

# Andhra Pradesh to Host India's First 6 GW Solar Ingot-Wafer Manufacturing Unit

Vijayawada: In a landmark development for India's renewable energy sector, Andhra Pradesh is poised to establish the country's first integrated 6-gigawatt (GW) solar ingot and wafer manufacturing facility. The project, spearheaded by ReNew Photovoltaics, a subsidiary of ReNew Energy Global PLC, is set to come up at Rambilli in Anakapalli district, marking a significant stride toward self-reliance in solar manufacturing.

The Andhra Pradesh State Investment Promotion Board (SIPB), chaired by Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu, approved the proposal on Thursday. The project, valued at 3,990 crore, will soon be placed before the State Cabinet for final clearance. The Memorandum of Understanding, initially signed during the Global Investment Partnership Summit, has now transitioned into an official investment commitment reflecting investor confidence in the state's proactive industrial policies.

This will be India's first commercial-scale, integrated solar ingot and wafer unit, producing the

critical building blocks required to manufacture solar cells and photovoltaic modules. By developing domestic capabilities in these upstream components, the project aims to drastically reduce India's dependence on foreign imports, primarily from China, and strengthen the energy security of the nation.

According to officials, the facility will be established on approximately 130 to 140 acres of land identified near Rambilli. The land transfer process is expected to be completed soon, paving the way for the construction of the greenfield plant. The project timeline envisages completion by March 2026, with commercial production slated to begin by January 2028. Once

operational, the facility will have the capacity to produce up to 6 GW of ingots and wafers annually positioning Andhra Pradesh as a pivotal player in India's transition to clean energy manufacturing.

The plant will create an estimated 1,200 direct employment opportunities for high-skilled and semi-skilled workers. In addition, it will generate substantial indirect jobs through associated logistics, maintenance, and ancillary industries. To sustain large-scale operations, the unit will require a continuous power supply of 95 megawatts (MW) and nearly 10 million liters of water per day (MLD). State officials have assured that the necessary infrastructure and

utility linkages will be facilitated on a priority basis through the district administration and APIIC.

The project also aligns with the Government of India's Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme aimed at boosting domestic solar manufacturing.

By localizing the production of critical components such as ingots and wafers, the initiative will support India's ambitious goal of achieving 300 GW of solar energy capacity by 2030.

With this project, the Anakapalli-Visakhapatnam region is fast emerging as a major hub for renewable energy innovation. Andhra Pradesh's conducive business environment, robust infrastructure, and clear

policy direction continue to attract high-value investments in the clean energy sector. Chief Minister Naidu emphasized that the state's focus on sustainability and industrial growth will create new opportunities for technology-led development.

"This project will not only catalyze job creation but also reinforce Andhra Pradesh's commitment to driving India's green energy transition," he noted.

As the project advances toward implementation, it is expected to serve as a model for domestic solar manufacturing, reshaping India's renewable energy landscape and enhancing the nation's global competitiveness in the green economy.

## IndiGo still facing disruptions

New Delhi: IndiGo's ongoing flight disruption worsened on Friday as the airline cancelled well over 1,000 flights across its domestic and international network, triggering severe chaos for passengers at major airports nationwide. The carrier, which usually operates around 2,300 flights a day, said the massive cancellations were part of an emergency "reboot" of its schedules and systems to stabilize operations in the coming days. Cancellations Spike Across Network IndiGo confirmed that December 5 was its worst day yet, with more than 1,000 services cancelled as the disruption stretched into a fourth consecutive day. The impact was felt most strongly at key hubs such as Delhi, Mumbai, Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Chennai and Goa, where passengers reported long queues, lack of information and overcrowded terminals. The airline, India's largest by market share, has sharply curtailed its schedule from the usual 2,300 daily flights, leading to widespread delays, missed connections and last-minute changes for thousands of travel

Reasons Behind The Meltdown Elbers and the airline have attributed the meltdown to a combination of factors rather than a single failure. IndiGo has cited minor technical issues on aircraft, winter schedule changes, adverse weather condi

tions, heavy congestion in India's aviation network and complications arising from updated crew rostering norms under flight duty time limitation (FDTL) rules.

The DGCA had recently tightened FDTL provisions, including rest requirements for crew, and the airline's planning for the second phase of implementation appears to have been inadequate, aggravating the disruption. Regulators have now granted limited relief on certain FDTL requirements, which Elbers described as "a great help" in rebuilding the roster and improving stability.

Outlook For Saturday And Mid-December Despite the record cancellations on Friday, IndiGo expects the situation to improve gradually from Saturday onwards. Elbers reiterated that the airline's teams were working round the clock with the Ministry of Civil Aviation and the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) to restore regular operations as quickly as possible.

## Fishermen Protest Against Land Takeover Near Visakhapatnam Fishing Harbour

Visakhapatnam: Tensions flared near the Visakhapatnam Fishing Harbour on Friday as members of the local fishing community staged a protest opposing alleged government moves to take over their traditional fishing grounds for upcoming naval events connected to the Navy Fleet Review. The protest, organized by the Fishermen Industrial Welfare Association, drew dozens of fishermen from the One Town and Jalaripeta areas, who vowed to defend their ancestral land at any cost.

The site in contention lies opposite the Navy Quarters near the harbour's fish landing centre, an area long used by local fishermen to dry their nets and sort their daily catch. The protesters alleged that authorities were now attempting to seize this land under the pretext of development activities linked to the forthcoming International Fleet Review (IFR). They warned officials not to

enter or interfere with their land, declaring, "Anyone entering our area will face resistance."

Speaking at the protest, association representatives Valasetti Tataji and Chintapalli Ayyappa Raju reminded authorities of earlier unfulfilled promises. They alleged that since the early 2000s, several development projects had displaced fishermen without proper compensation or rehabilitation.

"In the past, the container terminal project took away our coastline. Later, in 2002, the port authorities acquired our land promising to construct a multi-purpose jetty," said Tataji. "They assured each affected family 60 square yards of residential land, 1 lakh as economic support, and employment opportunities. None of those promises have been honored," he added. The protesters accused the current administration of repeating history by targeting the same coastal stretch for the upcoming naval exhibition and fleet review.

"Under the name of infrastructure and national events, they are slowly erasing the livelihoods of traditional fishermen," said Ayyappa Raju.

The fishermen expressed bitterness that while the city's port and navy projects brought prestige and profit to the region, local communities continued to lose land, income, and cultural heritage. Demonstrators gathered near the Navy Canteen and marched through parts of Jalaripeta, carrying placards demanding justice and protection of their traditional

fishing rights. Many recalled how their ancestors had depended on the very coastline now threatened by development.

"This is not just land; it is our life," said one protester. "We will give our lives if necessary, but we will not give up our land."

Leaders of the protest urged the government and the Visakhapatnam Port Trust to open a dialogue and implement long-pending rehabilitation measures before initiating any new projects.

They also demanded written assurances that no part of the fish landing area would be taken

over without the consent of the community. Those who participated in the protest included Gundla Ganesh, Vadamodula Pentayya Master, Vadamodula Guranna, and several others from the coastal community.

The fishermen's protest has once again highlighted the long-standing conflict between coastal development and the livelihood rights of traditional fishing families in Visakhapatnam, an issue that continues to test the balance between modernization and social justice along Andhra Pradesh's coastline.

## Road Safety Key to Achieving "Swarn Andhra": Accidents, Fatalities Decline in NTR District

NTR District Collector Dr G Lakshminisha said road accidents and fatalities have significantly decreased in 2025 compared to the previous year, attributing the improvement to coordinated efforts of various departments. He was speaking at the District Road Safety Committee (DRSC) meeting held in the Vijayawada Collectorate, attended by Vijayawada Police Commissioner Rajashekhar Babu and officials from various departments.

The Collector said that while NTR district recorded 1,343 road accidents in 2024, the number dropped to 918 in 2025. Fatalities also declined from 432 to 317. He noted that most accidents occur between 6 p.m. and midnight and highlighted that nearly one-third of all mishaps

and deaths involve two-wheelers.

