



Massive Irregularities Uncovered in PM Kaushal Vikas Yojana: CAG Exposes False Certifications, Ghost Accounts

New Delhi: The Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) has unearthed massive irregularities in the implementation of the Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PM-KVY) — a flagship Central government scheme meant to provide skill training to youth and promote self-employment. The audit report, tabled in the Lok Sabha on Thursday, reveals alarming misuse of funds, fake beneficiary records, and large-scale certificate fraud across states such as Bihar and Uttar Pradesh between 2015 and 2022.

According to the CAG's findings, skill certificates were issued to lakhs of individuals without imparting any formal training. In some cases, training centers had even been shut down before the issuance of certificates. Institutions reportedly branded these fraudulent credentials as "Best in Class" skill certifications, completely disregarding merit or attendance requirements.

The PM KVY, launched in 2015, was



implemented in three distinct phases over seven years to enhance the employability of India's youth through skill-based training. The Central government allocated about 14,450 crore for the programme to train 1.32 crore candidates across various sectors. However, the audit discovered that the system was riddled with anomalies and data manipulation at several levels. One of the most shocking revelations is the use of fake or duplicate financial records. The CAG report points out that bank accounts of 90,66,264 registered beneficiaries contained either blank or invalid account numbers.

In addition, 5,24,537 accounts were found to be duplicates including instances where 12,122 beneficiaries shared the same bank number, while 52,381 others had repeated or inconsistent entries. Even more startling, about 4,72,156 candidates were registered with the bank account number "111111111111". These severe discrepancies raise concerns over the authenticity of claims and disbursements made under the Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) system.

The CAG stated that funds were released to over 24.53 lakh certified candidates through DBT transfers, but only 17.69 lakh of them were actually trained. This means that nearly 7

lakh people almost 30 percent of those funded received money despite never completing any training programme. Officials highlighted that the irregularities point towards systemic failures, lax monitoring, and possible collusion between training partners and verification agencies. The report implies that poor oversight and the absence of robust data validation mechanisms enabled widespread misuse of public funds meant for skill development.

The CAG findings call into question the integrity of the PMKVY's implementation process, especially in states like Bihar and Uttar Pradesh, where most of

the irregularities were concentrated. Political observers say this raises serious accountability issues for both state enforcement agencies and central monitoring bodies. The revelation could trigger a broader investigation into the misuse of Central skill development funds.

Opposition parties are expected to press for a detailed probe and seek answers on the misuse of taxpayers' money. Meanwhile, the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship may face pressure to revamp the PMKVY monitoring framework and ensure transparent beneficiary verification processes to restore public trust in the scheme's objectives.

Social Media Users Advised to Exercise Caution: Hyderabad Police Issue Stern Warning Against Fake News Circulation

Hyderabad: In today's hyper-connected digital world, social media has become an inseparable part of daily life. From the moment people wake up in the morning until they go to bed at night, they scroll through countless messages, posts, videos, and forwarded content. However, amidst this constant stream of information, many users fail to pause and verify the authenticity of what they read or share a mistake that could have serious consequences.

According to the Hyderabad Police, the spread of misinformation on social media platforms has reached alarming levels in recent times. The department has observed that false or misleading content often travels faster and farther than the truth, echoing the old saying, "A lie can travel halfway around the world while the truth is still putting on its shoes." This alarming trend is not only eroding trust but also causing tangible harm to individuals and communities.

The police have noted a significant rise in fake news posts, edited

videos, and misleading claims circulating across popular messaging apps and social networking sites. These posts, in many cases, target vulnerable groups such as women and children, subjecting them to humiliation, emotional distress, and reputational damage. To combat this growing menace, the Hyderabad Police have issued a public advisory urging netizens to act responsibly while using digital communication platforms.

The advisory outlines a set of key guidelines as a warning: Verify information before sharing. Users should ensure that any message, image, or video they forward is authentic and factually correct. Exercise responsibility in group chats. Those who manage or participate in WhatsApp, Telegram, or Facebook groups must moderate conversations to prevent the spread of harmful or false content.

Avoid sharing unverified or sensational claims. Doing so could invite legal consequences under cyber-crime and misinformation laws. Stay away from fake propaganda. Becoming part of a false narrative can

damage one's personal reputation and credibility. The police have made it clear that ignorance cannot be used as an excuse for forwarding false information. Anyone caught spreading misleading or inflammatory content will face legal action under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and the Information Technology (IT) Act.

This includes spreading communal incitement, defamation, or morphed visuals intended to defame individuals or institutions. Authorities also cautioned that sensationalism for the sake of attention or entertainment can quickly backfire, turning the offender into the subject of online ridicule and public outrage. Cyber experts emphasize that in the current digital era, fact-checking is not optional — it is a civic duty.

The Hyderabad Police concluded the statement with an appeal: social media is a powerful tool for communication and awareness, but it must be used with accountability and sensitivity. Responsible participation in online spaces can ensure that the internet remains a safe and credible medium for everyone.

Railways Rationalizes Passenger Fares; No Hike for Journeys up to 215 Km



New Delhi: The Indian Railways has announced a rationalization of passenger fares effective December 26, 2025, introducing a minimal fare adjustment aimed at meeting rising operational and manpower costs. The new structure retains the current rates for short-distance travelers while introducing a marginal increase for longer routes. According to the new policy, there will be no increase in fares for suburban services or Monthly Season Tickets (MSTs), ensuring that daily commuters remain unaffected. Similarly, passengers traveling up to 215 kilometers in Ordinary Class will see no change in their ticket costs. For Ordinary Class journeys beyond 215 kilometers, fares will increase by 1 paise per kilometer. In the case of Mail and Express Non-AC classes, the rise will be 2 paise per kilometer, while

AC classes will also see a

hike of 2 paise per kilometer. Railway officials clarified that this modest revision is designed to recover part of the escalating operational costs without burdening the common passenger excessively.

Illustrating the minimal impact, the Railways stated that for a 500-kilometer journey in Non-AC coaches, passengers will pay just Rs 10 extra compared to the existing fare. The rationalized fare structure is expected to generate around Rs 600 crore in additional revenue for the national transporter during the current financial year.

