



## 37 Maoists Surrender in Telangana

In a significant setback for the banned CPI (Maoist), a total of 37 underground cadres surrendered before the Telangana Police on Saturday. The surrendering group included three high-ranking members: Koyyada Sambaiah alias Azad and Appasi Narayana alias Ramesh, both from the Telangana State Committee (SCM), and Muchakki Somada alias Erra from the Dandakarnya Special Zonal Committee (DKSZC). The surrender also involved th

ree Divisional Committee Members (DVCs), nine Area Committee Members (ACMs), and 22 regular party members. Highlighting the seriousness of the dissociation, the cadres also handed over a cache of eight firearms, including one AK-47 rifle, two SLRs, four .303 rifles, and one G3 rifle, along with 343 live ammunition of various calibres.

Director General of Police B. Shivadhar Reddy stated that the surrender was a direct and positive response to the appeal made by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on October 21, urging


## iBomma Kingpin's Global Links Under Probe

The police investigation into Ravi, the alleged operator of the massive film piracy platform 'iBomma,' is continuing from all angles after his arrest, focusing on the sheer scale of the operation that troubled the film industry and police for six years. Investigators are attempting to determine if the scale of the operation— Involving hundreds of agents globally, links with gaming app operators, over 100 websites, and 21,000 pirated films—could truly be managed by one person, or if a larger network is operating behind the scenes. During the second day of his five-day custody on Friday, police reportedly extracted key information from Ravi, particularly concerning his operational links in the UK, Switzerland, and the

Netherlands.

It was discovered that Ravi predominantly purchased pirated movies from Tamil websites. He is estimated to have run the piracy racket brazenly, establishing an office in the Caribbean Islands and utilizing the aid of technical experts (tekkies) based in the UK. Ravi's business model involved obtaining copies of new films, often recorded with cell phones in theaters, from the Tamil websites. He then used specialized software to convert these low-quality recordings into HD quality before uploading them to his network of websites. Ravi revealed that the massive revenue generated from advertisements for betting apps was used to finance the purchase of the pirated films. The investigation also uncovered personal details about Ravi's life, including a difficult childhood with separated parents, struggling with



To successfully evade detection, Ravi confessed to acquiring a foreign citizenship and obtaining a driver's license, Pan Card, and bank accounts under the false name of Prahlad Kumar. He also disclosed that his office in the Caribbean Islands employed 20 staff members. The investigation also uncovered personal details about Ravi's life, including a difficult childhood with separated parents, struggling with

poverty during his job search in Mumbai after completing his B.Sc. in Computers, and subsequent marital separation despite having an eight-year-old daughter. He reportedly told the police that his drive to earn money was fueled by these bitter experiences. The police noted that while they have shut down the 'iBomma' and 'Bappam' websites, Ravi had taken the precaution of linking his uploaded films to other piracy sites (gateways). This has led to the recent discovery that clicking the old links can still redirect users to over 50 other piracy sites, predominantly operating from Tamil Nadu. Furthermore, police are now assessing whether cyber fraudsters are using the 'iBomma' platform for broader criminal activities, as initially, it was thought to be limited to betting app advertisements.

## Kadiyam Srihari Gets Speaker's Notice on Defection Plea

Telangana Speaker Gaddam Prasad Kumar has issued a notice to MLA Kadiyam Srihari regarding a disqualification petition filed against him by the BRS (Bharat Rashtra Samithi). The plea alleges that the MLA has violated party norms by switching allegiance to the ruling Congress party. The Speaker directed Srihari to submit his response to the notice by November 23; however, official sources confirmed that the MLA has since requested an extension of time to prepare and submit his reply. Kadiyam Srihari is one of ten BRS MLAs against whom the party has filed similar disqualification petitions alleging defection to the Congress party, which now holds power in the state.

The current action by the Speaker follows a strong directive from the Supreme Court. On November 17, the Supreme Court issued a contempt notice to the Telangana Speaker for failing to comply with its earlier order. A bench led by Chief Justice B. R. Gavai had previously instructed the Assembly Speaker on July 31 to decide on the disqualification pleas



against the ten BRS MLAs within a strict three-month period. The Supreme Court bench expressed severe disapproval of the non-compliance, characterizing the failure to follow its earlier directions as the "grossest kind of contempt." Following this strong reprimand, the Court issued notices not only to the Speaker but also to other relevant parties regarding the contempt petition filed by the BRS leaders. The bench also addressed a separate plea filed on behalf of the Speaker's office, which requested an eight-week extension to deliver decisions on the pending disqualification pleas. In the latest hearing on November 17, the Supreme Court posted the matter for further hearing after four weeks. Meanwhile, lawyers

## Telangana Finalises Local Body Reservation Rules

The Telangana State Government has released G.O. Number 46 to finalize the reservations for Sarpanch and Ward Members in the upcoming local body elections. The key guidelines within this G.O. have been formulated to adhere strictly to the 50% limit mandated by the Supreme Court, ensuring that the total reservations for SC, ST, and BC categories do not exceed this threshold.

A primary objective of the new guidelines is to ensure equal opportunities for all communities by implementing a rotation system for SC, ST, BC, and Women reservations.

**The G.O. specifies different bases for determining reservations:**

Ward Members: SC, ST, and BC reservations for Ward Members will be determined based on the 2024 Social, Economic, Educational, and Caste Survey (SEEPC).

Sarpanch Positions: SC and ST res



ervations for Sarpanch posts will rely on the 2011 Census data, while BC reservations will be based on the data from the 2024 Caste Survey.

**BC Quota:** Under the new guidelines, the reservation quota for the Backward Classes (BCs) in both Sarpanch and Ward positions is fixed at 23%. **Tribal Areas:** All Sarpanch and Ward Member seats will be reserved entirely for STs in Gram Panchayats where the ST population is 100%.

Following the issuance of this G.O., the next crucial steps involve the District Collectors and Election Officers completing the reservation process in compliance with these guidelines and submitting their reports to the Panchayat Raj Department. The government is aiming to finalize the



# CM Directs Grand Preparations for Telangana Rising Global Summit

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy held a special meeting with CMO officials on Saturday afternoon to issue directives for the grand preparations of the Telangana Rising Global Summit, scheduled for December 8 and 9. The summit is set to take place in a vast ground in the Future City area. The Chief Minister instructed officials to organize the two-day event not just as a summit, but as a celebration marking the two-year anniversary of the Praja Government coming to power. The meeting was attended by Chief Secretary Ramakrishna Rao, Special Chief Secretary Jayesh Ranjan, CMO Chief Secretary Seshadri, and other CMO officials. The CM emphasized that the Global Summit should be a visually appealing event of international standards, attracting attention worldwide. He instructed officials to erect a huge stage



in the spacious ground at Future City, reflecting the celebration of two years of achievement. The schedule is strategically divided: the first day (December 8) will be dedicated to showcasing the success of the government's initiatives and schemes, ensuring a festive atmosphere. The second day (December 9) will be centered on un-

veiling the "Telangana Rising 2047 Document," which outlines the state's future vision and plans. In the same venue, the CM mandated round-table meetings to showcase Telangana's industrial policy and its priority on investments to the global community. He also advised all government departments to prepare compelling audio-video presentations and displays detailing their future goals.

The Chief Minister directed officials to specifically invite prominent national and international personalities, as well as renowned industrialists from all sectors. He stressed the importance of ensuring adequate accommodation and highest security for

all visiting guests, ensuring no shortcomings in the arrangements. He mandated that all departments work in coordination to make the event a success. The CM emphasized that all departments, which are key players in transforming Telangana into a \$3 trillion economy by 2047, must participate actively in the summit. ## Mandatory Display of PvPI QR Code and Toll-Free Number for Drug Reporting

The Drugs Control Administration (DCA), Telangana, issued an important press note informing all Retail Medical Shops / Pharmacies and Wholesale Medical Shops, as well as the general public, about a nationwide initiative to enhance patient safety and pharmacovigilance. As part of this effort, the Pharmacovigilance Programme of India (PvPI) has mandated the display of a designated QR Code and Toll-Free Number at all medical shops for the purpose of reporting Adverse Drug Reactions (ADRs) by the public.

