Government Releases 304 Crores Loans To Self Help Groups

The Telangana government delivered good news to women's Self-Help Groups (SHGs) by releasing 304 crores in interest-free loans. This substantial amount was credited directly to the accounts of 3,57,098 rural women's SHGs. The announcement was made during a video conference led by Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti VikramarkaMallu and Minister Seethakka, involving District DRDA (District Rural Development Agency) officials. Minister Seethakka, who participated in the conference from her tour of Mulugu district in Eturnagaram, emphasized the government's commitment to financially strengthening women.

Minister Seethakka stated that the Congress government is a 'pro-women' government dedicated to the economic empowerment of women. She highlighted the government's commitment to providing bank linkage loans of no less than 25,000 crores annually to women. The current administration ensures the regular release of interest-free loans to SHGs, with the government bearing the burden of the interest payments itself. The latest release of 304 crores is part of this ongoing effort.

In a sharp critique of the previous administration, Minister Seethakka accused the former BRS government of defaulting on 3,500 crores in interest payments owed to women's

groups. Furthermore, she alleged that the previous government misappropriated the savings—or 'Abhaya-hastam' funds—deposited by the women of the SHGs, causing the distress. She asserted that the BRS leaders, who allegedly stole the hard-earned money and caused tears to the women, have no moral right to speak on women's welfare. In contrast, the current people's government has initiated numerous schemes for the empowerment of women, not only mobilizing funds but also ensuring timely payment of the interest subsidies, thereby reinforcing its commitment to the financial stability and dignity of women across the state.

Cyber Safety Alert: Beware of E-KYC and Aadhaar Update WhatsApp Scams

The public is strongly cautioned against responding to suspicious WhatsApp messages concerning e-KYC and Aadhaar updates that originate from unknown numbers. These messages are identified as a common method used in cyber fraud. The core warning is clear: do not download any APK file attached to or linked with in these unsolicited messages. Downloading and installing such files can compromise the security of your device and lead to significant financial loss or identity theft.

This alert serves as a timely reminder for digital vigilance. Cybercriminals frequently employ social engineering tactics, using the guise of mandatory updates or account verification (like e-KYC or Aadhaar update) to trick individuals into granting access to their personal data or installing malicious software. Once the APK file is installed, the perpetrators can gain control over the user's phone, access sensitive information such as banking credentials, and execute fraudulent transactions without the victim's knowledge. The fraudulent nature of these messages often lies in their urgency and the request for immediate action.

Authorities urge everyone to immediately alert their friends and family members about these types of cyber scams to prevent them from becoming victims. Genuine government and financial institutions never request sensitive information or prompt the download of application files via unverified WhatsApp messages. Users should verify any official-looking message through the institution's official website or customer service channels. The key takeaway is to maintain a high level of suspicion towards any unsolicited digital communication that pressures one into performing actions such as downloading files or sharing personal data, especially when related to official documents like Aadhaar or bank account credentials. Immediate and widespread dissemination of this warning is crucial for community cyber safety.

Revanth Reddy Hailed as a Leader of Development

Minister Vakiti Srihari praised Chief Minister Revanth Reddy as a leader admired by the people of Telangana, asserting that a leader like him is one in a crore. Speaking at the Kodangal Assembly meeting, he drew a sharp contrast between the current and previous governments regarding welfare schemes for women. He stated that the sarees distributed by the previous administration were often used by farmers to protect their crops from animals, thereby disrespecting women's honor. In contrast, the current government, under Revanth Reddy, is presenting 'Sare' (traditional gifts) to uphold the dignity of women. Srihari declared that

the Kodangal region will become an 'AkshayaPatra' (a vessel of inexhaustible plenty) in terms of development. He highlighted the significant progress being made to bring Krishna River water to the Kodangal area, mentioning that a project is being undertaken at a cost of 4,500 crores to ensure the region is touched by 'GangaamTalli' (Mother Ganga/Water). He emphatically stated that the delivery of water to Kodangal is solely due to Revanth Reddy, further calling the Chief Minister 'Aparabhageeratha' (a modern-day Bhagiratha, who brought the Ganga to earth).

The government is prioritizing the honor and empowerment of women. The main goal of the current administration is to make one crore women millionaires, believing that the progress of the home, the state, and the country depends on the financial empowerment of women. Srihari criticized the previous rulers for neglecting the development of the Kodangal area. He confidently concluded that the development of Kodangal is only possible through the efforts and vision of Revanth Reddy. The focus remains on women's financial independence as the foundation for the prosperity of the state. The minister's address was centered on establishing Revanth Reddy as the sole architect of Kodangal's transformation and a true champion of women's welfare and economic progress.

Rapid Development of Temples Across Telangana from Basara to Bhadrakali

Endowments Minister Konda Surekha has made the development of Telangana's temples, from Basara to Keesara and Bhadrakali to Bhadrachalam, her primary agenda. The Endowments Department is rapidly moving to develop temples in different ways across the state under the 'people's government.' The Minister stated that the revenue of temples has significantly increased under the new government, attributing the rise to the comprehensive development work and improved facilities for devotees. The department's statistics show a massive increase in income from the 699

temple institutions in the state: revenue rose from 373.55 crores in late 2023 to 544.61 crores in 2024 following the government's initiatives. The Yadadri Sri Lakshmi Narasimhaswamy Temple witnessed a huge surge in revenue during the Kartika month, with over 20.52 lakh devotees visiting. The temple's income increased to 17.62 crores, an increase of 3.31 crores compared to the previous year's 14.30 crores. This increased income will be utilized entirely for the temple's development.

The Endowments Department, led by Minister Konda Surekha, is executing a master plan for the development of major temples, committing approximately 450 crores for works across the state. Significant funds have been allocated to Cheruvugattu, Kondagattu, Bhadrachalam, and Vemulawada temples. At Yadagirigutta, the work of gold plating the temple's 'VimanaGopuram' is underway, using 25 kg of gold in reserve and 35 kg received as donations. The government is covering the entire cost of 8 crores for the plating and fixing charges, aiming to complete the work by the upcoming Brahmothsavams. Furthermore, proposals for a Vedic school on 17 acres at a cost of 43.79 crores and the acquisition of 101 acres for guesthouses are in progress.

BEE Prepares for 35th National Energy Conservation Awards (NECA) 2025

The Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE), under the Ministry of Power, Government of India, is making comprehensive preparations for the 35th National Energy Conservation Awards (NECA) 2025, aiming for a grand success. Instituted in 1991, NECA promotes Energy Efficiency and Conservation as pillars of sustainable economic development. BEE is coordinating closely with Union Ministries, State Designated Agencies (SDAs), and public/private stakeholders nationwide to promote best practices.

Dhiraj Kumar Srivastava, Director General of BEE, stated that NECA



symbolizes India's commitment to innovation, sustainability, and climate responsibility, fostering healthy competition for greater energy savings. Milind Deore, Secretary of BEE, highlighted that India has achieved substantial energy savings, citing that

the Standards & Labeling Programme alone has saved 89.84 billion units of electricity and reduced CO₂ emissions by 63.78 million tonnes. He urged all states, including Telangana and Andhra Pradesh, to actively participate in NECA 2025.

Applications for the awards opened on October 15, 2025. The awards ceremony will be held on December 14, 2025, which is observed annually as National Energy Conservation Day, at VigyanBhawan, New Delhi, and will be graced by the Hon'ble President of India, Smt. Droupadi Murmu. The 35th NECA will honor achievements across multiple categories, including: Industries, Transport, Buildings, Institutions, Energy-Efficient Appliances, and Energy Efficiency Innovation.

For the first time, NECA 2025 introduces a new category for Digital Content Creators & Influencers, recognizing their role in driving behavioral change. Mr. Deore added that this initiative aligns with the vision of Mission LiFE (Lifestyle for Environment), aiming to mobilize content creators as ambassadors of energy conservation. Separately, Dr. A. Sarath, Chairman and MD of TGREDCO, and V. Anila met with BEE Secretary Milind Deore and Abhishek Sharma to submit a report on Telangana's Energy Efficiency programs in areas like Cool Proofing, EVs, and Clean Cooking. The Secretary assured full support to Telangana in implementing policy, awareness drives, and capacity building programs.



