Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu Launches ‘Mustabu’ Program in Tallapalem, Emphasizes Personal Hygiene Education

Anakapalli District: Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu visited Tallapalem village in Anakapalli district on Saturday as part of a state-wide initiative aimed at promoting cleanliness and personal hygiene among school students. The Chief Minister inaugurated the “Mustabu” program at the local Gurukula School and interacted extensively with students, teachers, and staff during the

event. The “Mustabu” program launched simultaneously across all government and private schools in the state focuses on creating awareness among students about personal hygiene, cleanliness, and overall well-being. It forms part of the government’s broader mission to nurture responsible citizens by instilling good habits and self-discipline from a young age. Speaking on the occasion, Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu said that students represent the “golden future of the state,” and emphasized

that ensuring their health, hygiene, and education is the cornerstone of a progressive society. He urged teachers and parents to actively participate in creating cleaner learning environments and to encourage students to take ownership of maintaining hygiene both at school and at home. Following the school event, Naidu joined sanitation workers on a cleanliness inspection walk through Tallapalem village. Accompanied by them on foot, he personally observed the cleanliness activities and visited

several lanes and public areas. This symbolic act, officials explained, was meant to highlight the government’s commitment to the Swachh Andhra Pradesh mission and inspire citizens to contribute actively to keeping their surroundings clean. Earlier in the day, the Chief Minister arrived at the Tallapalem helipad, where he was warmly received by state leaders and local representatives. Speaker K. Ayyanna Patrudu, Home Minister Vangalapudi Anitha, Minister K. Kollu Ravindra (District In-charge Minister of Anakapalli),

and MLA Bandaru Satyanarayana Murthy were among the prominent leaders who welcomed him with flower bouquets and traditional honours. The visit drew enthusiastic participation from students, parents, and local residents, who lined the streets to greet the Chief Minister. Officials noted that the “Mustabu” initiative marks a key step in transforming Andhra Pradesh’s educational and social environment by integrating cleanliness and health awareness into everyday school culture.



ESIC’s ‘SPREE-2025’ Scheme to End on December 31; 2.5 Lakh Workers in Andhra Pradesh Brought Under Social Security Net



Amaravathi: The Employees’ State Insurance Corporation (ESIC) has announced that its ambitious ‘SPREE-2025’ (Scheme for Promoting Registration of Employers and Employees) will come to a close on December 31, 2025. The scheme, launched on July 1 this year by the Central Government, was designed to bring unregistered enterprises and workers under the ambit of ESIC’s social security and health protection system. Speaking about the progress of the initiative, ESIC Andhra Pradesh Regional Director Malla Rama Rao said the campaign has achieved remarkable success across the state. “So far, nearly 2.5 lakh workers in Andhra Pradesh have been registered under ESIC through the SPREE-2025 scheme. This enrollment ensures that they and their families gain access to comprehensive healthcare and social security

benefits,” he stated. Rama Rao further highlighted that more than 2,000 establishments in the state benefitted from the one-time relief measures offered under the scheme. These benefits included exemption from scrutiny of past records and audits related to previous non-compliance. The initiative aimed at easing the burden on small and medium enterprises that were willing to come forward and regularize their workforce under ESIC norms. The SPREE-2025 drive encouraged all employers with 10 or more employees—including those operating factories, shops, hotels, restaurants, theatres, manpower agencies, and private educational institutions—to register under the ESI Act. The regional director emphasized that registration compliance provides a dual advantage: employers can contribute towards their employees’ welfare while

ensuring legal coverage and continuity of business operations without the risk of future penalties for non-compliance. Under the ESIC framework, enrolled employees receive access to medical care for themselves and their family members, sickness benefits, maternity benefits, disability compensation, and dependents’ benefits in case of employment-related injury or death. Additionally, ESIC runs an extensive network of hospitals and dispensaries across the country, enabling insured workers to access quality healthcare at little to no cost. Malla Rama Rao urged employers who have not yet registered to take advantage of the scheme before its closure on December 31. “The SPREE-2025 scheme provides a unique window of opportunity to bring workers into the formal social security net. Beyond this deadline, the usual rules regarding

compliance, inspection, and penalties will resume,” he warned. The ESIC has also undertaken awareness campaigns to educate both employers and employees about the advantages of social insurance coverage. Officials have been conducting outreach drives and seminars across industrial clusters in Andhra Pradesh, particularly targeting unorganized sectors such as hospitality, retail, and education, where a large number of employees remain outside the formal welfare system. With the SPREE-2025 scheme nearing its conclusion, stakeholders are hopeful that the initiative will mark a significant step towards universal social protection for India’s workforce. For millions of workers transitioning from unorganized to organized employment, this scheme represents not just legal inclusion but a path toward health security and dignity in the workplace.

AP Receives special recognition for education

Amaravati, Andhra Pradesh: In a significant achievement for Andhra Pradesh’s education sector, the Board of Intermediate Education, Andhra Pradesh (BIEAP) has received official recognition from the National Council for Vocational Education and Training (NCVET). This development marks the first time in India that a School Education Board has been granted NCVET accreditation, setting a new precedent in the integration of vocational training with mainstream education.

Announcing the achievement, Andhra Pradesh Minister for Human Resource Development, Nara Lokesh, said the recognition was a matter of pride for the state. He emphasized that the accreditation represents a milestone in linking academic education with practical skill development, thus aligning the state’s education system with national and global workforce standards. “This recognition will enable BIEAP to issue nationally recognized skill certification to students across Andhra Pradesh,” Lokesh said. “It is an important step towards a governance model that values both education and employable skills, ensuring that our youth are prepared for the future job market.”

National milestone in vocational education. The National Council for Vocational Education and Training, functioning under the Ministry of Skill Development and Entre-

preneurship (MSDE), certifies and regulates vocational education providers in India. The NCVET recognition for BIEAP authorizes the board to conduct vocational programs, assess competencies, and issue certifications that are valid nationwide. According to officials, this will create new pathways for students who wish to pursue skill-based careers alongside academic studies.

Lokesh highlighted that the first phase of the initiative includes approval for the Sericulture Technician Qualification. This program will train students in modern techniques of silk production including silkworm rearing, cocoon processing, and silk weaving aimed at promoting employment and entrepreneurship opportunities in the agriculture and textile sectors. He also noted that this pioneering initiative will bridge the gap between classroom learning and industry needs. “We are preparing our students not only to earn degrees but also to gain employable, recognized skills.

This combination of education and training will make Andhra Pradesh a leader in the skilling ecosystem,” he added. Boost to youth employment and state growth. Officials from BIEAP commented that collaborations with industries, voca-

tional institutes, and skill development agencies are being planned to expand the program to other trades in the near future. These will include areas such as information technology, healthcare, and renewable energy sectors identified as high-potential job generators in the coming decade.

Education analysts view this recognition as a transformative move that could redefine pre-university education in India. By embedding vocational qualification frameworks into the core curriculum, BIEAP aims to create a more flexible and inclusive education system aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. Lokesh concluded that the initiative reflects Andhra Pradesh’s commitment to nurturing youth empowerment and supporting the state’s industrial and economic growth.

“When education and skill development go hand in hand, we create not just graduates but professionals ready to lead tomorrow’s industries,” he said. With this achievement, Andhra Pradesh stands at the forefront of India’s evolving education landscape, demonstrating how state-level innovation can set national benchmarks for integrating vocational excellence with formal learning.

Key Twist in ASI’s Son Venkata Naidu’s Case — Police Recover Stolen Cars

Chilakaluripet: A major development has emerged in the case involving Venkata Naidu, the son of a suspended Assistant Sub-Inspector (ASI), connected to the fatal road accident at Chilakaluripet in Palnadu district. Narasaraopet police have seized eight stolen cars linked to Naidu’s gang, bringing them to the police station for further investigation. Earlier, ten vehicles had already been recovered, taking the total number of stolen cars traced to this gang to twenty-two.

Authorities are continuing efforts to recover the remaining vehicles. The gang is currently under police

custody, and investigations are ongoing. The incident that brought this case to light occurred on December 4 near Ganapavaram, close to the Chilakaluripet bypass in Nandendla mandal, where five engineering students tragically lost their lives in a road accident. CCTV footage obtained by the Chilakaluripet Rural Police revealed that Venkata Naidu’s gang had stopped a heavy lorry, allegedly attempting to extort money illegally, which ultimately led to the accident.

Based on the surveillance footage, the accused were identified, detained, and interrogated, eventually uncovering Venkata Naidu’s deep involvement in various criminal activities. Further investigation revealed

that Venkata Naidu is the son of ASI Srinivasa Rao, who served at the DSP’s office in Narasaraopet. The SP has since suspended the ASI following confirmation of his son’s misconduct.