He said 58% of the district's accidents and 41% of its fatalities occur along National Highway 65. To further reduce accidents, he directed officials to install clear signboards indicating speed limits and take strict action against overloaded vehicles. Dr Lakshminisha reiterated that Good Samaritans who help accident victims will not face any civil or criminal liability or police harassment, urging society to honour such life-savers. He called on NGOs to actively participate in road-safety awareness programs. High-Risk Zones Identified; Foot Overbridges

Proposed Vijayawada Police Commissioner Rajashekhar Babu said that Bhavanipuram, Ibrahimpatnam, Patalam, Kanchikacherla and Krishnalanka police station limits account for the highest number of road accidents in the city. He proposed the construction of foot overbridges at major junctions including Bus Stand, Benz Circle and Ramavarappadu to ensure pedestrian safety. He said special attention is being given to frequent accident-prone "black spots" and announced the introduction of a new app aimed at reducing traffic inconvenience for citizens.

## Ex-IRS Officer and Sons Arrested in 55-Crore Fraud Case Promising 12% Monthly Returns

In a major crackdown on a high-profile financial fraud, Visakhapatnam police have arrested former Indian Revenue Service (IRS) officer Katika Shivabhagyarao and his son for allegedly defrauding investors of over 55 crore through a cooperative society that promised unusually high monthly returns.

The accused were running an operation under the banner "Sneha Max Mutually Aided Cooperative Society", which authorities say was nothing short of a large-scale ponzi-style scam.

According to the police, the 65-year-old ex-IRS officer, hailing from Khairatabad in Hyderabad, along with his son Srikant and Kranthi, had been enticing investors since 2014 with promises of 12% interest on deposits. The scheme targeted primarily retired employees, ex-police offic-

ers, and middle-class pensioners who were lured by the promise of steady monthly returns. Initially, to gain the confidence of depositors, the society reportedly made timely payments for a few months.

This created a sense of legitimacy and encouraged many investors to reinvest or increase their deposits. Over time, however, the payments stopped, and all communication from the management ceased.

Alarmed by the sudden silence, investors began inquiring only to realize that they had fallen victim to a massive fraud. Investigations revealed that what started as a modest cooperative entity originally known as an SC-ST Mutual Cooperative Society in Visakhapatnam's Seethampeta area since 2008 was rebranded in 2014 by Shivabhagyarao and his associates as Sneha Max Cooperative Society.

# Telangana Minister Invites Chandrababu Naidu to Hyderabad Global Summit

## Advocate Seeks 33% Quota for Women in AP High Court Bar Association Elections

Vijayawada: Senior advocate Thota Sunitha has approached the Andhra Pradesh High Court, urging the implementation of 33 per cent reservation for women advocates in the upcoming elections of the Andhra Pradesh High Court Advocates' Association (APHCAA). The petition marks a significant move toward ensuring gender representation and equality within the state's legal fraternity.

In her writ petition filed against the president, secretary, and executive committee members of the Association, Sunitha contended that the same constitutional spirit that guarantees women's reservation in law-making bodies should apply to representative institutions within the legal ecosystem. She sought the court's direction to compel the Association to set aside one-third of the posts in its elected body exclusively for women.

Citing the 106th Constitutional Amendment, which mandates one-third reservation for women from panchayats to Parliament, Sunitha argued that the legal profession—being a pillar of democracy—must adopt similar affirmative action to reflect inclusive participation. "Equality in representation is the foundation of justice. The bar, being the cradle of judicial leadership, cannot remain an exception to constitutional ideals," she submitted before the court.

Sunitha further referred to a Supreme Court directive issued in May 2024, which instructed the Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA) and other as-

sociated bodies to ensure 33 per cent representation for women in their respective elected committees. She contended that the Andhra Pradesh High Court Advocates' Association should comply with the same principle, promoting greater participation of women advocates in decision-making and leadership roles.

Accepting the petition, Justice Gannamneni Rama Krishna Prasad admitted the case and issued notices to the Association's office-bearers, seeking their response. The matter has been posted for further hearing on Wednesday. The petitioner, Sunitha, appeared in person during the proceedings.

The plea is expected to initiate a broader debate within the state's legal community regarding gender inclusivity in professional bodies. While the legal profession in India has witnessed a steady rise in women advocates, their representation in bar associations and governing councils remains disproportionately low.

Activists and senior women lawyers have long argued that mandated quotas could break long-standing barriers and reshape institutional culture within the legal sector. If the High Court rules in favor of the petition, the decision could set a precedent for other bar associations across Andhra Pradesh to adopt similar measures.

Legal experts note that such a reform would not only align with the constitutional principles of equality but also resonate with the Supreme Court's recent push for gender equity in legal institutions. He asked whether TDP lead-

## YSRCP stands with Joji Nagar Families

VIJAYAWADA: YSRCP leaders strongly condemned the brutal demolition of 42 homes in Bhavanipuram's Joji Nagar, assuring full support to the displaced families and vowing to fight for justice until the end. Former Minister Velampalli Srinivas, former MLA Malladi Vishnu, NTR district YSRCP president Devineni Avinash, Vijayawada Mayor Rayana Bhagyalakshmi, YSRCP Social Media Wing State President Doddla Anjireddy and other leaders visited the victims and expressed deep anger at the manner in which the demolition was executed.

They said over 200 police personnel accompanied by hired rowdy elements stormed the locality at dawn, threatened the sleeping families, and razed their houses within minutes without giving them time even to collect their belongings.



This was done despite victims showing Supreme Court orders explicitly stating that no demolitions should take place until December 31.

The leaders revealed that Joji Nagar residents had repeatedly approached Minister Nara Lokesh, the Jana Sena party office, local MLA and MP Kesineni Chinni, pleading

for protection, yet none responded. They alleged that the demolition was carried out with the full knowledge and instructions of the MP and MLA, which explains why they have not visited the victims even after such a cruel act.

YSRCP leaders stated that ever since the coalition government came to power, MP

Kesineni Chinni has been eyeing this high-value land worth hundreds of crores and the demolition was part of a planned attempt to grab it. Even when a similar attempt was made four months ago, YSRCP leaders stopped the move, but this time the government secretly executed the operation during early hours to avoid resistance.

The leaders said the victims have been paying house tax, water tax and power bills to the Vijayawada Corporation for 20 years, and many elderly residents have been receiving pensions from the government. All documents proving ownership were ignored and even Supreme Court directions were violated, proving that the Chandrababu-led government has no respect for law or the Constitution.

They alleged that some rowdy elements accompanying the police misbehaved with women, and despite complaints, no cases were filed. The leaders said the coalition government is operating like a bulldozer regime, supporting land grabbers while driving poor families onto the streets.

YSRCP asserted that on being informed of the incident, former Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy immediately directed party leaders to stand with the victims and lead the fight for justice. The party warned that it will not remain silent and will take the battle to the courts and to the people until the 42 displaced families get justice.

The leaders demanded an immediate response from Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu, Minister Nara Lokesh, and Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan, holding them responsible for the unconstitutional, inhuman demolition carried out under their watch.



## Parakamani probe twisted for political vendetta: Bhumana

TIRUPATI: YSRCP State Official spokesperson and former TTD Chairman Bhumana Karunakar Reddy strongly condemned the ongoing Parakamani case investigation as politically motivated and deliberately distorted to portray YSRCP leaders as culprits. Speaking to the media at his residence in Tirupati, he said the CID inquiry is being conducted in a completely biased manner, targeting honest officials while sparing those who continue to serve in the present TTD Board under the Chandrababu government.

He questioned why TDP leaders who publicly claim to possess "evidence" against him and YV Subba Reddy were never summoned for questioning by the CID. He challenged those making allegations to produce proof, declaring that he would take political sanyas if even a single rupee benefit or favour from donor Ravi Kumar is established. He asked whether TDP lead-

ers would resign if the CID report contradicts their accusations.

