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All Set For Jubilee Hills Bypoll Today

All arrangements have been finalized for the Jubilee Hills Assembly by-election, with polling scheduled to take place tomorrow, from 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM. The Election Commission has completed the logistical preparations for the smooth and secure conduct of the polling process. Tonight, the Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) will be transported from the Kotla Vijaya Bhaskar Reddy Stadium,

which serves as the distribution center, to their respective polling stations across the constituency. The constituency has a total of 4,01,365 registered voters. Reflecting the high stakes and interest in this election, a large number of 58 candidates are contesting the by-poll this time. Given the high number of contenders, each polling station will be equipped with four Ballot Units. The commission has deployed a substantial number of voting equipment, including 561 Control Units, 595 VVPATs, and 2,394 Ballot

Units. A total of 407 polling booths have been established across 139 polling locations to accommodate the voters. Security is a top priority, with a three-tier security arrangement implemented at all polling centers to ensure a peaceful environment. A total of 2,060 polling personnel have been assigned duties for the election. All polling stations will have live streaming webcasting to monitor the proceedings in real-time. For voter assistance, help desks have been set up at all polling stations. Additionally, drones

will be utilized for monitoring the polling process, providing an aerial view of the external situation at the voting locations. Based on historical data and risk assessment, 226 polling stations across 65 locations have been identified as critical polling stations and will receive extra attention and security. The bandobast includes 1,761 local police personnel and 8 companies of CISF (Central Industrial Security Force) forces, ensuring robust protection throughout the voting process.

Noted Telangana Poet Andesri Passes Away at 64

Acclaimed Telangana poet and lyricist Andesri, famously known for penning the state anthem "Jaya Jayahe Telangana," passed away on Monday at the age of 64 while receiving treatment at Gandhi Hospital in Hyderabad. Andesri, whose real name was Ande Yellaiah, was shifted to Gandhi Hospital late Sunday night after collapsing at his residence in Lalaguda. Doctors confirmed that he breathed his last at around 7:30 AM. He is survived by three daughters and one son. Born on July 18, 1961, in Rebarthi village of Maddur mandal, Jangaon district, Andesri overcame the lack of formal schooling to become one of Telangana's most celebrated literary figures. His work was characterized by simple, heartfelt language and a deep commitment to

creating social awareness. He was recognized for his literary contributions with an honorary doctorate from Kakatiya University. His composition, "Mayamai Pothunnadamma," brought him widespread popularity. Andesri played a crucial role in the Telangana statehood movement, using his powerful writings and songs to voice the aspirations of the people. His song "Jaya Jayahe Telangana Janani Jaya Ketanam" became the unofficial anthem of the movement and was officially adopted as the state song by the Congress government in December 2023. In recognition of his immense contribution, Chief Minister Revanth Reddy honored Andesri with a cash award of 1 crore during this year's Telangana Formation Day celebrations on June 2, where the song was officially released with music composed by Keerava-

ni. Andesri was also a prominent lyricist for several socially conscious and revolutionary films. Chief Minister Revanth Reddy expressed profound shock over his sudden demise and announced that Andesri's last rites would be performed with state honours. The CM remembered the song as the "voice of crores of people" during the statehood movement and directed Chief Secretary K. Ramakrishna Rao to make all necessary arrangements for the state funeral. Condolences poured in from across the political spectrum, including from State Ministers, BRS leaders K. Chandrasekhar Rao and K.T. Rama Rao, BJP leaders Ramchander Rao, G. Kishan Reddy, and Bandi Sanjay, and Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu, who termed his death an irreplaceable loss to the Telugu literary world.

Mohammed Azharuddin Takes Charge as Telangana Minister

Telangana Minister Mohammed Azharuddin officially took charge today as the State's Minister for Public Enterprises and Minority Welfare in Hyderabad. Following his assumption of office, Azharuddin stated that he would immediately begin working to address the key issues concerning the people. He confirmed meeting with officials to identify priority matters that require urgent attention, emphasizing that his primary focus will be on the welfare and betterment of all minorities in the



state. Speaking to the media, Minister Azharuddin outlined his plan, stating, "I have met the officers. I have just taken charge. From tomorrow, we will start working. A lot of things are there. We will sit and find out what the major issues are that

have to be addressed immediately. So, we will take on that. We will work for the betterment of people and the welfare of all minorities." Meanwhile, the Telangana Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leaders criticized the timing of his appointment. They claimed that the decision to elevate Azharuddin to a Ministerial position was politically motivated and specifically intended to influence voters in the Jubilee Hills by-election, a constituency where Azharuddin had previously contested as a Congress candidate. The Jubilee Hills by-election is scheduled for tomorrow, November 11, with the vote counting set for November

14. The by-poll became necessary following the death of the sitting MLA, BRS leader Maganti Gopinath. Separately, Azharuddin expressed deep grief over the passing of the renowned poet and lyricist Andesri, calling it a great loss for the state. He paid tribute to Andesri, noting that he was not only a talented songwriter and singer but also an active participant in the Telangana agitation. Azharuddin said, "It is a very sad day. He was a really good songwriter and a great singer. He was involved in Telangana agitation also. I think it is a very sad day and my heartfelt condolences to his family. May his soul rest in peace."

SC to Hear Contempt Plea Against Telangana Speaker on BRS MLA Disqualification

The Supreme Court (SC) is scheduled to hear a crucial petition on November 17 seeking contempt proceedings against the Telangana Assembly Speaker. The petition alleges that the Speaker failed to comply with the court's earlier directive to decide on the disqualification pleas filed against 10 BRS MLAs who had defected to the ruling Congress party. The contempt plea follows a July 31 order from an SC bench led by Chief Justice B. R. Gavai, which explicitly directed the Assembly Speaker to adjudicate the disquali-

fication matter within three months. On Monday, a lawyer urgently mentioned the contempt petition, pointing out that the Speaker had not acted within the stipulated three-month deadline. CJI Gavai subsequently directed that the matter be listed for hearing next Monday. The counsel, expressing concern over the delay, suggested that the respondents were "dragging the proceedings till the end of the month for obvious reasons," an apparent reference to the impending retirement of CJI Gavai on November 23. The Chief Justice, however, responded by stating, "The Supreme Court will not close after the 24th of

November," dismissing any implication that the delay would halt justice. The petitioners' counsel further submitted that no proceedings whatsoever had been conducted by the Speaker since the court's July 31 order. The counsel noted the BRS MLAs are still continuing in office and recalled the court's previous warning that adverse inference would be drawn if any MLA tried to protract the proceedings. The contempt petition is rooted in the apex court's July 31 judgment delivered in a batch of writ petitions filed by BRS leaders K. T. Rama Rao, Padi Kaushik Reddy, and K.O. Vivekanand. In that landmark judgment, the top

court strongly reiterated that the Speaker acts as a tribunal when deciding disqualification pleas under the Tenth Schedule of the Constitution and therefore does not enjoy "constitutional immunity" in this capacity. The court had previously underscored the gravity of the delay, stating that the "very foundation of our democracy is shaken when elected representatives are allowed to defect and yet continue in office without timely adjudication." The bench had expressed its disappointment that the Parliament's trust in the high office of the Speaker to act expeditiously has not been honoured in many cases.

SC Initiates Suo Motu Case Over Road Crashes; Seeks NHAI Report

The Supreme Court (SC) has taken suo motu cognisance (on its own motion) of a tragic road accident in Phalodi, Rajasthan, where a tempo carrying pilgrims struck a stationary truck, resulting in the death of 15 people. While hearing the matter on Monday, a bench of Justices J. K. Maheshwari and Vijay Bishnoi issued a stern directive to the NHAI (National Highway Authority of India). The court has demanded that the NHAI submit a detailed report explaining how Dhabas (roadside eateries) along the national highways are situated in areas that



have not been notified as Facility Areas by the authorities. Furthermore, the bench also requested a report from the NHAI regarding the poor condition of the highways, despite the continuous collection of tolls from commuters. The Supreme Court's suo motu petition has also taken cognisance of a separate, recent and equally tragic bus accident that occurred on the Hyderabad-Bijapur highway in Telan-

gana, which resulted in the deaths of 19 people. The Court highlighted the alarming fact that both accidents, which occurred within a period of just two weeks on separate routes, have collectively caused 33 deaths. The reasons explicitly noted by the Court for these tragic accidents, based on newspaper reports that prompted the suo motu case, include the bad conditions of the highway routes in certain areas and non-com-

pliance with highway construction norms. During the hearing, the top court questioned the NHAI's practices: "How is it that dhabas are situated along the highways? People stop their trucks at these dhabas, leading to vehicles being parked on the roadside. We want to understand from the NHAI how such a situation has been allowed to develop and continue. In just two days, two incidents have occurred, resulting in the loss of 14 and 19 lives." The Court has now formally requested that the NHAI submit its comprehensive reports on the condition of the roads on highways that are causing these tragic and preventable accidents.



17 Students Fall Ill After Mid-day Meal in Jammikunta School

A troubling incident occurred today in Jammikunta, Karimnagar district, where 17 students (some reports indicating up to 35 students) at the Primary Upper School fell ill after consuming the mid-day meal. Alerted by the distress of the children, the concerned teachers immediately rushed them to the Jammikunta Government Hospital for urgent medical attention and treatment.