JAC Demands Immediate Transfer of Nizampet Commissioner

The Nizampet Municipal Corporation Joint Action Committee (JAC) launched a scathing attack on the corporation's current Commissioner, Sabir Ali, demanding his immediate transfer. The JAC accused Ali of presiding over massive corruption and illegalities across the engineering, town planning, and revenue divisions since he took charge in October 2024 without possessing the necessary qualifications. They alleged that he installed favored individuals in key posts, forming an employee syndicate that has pushed the corporation toward insolvency. Furthermore, the JAC criticized his administration as "highly inefficient," citing a total collapse in sanitation and drainage



management and a failure to protect public parks and roads from encroachment. The JAC formally registered a complaint at the Praja-

vani program with Additional Collector Vijender Reddy. They demanded that a Group-1 or IAS officer be appointed as Commissioner, as man-

dated by the Telangana Municipal Act-2019, and called for a full-scale inquiry into all illegalities of the past year. JAC leader Akula Satish war

ned that if the unqualified official is allowed to continue, the JAC, along with the citizens, would besiege the municipal office in December.

The JAC also expressed outrage over alleged discrimination in land allocation for the Hindu Vaikunthadham am. They noted that despite a 2022 government order to allocate 3.20 acres, officials are currently offering only 1.20 acres, while the Muslim community was rapidly allotted two acres for development. The JAC accused the government and local MLA Vivekananda of exhibiting anti-Hindu discrimination and vowed to continue their struggle until the full 3.20 acres are allocated, even if it requires combining adjacent survey numbers (343 and 346) with Survey No. 186.

Rajeev Gandhi Panchayat Raj State-Level Training Camp Begins

The state-level Sarvodaya Sankalp Camp training session, organized under the auspices of the Rajeev Gandhi Panchayat Raj Sangathan (RGPRS), commenced at the Keesara Bala Vikas Training Centre in Medchal. This two-day training camp is a strategic initiative aimed at fortifying the capabilities of the Congress party's grassroots workers and leaders,

training them in the principles of decentralized governance and community service. TPCC President Mahesh Kumar Goud graced the inaugural function as the chief guest. The event also saw the virtual participation of the AICC In-charge, Menakshi Natarajan, signifying the importance of the national leadership places on local governance structures. Other key dignitaries present included Corporation

Chairman Shiv Sena Reddy, RGPRS Chairman Rachamalla Sideshwar, and various AICC Secretaries. The camp focuses on instilling the vision of "Sarvodaya" (the upliftment of all) and equipping participants with the knowledge necessary to effectively implement the party's welfare and development agendas at the panchayat and local body levels across Telangana.

BRS Prepares for 'Deeksha Divas'

BRS party leaders held a preparatory meeting at the district office in Suryapet to ensure the grand success of 'Deeksha Divas,' scheduled for November 29. They emphasized that November 29 is a pivotal day in Telangana's history, marking KCR's fast-unto-death, which the party credits as the decisive factor that compelled the central government to grant statehood. The leaders asserted that the slogan "Telangana Vachchudo—KCR Sachchudo" (Telangana must be achieved or KCR must die) galvanized the movement and united all sectors. They encouraged party workers from all villages to prepare for the event, aiming to make Suryapet's 'Deeksha Divas' a model for the entire state.

Following the meeting, BRS leaders accused the current Congress government of engaging in misgovernance and cor-

ruption, alleging that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's primary objective is solely money-making, which is evident in major land scams. They pointed to the suspicious sale of government land, particularly properties allocated to the Industrial Corporation in Kokapet. They questioned why the land, which previously fetched 100 to 170 crores per acre, is now being sold for a significantly lower price, claiming the administration is focused on plundering public money. The BRS warned that an inquiry into this land scam is inevitable under the next government, stating that all those who assisted in stealing public assets would face jail. They also severely criticized the government for prevailing chaos in paddy procurement and for allegedly deceiving the BC community, noting that BC reservations are now at risk, urging the BRS to intensify its fight for BC rights.

BRS Vows Multi-Phased Fight for BC Rights

BRS leaders affirmed their party's commitment to standing by the BC (Backward Classes) community, announcing a phased agitation program to fight the deceptions allegedly perpetrated by the Congress government against BCs. This dedicated struggle for the rights of the BC community will be launched from the village level and will be reinforced through the organization of seminars across the state. They highlighted that the BRS is also taking the fight to the national level: MP Vaddiraju Ravichandra is slated to introduce a private bill in Parliament aimed at securing the

rights and welfare of the BC community. The leaders stated clearly that the BRS will relentlessly pursue the Congress government to ensure that justice is delivered to the community. A former minister questioned the legitimacy of providing party-based reservations, specifically the promised 42%, in the upcoming elections for the posts of Sarpanch, which are supposed to be non-partisan. This two-pronged approach—simultaneously fighting on the ground and in legislative forums—underscores the BRS's resolve to counter the perceived anti-BC policies of the current administration and regain political ground.

ED Attaches Assets of Patancheru MLA's Brother Worth 80 Crores

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) provisionally attached assets valued at 80 crores belonging to Madhusudhan Reddy, who is the brother of Patancheru MLA Gudem Mahipal Reddy. This significant action was taken following a comprehensive ED investigation into allegations of large-scale financial irregularities by Madhusudhan Reddy's company, Santosh Sand and

Granite. The investigation revealed that the company was allegedly involved in illegal activities amounting to an estimated 300 crores. A major point of contention was the company's alleged failure to remit 39 crores in royalty payments owed to the state government. The ED's decision to attach the assets underscores its firm approach toward individuals and entities involved in illicit mining operations and associat-

ed money laundering. This provisional attachment signals that the ED considers these assets to be proceeds of crime, reinforcing the regulatory body's commitment to recovering misappropriated public funds and penalizing those who violate financial and environmental laws. Further legal action is anticipated as the investigation into the company's operations and financial conduct proceeds.



KTR Strategizes with BRS Corporators for GHMC

Hyderabad | November 24, 2025

BRS Working President K. T. Rama Rao (KTR) convened a meeting with the party's MLAs, MLCs, and Corporators from the GHMC area at Telangana Bhavan to strategize for the upcoming municipal corporation meeting. KTR offered firm assurances, promising that every corporator who remained loyal to the party during its time in opposition would be rewarded with further official positions in the future. He commended the corporators for their decade of service, highlighting their work as being free from corruption and noting their exceptional dedica-

tion during crises like the COVID-19 pandemic. KTR instructed the corporators to adopt an aggressive posture during the municipal session, directing them to demand answers from the current state government regarding the controversial sale of lands in Hyderabad and the allocation of industrial land. They were also told to hold the government accountable for its alleged failures in implementing key development and welfare programs. KTR instilled confidence that the BRS would decisively win the GHMC elections whenever they are held, urging all members to remain united and perpetually prepared for the polls.

Niranjan Reddy Condemns Kavitha's Attacks

BRS leader and former Minister Singireddy Niranjan Reddy fiercely criticized the Revanth Reddy government for its "complete failure" on farmers' issues, pointing to 720 alleged farmer suicides in the past two years and the stall of the Palamuru-Rangareddy Project. However, the focus quickly shifted as he lashed out at Telangana Jagruthi President K. Kavitha for allegedly making "abusive comments" against him instead of attacking the ruling government.

Niranjan Reddy expressed deep anguish, questioning why she was attempting to please unnamed persons by attacking him, reminding her that KCR loyalists were grief-stricken when



she was jailed in the liquor case. The confrontation escalated into sharp personal rivalry:

Niranjan Reddy dismissed Kavitha's taunts about being "Water Niranjan Reddy" and retaliated by calling her

"Liquor Rani," referencing the Delhi liquor case. He challenged her to prove any corruption allegations against him and questioned the source of her substantial wealth, including her luxurious house in Hyderabad

and farmhouse in Gandipet. He asserted his unwavering loyalty to KCR and accused Kavitha of "mentally torturing" her father through her actions, while he remained committed to KCR's directives.