This directive is crucial for strengthening the drug safety monitoring system in the country. An Adverse Drug Reaction is any unwanted or harmful reaction experienced by a patient after taking a medicine, and prompt reporting is essential for identifying potential safety issues with pharmaceutical products. The DCA's announcement underscores the commitment to ensuring that members of the public have readily

accessible tools to report such adverse events. The public is specifically requested to report any adverse event they experience or suspect after taking a medicine by utilizing the two designated modes: either by scanning the PvPI QR Code displayed prominently at the medical shops or by calling the provided PvPI toll-free number. This proactive measure ensures a standardized, accessible, and user-friendly mechanism for pharmacovigilance reporting at the consumer level, making it easier for citizens to contribute to the nation's drug safety database. The involvement of the PvPI, a national centre for monitoring drug safety, highlights the significance of this mandate. The display of these resources will serve as a constant reminder to consumers about their role in reporting drug side effects, thereby creating a collaborative environment between regulatory bodies, medical shops, and the public to monitor and ensure the safety of medicines sold and consumed in Telangana.

## Transforming Education Is Telangana Government's Core Mission: Minister Sridhar Babu

Speaking as the Chief Guest at the JNTUH Global Alumni Meet – 2025 held at the JNTUH Auditorium in Kukatpally, the Minister emphasized the state's commitment to prioritizing skilling, re-skilling, and up-skilling its youth. This focus is aimed at preparing them as future-ready human resources for emerging global markets and the demands of modern technology-driven industries. Minister Sridhar Babu highlighted the government's dedication to accord top priority to both education and healthcare. Simultaneously, he noted that the state is actively strengthening an ecosystem that aims to position Telangana

as a leader in key emerging technologies, specifically mentioning fields such as quantum computing, cybersecurity, and artificial intelligence (AI). In a major announcement, the Minister revealed that the State will soon launch the Telangana AI Innovation Hub, a project developed in collaboration with international experts, designed to advance research and innovation in AI.

Urging the students and alumni to maintain a strong connection to their origins, he stated a philosophical tenet: "No matter how high we rise, we must never forget where we come from. Giving back to society is a responsibility that comes with gratitude." He linked the sincere fulfillment of duties to the power of individuals to demand progress and accountability from leadership. The Minister also issued a challenge to the JNTUH alumni network, calling upon them to take the lead in establishing a Centre of Excellence in AI, quantum computing, and cybersecurity. ## High-Level Committee Formed to Address Sugarcane Farmers' Issues

IT & Industries Minister Duddilla Sridhar Babu announced on Saturday that the government will constitute a high-level committee to conduct an in-depth study of the challenges faced by sugarcane farmers, industry representatives, and Chaipersons of Sugarcane Development Councils (CDCs). The Minister made this announcement after holding a detailed review meeting at the Secretariat with sugarcane farmers, industry representatives, and Chaipersons of Sugarcane Development Councils (CDCs).

Minister Sridhar Babu acknowledged that the government has taken serious note of the steady decline in sugarcane cultivation area in Telangana. He assured the attendees of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's commitment to resolving the issues facing the state's sugar industry. To examine the key concerns raised during the meeting and formulate a clear action plan, the Minister announced

that the committee will be headed by the Special Chief Secretary of the IT & Industries Department. Its members will include officials from relevant departments and representatives from sugar mills. A crucial part of the committee's mandate will be to study the incentives and benefits being offered to sugarcane farmers in other states and submit its report at the earliest to inform state policy.

The meeting highlighted several farmer demands, including the request to extend the 500-per-quintal bonus currently given to fine rice to sugarcane as well, which the Minister assured would be placed before the Chief Minister. Farmers also pointed out the issue of acute labour shortages for harvesting, noting that the BRS government had removed the 50% subsidy on sugarcane harvesters offered by the previous Congress government. Sridhar Babu referenced the labor crisis, even in his own constituency,

## UIDAI Introduces New Safety Measures: Aadhaar Card to Feature Only Photo and QR Code

The Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) is set to introduce new safety features for Aadhaar cards, primarily aimed at preventing the misuse of personal information and reducing reliance on offline verification methods. UIDAI Chief Executive Officer Bhuvanesh Kumar revealed that the authority is considering a proposal to feature only the individual's photograph and a QR code on the physical Aadhaar card. This change

stems from the observation that printing personal details on the card makes them susceptible to misuse.

To further strengthen verification protocols, UIDAI will implement new rules starting in December that will prohibit entities like hotels and event organizers from taking photocopies of Aadhaar cards or relying on physical copies for offline verification. Kumar clarified that Aadhaar is intended solely for online authentication. While the current Aadhaar Act already bans



the use and storage of biometric data or Aadhaar numbers for offline verification, many organizations continue to retain physical copies. To counter this, UIDAI is

introducing a new Aadhaar App. UIDAI DDG Vivek Chandra Verma explained that these new measures are expected to significantly reduce the practice of submitting photocopies or depending on physical cards. The upcoming app will offer advanced features such as the ability to view the Aadhaar details of up to five members of the same family and will give users complete control over which details they choose to share. Modern facilities like biometric lock/unlock will be available with a single click, and updating details such as mobile number and address will become much simpler for the user.

where cotton farmers are bringing in workers from Chhattisgarh and Maharashtra. The committee will also study the demand to continue the drip-irrigation subsidy for sugarcane, as officials noted that drip systems can increase yields by 8–9 tonnes per acre. Furthermore, the committee will assess the feasibility of the government bearing a portion of the transportation cost for sugarcane. He noted that Telangana has an encouraging sugar recovery rate of up to 11% and stressed the government's commitment to increasing cultivation. The meeting was attended by TGIIC Chairperson Nirmala Jagga Reddy, Zaheerabad MP Suresh Shetkar, Special Chief Secretary Sanjay Kumar, and other key officials and farmer representatives.

## Deputy CM Highlights Welfare Schemes, Announces Integrated School Project

Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka addressed a public meeting in Wyra constituency headquarters after performing the Bhoomi Puja for development works worth 400 crores, stating that the Telangana Government is dedicated to the people and committed to public welfare. He promised to keep exploiters and middlemen away from governance and projected that by 2047, Telangana would be globally competitive through continuous development. Vikramarka announced the



Young India Integrated School project as a "game-changer" that will drive social change and overall progress, with the goal of establishing at least one such school in every constituency. As part of this, a school is being built in Wyra with a 200 crore investment on 20 acres, including on-campus accommodation for

13,500 crore; and free electricity up to 200 units is being provided to 53 lakh families under the Gruhajyothi scheme. Addressing the financial empowerment of women, he highlighted the previous BRS government's failure to provide interest-free loans. The Congress government, in contrast, has pledged 1 lakh crore in interest-free loans over five years, with 27,000 crore already disbursed and the next phase scheduled for release within two to three days. Furthermore, the government is encouraging women's economic activity by supporting them with petrol bunks and solar power units, guaranteeing to purchase electricity from them. Vikramarka also addressed the improvement of residential schools by increasing diet charges by 40% and cosmetic charges by 200%, correcting the mismanagement of the previous regime. He sanctioned 400 crore for development works in Wyra in a single day, including the construction of a 100-bed government hospital and resuming work on the canal lining of the Wyra project, for which 42 crore was re-sanctioned.