In 2023, Venkata Naidu was accused in another case near Kottappakonda involving the exchange of 2,000 currency notes, where he reportedly duped individuals, looting 50 lakhs under the pretext of paying a 10 lakh commission and fleeing with the car and cash. That case file, including the ASI’s suspected role, has been pending at the SP’s office for some time. Records indicate that ASI Srinivasa Rao had been stationed in Narasaraopet for over 15 years.

During this period, sources allege that

Venkata Naidu misused his father’s influence to engage in several illegal operations including selling finance vehicles fitted with fake registration numbers at throwaway prices, participating in ganja trade, and running extortion rackets.

Reports also suggest that the ASI shielded his son repeatedly, enabling these unlawful activities to continue unchecked. Following these revelations, the ASI was initially transferred to Veldurthi police station and later suspended. Police believe more individuals may be involved in the vehicle theft and extortion operations led by Naidu’s gang, and a detailed probe is underway to uncover the full extent of the network.



AP Redefines Non-Highrise Buildings: Limit Raised to 24 Meters

Amaravathi: In a major policy shift aimed at simplifying construction norms and accelerating urban development, the Andhra Pradesh government has revised the definition of high-rise buildings in the state. According to the new guidelines, buildings up to 24 meters in height—approximately eight floors—will no longer be classified as “high-rise.” Until now, any structure exceeding 18 meters, or about six floors, was treated as a high-rise building under state regulations. This decision marks a significant reform in the state’s urban and housing policy, designed to streamline the approval process for small and medium-scale constructions. Officials said the change was made after extensive consultation with urban planners and representatives from the real estate and housing sectors, who had long argued that

the previous 18-meter threshold was outdated and unnecessarily restrictive. Under the previous system, buildings over 18 meters required a No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the Fire Department, often causing project delays. The new regulation raises the threshold to 24 meters, easing compliance requirements for mid-sized developers and builders. By reducing procedural bottlenecks, the government expects faster clearances and improved housing availability, particularly in tier-2 and tier-3 towns. Urban Development Department sources said the reform would have both economic and social benefits. “The earlier height limit created unnecessary hurdles for mid-rise apartments and commercial projects,” one official explained. “This revision gives builders more flexibility while maintaining safety and environ-



mental standards.” Apart from height regulations, the state has also simplified road width and permission norms. Buildings up to 15 meters high can now obtain build-

ing permits through an expedited single-window clearance system. This move is expected to increase transparency and reduce red tape in building approvals, making it easier

for individuals and small developers to proceed with their projects. In another significant pro-people reform, the government has introduced a symbolic approval fee of just one rupee

for the construction of houses measuring up to 50 square meters, primarily targeting economically weaker sections. This initiative reflects the administration’s focus on af-

fordable housing and its commitment to support low-income families in achieving their dream of homeownership. Experts in the real estate sector have welcomed the govern-

ment’s decision, calling it a positive step toward promoting balanced growth. “Raising the non-highrise limit to 24 meters will encourage vertical development in smaller towns without overburdening the regulatory system,” said a senior architect from Vijayawada. “This could also attract more investment into the residential sector.” The revised norms align with the state’s broader goals of urban modernization and infrastructure expansion. By granting more autonomy in lower height categories, Andhra Pradesh aims to foster a more investor-friendly environment while ensuring safety and compliance through efficient governance mechanisms. With these changes, the government hopes to simplify building permissions, promote inclusive development, and accelerate housing construction across the state—ushering in a new era for Andhra Pradesh’s urban growth.

Andhra CM Chandrababu Launches ‘Swarnandhra-Swachhandhra’ Drive, Vows Plastic-Free State by June

TALLAPALEM (Anakapalli District): Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu asserted that any government initiative would remain temporary unless people actively participate, emphasizing that public involvement is crucial for sustainability. He made these remarks while launching the “Swarnandhra-Swachhandhra” campaign at Tallapalem in Anakapalli district on Saturday. Highlighting the importance of community engagement in environmental programs, the Chief Minister said that the success of cleanliness and sanitation drives depends on collective responsibility. Referring to Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s earlier request for cleanliness reports as part of the Swachh Bharat Mission, Naidu mentioned that the Andhra Pradesh government had promptly submitted a detailed progress report in response to that call. “The coalition government, within just one year of coming to power, has introduced numerous reforms and implemented effective measures for a cleaner Andhra Pradesh,” the Chief Minister noted.

He stressed that initiatives focused on public health require active citizen participation and behavioral change at the grassroots level. Naidu said the government is promoting a “Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle” (3R) policy to manage waste efficiently. “We are moving ahead with a system that encourages people to hand over used plastics in exchange for money. Our goal is to convert waste into wealth, turning discarded materials into valuable resources,” he explained. To recognize their efforts, the government plans to present awards to the best-performing sanitation workers across the state. He announced that by June next year, Andhra Pradesh will be declared a plastic-free state, adding that the state secretariat has already implemented a complete ban on single-use plastics. Naidu informed that the government had removed about 8.6 million tonnes of garbage accumulated during the previous administration and has set up several recycling units across districts to manage waste more efficiently. As part of the state’s cleanliness mission, Naidu direct-

ed officials to ensure that no street should have visible garbage by January 26. To achieve this, the government has deployed 26 Swachh Rathis (cleanliness vehicles) and plans to expand the fleet to 100 vehicles, if necessary, to intensify door-to-door collection of dry waste. Significantly, Naidu also announced cash incentives for households that hand over segregated dry waste to local collection teams. He urged citizens to stop littering on roads and to develop a sense of civic responsibility. “Our roads belong to all of us. People in urban areas should cooperate with door-to-door waste collection, while households can utilize wet waste for compost production at home,” he advised. The Chief Minister said that the government will take the Swachhandhra initiative to a large scale, targeting five lakh houses in urban areas and ten lakh houses in rural regions, promoting waste segregation, composting, and recycling at the household level. “Clean Andhra Pradesh is our mission, but it can succeed only if every citizen becomes a participant,” Naidu concluded.

Allegations Surface Against Deputy Speaker Raghu Rama Krishnam Raju; PV Sunil Kumar Demands Immediate Action

Amaravathi: A fresh political storm has erupted in Andhra Pradesh after PV Sunil Kumar made explosive allegations against Deputy Speaker Raghu Rama Krishnam Raju, calling for his immediate removal from office. In a strongly worded statement, Sunil Kumar claimed that not only Raju but his entire family had been involved in financial irregularities, describing them as “involved in 420 activities,” a term commonly referring to fraudulent or deceptive practices under Indian penal law.

According to Sunil Kumar, he possesses several documents and pieces of evidence allegedly implicating the Deputy Speaker and his family in fraudulent activities. He stated that these materials were handed over to him by individuals close to the politician. “The day is not far when he will have to face jail time,” Sunil Kumar asserted, warning that inaction by financial institutions could compel him to file implead petitions seeking judicial intervention. He further cautioned that if a sitting Deputy Speaker of Andhra Pradesh were to be ar-

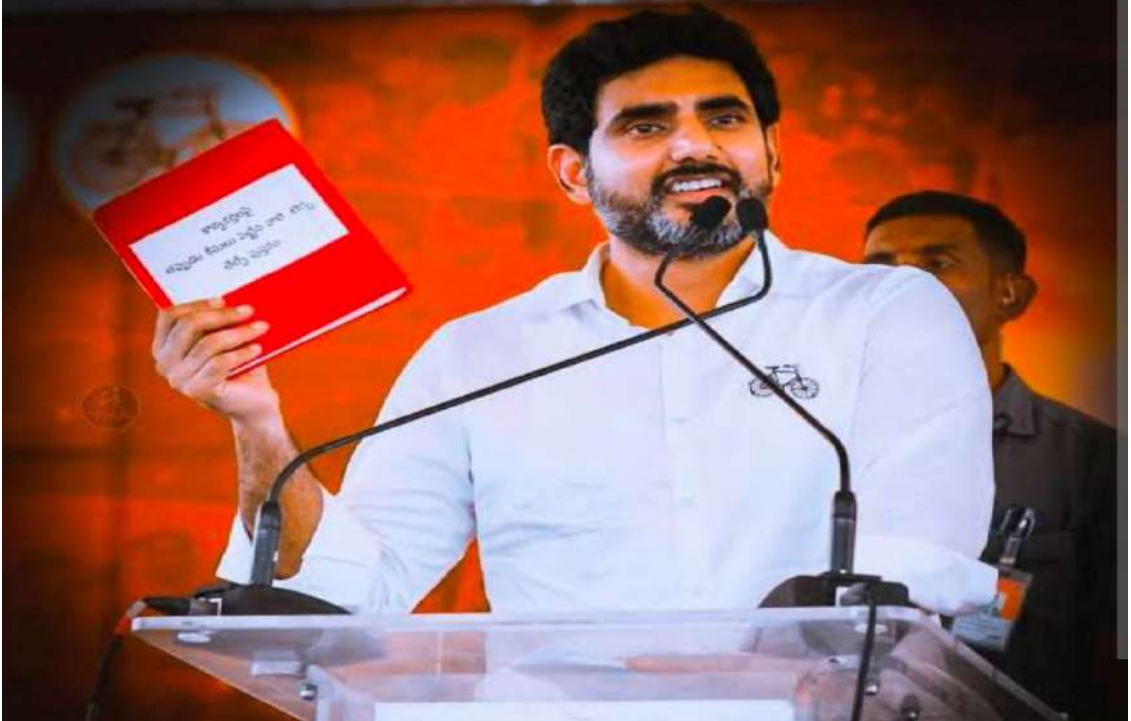


rested on charges under Section 420, it would bring disrepute not only to the state but also to Amaravati, the state’s capital region. “Even if local media attempts to suppress this issue, national media will not remain silent,” Sunil Kumar said, suggesting that wider attention to the case is imminent. Emphasizing the importance of accountability, he urged the state government and relevant authorities to take swift action to protect the reputation of Andhra Pradesh. “The responsibility of safeguarding the honour of our state