GHMC Deputy Mayor Intervenes on Tarnaka Bus Stop Issue

Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) Deputy Mayor Smt. Mothe Srilatha Shoban Reddy took prompt action to resolve the critical issue faced by commuters at the Old Dairy Farm Bus Stop in Tarnaka Division. For several days, the TGRTC buses had been skipping this major stop, severely inconveniencing the large number of students, employees, women, and the elderly who use it daily to travel to

key institutions like NIN, EFLU, and Osmania University. Key routes (including 3, 3K, 3H, and others) ignoring the stop forced commuters to stand on the road, walk long distances, and face persistent delays. Upon learning of the problem, the Deputy Mayor or personally visited the site to assess the situation and speak with the affected passengers. She issued clear instructions directly to the bus drivers and conductors passing by, stating the stop must be honored

due to the public inconvenience. Furthermore, she contacted the Depot Managers of both the Mushirabad and Kushaiguda RTC Depots by phone, ordering them to immediately address the issue. The Deputy Mayor emphasized that as one of the city's oldest and most frequently used stops, its neglect was causing severe discomfort, and she mandated TGRTC officials to prioritize public interest and restore the regular halting of buses at once.



Massive Drug and Ganja Seizure in Madhapur Zone

TPN Bureau | November 24, 2025, The Madhapur Special Operations Team (SOT) police have dealt a major blow to drug trafficking in Hyderabad by successfully cracking down on three separate narcotics cases within the Madhapur Zone. These extensive operations, overseen by Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Rithiraj, resulted in the arrest of six individuals and the confiscation of illicit substances valued at over 32.50 lakhs. The total seizure includes a substantial 41.9 kg of Ganja, 15 grams of MDMA (Methylenedioxymethamphetamine), and 1.170 kg of Alprazolam, underscoring the police's sus-



tained efforts against drug distribution networks. The first case, within the Chandannagar Police Station jurisdiction, involved the seizure of 1.170 kg of the psychotropic substance Alprazolam, valued at 10 lakhs. Police arrested Goundla Bala Murali Krishna (38), who was actively attempting to supply the drug to local Kalu (Toddy) shops, suggesting a dangerous trend of mixing the drug into the local brew. While one arrest was made, two other persons involved in this network are currently absconding. In a separate operation also under the Chandannagar PS limits, the SOT teams intercepted a syn-

thetic party drug network. They confiscated 15 grams of MDMA (Ecstasy), worth an estimated 1.50 lakhs. The investigation revealed that the drugs were procured from Bengaluru and smuggled into Hyderabad specifically for distribution and consumption during the upcoming New Year celebrations. The police arrested three individuals in this case: Harish, Sai Krishna, and Sai Mani Kantha. The largest seizure occurred in the Kollur PS jurisdiction, targeting a cannabis smuggling operation. A massive consignment of 41.9 kg of Ganja, valued at 21 lakhs, was seized. The net-

work was found to be smuggling the narcotics via train from West Bengal all the way to Secunderabad, with the intent to sell the Ganja to migrant labourers from Bihar working in the area. Three individuals—Mithun Barman, Sadan Roy, and Reejal Shaikh—were arrested for their involvement in this large-scale smuggling ring. These successful operations have severely impacted the drug supply chains in the Madhapur Zone, and the police have reaffirmed their commitment to continuing stringent measures to curb the supply and distribution of all forms of narcotics across the region.

Beware of Fake APK File Frauds: HYDERABAD POLICE

The Deputy Commissioner of Police, Cyber Crimes, Hyderabad, issued an urgent public advisory detailing the rising threat of Fake APK File Frauds. Cyber fraudsters are circulating malicious Android Package Kit (APK) files via various platforms (SMS, WhatsApp, fake websites) deceptively claiming to offer government benefits, bank services, or rewards like RTOChallan.APK or PMKisanYojana.apk. Victims are tricked into downloading these files from outside the Google Play Store and granting extensive permissions (like SMS access or screen sharing). This allows the malicious app, often containing Remote Access Tools (RATs), to secretly capture all sensitive details, including mobile banking credentials and OTPs, resulting in significant financial loss and misuse of personal data. The police strongly advised citizens: Never download or install unknown APK files, avoid clicking unverified links, be cautious of excessive app permissions, and keep all device security features updated. Immediate reporting of suspicious activity to the National Cybercrime Helpline (1930) or cybercrime.gov.in is urged to prevent fraud escalation.

Body Donation Emphasized as a 'Gift Beyond Life' for Medical Training

A special program titled "Body Donation: A Gift Beyond Life - Felicitation of Donor Family" was organized at the Mallareddy Medical College for Women in Suraram to raise crucial awareness about the significance of donating one's body after death. Speakers passionately highlighted that the donation of a mortal body is an immense and great contri-

bution that directly supports the education of medical students and propels medical research forward. They emphasized that through body donation, an individual can contribute to the training of future physicians and the development of new treatments, describing it as a visionary and meaningful way to continue serving society even after passing away. The highlight of the event was the

honoring of donor families, who shared their personal and often moving experiences, lending an emotional depth to the cause. The program was graced by the former Vice-Chancellor of Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Tamil Nadu, Dr. Sudha Seshayyan, along with institutional leaders like Dr. Sudha Ramana (Chancellor) and Dr. Anil Kaul (Vice-Chancellor) of Mallareddy Viswavidyalaya Peeth.



Hyderabad Launches New Excise Stations

GHMC Mayor Gudwal Vijayalakshmi inaugurated the new Banjara Hills Excise Station and called upon the Excise Department to work vigorously to eradicate drugs, striving to make the entire Hyderabad and GHMC area a "Drug-Free Metropolitan City." She stressed the vital need to actively educate the youth and general public about the severe harm caused by drug

abuse, emphasizing prevention alongside enforcement. This inauguration was part of a coordinated effort across Telangana, following orders from Prohibition and Excise Commissioner C. Harikiran to establish 14 new excise stations, including three in Hyderabad, nine in Ranga Reddy, and one each in Sangareddy and Warangal. In the Hyderabad Division, Deputy Mayor Mothe Srilatha Reddy opened the Chik-

kadpally station, and Cantonment MLA Ganesh inaugurated Mareddypally. Other dignitaries, including Hyderabad Excise Deputy Commissioner Anil Kumar Reddy, participated in the simultaneous openings in key areas like Gandipet, Kompally, Kukatpally, and Aminpur, showcasing a unified administrative strategy to strengthen vigilance against the drug menace across the urban and suburban areas.

Beware of OTP Frauds: POLICE

The Deputy Commissioner of Police, Cyber Crimes, Hyderabad, issued a second critical public advisory cautioning citizens against the persistent danger of OTP Frauds. Cybercriminals employ various deceptive tactics—including fake bank calls, false customer care inquiries, online shopping scams, and UPI Collect Requests—to trick victims into disclosing their

One-Time Passwords (OTPs). Fraudsters often impersonate bank officials, threatening to block accounts unless the OTP is shared, or mislead victims with promises of fake refunds or cashbacks. Once the OTP is obtained, criminals gain unauthorized access to bank accounts, credit cards, digital wallets, and personal data, leading to severe financial loss. The police delivered

a stern, non-negotiable directive: Never Share OTPs. Legitimate institutions will never ask for them. Citizens must avoid approving unknown UPI Collect Requests, verify customer care numbers only through official sources, and enable all available security features like SIM lock and transaction alerts. All suspected frauds must be immediately reported to the National Cybercrime Helpline (1930).

Aadhaar, Citizenship, and Voting Rights

SC Directive Sparks Legal and Political Debate



The Supreme Court's recent directive asking the Election Commission of India (ECI) to consider Aadhaar as a valid identity proof for voter enrolment in Bihar's Special Intensive Revision (SIR) has reignited a complex and sensitive debate over citizenship, voting rights, and national security.

While Aadhaar serves as proof of identity for accessing welfare schemes and services, it is not a conclusive document for establishing Indian citizenship. This legal distinction, upheld in the 2018

Puttaswamy judgment, lies at the heart of the controversy. The ECI had opposed the move, fearing it could allow illegal migrants—especially in border states—to gain access to the electoral rolls.

Under Article 326 of the Constitution, only Indian citizens can vote. With Aadhaar now being used to validate voter identity, critics argue that the gap between identity and citizenship is being dangerously blurred, particularly in sensitive states like Assam and West Bengal.

Assam's Long History of

Anxiety

Assam has long been wary of demographic shifts due to illegal immigration. Following the Assam Movement (1979–1985), amendments to the Citizenship Act in 1986 and 1992 made it harder to gain Indian citizenship by birth, shifting towards the principle of *jus sanguinis* (citizenship by blood).