## Government Pushes to Complete Gouravelli Project, Legal Hurdles Cleared

Minister Ponnambalam Prabhakar, following a review meeting with Irrigation Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy at Jal Saudha, announced significant progress toward completing the Gouravelli Project. The project is designed to provide permanent irrigation benefits to the farming community in the Husnabad region, covering an extensive area of over one lakh acres on a high-altitude plateau. Prabhakar stated that the major legal challenge concerning the project has recently been resolved by the Supreme Court. Furthermore, he confirmed that the Chief Minister, Deputy Chief Minister, and

Irrigation Minister have all approved the necessary funds required for filling the Gouravelli reservoir with water, digging canals, and addressing pending land acquisition issues. The Minister noted that while most legal problems have been resolved, a remaining issue pertains to the Rehabilitation and Resettlement (R&R) package for 55 acres of land. He brought the affected individuals to meet Irrigation Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy, who reportedly promised to expedite the resolution of their problem. With all major obstacles now being removed, Prabhakar requested the cooperation and support of the local



farmers in completing the canal land acquisition quickly. He emphasized that the completion of the reservoir bund and the canals would enable the Godavari river water to reach every village through Gouravelli. Minister

Prabhakar took personal responsibility for completing the project, which was originally founded by the late Y.S. Rajasekhara Reddy but remained incomplete despite the previous KCR-led BRS government's ten-year promise to finish it quickly. He affirmed that the current government is not interested in blaming the past administration but is committed to fulfilling its word and providing water to the farmers of the region as promised.

## Harish Rao Brands Congress Land Policy "Biggest Scam"

Former Minister Harish Rao, speaking at a press meet at Telangana Bhavan, launched a fierce attack on the Congress government's new land policy, calling it the latest in a series of "scams" and labeling the Congress party as the "address for scams." He renamed the policy from the Hyderabad Industrial Land Transformation Policy to the "Hyderabad Industrial Land Looting Policy," alleging it is a conspiracy by the Revanth Reddy government to sell off nearly ten thousand acres of industrial land cheaply. Rao accused CM Revanth Reddy of being singularly focused on "illegal looting" since taking pow-

er, pointing to alleged issues with Lagherla and HCU lands, and claiming that the current government is only known for "selling" land, unlike the BRS which was known for "approvals" and "investments." Rao further stated that the CM is selling every inch of land, down to small plots in the Housing Board, contradicting his previous statements against selling land. He noted that while other states take 50% of the land or fees to regularize industrial land conversion, the Revanth Reddy government is only taking 30%. He alleged the CM is not Anumula Revanth Reddy but "Ammakala Revanth Reddy" (Revanth Reddy of Sales). Harish Rao confirmed KTR's

previous assertions and challenged Minister Sridhar Babu, saying that the Minister himself admitted the 9,292 acres conversion, with only 30% payment of the SRO value, would yield 5,000 crore. Rao stated that the land's actual value is 5 lakh crore, making the difference of 4.95 lakh crore a clear scam. As the former Chairman of the Revenue Resource Mobilization Cabinet Sub Committee, he challenged Sridhar Babu for an open debate on the claim that only 4,740 acres are involved, calling it an attempt to minimize the scale of the scam. He claimed the speed of the implementation—with a two-month completion timeline—shows a pre-planned

sketch for the 5 lakh crore scam. Rao presented eight specific questions to the government, demanding answers on why they are using the lower SRO value instead of the TGICC rate, why they aren't waiting for the announced SRO hike, why the rate for the poor (LRS) is 60-80% but for the rich (land conversion) is 30%, and whether the policy is intended to fill the pockets of the CM and his alleged associates ("Anumula Brothers"). He called it the "biggest land scam in India" and demanded an immediate Assembly session to discuss the policy, warning that the BRS would not tolerate the selling of public property.



## Minister Sridhar Babu Delivers Strong Counter to BRS's 5 Lakh Crore Land Scam Allegation

State IT and Industries Minister Duddilla Sridhar Babu issued a strong counter-statement against former Minister Harish Rao and BRS leaders KTR's allegations of a 5 lakh crore scam related to the Industrial Land Transformation Policy. Sridhar Babu vehemently dismissed the accusation as "completely baseless, untrue, and politically motivated," stating that making "false allegations and spreading lies is second nature" to BRS leaders. He challenged Harish

Rao to produce concrete evidence to substantiate the claim, failing which he demanded a public apology to the people of the state, asserting that the BRS is continuously repeating the "5 lakh crore scam" record simply out of frustration over losing power. The Minister then redirected the focus, demanding that BRS leaders first answer the "lakhs of crores mystery" behind the freehold G.O.s (19, 20, 21) issued by the BRS government in August 2023. He called Harish Rao's allegations, given his long

## Congress Slams KTR's Allegations as Diversionary Tactic for Formula E Scam

TPCC General Secretary Channagani Dayakar fiercely criticized BRS leader KTR, accusing him of making "petty comments" against CM Revanth Reddy as a tactic to divert attention from his own alleged corruption, particularly the Formula E Cars corruption case. Dayakar stated that Revanth Reddy became Chief Minister by successfully fighting against the corruption of the BRS regime. He then aggressively countered that KTR was complicit in the misappropriation of nearly 1,000 acres of land belonging to HMDA and TGICC between 2014 and 2023. As evidence of BRS corruption, Dayakar pointed to the ACB raids on former HMDA Director Balakrishna, who was allegedly caught with assets worth 1,000

crore. Dayakar accused KTR of colluding with realtors to sell off valuable land in prime locations around Hyderabad, including Kokapet, Bachupally, Uppal, Bhagayat, and Patancheru. He claimed that the sale of TGICC lands was conducted haphazardly to finance by-elections and GHMC elections during the BRS tenure. The General Secretary warned KTR to cease his "petty allegations" against the Chief Minister, or Congress workers would not hesitate to retaliate physically. Dayakar asserted that the new Congress government is a "Praja Prabhuvtam" (Peo-

ple's Government) that has introduced a new industrial policy aimed at Telangana's progress and development, contrasting it with the BRS era, where government land was "eaten up like an anaconda." He alleged that corruption involving TGICC lands over the past ten years amounted to 30,000 crore. Dayakar concluded by demanding that KTR respond to the corruption allegations made by his own sister and show "shame and conscience" by answering the demands of the people, emphasizing that the current government is working to protect government lands.

# HYDRA Resolves Dispute Over Temple and Chilla Relocation at Sunnam Cheruvu

The HYDRA successfully held a meeting with residents of the Sunnam Cheruvu area, resolving a dispute concerning the relocation of an Anjaneya Temple and a Muslim prayer site (Chilla) located within the Full Tank Level (FTL) boundary of the lake. Sunnam Cheruvu, which borders Madhupur and Borabanda, is one of the six lakes undergoing restoration in HYDRA's first phase. As the two religious structures were encroaching upon the lake's FTL area, HYDRA planned to relocate them to the lake bund. The issue had become a subject of discussion on social media. To address the matter, HYDRA Commissioner Shri A.V. Ranganath held a meeting with local residents from both communities at the HYDRA office on Saturday. During the discussion,



he explained the guidelines set by the Supreme Court regarding constructions in water bodies. After reviewing their opinions on relocating the Anjaneya idol and the Chilla to the bund side, safely outside the FTL boundary, both parties agreed to the proposal. The residents ex-

pressed their consent to the safe relocation of the structures adjacent to Sunnam Cheruvu. This agreement successfully resolves the contentious issue, clearing the path for the full restoration and protection of the lake's FTL boundary. The Commissioner's approach of directly engaging with the community leaders and explaining the legal context, particularly the Supreme Court mandates to protect water bodies, was instrumental in building consensus. The relocation is considered vital for the ecological health of Sunnam Cheruvu, as encroachment severely com-

promises the lake's capacity and integrity, leading to flooding during heavy rains. The agreement ensures that the religious sentiments of both Hindu and Muslim communities are respected by providing safe, designated alternative sites for the temple and the Chilla, thus balancing environmental conservation with community faith. This resolution is being hailed as an example of effective, sensitive administration in managing complex urban issues where development and religious structures often clash. The successful consensus is expected to expedite the overall lake restoration project, benefiting the larger population of Madhupur and Borabanda by mitigating flood risks and creating a cleaner urban water body.

