

Authorities seized a significant quantity of illegal substances during the raid, including 18 grams of MDMA (Methylenedioxymethamphetamine), estimated to be worth 2 lakh on the black marke t, and 130 grams of Ganja (mariju

Additionally, five mobile phones used for coordinating the drug transactions were confiscated. DCP Gautam assured the public and the media that the police are working diligently and expect to apprehend the remaining accused persons soon, reaffirming the police department's commitment to combating drug menace in the city and ensuring the safety of its youth. This crackdown is part of the ongoing efforts to make Hyderabad a drug-free city, focusing on both local peddlers and international suppliers.

ACB Conducts Raids on Quthbullapur Sub-Registrar Office Over Corruption Allegations



Hyderabad | Nov 6, 2025, The Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) conducted surprise raids and inspections at the Quthbullapur Sub-Registration Office on November 6, following mounting allegations of corruption and inefficiency. The raid was initiated based on confidential information indic ating that officials at the office were allegedly demanding and accepting excessive bribes for registration services and were deliberately delay-

ing the processing of work, causing significant inconvenience to the public.

The ACB team, led by DSP Srinivas Reddy, arrived at the registration office unannounced to conduct the sudden search. Upon the arrival of the ACB officials, the office had a large number of documentary writers present, who serve as middlemen for the registration process. All the documentary writers were immediately detained and questioned extensively as part of the initial investigation to ascertain the extent of corrupt practices and the network of individuals involved.

During the course of the inspection and questioning, 10,000 in cash was reportedly found with one witness. ACB officials are currently investigating the financial transactions and background of this particular individual to determine the source and purpose of the cash, and whether it was part of a bribe

DSP Srinivas Reddy later addressed the media, confirming the ongoing investigation. He stated that while the documentary writers were being questioned and the witness's transactions were under scrutiny, no significant cash has been found with any of the key registration officials so far. Furthermo re, he assured the public that despite the ongoing inspection, the registration process was being allowed to continue so as not to cause further disruption to citizens seeking to register their property. The ACB raid signals a stern warning against corruption and bureaucratic delays in government offices, particularly those handling public services like land registration, and the investigation is expected to continue to unearth any deep-rooted nexus

Tummala Reviews Fertiliser Supplies for Yasangi Season plex fertilisers as buffdomestic sources. How-

TPN Bureau | Nov 6 Hyderabad: Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao on Thu rsday held a detailed review meeting with department officials on the supply and distribution of fertilisers for the upcoming Yasangi (Rabi) season. The me eting focused on ensuring adequate availability and preventing short ages during the peak cultivation period.

Agriculture Director Gopi briefed the Minister that the Centre has allocated 10.40 lakh metric tonnes (LMT) of urea, 1.45 LMT of DAP. 7 LMT of complex fertilisers, 0.65 LMT of MOP, and 0.60 LMT of SSP to Telangana for the season. He said the state



LMT of urea be supplied over three months October, November, and December — at 2 LMT per month, to ensure smooth availability to farmers.

Minister Tummala

expressed concern that during the previous season, fertilisers were not supplied as per schedule despite early requests from the state government. He urged the Centre to deliver at

least 60-70% of the total

allocation in advanc e this season, to avoid any disruption to the Yasangi crops, especially paddy and maize.

Currently, Telangana holds 1.43 LMT of urea, 58,000 tonnes of DAP, and 2.09 LMT of com-

er stock, which the Minister said would be sufficient if replenished regularly.

He also raised concern over the Railways' decision to shut down the Warangal rake point, shifting handling to Chintalapalli. "Such sudden closure could affect fertiliser supply in the entire erstwhile Warangal district," he warned, writing to the Union Railway Minister to continue operations at Warangal for another 4-5 months until Chintalapalli becomes fully functional.

For November, the Centre has sanctioned 2 LMT of urea, including 1.29 LMT of imported urea and 0.71 LMT from ever, there is still a shortfall of 37,000 tonnes of imported urea from October allocations. The Minister urged the Union Chemicals and Fertilisers Ministry to allocate an additional 0.50 LMT of imported urea immediately and expedite transportation through CIL to prevent any cri sis in December when fer iliser demand peaks.



VANDE MATARAM — The Electrifying National Song



The power of that immortal song, which electrified and unified Bharat, is once again evident as it celebrates its post-centenary golden jubilee year. Its spirit was palpable during the final match when the Indian women's team defeated South Africa to win the One Day International World Cup at the New Mumbai Stadium in the first week of November. The galleries, filled with young and old alike, reverberated with the songs "Vande Mataram" and "Maa Tujhe Salaam," paying homage to and glorifying Bharat Mata.