Currently, several districts in Assam report Aadhaar holders exceeding projected population figures, prompting the state to halt Aadhaar issuance in those areas. This

has raised alarm over the misuse of Aadhaar by undocumented migrants.

West Bengal & Beyond

In West Bengal, over 2.43 lakh voter enrolment applications were recently rejected, mostly from border districts. Similar fears are growing in Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, and Nagaland, highlighting the need for a coordinated regional response.

Legal Ambiguity & National Security

India's legal regime, split between the Citizenship Act (1955) and the Foreigners Act (1946), does not

clearly address undocumented citizens or infiltrators. Foreigner Tribunals in Assam attempt to adjudicate these cases, but their processes remain complex and inconsistent.

As the SIR process potentially scales nationwide, unresolved legal questions about Aadhaar's role, citizenship verification, and voting rights could deepen. The judiciary's directive, though well-intentioned, may require broader legal reform to protect the integrity of India's electoral and citizenship systems.

Latin American Left Finds Curious Admirers in Indian Intellectual Circles



As India's Leader of the Opposition embarks on a rare visit to Latin America, many are left wondering: what binds two regions that have historically remained distant, both geographically and psychologically? The answer may lie not in trade or geopolitics, but in ideology and intellectual inspiration — particularly for India's Left-liberal circles.

While diplomatic moments between India and Latin America have been few and episodic — from Gandhi's inquiry into migration prospects to Brazil in 1948, to Tagore's fanbase in Argentina — the deeper connection lies in shared philosophical undercurrents that have attracted Indian intellectuals for decades.

At the centre of this soft-power exchange is Che Guevara, the Argentine revolutionary who became a global leftist icon. Unlike Fidel Castro, Che's internationalism and tragic end made him a cult figure, particularly in Indian university towns like Calcutta in the 1960s. His image, idealism, and anti-capitalist rhetoric deeply influenced India's student Left.

Another significant cultural export has been magical realism, with writers like Gabriel García Márquez capturing Indian readers' imaginations. Márquez's popularity in India isn't surprising — the idea of Maya and the mystical has always been central to Indian

thought. The genre's subtle critique of authoritarianism resonated with Indian audiences, even though it lacked overt political messaging.

The most curious — and controversial — export has been Liberation Theology, a fusion of Marxism and Roman Catholicism led by Peruvian priest Gustavo Gutiérrez. While dismissed by the Vatican's conservatives like Cardinal Ratzinger (later Pope Benedict), the movement has gained quiet traction among some Catholic communities in India. Pope Francis, an Argentine, is seen as more sympathetic to these ideas.

However, critics like columnist and author Jaithirth "Jerry" Rao, who lived in Venezuela in the 1980s, argue that this ideological romance with Latin America is more symbolic than substantive. "The Left's admiration for Latin America is driven more by romanticism than realism," he says, pointing to the intellectual disconnect between rhetoric and ground realities — especially the economic failures of socialist regimes.

Nonetheless, the symbolic solidarity continues to appeal to sections of India's academia and political Left — despite the region's limited real-world impact on Indian life. Whether this connection leads to fruitful collaboration or ideological quicksand remains to be seen.

Gold's Sharp Rally Triggers FOMO – But Should Investors Jump In?



The recent surge in gold prices has reignited a classic dilemma for Indian investors: Has the best opportunity already passed, or is now still a good time to buy?

With gold touching new highs, the fear of missing out (FOMO) is becoming palpable — especially in a country like India, where gold carries deep emotional and cultural value. However, financial experts are urging caution. History suggests that chasing gold during sharp rallies often leads to disappointment.

Gold is not typically a wealth-creation tool like equities. While it offers strong returns during crises, such as the 2008 financial meltdown or the 2020 COVID-19 shock, it also experiences long periods of stagnation. Between 2011 and 2018, for instance, gold returned a mere 2.5% annually, significantly underperforming the stock

market.

Global Drivers at Play

Gold's price is influenced by global uncertainties, central bank actions, and interest rate movements. As US interest rates drop, the opportunity cost of holding gold decreases, pushing investors toward the metal. With rising geopolitical tensions and a potential economic slowdown looming, many central banks are increasing their gold reserves, reducing reliance on the US dollar.

However, gold's upward momentum is easily reversed. A strengthening dollar, rising bond yields, or easing geopolitical tensions can all deflate gold's appeal. In India, rising prices also dampen jewellery demand, causing consumers to shift toward alternatives like silver or platinum.

Indian Investors and Portfolio Allocation

Over the past 25 years, Indian investors have enjoyed annualised gold returns of 12–13%, aided by a weakening rupee. Still, this historical performance shouldn't be mistaken for a guarantee of future gains. Financial planners caution against treating gold as a primary engine of growth.

The key is disciplined asset allocation. Experts recommend maintaining a gold allocation of 5–15% in one's investment portfolio. This helps hedge against volatility without overexposing to an unpredictable asset.

In conclusion, gold is best viewed as insurance in an investment plan — a stabiliser, not a star performer. While FOMO is understandable amid surging prices, smart investors know that discipline and diversification, not emotion, deliver long-term financial success.

Flood-Hit Punjab Feels Ignored, Old Wounds Reopen Amid Rising Alienation



As Punjab grapples with one of its worst flood disasters in decades, simmering discontent is boiling over into a deeper sense of alienation. Despite the Centre promising support, the absence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi from the state has struck a nerve among many Punjabis — particularly within the Sikh community — who feel abandoned in their hour of crisis.

While PM Modi tweeted condolences for the Afghanistan earthquake upon returning from Tianjin on September 1, his silence on Punjab's floods sparked backlash. Giani Harpreet Singh, former Akal Takht head priest and now a

rising religious-political voice, publicly rebuked the Prime Minister. "Punjab is also part of this country," he wrote, questioning Modi's priorities in a pointed social media post followed by a formal letter.

Though the Prime Minister reportedly spoke to Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann and promised help, for many affected families across 1,500 villages and 3 lakh displaced people, this fell short of expectations. Union Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan did visit flood-hit areas, wading through water, but Modi's absence is being perceived as political distancing.

The alienation, observers

note, is rooted in the unresolved trauma of the farm laws movement, where Sikh farmers were at the forefront of the year-long protest against the Centre. That movement fractured already tenuous bonds between New Delhi and Punjab, and today's silence only reinforces old suspicions.

Politically, the BJP's relationship with Punjab has remained complicated. Once a junior partner to the Shiromani Akali Dal, it now contests alone, tripling its vote share in 2024 but winning no seats. Analysts suggest the party may be eyeing a long game — banking on a fragmented Sikh vote

and Hindu consolidation.

However, this gamble is risky. The rise of radical voices like Amritpal Singh's faction, growing online propaganda linking Sikh grievances with broader separatist narratives, and the vacuum in traditional Sikh politics are creating fertile ground for unrest — and for external actors like Pakistan's ISI to exploit.

History reminds us that neglect during crisis breeds discontent. Punjab's flood tragedy, if not met with empathy and urgency, could deepen a dangerous divide. The moment calls not just for aid — but presence, understanding, and political foresight.

PM Modi Holds Bilateral Talks With Japanese PM at G20 Summit

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday held bilateral talks with Japanese Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi on the sidelines of the G20 Summit, discussing ways to strengthen India-Japan co-operation across multiple sectors.
“Had a productive meeting with Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi of Japan. We discussed ways to add momentum to bilateral co-operation in areas such as innovation, defence, talent mobility and more,” PM Modi posted on social media. The leaders also explored measures to enhance trade ties, emphasizing that a strong India-Japan partnership is vital for global progress.
According to the Ministry of External Affairs, both leaders reaffirmed the India-Japan Special Strategic and Global Partnership, grounded in civilizational connect, shared values, mutual goodwill, and commitment to a free and open Indo-Pacific. They highlighted the need to deepen bilateral ties to promote regional and global peace, prosperity, and stability.
The discussions built on the 15th India-Japan An-

nual Summit, focusing on expeditious implementation of agreements across defense and security, trade and investment, SMEs, artificial intelligence, critical minerals, semiconductors, infrastructure, technology, and people-to-people exchanges. They also explored strategic sector collaborations and exchanged views on regional and global issues.
PM Takaichi expressed strong support for the AI Summit to be hosted by India in February 2026. This was the first meeting between the two leaders since she assumed office in October.
The talks followed PM Modi’s visit to Japan in August, during which India and Japan finalized 13 key agreements and declarations, launched transformative initiatives, and adopted the India-Japan Joint Vision for the Next Decade. Building on progress toward the 2022-2026 target of JPY 5 trillion in Japanese investments in India, a new goal of JPY 10 trillion (USD 68 billion) in private investment has been set. The vision emphasizes strategic alignment in clean energy, emerging technologies, and infrastructure development.