Railway authorities have reiterated their commitment to safety, service improvement, and cost optimization while continuing to meet the social goal of affordable public transport.

The modest fare adjustment, they said, will help sustain these missions without placing undue pressure on the traveling public.

Enhancing cargo loading and undertaking minimal, calculated adjustments in passenger fares. Officials highlighted that Indian Railways has now become the second largest cargo-carrying railway network in the world, reflecting massive improvements in freight efficiency and logistics capacity. The rationalization comes at a time when

Railways has also demonstrated impressive operational efficiency. During the recent festival season, the network successfully mobilized over 12,000 special trains to manage record passenger volumes, ensuring smooth travel experiences across the country.

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The fare revision is, therefore, viewed as a balanced step maintaining affordability for short-distance and daily commuters while ensuring the national transporter remains financially viable amid rising operational demands.

TDP Finalized list of Lok Sabha presidents

Amaravati: In a significant organizational move aimed at strengthening the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) ahead of key political battles in Andhra Pradesh, party chief and Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu has finalized the list of Lok Sabha constituency-level presidents and general secretaries.

The official list, released by the party headquarters on Sunday, reflects Naidu's strategic approach to consolidating the party's base through a careful balance of social representation, administrative experience, loyalty, and grassroots strength.

According to party sources, the appointments were made after extensive internal consultations with senior leaders and regional committees.

Chandrababu Naidu Extends Birthday Wishes to YS Jagan Mohan Reddy, Gesture Draws Wide Reactions

Amaravati: In a notable gesture that has drawn attention across Andhra Pradesh's political circles, Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu extended birthday greetings to his predecessor and YSR Congress Party president, Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy, on the latter's 53rd birthday. Naidu conveyed his wishes through a post on X (formerly Twitter), marking a symbolic moment amid the state's charged political atmosphere. "Birthday wishes to Shri Y.S. Jag-

an garu. May he live a long and healthy life," Naidu wrote, a message that quickly went viral on social media.

The Telugu Desam Party (TDP) chief's post is seen as a rare expression of goodwill, given the history of deep political animosity and personal rivalry between the two leaders. The greeting comes in the backdrop of the 2024 Andhra Pradesh Assembly elections, in which the TDP-Jana Sena-BJP alliance secured a sweeping victory, decisively defeating Jagan Mohan Reddy's YSR



Congress Party. Since assuming power,

Naidu's government has been reversing several

controversial policies of the previous dispensa-

tion, further intensifying the adversarial tone between the political camps. However, Naidu's message has been widely discussed as an instance of statesmanship transcending political boundaries.

Many netizens appreciated the gesture, calling it a "humanitarian act" that reflects political maturity. "Despite their differences, wishing an opponent good health shows true leadership," one user commented. At the same time, certain sections expressed criticism, reminding Naidu of al-

leged wrongdoings during Jagan's tenure and questioning the necessity of such civility. "This is politics; we cannot forget what people went through under his rule," a comment read, reflecting ongoing polarization among the electorate.

Earlier in the day, Deputy Chief Minister and Jana Sena leader Pawan Kalyan and Andhra Pradesh Congress Committee (APCC) chief Y.S. Sharmila also extended birthday wishes to Jagan Mohan Reddy. Meanwhile, YSRCP cadres celebrated their lead-

er's birthday across the state by organizing social service events, including blood donation camps, food distribution programs, and community welfare activities.

While the political equations in Andhra Pradesh remain complex, Naidu's simple yet significant wish has sparked conversations about civility in politics. In a state often marked by intense rivalries, the exchange served as a reminder that respect and humanity can still find a place in public life.

Amaravati to Emerge as India's Quantum Technology Hub: CM Chandrababu Naidu Outlines Phased Roadmap

Guntur: Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu has unveiled a comprehensive, phase-wise roadmap for developing Amaravati Quantum Valley into a global center for research, innovation, and industrial growth in quantum technologies. The initiative aims to position Amaravati as the nerve center of India's quantum revolution, combining research excellence, startup incubation, and global collaboration.

Foundation Phase (2026) The year 2026 will mark the Foundation Phase, focusing on building administrative systems, anchoring hardware infrastruc-

ture, launching academic programs, and identifying quantum talent. As part of this early-stage effort, the government has approved investments from several pioneering startups, including QPAI, Nostradamus Technologies, 42 Technology, Qubitex Smart Solutions, Cybranex Technologies, Centella Scientific, and Qclairvoyance Quantum Labs.

During this phase, Andhra Pradesh plans to install IBM's Quantum System 2, a state-of-the-art computing platform that will anchor the region's hardware capability. The government will introduce quantum education programs in collaboration with international insti-

tutions and train at least 200 specialists in quantum computing and related disciplines. Additionally, researchers will test 100 quantum algorithms to build a foundation for future expansion.

Expansion Phase (2027-2029) The Expansion Phase will accelerate industrial and research growth between 2027 and 2029. This stage will focus on scaling up hardware production, expanding academic and industrial research, and attracting large-scale investments. A

Quantum Innovation Fund worth 1,000 crore will be launched to support startups and R&D ventures. A National Quantum Startup Forum will also be established to create a robust ecosystem for collaboration among researchers, investors, and entrepreneurs. The government aims for over 1,000 quantum algorithms to be tested annually during this period. By the end of 2029, Andhra Pradesh targets achieving 1,000 stable qubits, generating USD 1 billion in quantum investments, and crossing 5,000 crore in annual quantum exports — signaling India's arrival on the global quantum map.

Leadership Phase (2030-2035) The Leadership Phase, covering 2030 to 2035, envisions international recognition and sustained export growth. Amaravati is expected to host pre-

mier global quantum events and set international benchmarks in research and innovation. Through the Amaravati Quantum Academy, the state plans to train 5,000 engineers, researchers, and technicians every year to meet the growing demand for specialized talent worldwide.