This was the song penned by the great revolutionary poet and novelist Shri Bankim Chandra

Chatterjee in 1875 in his widely acclaimed and inspiring novel Anandamath. It carried a powerful message of freedom from colonial rule. The song, first recited by Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore in 1896, inspired countless youths to defy British authority. Many sacrificed their lives on the gallows chanting

Vande Mataram. For every British police lathi that struck the bodies of protesters, the pitch of Vande Mataram grew louder and louder.

During the partition of Bengal, Indians responded to British oppression with unified chants of Vande Mataram. There was no part of Akhand Bharat untouched by the resonance of that song in the first two decades of the 20th century. It became a symbol of resistance and unity, making every Indian visualize Bharat Mata in all her divine grandeur, as we now see in paintings and

photographs. Lala Lajpat Rai, Bal Gangadhar Tilak, Bhagat Singh, and Subhas Chandra Bose—all drew inspiration from Vande Mataram. It became the roaring anthem of the common people—rural and urban, educated and uneducated alike.

When the Indian Constitution was adopted, Vande Mataram was declared the National Song as desired by the Constituent Assembly. However,

the intentional truncation of the song by then Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru remains an unpardonable act. It was not the first time Nehru placed national interests aside to appease the Muslim community. This appeasement became the official policy of the Congress Party, beginning with Mahatma Gandhi's support for the Khilafat Movement, which had little to do with India's freedom struggle. By subordinating national interests to religious considera-tions, the Gandhi-Nehru-Congress combine caused great harm—effects of which are still felt by the nation

Starting from the 1923 Kakinada Session of the Congress, when party president Maulana Mohammad Ali objected to Vande Mataram being sung as the prayer song by Pandit Vishnu Digambar Paluskar, the Gandhi-Nehru leadership failed to reprimand him for his anti-national stance. Instead, they meekly allowed that fanatic Maulana to walk out of the meeting. He was later seen puffing a cigarette outside, in full view of the session's delegates.

If only the Congress stalwarts of that time had shown the courage to stand up to such religious

majority's respected traditions, this issue would have been settled long ago. But by allowing Vande Mataram to be disrespected, the Congress laid the foundation of its Muslim appeasement

Shamelessly, the Congress continued this policy—first by mutilating Vande Mataram at its 1937 session, then by truncating it in 1950, followed by granting exemptions to those who refused to sing or respect it. No nation in the world allows its citizens to show disrespect to national symbols. Yet, under successive Congress regimes—both at the Centre and in the states— Indian nationalism was deliberately diluted for electoral gains.

Now, on the 150th anniversary of Vande Mataram, it is time to correct those historical wrongs. Let us raise awareness among the youth of India, engage with those who refuse to chant it, and help them understand the sanctity of our national song-not through coercion, but through education and awakening. Let every Indian feel proud to say, with reverence and

First Phase of 2025 Assembly **Elections Underway**

BIHAR: MANIFESTO PROMISES

The first phase of the 2025 Bihar Assembly Elections began today, with polling taking place across 121 constituencies and the fate of 1,314 candidates hanging in the balance. Voters are deciding whether the NDA will return to power or if the state will opt for a change under the Mahagathbandhan, which has declared Tejashwi Yadav as its

chief ministerial candidate. Political eyes are also on Deputy CM Samrat Choudhary, who is attempting the transition from MLC to MLA, and Maithili Thakur, a debutante candidate in Aliganj, to see if she can make a strong impression on the electorate. Another key question is whether Prashant Kishor's Jan Suraaj Party will manage to break through in the voter landscape.

Early reports from the ground suggest a tense start to polling. By 3:20 PM, the RJD had posted video clips on its X account alleging voter obstruction in multiple constituencies. In Mohiuddinagar, they claim police personnel beat and threatened voters, while in Danapur, administration restrictions on boat services reportedly prevented thousands from reaching their polling booths.

In Raghopur, the RJD alleges that the Vaishali district administration has stopped both boat and vehicle operations, leaving hundreds unable to cast their votes, despite showing voter ID cards. Party officials have raised the issue with the Chief Electoral Officer of Bihar and the Election Commission's SVEEP division, questioning the authority behind these actions.

The election campaign has been characterized by ambitious promises from both sides. The NDA and the Mahagathbandhan have pledged development initiatives including jobs, expressways, and welfare schemes for farmers, women, and students, with each party presenting a competing vision for Bihar's

Polling has also witnessed sporadic incidents of unrest. By 2:30 PM, the RJD reported that a worker was attacked by local BJP affiliates in Maricha Chowk, Sarai, while at 2:20 PM, RJD supporters allegedly surrounded Deputy CM and BJP candidate Vijay Kumar Sinha's car in Lakhisarai, pelting stones and blocking his entry into Khoriari village amid slogans of protest.