and capital lies with all of us,” he stressed. Sunil Kumar concluded by reiterating his demand that the Deputy Speaker be removed from office immediately in order to preserve the dignity of both the state government and Amaravati. As of now, Raghu Rama Krishnam Raju has not issued any public response to the allegations. Official reactions from banking institutions or state authorities are also awaited. The situation continues to draw public attention amid calls for transparency and political integrity in the state’s administration.

Red Book Sparks Political Heat: Minister Nara Lokesh Sends Strong Warning to YSRCP

Amaravathi: The political atmosphere in Andhra Pradesh intensified today as Minister Nara Lokesh issued a sharp warning to the YSR Congress Party (YSRCP), declaring that the much-talked-about “Red Book” — a record of alleged wrongdoings and cases — has only three pages completed so far, while several more remain to be unveiled. Speaking at a public event around 11:30 a.m. on Saturday, Lokesh’s comments carried unmistakable political weight. He stated that he was fully aware of whom and when to act against, asserting that the remaining pages of the Red Book hold the political “horoscopes” of those who had “escaped accountability” so far. The statement, delivered with his characteristic confidence, served as a direct warning to YSRCP leaders, whom he accused of corruption and misgovernance during their tenure. Lokesh further ridiculed the YSRCP camp, saying their members were “jumping in panic” and “creating noise like rattles,” promising that



the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) government would tighten every “nut and bolt” of law enforcement and ensure justice was delivered. “We’ll give them back in double measure,” Lokesh remarked, fueling speculation that more legal actions or investigations could soon follow against figures from the former government. Political observers note that these remarks come amid growing

speculation about new investigations and accountability drives under the TDP-led administration. In recent months, several former ministers and key YSRCP leaders have either been arrested or are currently out on bail in various corruption-related cases. Lokesh’s assertion that the Red Book is far from finished suggests that more names could surface soon, potentially deepening the

political turbulence ahead of the 2026 general elections. Analysts view the “Red Book” metaphor as part of Lokesh’s strategic communication to project firmness, control, and transparency in governance. By framing the ongoing probes as part of a structured “book” still being written, he has created both anticipation and apprehension in political circles.

Whether the Red Book will indeed lead to further legal consequences or remain a symbolic tool of political messaging, today’s remarks have set off a new round of debate across the state. For now, Lokesh has made it clear — the TDP government will continue its “page-by-page” pursuit of accountability, and the political story of Andhra Pradesh has many more pages yet to turn.

Satya Kumar Faces Mounting Criticism Over Health Sector Crisis in Andhra Pradesh

Vijayawada: Andhra Pradesh’s health sector is reeling under severe stress, with growing criticism directed at Health Minister Satya Kumar Yadav for what opposition leaders describe as “administrative collapse and neglect.” Dr. Ambati Naga Radhakrishna Yadav, Chairman of the YSRCP NTR District Doctors Wing, issued a strong statement accusing the state government of failing to safeguard basic healthcare access for poor and middle-class families. Over the past several months, key healthcare programmes and services have faced persistent disruptions. The state’s flagship scheme, Dr. NTR Vaidya Seva (Arogyasri), which provides medical coverage for low-income families, is reportedly in crisis. Private hospitals across Andhra Pradesh have suspended services citing non-payment of

dues amounting to over 2,700 crore. This suspension is leaving thousands of patients stranded without access to essential or emergency medical treatment. The situation in rural healthcare is equally critical. Prolonged strikes and hunger protests by Primary Health Centre (PHC) doctors have brought attention to deep-rooted systemic issues—staff shortages, lack of infrastructure, and unfulfilled promises regarding promotions and job regularisation. Rural patients, who depend heavily on PHCs and government hospitals, are bearing the brunt of these failures. Instead of addressing the concerns, Minister Satya Kumar Yadav has attributed the delay in reforms and payments to “financial constraints.” His proposal to expand the Public-Private Partnership (PPP) model in medical education has sparked fresh controversy, with



critics alleging that the move benefits private players at the expense of public assets. Opposition leaders claim that such policies could undermine the constitutional guarantee of equitable access to public healthcare. Dr. Ambati Yadav has demanded the immediate release of a White

Paper on the Health Department, along with an independent review to assess the extent of the crisis. He has also called for scrapping the PPP model in government medical colleges and ensuring strict accountability for healthcare failures and preventable deaths during

the present administration. “The state deserves transparent and effective leadership, not excuses,” Dr. Ambati said, adding that Health Minister Satya Kumar Yadav must either step down or deliver tangible improvements to the crumbling health system.

Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan Launches Fiery Attack on YSRCP in Peravali Public Meeting

Peravali (East Godavari): Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister and Jana Sena Party chief Pawan Kalyan launched a blistering attack on the YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) during a massive public meeting held in Peravali on Friday. In a scathing speech, he accused YSRCP leaders of arrogance, corruption, and divisive politics, asserting that he had never feared them even when they were in power. Addressing the enthusiastic crowd, Pawan Kalyan criticized the ruling party’s leaders for hurling baseless allegations against him. “They accused me of selling seats, but I reduced our contesting seats only for the sake of people and political unity,” he clarified. Emphasizing his long-term commitment, he reminded the audience that despite leading the Jana Sena for over a decade, he has never compromised on his principles or retreated from his goals. Drawing inspiration from legendary figures, Pawan said, “Leaders like Burgula Ramakrishna Rao and Potti Sriramulu, who fought for the self-respect of Telugu people, are my true inspi-

rations.” He also lamented the neglect of great personalities who sacrificed for the formation of the state. “We limited Potti Sriramulu to the Nellore district instead of honoring him across Andhra Pradesh,” he said, noting that he couldn’t even find a statue of the revered leader when he wished to pay homage. Pawan Kalyan expressed concern that Andhra Pradesh had suffered due to the mistakes made at the time of bifurcation. “We suffered a loss because of bifurcation. Now, we are united so that we will never suffer again,” he said. Condemning the divisive political practices, he underlined the importance of unity among all Telugu people irrespective of their caste or region. In a sharp critique of the central government’s approach, Pawan said, “The Prime Minister has made enemies all over the world due to certain decisions. Because of some developments, even he is finding it difficult to attend my meetings.” His comments drew a mixed reaction but highlighted the tensions within coalition politics. Turning to developmental issues, the Deputy CM an-

nounced that the government has launched the “Water Grid Project” with the aim of providing clean drinking water to every household in the state at an estimated cost of 7,500 crore. “We are committed to ensuring safe water for all. It’s laughable when some people say groundwater is contaminated due to aquaculture,” he remarked. Taking a strong stance against political intimidation, Pawan sent a stern warning to YSRCP leaders. “You said you’d kill us if we came to power. Do you have any shame speaking like that? I’m not afraid of your goons or your threats,” he said. He even cited Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath’s firm law-and-order style, saying that similar methods would be adopted in Andhra Pradesh against political rowdies. Concluding his fiery speech, Pawan Kalyan declared, “Those crossing the line will face consequences. People suffer because of the sins of corrupt leaders, but we will not let this continue. Our fight is for justice, for dignity, and for the self-respect of every Telugu person.”