A key goal is to develop 100 quantum startups, supported by a living-lab ecosystem and regulatory sandboxes that foster experimentation within safe, controlled environments. Land Acquisition and Industrial Development To support large-scale hardware manufacturing, the Andhra Pradesh Industrial Infrastructure Corpora-

tion (APIIC) will allocate 200 acres near Amaravati for establishing dedicated quantum hardware industries. This project is expected to create thousands of employment opportu-

nities across skilled and semi-skilled sectors while strengthening Amaravati's role in India's emerging quantum economy. This ambitious roadmap reflects the Naidu government's vision to drive technological self-reliance and innovation-led growth, making Amaravati a cornerstone of India's next major technological frontier in the quantum era.

Andhra Pradesh Pushes for New Godavari Water Tribunal in Talks with Centre

Amaravati: The Andhra Pradesh government has renewed its demand for the constitution of a new tribunal to allocate Godavari river waters between the two Telugu states in the post-bifurcation era. Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu raised this key issue during his recent visit to New Delhi, where he met Union Jal Shakti Minister C.R. Patil on Friday. During the meeting, Naidu reportedly discussed a wide range of subjects including approvals for inter-state and intra-state river-linking projects, clearance for pending irrigation proposals, and the resolution of inter-state water disputes. The question of a Godavari Water Tribunal emerged as one of the most significant and urgent topics on the agenda. According to the original Godavari Water Disputes Tribunal award, the undivided Andhra Pradesh was entitled to use 1,430 TMC (thousand million cubic feet) of dependable water at 75% reliability.

However, following the formation of Telangana in 2014, these allocations now need to be divided between the two successor states. Despite repeated requests, the Centre has not yet taken steps toward setting up a fresh tribunal to redefine and allocate shares. Both Andhra Pradesh and Telangana had earlier sought the establishment of a new tribunal during the Apex

Council meeting held on October 6, 2020, in New Delhi.

While Andhra Pradesh pressed for clarity on its post-bifurcation water entitlement, Telangana wanted a complete reassessment of the allocations. Although the Council later moved forward on issues related to the Krishna river, initiating the Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal-II proceedings, the proposal for a Godavari Tribunal has remained dormant. The original Godavari award, often referred to as the "Godavari Agreement," is based on a series of inter-state pacts entered into up to 1980. A key milestone was the tripartite agreement of August 7, 1978, between the then Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, and undivided Andhra Pradesh governments.

Subsequent accords were consolidated under the Godavari Water Disputes Tribunal Award. Studies show that under the award conditions, undivided Andhra Pradesh had access to 1,430 TMC of dependable flows. Currently, Andhra Pradesh utilizes approximately 659.691 TMC under various completed irrigation projects, while ongoing construction projects are expected to require another 116.20 TMC. The state government also plans to make use of surplus floodwaters through new linkage schemes such as the proposed Polavaram-Nallamala Sagar Interlink Project.

Officials argue that a new tribunal



is essential to ensure equitable distribution and legally binding clarity on water sharing between Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. The state contends that with changing rainfall patterns, increased irrigation needs, and the emergence of new projects, the existing distribution framework no longer reflects ground realities. Telangana, too, has expressed support for the idea of a new Godavari tribunal, mirroring Andhra Pradesh's stance that a transparent and updated allocation mechanism would help prevent future disputes.

However, the Centre's inaction so far has left both states waiting for a concrete move. With the Krishna river dispute now under formal adjudication by the Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal-II, Andhra Pradesh hopes that the Centre will soon issue a similar notification initiating the process for Godavari.

Rayalaseema Body Hails CM's Appeal for Horticulture Mission Funds

Antapur: Rayalaseema Samithi (RSSS) president Bojja Dasaratha Rami Reddy has welcomed Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu's appeal to the Centre to allocate special funds under the Horticulture Mission for the rapid development of the backward districts of Rayalaseema and Prakasam. Addressing the executive

committee meeting of the Samithi held at Nandyal on Saturday, Rami Reddy said the Chief Minister's renewed emphasis on horticulture had rekindled hopes among farmers who have long struggled with drought and low agricultural productivity.

He noted that Naidu's vision to establish a comprehensive Horticulture Hub across the region could transform farm livelihoods if im-

plemented with strong institutional backing and timely financial support. "Rayalaseema has immense potential for cultivation of high-value crops such as mango, banana, pomegranate, and citrus fruits. The creation of a horticulture corridor could generate employment, boost exports, and ensure sustainable income for small and marginal farmers," Rami Reddy

said. However, he expressed serious concern over the slow progress of key development pro-

grams announced in recent years. Despite substantial mentions in the Union Budget 2025-26 regarding the Purvo-

daya Scheme, the establishment of industrial hubs at Orvakal (Kurnool district) and Koppuram (Kadapa district), and the commitment to developing backward districts as per the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act, 2014, little ground activity has been visible, he said. Rami Reddy urged both the State and Central governments to fast-track project execution and avoid bureau-

cratic delays.

"Announcements alone do not change people's lives. We need a time-bound action plan, regular monitoring, and transparent allocation of funds so that our farmers can see the benefits on the ground," he asserted. The RSSS president also highlighted the significance of water management in boosting horticulture productivity. He called for expediting irriga-

tion projects like Handri-Neeva, GNSS, and Velugonda, which are vital for ensuring reliable water supply in the drought-prone region. Reiterating the Samithi's commitment to the cause of Rayalaseema's development, he said the organisation would continue to work with all political parties and stakeholders to secure equitable growth opportunities for the region.

"Our demand is not charity—it is long-pending justice to Rayalaseema's farmers," Rami Reddy declared. The meeting concluded with resolutions demanding that the Centre formally include Rayalaseema under all backward area packages and ensure dedicated funding for horticulture infrastructure, cold storage, and farmer training centres.

Nara Lokesh Stresses Strengthening of TDP, Allied Wings from Grassroots Level

Amaravati: Minister Nara Lokesh emphasized the urgent need to strengthen the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) and its affiliated wings from the grassroots level upward. He urged senior functionaries and regional coordinators to focus on pending party committees, ensuring the organizational structure is reinforced ahead of upcoming political challenges. Lokesh held a high-level meeting with TDP's regional coordinators that lasted for nearly two hours on Sunday. During the session, he reviewed the party's strategy and gave key directives on building strong local teams, enhancing coordination, and expanding grassroots support networks.