Upon examination and treatment, the doctors at the government hospital confirmed that none of the affected students were in danger and that their condition was stable, assuring the worried parents and authorities. However, the students made serious allegations regarding the quality of the food served under the mid-day meal scheme, which provides crucial nutrition to many children. Specifically, the students complained that the eggs served with the meal were foul-smelling (suggesting they were stale or spoiled), and more alarmingly, they claimed that there were worms found in the rice

(Annam). Following the incident, Union Minister of State for Home, Bandi Sanjay Kumar, contacted Collector Pamela Satpathy to inquire about the condition of the students and directed her to ensure proper care and necessary action. Local officials confirmed that an immediate inquiry has been launched to determine the source of the contamination, whether it was the rice, the eggs, or a general hygiene lapse in the cooking process. Such a severe incident raises significant concerns about the safety and hygiene standards being maintained in the preparation of food for school-children in the area. The local authorities are now under immense pressure to conduct a thorough inspection of the cooking unit, the stock points, and the supply chain to hold the responsible parties accountable for jeopardizing the health of the students. Strict corrective measures are expected to be initiated to prevent any recurrence of food poisoning, upholding the government's commitment to providing nutritious and safe meals.

Speaking at the occasion, the BRS Working President expressed profound grief and high-

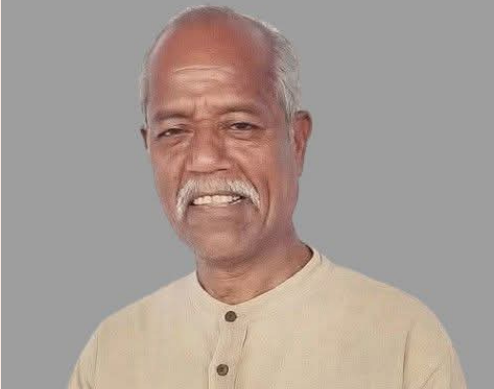

KTR Files Contempt Petition Against Speaker in SC Over Defection Case

The Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) party, through its Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR), has filed a contempt of court petition against the Telangana Assembly Speaker in the Supreme Court (SC). The petition alleges that the Speaker has failed to comply with the SC's previous orders regarding the disqualification of MLAs who defected from the BRS to the ruling Congress party.

The Supreme Court had explicitly directed the Speaker to take action on the defection petitions within a timeframe of three months. KTR's action of approaching the apex court underscores the BRS party's assertion that this deadline has



been disregarded, allowing the defected MLAs to continue their tenure despite the allegations of violating the anti-defection law (Tenth Schedule). The issue has been further complicated by the fact that the Speaker's office had already filed a petition in the Supreme Court requesting more time to complete the in-

quiry and decision-making process concerning the MLAs' qualification. The BRS is pushing for immediate action, arguing that the prolonged delay undermines the democratic process and the authority of the Supreme Court's directives, especially concerning legislative defection cases.

A delegation from the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) party, led by former Minister Harish Rao, met with the State Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) today to submit a formal complaint regarding what they allege are massive violations and misuse of power by the ruling Congress party in the Jubilee Hills by-elections. Speaking to the media after the meeting, Harish Rao asserted that the Congress party is acting unilaterally and "arbitrarily flooding the constituency with liquor," distributing large sums of money, and illegally giving away over one lakh sarees, as well as mixer-grinders.

He confirmed that the BRS submitted all avail-

able video and photo evidence of these illicit activities to the Election Commission. The primary demand of the delegation was for the Election Commission to take strict action against officials involved in the alleged misuse of official power. Harish Rao specifically accused some police officers and other government officials of acting as "stooges" for the ruling party. He mentioned that while complaints have been filed through the cVIGIL app, police officials are reportedly ignoring them. Despite the alleged widespread abuse of power, Harish Rao expressed confidence in the electorate, stating that Jubilee Hills voters are smart and will teach the Con-

gress a lesson in the polls. He lamented that election officials have not been responsive despite the extent of the official misconduct. The delegation brought several specific issues to the CEO's attention, including the demand for the deployment of Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) at all sensitive polling booths, providing the Commission with a list of these locations. A particularly detailed request was made to appoint women police officers, ASHA, and Anganwadi workers at polling booths to identify voters' identities before they are allowed inside, specifically to check for fake voter IDs. Harish Rao claimed that fake voter IDs have been manufac-

tured, and a video showing these fake cards was submitted to the CEO. Information regarding the Congress party's misuse of power and the fake ID cards was also provided to the Election Observers. The BRS delegation stated that the CEO assured them that action would definitely be taken against the concerned officials. Another serious structural complaint was lodged regarding a polling booth located adjacent to the Congress party office in Yousufguda, with evidence submitted to the Commission questioning how such proximity is allowed. Harish Rao also attacked Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's timing, questioning why the CM decided to hold a review

meeting on the "Six Guarantees" today, suggesting that the CM never found time for such a review in the two years since the promises were made, despite assuring they would be given legal sanctity in the very first Assembly session. He alleged that the CM is "crawling on his knees" due to fear of defeat in Jubilee Hills and that reviewing the guarantees today is a direct attempt to influence the Jubilee Hills voters. He concluded by stating that the people of the state are aware of CM Revanth Reddy's "bankrupt politics" and that the Jubilee Hills voters have already made up their minds, regardless of the CM's "dramas."

Park Encroachments and Water Logging Dominate HYDRA Prajavani

The HYDRA Prajavani (Public Grievance Cell) received a total of 47 complaints on Monday, with a significant number revolving around the encroachment and diminishing identity of public parks and issues related to water bodies and drainage. Several citizens appealed for public spaces, particularly areas designated as parks in layouts, to be fenced off and protected from further intrusion. Complaints highlighted that parks are being defaced by the unauthorized construction of temples and the setting up of small shops nearby for commercial exploitation. Residents also called for the protection of government lands.

A major concern raised by residents near Ameenpur Pedda Cheruvu and Ravirvala Cheruvu was that the annual expansion of these lakes is inundating the residential areas located upstream. Complaintants demanded that blocked sluice gates be reopened and the height



of the weir (overflow) be reduced. Residents noted that historically, water levels were controlled by agricultural use, but now the lakes are filling up with sewage, causing inundation in upstream areas. Representatives from Gang Avenue Residents filed a grievance about an old quarry pit in Old Alwal, Survey No. 576, which has accumulated sewage, leading to a foul odor polluting the surroundings. They urged the authorities to fill the pits with soil and develop them into parks. Specific complaints included: Balaji Enclave Residents reported that 30 guntas of government land in Machcha Bolarum village, Alwal mandal, is being encroached upon. They requested that the land be earmarked for the construction of a government primary school, which would benefit over 60,000 residents across 60 colonies. Plot owners near Ameenpur Pedda Cheruvu complained that the blocked sluices and the raised weir height are causing their plots to sink. They requested that the government implement a clear policy to determine the actual extent of the lake.

Residents of the Telangana Housing Board Colony in Ravirvala village reported that open spaces in their 545-plot layout are being encroached upon. They cited instances of temple construction in parks, illegal sheds rented out, and roads being blocked, all contributing to the illegal seizure of open lands.

Residents of the Housing Board Colony in Bagh Lingampally division complained that a 1,300-yard children's park has been encroached upon, with steel and iron shops and service centers operating there. They lamented that complaints to Housing Board and GHMC officials have been futile and requested HYDRA to protect the park from commercial exploitation.

Restoration of Thammidikunta Lake in Madhapur Gains Momentum

The restoration work on the Thammidikunta lake in Madhapur, located in the heart of the IT corridor, is gaining momentum, promising a new scenic attraction for the public. The lake is being transformed from a dumping ground of sewage and foul odor back into a natural water body. HYDRA has successfully removed the dense undergrowth, plastic waste, and meters of silt that had accumulated, effectively restoring the lake's natural character.

The removal of encroachments and silt has expanded the lake area, making the surroundings significantly more spacious. The main entrance near Shilparamam is being developed to be visually appealing. HYDRA Commissioner Shri A.V. Ranganath personally inspected the development works today (Monday) and reviewed the construction of the strengthened bund around the lake, along with the inlet and outlet structures. The Commissioner directed the officials to develop the lake, which



h is situated in the bustling IT corridor, into a major tourist attraction. He specifically instructed them to improve the inlets near Shilparamam to prevent the stagnation of floodwaters. He noted that the lake area has been successfully expanded from 14 acres to 29 acres and emphasized the need to develop the reservoir to retain water over this entire new expanse. The vision is to create a pleasant environment for the high-density population and IT professionals who frequent the area. Commissioner Ranganath stressed that clean water is as important as maintaining a clean and pleasant atmosphere in the surroundings. He directed officials to plant oxygen-rich, shade-giving trees along the nearly 2 km bund of the lake. The Commissioner suggested developing parks at the main entrance and creating facilities for all age groups to relax, including play areas for children and arrangements like cement and stone benches for the elderly. He also proposed setting up open gyms and constructing small domes or gazebos for peaceful small gatherings. Additional Commissioner Shri N. Ashok Kumar and HYDRA ACP Srikanth accompanied the Commissioner during the inspection.