Justice Surya Kant Sworn in as 53rd Chief Justice of India

Justice Surya Kant, the senior-most judge of the Supreme Court, was sworn in as the 53rd Chief Justice of India (CJI) on Monday. President Droupadi Murmu administered the oath of office at a brief ceremony at Rashtrapati Bhavan at 10 am.
Justice Kant succeeds Justice BR Gavai, who retired on November 23 after serving just over six months. Justice Gavai had recommended Justice Kant’s name as his successor on October 27, and the President appointed him on October 30. Elevated to the Supreme Court on May 24, 2019, Justice Kant will serve as CJI for nearly 15 months, retiring on February 9, 2027.
The swearing-in ceremony was attended by Vice President CP Radhakrishnan, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, Home Minister Amit Shah, several Union ministers, Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini, outgoing CJI Gavai, former Vice President



Jagdeep Dhankhar, and judges from the Supreme Court and High Courts. Chief justices and judges from countries including Nepal, Bhutan, Sri Lanka, Mauritius, Malaysia, Brazil, and Kenya were also present.
Justice Kant outlined his priorities as CJI, focusing on reducing the massive pendency of cas-

es in the Supreme Court, which currently stands at around 90,000. He emphasized the importance of mediation as an alternative dispute resolution mechanism and highlighted plans to set up Constitution Benches to dispose of key constitutional matters, which could help clear hundreds of cases in high courts.

Born on February 10, 1962, in Hisar, Haryana, Justice Kant graduated in law from Maharishi Dayanand University, Rohtak, and earned his Master’s degree in law from Kurukshetra University, standing first in his class. He became the youngest Advocate General of Haryana in 2000, was appointed judge of the Punjab and

Haryana High Court in 2004, and served as Chief Justice of Himachal Pradesh High Court in 2018 before elevation to the Supreme Court.
Justice Kant brings over two decades of judicial experience, with landmark judgments on Article 370, free speech, corruption, environment, and gender equality.

Delhi HC Seeks Response on Christian Michel’s Extradition Challenge

The Delhi High Court on Monday sought responses from the Centre, the CBI, and the Enforcement Directorate (ED) on a plea filed by British national Christian Michel James, accused in the ₹3,600-crore AgustaWestland VVIP chopper scam, challenging a provision

of the India-UAE extradition treaty.
A bench comprising Justices Vivek Chaudhary and Manoj Jain directed the Home Ministry, the Ministry of External Affairs, the CBI, and the ED to submit their objections regarding the maintainability of Michel’s petition. The

court’s notice marks the next step in a legal battle that has spanned several years.
Michel’s lawyer highlighted that the accused will complete seven years in Indian custody on December 4, 2025, and has not been granted release even once during this period. The plea contends

that certain provisions of the extradition treaty are arbitrary and seeks relief from continued detention, raising questions about procedural safeguards and legal rights under the treaty framework.
The AgustaWestland case, one of India’s high-profile defense procure-

ment scandals, involves allegations of kickbacks paid to secure a contract for VVIP helicopters. Christian Michel, considered a key middleman in the case, has been in Indian custody since his arrest, while investigations by the CBI and ED continue to unravel complex financial and contractual transactions linked to the deal.
Legal experts said the High Court’s examination of the extradition treaty provisions could have broader implications, including the interpretation of bilateral agreements and the procedural rights of foreign nationals facing long-term detention in India.
The court will review submissions from the government and investigative agencies before deciding on the maintainability of Michel’s petition and the next course of action, which could include hearings on his release or modifications to his detention conditions.

15 Arrested For Using Pepper Spray On Delhi Cops During Air Pollution Protest ‘Madvi Hidma Amar Rahe’ Slogans Raised

Fifteen individuals were arrested during a protest against rising air pollution in the Delhi-NCR region, after allegedly using pepper spray on police officers, officials said on Monday. The detentions followed Sunday’s demonstration at the C-hexagon, where protesters reportedly refused repeated warnings to disperse.
The arrested were taken to the Parliament Street Police Station for medical examination. Delhi Police confirmed an FIR has been registered under multiple sections, including obstruction of government work. Some of the protesters were apprehended near India Gate, while others were detained outside the police station. Authorities said the pepper spray caused irritation to three to

four officers, who were treated at a hospital.
Officials explained that several demonstrators attempted to cross barricades meant to regulate traffic and allow ambulance movement. When asked to step back, the protesters allegedly became agitated, sat on the road, and disrupted traffic, forcing police intervention to restore order.
This is the latest in a series of “clean air protests” in the capital. Earlier, on November 9, demonstrators were detained at India Gate demanding stricter government action to address the “air emergency” in Delhi.
Meanwhile, Delhi and neighbouring NCR cities are facing severe air quality issues. Current AQI readings include Gurugram at 370, Noida at 372, Faridabad 358, and Ghaziabad 355, with

several areas in Delhi breaching 400, entering the ‘severe’ category. Low wind speeds are expected to worsen conditions.
In response, the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) has revised the Graded Response Action Plan, enforcing measures previously meant for Stage IV under Stage III. These include uninterrupted power supply to curb diesel generator use, deployment of additional traffic personnel, alerts via media, and expanded CNG and electric public transport with differential fares.
The Delhi government has directed private offices to operate with 50% on-site staff and allow the rest to work from home, as authorities continue to urge caution amid hazardous air quality.

Indian Navy Commissions Indigenous ASW Vessel INS Mahe

The Indian Navy on Monday commissioned INS Mahe, the first of the Mahe-class anti-submarine warfare (ASW) shallow water crafts, at the Naval Dockyard in Mumbai. The vessel is designed to hunt submarines, conduct coastal patrols, and secure India’s vital maritime approaches.
The commissioning ceremony was attended by Army Chief General Upendra Dwivedi as the chief guest, along with senior naval officers and officials. The event highlighted the Indian Navy’s focus on strengthening indigenous shipbuilding and enhancing operational capabilities in shallow waters.
INS Mahe, built in India, represents a new generation of stealthy

and agile shallow-water combatants. The vessel is equipped with advanced sonar systems, torpedoes, and other anti-submarine warfare weaponry, enabling it to detect and neutralize underwater threats efficiently. Its design also allows for rapid deployment along India’s extensive coastline, safeguarding strategic maritime routes.
The ship is expected to play a crucial role in coastal security, surveillance, and intelligence gathering, complementing larger fleet units in safeguarding India’s maritime interests. Indian Navy officials emphasized that the induction of INS Mahe strengthens the country’s self-reliance in defense manufacturing while significantly boosting anti-subma-

rine capabilities in the shallow water environment.
The Mahe-class vessel is part of a broader program aimed at modernizing the Indian Navy with indigenous, state-of-the-art platforms capable of operating in diverse maritime conditions. Its commissioning aligns with the government’s “Make in India” initiative, reflecting India’s growing emphasis on homegrown defense technology and strategic maritime preparedness.
With INS Mahe joining the fleet, the Indian Navy now possesses enhanced capability to monitor and counter potential underwater threats, ensuring the security of India’s coastline and safeguarding the nation’s strategic maritime interests.

Bangladesh Seeks Extradition of Sheikh Hasina from India

The interim government of Bangladesh has formally requested the extradition of former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina from India, following her death sentence by the International Crimes Tribunal in Dhaka. The letter was sent to the Indian Ministry of External Affairs, and Bangladeshi authorities are currently awaiting a response, according to Foreign Affairs Adviser Touhid Hossein.

Sheikh Hasina, who fled Bangladesh on August 5, 2024, amid widespread protests against her government, has been living in India since her departure. Prior to her flight, the tribunal had declared her a fugitive, and she now faces multiple charges, including alleged involvement in the enforced disappearance of political activists and critics during her 16-year tenure as Prime Minister.