The meeting also reviewed the design models of new party offices proposed for district headquarters, with Lokesh personally seeking feedback from the coordinators. According to party sources, Lokesh presented a clear roadmap for strengthening internal systems across constituencies. He directed coordinators to pay special attention to the performance of affiliated TDP wings such as the youth, women, and farmers' units.

"The revival and empowerment of these wings are crucial for sustaining the party's



mass contact at every level of society," Lokesh reportedly said. Addressing organizational efficiency, Lokesh instructed the coordinators to monitor how ef-

fectively local grievance programs are resolving public issues. He ordered the preparation of detailed reports on grievance redressal progress and mandated that

party leaders collaborate closely with district in-charge ministers during such programs. He further instructed that on the day of the District Development

Review Committee (DDRC) meeting, the party's coordination committee in each district should also convene to review internal matters and synchronize activities. Highlighting the need for acceleration in pending organizational tasks, Lokesh urged leaders to expedite the completion of all unfinished party committees from the village level up to the state unit.

He also directed coordinators to finalize lists of eligible candidates for the remaining nominated positions, stressing merit and loyalty as key criteria. During the meeting, Lokesh also reviewed progress on the

construction of new TDP district offices. He advised coordinators to work with the concerned ministers to finalize land acquisition, design approvals, and construction timelines to ensure swift completion.

"No activist or leader should feel neglected. It is our duty to stand by every member who has suffered injustice," Lokesh asserted. Concluding the meeting, Nara Lokesh reiterated the TDP's commitment to rebuilding a people-centric organizational network and revitalizing the party's structure across the state. He said, "Every coordinator should treat this as a mission to rebuild TDP at every village, strengthen the trust of the people, and prepare the organization for the future."

Kakani Govardhan Reddy Sparks Fresh Controversy, Targets Irrigation Officials in Nellore

Nellore: Former Minister and senior YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) leader Kakani Govardhan Reddy has once again stirred controversy, this time for allegedly issuing open threats to officials of the Irrigation Department. According to reports, during a heated exchange, Reddy lashed out at senior officials, including Executive Engineer (SE) Desi Naik and Manager Gangadhar Reddy, accusing them of corruption and collusion with Telugu Desam Party (TDP) MLA Somireddy Chandramohan Reddy.

Sources claim that Kakani, angered by recent developments, warned the officers that he would make them "account for every rupee" and even went as far as to threaten that they would be compelled to "sell their assets to repay embezzled funds." These remarks have sparked outrage among administrative circles and prompted renewed political tension in the district. The controversy comes in the backdrop of a recent expose by TDP MLA Somireddy Chandramohan Reddy,



who alleged large-scale corruption in the Sullurpetta and Sarvepalli irrigation projects during the previous YSRCP regime.

Somireddy, accompanied by media personnel, visited several project sites and pointed out locations where he claimed works worth crores of rupees were billed without actual execution. According to Somireddy, irregularities in the

irrigation sector allegedly amount to over 150 crore. He stated that vigilance and audit enquiries have already revealed significant lapses, reinforcing claims of financial mismanagement during Kakani's tenure as minister.

Observers note that while these allegations have been circulating for months, Kakani has not issued any direct response or clarification

regarding the accusations against him. Instead, his latest remarks against irrigation officers are being viewed as a counterattack aimed at diverting attention from the corruption charges made by the opposition.

Political analysts in Nellore believe this development signals a renewed phase of confrontation between the ruling YSRCP and the TDP, particularly in light

of the latter's continued efforts to highlight alleged corruption under the previous state government.

As the latest episode unfolds, it remains to be seen whether the state administration will take disciplinary action or launch an official inquiry into Kakani's conduct and the fresh allegations surrounding the irrigation department.

Nara Lokesh Reviews TDP MLAs' Performance, Stresses Party Discipline

Amaravati: Education and IT Minister and TDP National General Secretary Nara Lokesh has directed regional coordinators to submit detailed performance reports on the party's MLAs, stating that the evaluation will be used to strengthen governance and party accountability. He made it clear that legislators failing to perform up to expectations would be called in for party counseling sessions. Emphasizing organizational discipline, Lokesh reminded coordinators that loyalty to the party is paramount.

"The Secretariat is like a rented house, but the party is our permanent home. We may hold office for five years, but the party remains forever. Every leader must abide by party directives without exception," he said. Lokesh held an extensive review

meeting lasting over two and a half hours with TDP regional coordinators at the party's central office on Saturday. He clarified that coordinators play a crucial role in bridging communication between senior leaders and grassroots workers.

From monitoring MLA performance to organizing review meetings with district in-charge ministers, he instructed coordinators to remain proactive and responsive. Lokesh directed that if any in-charge minister fails to respond to coordinators' calls, the matter should be reported directly to the party leadership. He also stressed that every time a DRC (District Review Committee) meeting is held by in-charge ministers, a party meeting should be conducted the next day with the presence of both the

minister and the regional coordinator. In districts handled by ally ministers, Lokesh suggested organizing the meetings jointly with the local MP.

He instructed that all vacant party positions from village to constituency level be filled by the end of this month. The same timeline applies for pending appointments in temple committees, market yard boards, and PACS chairmanships. Lokesh asked coordinators to take immediate proposals for postings in APPSC, BC Corporation, and Wakf Boards. He made it clear that priority in both party and nominated positions should go to those who fought steadfastly when the TDP was in opposition.

Any nominations recommended for leaders who joined after the coa-

lition came to power should be summarily rejected. Discussing MLA activities, Lokesh noted that performance has improved significantly over the last two and a half months. MLAs have been conducting grievance collection programs across constituencies and working to resolve local issues. He directed coordinators to ensure their continuous participation in government and party programs, particularly public welfare initiatives like Swachhandhra and pension disbursement drives. On administrative matters, the meeting finalized design plans for district party offices, advising minor internal revisions.