Interstate Property Offenders Busted: 12 Cases Solved

The Commissioners Task Force, South-East Zone Team, working with the IS Sadan Police, successfully nabbed a group of notorious interstate property offenders and a minor (CCL-1) within three days of their crime spree, detecting a total of 12 cases across the Hyderabad City and Rachakonda Commissionerates. The coordinated operation led to the detection of four temple thefts, six shutter-lifting cases, and the recovery of two stolen motorcycles, with a total estimated recovery value of around 4,00,000. The recovered property includes 17,104 in cash and the vehicles used in the commission of the offenses.

The accused persons (A1 to A5, and CCL-1) are all natives of Bhimavaram, West Godavari, Andhra Pradesh State. A1 to A4 are described as habitual housebreaking offenders (HB), with extensive criminal histories in and around Bhimavaram. Specifically, A-1 Juvvala Tharun Kumar Raju is involved in about 41 cases, A-2 Dagarapu Ellyaaaru in about 30 cases, A-3 Maruboyina Mavullu in about 6 cases, and A-4 Gandreddy Lokesh in about 15 cases. A-5, Konala Rajji, a house-



wife, and the CCL-1 were involved in receiving and instigating the commission of offenses. The series of crimes began after A-1 was released on bail in October 2025. Realizing they were easily identifiable in West Godavari, A-1 convinced the others to shift their operations to Hyderabad. On their way to Hyderabad, they stole a Bajaj Pulsar NS-200 bike under the limits of Nandigama PS. They took shelter in Kammaguda, Nadargul. Between the intervening nights of November 4th and 6th, A-1 to A-4 committed a series of offenses. They first stole from the Sri Prasannanayana Swamy Temple in LB Nagar. The next night, they stole another Bajaj Pulsar bike from Hayath Nagar PS limits. Using these two stolen two-wheelers, A-1 to A-4 went on to commit three more temple thefts and six shop

liftings across several police stations, including IS Sadan, Saroor Nagar, Saidabad, Begum Bazar, and Sultan Bazar. After this spree, they escaped back to Bhimavaram with A-5 and the CCL. All six accused, however, returned to their rented shelter in Kammaguda early on November 7th with the intention of committing further thefts. Based on a tip-off, the Task Force and IS Sadan Police technically worked out the clues and apprehended all six individuals near Four Temple, Champapet, during a vehicle check on November 9th. Upon interrogation, they confessed to the offenses, and the stolen property, along with tools like iron rods, screw drivers, and spanners, was recovered. The accused persons are currently being remanded to judicial custody.



Mobile Phone Thief Held In Musheerabad

The sleuths of Musheerabad Police Station successfully detected a case of Mobile Phone Theft by Cheating and diverting attention, apprehending one offender and one receiver on November 9, 2025. The police recovered the stolen property, an Apple iPhone 17 Air.

The main accused (A-1) is Mohammed Ikramuddin @ Ikram (Age 24), a manager at a Blue Spa in Kokapet. The receiver (A-2) is Sumeet Saini @ Sumeet (Age 38), a businessman from Hyderabad. The theft occurred after A-1, planning to clear his debts and live a lavish life, saw an OLX advertisement for

the sale of an Apple iPhone 17 Air. A-1 contacted the complainant and arranged to meet at the Eden Home Stay in Gandhinagar, a room he had rented for one day, on the night of October 27, 2025. The complainant and his brother arrived, and A-1 attempted to establish credibility by claiming he resided there and offering them a glass of Mazaa. He then took the Apple iPhone 17 Air, charging cable, and box from the complainant under the pretext of showing the device to his "mother" in the next room. A-1 quickly went out, bolted the main door from the outside, and fled the scene. On October 29, 2025, A-1 sold the stolen iPhone to A-2, Sumeet Saini, for 69,000, using the money to clear his outstanding debts. A-1 has a history of crime, with previous cases registered at Chevella PS, Banjarahills PS, and Jubilee Hills PS. The accused's identity was established through scientific means of investigation. The Musheerabad Crime Team, led by DI Nadeem, received credible information about the accused's presence at his residence on November 9th and swiftly apprehended him. The arrests were made under the supervision of Sri L. Ramesh Kumar, ACP Chikkadpally Division, and the efforts of the Musheerabad Police Station team.

CP Sajjanar: No Compromise on Safety of Women and Children

Hyderabad Police Commissioner Shri V. C. Sajjanar, IPS, unequivocally stated that there will be no compromise on the safety and security of women and children in the city, stressing that their protection is a social responsibility. The Commissioner made these remarks during a review meeting on the performance of the Women's Safety Wing, held today (Monday) at the ICCA Auditorium in Banjara Hills.

CP Sajjanar inquired about the cases registered in the Women's Police Stations under the wing and reviewed the functioning of various units, including the She Teams, Bharosa Centre, Anti-Human Trafficking Unit, and Juvenile Wing, speaking directly with the police officers in charge. Subsequently, he provided key directives on how to approach matters related to women's safety. He urged officers to treat women who come to the police stations with distress with humanity and empathy. Officers must ensure they instill a sense of security and assurance in the victims that the police stand firmly with them. The CP strictly instructed

ed that simply registering cases is insufficient; thorough and comprehensive investigation is paramount. He issued a stern warning that any negligence in handling cases related to POCs and rape would result in action against the responsible officers. Furthermore, CP Sajjanar mandated the need for increased awareness programs on women's safety and directed officers to teach children about 'Good Touch - Bad Touch' and basic self-defense techniques. He stressed that Operation Smile and Muskaan should not be limited to specific periods but must be a continuous effort to rescue street children, bonded laborers, and child workers trapped in various industries. The Commissioner warned that strict legal action will be taken against those who harass girls, including opening History Sheets on the accused. He clearly stated that individuals with such records would be denied passports and would not be eligible for government jobs. The review meeting was attended by Additional CP (Crimes) Shri Srinivas and DCP (Women's Safety) Smt. Lavanya Naik, among others.

Police Counsel Rowdy Sheeters Ahead of Jubilee Hills By-poll

In light of the impending Jubilee Hills by-election and following the recent tragic murder of a rowdy sheeter in Jagadgirigutta, Cyberabad CP Avinash Mohanty, IPS, ordered a proactive move to maintain law and order. Accordingly, In-charge DCP Koti Reddy, IPS, of Balanagar Division, conducted a counseling session for approximately 20 active rowdy sheeters in the Balanagar division at the ACP office today (Monday).



DCP Koti Reddy sternly warned the rowdy sheeters that strict action would be taken if they failed to maintain good conduct and continued their criminal activities. He announced that as per the CP's instructions, those involved in riots, disturbances, or promotion of crime would face severe legal consequences, including city expulsion (banishment), registration under the PD Act (Preventive Detention Act), and binding over. Furthermore, he warned that the bail ob-

tained in past cases would be revoked for those who violate the peace. The DCP advised them to maintain good conduct, emphasizing that it would lead to happy family lives and increased respect within society. He reiterated that police surveillance would remain vigilant over those with bad conduct and that disturbing peace and order would not be tolerated. All registered rowdy sheeters were mandated to sign attendance at their respective police stations regularly and

obtain prior permission from the Station Officer if they intend to travel out of the area. During the session, the police bound over 20 rowdy sheeters before the DCP. They were required to provide a written assurance on a bond paper that they would refrain from illegal activities and were subsequently released on a personal bond of 2 lakh. The session was attended by Balanagar ACP Naresh Reddy, Jagadgirigutta CI Venkatesham, and Jeedimetla DSI Shyam Babu.

Woman Maoist Surrenders to Police in Mulugu, Telangana

A 30-year-old woman member of the outlawed CPI (Maoist) group from Chhattisgarh formally surrendered to the police in Telangana today (Monday). The surrender took place in Mulugu district before the Superintendent of Police, Shabarish P, as confirmed by a press release issued by the police department. This successful instance of defection is seen as a victory for the state's developmental approach over extremist ideology.

The woman Maoist's crucial decision to abandon the armed struggle was reportedly influenced by the widespread and effective dissemination of information regarding the welfare and development schemes being actively implemented for the tribal communities in Telangana. She realized the government's focus was on upliftment, not oppression. Furthermore,

the comprehensive rehabilitation measures introduced by the Telangana government specifically for surrendered Maoists—which often include financial aid, skill training, and social security—played a decisive role in her personal calculation to return to the mainstream.

The press release explicitly stated that the woman decided to “leave the path of Naxalism, lead a peaceful life, and

join the mainstream” of society, responding positively to the government's efforts to reintegrate former extremists and offering them a dignified alternative. The police department noted that the continued focus on development in tribal areas and the attractive rehabilitation package are yielding tangible results in counter-insurgency efforts, leading to a noticeable weakening of the Maoist movement in the region. So far this

year, a staggering total of 85 Maoists, belonging to various cadres within the banned organization, have surrendered to the Mulugu district police alone, indicating the sustained effectiveness of the government's holistic policies combining socio-economic development and a secure rehabilitation package for those willing to renounce violence. The police are continuing their outreach to convince others to follow suit.