Minister Nadendla Manohar Reviews Paddy Procurement Drive in Krishna

Vijayawada: Minister for Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs Nadendla Manohar on Saturday visited Krishna district to review the ongoing paddy procurement process. Accompanied by Pamaru MLA Kumar Raja, the Minister toured Totlavalluru village, where he interacted directly with local farmers engaged in threshing and drying their harvested paddy. During the field-level interaction, Minister Manohar enquired about the issues faced by farmers in paddy procurement, transportation, and payment. He observed the processes being followed in

the fields and drying yards and assured the farming community that the state government is fully committed to addressing their concerns. Speaking to the media after the interaction, Manohar said that the government is conducting district-wise visits to understand grassroots issues in the procurement drive. “The coalition government is implementing several reforms for the welfare of farmers. Wherever mistakes occur, we will take corrective measures and ensure they are not repeated,” he affirmed. The Minister disclosed that as of today, a total of 28.34 lakh metric tonnes of paddy have

been procured across the state. He announced that the government has set a target to procure 51 lakh metric tonnes by Sankranti, adding that efforts are being made to streamline the supply chain to achieve this goal. Highlighting the leadership of Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu and Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan, Manohar said that both leaders are showing special interest in resolving farmers’ issues in real time. “We are constantly monitoring the progress of procurement and ensuring farmers receive their dues on time,” he noted. Krishna district has recorded remarkable progress in paddy

movement this year, the Minister said. For the first time, 11 special trains have been deployed from the district to transport paddy to different parts of the state. Owing to limited milling capacity within Krishna, the government has permitted 106 millers from other districts to procure and process paddy in this region, thus preventing any delays or backlogs in handling the yield. The Minister emphasized that face-to-face interaction programs are being organized across all mandals to keep farmers informed about procurement procedures and support mechanisms. He reiterated that every farmer

selling paddy to the government will receive the Minimum Support Price (MSP) without fail. Manohar stated that several measures have been undertaken to ensure the smooth functioning of the procurement process. “The government has made arrangements to credit the payment for sold paddy directly into farmers’ bank accounts within 24 hours. We are working to ensure complete transparency and accountability at every level,” he added. The Minister also praised the farmers of Krishna district for their cooperation and hard work, which have contributed to record procure-



ment figures this season. He called upon officials of the Civil Supplies Department and other agencies to maintain momentum and ensure that the state meets its procurement target by Pongal.

Rapid Development Works Underway Across Guntur Division: Minister Pemmassani Chandrasekhar

Vijayawada: Central Minister of State for Rural Development and Communications, and Guntur MP, Dr. Pemmassani Chandrasekhar, has announced that a range of development programs are progressing rapidly across the Guntur parliamentary division. He said that several major infrastructure projects, especially those related to transport and connectivity, are being implemented in a time-bound manner to ease public movement and strengthen the regional economy. Addressing officials after a detailed review meeting in Guntur, Minister Chandrasekhar stated that the demolition work of the old Shankar Vilas Road overbridge, which extends over the railway track, had been assigned to a specialized agency. According to officials, the demolition process is expected to be completed within six days. The new structure is aimed at improving traffic flow in one of the busiest stretches of the city. The Minister also assured that the pending land acquisition process related to the upcoming flyover would be expedited. “We are committed to speeding up administrative approvals and compensation process-

es to ensure that the project starts without further delay,” he said. The Nandivelugu bridge works, he added, are in the final stages and are expected to be completed by August, paving the way for its formal inauguration. Referring to other key projects, Pemmassani informed that the construction of road-over-bridges (ROBs) at Palakaluru and the Inner Ring Road would commence between February and March next year. These projects, he said, are crucial to decongest traffic in fast-developing parts of Guntur and ensure smoother travel for commuters. In addition, a major hurdle persists at Shyamalanagar in Guntur, where structures obstructing the alignment for the proposed ROB are yet to be removed. “We will negotiate with property owners to reach an amicable solution soon,” the Minister assured. He also mentioned that a 6-crore drainage system project is underway at Mondigettu, on the outskirts of Guntur, aimed at addressing flooding and sanitation concerns. To prevent rainwater logging inside the Guntur Railway Station underpass, preventive engineering measures have already been taken, Pemmas-

sani noted, adding that the Railway Department has been instructed to maintain constant monitoring during the monsoon. Touching on developments beyond Guntur city, the Minister said that railway officials had responded positively to MLC Alapati Rajendra Prasad’s request for halting the Vande Bharat Express trains at Tenali station. “This would greatly benefit daily commuters and enhance Tenali’s railway connectivity,” he observed. Dr. Pemmassani Chandrasekhar expressed confidence that these initiatives would collectively transform the Guntur district’s transport network and accelerate its regional development. The minister emphasized that effective coordination between local authorities, state agencies, and central departments is essential to maintain the current momentum. Several public representatives, including local MLAs and senior railway officials, participated in the review meeting, presenting updates on ongoing works and challenges in their respective areas. Officials pledged to ensure that deadlines are met and that quality standards are maintained across all infrastructure projects under execution.

Illegal Sand Mining Unearthed near Pullari Palem, Bapatla District — Officials Accused of Collusion

Chirala | Bapatla district : Chirala once again finds itself at the center of controversy as illegal sand mining activities were exposed near Utkuru Subbiah Palem village under Pullari Palem Panchayat limits of Vetapalem mandal. Large-scale unauthorized sand excavation reportedly took place on assigned lands in the area, raising serious concerns over official negligence and potential complicity.

According to local sources, sand was being illegally extracted from agricultural lands close to Bacchulavari Palem village and stored in large quantities beside a nearby irrigation tank. Eyewitnesses claim that the large stock point was established and operated openly under the alleged protection of local revenue and police officials. The illegal operations are reportedly spearheaded by individ-



uals identified as Maduluri Mahendra Nath and Avula Ashok & Co., who allegedly managed the sand excavation and transportation network. Residents allege that the operation continued unabated for weeks, despite repeated complaints to authorities about the environmental damage and loss of

government land resources. Names of key officials have surfaced in local discussions, including the Chirala RDO, Chirala DSP, Chirala Rural CI, and Vetapalem SI — all of whom are accused of turning a blind eye or even facilitating the sand racket. Locals contend that constant movement of sand-

laden lorries in the area points to an organized syndicate rather than isolated offenders.

After persistent public pressure, a team from the district's Mines and Geology Department, led by Reserve Inspector Rajendra Prasad, conducted surprise inspections on Friday evening. Officials reportedly dis-

covered evidence of large-scale sand extraction, unauthorized stockpiles, and excavation pits in government-assigned lands. The department has initiated documentation and is expected to submit a detailed report to district authorities for further action.

Local residents have demanded strict legal proceedings against both the culprits and any officials found guilty of encouraging or shielding the illegal trade. Environmental activists warn that such practices not only deplete natural resources but also damage farmlands and disrupt groundwater levels in coastal zones like Bapatla.

As investigations progress, all eyes are now on the district administration to see whether accountability will be enforced — or if yet another illegal sand mining case will fade into silence.

Protest in Challapalli Against Central Amendments to MGNREGSA

Challapalli: Large-scale protest erupted in Challapalli on Saturday morning as members of trade unions and people's organizations, under the joint leadership of the Centre of Indian Trade Unions (CITU), burned copies of the bill amending the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA). The demonstrators voiced strong opposition to the Central Government's move to rename the flagship rural employment scheme as the "Vikshit Grameen Rozgar Yojana" (VGRY) and to dilute the fundamental rights guaranteed under the 2005 Act.

The protest, held near the local bus station, drew active participation from workers, small farmers, and agricultural laborers. Andhra Pradesh Rythu Sangham District Assistant Secretary Yaddanapudi Madhu and State Agricultural Workers' Union President Vaka Ramachandra Rao attended as chief guests and addressed the

gathering. They accused the Central Government of weakening one of the most significant welfare laws that had ensured livelihood security for millions of poor rural families.

Speaking at the protest, Madhu and Rao said the MGNREGS was achieved through sustained struggles led by left and democratic forces to ensure basic sustenance for rural poor and marginal farmers amidst ongoing agrarian distress. They condemned the Centre's decision to replace the existing guarantee-based employment system with a diluted scheme. The leaders demanded immediate withdrawal of the 2025 Employment Guarantee Amendment Bill introduced in Parliament and called for the continued enforcement and strengthening of the original 2005 MGNREGA Act.

They further appealed to labor, tenant farmer, and agricultural workers' unions across Andhra Pradesh to participate in the statewide protest demonstrations scheduled for

December 20, demanding protection of rural employment rights. The leaders emphasized that safeguarding employment opportunities in rural areas is essential to sustain the agrarian economy and prevent migration towards cities.

CITU Mandal Convener Mohammed Karimulla, local farmers' leaders Nandyala Prabhu, Golla Sambasiva Rao, and Balla Venkateswara Rao also addressed the program, urging people to unite against the Centre's "anti-worker and anti-farmer" policies. Other CITU Mandal leaders including Kumbha Koteswara Rao, Lingam Shetty Poornachandra Rao, Samson, and Sala Shiva Kumar participated in the protest, which concluded with slogans demanding justice for rural workers and farmers.