Mr. Hossein stated that the extradition request follows the tribunal's latest verdict and comes at a time when the court continues to hear cases related to Hasina's alleged role in suppressing dissent and human rights violations. "The interim government is committed to ensuring ac-

countability for crimes committed during the previous administration," he added.

The request underscores the growing diplomatic and legal tensions between Dhaka and New Delhi, as India has historically provided refuge to political figures facing turmoil in neighbouring countries. Legal experts suggest that extradition could become a complex process, requiring careful consideration of international law, bilateral treaties, and humanitarian concerns.

Observers note that this development will test India's diplomatic balancing act between respecting Bangladesh's judicial process and safeguarding individuals residing within its territory. Meanwhile, Bangladesh has reiterated its commitment to upholding the tribunal's decisions and pursuing all legal avenues to ensure that Hasina faces trial for alleged crimes committed during her administration.

The situation continues to evolve, with both countries expected to engage in diplomatic consultations in the coming weeks over the handling of the extradition request.

South Africa Passes G20 Baton to U.S. Amid Debt Concerns

South Africa has formally handed over the G20 presidency to the United States, concluding a year in which it pushed to highlight debt sustainability challenges facing developing nations. The transition marks the end of a four-nation leadership stretch by emerging economies, including Indonesia, India, Brazil, and South Africa, which collectively focused on elevating the Global South's priorities on the global stage.

Speaking on the handover, Finance Minister Enoch Godongwana emphasised that South Africa aimed to institutionalise debt relief mechanisms and push forward recommendations agreed upon by the G20 over the past year. "Debt sustainability remains a critical issue for emerging economies and low-income countries," he said, noting that global debt across developing nations has now surpassed \$100 trillion.

The G20's debt agenda under South Africa's leadership sought to strengthen coordinated approaches to sovereign debt restructuring, promote financing for development, and prevent debt crises from escalating in vulnerable economies. Analysts

have described these efforts as an important step in bridging inequalities between the Global South and advanced economies.

However, the shift to a U.S.-led presidency raises questions about whether the momentum on debt relief will be maintained. Historically, priorities under advanced-economy leadership have leaned toward global financial stability and regulatory issues, while debt relief and development finance have received comparatively less focus.

Observers note that the United States will face pressure to translate G20 ambitions into concrete action, especially as economic stress in poorer nations threatens to intensify. Emerging economies have warned that rising debt levels, coupled with inflationary pressures and slower global growth, could trigger new crises without robust international coordination.

As the G20 prepares for its next summit, all eyes will be on Washington to see whether the commitments and frameworks developed under South Africa's leadership will be sustained, ensuring that debt relief remains a priority for the world's most vulnerable countries.

Trump's Evolving Rhetoric on Zelenskyy and Putin

President Donald Trump's rhetoric toward Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy and Russian President Vladimir Putin has shifted dramatically over the first 10 months of his second term, reflecting changing dynamics in the Russia-Ukraine conflict.

During his 2024 campaign, Trump repeatedly claimed he could end the war "in 24 hours" if re-elected. Initially conciliatory toward Putin, whom he has long admired, Trump over time expressed growing frustration with the Russian leader. Conversely, after a February Oval Office confrontation, Trump softened his criticism of Zelenskyy, though tensions remained evident.

In recent months, Trump endorsed a peace plan seen by some as favorable to Russia. Democratic



senators criticized it as a "wish list" from Moscow, while Secretary of State Marco Rubio insisted it was drafted by the U.S. Allies in Eu-

rope expressed concern the plan could be overly lenient toward Russia.

Trump has alternated between criticizing

and praising both leaders. At times, he slammed Zelenskyy for allegedly failing to show sufficient gratitude for U.S. military

support, recalling the Oval Office spat with Vice President JD Vance that temporarily paused aid to Ukraine. He also rebuked Euro-

pean nations for not applying more economic pressure on Russia.

At the same time, Trump has occasionally defended Putin, expressing trust that the Russian leader would honor potential peace commitments. After Russian attacks on Kyiv, Trump publicly condemned the strikes, highlighting the human toll, while signaling his continued willingness to negotiate directly with both leaders.

Trump's fluctuating tone—ranging from admiration and trust toward Putin to occasional harsh criticism of Zelenskyy—illustrates the complex balancing act of U.S. diplomacy. Analysts note that his statements have had significant domestic and international repercussions, influencing both bipartisan support for Ukraine and the broader trajectory of U.S.-Russia relations.

“Arunachal In China”: Indian Woman's Post On Shanghai Airport Harassment

A woman from Arunachal Pradesh, India, was detained and harassed by Chinese authorities at Shanghai Pudong Airport after officials refused to recognise her Indian passport during a transit stop on November 21. Pema Wang Thongdok, who was traveling from London to Japan, said in posts on X that she was held for over 18 hours because immigration officers claimed her birthplace, Arunachal Pradesh, is Chinese territory.

Thongdok stated that officials repeatedly told her that her Indian passport was invalid, confiscated it, and prevented her from boarding her onward flight, despite having a valid Japanese visa. She was also denied access to food, airport facilities, and updates on her status. Officers reportedly mocked her and suggested she should "ap-



ply for a Chinese passport."

To resume her journey, Thongdok had to purchase a new ticket exclusively on China Eastern Airlines, resulting in financial losses from missed

flights and hotel bookings. Confined to the airport transit area, she was eventually able to leave after contacting the Indian Consulate in Shanghai, with consular intervention.

Calling the incident a "direct insult to India's sovereignty," Thongdok appealed to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Indian authorities to raise the issue with Beijing, seek accountability

and compensation, and ensure the protection of all Indian citizens from Arunachal Pradesh while traveling abroad.

The episode has sparked strong reactions in diplomatic cir-

cles and among Indian citizens, highlighting the sensitive territorial dispute between India and China. Beijing claims Arunachal Pradesh as part of "Zangnan" or southern Tibet, a position consistently rejected by New Delhi.

India has maintained that Arunachal Pradesh is an integral part of the country. In May, the Ministry of External Affairs criticized China's attempts to rename 27 locations in the state, calling them "vain and preposterous" and reaffirming that naming changes cannot alter the reality that Arunachal Pradesh "was, is, and will always remain" part of India.

The incident underscores the challenges faced by citizens of Arunachal Pradesh amid ongoing India-China tensions and the importance of consular support for Indians abroad.

TTAP Launches Three-Day Drive Against 27th Amendment

The opposition alliance Tehreek Tahafuz Ayeen-i-Pakistan (TTAP) has announced a three-day public mobilisation campaign in early December to intensify its resistance to the proposed 27th Constitutional Amendment. The movement will begin in Kamo

Shaheed, Ghotki, and conclude in Karachi, according to a report by Dawn.

The decision was finalised during a crucial meeting of TTAP's Sindh chapter, chaired by Syed Zain Shah and attended by senior representatives from PTI, Majlis Wahdat-i-Muslimeen, Sindh United

Party, PkMAP, and other coalition partners. The session reviewed the ongoing political and constitutional situation in Pakistan and approved several organisational measures to strengthen the alliance's outreach.

A statement released after the meeting noted that the TTAP leader-

ship had mapped out the route for the mobilisation, which will pass through multiple towns before reaching Karachi. The participants also commended the people of Sindh for marking Black Day on November 21, and praised the legal fraternity for its continued opposition to the

amendment.

Speaking to the media, Zain Shah highlighted growing public frustration over unemployment, inflation, and economic instability. He asserted that the 27th Amendment "undermines constitutional supremacy and the rule of law." Shah also criticised the Sindh

government for imposing Section 144 shortly after TTAP announced a rally in Hyderabad, calling it proof that the ruling PPP had "lost its popular support."

He warned that attempts to suppress dissent or impose governments through "fabricated mandates" would no longer be tolerated.

PTI leader Haleem Adil Sheikh echoed these concerns, alleging that the amendment "strips the judiciary of its independence." He stressed that only a strong, people-powered movement could counter what he described as a system built on a "stolen mandate," while condemning the government for introducing "anti-people" changes and keeping PTI founder Imran Khan in "unjust imprisonment."

The TTAP expects significant public participation in its December mobilisation as it continues its campaign against the proposed constitutional reforms.

India's Exports Fall for First Time in 14 Months: CRISIL

India's merchandise exports recorded a decline in October 2025, marking the first drop in 14 months, according to a report by CRISIL. Exports fell 11.8% year-on-year to \$34.38 billion, reversing the growth trend seen since August 2024.