Jagga Reddy Mourns Demise of People's Poet Ande Sri

Youth Employment Drives Bihar Poll Agendas Ahead of Elections

As Bihar heads to Phase 1 Assembly elections, youth employment has emerged as the central issue shaping political narratives. In Patna, the newly-built Ganga riverfront, dubbed the city's 'Marine Drive,' is bustling with youngsters unwinding after long days of competitive exam preparations. Many, like Ankit Kumar, a TRE aspirant, emphasize that employment remains the top priority for Bihar's youth. "Youth toh sabse pehle rozgaar chaahtha hai, chaahe koi bhi

ho," he remarked, highlighting a sentiment shared across the state.

Political parties are responding with diverse promises. The NDA has pledged one crore new jobs alongside initiatives for industrial development and infrastructure expansion. The goal is to create an ecosystem where graduates and skilled youth can find employment within Bihar, reducing the need to migrate to metros like Delhi, Bengaluru, or Mumbai.

Meanwhile, the Mahagathbandhan is focusing on direct support, proposing one government job per household and unemployment stipends to ease the immediate pressure on young job seekers. Both alliances recognize that ad-



ressing education-to-employment gaps, skill development, and access to industrial jobs is essential to secure the youth vote.

Experts note that Bihar's youth face limited opportunities in local industries despite the state's growing manufacturing, food processing, and IT sectors. Young voters are increasingly asking for companies and industries to set up operations locally, so they can build careers without leaving their hometowns. Industrial hubs in Patna, Muzaffarpur, Gaya, and Bhagalpur are being highlighted as potential centers for growth, particularly in IT, textile, and agro-based sectors.

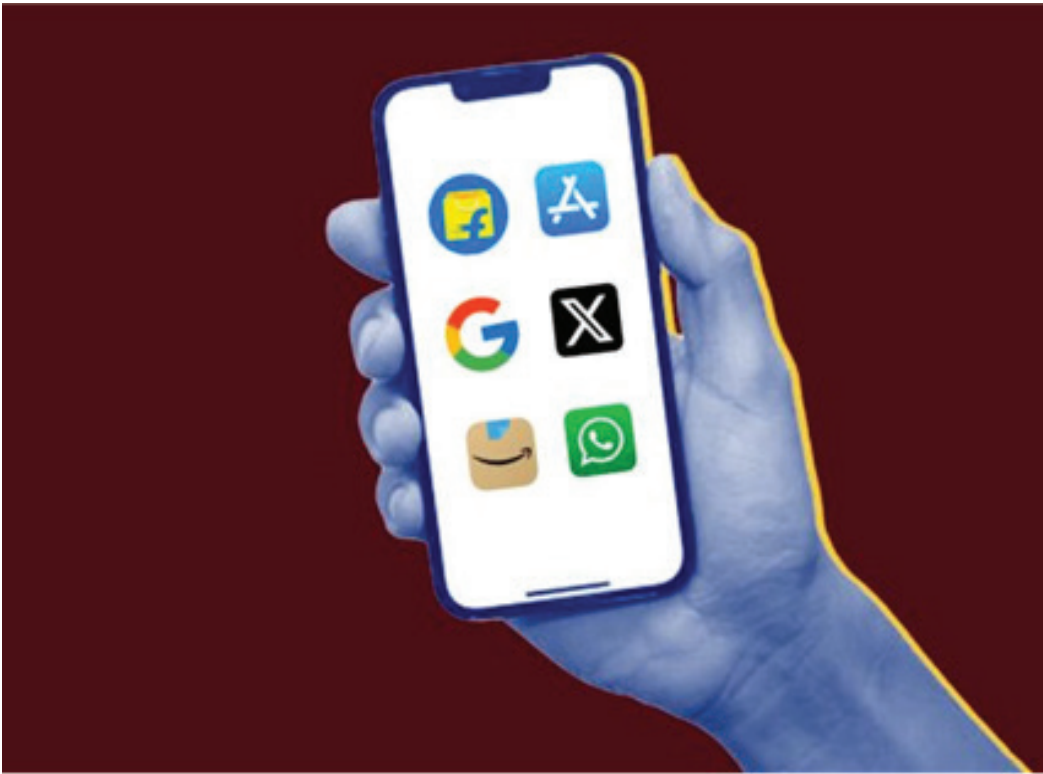
While some students express satisfaction with recent development initiatives, many

call for long-term, sustainable employment rather than short-term schemes. "We want industries, not just promises," said another youth in Muzaffarpur.

With job creation taking center stage, Bihar's young electorate is influencing political agendas more than ever. As parties compete to win their favor, employment and industrial development are likely to remain key determinants of the state's political landscape in this election season.

The focus on youth jobs underscores a broader demand: that Bihar's development translates into tangible career opportunities, empowering local talent and reducing the perennial outflow of graduates to other states.

NCLAT Rulings Spotlight India's Tough Stance on Big Tech



India's regulators are sending a clear message to Big Tech, as the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT) recently ruled on WhatsApp's privacy practices, upholding a penalty while scrapping a blanket ban on data sharing with Meta. The decision highlights India's balanced approach—penalizing unfair practices without imposing extreme restrictions.

The case traces back to No-

vember 2024, when the Competition Commission of India (CCI) found that WhatsApp had abused its dominant position by forcing users to accept its 2021 privacy policy, which allowed user data sharing with Meta for advertising and business purposes. The CCI fined Meta and WhatsApp Rs 213 crore and imposed a five-year data-sharing ban. On appeal, the NCLAT agreed that the privacy update restricted user choice and transparency,

upholding the fine, but removed the data-sharing ban, stating that the CCI had not demonstrated specific market harm.

India's regulatory scrutiny extends beyond WhatsApp. In 2022, Google was fined Rs 1,337 crore for leveraging its dominance in the Android ecosystem by pre-installing apps like Search, Chrome, and YouTube, limiting consumer choice and challenging smaller competitors. A separate

CCI case against Google's Play Store billing policies resulted in a Rs 936.44 crore fine, later reduced by the NCLAT to about Rs 216.69 crore, emphasizing the need for transparency and allowing developers alternative payment options.

E-commerce giants have also been under the lens. Amazon and Flipkart faced investigations over preferential treatment to certain sellers and the use of foreign investment structures to subsidize services, disadvantaging ordinary vendors. The CCI imposed a Rs 200 crore penalty on Amazon in 2021 for misreporting investment details, which the NCLAT upheld in 2022. The Supreme Court later stayed the recovery pending further hearings.

These cases demonstrate India's proactive approach to regulating market dominance, ensuring fair competition while avoiding blanket restrictions that could disrupt digital markets. Analysts note that India's tech policy framework is evolving, combining penalties, monitoring, and regulatory oversight to protect consumer interests and support a level playing field.

With scrutiny extending to WhatsApp, Google, Amazon, Flipkart, and X (formerly Twitter), India is positioning itself as a country where Big Tech must comply with competition norms or face significant penalties, sending a strong signal to the global tech industry.

Delhi's Air Crisis: When Lungs Become Collateral Damage

Delhi's struggle with air pollution has reached a point where breathing itself has become a daily challenge, yet public concern and official accountability appear to be fading. Research shows that toxic air is shortening residents' lifespans by nearly a decade, but the combination of political inaction, public indifference, and "whataboutery" has normalized Delhi's smog-filled days.

In previous years, citizens would raise alarms, post pictures wearing masks, and campaign online with hashtags like #rightto-breathe. Many still voice concerns, but a growing number of Delhiites have resigned themselves to coping rather than protesting. Air purifiers, masks, WFH options, and short escapes from the city have become the modern survival toolkit, but those without resources are left struggling in silence.

A troubling development this year is the erosion of trust in air quality data. Citizens no longer see the annual ritual of checking AQI before stepping out as meaningful. Allegations of tampering with AQI readings and water spraying at pollution sensors have cast doubt on official numbers. As a result, people are forced to breathe toxic air without reliable information, leaving both lungs and minds compromised.

Public engagement on pollution issues has shifted. Social media debates often place citizens on trial rather than



officials. Questions like "Why are farmers burning stubble?" or "What did the previous government do?" dominate discussions, shifting focus from systemic accountability to individual justifications. Persistent headaches, coughs, and sore throats further silence dissent, as people opt for quiet endurance over confrontation.

Even street protests face restrictions. Demonstrations at India Gate are quickly dispersed by police, forcing activists to relocate to designated spots like Jantar Mantar, while Supreme Court orders on limited firecracker windows are openly flouted during Diwali. The message is clear: citizens are restricted

in protest, even as air quality continues to worsen.

Delhi's air crisis exemplifies a grim reality: while political blame-games and social media fights continue, the real victims are the lungs of the city's residents. Clean air is not a political prize to be debated; it is a basic necessity, yet every year, Delhiites are forced to sacrifice their health as part of a recurring, seemingly inescapable cycle.

In the end, the fight for clean air remains lost in ritualized tolerance, while those who breathe the toxic air bear the consequences silently. The debate may continue, but the lungs of Delhi will never forget.