## Family Suicide Reported in Amberpet Due to Suspected Superstitious Beliefs

The case has sent shockwaves through the local community, highlighting the dangers of extreme beliefs influencing vulnerable individuals. The Amberpet Police are meticulously searching the residence and examining the family's personal belongings, including any notes or diaries, to find concrete evidence that substantiates the initial suspicion of black magic or other forms of extreme superstition as the primary motive. They are also interviewing close relatives, neig-

## Begumpet Residents Protest Against Liquor Store In Residential Area

Residents of Begumpet's Harmony Avenue, organized under the Harmony Avenue Welfare Association, conducted a peaceful candlelight protest demanding the relocation of a liquor store situated near their residential colony. The residents stated that the liquor store, which has been operating near Guru Murthy Colony in Begumpet for the past four years, has been causing severe distress to colony residents, students, and women. With the recent completion of liquor tenders and the imminent opening of new shops next month, the association demanded the immediate removal of the existing store from the vicinity of the colony. Residents expressed deep concerns about safety, reporting that intoxicated patrons often behave inappropriately toward female students and women from the colony late at night. They voiced their anxiety, stating that the situation has

made them fearful of entering the colony after dark. The protesters expressed anger toward Excise officials, who they claim provide indifferent responses when the issues are brought to their attention. They emphasized that the police have the responsibility to ensure their protection and vowed to continue their struggle until the liquor store is relocated elsewhere. Residents Parvati and Rashi provided statements echoing the community's demand for safety and relocation of the shop, highlighting the urgent need for action to restore peace and security in their neighborhood. The protest underscores that the safety of young women walking home from educational institutions is being directly compromised by the behavior of the patrons. The association is reportedly prepared to escalate the matter to a legal challenge if administrative action is not taken swiftly to address the public nuisance.

## Cops Conduct Special Safety Drives, Focus on Human Trafficking

The Cyberabad Women & Child Safety Wing, under the direction of Dy. Commissioner of Police K. Srujan, detailed its activities for the week from November 15 to November 21, 2025, highlighting a focus on anti-human trafficking, public indecency, and preventive awareness. The Anti Human Trafficking Unit (AHTU) conducted night raids, apprehending 5 sex workers and 2 transgenders. Furthermore, AHTU registered three cases under the PITA Act, resulting in the rescue of 10 victims and the apprehension of 5 accused persons. Meanwhile, Cyberabad SHE Teams conducted 128 decoy operations, catching 79 persons red-handed while engaging in indecent acts in public spaces. Petty cases were booked in these 79 incidents, while the remaining individuals were appropriately counselled. The SHE Teams also addressed 18 complaints received from women victims through various channels during the week. In an effort to strengthen family bonds, the Family Counselling

Centres / CDEW Centres successfully worked to reunite 30 families embroiled in marital and family disputes. As part of their preventive strategy, AHTU and SHE Teams organized awareness programs across Cyberabad, engaging approximately 286 participants. These sessions covered crucial topics, including Human trafficking (both general and child trafficking), eve teasing, social media harassment, child marriage, child rights, child labour, stalking, begging, cyber bullying, and cyber frauds. Participants were also educated on essential support services like the Women helpline (181), Child helpline (1098), Dial 100, and Crimes 1930. The Suraksha Kavach Program, a special initiative under the Children & Youth Forum in association with SCSC, held a safety awareness session for 230 Grade 3 students at CHIREC School 1 (Cambridge Board). The session, themed "Being Good, Being Safe," used interactive activities to teach safety habits, reinforcing the message that the police are friendly and trustworthy protectors. This comprehensive weekly report indicates a multi-faceted strategy by Cyberabad Police, balancing enforcement operations with extensive social welfare initiatives. The high number of decoy operations highlights the commitment to creating safer public spaces for women and girls by actively curbing harassment. The counseling provided to both petty offenders and distressed families underscores a restorative justice approach, aiming for social reformation alongside legal enforcement. Additionally, the targeted awareness campaigns, reaching students and general public alike, are critical in empowering citizens with the knowledge to protect themselves from modern threats like cyber fraud and trafficking, thus contributing to a proactively safer community. The Suraksha Kavach program, in particular, focuses on building a foundation of trust between young children and the police force, ensuring that safety consciousness is inculcated from an early age, making them effective partners in crime prevention.




## Public Outcry Over Staff Negligence at Vikarabad Civil Supplies Office

The Civil Supplies Department section within the Vikarabad District Collectorate is facing severe public criticism due to chronic unpunctuality among its staff. Citizens arriving for services consistently find staff arriving late, and when questioned about the delay on Saturday morning, the employees reportedly responded with arrogance, stating they would work at their own will. This indifferent and irresponsible attitude from the officials has created deep public dissatisfaction. The public contrasted the staff's negligence with the exemplary punctuality of the District Collector, who strictly

adheres to time schedules. Residents are now demanding that senior authorities take strict disciplinary action against the non-punctual staff to ensure accountability and prevent the precious time of the public from being wasted, especially when seeking essential services like ration card approvals and distribution of vital supplies. The recurring lack of discipline within the Civil Supplies section is causing significant service delays, forcing the public, often the elderly and poor seeking ration services, to wait for hours. This ongoing issue demonstrates a systemic failure of supervisory checks and balances within the department, despite



# Trump's Trade Power, India's Missed Opportunity



U.S. President Donald Trump's recent Asia tour has highlighted the growing influence of trade as a tool of geopolitical power—an area where India appears to have missed the memo. Analysts note that while China has leveraged both its seller and buyer power, India has yet to fully exploit its potential in global trade.

Trump, who often emphasizes the U.S. as the world's largest importer, has used this economic leverage to shape relationships with exporting nations. During his interactions with China,

he demonstrated how import dependence can translate into bargaining power, particularly in commodities like soybeans and corn, vital for Chinese agriculture. By contrast, India's imports of U.S. soybeans, corn, and edible oils—totaling over \$18 billion annually—remain underutilized in diplomatic strategy.

China's success, experts say, stems from a mix of forward planning, technological adoption, and strategic patience. The nation has invested in genetically modified crops, improved yields, and diversified im-

port sources, ensuring it can negotiate from a position of strength. India, meanwhile, continues to rely heavily on trade protectionism and domestic lobbying pressures, limiting its ability to wield similar influence.

The recent events underscore the shift in global power dynamics: reputation, moral authority, or political history no longer determine leverage—economic power does. Trump reportedly showed condescension toward India's leadership, emphasizing that hard power is measured by what nations can

offer rather than what they expect. Analysts argue that India's hesitancy to strategically use its import capacity has cost it potential influence in bilateral negotiations.

Experts point to lessons from history: like Deng Xiaoping's dictum to "bide your time, hide your power," nations must exercise patience and deploy strategic leverage rather than celebrate economic size prematurely.

India, while the world's fifth-largest economy, has yet to convert its market size into tangible diplomatic influence.

Commerce Minister Pi-

yush Goyal has urged Indian entrepreneurs to adapt, innovate, and move beyond tariff protections. Observers say this moment resembles India's 1991 balance-of-payments crisis, signaling that reform may now be necessary, driven not by financial collapse but by geopolitical imperatives.

As global trade reshapes power structures, India's challenge will be to align domestic policy with strategic opportunity, ensuring its buying power becomes a currency in international diplomacy rather than a missed chance.