Bhumana stated that he was only a special invitee to the TTD Board, yet was selectively summoned while other Board members from that period, who are still members today, were conveniently ignored. He asserted that the investigation has gone off-track due to direct interference from the Chandrababu government, with CID and ACB officials acting under political pressure and misleading courts while leaking selective information to pro-TDP media to malign YSRCP leaders.

He accused the government of twisting even court orders to suit its narrative and using the probe solely to defame YS Jagan Mohan Reddy and other YSRCP leaders over the last three months.

He further said that the inquiry was conducted in such a coercive and intimidating manner that an honest police officer like Satish Kumar lost his life. Lower-rank

officials were pressured, threatened, and pushed to give false statements, while attempts were made to use ACB as a weapon against officers who refused to lie.

Calling the entire probe a fabricated exercise, he questioned why the current government has not returned Ravi Kumar's donated properties if it claims they were obtained improperly. Accepting donations is a long-standing TTD practice, he said, and no wrongdoing occurred during the Board's tenure. Bhumana demanded that Chandrababu Naidu, who has been getting multiple cases against him withdrawn, perform "penance" by handing over his own assets to the government just as donor Ravi Kumar did.

Concluding that the Parakamani inquiry is nothing but a political conspiracy aimed at terrorising honest officers and branding YSRCP leaders as thieves, he insisted that the investigation was carried out in a manner completely contrary to facts and justice.

## TDP State President Palla Targets Jagan, Says Tirumala Traditions Were 'Denigrated' Under Previous Regime

VISAKHAPATNAM: Telugu Desam Party (TDP) State President Palla Srinivasa Rao launched a sharp attack on former Chief Minister YS Jagan Mohan Reddy, alleging that the previous YSRCP government had undermined the sanctity of Tirumala and mishandled several temple-related issues. Addressing the media, Palla accused Jagan of "repeatedly invoking the sacred name of Lord Venkateswara for political gain," despite lacking understanding of Sanatana Dharma and Tirumala's traditions.

He said every rupee offered at the temple hundi represented the "faith and sacrifice of devotees," and alleged that the previous regime allowed mismanagement of temple affairs. Referring to the Parakamani episode, Palla termed it the "clearest example" of what happens when persons facing theft allegations are entrusted with sensitive temple duties. He also ridiculed Jagan's recent media interactions, claiming they reflected desperation to stay politically relevant.

Arrests made by the Supreme Court-appointed SIT, he said, were only the beginning of uncovering the full network. Palla also accused the former Chief Minister of lacking basic knowledge of temple etiquette, including restrictions on

footwear and traditional offerings. He criticised Jagan for allegedly maligning judges and constitutional authorities and for promoting an environment of intimidation through phone tapping and pressure tactics.

He said Andhra Pradesh had turned into a "narcotics corridor" during the previous regime, with illegal liquor and ganja cultivation reportedly flourishing. Contrasting this with the present administration, he credited Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu and TDP General Secretary Nara Lokesh for restoring governance standards and reviving investor confidence.

He highlighted the successful conduct of the Mega Parent-Teacher Meeting 3.0, held across nearly 45,000 schools, calling it a testament to the government's commitment to improving education quality and community participation.

## AP Agriculture Department Launches Initiative to Boost Farmers' GVA and Net Income

The initiative aims to institutionalise scientific planning at RSKs to ensure higher net income, greater value addition, and improved gross val-



ue for farmers across agriculture, horticulture, animal husbandry, and sericulture.

As part of the programme, the department will identify key agricultural resources contributing to GVA and train RSK staff to understand how various factors influence value addition. The training will cover GVA calculation, value drivers, crop planning opportunities, and market-linked strategies within each RSK jurisdiction.

Director Holds Review Meeting

Dr Samoon convened a detailed review meeting on Thursday at the Mangalagiri office with senior agricultural officials and the PMU team from Athena Infonomics. He noted that the Chief Minister had emphasised the need for a mindset shift among farmers, urging them to focus on increasing value and income rather than merely production.

He said RSK functionaries would play a key role in this transformation. To support them, data from all village-level departments will be integrated into a unified RSK Dashboard, enabling evidence-based decision-making and transparent monitoring. The Director also instructed the PMU to integrate market price variations and analytics into the dashboards to help farmers make informed choices.

### Mechanisation and Annual Planning

The meeting also discussed mapping all mechanisation assets—such as GPS-enabled harvesters and tractors—to improve utilisation and streamline state-wide

planning.

Dr. Samoon stressed that the Annual Action Plan prepared by RSKs must be realistic, data-driven, and inclusive of inputs from all related departments. Strengthening dashboards to display targets, measurable indicators, and performance gaps was identified as a priority.

## Ambati Accuses Chandrababu of Downgrading Polavaram for Commissions

VIJAYAWADA: YSR Congress Party Guntur district president and former minister Ambati Rambabu launched a fierce attack on Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu, alleging that he has "reduced Polavaram to a mere barrage" to protect corrupt interests and to please the Centre. Addressing the media at the YSRCP central office, Ambati said Polavaram is the lifeline of Andhra Pradesh and a dream project of the late Dr YS Rajashekhar Reddy, who laid its foundations with all necessary approvals.

Ambati alleged that after YSR's demise, Chandrababu Naidu turned the project into an "endless saga of corruption." He accused Naidu of taking over the project from the Centre—despite the Andhra Reorganisation Act placing responsibility on the Union government—"only to treat it like an ATM." He said Naidu constructed the diaphragm wall without completing essential components such as the upper and lower cofferdams, the spillway and diversion arrangements, resulting in the collapse of the diaphragm wall built at a cost of nearly 1,000 crore.

The YSRCP leader said that after 2019, the

Jagan Mohan Reddy government rectified major structural faults by completing the cofferdams, spillway, downstream channels, Gap-3 works and advancing the power house construction. He pointed out that Naidu earlier agreed to execute Polavaram at 2013-14 prices, whereas the YSRCP government secured revised cost approvals based on 2017-18 rates, with the Central Water Commission approving a total project expenditure of 55,656.87 crore.

Ambati alleged that the Centre had, in March 2024, moved a proposal to release 12,157.53 crore for the first phase, but Chandrababu sabotaged it to deny political credit to Jagan. After the BJP-TDP alliance took shape, the file was "pushed into cold storage," he claimed.

He expressed alarm that the NDA government has now "officially downgraded" Polavaram by restricting the full reservoir level (FRL) to 41.15 metres and capping the project cost at 30,436 crore, as revealed in a Lok Sabha reply by Union Jal Shakti Minister CR Patil. Ambati noted that the Godavari Tribunal permitted storage at 45.72 metres with 194.6 TMCs—enough to irrigate against Chandrababu and his allies.

Concluding, Ambati said the public is already disillusioned with the current coalition for "selling off institutions and dismantling welfare systems," and predicted that people will soon deliver a political verdict against Chandrababu and his allies.

Addressing a mega parents-teachers meeting at the AP Model School in Bhamini, he said that reforms introduced by the government are aimed at nurturing globally competent and socially responsible young citizens. The Chief Minister announced that a Students' Innovative Part-

nership Summit will be held in the last week of January to foster innovation among students. Industrialists will be invited to the summit, and awards will be presented to the best student innovation projects. Additionally, students aspiring to pursue higher education abroad will be supported under the Kalalaku Rekkalu scheme with loans at a nominal 25 paise interest rate. Naidu said he was impressed by the skills displayed by students at the meeting and noted that India's demographic advantage places a special responsibility on the education system to empower youth. Stressing



the need for moral and ethical education, he said the government has appointed Chaganti Koteswara Rao to help promote value-based learning and build an ethics-driven society.

The Chief Minister highlighted that the NDA government has in-

roduced 28 reforms in school education and 10 reforms in Intermediate education. The Talliki Vandana scheme is being implemented effectively, with one mother reportedly receiving 90,000 for her six school-going children. Improvements in the Mid-Day Meal Scheme, a political

## Coalition Government Prioritises Rural Healthcare, Says Minister Gottipati Ravi Kumar

ADDANKI : Energy Minister Gottipati Ravi Kumar asserted that the coalition government led by Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu is giving top priority to strengthening rural healthcare and ensuring accessible medical services for people in remote regions. The Minister, accompanied by Health Minister Satya Kumar, toured Santamaguluru village in Addanki constituency on Friday and inaugurated a newly constructed Primary Health Centre (PHC) built at a cost of 1.66 crore. The Ministers also inaugurated the Santamaguluru Secretariat and distributed free bicycles to school students.