The slowdown was broad-based, affecting key sectors such as petroleum products, gems and jewellery, and other core industrial segments. CRISIL attributed the decline to subdued global demand and lingering supply-side constraints that affected production and shipment timelines.

Petroleum exports, which have historically contributed significantly to India's merchandise trade, saw a marked reduction amid fluctuating crude prices and weaker overseas demand. Gems and jewellery, another major export segment, also experienced a drop due to subdued international



al consumption and ongoing market volatility. Core sectors, including engineering goods,

chemicals, and textiles, witnessed slower growth, reflecting challenges in the global

trade environment. Analysts noted that while domestic production remains strong, external

factors such as weakening global demand, inflationary pressures in importing countries,

and currency fluctuations have impacted export performance.

Despite the decline, CRISIL emphasized that the long-term fundamentals of India's export sector remain intact, supported by ongoing diversification of export markets and the government's focus on promoting value-added manufacturing. Efforts to enhance competitiveness in sectors like electronics, pharmaceuticals, and engineering goods are expected to gradually offset the near-term challenges.

The report suggests that while October's numbers indicate a temporary setback, policy measures to incentivize exports and strengthen supply chains could help stabilize growth in the coming months. Experts anticipate a cautious rebound if global demand improves and domestic industries maintain production efficiency.

S&P Projects India's FY26 GDP Growth at 6.5%



S&P Global Ratings on Monday projected India's economy to grow 6.5% in the current fiscal year and 6.7% in FY27, citing tax cuts and monetary policy easing as key drivers of consumption-led growth.

According to S&P's Economic Outlook Asia-Pacific report, India's real GDP grew at 7.8% in the April-June quarter of FY26, marking the fastest pace in five quarters. Official data for Q2 (July-September) GDP growth is scheduled for release on November 28.

"Domestic growth remains robust, driven by strong consumption, despite the impact of US tariffs," S&P said. The report also noted that a potential trade agreement with the US could reduce uncertainty and boost confidence, benefiting labour-intensive sectors.

S&P highlighted that lowered goods and services tax (GST) rates, combined with income tax relief and recent interest rate cuts, are likely to make consumption a stronger growth driver than investment in the current and next

fiscal year. The government's 2025-26 Budget raised the income tax rebate to ₹12 lakh from ₹7 lakh, providing around ₹1 lakh crore in relief to the middle class.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) had cut key policy rates by 50 basis points in June, bringing the repo rate to a three-year low of 5.5%. Additionally, GST rates on approximately 375 items were reduced from September 22, making essential consumer goods more affordable.

S&P noted that the spike in effective US tariffs on Indian products is weighing on export-oriented manufacturing, though signs suggest potential tariff reductions in the future. The agency added that current US trade policies are diverting time and resources toward negotiating exemptions, which could impact productivity gains.

The RBI has projected India's GDP growth for FY26 at 6.8%, slightly above S&P's estimate, reflecting strong domestic consumption and resilient economic fundamentals.

Stock Markets Rebound on IT Rally, Strong Global Trends



Benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty rebounded in early trade on Monday, November 24, 2025, led by gains in IT stocks and supportive global market trends.

The 30-share Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE) Sensex

climbed 218.44 points to 85,450.36, while the 50-share National Stock Exchange (NSE) Nifty rose 69.4 points to 26,137.55 in early trading. Market analysts attributed the recovery to optimism in the technology sector and

positive cues from global equities.

Among the Sensex firms, Tech Mahindra, Infosys, HCL Technologies, Tata Consultancy Services, HDFC Bank, and Maruti were among the top gainers, reflecting re-

newed investor confidence in IT and banking stocks. Broader sectoral movements indicated firm buying in financial services, automobile, and engineering stocks.

Global trends also supported the rally, with major indi-

ces in the US and Europe recording gains overnight amid easing concerns over interest rates and encouraging corporate earnings. Analysts said that the positive global cues helped offset domestic market uncertainties, prompting early buying interest among investors.

Sector experts highlighted that IT stocks are expected to continue benefiting from strong earnings, higher order inflows, and favorable currency movements. The banking sector also drew investor attention due to steady asset quality and healthy credit growth prospects.

Market participants are closely watching macroeconomic data, corporate results, and global developments to gauge the sustainability of the rebound. Short-term trading activity is likely to remain volatile, with investors cautiously optimistic about further upside potential in select sectors.

Overall, Monday's early session indicated a positive start for Indian equities, fueled by IT sector momentum and firm global cues, suggesting that investors are regaining confidence after recent bouts of market consolidation.

SEBI to Review Mutual Fund, Broker Rules on Dec 17



The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) plans to undertake a comprehensive review of its mutual fund and stock broker regulations at its upcoming board meeting, officials said on Friday. The meeting is scheduled for December 17, 2025, and will discuss proposed reforms aimed at making regulatory frameworks more relevant, transparent, and efficient.

In October, SEBI had issued a consultation paper proposing an overhaul of mutual fund rules. Key recommendations included a clearer definition of the Total Expense Ratio (TER), revised limits on brokerage charges, and enhanced disclosure requirements for investors. The regulator had sought public feedback on these proposals to ensure that the new framework aligns with evolving market practices and investor interests.

The board will also examine changes to stock broker regulations, focusing on improving risk management, operational efficiency, and investor protection. This initiative comes amid growing market complexities, rising trading volumes, and increased participation of retail investors in equities and

mutual funds. SEBI officials emphasized that the review aims to simplify existing rules, address ambiguities, and strengthen governance practices within the mutual fund and brokerage sectors. Analysts said the proposed reforms could enhance transparency, lower costs for investors, and make mutual funds a more attractive investment avenue.

Market participants are closely watching the developments, as any changes in TER norms, brokerage limits, and compliance requirements could significantly impact fund houses and stock brokers. Investor advocacy groups have welcomed SEBI's review, noting that a modernized regulatory framework could boost confidence in India's capital markets and promote long-term sustainable growth.

The board meeting on December 17 is expected to provide clarity on the timeline for implementing these reforms and finalizing the regulatory amendments. SEBI's move reflects its ongoing commitment to safeguard investor interests while fostering a dynamic and resilient capital market ecosystem.

Government to Propose 100% FDI in Insurance Sector: Sitaraman



The government is set to introduce a Bill in the upcoming Winter Session of Parliament to raise foreign direct in-

vestment (FDI) in the insurance sector to 100%, officials said on Friday. The session is scheduled to begin on December 1

and run until December 19, spanning 15 working days.

The proposed legisla-

tion forms part of a broader effort to modernize India's insurance regulatory framework. As part of the exercise, the Life Insurance Cor-

poration Act, 1956, the Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority Act, 1999, and the Insurance Act, 1938, are expected to be amended to facilitate full foreign ownership in the sector.

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman highlighted that allowing 100% FDI is aimed at attracting greater foreign capital, enhancing technology adoption, and expanding product offerings in the insurance industry. She emphasized that this step would boost competitiveness, improve customer service, and strengthen India's insurance market in line with global best practices.

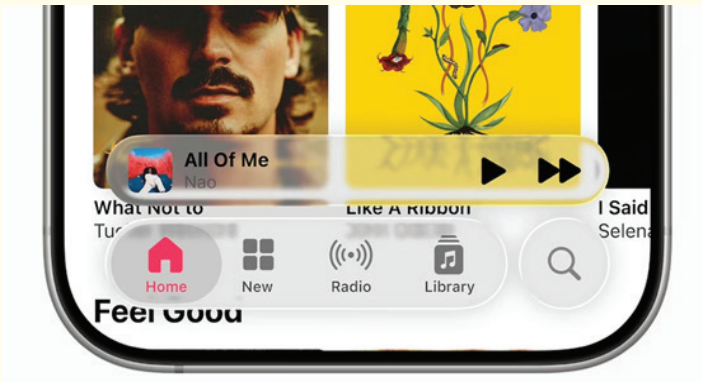
Currently, foreign investors can hold up to 74% stake in insurance companies, subject to regulatory approvals. The proposed hike to 100% would make India one of the few major

economies with full foreign participation allowed in its insurance market.

Industry analysts said the move is likely to attract global insurers seeking a foothold in one of the world's fastest-growing insurance markets. Increased FDI could also support the government's broader objectives of financial inclusion and deepening penetration of life and non-life insurance products across urban and rural India.