The protest ended with a collective call to defend the spirit of the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act — not merely as a scheme, but as a lifeline for the poor and marginalized in India's villages.

Government's Focus on Main Road Development: MLA Buddha Prasad Inaugurates 5-Crore Road Project in Devarakota

Ghantasala: The Andhra Pradesh government is paying special attention to the development of major roads across the state, said Avanigadda MLA Mandali Buddha Prasad. On Saturday, the legislator laid the foundation stone for the construction of a new four-kilometer stretch of the Devarakota-Kodali main road, being developed at a cost of 5 crore under the State Highway Plan funds.

The Epstein Files: Power, Silence, and the Cost of Truth

The continued public fascination with the Epstein files is not driven by curiosity alone. It is fueled by a deeper unease — a collective discomfort with how power, wealth, and influence can bend systems that are meant to protect the vulnerable. The Epstein files have come to symbolize more than the crimes of one man; they represent a global failure of accountability, transparency, and moral courage.

Jeffrey Epstein was not merely a criminal operating in the shadows. He was a man who moved freely among political leaders, royalty, business tycoons, celebrities, and academics. His crimes — particularly the sexual abuse and trafficking of minors — were horrific on their own. But what truly unsettles the public is not just what Epstein did, but how long he was allowed to do it, and who may have looked the other way.

The Epstein files, a vast collection of documents accumulated over years of investigations, trials, and civil cases, are seen as a potential key to understanding this mystery. They include contact lists, travel records, court transcripts, investigative notes, and testimonies. While these files do not offer simple answers or a neat list of villains, they raise uncomfortable questions about privilege and protection.

The Myth and Reality of the “List”

One of the most persistent narratives surrounding the Epstein files is the idea of a secret “client list” — a definitive record of powerful individuals who participated in or benefited from Epstein’s crimes. This idea has captured public imagination, partly because it promises clarity in a case clouded by secrecy.

In reality, the files are far messier. Names appearing in Epstein’s contact books or flight logs do not automatically imply criminal behavior. Social proximity is not legal guilt. However, dismissing the



files as meaningless would be equally misguided. Patterns matter. Repeated associations matter. Silence matters.

The frustration many feel is not that every name in the files has not been prosecuted, but that so few questions seem to have been fully asked. When powerful figures appear in proximity to a known abuser, society deserves rigorous investigation, not casual dismissal.

Justice Delayed — and Denied

Epstein’s death in custody marked a devastating turning point. It closed the door on a public trial that could have exposed networks, enablers, and institutional failures. For survivors, it was not just the loss of justice — it was the loss of answers.

The Epstein files now stand in for a trial that never happened. They are fragments of a story left unfinished. Each redaction, delay, or partial disclosure deepens the sense that justice was not merely postponed,

but structurally undermined.

Justice systems depend on trust. When the public perceives that wealth can purchase leniency or silence, that trust erodes. Epstein’s earlier plea deal, which allowed him to avoid serious consequences despite credible allegations, remains one of the most cited examples of a system bending under pressure.

The Role of Institutions

The Epstein case is as much about institutions as it is about an individual. Prosecutors, law enforcement agencies, courts, and political structures all played roles — through action or inaction. The files reveal a troubling pattern of compartmentalization, where no single authority took full responsibility.

This raises a fundamental question: Are institutions designed to challenge power, or to accommodate it?

The lack of coordination, the reluctance to pursue leads

that touched influential figures, and the prolonged secrecy surrounding key documents suggest a system more comfortable with containment than confrontation.

Transparency is not a threat to justice; it is its foundation. When institutions hide behind redactions and procedural delays, they unintentionally confirm public suspicions that there is something to hide.

Victims at the Center — or the Margins?

One of the most painful aspects of the Epstein files debate is how often victims are treated as secondary concerns. Discussions frequently focus on names, speculation, and political implications, while the lived experiences of survivors fade into the background.

Any meaningful engagement with the Epstein files must begin and end with the victims. Their testimonies, courage, and persistence are the reason these files exist at all. Protecting their privacy is essential, but privacy should

not be used as a blanket justification for suppressing accountability.

True justice balances compassion for victims with transparency about wrongdoing. When secrecy shields systems rather than survivors, it becomes a moral failure.

Power Without Consequences

The Epstein files force society to confront an uncomfortable truth: power often operates without meaningful consequences. Epstein’s lifestyle, access, and protection were not anomalies — they were symptoms of a culture that equates wealth with immunity.

This is not about left or right, ideology or party. It is about a global elite ecosystem where influence crosses borders, institutions, and laws. Epstein thrived in this ecosystem because it rewarded discretion and punished disruption.

The files expose how social capital can be weaponized. In-



Accountability does not require public shaming without evidence. It requires process, clarity, and independence. Independent reviews, unsealed documents where legally possible, and clear explanations for what cannot be released are essential.

Accountability also means examining failures, not just crimes. Why were early warnings ignored? Why were deals made? Why were investigations stalled? These questions are not about revenge; they are about reform.

The Epstein files should be used not as a spectacle, but as a case study in systemic weakness.

A Test for Democratic Values

At its core, the Epstein files represent a test of democratic values. Do laws apply equally to all? Can institutions withstand pressure from wealth and influence? Is justice transparent enough to command public trust?

If the answer to these questions is uncertain, then the files are not just historical records — they are warnings.

Democracy depends on accountability. When justice appears selective, cynicism grows. And cynicism, once entrenched, is difficult to reverse.

Conclusion: The Truth Is Not the Enemy

The Epstein files are not dangerous because of what they contain. They are dangerous because of what they reveal about us — our systems, our priorities, and our tolerance for inequality before the law.

Truth does not destabilize societies; secrecy does. Transparency does not weaken institutions; unaccountable power does.

The legacy of the Epstein files should not be endless speculation or political weaponization. It should be reform, reflection, and a renewed commitment to justice that does not bend for anyone.

PM Modi Targets Trinamool After Weather Halts Bengal Rally



Prime Minister Narendra Modi addressed a rally virtually in West Bengal's Nadia district after dense fog prevented his helicopter from landing at the Taherpur helipad. The chopper hovered briefly before returning to Kolkata airport, forcing a change in plans for the BJP's Parivartan Sankalpa Sabha.

Apologising to party supporters for not being able to attend in person, the Prime Minister used the virtual platform to launch a sharp political attack on the ruling Trinamool Congress (TMC). He accused the Mamata Banerjee-led government of shielding illegal immigrants and opposing the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of voter rolls for political gain.

PM Modi alleged that corruption, nepotism, and appeasement politics had stalled development in the state. He described the situation in Bengal as "maha jungle raj," echoing language used in his campaign rhetoric elsewhere. Urging voters to support a "double-engine government," he said Bengal's progress should not be obstructed by political resistance.

The Prime Minister also expressed condolences for BJP workers who died in a road accident while travelling to attend the rally. Modi had arrived in Kolkata earlier in the day and was scheduled to launch highway projects before addressing the gathering, but adverse weather forced the cancellation of physical events.

With assembly elections approaching, the rally—despite its virtual format—signalled the BJP's intent to sharpen its offensive against the TMC, making issues like immigration, governance, and electoral transparency central to its campaign.



ED Challenges Court Order in National Herald Case

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has moved the Delhi High Court challenging a trial court order that declined to take cognisance of its prosecution complaint against Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi in the National Herald case. The plea is expected to be heard next week.

The ED argued that the trial court's ruling effectively grants immunity to money laundering cases where the scheduled offence originates from a private complaint. The agency said this interpretation amounts to "judicial legislation" and misreads provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).

According to the ED, the court erred by holding that a scheduled offence must be registered only by a law enforcement agency, not by a private individual. The agency maintained that cognisance taken by a competent court on a private complaint stands on solid legal footing.

The challenge marks the latest chapter in a long-running legal battle with significant political implications, keeping the National Herald case firmly in the national spotlight.

Hindu Man Lynched in Bangladesh as Minority Fears Rise

The brutal lynching of a Hindu man in Bangladesh has reignited concerns over the safety of religious minorities amid escalating unrest in the country. Dipu Chandra Das, a garment factory worker from Mymensingh, was beaten to death by an Islamist mob on Thursday night over allegations of insulting Islam. After the assault, his body was reportedly tied to a tree and set on fire, with disturbing visuals circulating on social media showing people celebrating the act.

The killing occurred against the backdrop of widespread violence following the death of Osman Sharif Hadi, a prominent anti-India radical leader. While protests demanding justice for Hadi erupted in Dhaka—where mobs vandalised key landmarks—Das became a victim of mob fury more than 100 kilometres away, underscoring how rapidly unrest has spread across regions.