Speaking at the programme, Gottipati said construction of PHCs in Santamaguluru, Addanki, and Korisapadu has been completed and will soon be opened to the public. He announced that 1.50 crore has been sanctioned for constructing a PHC in Elchuru. He

also informed that 38 Sub-Health Centres sanctioned for Addanki mandal are nearing the construction stage and directed revenue officials to expedite land acquisition. Buildings will be named after land donors as a mark of gratitude, he added.

The Minister said development of specialized healthcare facilities is a key priority. A five-bed dialysis centre and an AIDS treatment facility will be set up in Addanki so patients no longer need to travel long distances. He also revealed that the existing 30-bed Area Hospital will be modernized with upgraded facilities.

Taking on the previous YSRCP government, Gottipati alleged that public health development during their rule remained "only on paper," with no real progress on the ground. He said the Santamaguluru Secretariat was left incomplete and important government offices in the Nagarjuna Sagar command area lacked proper build-



ings. "Such negligence will not be tolerated under the coalition government," he asserted.

He reiterated the government's commitment to fulfilling promises made by Chandrababu Naidu and Pawan Kalyan during the elections. As part of this, the government sanctioned a special Revenue Division for Addanki and initiated steps to realign the constituency back into Prakasam district, addressing long-pending local demands.

He credited Health Minister Satya Kumar for securing additional resources owing to his rapport with Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Touching on education, the Minister praised the conduct of the Mega Parent-Teacher Meeting and

appreciated Education Minister Nara Lokesh for key reforms, including recruiting 16,300 teachers through DSC and ensuring annual filling of teacher vacancies.

He highlighted donor contributions 350 bicycles from Continental Coffee Chairman Rajendra Prasad and 150 bicycles through Assist NGO to support students in Santamaguluru.

This incident has sparked discussions in the district about the need for stricter monitoring of government medical staff and better administrative oversight, noting that ensuring doctors are available during working hours is essential for maintaining public trust in government health care facilities.

# Telangana's Temples Marching Forward



Telangana's temples are seeing major improvements, thanks to the government led by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and Endowments Minister Smt. Konda Surekha. The government is working hard to make temples beautiful and grand, but most importantly, they're making sure ordinary people have basic facilities when they visit. They are fixing many things that were ignored before and are giving special importance to the people's religious beliefs. This commitment was clear during the big festivals. The recent Sammaka-Saralamma Jatara, the state's largest gathering, was held successfully, with the government spending

₹110 crores to ensure a smooth experience. Now, they are planning an even bigger festival next time, including permanent construction at the site. The Bonalu festival in Hyderabad was also celebrated on a grander scale, with ₹20 crores sanctioned—more money than before—due to the Minister's special interest. In a first, the Endowments Department started Mass Karthika Month Lamp Festivals (Deepotsavams), bringing spiritual light to all temples every evening during the holy Karthika month. They're also using technology: people who can't attend the Sammaka-Saralamma festival can now offer 'gold' and receive

prasadam online through services like Mee Seva and the Postal Department. This online service was also available for prasadam during Maha Shivaratri. On the administrative side, the government gave promotions to 33 long-serving employees and moved temple staff around in transfers after 16 years. New events like the River Lamp Offering (Nadi Aarthi) have begun at sacred places like Bhadrachalam. Big Plans for Big Temples The government is spending about ₹400 crores to improve temples across the state.

Yadagirigutta is getting a new gold plating on its main dome (about 63 kg of gold). They've also planned

a Vedic School and acquired a large area of land for building guest houses. Vemulawada received ₹76 crores for improvements, including building a new free meal (Annadanam) center. Bhadrachalam received ₹60.20 crores to buy land for future development. The government is also protecting temple property. They started a special effort to secure over 632 acres of temple land. They plan to use some of this land for solar plants, involving women's self-help groups (Indira Mahila Shakti Groups). They are also using modern mapping technology (GIS digitalization) to keep track of temple lands, which is a commendable step. Over-

all, Telangana's religious sites are not just being preserved; they are being actively developed using modern methods, greater funding, and a deep respect for the public's faith, ensuring a bright future for these cultural landmarks.

## The rupee's real problem: A rising import bill and stagnant exports



The Indian rupee's latest slide has sparked concern, especially since domestic fundamentals appear stable. Inflation remains within the RBI's tolerance band, economic growth hit 8.2% in Q2 FY26, and weakening US manufacturing data should typically soften the dollar. Yet the rupee continues to depreciate, and attributing this solely to tariff threats from the Donald Trump administration oversimplifies the issue. India's currency pressures stem from long-standing structural vulnerabilities in the external sector—not short-term geopolitical shocks.

At the core of the problem is a persistent mismatch: India's heavy import dependence alongside modest export performance. India relies on a narrow set of imports—crude oil, gold, electronics, edible oils, and key intermediate goods. As incomes rise and manufacturing expands, the import bill grows faster than export earnings, widening the current account deficit. HSBC estimates FY26's deficit may nearly double from 0.6% to 1.4% of GDP, signalling mounting pressure on the rupee.

Meanwhile, India's export performance has remained largely stagnant for decades. The country accounts for just 1.8% of global merchandise exports and 4.3% in services. By contrast, China's share jumped from 4% in 2001 to over 15% by 2022 due to its deep integration with global value chains and massive investments in logistics and manufacturing. India continues to grapple with high logistics costs, unpredictable regulations, quality-control issues, and limited participation in global supply chains.

This combination—high imports and stagnant exports—keeps the rupee vulnerable. Depreciation is often seen as a tool to boost exports, but in India's case the benefits are muted. The rupee has weakened more than 35% since 2015, yet export shares have barely moved. Many export industries depend heavily on imported inputs, meaning a weaker rupee simply raises production costs. In high-value sectors, competitiveness depends on reliability, innovation, and supply-chain integration—not currency movements.

The RBI's ability to influence this structural imbalance is limited. The central bank can smooth volatility but cannot sustainably support an artificially strong rupee without risking reserve depletion or capital flight. Durable currency strength must come from the real economy.

Policy priorities must therefore shift toward expanding export capacity. This includes strengthening R&D, improving university-industry collaboration, modernising logistics through programmes like Gati Shakti, and ensuring a stable, predictable trade regime. India also needs deeper participation in global supply chains through free-trade agreements and partnerships. Finally, a shift from volatile portfolio flows to long-term FDI would provide greater currency stability.

The rupee's recent depreciation is a reminder that currencies reflect economic strength. Without bold reforms to raise competitiveness and diversify exports, the rupee will continue to mirror India's unrealised potential.

## India Needs More Bureaucrats, Not DOGE-Style Cuts, to Improve Efficiency



As the US disbands its controversial Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE), once championed by Elon Musk and former President Donald Trump, the episode offers a cautionary tale for countries like India that often romanticise drastic bureaucratic downsizing. DOGE's 10-month run, marked by the firing of 2,60,000 federal workers, ultimately collapsed under its own chaos. Rather than improving governance, it promoted a techno-dystopia that sidelined human expertise in favour of hyper-automation.

Yet in India, where frustrations over red tape are common, many saw DOGE as a model for streamlining governance. This reflects a broader belief that bureaucracies are bloated and inefficient. However, global research—and India's own experience—suggest the opposite: the Indian state is severely understaffed, not overstaffed.

Much of India's administrative reform discourse relies

on curbing bureaucratic discretion through digital surveillance tools—MIS dashboards, biometric attendance, GPS tracking and command-and-control centres. These systems aim to "discipline" civil servants but often undermine their ability to deliver public services. Frontline workers, from teachers to anganwadi staff, say they are reduced to "clerks" uploading data rather than solving real implementation challenges.