## Amazon Layoffs Highlight AI Transition Challenges



Global tech industry trembled last week as Amazon announced the layoff of 14,000 employees, part of a broader wave that has seen over 1,72,000 jobs cut across American tech giants, including Meta, Microsoft, Salesforce, and Google. These reductions have sparked concerns about the human cost of automation, especially as artificial intelligence continues to transform workplaces worldwide.

The layoffs contrast sharply with the soaring market value of AI hardware and software leaders. Nvidia, whose chips power AI data centers, recently reached a staggering \$5 trillion market capitalization, while OpenAI, in partnership with Microsoft, plans to develop 30 gigawatts of computing resources at a cost of \$1.4 trillion. Such figures underscore a growing divide between AI-driven wealth creation and workforce instability.

Jensen Huang, Nvidia's CEO, recently highlighted the future demand for skilled trades like electricians and plumbers as AI infrastructure expands. His comments illustrate the duality of the AI revolution: while some jobs are replaced by automation, new roles emerge that require technical, adaptive, and hybrid skill sets.

Experts advise tech professionals to focus on continuous learning, cultivate human-centric skills like trust and teamwork, and maintain financial prudence to navigate this transition. ## GST Reform 2.0: Turning Compliance Into Empowerment

What began as a complex tax system has evolved into a live, verifiable digital ledger of the economy, enabling businesses and authorities alike to leverage real-time data. Mandatory e-invoicing and the GST Network (GSTN) turned every invoice into a trusted financial footprint, creating a foundation for credit access, financial inclusion, and data-driven governance.

For small and medium enterprises (MSMEs), GST filings became a financial passport. Lenders could now assess a firm's health instantly, unlocking loans and invoice financing. Yet, this digital advantage is uneven. Only 12% of MSMEs are fully digitalised, leaving many reliant on paper records or outsourced accounting. This digital divide risks creating a two-speed economy, where businesses in digitally advanced states like Karnataka,

Maharashtra, and Tamil Nadu thrive, while those in less-connected regions lag behind.

GST Reform 2.0 aims to bridge this gap. The 56th GST Council meeting introduced people-centric reforms, including a simplified two-rate tax structure and reduced levies on daily essentials. For businesses, the changes are transformative: provisional, risk-based refunds cover 90% of claims, easing cash-flow constraints, while a streamlined, automated GST registration scheme promises onboarding of low-risk entrepreneurs in just three days. The establishment of the GST Appellate Tribunal (GSTAT) by December 2025 adds a credible, rules-based enforcement layer.

Looking ahead, GST is poised to become more than a tax mechanism—it could emerge as a cornerstone of India's economic strategy. Recognising the GST data infrastructure as a national public good, similar to UPI, could stimulate private innovation in finance and supply-chain management. The next phase will test whether GST 2.0 can drive inclusive growth, ensuring that every MSME, regardless of location or size, benefits from this digital transformation.

GST's journey—from chaotic rollout to digital backbone and now to a tool of empowerment—could redefine India's economic landscape, shaping competitiveness and inclusivity for the decade ahead. However, for the system to

## India Pushes for Globalised Rupee Ecosystem



India is taking significant steps to reduce reliance on the U.S. dollar and strengthen its financial sovereignty amid an increasingly uncertain global trade environment. Geopolitical tensions, sanctions threats on Russian oil, and inconsistent U.S. tariff policies have accelerated efforts to develop a rupee-led international settlement system.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has spearheaded key initiatives to promote rupee internationalisation. In October, the RBI allowed authorised dealers (AD) banks and their overseas branches to extend rupee-denominated loans to residents, businesses, and financial institutions in Nepal, Bhutan, and Sri Lanka. This is facilitated through Special Rupee Vostro Accounts (SRVAs), which now number around 200, up from 156 in February. The expansion allows bilateral trade settlements in rupees, bypassing the U.S. dollar, reducing conversion costs, and limiting exposure to dollar volatility. Surplus SRVA balances can also be invested in corporate bonds and commercial papers, enhancing liquidity and attracting foreign participation.

In parallel, the RBI has launched the Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC), or Digital Rupee (e₹), a blockchain-based, fully regulated digital token. The digital rupee supports atomic settlements via Delivery vs Payment (DvP) protocols, ensuring efficiency, privacy, and transparency. The RBI will also publish reference exchange rates for major trading partners' currencies, starting with the U.S. dollar and expanding to the euro, yen, and pound. Meanwhile, BRICS countries are exploring integration of their digital currency systems, aiming to reduce intermediary costs and promote de-dollarisation. The

GIFT City in Gujarat has emerged as a hub for these developments. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman inaugurated the Foreign Currency Settlement System in October, enabling faster and safer transactions in major currencies, starting with the U.S. dollar and expanding to the euro, yen, and pound. Meanwhile, BRICS countries are exploring integration of their digital currency systems, aiming to reduce intermediary costs and promote de-dollarisation. The

New Development Bank plans its first INR-denominated bond issuance to encourage local currency financing.

India is also planning onshore rupee bonds worth \$400-500 million with three- to five-year maturities by March 2026. These moves could expand investment opportunities in masala bonds and reinforce India's role in global financial markets. Future plans include linking SRVAs with the Unified Payments Interface (UPI) for international settlements and integrating with central bank digital currencies, potentially enabling GIFT City to operate as a 24x7 global financial hub.

Analysts say these steps mark a strategic shift from a globalised outlook to transactional diplomacy, prioritising national financial sovereignty. By reducing dependence on offshore financial centres, India aims to enhance regional stability, attract investment, and strengthen the rupee's global presence.

## PM Modi meets Indian origin tech entrepreneurs, community members in Johannesburg

Prime Minister Narendra Modi met Indian-origin tech innovators and members of the Indian community in Johannesburg on Friday urging them to strengthen their collaboration with India and contribute to the country's growth in emerging sectors. Modi is in South Africa to participate in the G20 Leaders' Summit, which has brought together world leaders for high-level discussions on global economic and geopolitical challenges.

In a social media post, the Prime Minister described the meeting as a "fruitful interaction," noting that the entrepreneurs shared insights into their work across a wide spectrum of industries, including FinTech, social media platforms, agriculture technology, education, healthcare and medical devices. and business landscape. He also emphasised India's growing importance as a global innovation hub and invited the community to be part of the country's expanding digital and economic transformation.

## Lobbying intensifies for Bihar Assembly Speaker post

### BJP's Prem Kumar emerges frontrunner

Intense lobbying has begun within the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) for the crucial post of Bihar Assembly Speaker, just a day after Chief Minister Nitish Kumar allocated portfolios to his new cabinet. With a special Assembly session expected soon, both the BJP and JD(U) are vying for the influential position, party insiders confirmed on Saturday.

Among the contenders, senior BJP leader and nine-term MLA Prem Kumar has emerged as the leading candidate. Elected repeatedly from the Gaya Town constituency, Kumar is one of the BJP's most experienced legislators. He previously served as the state's cooperative minister and was Leader of Opposition between 2015 and 2017. In the recent polls, he defeated Congress candidate Akharya Onkar Nath by over 26,000 votes.

Sources said that JD(U) is also actively lobbying for the post, with the name



of Damodar Rawat, the MLA from Jhajha, gaining traction within the party. JD(U) leaders argue that since BJP's Awadhesh

Narain Singh currently heads the state legislative council, the Speaker's chair should be allotted to Nitish Kumar's party un-

der power-sharing norms. The BJP, on the other hand, is reportedly eyeing the Deputy Speaker position if the top slot goes to

JD(U). A special Assembly session will be convened soon to administer the oath to all 243 newly elected members and conduct the Speaker election. The date will be finalised at the state cabinet meeting scheduled for November 25. The Governor will appoint a Protem Speaker, who will oversee the swearing-in of the MLAs before the formal election.

In the last Assembly, BJP's Nand Kishore Yadav served as Speaker while JD(U)'s Narendra Narayan Yadav held the Deputy Speaker position.