As Bihar casts its votes, political observers note that the first phase could set the tone for the remaining rounds of polling. With key constituencies like Raghopur, Lakhisarai, and Aliganj under close watch, today's results will be critical in determining the trajectory of the 2025 Bihar Assembly Elections. Live updates continue to track developments across the state.

Bihar Phase 1 Voting Sees 54% Turnout Amid Political Tensions

Voting continued across 121 Assembly constituencies in Bihar on Thursday (November 6, 2025) for the first phase of the state elections. with 53.77% of 3.75 crore eligible voters casting their ballots by 3 p.m. This round is crucial for both the ruling NDA and opposition INDIA bloc, as over 1,000 candidates vie for power.

The first phase has several high-profile leaders in the fray, including RJD chief ministerial candidate Tejashwi Yadav, NDA Deputy Chief Ministers Samrat Choudhary and Vijay Kumar Sinha, and multiple ministers from the Nitish Kumar government. Union Minister Nityanand Rai was vote in Hajipur.

The voting phase has been marked by heightened political tensions. Deputy CM Vijay Kumar Sinha alleged that his convoy in Lakhisarai was attacked by RJD supporters attempting to intimidate voters, particularly from extremely backward classes. Brazilian Model Shocked as Photo Used in Rahul Gandhi's Press Conference

The incident came to light after Indian factchecker Mohammed Zubair shared a video highlighting that the photograph shown during



Gandhi's press briefing did not belong to an Indian citizen. The revelation quickly went viral, sparking widespread discussion online, with social media users mocking the mix-up and questioning how the image became linked to Indian voter identifica-

tion records. Larissa later addressed hearted video, confirming that the viral photo was indeed hers. She revealed that she had started receiving calls from journalists soon after the incident gained attention. "A reporter even called the salon where I work, trying to talk to me for an inter-

contact me there. Oh my God, what craziness!" she

ED Attaches Rs 11.14 Crore Assets of Dhawan, Raina in Betting Case

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Thursday attached assets worth Rs 11.14 crore belonging to former Indian cricketers Shikhar Dhawan and Suresh Raina in connection with a money-laundering investigation linked to an alleged illegal online betting platform, official sources said.

A provisional order under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) has been issued to attach Dhawan's immovable property valued at Rs 4.5 crore and Raina's mutual fund holdings worth Rs 6.64 crore. The action is part of the ongoing probe into the operations of the online betting site

The ED's investiga-

tion has revealed that both cricketers "knowingly" entered into endorsement agreements with foreign entities promoting 1xBet and its affiliated platforms. The agency is examining the financial flows and contractual arrangements to determine the extent of involvement in the alleged illegal activities.

In addition to Dhawan and Raina, the ED has questioned other former cricketers including Yuvraj Singh and Robin Uthappa, as well as actors Sonu Sood, Urvashi Rautela, Mimi Chakraborty—a former Trinamool Congress MP—and Bengali actor Ankush Hazra. Authorities are scrutinising their connections to promotions or endorsements of the betting

1xBet, registered in Curacao, describes itself as a globally-recognised bookmaker with 18 years of experience in the betting industry. The federal agency's probe focuses on the alleged facilitation of illegal betting through online channels and the role of prominent individuals in promoting the platform in India.

The ED's latest move underscores its efforts to clamp down on financial crimes linked to illegal gambling operations and holds high-profile personalities accountable under the PMLA. Further developments are expected as the agency continues to examine documents, bank transactions, and contractual agreements linked to



Putin Orders Plans for Possible Nuclear Tests

Russian President Vladimir Putin has instructed government officials to prepare proposals for potentially resuming nuclear weapons tests, following recent remarks by U.S. President Donald Trump that hinted Washington may restart its own atomic testing. The announcement came during a meeting of Russia's Security Council on November 5.

Mexican President Presses for Nationwide Anti-Harassment Law

Mexican President Claudia Sheinbaum has called for sexual harassment to be recognized as a crime nationwide, following an incident in which she was groped on the street. The attack, which occurred while Sheinbaum was greeting supporters near the presidential palace in Mexico City on November 4, highlighted the persistent dangers women face in Latin America.

At 63. Sheinbaum was walking to a public event when the assault took place. Speaking on Wednesday, she emphasized that such behavior "should be considered a criminal offense" and pushed for stricter legal measures to protect women across Mexico.

Currently, Mexico City defines sexual harassment as "conduct of a sexual nature that is undesirable to the person who receives it," punishable by one to three years in prison. However, not all Mexican states classify sexual harassment as a criminal act, resulting in inconsistent legal protections for victims

nationwide. Sheinbaum's call aims to unify the country's approach and strengthen penalties for perpetrators.