Restricting discretion also removes critical feedback loops from frontline officers who best understand on-ground realities. When their voices are ignored, bureaucratic culture shifts toward rigid adherence to process rather than outcomes. Many officers describe themselves as powerless "post officers," reflecting a system that overvalues data compliance instead of service delivery.

International comparisons highlight India's staffing crisis. In 2011, government em-

## Putin in Delhi: India-Russia Ties Enter a More Transactional Phase



Russian President Vladimir Putin's visit to New Delhi has renewed attention on a relationship long steeped in nostalgia and strategic habit. While expectations from his meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi remain high, the India-Russia partnership is undergoing visible transformation, shaped by shifting global geopolitics, sanctions pressure, defence diversification, and India's broader multilateral alignment strategy.

For decades, defence ties served as the backbone of bilateral relations. Since the 2000 Strategic Partnership declaration and the 2010 upgrade to a "Special and Privileged Strategic Partnership," India has relied on Moscow for trusted defence supplies, advanced technologies, and diplomatic support. Legacy platforms—from MiG and Sukhoi aircraft to T-90 tanks and the INS Vikramaditya—cemented Russia's role as India's key armaments partner. Flagship ventures like BrahMos and the S-400 exemplified deep collaboration.

But the landscape is changing. Russia remains India's largest single defence supplier, yet its share of imports has declined sharply as New Delhi diversifies towards the US, France, Israel, and domestic production under Make in India. Sanctions and the Ukraine conflict have disrupted deliveries and payments, exposing the risks of overdependence and accelerating India's push for selective, high-end cooperation rather than broad reliance.

Energy and trade ties have expanded, particularly after India increased purchases of discounted Russian crude. Trade has surged to over \$65 billion, but remains starkly imbalanced: India's exports are still below \$5 billion. Western sanctions on Rosneft and Lukoil have complicated payments, creating rupee surpluses and pushing experiments with local-currency settlement. Ambitious connectivity initiatives—INSTC, Chennai-Vladivostok, and the Northern Sea Route—have political backing but face infrastructural and sanctions-related hurdles.

Geopolitically, both countries champion multipolarity and coordination in BRICS, SCO, and the G20. But Russia's tightening embrace of China limits Moscow's ability to balance Beijing on issues central to India's security. Meanwhile, India's deepening partnerships with the US, QUAD, and Europe constrain overt alignment with a heavily sanctioned Russia. This dynamic has led to a more pragmatic Indian approach—maintaining ties with Moscow while diversifying across multiple partners.

Looking ahead, the relationship will remain relevant but more constrained and transactional. Cooperation will endure in nuclear energy, hydrocarbons, select defence technologies, and Eurasian connectivity. Yet Russia will no longer occupy the central position it once did in India's foreign policy. Instead, New Delhi will pursue a calibrated partnership—resilient in priority sectors but shaped by the realities of a rapidly evolving global order.

# MODI AND PUTIN REAFFIRM STRONG ANTI-TERROR ALLIANCE

India and Russia on Friday reaffirmed their long-standing strategic partnership and vowed to intensify cooperation in the global fight against terrorism. In a strong and symbolic joint statement delivered at Hyderabad House, Prime Minister Narendra Modi declared that the two nations "stand shoulder-to-shoulder and walk together in the fight against terrorism", while Russian President Vladimir Putin hailed New Delhi's efforts to promote global peace amid ongoing geopolitical turbulence.

The meeting marked Putin's first state visit to India in four years, a trip loaded with diplomatic significance given the shifting global alignments, continued Western pressure on Moscow, and India's own challenge of balancing relations between Russia and the United States.

## A Shared Stand Against Terrorism

Prime Minister Modi opened his remarks by highlighting the shared security concerns of both nations and condemned recent terrorist attacks that have shaken India and Russia.

"Whether it is the terrorist attack in Pahalgam, where 26 innocent people were killed by the Jaish-e-Mohammed, or the cowardly assault on the Crocus City Hall in Moscow... the root of all these incidents is the same," the Prime Minister said, referring to the March 2024 Islamic State-Khorasan (ISIS-K) attack in Russia that left 149 people dead.

Reiterating India's long-standing position, Modi stated, "Any terrorist attack is a direct assault on the values of humanity, and global unity against terrorism is our greatest strength." The



remarks come at a time when both countries have intensified intelligence and security cooperation, particularly after Moscow strongly backed India following the Pahalgam attack. Russia had publicly condemned the Pakistan-based Jaish group and stated it "stands in solidarity with India for elimination of terrorism in all its forms".

The Kremlin had also supported India during Operation Sindoora, the military response targeting terror bases across Pakistan and regions illegally occupied by it. Friday's joint statement further cements this alignment, signaling that counter-terrorism continues to be a core pillar of the India-Russia strategic partnership.

## A Partnership That Has Stood the Test of Time

Reflecting on the durability of bilateral ties, PM Modi said the India-Russia friendship remained a stabilizing force despite global upheavals.

"Over the past eight decades, the world has witnessed ups and downs. Humanity has had to pass through many challenges and crises. Amidst all this, the India-Russia friendship has remained steady-

"Energy security has been a strong and important pillar of the Indian-

fast," he said. He emphasized that the relationship is "rooted in mutual respect and trust," and has consistently "stood the test of time."

Putin's presence in Delhi — his first state visit since the pandemic and the escalation of the Ukraine war — underscored Moscow's continued prioritization of New Delhi even amid its growing dependence on China.

## Energy and Trade: The Driving Forces of Cooperation

One of the most closely watched segments of the joint statement related to energy cooperation, especially at a time when Western nations, led by the United States, are pressuring India to scale down its purchases of Russian crude.

Putin reaffirmed Russia's commitment to ensure "uninterrupted shipments" of fuel to India, a message of reassurance as global markets brace for another turbulent year. However, PM Modi chose his words carefully, making no specific reference to Russian oil. Instead, he highlighted cleaner and long-standing areas of joint work.

"Energy security has been a strong and important pillar of the Indian-

Russia partnership. Our decades-old cooperation in the field of civil nuclear energy has been crucial in giving meaning to our shared priorities for clean energy. We will continue this win-win cooperation," the Prime Minister said.

Despite Modi's diplomatic balancing act, both leaders signaled a push for deeper economic engagement. Russia announced plans to elevate annual bilateral trade to USD 100 billion, a major leap from the current levels. Officials exchanged agreements covering employment, healthcare, shipping, chemicals, and maritime cooperation, including a new MoU for the shipping sector.

In what will be closely scrutinized by Western capitals, particularly the United States, Putin said India and Russia are "moving towards use of national currencies for bilateral payments," a step that could further dilute dependence on the US dollar in global trade, especially within the BRICS framework.

## Ukraine War: Peace Efforts and Diplomacy

The ongoing war in Ukraine — now in its fourth year with no visible resolution — was also a key point of discussion. Putin said he had a "very

informative and useful conversation" with Prime Minister Modi on the matter and thanked him for his consistent efforts to promote peace.

He revealed he had shared new details of a potential plan for peaceful resolution of the conflict and reiterated Moscow's appreciation for India's role as a "champion of peace". India has maintained a balanced diplomatic stance throughout the conflict, calling for dialogue and cessation of hostilities without aligning fully with either bloc.

## Expanding Horizons: Minerals, Technology, and Future Growth

Modi also emphasized expanding cooperation beyond traditional sectors. The PM highlighted new opportunities in critical minerals — an emerging global priority, especially for clean energy technologies — and reaffirmed the intent to strengthen the partnership across energy, trade, innovation, and defense.

"We will continue this trend while expanding to areas like critical minerals," he said, signaling India's interest in leveraging Russia's resource-rich geography.

## A Renewed Commitment

The Modi-Putin summit concluded on a note of warmth, strategic clarity, and shared global vision. While geopolitical tensions remain high internationally, the India-Russia partnership appears set for renewed momentum.

For New Delhi, the challenge will be to maintain this deep-rooted friendship with Moscow while navigating its increasingly complex relations with the West — a diplomatic balancing act that Prime Minister Modi seems determined to continue.