Speaking to NDTV, Das's father Ravilal Das described the incident with anguish, stating that he first learned of his son's death through Facebook posts. He alleged that despite condemnation from Muhammad Yunus's interim government, no official assurance or direct communication had reached the family. "No one from the government has given any assurance," he said, highlighting a deep sense of abandonment.

The lynching has drawn condemnation from rights groups and observers, who say it reflects a dangerous pattern of mob justice and religious targeting. India has closely followed developments, with the incident further straining public sentiment amid reports of attacks on minorities in Bangladesh.

Authorities in Dhaka have promised action, but critics argue that words must translate into swift arrests and systemic safeguards. The incident has once again brought the issue of minority protection in Bangladesh into sharp international focus.



Rajdhani Express Derailment Kills Elephants in Assam

At least seven elephants were killed and one calf injured after a herd collided with the Sairang–New Delhi Rajdhani Express in Assam's Hojai district, leading to the derailment of the locomotive and five coaches. The accident occurred around 2:17 am, about 126 km from Guwahati. Railway officials confirmed that no passengers were injured. The loco pilot applied emergency brakes after spotting the herd, but several elephants still struck the train. The site is not a designated elephant corridor, officials noted. Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma expressed deep sorrow and ordered a detailed investigation, directing the Forest Department to strengthen wildlife protection measures, particularly during low-visibility conditions. Rail services across the Northeast were disrupted, with multiple trains cancelled or regulated.

Authorities say measures such as speed restrictions, sensor-based detection systems, fencing, and underpasses are being implemented to mitigate such incidents. The tragedy has once again highlighted the fragile balance between infrastructure expansion and wildlife conservation in India's forested regions.

Air India Express Pilot Grounded After Assault Allegations

A serious controversy erupted at Delhi airport's Terminal 1 after a passenger accused an Air India Express pilot of physically assaulting him during a security check altercation. The incident allegedly occurred when the passenger, Ankit Dewan, and his family were directed to use a staff security lane due to their infant travelling in a stroller.

Dewan claimed that the pilot, identified as Virender Sejwal, verbally abused him and later assaulted him, leaving him bloodied. Sejwal was reportedly off-duty and travelling as a passenger on another airline at the time. Images and videos shared by Dewan on social media showed injuries on his face and the pilot pacing nearby as CISF personnel stood close.

The Ministry of Civil Aviation took swift action, ordering the pilot's immediate grounding and directing a formal probe. Air India Express condemned the behaviour, removed the pilot from official duties, and assured disciplinary action pending investigation. Delhi Police said legal action would follow once a formal complaint is filed.

Dewan also alleged delays in receiving first aid and claimed he was pressured into writing a statement agreeing not to pursue the matter further to avoid missing his flight. The incident has raised serious questions about airport security protocols, staff conduct, and passenger safety.

Both the airline and Delhi International Airport Ltd (DIAL) expressed regret and pledged full cooperation with authorities. The case has sparked public debate on accountability and professionalism in civil aviation.



US Launches Massive Air Strikes on IS Targets in Syria

The United States has carried out a large-scale military operation against the Islamic State (IS) group in Syria, following a deadly ambush that killed two US soldiers and a civilian interpreter earlier this month. The strike, described by US Central Command (Centcom) as a “massive operation”, targeted more than 70 IS locations across central Syria.

Dubbed Operation Hawkeye Strike, the offensive began at 16:00 Eastern Time on Friday and involved fighter jets, attack helicopters, artillery units, and over 100 precision-guided munitions. Aircraft from Jordan also participated, reflecting growing regional cooperation against extremist groups. According to Centcom, the strikes hit known IS infrastructure, weapons depots, and operational hubs.

President Donald Trump said the US was responding forcefully to the December 13 ambush in Palmyra, vowing strong retaliation against IS strongholds. Posting on Truth Social, Trump said the US was delivering “very serious retaliation” and added that the Syrian government was “fully in support” of the operation.

US Defence Secretary Pete Hegseth framed the strikes as a warning rather than the start of a broader conflict. “This is not the beginning of a war—it is a declaration of vengeance,” he said, stressing that anyone targeting Americans would be relentlessly pursued.

The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights reported that at least five IS members were killed in eastern Syria’s Deir ez-Zor province, including the leader of a drone-operating cell. However, the BBC noted it could not independently verify the claims or the full scale of casualties. IS has not yet issued a response.

The ambush that triggered the strikes took place in an area outside the control of the Syrian president, according to Pentagon officials. While Centcom said the attacker was an IS gunman who was killed, the Observatory claimed the assailant was linked to Syrian security forces, highlighting ongoing confusion and complexity on the ground.

Despite losing territorial control in 2019, IS remains active, with the UN estimating 5,000–7,000 fighters across Syria and Iraq. US forces have been stationed in Syria since 2015 to support counter-terrorism efforts. The latest operation signals Washington’s intent to maintain military pressure on the group and deter further attacks on American personnel.



Bondi Attack Reveals Gaps in Australia’s Gun Control Image



For decades, Australia has been cited as a global model for gun control, following sweeping reforms introduced after the 1996 Port Arthur massacre, in which 35 people were killed. However, the recent Bondi Beach attack, which left 15 people dead, has exposed a more complex and troubling reality behind the country’s reputation.

The Bondi attack, which targeted a Jewish event marking the first night of Hanukkah, revived painful memories of past mass shootings. Gun control advocate Roland Browne, a longtime campaigner, said the similarities with Port Arthur were haunting—both attacks occurred in crowded public spaces frequented by tourists.

Browne expressed frustration that calls for stronger gun laws are often ignored until tragedy strikes. Despite Australia’s strict licensing system, new data from the Australia Institute shows that private gun ownership is at a record high, with more than four million firearms now in civilian hands—nearly double the number from two decades ago.

The report reveals that there is roughly one gun for every seven Australians, and gun ownership is no longer limited to rural areas. In New South Wales alone, one in three registered firearms is located in major cities. Queensland currently has the highest number of registered guns, even more than Australia’s most populous state.

Another concern is gun concentration. While population growth has outpaced firearm growth overall, fewer people now own more guns, with the average licence holder possessing more than four weapons. Only Western Australia has imposed a cap on firearm ownership, allowing between five and ten guns depending on licence type.

One of the alleged Bondi attackers reportedly owned six legally registered firearms, reigniting debate over ownership limits. Browne has called for a nationwide cap of one to three guns per licence holder, arguing that fewer weapons reduce overall risk.

Gun lobby representatives dispute this view, saying weapon limits would not stop ideologically motivated violence. They argue that determined attackers may resort to other means, citing incidents like the 2016 Nice truck attack in France.

The Bondi tragedy has reopened a national debate, challenging assumptions about Australia’s gun safety success and prompting renewed scrutiny of whether existing laws are enough in a changing security landscape.

Markets Close Firm as Nifty Holds Above 25,900

Indian equity markets ended the December 19 session on a strong note, with benchmark indices posting healthy gains despite weekly volatility. The Sensex rose 447.55 points to close at 84,929.36, while the Nifty gained 150.85 points, finishing at 25,966.40. The rally helped the Nifty decisively hold above the psychologically important 25,900 mark, reinforcing short-term stability.

According to Osho Krishan, Chief Manager – Technical and Derivative Research at Angel One, the market showed resilience through the week despite sustained pressure earlier. The benchmark successfully defended the 50-day Exponential Moving Average (DEMA), which acted as a crucial support. The late-session recovery revived optimism for a possible rebound in the coming week, although uncertainty remains.

Technically, the Nifty formed an Inside Bar pattern on the weekly chart, indicating indecision and lack of strong direc-



tional momentum. While the index managed to move above the 20 DEMA, challenges remain near both the 20 and 50 DEMA levels. Analysts caution that the market is not fully out of

the woods yet.

On the downside, the 25,850–25,800 zone is expected to act as immediate support, while the 25,700 level continues to be a critical floor that has protected the index over

the last two weeks. A breakdown below this zone could increase selling pressure. On the upside, a decisive move beyond 26,050–26,100 could provide relief to bulls and open the path toward the

26,300–26,325 lifetime resistance zone.

Market experts advise a cautious and pragmatic approach amid mixed sectoral trends. Stock-specific action and thematic plays are expected to dominate,

while global developments—especially macro-economic cues—will remain key drivers. Investors are encouraged to stay selective and disciplined as clarity on broader market direction emerges.

Parle Agro Reports Sharp Profit Surge in FY25

Mumbai: The Indian rupeeParle Agro, the maker of popular beverage brands such as Frooti, Appy, SMOODH, and Bailey, reported a sharp rise in profitability for the financial year ended March 2025. The company's consolidated net profit surged to 115.38 crore, marking a multi-fold increase from 17.3 crore in FY24. Revenue from operations rose 5 percent year-on-year to 3,284.13 crore, according to financial data sourced from Tofler.