Nitish Kumar, sworn in on Thursday for a historic 10th term, leads a cabinet that includes 14 BJP ministers, 8 JD(U) ministers, along with members from LJP (Ram Vilas), HAM and Rashtriya Lok Morcha. With lobbying intensifying, the Speaker election is set to be one of the first major political tests for the renewed NDA alliance.

## US Court Orders Byju's Founder to Pay \$1.07 Billion After Default Ruling

A US bankruptcy court has ordered Byju Raveendran, founder of EdTech giant Byju's, to pay over \$1.07 billion, holding him personally liable for the movement and alleged concealment of funds from Byju's Alpha, the company's US-based financing arm. The ruling was issued by Judge Brendan Shannon of the Delaware Bankruptcy Court after Raveendran repeatedly failed to comply with court directions to appear and provide documents.

The judgment is a default ruling, which occurs when a party does not participate in litigation or ignores court orders, allowing the court to decide the case without a trial. Byju Raveendran has denied all allegations and announced he plans to appeal the US

court decision, calling it expedited and claiming it denied him the opportunity to present a defence. His legal team argued that the court ignored relevant facts, including that the funds were used for the benefit of Think & Learn Private Limited (TLPL), Byju's India-based parent company, rather than for personal gain.

Byju's Alpha, incorporated in Delaware in 2021, was set up as a special-purpose vehicle to manage a \$1.2 billion term loan from a consortium of global lenders. The subsidiary had no operational business and primarily acted as a holding entity for the loan proceeds. Court filings revealed that \$533 million was transferred from Alpha to Camshaft Capital, a small Miami-based hedge fund, and subsequently moved

through affiliated entities such as Inspilearn and offshore trusts without any consideration returning to Byju's Alpha.

The default judgment marks a major legal setback for Byju's, which has been grappling with financial and operational challenges in recent years. Observers note that the appeal process could extend the case timeline, and Raveendran's legal team is expected to challenge the court's expedited handling, emphasizing his right to present a full defence.

This ruling underscores increasing scrutiny of global fund management practices by Indian founders operating US-based financing entities, especially in high-profile EdTech ventures.

## Union Minister Accuses DK Shivakumar of MLA Lobbying in Karnataka

Union Minister Pralhad Joshi on Saturday accused Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar and Chief Minister Siddaramaiah of attempting to buy support from MLAs amid an escalating leadership tussle in the state.

Speaking to reporters, Joshi claimed that Shivakumar recently visited Bengaluru Central Prison to meet two jailed Congress MLAs, Vinay Kulkarni and Veerendra Pappi, undertrial prisoners, allegedly to secure their support after release. "Why had he not met them all these days? This meeting was clearly aimed at gathering numbers for a vote on the Chief Minister's post," Joshi said.

The Union Minister added that both leaders are actively mobilising

MLAs to consolidate their positions, as Siddaramaiah faces calls to step down. "Whenever the Chief Minister is asked to resign, he insists on a vote. Both are busy ensuring legislative backing," Joshi claimed.

In response, Congress MLA HC Balakrishna, a close Shivakumar supporter, said the Deputy CM has his own strength and does not need external support. "All matters will be decided by the high command. Shivakumar has instructed leaders not to embarrass the party through public statements," Balakrishna clarified.

He stressed that MLAs expressing personal opinions should not be construed as Shivakumar seeking support.

The allegations come amid intensifying Congress infighting in Karnataka, over demands

for a leadership change after two-and-a-half years of the Siddaramaiah government. Party president Mallikarjun Kharge, who visited Bengaluru on Friday, is staying on to address the crisis. He is scheduled to meet Siddaramaiah and is expected to hold talks with Shivakumar to resolve the leadership dispute.

This episode highlights growing tensions within the ruling Congress in Karnataka, with the high command under pressure to mediate between warring factions and maintain party cohesion ahead of the next political developments.

The situation remains fluid, and political observers are closely watching how the high command manages internal dissent and the potential implications for state governance.

## Trump's New Ukraine Plan Puts Zelenskyy in a Difficult Corner

US President Donald Trump's newly unveiled 28-point plan to end Russia's war in Ukraine has intensified pressure on Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, pushing him toward concessions that heavily favour Moscow. The proposal, presented in Kyiv this week, demands territorial compromises, military reductions and guarantees that Ukraine will never join NATO.

Trump has argued that Ukraine can no longer sustain the battlefield struggle, claiming Zelenskyy "doesn't have the cards" to continue resisting Russia. Speaking at the White House, Trump said he expects a response from the Ukrainian leader by next Thursday, saying, "We think we have a way of getting peace. He's going to have to approve it."

Zelenskyy, grappling with corruption scandals, battlefield losses and a harsh winter as Russia intensifies strikes on Ukraine's energy grid, admitted the country faces one of the most difficult decisions in its history. Though he has not spoken to Trump since the plan became public, Zelenskyy says a discussion is expected soon.

Key elements of Trump's plan include Ukraine conceding the entire Donbas region, despite large parts remaining under Ukrainian control. Analysts note that Russia would need years to fully occupy the territory at its current pace, but Trump insists its loss is inevitable. The proposal also calls for a drastic downsizing of Ukraine's armed forces and demands from European allies to block Kyiv's future NATO membership.

The plan was delivered by US Army Secretary Dan Driscoll, surprising even his own staff. Early indications suggest Ukraine views the proposal as a starting point, though Trump's willingness to negotiate further is unclear.

Zelenskyy faces political risks at home, where a \$100 million kickbacks scandal has already led to ministerial resignations. Experts warn that accepting Trump's terms could endanger his government's stability and undermine Ukrainian national dignity.

With looming energy shortages, uncertain European financial support and unrelenting Russian attacks, Ukraine must now weigh its survival against the cost of concessions that many fear would be impossible for the public to accept.

## China Builds World's First Nuclear-Resistant Artificial Floating Island

China is advancing a groundbreaking maritime project with the construction of the world's first artificial floating island capable of surviving nuclear blasts. The massive 78,000-tonne semi-submersible structure—officially named the Deep-Sea All-Weather Resident Floating Research Facility—is expected to become fully operational by 2028, marking a major leap in offshore engineering and strategic ocean research.

Comparable in size to China's Fujian aircraft carrier, the twin-hull platform is designed for long-term deployment in deep seas. It can withstand 6-9 metre waves and endure Category 17 typhoons, the strongest tropical cyclones rated in China. The facility will be able to support 238 personnel for up to four months without resupply, enabling extended scientific missions in remote waters.

Project leader Lin Zhongqin, an academician with Shanghai Jiao Tong University (SJTU), told Economic Information Daily that rapid progress is underway: "We're racing to complete the design and construction, aiming for operational status by 2028."

A report in the South China Morning Post reveals that the platform's resilience is en-

hanced by advanced metamaterial sandwich panels, engineered to convert intense shock waves—including nuclear blast pressure—into far milder impacts. The core superstructure includes protected compartments for emergency power, communications and navigation, making blast resistance crucial to ensuring uninterrupted operations.

According to a research team led by Professor Yang Deqing of SJTU, the platform is designed for all-weather, long-duration deep-sea residency, reflecting more than a decade of Chinese research into far-sea mobile bases. Measuring 138 metres in length and 85 metres in width, the facility stands 45 metres above the waterline, offering a stable and protected workspace even in extreme marine conditions.

Although officially presented as a civilian scientific facility, the design cites GJB 1060.1-1991, a Chinese military standard for nuclear blast protection—fueling speculation about possible dual-use strategic capabilities.

With its vast endurance, cutting-edge materials and unprecedented blast resistance, China's floating island marks a new frontier in maritime engineering and deep-sea infrastructure development.