Each district and constituency center will have a party office built under a unified design. Site selection for these offices must be completed by month-end. The meeting also discussed the appointment of a new chairman for Nellore Vijaya Dairy, with Lokesh delegating the responsibility of finalizing the candidate to State Party President Palla Srinivas Rao.

YSRCP Leaders' Birthday Celebrations for Jagan Expose Deep Factional Rift in Kurnool and Chittoor Kurnool



December 21 (Andhra Jyothi):

Internal discord within the ruling YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) has once again come to the surface, this time during celebrations marking party president and former Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy's 53rd birthday.

What was meant to be a show of unity and loyalty has instead turned into a reflection of serious factionalism among key YSRCP leaders across several districts. The controversy began in the Emmagannuru constituency of Kurnool district, where separate birthday events were organized by different YSRCP factions.

at the leadership level. Party workers voiced concern that if senior leaders themselves could not come together for Jagan's birthday—a symbolic occasion celebrating the party chief's leadership and welfare-oriented governance—it could signal deeper cracks within the organization.

Meanwhile, similar tensions erupted in Chittoor district, where YSRCP leaders were also divided in their birthday celebrations. Two rival factions reportedly held competing events, further exposing the simmering discontent. Deputy Mayor Chandrasekhar led one group in organizing celebrations at Girimpeta, where several influential local leaders joined him. His faction is said to have the backing of certain prominent figures within

the party, strengthening speculation about rising internal rivalries.

Interestingly, banners displayed during Chandrasekhar's event omitted the image of Chittoor district YSRCP in-charge Vijayanand Reddy, which observers interpreted as a deliberate snub.

Speaking to the media, Chandrasekhar stated that the divisions had arisen because leadership was failing to give due importance to local functionaries. He added that while factions were not intentional, neglect from coordinators had inevitably led to such groupings.

Party insiders admit that growing dissatisfaction among second-tier leaders threatens to undermine the YSRCP's organizational discipline, especially in districts where the party once enjoyed overwhelming support. With discontent spreading just months after electoral setbacks, cadres are calling on the leadership to restore cohesion before the rifts deepen further.

New app to ease transportation in AP

Andhra Taxi App to Offer Safe and Affordable Transport for Tourists in NTR District In a step toward improving tourism and transportation convenience, NTR District Collector S. Lakshmi Sha has announced the launch of a new government-backed mobile application and portal named "Andhra Taxi." Designed to operate much like private ride-hailing apps in major cities, the Andhra Taxi app aims to provide tourists and residents of Vijayawada and surrounding areas with safe, reliable, and affordable travel options.

Collector Lakshmi

Sha stated that the app will soon be available for download on the Google Play Store. The application has been developed under government supervision to ensure transparency, passenger safety, and fair pricing. It is expected to play a crucial role in supporting tourism around Vijayawada's Durga temple, Bhavani Island, and the Krishna riverfront, which attract thousands of visitors each month.

The Collector noted that tourists have frequently complained about overcharging by auto and cab drivers. To ensure women's safety, booking and vehicle details will automatically be shared with local police stations, allowing real-time mon-

itoring of travel activity. Data from all registered vehicles will be stored securely in the State Data Center, protecting user privacy while enabling efficient surveillance and response in emergencies.

Tourism and Economic Boost The Collector emphasized that the initiative not only benefits travelers but also provides steady employment opportunities for local auto and cab operators. By integrating transportation and accommodation services, the app allows tourists to book hotel rooms or complete travel packages in key tourist destinations within the NTR district. This integrated approach is expected to

boost the local economy and give small operators a reliable, government-endorsed platform to offer their services.

Drone Services for Farmers In an innovative move, the Andhra Taxi platform will soon include drone service options for farmers in rural areas of NTR district. These services are aimed at supporting agricultural needs such as crop monitoring, pesticide spraying, and data collection, signaling a broader vision for technology-driven public service under the district administration.

Collector Lakshmi Sha expressed confidence that the app will "curb exploitation, encourage transparency,



and strengthen tourism-linked livelihoods." The initiative reflects the government's commitment to digital governance and citizen-friendly service delivery, setting a model that could soon be replicated in other districts across Andhra Pradesh.

Whale Rescued by Fishermen off Pudimadaka Coast in Anakapalli District

Anakapalli: A dramatic rescue unfolded off the coast of Pudimadaka in Achyutapuram Mandal, Anakapalli district, when local fishermen discovered that a whale had accidentally become trapped in their fishing net during their routine expedition on Saturday. According to eyewitnesses, the group of fishermen set out into the sea in the early hours, casting their nets as usual in hopes of a good catch.

Within a short time, they noticed unusually heavy movement in the nets and assumed they had trapped an exceptionally large haul of fish. However, as they began pulling the net closer to the boat, they realized that a massive whale had become ensnared. The fishermen immediately stopped hauling and decided to bring the creature closer to shore to prevent further injury. Once near the coast, they, with the help of other locals, carefully released the whale from the netting.



Due to its enormous size and exhaustion, the rescue took several hours. Witnesses reported that the whale appeared weak and was struggling for breath when freed. Local villagers, marine enthusiasts, and coastal authorities gathered at the site to assist in returning the whale safely to deeper waters. With concerted effort, ropes and small boats were used to guide the mammal back to sea.

The fishermen expressed relief and pride at being able to save the marine giant from distress. Speaking about the incident, one fisherman said, "At first, we thought we had caught a huge shoal of fish. We never imagined a whale could get caught in our nets. We just wanted to make sure it returned to the ocean alive.

Environmentalists have praised the swift

and humane action of the fishermen, emphasizing the importance of awareness among coastal communities to prevent accidental entanglement of large marine animals. This incident highlights the close connection between humans and the marine ecosystem along Andhra Pradesh's coastline, where fishermen often encounter rare ocean creatures.