## KUDANKULAM EXPANSION ACCELERATES AS RUSSIA SENDS FUEL FOR THIRD REACTOR

Russia reaffirmed its commitment to India's civil nuclear energy ambitions on Friday, with President Vladimir Putin emphasizing the strategic importance of the Kudankulam Nuclear Power Plant (KKNPP) during a joint press briefing with Prime Minister Narendra Modi in New Delhi. Calling Kudankulam a "flagship project" of India-Russia cooperation, Putin said Moscow remains fully committed to ensuring that the plant reaches its full six-reactor capacity, strengthening India's long-term energy security.

Putin noted that two of the plant's six VVER-1000 reactors are already operational and supplying power to the national grid, while four more reactors are at various stages of construction. "We're conducting a flagship project to build the largest Indian nuclear power plant, Kudankulam. Two out of six reactor units have already been connected to the energy network, and four are still under construction. Getting this nuclear power plant to full power output will make an impressive contribution to the energy requirements of India," he said.

His comments came shortly after Rosatom, Russia's state-run nuclear corporation, confirmed the delivery of its first consignment of nuclear fuel for the initial loading of Kudankulam's third reactor. The fuel assemblies were manufactured at the Novosibirsk Chemical Concentrates Plant and arrived in India earlier today on a special cargo flight. According to Rosatom, the



and could serve remote regions, islands, or coastal areas. He also highlighted the potential of nuclear technologies in non-energy applications such as medicine, cancer treatment, and agriculture, areas where both countries already collaborate through existing scientific partnerships.

The Russian President described Moscow as a stable and reliable supplier of energy to India, emphasizing that Russia continues to provide oil, gas, coal, and nuclear fuel despite global market pressures and geopolitical tensions.

"Russia is a reliable supplier of oil, gas, coal, and everything required for the development of India's energy," he said, adding that uninterrupted supplies would continue for the fast-growing Indian economy.

For India, the Kudankulam project remains a cornerstone of its long-term clean energy strategy. The first two reactors have been operating successfully since 2013 and 2016, and the upcoming units are expected to significantly enhance the country's non-fossil power capacity. As India expands its energy infrastructure to meet rising demand, nuclear power is poised to play an increasingly important role.

Putin also signaled Russia's willingness to expand nuclear cooperation into emerging and next-generation technologies. He said Moscow is ready to discuss projects involving small modular reactors and floating nuclear power plants — both of which represent the newest wave of global nuclear innovation. Such technologies can be deployed more quickly, require smaller footprints,

## SPECIAL CESS ON PAN MASALA: LOKSABHA APPROVED

The Lok Sabha on Friday approved the Health Security and National Security Cess Bill, 2025, paving the way for the imposition of a special cess on pan masala manufacturing units. The revenue generated from this cess will be directed toward national security initiatives and public health programmes. The bill, introduced by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, was passed by a voice vote after a short but pointed discussion.

Explaining the purpose of the new levy, Sitharaman said that pan masala and similar products have long-term adverse effects on public health, and therefore industries manufacturing them should contribute financially to measures that improve national well-being. She emphasized that the funds collected would not remain solely with the Centre; instead, they would be shared with the states to support joint efforts in strengthening health infrastructure and security preparedness.

Currently, pan masala falls under the highest GST slab of 40 per cent. The Finance Minister clarified that the new cess would not impact GST revenue since it is being structured as a separate charge. The cess will be imposed based on the production capacity of each unit, ensuring an objective and measurable method of assessing liability.

Sitharaman also pointed out a decline in the contribution of cesses to

the government's total revenue. Between 2010 and 2014, cesses accounted for nearly 7 per cent of revenue, while in the current financial year the figure has dropped to 6.1 per cent. She argued that the new cess is necessary to boost funds for crucial sectors linked to national health and security.

Government sources said the measure is also intended to send a strong public health message, given that pan masala consumption remains a major cause of oral and other health issues in India. By imposing an additional financial burden on manufacturers, the government aims both to raise essential revenue and to discourage the proliferation of harmful products.

With the bill's passage in the Lok Sabha, the government is confident it will strengthen targeted revenue mobilization for high-priority national needs.

Opposition members, however, may raise implementation-related questions when the bill is introduced in the Rajya Sabha.



## INDIA'S BIGGEST AIRLINE HIT BY UNPRECEDENTED MELTDOWN

IndiGo, India's largest airline,

faced its worst operational crisis to date on Friday, canceling more than a thousand flights and leaving passengers stranded across major airports.

Calling it the "most severely impacted day" in the airline's history, IndiGo CEO Pieter Elbers issued a public apology this evening, acknowledging widespread disruption and assuring that efforts are underway to stabilize operations.

Elbers admitted the airline had misjudged the impact of the new regulations.

"Yesterday and today have been the most severely impacted days so far. The situation is a result of various causes, including misjudgment and planning gaps on our part," he said.

He added that while disruptions will continue into Saturday, the airline expects fewer than 1,000 cancellations.

Normal operations are projected to return only between December 10 and 15.

As scenes of over-

crowding and frustration spread across social media, the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) stepped in to provide temporary regulatory relief. The aviation regulator granted IndiGo a short-term exemption from strict night-duty limitations for pilots and allowed the airline to substitute weekly rest periods with approved leave in certain cases.

IndiGo, which operates around 2,300 domestic and international flights every day, canceled "more than half" of its daily schedule.

# SENSEX SURGES 447 POINTS, NIFTY GAINS 153 ON RBI RATE CUT

Indian equity markets rallied on Friday following the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) decision to cut the repo rate by 25 basis points to 5.25%, providing a boost to investor sentiment. The Sensex climbed 447 points to close above 68,200, while the Nifty rose 153 points to finish near 20,300. The rally was led by financial and automobile stocks, which are among the most sensitive to changes in interest rates.

Among the top gainers were State Bank of India (SBI), Bajaj Finance, Bajaj Finserv, Maruti Suzuki, and HCL Technologies. Analysts noted that the RBI's move to lower borrowing costs is expected to benefit consumers and businesses alike, boosting demand for home loans, vehicle financing, and other credit products. "The rate cut is positive for large-cap financials and auto companies, as lower interest rates typically lead to higher loan growth and increased consumer spending," said a market strategist.



Despite Friday's gains, weekly performance remained muted. The Sensex and Nifty were largely flat for the week, reflecting a mix of positive and negative sectoral movements. Mid-cap and small-cap indices underperformed, with the Nifty Midcap 150 down 0.7% and the Nifty Smallcap 250 declining 1.8%. This

indicates that investors favored large-cap stocks amid selective buying, while broader market segments faced selling pressure.

A notable underperformer this week was IndiGo, whose shares dropped 9% following the airline's cancellation of more than 1,000 flights. The disruptions, described as the "most

severely impacted day" in the airline's history, were attributed to new pilot regulations and internal planning gaps. Regulators intervened, granting temporary relief to help IndiGo manage its operations and reduce further cancellations. Analysts highlighted that investor concerns over operational setbacks and po-

tential financial impact weighed on the stock.

Sectoral analysis shows that banking and financial services stocks were among the main beneficiaries of the rate cut, as lower borrowing costs are expected to spur credit growth. Automobile companies also gained on expectations of increased consumer demand for vehi-

cles. Meanwhile, technology stocks, led by HCL Technologies, contributed to the broader market gains, reflecting ongoing investor interest in the IT sector.

Looking ahead, market experts said domestic monetary policy and global cues will remain key drivers for equity markets. The RBI's accommodative stance to support growth is likely to provide continued momentum for rate-sensitive sectors, though caution remains around companies facing operational or regulatory challenges.

Overall, Friday's surge in Sensex and Nifty highlights renewed investor optimism following the RBI rate cut, with financials and auto stocks leading the rally. However, the underperformance of mid- and small-cap stocks, along with sector-specific concerns such as IndiGo's flight cancellations, underscores that markets remain cautiously optimistic, balancing macroeconomic support with company-level risks.