# Trump Administration to Launch Immigration Crackdown in New Orleans

The administration of U.S. President Donald Trump is preparing to target New Orleans in the next phase of its ongoing city-by-city immigration crackdown, according to one current and two former immigration officials familiar with the planning. The move marks a continuation of the administration's intensified enforcement campaign, which has been rolling out across several major American cities in recent months.

Sources said that U.S. Border Patrol agents could arrive in New Orleans as early as Saturday, November 22, 2025, with operations expected to continue into January 2026. Officials, who spoke on condition of anonymity due to the sensitivity of the plans, added that enforcement activity is likely to scale down temporarily during



the Thanksgiving holiday on November 20 and again around Christmas.

The planned operation forms part of Trump's broader strategy to tighten immi-

gration enforcement by deploying federal agents to targeted cities deemed to have high levels of undocumented migrants or insufficient local cooperation with federal

authorities. Earlier phases of the crackdown have included increased workplace raids, broader use of mobile fingerprinting units, and expanded detention measures.

While the administration has maintained that such operations are necessary to restore law and order, critics argue that the measures create fear within immigrant com-

munities and disrupt local economies. Civil rights groups have warned that aggressive raids risk sweeping up individuals with no criminal background and could strain relations between federal agencies and municipal governments.

New Orleans, known for its diverse population and strong cultural identity, has previously positioned itself as a city supportive of immigrant communities. Officials there have not yet commented publicly on the reported federal plan.

As the operation prepares to launch, questions remain about its scope, scale and potential impact on residents. With enforcement expected to extend over several weeks, New Orleans is poised to become the next focal point in the Trump administration's escalating immigration policy drive.

## Over 300 Children Abducted in Nigerian School Attack After Updated Count

The number of victims in the St. Mary's School mass abduction in Nigeria's Niger state has risen significantly, with authorities confirming that 303 schoolchildren and 12 teachers were taken by armed assailants. The updated tally was released on Saturday by the Christian Association of Nigeria (CAN), following a full verification and census at the Catholic-run institution.

Most Rev. Bulus Dauwa Yohanna, chairman of CAN's Niger state chapter, said the revised figures emerged after a thorough assessment during his visit to the school on Friday. Earlier estimates had placed the number of abducted children at 215. Yohanna also revealed that 88 additional students were captured while attempting to flee during Monday's attack in the remote Pari community. The



victims, both boys and girls aged between 10 and 18, were taken during a midnight raid on the school dormitories.

The abduction occurred just four days

after another kidnapping of 25 schoolchildren in neighbouring Kebbi state's Maga town, located about 170 km away. No armed group has claimed responsibility yet, but se-

curity forces, along with local hunters, have been deployed to mount rescue operations.

Yohanna criticised the Niger state government for claiming the

and prayerful as efforts continue.

School kidnappings have become a recurring tragedy in Nigeria, where armed gangs frequently target educational institutions to attract maximum attention. UNICEF reported last year that only 37% of schools across 10 conflict-affected states have effective early warning systems for threat detection.

The attack coincides with renewed international scrutiny, including recent claims by US President Donald Trump about targeted killings of Christians in Nigeria—assertions contradicted by evidence showing that both Christians and Muslims have been victims of such attacks. The incident also unfolded as Nigeria's National Security Adviser Nuhu Ribadu visited Washington for security discussions with US Defence Secretary Pete Hegseth.

## "Wipe My A\*\*": Ex-CIA Man On Pak Apology Demand Over 'India Will Win' Remark

A diplomatic and political row has erupted after former CIA officer John Kiriakou revealed that Paki-

stan's Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) attempted to pressure him into issuing an apology over comments he made on the military balance between India and Pa-

kistan. Instead of complying, Kiriakou responded with an intentionally crude message, saying he would "wipe" himself with the party's letter de-

manding contrition.

The controversy began after Kiriakou told ANI in October that Pakistan would lose a conventional war with India, stress-

ing that "nothing good will come out of an actual war" between the two nuclear-armed neighbours. His remarks ignited backlash in Pakistan, resulting in a wave of online abuse and numerous death threats. "I've lost count of how many death threats I received," he said during a podcast interview with Julian Dorey released on November 18.

PTI, led since 2023 by former Punjab Chief Minister Chaudhry Parvez Elahi, issued a formal letter condemning Kiriakou's remarks "in the strongest possible terms." The party demanded an "immediate apology" to former Prime Minister Imran Khan, its members and "the people of Pakistan." According to Kiriakou, the letter came directly from the PTI president.

Instead of softening his stance, Kiriakou wrote back bluntly:

"In regards to your demand for an apology, I wipe my a\*\* with your demands." He added that despite legal advice urging him to keep a low profile, he felt compelled to respond directly. PTI has not replied since.

Kiriakou, who served 15 years with the CIA, played a key role in US counterterrorism operations after 9/11, including the 2002 capture of top al-Qaeda operative Abu Zubaydah. He later became a whistleblower in 2007 by exposing the CIA's torture programme, a move that led to his imprisonment for 23 months. Reflecting on his past, he maintains he has "no regrets, no remorse."

The latest dispute underscores the heightened sensitivities surrounding India-Pakistan relations and the intense political polarization within Pakistan's leadership.

# GST 2.0 Reforms To Put ₹2 Lakh Crore In People's Hands: Sitharaman

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Wednesday announced sweeping GST reforms under "GST 2.0," aimed at simplifying the tax system and boosting affordability for the common man. Speaking at an outreach programme in Visakhapatnam, she said the reforms will leave an additional ₹2 lakh crore in the hands of consumers by easing their tax burden and improving liquidity in the economy.

The revamped system, effective from September 22, will replace the existing five tax slabs (0%, 5%, 12%, 18% and 28%) with just two — 5% for essential goods and 18% for others. Sitharaman highlighted that daily necessities such as soaps, toothpaste and household essentials will now fall under the 5% or nil tax category, while life-saving medicines will see their rates cut from 12% to 5% or nil. Big-ticket items including two-wheelers, cars, televisions, and cement



will move from 28% to 18%, offering significant relief to the middle class.

"Nearly 99% of goods that were taxed at 12% earlier have been shifted into the 5% slab un-

der the new GST 2.0 system," Sitharaman said, underscoring the direct benefits to poor and middle-class families. She credited GST revenues for enabling infrastructure projects like

airports, expressways, and Vande Bharat trains. Revenues have grown from ₹7.19 lakh crore in 2018 to ₹22.08 lakh crore in 2025, with taxpayers increasing from 65 lakh to 1.51

crore over the same period.

Calling it the biggest reform since the introduction of "One Nation, One Tax" in 2017, Sitharaman said GST 2.0 is designed with the

common man at its core. The government hopes the simplified structure will encourage greater spending and drive economic growth by making goods more affordable across the country.

## Urban Company Shares Soar Over 10% After Strong Market Debut



Urban Company shares made a bumper debut on the Indian stock exchanges on Wednesday (September 17), listing with a stellar premium and continuing their rally through the trading session. The stock opened at ₹162.25 apiece on the NSE,

reflecting a 64.77% jump over the issue price of ₹103. On the BSE, it listed at ₹161.00, marking a 56.31% premium. Soon after listing, Urban Company surged further to hit an intraday high of ₹179.00 apiece, nearly 74% above its IPO price and more

than 10% higher than its listing price.

The ₹1,900 crore IPO, open between September 10 and 12, received overwhelming investor response, being subscribed 103.63 times. The grey market premium (GMP) had already hinted at a

strong debut, indicating nearly 50% gains over the issue price. Urban Company, a tech-enabled marketplace for home and beauty services, operates in 51 cities across India, UAE, and Singapore. The successful listing is being viewed as a boost for In-

dia's startup IPO market, which has seen cautious momentum in recent years.