The Winter Session is expected to see detailed debates on the Bill, with both opposition and ruling parties discussing regulatory safeguards, consumer protection, and the potential impact on domestic insurers. If passed, the amendments would mark a historic milestone for India's insurance sector, paving the way for enhanced foreign collaboration and investment.

WhatsApp May Soon Let Users Call Others via Username

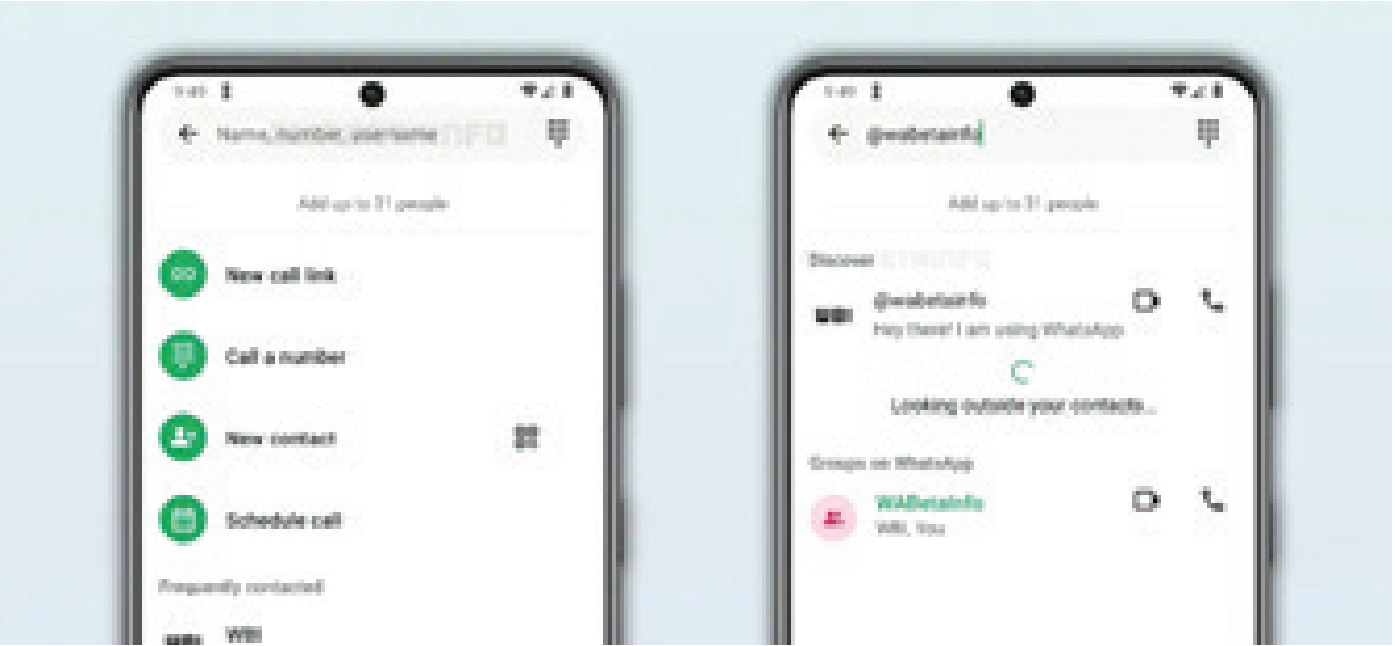

While the feature is still in development, it promises to offer a more streamlined way of communication, similar to Signal's existing username-based calls.

To prevent misuse by spammers or scammers, WhatsApp plans to introduce a "username key" system. Unknown users attempting to place a call would need to enter the correct username key to connect. This feature is expected to be optional but could play a crucial role in enhancing security while enabling easier communication.

Apart from username-based calls, WhatsApp is actively testing several other features. These include cover photos for chats, in-chat storage management, media and sticker filters, message limits for new chats, and a channel quiz feature. Users may also soon be able to reply and react to messages from Apple Watch and secure chat backups with passkey encryption.

No official timeline has been shared regarding the rollout of these features. They are expected to first appear on the beta channel, where WhatsApp will test them before making them available to all users. Once released, these updates could mark a significant shift in how WhatsApp handles privacy, contact discovery, and user interaction.

This development indicates WhatsApp's growing focus on enhancing usability while balancing security and privacy for its over 2 billion global users.

spanning more than six decades. His versatility allowed him to shine in romantic dramas, intense emotional stories, and high-voltage action entertainers.

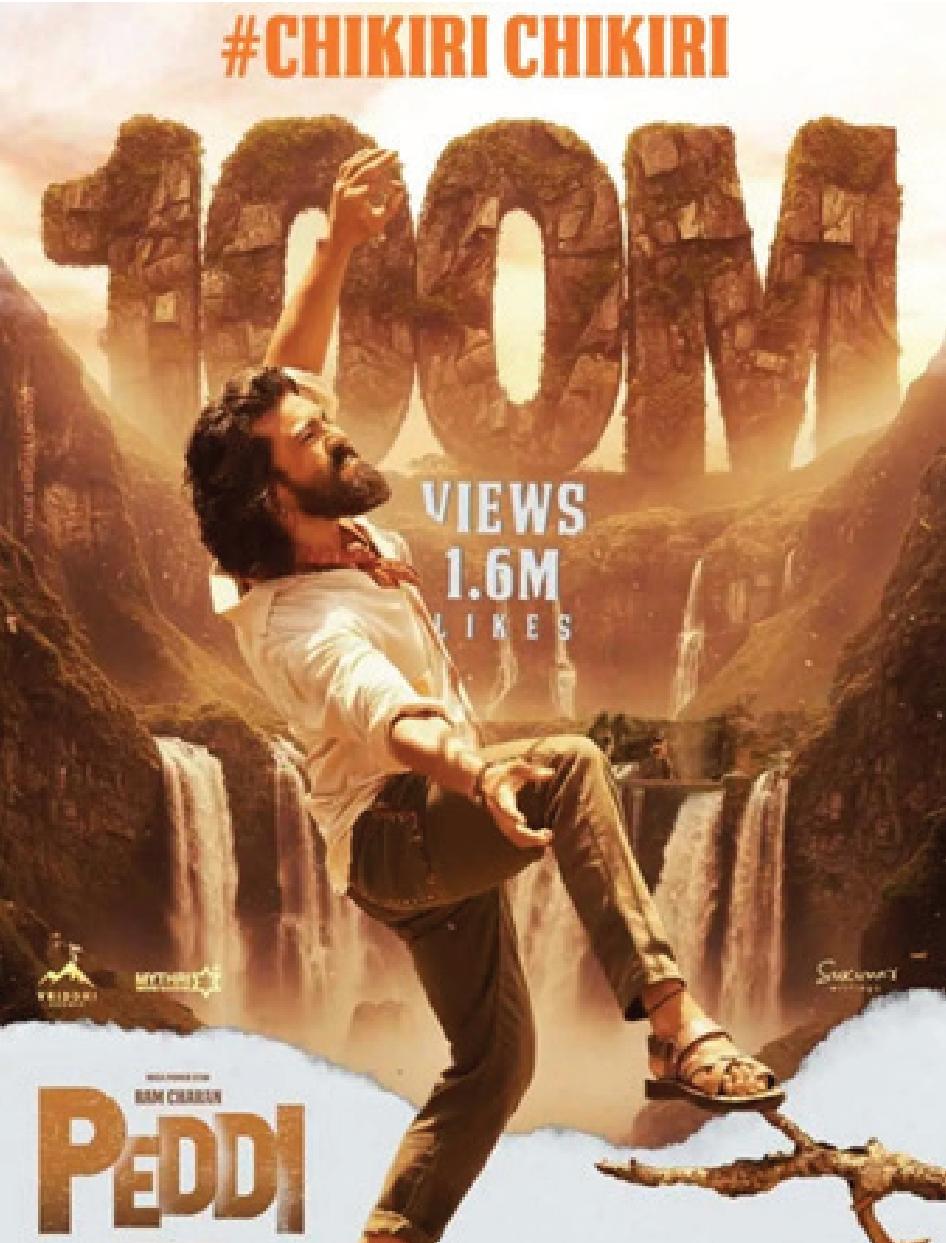