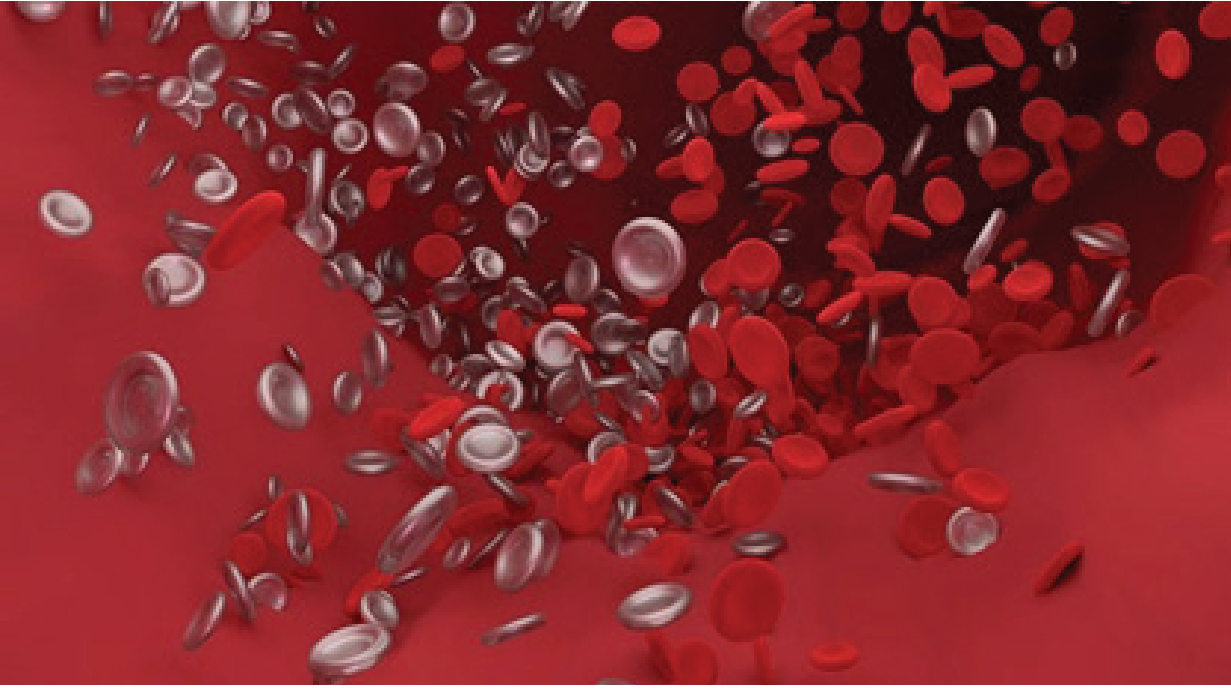
Despite Health Campaigns, Blood Clot Awareness Remains Dangerously Low

Behind many sudden deaths in India lies an often-overlooked killer — blood clots that block blood flow to the heart, lungs, or brain. Globally, one in four deaths is linked to clotting disorders, more than those caused by AIDS, breast cancer, or road accidents combined. In India, clots strike at a younger age than in the West, often during people's most productive years. Of the 2.5 million heart-related deaths reported annually in India, a significant portion is triggered by clot formation.

Despite major campaigns for diabetes and hypertension, public awareness about clotting remains alarmingly low. Warning signs — chest

pain, swelling in a leg, shortness of breath, or dizziness — are often ignored until it's too late. Conditions such as deep vein thrombosis (DVT) and pulmonary embolism (PE), collectively known as venous thromboembolism, can recur and cause lasting damage or sudden death if untreated.

The Covid-19 pandemic drew brief attention to clotting disorders when infections were found to make blood more prone to clotting by damaging vessels and activating platelets. The D-dimer test, which detects fragments of clots in the bloodstream, became widely known. However, as the pandemic faded, so did public concern.



The risk of clotting is higher among people who are sedentary, obese, diabetic, recovering from surgery, or undergoing cancer therapy. Women face additional risks during pregnancy or while taking oral contraceptives, and soldiers stationed at high altitudes are also vulnerable due to low oxygen and dehydration.

Experts stress that prevention is simple — move more, sit less, and stay hydrated. Standing or walking every hour can significantly reduce risk. Treatment has also advanced, with modern anticoagulants such as dabigatran and rivaroxaban providing safer, more targeted options than older drugs like

warfarin. India has contributed to innovation in this field through the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research's streptokinase enzyme and ongoing research at IISc and IIT (BHU) into nano-based therapies.

India's first national registry for clotting disorders, i-RegVeD, launched by the ICMR in 2022, is already helping shape hospital protocols. Still, experts call for a nationwide awareness campaign across workplaces, airlines, and hospitals.

Blood clots may kill silently, but with early recognition, prevention, and timely care, India can turn this silent threat into a preventable one.

Canvassing ends for Bihar final phase polls; 3.7 cr voters to seal fate of 1,302 leaders

Campaigning for the second and final phase of Bihar assembly elections concluded on Sunday, ahead of polling on November 11. This phase covers 122 seats across 20 districts, with results slated for November 14. The closing day saw a flurry of high-profile cam-

paing. Home Minister Amit Shah, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, and Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi led the blitzkrieg. Rahul Gandhi addressed rallies in Kishanganj and Purnea, reiterating allegations of "vote theft" and claiming that Prime Minister Modi, Shah, and the Election

Commission have no answers. Shah, campaigning in Sasaram and Arwal, accused the INDIA bloc of creating a "corridor for infiltrators" while presenting PM Modi's vision of an "industrial corridor." Over 3.7 crore voters will decide the fate of 1,302 candidates across 45,399 polling booths. Bihar po-

lice and central forces have beefed up security, sealing borders with Nepal, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand, and West Bengal, with 150 additional central companies deployed for tighter vigilance than the first phase. This phase includes Seemanchal (dense Muslim population), Kosi region

(large EBC population), parts of Mithilanchal, and Champaran. Unlike the first phase, where the Mahagathbandhan defended most seats, the NDA now carries the onus. In 2020, the NDA won 70 seats in this region, while the Mahagathbandhan secured 50.

Among NDA candidates, 53 are from BJP, 44 JD(U), 15 LJP (Chirag Paswan), four RLD, and six HAM. Key ministers under CM Nitish Kumar, including Bijendra Yadav, Nitish Mishra, Renu Devi, and Leslie Singh, are in the fray. For the Mahagathbandhan, RJD fields 72, Congress 37, VIP 10, and other allies four candidates. Leaders like Tejashwi Yadav, Priyanka Gandhi, and Mallikarjun Kharge campaigned extensively, though Tejashwi bore the main responsibility.

Key campaign themes included industrialization, job creation, infiltration concerns, and claims of "jungle raj" under opposition rule. PM Modi urged voters to exceed the first phase turnout of 65%, while both sides claimed confidence of victory.

Unlimited possibilities to strengthen India, Angola ties in various sectors: Murmu

President Droupadi Murmu has highlighted the "unlimited possibilities" for expanding ties between India and Angola across multiple sectors, including energy, agriculture, food processing, and medicines. She also noted opportunities to strengthen collaboration in critical minerals exploration and diamond processing. Speaking during bilateral discussions with Angola President João Manuel Gonçalves Lourenço on November 9, 2025, in Luanda, Murmu emphasized the potential for deeper cooperation that could benefit both nations economically and strategically.

This visit marks the first state visit to Angola by an Indian President, reflecting the growing importance of the partnership. Murmu's trip coincides with Angola's 50th Independence Day celebrations on November 11, which she is set to at-



tend. It also comes during the commemoration of 40 years of diplomatic relations between India and Angola, established in 1985.

President Murmu described the bilateral discussions as an opportunity to explore innovative approaches to trade and investment, particularly

in sectors crucial for sustainable development. She stressed that enhancing ties in critical minerals and diamond processing could pave the way for mu-

tually beneficial industrial projects and technology exchanges.

The visit also includes engagements aimed at deepening cultural and educational ties and boosting people-to-people connections, strengthening the overall framework of India-Angola relations.

The two leaders reaffirmed their commitment to expanding cooperation across sectors while exploring new avenues for economic growth, investment, and technological collaboration. Murmu's visit underscores India's intent to enhance strategic partnerships in Africa, focusing on sectors that can deliver tangible benefits to both countries.

The discussions set the stage for a renewed roadmap of collaboration, marking a milestone in the evolving relationship between India and Angola, with a focus on sustainable development, economic growth, and long-term strategic partnership.

Registration not mandatory, we are recognised as a body of individuals: RSS chief

Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) chief Mohan Bhagwat clarified on Sunday that the organisation does not require formal registration, stating that it is "recognised as a body of individuals."

Bhagwat's remarks came during his address at the '100 Years of Sangh

Journey: New Horizons' lecture series in Bengaluru on November 9, 2025. The RSS head responded to repeated questions regarding the organisation's registration status, explaining that the group operates as a collective of volunteers rather than a legally registered entity.

The clarification is significant given longstand-

ing public and media interest in the RSS's legal and organisational framework. Despite not being formally registered, the RSS has historically maintained a wide network of affiliates, schools, and community service initiatives across India.

During the lecture, Bhagwat also highlighted the RSS's century-long

journey, focusing on its societal and cultural contributions. He reiterated that the Sangh functions through the dedication and voluntary participation of its members rather than relying on legal formalities.