Post listing, analysts largely advised investors to hold the stock for long-term gains. Prashanth Tapse, Senior VP (Research), Mehta Equities, said the company offers a compelling structural growth story in the expanding home services segment. He recommended allotted investors to hold, while non-allotted investors should adopt a wait-and-watch strategy for a possible price dip. ## Gold and Silver prices hit record high, driven by global uncertainty



Gold and silver prices surged to fresh record highs this week, supported by safe-haven demand amid rising global uncertainty, tariff concerns, and geopolitical tensions. Analysts expect the bullish momen-

tum in bullion to continue in the near term as investors turn to precious metals for security during volatile times.

According to the Indian Bullion and Jewelers Association (IBJA), 24-carat gold closed at

₹1,09,707 per 10 grams on Friday, registering a sharp gain of ₹1,670 compared to Monday's ₹1,08,037. Gold has remained above the ₹1 lakh mark throughout September, having started the month at ₹1,04,075.

Prices of 22-carat gold followed suit, ending the week at ₹1,00,492 per 10 grams, up from ₹98,962 earlier in the week.

Silver prices also maintained a strong rally. The metal ended the week at ₹1,28,008 per kilo.

On the futures market, October gold contracts settled at ₹1,09,356

per 10 grams, up 0.34 per cent, reflecting sustained optimism. Globally, Comex gold traded at \$3,680.7 per ounce, extending gains as traders sought refuge from economic and political uncertainties.

Analysts believe the upward trend will remain intact, citing geopolitical risks, a fragile economic outlook, and ongoing tariff issues. Jateen Trivedi of LKP Securities noted that gold gained 0.35 per cent at ₹1,09,350, with Comex prices factoring in expectations of a possible U.S. Fed rate cut to support economic growth.

Despite being in overbought territory, bullion continues to attract premium buying. Market watchers see gold trading within a range of ₹1,07,000-₹1,12,000 in the coming weeks, reinforcing its role as a safe-haven asset during global uncertainty.

## US tariffs to hit 8% of India's auto component output



The Indian auto component industry is facing significant headwinds as high US tariffs are expected to impact nearly 8% of the sector's total production, according to ratings agency Icra. Auto component exports contribute almost 30% to the industry's revenues, with the United States alone accounting for 27% of this share. However, the recent imposition of a 50% tariff on Indian goods has placed Indian exporters at a relative disadvantage compared to several Asian peers.

While China, Japan, Vietnam, and Indonesia face tariffs in the 15-30% range, India's much higher tariff burden makes its products less competitive. Adding to the challenge, manufacturers in Mexico and Canada enjoy exemptions under the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA), further intensifying competition in the American market. This disparity underscores the growing need for India to accelerate trade talks with Washington to protect its export interests.

## GST Cut on Renewables to 5% Aims to Power India's Green Future



The government's decision to rationalize GST rates across the renewable energy value chain from 12% to 5% is set to bring down the cost of clean energy projects, making electricity more affordable for households, farmers, industries, and developers. According to the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, the move will significantly reduce capital costs for utility-scale projects, rooftop solar systems, and solar pumps, while strengthening India's clean energy ecosystem.

For large-scale solar projects, where the cost typically stands at ₹3.5-4 crore per MW, the revised GST is expected to generate savings of ₹20-25 lakh per MW. A 500 MW solar park, for instance, could see project costs cut by over ₹100 crore, improving tariff competitiveness and lowering the financial burden on distribution companies (DISCOMS). Nationwide, annual savings of ₹2,000-3,000 crore in power procurement costs are anticipated. Households will also benefit as rooftop solar sys-

tems become cheaper. A 3 kW system will now cost ₹9,000-10,500 less, accelerating adoption under the PM Surya Ghar: Muft Bijli Yojana. Farmers under the PM-KUSUM scheme are expected to save nearly ₹17,500 on a 5 HP solar pump, translating into a collective saving of ₹1,750 crore across 10 lakh pumps, making irrigation more sustainable and cost-effective.

The reform is also set to enhance competitiveness of Indian-made solar equipment, reducing module and component costs by 3-4%. With India targeting 300 GW of renewable capacity by 2030, a modest 2-3% cost reduction could free up investments worth 1-1.5 lakh crore, while creating 5-7 lakh jobs in the next decade. Faster renewable deployment will also help India avoid 50-70 million tonnes of CO2 emissions annually by 2030.

Effective from September 22, 2025, the GST cut is being hailed as a landmark step to advance India's green growth, energy independence, and Paris Agreement commitments.

Online food delivery users are feeling the pinch as platforms like Zomato and Swiggy now come under 18% Goods and Services Tax (GST) on their delivery fees, effective September 22, 2025. The move, part of the latest GST Council reforms, applies Section 9(5) of the Central GST Act to local e-commerce delivery services, making even small charges like the "rain fee" taxable.

The change has already started reflecting in bills, with users noticing higher costs for orders during adverse weather conditions. For instance, a delivery rain fee of Rs 25 now attracts an 18% GST, bringing the total to Rs 29.50, adding an unexpected extra burden on customers. Restaurant GST is also separately applied, as seen in typical bills showing charges such as Rs 14.75 for the meal itself.

Social media users quickly reacted to the new tax rules with humor and satire. One post on X (formerly Twitter) jokingly remarked, "After historic GST reforms, even Lord Indra has been brought under

## Delhi Metro's Airport-to-Railway Station Ride Wows Passenger: "Built Differently"



ters 1000 title in Toronto earlier this year, also secured a debut spot at the ATP Finals in Turin. "It's the result of a year's hard work — the ups, downs, and comebacks," Shelton said.

Meanwhile, Zverev maintained his title defence with a 6-2, 6-4 victory over Spain's Alejandro Davidovich Fokina. The German third seed will next face former World No. 1 Daniil Medvedev, who defeated Lorenzo Sonego in three sets. "Daniil is my kryptonite — he beats me most of the time," Zverev admitted.

Elsewhere, Alexander Bublik stunned fourth seed Taylor Fritz 7-6(5), 6-2 to meet Alex de Minaur, who cruised past Karen Khachanov 6-2, 6-2. Felix Auger-Aliassime also advanced, rallying past Daniel Altmaier 3-6, 6-3, 6-2, keeping his ATP Finals hopes alive as the Paris Masters heads into an electrifying final weekend.

## Oman Replaces Pakistan at Junior Hockey World Cup



Oman will join the lineup for the upcoming FIH Men's Junior World Cup 2025 in Tamil Nadu, following Pakistan's late withdrawal, the International Hockey Federation (FIH) announced on Wednesday. The tournament is scheduled from November 28 to December 10, with matches to be held in Chennai and Madurai.

Oman earned the spot as the next highest-ranked team from the Junior Asia Cup 2024, stepping in after Pakistan decided not to participate despite qualifying through last year's continental championship. The Pakistan Hockey Federation informed the FIH that the team would not accept the invitation, citing internal consultations with their government before the event.

Pakistan had been placed in Group B alongside India, Chile, and Switzerland. With Oman taking their place, the group composition has been updated ahead of the tournament. This late withdrawal marks the second recent instance of Pakistan

pulling out from a major hockey event in India, after the Men's Asia Cup in Rajbir, Bihar, where Bangladesh replaced them. The withdrawal also cost Pakistan a chance to qualify for next year's World Cup, as the Asia Junior Cup served as a qualifying event.

The FIH had initially postponed the official draw for nearly a month to accommodate Pakistan's decision-making, eventually holding the ceremony at its headquarters in Lausanne. The Men's Junior World Cup 2025 will feature 24 teams for the first time, alongside the Women's edition, reflecting the FIH's Empowerment and Engagement strategy aimed at promoting wider participation.

Germany enters the tournament as the defending champions, having won the 2023 edition in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. The inclusion of Oman ensures the tournament maintains full participation and competitive balance, while giving the Middle Eastern nation an opportunity to showcase its growing hockey prowess on the global stage.