## SEBI BANS FINANCIAL INFLUENCER AVADHUT SATHE: FREEZES ₹546 Cr

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has taken a major step to regulate the booming "finfluencer" ecosystem by banning financial influencer and market trainer Avadhut Sathe from participating in the securities market. The regulator found that Sathe, through his organization Avadhut Sathe Trading Academy Private Limited, was offering investment advice without proper registration, prompting SEBI to prohibit him from entering the securities market and to order the attachment of assets worth ₹546 crore.

Sathe, a prominent figure in investor education, has gained massive popularity for his trading sessions and online advice related to the stock market. SEBI observed that he was advising investors on stock purchases and sales without holding any regulatory licenses, raising concerns about potential risks for retail investors. In August, the regulator conducted inspections at his residence and the academy to assess his activities.

Originally from Dadar,



Mumbai, Sathe studied engineering and worked in the IT sector across Singapore, Australia, and the United States before focusing full-time on trading after returning to India in 2007. In 2008, he founded Avadhut Sathe Trading Academy, which combines technical analysis, market psychology, yoga, and motivational sessions into its training programs. His approach

has drawn widespread attention both in India and abroad, with hundreds of thousands of followers on platforms like YouTube. Reports indicate that his courses range from ₹21,000 to ₹1.7 lakh for three-month programs. A video of Sathe dancing during a trading session in 2023 went viral, further boosting his popularity.

According to SEBI, the

academy collected ₹601 crore from approximately 3.37 lakh investors. Beyond providing training, the academy actively advised participants on which stocks to buy or sell during live market sessions. Such practices, SEBI noted, could mislead retail investors into following questionable trading strategies. Other financial influencers have criticized Sathe for sharing stock


tips in private groups, potentially influencing inexperienced traders.

The rapid growth of Sathe's business also drew SEBI's attention. While he earned ₹17 crore in fees in 2021, the income reportedly rose to ₹86 crore in 2023, with projections suggesting it could reach ₹200 crore by 2025. This exponential expansion, coupled with unregistered advisory activities, was a key factor behind SEBI's regulatory intervention.

SEBI's directive includes freezing Sathe's assets until further notice, ensuring that the ₹546 crore raised from investors cannot be moved or utilized without regulatory oversight. The move highlights the regulator's commitment to safeguarding investors from unregistered financial advisors and maintaining the integrity of India's securities market.

As India witnesses a surge in fintech-based financial education and influencer-driven trading advice, SEBI's decisive action against Sathe sets a strong precedent for regulating the rapidly growing segment of unlicensed financial influencers.

## SANCHAR SAATHI APP CLIMBS TO No.1 ON APP STORE AMID CONTROVERSY

The government-backed Sanchar Saathi app has achieved a remarkable milestone, climbing to the number one position on the App Store after rising sharply from its previous rank of 127. The sudden surge comes amid heightened public attention and

controversy surrounding the platform, reflecting both widespread curiosity and public debate over its use and privacy concerns.

Launched to help mobile users access information related to their telecom connections, Sanchar Saathi enables individuals to verify all

mobile numbers registered under their name, manage subscriptions, and check for unauthorized connections. The app is part of the government's initiative to improve transparency and consumer awareness in the telecom sector, ensuring that users have easy access to critical data related to their mobile connections.

The recent controversy has revolved around concerns over user privacy and the collection of personal data. Critics have questioned whether the app, which requires access to sensitive information such as phone numbers and

identity details, could compromise user security. Despite these criticisms, or perhaps because of the widespread debate, the app has witnessed an unprecedented surge in downloads.

Industry analysts note that such a rapid climb on the App Store—from 127th to the top position—is unusual in India's competitive app market, dominated by social media, streaming, and gaming platforms. tion guidelines and is designed to strengthen user control over their mobile services. Officials also highlighted that the platform provides valuable services, including identifying unauthorized mobile connections, reporting complaints to telecom operators, and managing multiple numbers efficiently.

The Sanchar Saathi app's ascent to the top of the App Store highlights the growing role of digital platforms in shaping public discourse. It also underscores how controversies, while sometimes drawing criticism, can significantly boost awareness and user adoption. As the debate around privacy continues, the app's developers and government agencies are likely to focus on reinforcing security measures and addressing public concerns to maintain trust while sustaining its newfound popularity.

## RBI CUTS REPO RATE BY 25 BASIS POINTS, HOME LOAN BORROWERS TO BENEFIT

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has once again brought good news for home loan borrowers by reducing the repo rate by 25 basis points, bringing it down to 5.25%. This marks the fourth rate cut by the central bank this year, resulting in a total reduction of 125 basis points in 2025. The move is expected to provide substantial savings for borrowers across the country.

Several banks have already passed on the benefits of earlier rate cuts to borrowers, although the impact may vary depending on the reset cycle of the loan. With the latest 25-basis-point reduction, home loans linked to the External Benchmark Lending Rate (EBLR) are expected to see a further decrease in EMI burdens. Interest rates that were around 9% last year have now fallen to below 7.5%, offering long-term financial relief for borrowers.

Financial experts estimate that a reduction of 125 basis points on a ₹50 lakh home loan could save nearly ₹9 lakh over the tenure of the loan. The central bank's rate cut is part of its ongoing effort to support economic growth and reduce the cost of borrowing. With home loan EMIs becoming more affordable, borrowers can expect relief in their monthly budgets, while banks and financial institutions will adjust deposit offerings in response to the monetary easing.

## SPICEJET CAPITALIZES ON INDIGO CRISIS

The ongoing operational crisis at IndiGo has provided a strategic opportunity for rival airline SpiceJet, which moved quickly to expand its services amid widespread flight cancellations and delays. While IndiGo continues to grapple with stranded passengers and operational bottlenecks, SpiceJet has added multiple new flights from Delhi and Mumbai to meet the surge in demand, positively impacting its business and stock performance. Conversely, IndiGo's shares have been negatively affected due to the disruption.

SpiceJet announced the additional flights on social media platform X, stating, "Quick update: We have added additional departures from Delhi and Mumbai today for your convenience."

The airline also provided detailed information on flight numbers, destinations, and timings for the new services.

The expanded schedule includes flights from Delhi to Mumbai, Ayodhya, Pune, Bangkok, Bengaluru, and Kolkata. Meanwhile, Mumbai-based departures now cover Jaipur, Patna, Goa, Bengaluru, Gorakhpur, Chennai, and New Delhi. The airline's prompt response highlights its strategy to capture demand generated by IndiGo's operational setbacks, turning a competitor's crisis into a commercial advantage.

However, the spike in fares has drawn attention. According to SpiceJet's website, one-way tickets from Mumbai to Delhi for late-night flights were priced at ₹40,599 and ₹34,299—dramatically higher than the regular ₹4,000-₹7,000 range. This surge reflects the pressure of limited seat availability amid high demand, as travelers urgently seek alternatives to canceled IndiGo flights.

Despite the announcement of additional flights, most of the new services were already sold out at the time of reporting, suggesting that

the airline is operating at full capacity to accommodate displaced passengers. Industry experts note that while the high fares may attract criticism from travelers, the move is a significant revenue booster for SpiceJet during a period when competitors are struggling operationally.

Financial analysts have pointed out that SpiceJet's quick operational response demonstrates the flexibility and opportunistic strategies of smaller carriers in the Indian aviation market. By swiftly reallocating aircraft and increasing flight frequencies, the airline has not only addressed urgent passenger needs but also strengthened its position in the domestic sector, particularly in key hubs like Delhi and Mumbai.

For IndiGo, the crisis continues to weigh heavily, affecting customer trust and investor confidence. Regulatory intervention and temporary relief measures have been implemented, but recovery is expected to take time. Meanwhile, SpiceJet's decisive approach has underscored the importance of agile planning in a competitive industry where one airline's misfortune can become another's opportunity.

Overall, the IndiGo disruption has reshaped short-term dynamics in India's aviation sector, with SpiceJet emerging as the primary beneficiary through expanded flight offerings, record fares, and increased market visibility.