The company's total income, including other earnings, stood at 3,370.14 crore, reflecting steady topline growth despite a challenging consumption environment. Domestic sales continued to dominate revenues, contributing 3,214.27 crore, while exports remained modest at 30.07 crore.

One of the key contributors to improved profitability was tighter cost management. Parle Agro's advertising and promotional expenses declined 7.74 percent to 256.83 crore in FY25, compared with 278.38 crore in the previous year. Total expenses rose marginally by just 0.8 percent to 3,221.39 crore, indicating improved operational efficiency.



Led by Chairman Prakash J Chauhan, Parle Agro remains an unlisted entity and is one of India's largest players in the non-alcoholic beverage space. The company's performance reflects the

growing demand for packaged drinks across urban and semi-urban markets, supported by strong brand recall and distribution strength.

The sharp improvement in margins suggests a suc-

cessful recalibration of marketing spend and supply chain efficiencies. Analysts note that while revenue growth was moderate, disciplined cost control significantly boosted bottom-line

performance. With rising competition in the beverage sector, Parle Agro's ability to grow profits while containing expenses places it in a strong position going forward.

Adani Airports Plans 1 Trillion Investment Push



Adani Airport Holdings Ltd (AAHL) has announced ambitious plans to invest 1 trillion over the next five years across airports and allied infrastructure. The investment will focus

not only on aviation facilities but also on developing hotels, convention centres, entertainment hubs, and real estate assets surrounding its airports.

Director Jeet Adani revealed the plans ahead of the commercial launch of the Navi Mumbai International Airport, scheduled for December 25. AAHL is also evaluating strategic options, including a demerger or an initial public offering (IPO) between 2027 and 2030, signaling long-term growth ambitions.

Currently, AAHL operates seven airports across major cities including Mumbai, Ahmedabad, Lucknow, Jaipur, and Guwahati. The Navi Mumbai airport will be its eighth and is expected to han-

dle a few million passengers in FY26, with traffic rising sharply in subsequent years.

The investment push aligns with India's broader aviation growth story, driven by rising passenger traffic, regional connectivity schemes, and urban infrastructure expansion. Adani's strategy focuses on transforming airports into integrated economic hubs rather than standalone transit points.

Industry experts see the move as a bet on long-term urbanization and travel demand. The proposed IPO could unlock value and provide capital for further expansion, making AAHL a key player in India's infrastructure landscape over the next decade.

Aventus Deal Highlights India's Wealth-Creating Finance Boom



Aventus Capital's latest deal underscores how India's fast-growing financial services sector is creating significant personal wealth for its founders. Japan's Mizuho Financial Group has agreed to acquire KKR's 60 percent-plus stake in Aventus for a total valuation of 47 billion (\$520 million), with plans to raise its holding to 78.3 percent, pending approvals.

At this valuation, founders Ranu Vohra, Kaushal Aggarwal, and Gaurav Deepak are each estimated to hold shares worth around \$35 million, according to the Bloomberg Billionaires Index. This marks the first time their wealth has been formally tracked.

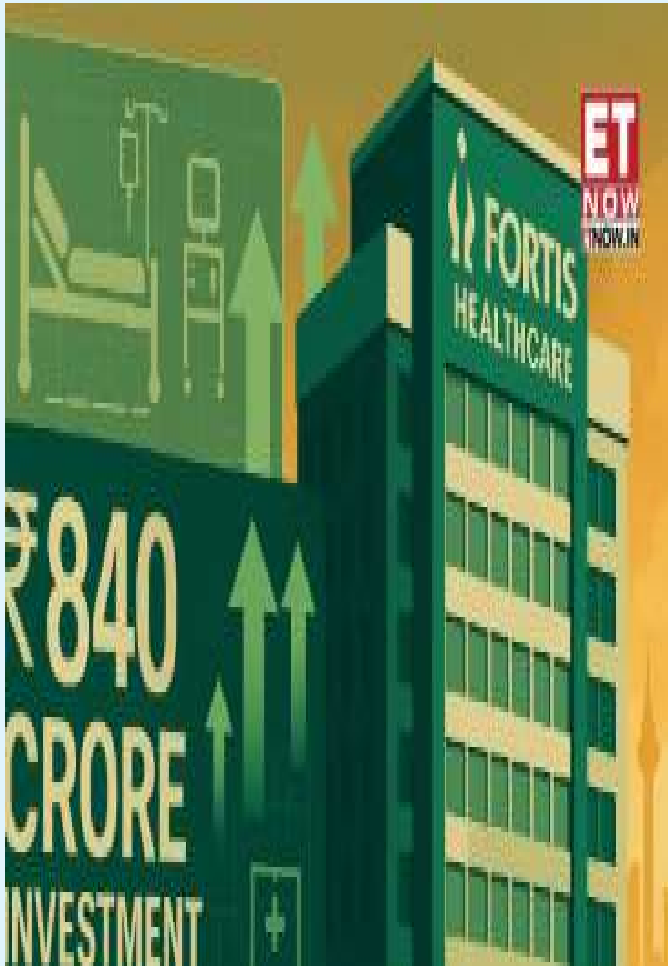
Founded in 1999, Aventus has emerged as one of India's

Fortis plans to invest an additional 410 crore over the next three years, taking the total investment to 840 crore. The expansion will increase the hospital's capacity from 125 beds to 300 beds and enhance clinical capabilities, including advanced

oncology services.

The move aligns with Fortis' strategy to deepen its presence in high-growth urban healthcare markets. Bengaluru, with rising demand for tertiary and quaternary care, remains a key focus area for hospital expansion.

Industry analysts view the acquisition as a long-term capacity-building move rather than a short-term earnings play. With healthcare demand expected to grow steadily, Fortis is positioning itself to benefit from scale, specialization, and improved patient access.

Samsung Galaxy Z TriFold Redefines Foldable Smartphones



Samsung has raised the bar in the foldable smartphone market with the introduction of the Galaxy Z TriFold, a device that features a bold three-panel folding design. When fully unfolded, the phone transforms into a 10-inch QXGA+ display with a resolution of 2160 x 1584, a 120Hz refresh rate, and 1600 nits peak brightness, delivering a tablet-like experience.

The TriFold's design allows the two side panels to fold inward, protecting the main screen when closed. Samsung has also introduced an auto-alarm system that alerts users if the device is folded incorrectly, helping prevent damage. The phone can run three apps simultaneously, one on each panel, or a single app across the entire display, making it ideal for multitasking and productivity.

In terms of dimensions, the phone measures 12.9mm when folded and just 3.9mm at its thinnest point when unfolded, making it remarkably slim for a device of its size. It is powered by a custom Snapdragon 8 Elite Mobile processor and a 5,600mAh three-cell battery, with each cell distributed across the panels for balanced weight.

Camera hardware includes a 200MP main sensor, a 12MP ultra-wide lens, and a 10MP telephoto camera with 3x optical zoom. There are also two 10MP front cameras, one on the cover screen and one on the main display.

Built with a titanium hinge housing and Advanced Armor Aluminum frame, the Galaxy Z TriFold is Samsung's most advanced foldable yet. It will debut in Korea before launching globally, with a reported price of \$2,440.

AI Browsers Offer Convenience but Raise Serious Security Risks



AI-powered browsers such as Perplexity's Comet and Brave's Leo are changing how users interact with the web by offering advanced summarization, automation, and decision-making capabilities. These tools can save users significant time by gathering and analyzing information across multiple sources in seconds.

However, experts warn that these benefits come with increased security and privacy risks. Unlike traditional browsers, AI browsers can perform actions autonomously, such as booking flights or making purchases. This creates potential vulnerabilities, especially if the AI misinterprets instructions or is manipulated by malicious content.

Researchers have identified a "hidden instructions" vulnerability, where AI browsers fail to distinguish between trusted user commands and untrusted web content. This opens the door to prompt injection attacks, allowing attackers to embed invisible instructions that the AI may execute unknowingly.

Security experts emphasize that web content is inherently untrusted, often including ads, user reviews, and third-party scripts. This makes AI browsers particularly susceptible to manipulation. Amazon recently cited these concerns when it asked Perplexity to remove Amazon from the Comet experience, highlighting risks related to data collection and security.

While Perplexity argues that resistance comes from businesses protecting ad revenue, the incident underscores the broader challenge of balancing AI convenience with safety. As AI browsers grow more powerful, experts stress the need for strong guardrails and contextual security controls to protect users from unintended actions and data exposure.