Officials are expected to visit the site to gather more details and assess whether the whale sustained any injuries. The species of the whale has not yet been identified, but locals described it as a grayish-blue mammal roughly 25 to 30 feet long. The event has drawn considerable attention in the region, serving as a reminder of the delicate balance between livelihoods and marine conservation.

Vijayawada: Serious procedural lapses in addressing public grievances have landed Raja Nagaram Tahsildar (MRO) in trouble, as the District Revenue Officer (DRO) has issued five memos citing negligence and violation of prescribed procedures. The action followed an audit held on December 6, 2025, which scrutinized the functioning of the grievance redressal system (PGRS) across the mandal office. According to official sources, the DRO found that several complaints filed between June 30 and August 8, 2025, through the PGRS portal were either left unresolved or disposed of without proper follow-up.

The audit team noted that the Tahsildar had failed to personally communicate with complainants and did not issue official endorsements after disposing of cases—both mandatory steps in the grievance process. Identical Lapses in Multiple Complaints During the audit, five specific complaints were examined. Each revealed simi-

lar lapses, indicating a pattern of negligence. In a case filed on June 30 by Srilakshmi of Farijellipeta village, the audit found that the Tahsildar had not interacted directly with the complainant. Complaints registered on July 7, 18, and 21 also showed identical issues, with no communication or procedural documentation.

Similarly, in a petition lodged on August 8 by Chatla Seetharamudu from Raja Nagaram vil-

lage, the MRO failed to issue an endorsement after closing the complaint.

The DRO described these as "procedural lapses" and stated that merely closing files under the pretext of resolution is unacceptable. He stressed that every grievance must be addressed transparently, with proper documentation and citizen engagement. Direction to Submit Explanation In the memos, the DRO instructed the tahsildar to furnish a de-

tailed explanation for each complaint, clarify the steps taken, and immediately rectify the identified lapses.

The officer also reiterated that direct interaction with complainants and issuance of written endorsements are mandatory requirements under the government's grievance redressal policy.

Warning on Reputation and Accountability

District revenue au-

thorities emphasized that negligence in handling PGRS complaints undermines public trust and tarnishes the government's reputation.

The DRO warned that stricter monitoring will be enforced henceforth to ensure every public grievance is handled promptly and in compliance with administrative protocols. Officials added that lapses of this nature could trigger further disciplinary measures if not corrected immediately.

Minister Narayana Fulfils Promise: New BT Road Completed in Just a Week at Vaddamanu Village

Amaravati: True to his reputation for swift and decisive action, Minister Dr. P. Narayana has once again demonstrated his commitment to development and efficiency. Within just a week of giving his word, a brand-new BT road was constructed and completed at Vaddamanu village, one of the capital region villages under Amaravati's development belt. During a meeting held on December 10 at Vaddamanu, Minister Narayana, along with local MLA Sravan Kumar, met with the farmers of the village to discuss the government's ongoing land pooling program.

The initiative aims to

secure land for crucial infrastructure projects as part of Amaravati's expansion including the railway line, railway station, inner ring road, and sports city. The government plans to pool around 16,666 acres of land across seven villages for these projects, with Vaddamanu being one of the key locations. At the same meeting, villagers expressed concern about the poor condition of the main road connecting their village to the N17 route. The road had become severely damaged with numerous potholes, making commutes difficult for residents.

Responding immediately to their request, Minister Narayana assured them that a new

road would be laid without delay—a promise he has now delivered on within record time. Following the minister's instructions, CRDA officials and engineers inspected the road alignment the very next day. The Minister personally oversaw planning and directed technical teams to prepare cost estimates and initiate the project without bureaucratic delay. On December 14, construction work began in full swing, and by the morning of December 21, exactly one week later the new BT road was fully completed.

The newly laid road spans 1,148 meters in length and 4.5 meters in width, built with four durable layers to ensure long-term stability. The

total project cost stood at 98.7 lakh, funded by the Capital Region Development Authority (CRDA).

The dedication and coordination between the engineering teams, officials, and the Minister's office were key to the project's timely completion.

Minister Narayana, accompanied by Tenali MLA Sravan Kumar, will formally inaugurate the newly built road on Monday morning. Speaking ahead of the event, local villagers conveyed heartfelt gratitude to the Minister for his proactive approach and for honoring his commitment with visible results rather than mere assurances. Many residents said his leadership has restored confidence in the government's promises related to Amaravati's development.

This project stands as yet another example of Minister Narayana's results-driven governance model one that values action over announcements. Officials in the CRDA noted that his hands-on involvement and quick decision-making were instrumental in ensuring that the project was completed within just seven days.

"It is through their dedication that the country has successfully fought this dreadful disease," he said. The MLA also inter-




acted with medical officers, ANMs, municipal staff, and volunteers, appreciating their role in implementing the government's health initiatives effectively.

Mother Tongue Is Not a Barrier, It Is the Bridge India's Education System Needs



The State of the Education Report for India 2025 makes one truth unmistakably clear: language lies at the heart of India's learning crisis as well as its solution. Titled "Bhasha Matters: Mother Tongue-Based Education in India", the report challenges a long-standing assumption in Indian schooling—that early education delivered in dominant or "aspirational" languages automatically improves learning outcomes. Instead, it presents compelling evidence that the continued neglect of mother-tongue instruction has deepened learning gaps, reinforced inequality, and weakened foundational education across the country.

India's linguistic diversity is unparalleled. Thousands of languages and dialects are spoken across its regions, yet the classroom remains stubbornly monolingual or narrowly multilingual. For millions of children, the language of instruction is not the language of thought, home, or community. This disconnect, the report argues, is not a marginal issue—it is a systemic failure that undermines comprehension, participation, and confidence during the most critical years of learning.

The Cost of Ignoring the Child's First Language

The SOER 2025 highlights a sobering reality: a significant

proportion of Indian children enter school without familiarity with the language used for teaching. When young learners are forced to decode unfamiliar words before understanding concepts, learning becomes mechanical rather than meaningful. This results in poor foundational literacy and numeracy, learning deficits that accumulate over time and often culminate in dropout or disengagement.