## Fabergé 'Winter Egg' Expected to Fetch Rs 200 Crore at Auction



A rare Fabergé masterpiece—famously known as the Winter Egg—is once again headed to auction, and experts believe it could command an extraordinary price of Rs 200 crore. Just four inches tall, the jewel-like creation is considered one of the most exquisite and valuable decorative eggs ever made.

Crafted in 1913 for Tsar Nicholas II of Russia, the Winter Egg was designed by Alma Pihl, one of the very few female artists at the House of Fabergé. The Tsar commissioned it as an Easter gift for his mother, Empress Maria Feodorovna. Today, only two eggs created by Pihl survive—one held by the British royal family, and this newly surfaced piece now set for sale.

What sets the Winter Egg apart is its extraordinary craftsmanship. Made from rock crystal, the exterior shimmers like frozen glass and is embellished with nearly 4,500 dia-

monds, giving it a glistening, frost-like appearance. Inside the egg lies its signature surprise: a miniature basket of flowers, crafted from precious stones and quartz. The delicate design symbolises the transition from winter to spring, capturing the elegance and imagination for which Fabergé is renowned.

The egg's journey through history is just as striking as its design. After the fall of the Romanov dynasty in 1917, many royal treasures were sold off by the new communist regime. Despite its immense value, the Winter Egg was reportedly sold to a London dealer for only £450 due to Russia's financial crisis at the time.

More than a century later, the piece is poised to break auction records. With its rich imperial history, intricate artistry, and extreme rarity, the Fabergé Winter Egg stands as one of the world's most extraordinary—and expensive—art objects.

## Over 1,000 Amazon Workers Warn Against 'Warp-Speed' AI Rollout



More than 1,000 Amazon employees have signed an open letter urging the company to slow down its rapid expansion of artificial intelligence systems, warning that the current "all-costs-justified, warp-speed" approach could harm workers, democracy and the environment. The letter, published on November 26, comes amid Amazon's ongoing plan to cut up to 14,000 corporate jobs globally this year.

The signatories include engineers, product managers and warehouse associates, reflecting concerns across the company's workforce. Their message has also drawn support from over 2,400 employees at other major tech firms, including Microsoft, Apple, Google and Meta—showing a broader industry unease about unchecked AI growth.

Employees argue that Amazon's leadership is pushing ahead with AI adoption without adequate guardrails, risking mass job displacement and expanding workplace surveillance. They also highlight the environmental cost of large-scale AI infrastructure, which demands vast energy resources at a time when climate concerns are mounting.

The letter warns that deploying powerful AI tools without proper oversight could contribute to democratic backsliding, especially when combined with rising global authoritarianism. Workers fear that AI-driven decision-making in logistics, hiring, productivity tracking and customer-facing services could concentrate power and reduce transparency.

"We believe that the warp-speed approach to AI development will do staggering damage," the letter states, urging Amazon to invest in stronger safety, privacy and ethical standards before scaling further. Employees want clearer policies on how AI may affect job roles, along with commitments to retraining and protecting workers' rights.

As Amazon accelerates integration of generative AI across e-commerce, cloud services and warehouse operations, the internal pushback underscores a growing divide between corporate strategy and employee anxieties. Workers say AI innovation is inevitable—but warn that without meaningful safeguards, its consequences could be far-reaching and irreversible.

## Apple Watch Rolls Out Hypertension Alerts for Users in India

Apple has introduced a new hypertension notifications feature for Apple Watch users in India, aiming to help identify signs of chronic high blood pressure in people who may not know they have the condition. The feature analyzes 30 days of PPG (photoplethysmography) sensor data using machine learning and is designed specifically for users without a prior hypertension diagnosis.

Unlike a traditional blood pressure monitor, the Apple Watch does not measure blood pressure directly or show BP readings. Instead, it looks for long-term patterns linked to chronic hypertension and alerts eligible users—those over 22, not pregnant, and undiagnosed—if concerning trends emerge. Once enabled through the Watch or Health app, the feature runs automatically in the background.

Dr. Adam Phillips, a cardiologist at Apple involved in developing


the feature, said it is built on three principles: scientific valida-

tion, actionable insights, and privacy. Apple used data from

dated it on 2,229 adults. In testing, it achieved 41.2% sensitivity in detecting hypertension and 92.3% specificity in identifying users without it—performance comparable to clinical BP cuffs.

The feature works on Apple Watch Series 9, 10, 11, Ultra 2, and Ultra 3. If a user receives a notification, Apple recommends logging blood pressure for seven days using a certified external BP cuff. Reports generated through the Health app can be shared with doctors via email, messaging apps, or WhatsApp.

Hypertension affects 1.3 billion people worldwide, with nearly half going undiagnosed. Apple says its goal is to help this large population get early alerts that can encourage timely medical evaluation and prevent complications such as heart attacks, stroke, and kidney disease.



## Russian Firm Claims Neurochip Can Turn Pigeons Into Human-Controlled Drones

A Russian neurotechnology company, Neiry, has announced that it is developing a system that can turn real birds—starting with pigeons—into remotely operated "biodrones." According to a translated post from the company, its implanted neurochip allows an operator to control the bird's flight by uploading tasks, similar to programming conventional unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs).

Unlike trained messenger birds, Neiry claims its biodrones require no training at all. After surgery, the bird can reportedly be guided through brain stimulation. By activating specific neural regions, researchers say they can create an impulse that makes the bird "want" to fly in the commanded direction.

The company argues that using live birds offers significant advantages. Pigeons can naturally navigate complex urban environments and have better endurance than many mechanical drones. Neiry also asserts that the risk of operational failure is equivalent to the normal chances of a bird falling mid-flight.

The biodrone system involves implanted electrodes, a back-mounted stimulator, and a remote controller that sends directional cues. A GPS receiver tracks the bird's location in real time. Neiry claims that operators can manage entire flocks, up-

dating flight paths through the neural interface. A pigeon equipped as a PJN-1 biodrone can reportedly fly up to 310 miles in a day, and with adequate sunlight for the on-board power system, nearly 1,850 miles in a week. Founder Alexander Panov

says the company plans to expand the technology to other species: ravens for heavier payloads, gulls for coastal monitoring, and albatrosses for long-range ocean surveillance.

Neiry states that the project is in its final testing



## AI Firms Fall Short of Global Safety Standards: Study



A new report from the Future of Life Institute (FLI) has found that the safety practices of leading artificial intelligence companies, including Anthropic, OpenAI, xAI and Meta, remain far below emerging global standards. The findings were released in the latest edition of FLI's AI Safety

Index on Wednesday.

The independent expert panel that evaluated these companies concluded that, despite rapid efforts to build increasingly powerful and potentially superintelligent AI systems, none of the firms has developed a robust, reliable framework to control or align such ad-

vanced technologies. The report warns that safety measures are not keeping pace with the accelerating AI race.

The study comes at a time of growing public anxiety over the societal impacts of smarter-than-human systems. Recent incidents link-

ing AI chatbots to self-harm and suicide cases have intensified scrutiny. Concerns have also risen around AI-powered hacking, manipulation, and psychological harm.

Max Tegmark, MIT professor and president of FLI, criticized the regulatory vacuum surrounding AI development. "Despite recent up-

roar over AI-powered hacking and AI driving people to psychosis and self-harm, US AI companies remain less regulated than restaurants and continue lobbying against binding safety standards," he said.

While governments worldwide are exploring guardrails for advanced AI, the tech industry continues its rapid expansion. Major companies are investing hundreds of billions of dollars to scale up machine learning infrastructure, signaling no slowdown in the competitive push toward superintelligence.

FLI—founded in 2014 and initially supported by Elon Musk—has long warned about the existential risks posed by uncontrolled AI. Just this October, a group of prominent scientists including Geoffrey Hinton and Yoshua Bengio called for a moratorium on developing superintelligent AI until stronger public oversight and scientific understanding are in place.

The institute argues that without stringent safety standards, the gap between AI capabilities and governance will continue to widen, increasing the risk of real-world harm.