Experts note that while the RSS operates without formal registration, it has structured bodies and ini-

tiatives, including charitable, educational, and social outreach programs, which function within existing legal frameworks. Bhagwat's comments underline the organisation's self-perception as a voluntary cultural movement rather than a conventional entity requiring statutory recognition. The lecture, which marked Day 2 of the series, drew attention to the RSS's historical evolution and future vision. The chief emphasised that the Sangh's work continues to focus on nation-building, cultural education, and social service, staying true to its foundational ethos.

Bhagwat's explanation regarding registration reinforces the RSS's longstanding position of functioning as a volunteer-driven network and clarifies public queries about its legal status, highlighting the distinction between administrative registration and organisational legitimacy.

"Made Of Cardboard": Udhayanidhi Stalin Jabs Actor Vijay, TVK Responds



Tamil Nadu Deputy Chief Minister Udhayanidhi Stalin launched a veiled attack on actor-turned-politician Vijay, suggesting that some individuals are entering politics without ideology or a strong foundation.

Speaking at the Platinum Jubilee celebration of DMK, Stalin emphasised the importance of ideology in politics, saying, "Ideology is the foundation of DMK. If the foundation is strong, then the fort built on it will also remain strong. Today, some are trying to enter politics without any foundation." His remarks were widely interpreted as a reference to Vijay, who heads the Tamilaga Vettai Kazhagam (TVK).

In a sarcastic analogy,

Stalin compared Vijay and TVK to replica models of the Taj Mahal and Eiffel Tower, saying, "People get excited, take selfies, and feel thrilled. But those are just made of cardboard without any foundation or ideology. A slight touch or wind is enough." He added that the DMK was built through decades of struggle and sacrifice, recalling the party's hardships during the Emergency.

TVK swiftly responded to the comments. Loyola Mani, a TVK spokesperson, questioned Stalin's own political credentials, writing on X, "Udhayanidhi Stalin says DMK was built through sacrifice and struggle. But what is his role in that movement? What protests

has he faced? What sacrifices has he made?"

Mani also raised questions about Stalin's political rise, saying, "On what basis was he given the youth wing post and ticket to contest elections? Tell us what qualifications you have beyond being the grandson of former Chief Minister M Karunanidhi and the son of MK Stalin."

TVK concluded by asserting its political ambitions, claiming it will defeat the ruling DMK in the 2026 Tamil Nadu assembly elections. The exchange highlights increasing tensions ahead of the state elections, with veteran and new political players staking positions and drawing sharp lines in the state's political landscape.

"Love PM Modi Bit Too Much": Chirag Paswan Affirms Loyalty To NDA

Lok Janshakti Party (Ram Vilas) chief Chirag Paswan reaffirmed his unwavering support for Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday, saying he is "inseparable" from the PM and emphasizing that he will remain part of the National Democratic Alliance (NDA).

Speaking to ANI, Paswan dismissed speculation about a post-poll alliance after the Bihar elections. "As long as my Prime Minister is there, I am absolutely not going anywhere. My dedication and my love remain. I love him a bit too much," he said. He noted that while he communicates with Congress MP Priyanka Gandhi, he has no in-

tention of leaving the NDA fold.

Reflecting on his father Ram Vilas Paswan's political legacy, Chirag highlighted the LJP's historical pattern of joining alliances before elections rather than post-poll. He recalled how his father, often called the political "weatherman," joined the UPA in 2004, leading to its unexpected victory. Chirag stressed that he continues this tradition of strategic alliances and loyalty.

Formed in 2000, the LJP initially joined the NDA, parted ways in 2002, and later joined the UPA in 2004. Following Ram Vilas Paswan's death in 2020, the party split into two factions: LJP (Ram Vilas) led by Chirag, and Rashtriya

LJP led by Pashupati Kumar Paras. Chirag rejoined the NDA ahead of the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, winning all five seats contested in Bihar.

Paswan reiterated his party's focus on development and the "Bihar First, Bihari First" agenda. He expressed confidence in the NDA forming a strong government in Bihar, attributing it to public faith in the "double-engine" government.

The upcoming second phase of the 2025 Bihar assembly polls will be crucial for the NDA, deciding the fate of key ministers from both JD(U) and BJP, including Nitish Kumar's cabinet members and other senior leaders in northern Bihar strongholds.

Super Typhoon Fung-wong Kills Four in Philippines

Super Typhoon Fung-wong, one of the strongest storms of the year in the Philippines, has claimed four lives as authorities begin assessing damage across the most populous island of Luzon. Over one million people were evacuated ahead of the typhoon's landfall on Sunday, amid howling winds, heavy rain, and storm swells.

Most of the fatalities occurred due to a mudslide in Nueva Vizcaya, which buried a house and killed two children, while two others died from drowning and fallen debris, officials reported. Regional civil defence authorities also confirmed that landslides isolated at least four towns in Aurora province, where Fung-wong first made landfall.

Residents described a harrowing night as strong winds tore through rooftops and tree branches, making it impossible to sleep. Romeo Mariano, who sheltered with his grandmother in Isabela province, said, "When we got out to check our home, we saw the dam-

age," though early assessments suggest that the overall death toll is likely to remain low.

The storm has now shifted northeast toward Taiwan, with sustained winds dropping to between 130 kph and 160 kph (80-100 mph). Meteorologists warn that while the typhoon has weakened slightly, its outer bands could still bring heavy rain and storm surges to coastal areas.

Fung-wong is the 21st typhoon of the year in the Philippines, striking just days after Typhoon Kalmaegi, which killed 224 people in the country and five in Vietnam. In anticipation of further impacts, the Taiwanese government has ordered evacuations in flood-prone areas, including the town of Guangfu on the island's east coast, historically vulnerable to typhoon-induced flooding.

Authorities continue to monitor the storm closely, urging residents in affected areas to stay indoors, follow evacuation orders, and avoid traveling through flooded or landslide-prone zones.

Five Indians Kidnapped in Mali Amid Rising Jihadist Violence

Five Indian nationals were kidnapped in western Mali last week, prompting urgent action by the Indian Embassy in Bamako. The hostages, employed by a company involved in electrification projects, were abducted near Kobori on November 6. No group has yet claimed responsibility for the attack.

In a statement on X, the Indian Embassy said it is "working closely with the Malian authorities and the company concerned to secure their safe release as quickly as possible." New Delhi is monitoring the situation closely, coordinating with local officials to ensure the hostages' safety.

Mali, currently under a military junta, has faced escalating unrest driven by criminal groups and jihadists linked to Al-Qaeda and the Islamic State. Kidnappings targeting foreigners are increasingly common, as security forces struggle to contain militant activities and protect vital infrastructure.

The kidnapping comes amid worsening economic and security conditions, with the Al-

Qaeda-linked Group for the Support of Islam and Muslims (JNIM) imposing blockades and intensifying attacks on highways, fuel convoys, and government forces. The group has also targeted foreign workers, aid personnel, and industrial sites across Mali and the wider Sahel region.

JNIM's recent operations include the abduction of two Emirati nationals and an Iranian near Bamako in September; the victims were released last week following a ransom reportedly exceeding \$50 million.

The growing threat has led several countries, including the United States, United Kingdom, and Germany, to issue urgent travel advisories, urging citizens to leave Mali due to the "unpredictable security situation."

Authorities continue to assess the situation as efforts to secure the release of the five Indians intensify. The incident underscores the persistent security risks faced by foreign workers in Mali and the broader Sahel region, where jihadist activity remains a major destabilizing force.

"People Against Tariff Fools": Trump Pledges \$2,000 "Dividends" To Americans

US President Donald Trump has doubled down on his controversial tariff policies, promising that every American—excluding the wealthiest—will receive at least \$2,000 from tariff revenues. The pledge comes as the US Supreme Court questions the legality of his sweeping trade measures, marking a key test of executive powers in global economic policy.

Trump defended his approach on his Truth Social platform, calling critics of tariffs "fools" and asserting that his policies have made the United States the "richest" and "most respected" nation in the world. He claimed that tariffs have driven record domestic investment, with new factories and plants being established across the country, and have contributed to "almost no inflation" and historically high 401(k) values.

"Businesses are pouring into the USA ONLY BECAUSE OF TARIFFS," Trump wrote, emphasizing that his strategy has incentivized domestic



growth while reshaping the trade landscape. He also framed his actions as a matter of national security, questioning why the president could not impose

tariffs even when foreign countries levy duties on the United States.

Trump's remarks follow a Supreme Court hearing where justices—both con-

servative and liberal—challenged the administration's use of a 1977 law designed for national emergencies to justify broad tariffs. The court

questioned whether such a sweeping executive action requires clear congressional approval, with some conservative justices acknowledging the presi-

dent's inherent powers in foreign trade but indicating a potential split in judgment. The case stems from lawsuits filed by 12 states and several businesses, arguing that Trump's tariffs exceeded executive authority.

If upheld, the tariffs could generate trillions of dollars in revenue over the next decade, a significant portion of which Trump says will fund "tariff dividends" for Americans. He framed the payouts as a reward to citizens benefiting from his economic policies, while critics argue that the plan is economically risky and legally questionable.