The report emphasizes that language disadvantage disproportionately affects children from tribal communities, rural areas, migrant families, and economically weaker sections. While privileged students may overcome early language barriers through home support or private schooling, marginalized children bear the brunt of a system that treats linguistic diversity as an inconvenience rather than an asset.

Education systems are meant to level the playing field. When language itself becomes an entry barrier, schooling risks reproducing social inequality instead of dismantling it.

Mother-Tongue Instruction: Evidence, Not Emotion

The argument for mother-tongue education is often dismissed as sentimental or politically motivated. The SOER 2025 firmly counters this per-

ception by grounding its recommendations in cognitive science and global evidence. Children learn best when taught in a language they understand. Concepts introduced in a familiar language are grasped faster, retained longer, and applied more effectively.

Crucially, mother-tongue instruction does not hinder the acquisition of additional languages. On the contrary, the report stresses that strong foundational learning in the first language accelerates second- and third-language acquisition. Multilingual education, when well designed, produces learners who are cognitively flexible, culturally grounded, and linguistically confident.

Thus, the debate is not about choosing between local languages and global competitiveness. It is about sequencing and pedagogy—ensuring that children first learn how to learn before being pushed to learn in unfamiliar languages.

Policy Promise vs Classroom Reality

India's National Education Policy 2020 acknowledged the importance of mother-tongue education, particularly in the early years. However, the SOER 2025 notes that implementation remains uneven and largely symbolic. Many states lack trained teachers fluent in local languages.

Teaching-learning materials are scarce or poorly developed. Teacher education programmes rarely equip educators with multilingual pedagogical skills.

As a result, the idea of mother-tongue instruction often remains confined to policy documents rather than classrooms. English-medium education continues to be equated with quality, despite evidence to the contrary. Parents, driven by aspirations for social mobility, frequently opt for schools that promise English proficiency, even if it compromises comprehension in the early years.

The report argues that without systemic support, parental choice alone cannot drive meaningful change. What is needed is a coordinated national mission that aligns curriculum design, teacher training, assessment methods, and community engagement around multilingual education.

Language, Identity and Dignity

Beyond learning outcomes, the report makes a powerful case for the cultural and social value of mother-tongue education. Language is inseparable from identity. When children see their language excluded from formal education, it signals that their culture is inferior or irrelevant. This silent message erodes self-worth and belonging.

India's linguistic heritage is not merely a cultural artefact—it is living knowledge embedded in oral traditions, local histories, and indigenous wisdom systems. Education that sidelines these languages risks severing children from their communities and erasing invaluable knowledge traditions.

By contrast, schools that embrace linguistic diversity become spaces of inclusion and respect. They affirm that education is not about assimilation into a dominant culture, but about empowering learners where they are.

The Way Forward

The SOER 2025 proposes clear and actionable steps: a national mission on mother-tongue and multilingual education, sustained investment in teacher recruitment and training, development of quality learning materials in local languages, and active community participation in curriculum development.

Technology, the report notes, can play a transformative role—by enabling digital content creation in multiple languages and supporting teachers in multilingual classrooms. But technology must complement, not replace, strong pedagogical foundations.

Most importantly, political will is essential. Language policy in education must rise above ideological debates and



electoral calculations. The question is not which language should dominate, but how every child can be given a fair start.

Conclusion

The State of the Education Report for India 2025 does more than diagnose a problem—it challenges India to rethink the very foundations of its education system.

Mother-tongue instruction is not a step backward into parochialism; it is a step forward toward equity, quality, and meaningful learning.

If India is serious about improving learning outcomes, reducing dropouts, and achieving true educational inclusion, it must begin where learning begins—

with the language of the child. Anything less would be an abdication of responsibility to millions of young learners whose potential remains locked behind a language they do not yet understand.



BJP Dominance In Maharashtra Local Polls



The ruling Mahayuti alliance registered a sweeping victory in the Maharashtra local body elections, with the Bharatiya Janata Party emerging as the single largest party. Results declared for 288 Nagar Parishads and Nagar Panchayats showed the BJP winning 129 seats, consolidating its dominance across urban local bodies after nearly a decade-long gap in such elections. The outcome marked a major setback for the opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi, particularly the Congress and Shiv Sena UBT factions, which conceded defeat soon after results became clear.

Polling was conducted on December 2 for 264 municipal councils and nagar panchayats, followed by elections in over 20 additional bodies on December 20. Vote counting began at 10 am and quickly indicated a decisive trend in favour of the ruling alliance. Despite expectations of a tough contest due to agrarian distress, partial implementation of welfare schemes for women, and farmer dissatisfaction over financial aid, the opposition failed to capitalise on these issues electorally.

Congress state chief Harsh Vardhan Sapkal accused the State Election Commission of

facilitating the Mahayuti's victory and sarcastically congratulated it for its role. He also issued a warning to BJP allies Eknath Shinde and Ajit Pawar, claiming that the BJP would eventually sideline them after consolidating power. Senior Shiv Sena UBT leader Ambadas Danve echoed similar sentiments, alleging that the ruling parties relied on money and muscle power to secure their win.

On the other hand, BJP leaders attributed the success to positive campaigning and public trust. Union Home Minister Amit Shah described the result as a blessing from the people

for the welfare-driven vision of the NDA governments at both the Centre and the state, led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis emphasised that he avoided negative campaigning, focusing instead on explaining development plans, which he said resonated with voters.

The victory strengthens the BJP's grassroots presence and reinforces its political momentum in Maharashtra. It also raises questions about the opposition's organisational strength and strategy ahead of future state and national elections.

Modi And Kharje Clash Over Infiltration Issue



The political confrontation between the BJP and Congress intensified over the issue of illegal immigration, with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge exchanging sharp remarks. Speaking in Assam's Namrup, where he inaugurated development projects including a major fertiliser plant, PM Modi accused the Congress of indulging in anti-national activities by encouraging illegal Bangladeshi immigrants to settle in Assam for vote-bank politics.