The president's statement drew attention to the broader issue of genderbased violence in Mexico, where women frequently face harassment in public spaces. Experts say the country has some of the highest rates of sexual harassment and assault in

India's Solar Waste Could Create Rs 3,700 Crore Recycling Market by 2047

India's booming solar energy sector could give rise to a Rs 3,700 crore market for solar panel recycling by 2047, according to two new independent studies released by the Council on Energy, Environment and Water (CEEW) on No-

The studies highlight the potential to recover valuable materials such as silicon, copper, aluminium, and silver from discarded solar panels. If fully leveraged, recycling could supply up to 38% of the solar sector's manufacturing inputs in 2047 while preventing 37 million tonnes of carbon emissions by replacing virgin resources with recycled ones.

Currently, India's solar module recycling market is at a nascent stage, with only a handful of commercial recyclers operating. The CEEW studies provide the country's first comprehensive blueprint for developing a domestic solar recycling ecosystem that promotes both clean energy and manufacturing self-reliance.

By 2047, India's installed solar capacity is projected to generate over 11 million tonnes of solar waste, predominantly from crystalline-silicon modules. Managing this waste would require nearly 300 recy-



cling plants across the country and an estimated investment of Rs 4,200 crore.

Rishabh Jain, fellow at CEEW, said, "India's solar revolution can power a new green industrial opportunity. By embedding circularity into our recover critical minerals, strengthen supply chains, and create green jobs—while turning potential waste into lasting value. Building this circular economy is most important for India's resilient and responsi-

that solar recycling in a formal setup is currently financially unviable, with recyclers facing losses of Rs 10,000-12,000 per tonne. Experts emphasize that supportive policies, investments, and technological innovation will be key to unlocking dia's solar recycling market.

India's services sector recorded its slowest growth in five months in October, impacted by competitive pressures and heavy rainfall in parts of the country, according to the latest PMI sur-

vey released on November 6. The seasonally adjusted HSBC India Services PMI Business Activity Index dropped to 58.9 in October from 60.9 in September, signaling a moderation in the pace of expansion. Despite the slowdown, a reading above 50 still indicates continued growth

Industry experts attributed the softer expansion to a combination of domestic challenges and external competition. Heavy rains disrupted business activities in several regions, slowing the pace of output growth. At the same time, rising competitive continued to rise, suggesting

pressures within the services industry limited pricing power and affected new business

However, the survey also highlighted a positive trend in international demand. External sales

increasingly benefiting from global clients and cross-border business opportunities. Many companies reported stable or improving demand from overseas markets, which helped offset some of the domestic headwinds.

The Indian rupee strengthened by 8 paise to 88.62 against the U.S. dollar in early trade on Thursday, November 6, 2025, supported by a weaker American currency and softer global crude oil prices.

At the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee opened at 88.51 and briefly touched 88.49 before settling at 88.62 in early deals, marking a modest appreciation from its previous closing level. Forex traders attributed the gain to positive market sentiment in both domestic and global markets, although gains were capped due to selling pressure from foreign

investors. The domestic equity market mirrored the upbeat sentiment, with benchmark indices showing early gains. The BSE Sensex climbed 321.81 points, or 0.39%, to 83,780.96, while the NSE Nifty rose 57.05 points, or 0.22%, to 25,654.70. Analysts noted that positive equities often lends support to the rupee by encouraging capital inflows and stabilizing demand for the currency.



Astrophysicist Neil deGrasse Tyson recently shared a video that has left many questioning what is real in the age of artificial intelligence. The clip begins with a seemingly genuine Tyson claiming that the Earth is flat, a shocking statement that immediately grabbed attention. Moments later, the real Tyson appears, revealing that the earlier segment was an AI-generated deepfake, created to show how easily digital content can blur the line between truth and fiction.

The video, titled "It's Getting Harder to Know What's Real," serves as a warning about the growing sophistication of deepfake technology. Tyson explained that while deepfakes can be entertaining when clearly parodying someone, they become dangerous when viewers cannot distinguish them from reality. "The early stuff is fine if it's paro-dy, and if it is obvious it's parody. But when you do this and the viewer does not know it's a parody, then you are crossing a line," he

Tyson also highlighted that he is not alone in being target ed; many public figures have been deepfaked in ways that misrepresent their words and harm their credibility. The rapid advancement of AI tools has made creating realistic videos, images, and audio easier than ever, raising concerns about misinformation and the manipulation of public

The video sparked a strong reaction on social media. Users admitted being fooled by the deepfake, with one commenting, "Deepfakes are becoming too good. It's getting harder to tell." Others expressed concern over the broader implications, questioning how society can verify authenticity in the digital age. Suggestions such as using blockchain to track content authenticity were also proposed as potential solutions.

Tyson's video is a timely reminder that while AI can create impressive and entertaining content, it also poses a serious challenge to truth and trust online, making media literacy and skepticism more im-