The Supreme Court's decision will have far-reaching implications, not only for the legality of Trump's tariffs but also for the limits of presidential power in shaping trade policy. Until then, Trump continues to champion his tariff program as a hallmark of his economic and foreign policy legacy, vowing to use the funds collected to directly benefit the American public.

China Suspends Special Port Fees on U.S. Ships

China announced on Monday that it will suspend "special port fees" on U.S. vessels for one year, in a move signaling a tentative thaw in trade tensions between the two economic powers. The suspension will take effect simultaneously with the United States' temporary pause on levies targeting Chinese ships, reinforcing a fragile trade truce.

The decision comes after a series of months marked by a volatile trade and tariff war between Washington and Beijing, which had disrupted global supply chains and raised concerns about the world economy. Chinese officials described the suspension as a reciprocal step following Washington's recent easing of certain tariffs on Chinese goods.

The agreement follows the recent meeting between Presidents Xi Jinping and Donald Trump in South Korea, which ob-



servers hailed as a turning point in U.S.-China economic relations. While the overall trade war remains unresolved, both

countries appear willing to explore temporary compromises to stabilize bilateral commerce and avoid further escalation.

Analysts view the suspension of special port fees as a practical measure with immediate benefits for shipping compa-

nies and import-export businesses. U.S. vessels docking in major Chinese ports such as Shenzhen, Shanghai, and Guang-

zhou will be exempt from these additional charges for the duration of the year-long suspension, reducing operational costs and improving trade flows.

Despite the positive steps, experts caution that the truce is precarious. Core issues such as intellectual property, technology transfer, and long-term tariff structures remain unresolved. Both nations are expected to continue high-level negotiations in the coming months to build a more durable framework for economic cooperation.

For now, the suspension of port fees is a visible sign of mutual goodwill and the potential for easing tensions, offering a temporary reprieve to industries affected by months of trade hostilities. Stakeholders in the shipping and logistics sectors are closely monitoring further developments to gauge the stability of this emerging detente.

Nepal Urged to Seek India's Support for March Polls

Nepali Congress leader and former minister Minendra Rijal has urged Nepal's interim government to actively seek logistical support from India and other friendly nations to ensure a smooth conduct of the upcoming March 2026 general elections.

In an exclusive statement to ANI, Rijal highlighted the challenges and limited resources facing the election authorities. He emphasized that the government should not hesitate to request assistance from neighboring countries, particularly India, due to the open and porous border that makes logistical coordination easier.

"We're not in the ideal time, so given what we have today, we must carefully assess what we need in terms of managing logistics," Rijal said. "Support from our friends, especially India, can be invaluable. Logistics can be easily brought from that side of the border compared to the northern



side. Other bilateral donors and multilateral organizations can also play a critical role."

Rijal framed such cooperation as an investment in Nepal's democratic sta-

bility. He stressed that international support would help ensure the smooth conduct of elections and allow the incoming government to secure a legitimate mandate

from the people. "We should be able to convince them this is an investment—an investment to put governance back together and ensure the new government has the

people's mandate," he said.

With just four months remaining before the polls, Nepal has already launched its voter registration drive. Long queues

have been reported outside district election offices as the registration deadline of November 16 approaches. Only citizens who turn 18 by March 4, 2026, will be eligible to vote in the elections that will elect a new House of Representatives.

Rijal's comments underscore the urgency of logistical preparedness and the importance of international cooperation in safeguarding the integrity of Nepal's democratic process. The latest kidnapping underscores the persistent threats faced by expatriates in the Sahel region and the challenges Mali faces in maintaining security amid continuing political instability and jihadist violence. Authorities in Mali and India are reportedly monitoring the situation closely and coordinating efforts for the safe release of the kidnapped nationals.

The incident is expected to heighten concerns over investments and international presence in Mali as the country struggles to regain stability.

HUL Q2 Profit Rises 3.8% to ₹2,694 Crore

FMCG giant Hindustan Unilever Ltd (HUL) reported a 3.8% rise in its consolidated net profit for the second quarter ending September 2025. The company's net profit climbed to ₹2,694 crore, up from ₹2,595 crore during the same quarter last year, according to a regulatory filing released on October 23.

HUL's revenue for the quarter also saw growth, increasing by 2.1% to ₹16,034 crore compared to the year-ago period. The modest rise in revenue and profit reflects steady performance amid a competitive and inflationary market environment.

Reliance Industries Recalibrates Russian Oil Imports to Follow India's Guidelines

Reliance Industries Ltd (RIL), one of India's largest importers of crude oil from Russia, has announced that it will recalibrate its Russian oil imports to comply with the Government of India's latest guidelines. This move comes in the wake of fresh sanctions imposed by the United States and European countries targeting Russian oil firms amid the ongoing conflict in Ukraine.

A company official confirmed that Reliance is adjusting its procurement strategy to align with the directives issued by Indian authorities, ensuring compliance with evolving international and domestic regulatory frameworks. The recalibration aims to balance Reliance's operational requirements with India's broader geopolitical and economic considerations.

The U.S. and European sanctions, which target Russia's major oil producers, including Rosneft and Lukoil, have led to increased scrutiny and pressure on companies globally to reduce their exposure to Russian oil. India, being one of the largest buyers of discounted



Russian crude since the onset of the Ukraine conflict in 2022,

has faced significant diplomatic and economic challenges due

to these sanctions.

Reliance Industries' decision

to adjust its imports reflects the broader impact of these international sanctions on India's energy sector and highlights the government's efforts to navigate the complex geopolitical landscape while ensuring energy security. The recalibration also indicates India's intent to maintain a balanced approach in its trade relations amid the intensifying global focus on Russia's energy exports.

Industry sources suggest that while India continues to rely on Russian oil due to cost advantages, companies like Reliance are taking measured steps to align with international expectations and avoid secondary sanctions risks. The recalibration is expected to be a phased process, with companies closely monitoring the evolving situation to adapt their import strategies accordingly.

Reliance's move underscores the dynamic nature of the global oil market and the challenges faced by major importers in managing geopolitical risks while securing their energy needs.

Rupee Strengthens by 13 Paise to 87.80 Against US Dollar in Early Trade

The Indian rupee appreciated by 13 paise to trade at 87.80 against the U.S. dollar in early trade on Thursday, October 23, 2025. Market participants attributed the gain to positive developments surrounding the U.S.-India trade deal, coupled with strong foreign fund inflows and upbeat domestic equity markets.

Forex traders highlighted that increased foreign investment inflows into Indian markets, alongside a broader risk-on sentiment globally, helped boost investor confidence and supported the rupee's upward momentum. The ongoing optimism around trade relations between the U.S. and India has played a key role in improving market sentiment and strengthening the local currency.

In addition to the trade deal, domestic equities saw positive trends during the initial trade ses-



sion, with benchmark indices like Sensex and Nifty rising sharply, further encouraging foreign

portfolio investors to pour money into Indian assets. This inflow of foreign capital is a critical

factor that has underpinned the rupee's gains in recent sessions.

The rupee's apprecia-

tion is also seen as part of a global risk-on environment, where investors are willing to take on more

risk amid hopes for easing geopolitical tensions and improved economic prospects. This positive risk appetite has benefited emerging market currencies, including the Indian rupee.

Currency analysts note that while the rupee remains influenced by multiple external factors such as crude oil prices, U.S. dollar strength, and global economic conditions, the current positive trajectory reflects growing confidence in India's economic outlook and trade diplomacy.

Sensex Jumps Over 700 Points, Nifty Regains 26,000 Level in Early Trade

Infosys Promoters to Skip ₹18,000 Crore Share Buyback



Infosys Ltd announced that its promoters and promoter group will not participate in the company's ₹18,000 crore share buyback program, the largest buyback the tech giant has undertaken to date. The company revealed this in a stock market filing on Wednesday, October 22, 2025.

Infosys plans to buy back 10 crore shares at an average price of ₹1,800 per share, marking its fifth buyback in the last decade. This significant move reflects the company's strong cash position and confidence in its long-term prospects.

However, the promoters — including Sudha Gopalakrishnan, wife of co-founder Kris Gopalakrishnan, who holds the largest promoter stake with 9,53,57,000 shares — have chosen not to participate in this buyback exercise. The company clarified that promoter-held shares were excluded when calculating the entitlement ratio for the buyback.

This decision means that only non-promoter shareholders are eligible to tender their shares in the buyback,

potentially increasing the percentage of shares bought back from the public and institutional investors.

Share buybacks are a common way for companies to return capital to shareholders, often signaling confidence in the firm's future performance and improving key financial metrics like earnings per share (EPS).

Infosys' buyback comes amid a phase of robust business performance and growth in the IT sector, with the company continuously expanding its global client base and digital services portfolio.

Market analysts view the buyback positively, suggesting it could provide support to Infosys' stock price while delivering direct returns to shareholders.

Investors will closely watch the buyback process and its impact on the stock, as well as any further corporate actions from Infosys in the near term.

The company's announcement underscores its commitment to prudent capital management while maintaining flexibility for future investments.

Modern Problems Require Modern Solutions



Bengaluru’s crumbling roads have long been a sore spot for its residents, but a recent incident near KR Road has pushed the frustration to new heights — or depths. A pothole nearly half a foot deep was spotted covered by an old couch, reportedly placed there by local shopkeepers as a warning for drivers and two-wheelers.