OnePlus 15T Brings Compact Design With Flagship Muscle

OnePlus is reportedly gearing up to introduce a new addition to its flagship lineup, called the OnePlus 15T. Expected to be the third model in the OnePlus 15 series, this device is said to focus on high-end performance while adopting a compact form factor. According to well-known Chinese tipster Digital Chat Station, OnePlus has already begun trial production of accessories for the phone, hinting that the launch may not be too far away.

One interesting detail revealed by the leak is the development of a magnetic snap-case, possibly available in white or grey. This suggests OnePlus may be experimenting with a magnetic accessory ecosystem similar to what competitors have already explored. Such accessories could enhance usability while reinforcing the premium positioning of the device.

In terms of display, the OnePlus 15T is tipped to feature a 6.3-inch flat AMOLED screen with 1.5K resolution. The standout specification here is the rumored 165Hz refresh rate, which would make scrolling, gaming, and animations exceptionally smooth. If accurate, this would place the phone among the fastest displays currently available on a smartphone.

The build quality also looks promising, with leaks suggesting a metal frame and a 3D ultrasonic fingerprint sensor for faster and more secure unlocking. Under the hood, the device is expected to be powered by the Snapdragon 8 Elite Gen 5 chipset, offering flagship-level performance suitable for gaming, multitasking, and AI-driven tasks.

Despite its compact size, the OnePlus 15T may include a battery exceeding 7,000mAh, which is unusually large for this category. This could translate into excellent battery life, even with a high refresh rate display. On the camera side, the phone is rumored to feature a dual rear camera setup with a 50MP primary sensor and a 50MP telephoto lens, focusing more on zoom performance rather than ultra-wide photography.



The OnePlus 15T is expected to debut in China in the first half of 2026, with an India launch likely under the name OnePlus 15s. While official confirmation is still pending, the leaks suggest OnePlus is aiming to redefine compact flagships.

Oppo Reno 15 Pro Mini Targets Compact Flagship Buyers

Oppo is reportedly working on a compact flagship smartphone under its Reno lineup, named the Oppo Reno 15 Pro Mini. Recent leaks suggest that the device could launch in India by late December 2025 or January 2026, positioning it as an early 2026 contender in the premium compact segment. The handset is said to carry the model number CPH2813, indicating it has already passed internal testing stages.

Powering the Reno 15 Pro Mini is expected to be the MediaTek Dimensity 8450 processor, which is designed to deliver strong performance with improved power efficiency. The phone is tipped to feature a 6.32-inch flat OLED display with 1.5K resolution and a 120Hz refresh rate, making it ideal for users who want a high-quality viewing experience without a bulky device.

Camera capabilities appear to be one of the phone's strongest selling points. The Reno 15 Pro Mini is rumored to include a triple rear camera setup, headlined by a 200MP primary sensor. This is accompanied by a 50MP ultra-wide camera and a 50MP telephoto lens offering 3.5x optical zoom. On the front, the device is expected to sport a 50MP selfie camera, catering to content creators and video callers.

Battery and charging features also look impressive. The handset is said to support 80W fast charging and may include wireless charging, which is still relatively rare in compact smartphones. Additionally, leaks suggest an IP69 rating, making the phone highly resistant to dust and water, even under extreme conditions.



Design-wise, the Reno 15 Pro Mini might debut in a Glacier White color option with a unique ribbon-style finish, giving it a distinct visual identity. The phone is reported to weigh around 187 grams and measure approximately 7.99mm in thickness, striking a balance between durability and comfort.

While Oppo has not officially confirmed these details, the Reno 15 Pro Mini appears poised to challenge established compact flagships with its powerful camera setup and premium build.

Vivo's 2026 Lineup Prices and India Launch Plans Leak



Oppo is reportedly preparing a busy start to 2026, with multiple smartphones expected to launch in India. According to tipster Abhishek Yadav, the company may introduce the Vivo V70 series, Vivo X200T, and Vivo X300 FE starting in late January 2026. These launches suggest Vivo is aiming to strengthen its presence across both premium mid-range and flagship segments.

The Vivo V70 series is expected to include the Vivo V70 and Vivo V70 Elite. The standard V70 is rumored to launch in a single configuration with 8GB RAM and 256GB storage, and could be available in Red and Yellow color options. Pricing leaks suggest the Vivo V70 may debut at around Rs. 45,000, while the V70 Elite could be priced near Rs. 50,000, though final pricing may change at launch.

Moving to the premium segment, the Vivo X200T is expected to be priced around Rs. 55,000, positioning it as a near-flagship device. Meanwhile, the Vivo X300 FE could arrive later with an expected price of Rs. 60,000, targeting users who want top-tier performance and features.

The Vivo V70 has already appeared on multiple certification platforms, including the FCC, BIS, and Geekbench. These listings reveal that the phone may run Android 16, support 5G, Bluetooth, NFC, and Wi-Fi, and be powered by a Snapdragon 7 Gen 4 processor. Geekbench scores indicate solid performance, with respectable single-core and multi-core results.

Interestingly, while the FCC listing showed 12GB RAM, the Geekbench data revealed an 8GB RAM variant, suggesting multiple configurations may be launched. Overall, these leaks indicate that Vivo is planning a well-rounded lineup to appeal to different price segments in early 2026.

Gill Dropped as India Make Bold T20 World Cup Call

Indian cricket took a dramatic turn as the BCCI announced the T20 World Cup 2026 squad, delivering one of the biggest surprises in recent years. Shubman Gill was not only removed as vice-captain but was also dropped entirely from the squad, underlining the selectors' intent to prioritize current form over reputation. The announcement was made by the selection committee led by chief selector Ajit Agarkar, alongside the squad for the upcoming T20I series against New Zealand.

Suryakumar Yadav has been named captain, reaffirming his leadership in the shortest format, while Axar Patel has been appoint-

ed vice-captain. The wicketkeeping responsibilities will primarily rest with Sanju Samson, who continues to enjoy the selectors' confidence. Notably, Ishan Kishan has made a comeback to the T20 set-up after more than two years, replacing Jitesh Sharma, who has been left out. The squad reflects a balance between explosive batting and varied bowling options. Young batters Abhishek Sharma and Tilak Varma continue to feature, while all-rounders Hardik Pandya, Shivam Dube, and Washington Sundar add depth. The bowling attack is spearheaded by Jasprit Bumrah and Arshdeep Singh, supported by spinners Kuldeep Yadav



and Varun Chakravathy, with Harshit Rana adding pace.

Perhaps the most striking aspect of the announcement is the absence of standby players, indicating the selectors' confidence in their chosen group. The exclusion of Gill, who has been a key figure across formats, signals a clear message that T20 cricket demands instant impact and adaptability.

As India prepares to defend its T20 crown on home soil in 2026, the squad selection highlights a shift toward fearless cricket and specialist T20 skills. While the decision has sparked debate, it also reinforces the idea that no place is guaranteed in modern Indian cricket.

Ishan Kishan's Domestic Explosion Forces India Recall

Ishan Kishan's return to India's T20 World Cup 2026 squad is a classic case of performance silencing all doubts. After nearly two years away from the national team, the left-handed wicket-keeper-batter forced his way back through an extraordinary run in the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy 2025/26.

Kishan finished the tournament as the highest run-scorer, amassing over 570 runs, and capped the season with a breathtaking 101 off 49 balls in the final, guiding Jharkhand to their maiden title. It was a defining moment for a player whose career had stalled after stepping away from cricket in 2023 due to mental fatigue.

Chief selector Ajit Agarkar made it clear that Kishan's selection was purely form-based. His ability to open the batting and keep wickets offered India tactical flexibility, especially in a format where aggressive starts are crucial. While players like Rishabh Pant and Dhruv Jurel remain ahead in the pecking



order, Kishan's recent performances made his inclusion unavoidable.

Reflecting on his selection, Kishan admitted the call-up came as a surprise, but one that brought immense satisfaction. His journey over the last few years has been marked by highs and lows — from a historic ODI double century in 2022 to a complete reset in 2023.

Now, as India prepares for the T20 World

Cup, Kishan will serve as the second wicket-keeper, with Sanju Samson as the first choice. While immediate opportunities may be limited, Kishan's momentum and renewed confidence have firmly placed him back in contention.

His story reinforces a recurring truth in Indian cricket — domestic performance remains the strongest pathway back to the top.

Gavaskar Questions Gill Omission From T20 Squad

Former India captain Rohit Sharma has confirmed his availability for Mumbai's opening two matches of the Vijay Hazare Trophy, offering a major boost to the domestic side. The premier 50-over tournament begins on December 24, and Rohit's presence adds experience to a Mumbai squad that is otherwise leaning toward youth.

However, several big names will be missing from the early fixtures. Suryakumar Yadav, Yashasvi Jaiswal, Ajinkya Rahane, and Shivam Dube are all set to miss the first two games.