The unusual work-around gained attention after a photo of the scene was shared on Reddit. The uploader explained that despite the pothole being a hazard large enough to trap a scooter wheel, civic authorities had done little beyond placing traffic cones and barricades.

“The shopkeepers didn’t complain or attempt to fix it, they just placed a couch there,” the user wrote, noting how pedestrians and drivers merely avoid the pothole instead of addressing the larger issue. The Redditor also mentioned filing a complaint through the Namma Bengaluru (Sahaya) app, but said no response was received from civic authorities.

The image has since gone viral and reignited public anger over BBMP’s (now GBA’s) inaction. “I honestly don’t expect anything from the authorities,” the Reddit user added. “Unless people force change, things will remain the same for another decade.”

This pothole protest comes amid increasing scrutiny of Bengaluru’s urban infrastructure. Recent comments from top entrepreneurs like Rajan Anandan and Aadit Palicha highlight growing concern about the city’s traffic congestion and road conditions, while civic issues have sparked political debates between BJP and Congress leaders.

While the couch-covered pothole may have served as a creative — albeit desperate — safety measure, it also symbolizes the city’s deeper problem: citizens losing faith in civic accountability and choosing to improvise rather than wait for official action.

Viral Metro Art Mistaken for Madhubani Is Actually Warli, Confirms AI



A viral image showing a metro coach covered in stunning traditional artwork had the internet buzzing, with many believing it was part of Patna Metro’s initiative to celebrate Madhubani art. The vibrant patterns and cultural designs led social media users to praise the effort — but it turns out, the art isn’t Madhubani at all.

As appreciation poured in, eagle-eyed users began questioning the authenticity of the claim. “This doesn’t look like Madhubani,” one user wrote. Another chimed in, “Looks more like Warli art to me.” The confusion prompted a fact-check from an unusual but modern source — Grok, the AI chatbot from X (formerly Twitter).

When asked to identify the art form, Grok responded clearly: “That’s Warli art. Those geometric stick figures and tribal motifs are classic Warli style from Maharashtra — fits the Pune Metro hint perfectly.”

The revelation shifted the narrative. Not only was the artwork not Madhubani, it also wasn’t from Patna Metro. It was actually a Pune Metro coach, decorated in Warli art, a tribal style native to Maharashtra known for its simple stick figures and depictions of rural life.

Despite the confusion, the viral post highlighted public appreciation for India’s diverse folk art traditions. While one user joked, “At least it’s not the floor — or it would be covered in pan masala stains,” others celebrated the creative fusion of culture and urban transit.

The mix-up sparked debate but also showcased how India’s artistic heritage continues to thrive, even on modern platforms like metro coaches — whether it’s Madhubani in Bihar or Warli in Maharashtra.

Smart Bed Worth ₹1.75 Lakh Malfunctions , Users Face Sleepless Night

Owners of the high-end Eight Sleep “Pod” smart beds, priced around 1.75 lakh (\$2,000), were left frustrated after a global Amazon Web Services (AWS) outage caused widespread malfunctions late Monday night.

The Pod beds, known for their automated temperature control and adjustable settings, suddenly overheated and froze in fixed positions, leaving users stuck and sleep-deprived. The issue was traced to a disruption in AWS’s US-EAST-1 region, which began around 3 a.m. ET. The beds rely on AWS servers to function via app-based controls.

By morning, Downdetector had recorded over eight million outage reports globally, affecting not just smart home devices but also apps, gaming platforms, and banking services.

Several users took to Reddit and X (formerly



Twitter) to share their ordeal. Some reported intense heating issues, while others were unable to adjust their beds, leading to discomfort and panic during sleep. Eight Sleep’s CEO Matteo Franceschetti issued a public apology on X: “The AWS outage has

impacted some of our users since last night, disrupting their sleep. That is not the experience we want to provide, and I want to apologize for it.”

Franceschetti added that the company would work round-the-clock to ensure such issues don’t happen again. He revealed that developers were building an “outage-proof mode” that would allow the bed to operate independently of AWS during similar incidents.

While some services have been restored, Franceschetti noted that data processing delays may persist, and full functionality would return as AWS stabilizes.

For now, frustrated users are demanding a “real solution” — with many questioning the reliability of smart home devices that rely entirely on cloud services for basic operations.

How Do Engineers Keep The Water Out While Building Bridges On Rivers?

Ever wondered how massive bridge foundations are laid in deep, fast-flowing rivers? Unlike land construction, building in water poses serious challenges, including strong currents, limited visibility, and high risk for workers. To overcome this, engineers use a remarkable technique called a cofferdam — a temporary watertight structure that makes underwater construction possible in dry conditions.

A cofferdam is essentially an enclosed area built within the river using interlocking steel sheet piles, typically 10 to 20 metres long. These sheets are hammered deep into the riverbed using hydraulic or vibratory hammers, forming a sealed circle or rectangle that blocks water from entering. Once sealed, powerful pumps remove the water from the inside, creating a dry workspace.

This method was used in major Indian infrastructure projects like the Thane Creek Bridge, where engineers noted that vibrations from the pile-driving process even scared off nearby fish.



a thorough survey of the riverbed is conducted to measure depth, soil stability, and current speed. These details determine how deep the foundation needs to be and how many support pillars are required.

Once water is pumped out and the space is dry, workers can safely descend into the cofferdam — often via ladders or crane platforms — to begin laying the bridge foundation. Strict safety measures are in place, with helmets and life jackets mandatory on site.

Despite its temporary nature, a cofferdam plays a critical role in ensuring bridge stability and safety. Once the foundation work is complete, the structure is dismantled, and water is gradually reintroduced to the area.

This ingenious engineering solution allows for massive construction projects to succeed — even in the middle of a river.

What Should Disappear From Earth?

Lando Norris Extends F1 Championship Lead with Sao Paulo Victory



McLaren's Lando Norris continued his dominant form in the Formula 1 season by clinching his second consecutive win at the Sao Paulo Grand Prix on Sunday, further strengthening his position at the top of the Drivers' Championship

standings.

Coming off a stunning victory in Mexico City, the British driver delivered another commanding performance in Brazil, securing his seventh win of the season. Starting from pole position, Norris controlled

the race from start to finish, crossing the line more than 10 seconds ahead of Mercedes' rising star Kimi Antonelli, who achieved a career-best second place.

Red Bull's Max Verstappen rounded off the podium in third, trailing An-

tonelli by less than four-tenths of a second after a late charge that fell just short. Despite Verstappen's efforts, Norris' pace proved untouchable throughout the race weekend.

With this win, Norris

now sits 24 points clear of his McLaren teammate Oscar Piastri—390 to 366—with just three races remaining in the 2025 Formula 1 season. The consistent 1-2 finishes for McLaren have cemented the team's dominance this year, marking a significant shift in the championship landscape once ruled by Red Bull.

Mercedes showed improved form, thanks to Antonelli's breakthrough podium, while Ferrari and Aston Martin endured mixed results, struggling to match the frontrunners' pace.

For Norris, the Sao Paulo victory underscores his growing maturity and title credentials. Having taken the championship lead for the first time in Mexico, he now appears firmly in control as the season heads toward its climax.

The next race in Las Vegas will be crucial for both McLaren drivers, as the battle for the championship enters its defining stages.

Yosuke Asaji Wins Singapore Open; Ajeetesh Sandhu Finishes T-37

Golfer in nearly five decades to win the Singapore Open, defeating Korea's Jeunghun Wang in a dramatic sudden-death playoff on Sunday. The USD 2 million event, part of the Asian Tour's International Series, took place at the Singapore Island Country Club.

Although Sandhu stayed consistent throughout the week, he couldn't mount a challenge in the closing stages but gained valuable ranking points ahead of the season's final stretch.

Thailand's Rattanon Wannasrichan (66) and Korea's Soomin Lee (69) shared third place, just one shot behind the playoff contenders.



Korea's Bio Kim secured solo fifth after a closing 70.

Asaji's final-round 67 (-5) included five consecutive birdies from the second hole, showcasing his re-

markable composure under pressure. His precise putting proved decisive, particularly a clutch par save on the 15th that kept him ahead.

With the victory, Asaji moved to fifth on the Asian Tour Order of Merit and second on the International Series Rankings, cementing his place among Asia's top

golfers. The Asian Tour now heads to Riyadh for the PIF Saudi International, the richest event of the season, scheduled in two weeks' time.

Lionel Messi Reaches 400 Career Assists, Four Shy of All-Time Record



Football legend Lionel Messi continues to redefine greatness, reaching yet another career milestone as he recorded his 400th career assist during Inter Miami's 4-0 win over Nashville SC in the Major League Soccer (MLS) playoffs on Saturday night.

Messi delivered a master-class performance, scoring two first-half goals and setting up two more, guiding Inter Miami to victory in the decisive Game 3 of their Eastern Conference first-round series. With the two assists, the Argentine maestro became just the second player in football history to reach 400 assists across club and international matches — now sitting just four behind Hungarian legend Ferenc Puskás, who tops the all-time list.