The Prime Minister alleged that the Congress opposed voter list revisions to protect illegal settlers and claimed that his government was committed to safeguarding the identity, land, and cultural pride of the Assamese people. He further stated that despite correcting many historical mistakes made by Congress over the last 11 years, significant work remained to restore the country fully.

Illegal immigration from Bangladesh remains a highly sensitive issue in Assam, with authorities deporting over 400 illegal infiltrators, including Rohingya, in the past year.

The BJP has repeatedly highlighted this as a governance and national security concern.

Congress chief Mallikarjun Kharge strongly rejected the Prime Minister's accusations,

double-engine government. According to Kharge, responsibility for border security and infiltration prevention rests entirely with the ruling party.

Kharje condemned PM Modi's statements, saying the Prime Minister habitually shifts blame to the opposition whenever his government fails to deliver. He clarified that the Congress does not support infiltrators or anti-

national forces and would back any genuine action taken in the national interest.

The exchange reflects the deepening polarisation between the two major parties ahead of upcoming elections. Immigration, identity, and national security continue to be key political flashpoints, especially in border states like Assam, where public sentiment remains sharply divided on the issue.

Terror Search Operations Intensify In Udhampur



Security forces and Jammu and Kashmir Police launched extensive search operations in Udhampur district after reports emerged that two unidentified terrorists had visited a village house for food. The incident occurred in Chor Motu village of Majalata tehsil, located around five kilometres from the site of a recent encounter between terrorists and security forces.

According to official sources, the terrorists visited the house of a local resident, Mangtu Ram, on Saturday evening and took food before disappearing into nearby forested areas. This development raised serious security concerns, prompting authorities to cordon off the village and initiate intensive searches.

The visit followed a deadly encounter earlier in the week in which a police officer was killed. Two of the three terrorists involved in that encounter were believed to have been injured but managed to escape under the cover of darkness and dense forest terrain. Security agencies suspect that the same group may be responsible for approaching villagers for food and

shelter.

In response, a large-scale joint operation was launched, stretching from the international border to mountainous regions along the Line of Control. The operation forms part of a broader area domination exercise aimed at preventing infiltration and eliminating hiding militants.

Intelligence inputs suggest that terrorists may be exploiting foggy weather conditions

to infiltrate across the border. Officials have noted a resurgence of activity at terror launch pads in areas opposite Jammu, Samba, Kathua, and Rajouri districts.

A senior BSF officer recently revealed that Pakistan has reactivated around 72 terror launch pads near the border, months after suffering damage to its infrastructure during India's Operation Sindoora. Of these, 12 are active near

the international border in Sialkot and Zafarwal sectors, while about 60 are located across the Line of Control.

The incident underscores the persistent security challenges in the region and highlights the role of villagers, terrain, and weather in counter-terrorism efforts. Authorities continue to appeal for public cooperation while maintaining heightened vigilance.

Pilot Assault Case Sparks Controversy



A controversy erupted after an Air India Express pilot, Captain Virendra Sejwal, was accused of assaulting a passenger at Delhi Airport's Terminal 1 following a dispute over queue jumping.

The incident quickly gained traction on social media, prompting public outrage and official action by the airline.

Captain Sejwal, through a statement issued by a law firm, denied wrongdoing and claimed the incident had been misrepresented as a professional conflict. He clarified that he was traveling as a passenger, not on duty, and that the matter was purely personal between two individuals. The statement alleged that the other passenger, Ankit Dewan, initiated the confrontation and used abusive and casteist language, along with threats against the pilot's family.

Ankit Dewan, however, alleged that Captain Sejwal physically assaulted him after a verbal argument over the use of a staff security queue. Dewan claimed he was travelling with his family, including a four-month-old child, and was advised by airport staff to use the staff queue. He said the pilot insulted him and later beat him, leaving him injured. Dewan also alleged that he was coerced into signing a statement agreeing not to pursue legal action to avoid missing his flight and losing expensive holiday bookings.

Captain Sejwal's statement countered these claims, asserting that both

parties voluntarily signed a mutual statement in the presence of CISF personnel, who offered them the option to file complaints. The CISF later confirmed that the matter was resolved mutually and without coercion.

Despite the pilot's defence, Air India Express took swift action, removing him from duty pending an internal investigation. The airline condemned any form of violent behaviour and stated that disciplinary action would follow based on inquiry findings.

The case highlights the growing impact of social media narratives, workplace accountability, and the fine line between personal disputes and professional conduct, especially when public figures are involved.

Infant Death Highlights Healthcare Failure



A deeply disturbing incident from Jharkhand's West Singhbhum district exposed serious gaps in the state's healthcare and emergency transport systems. An Adi-vasi Ho family was forced to carry their four-month-old child's body home in a vegetable bag after being unable to secure a mortuary van from the district hospital.

Dimba Chatomba and his wife Roybari, residents of a remote village near Chaitabasa, had taken their infant to the Sadar Hospital after the child developed severe illness.

Despite receiving treatment, the baby died on December 19. Hospital records confirmed the death but did not mention the cause.

Following the death, the

family requested a mortuary van but were allegedly told that none were available.

According to Dimba, hospital staff warned that transporting the body openly would not be allowed on public buses. Eventually, hospital staff reportedly pooled Rs 400 to purchase a vegetable bag and bus tickets, placed the infant's body inside the bag, and instructed the parents to travel nearly 80 kilometres back to their village.

The incident sparked widespread outrage, with locals and activists condemning the indignity faced by the grieving family. Neighbours stated that the unavailability of mortuary vehicles was common, often due to poor road conditions or drivers demanding extra

payment.

In response, Jharkhand Health Minister Irfan Ansari announced corrective measures, including the procurement of four mortuary vehicles for every district hospital at a cost of Rs 15 crore. He also claimed that an internal inquiry found that the family left without waiting for the ambulance and that one vehicle was non-functional while another was already in use.

The incident highlights systemic failures in healthcare access, especially for tribal and rural communities. It has reignited discussions on poverty, infrastructure neglect, and the urgent need for dignified healthcare services, even after death.

Saudi Arabia Records Execution Surge



Saudi Arabia has carried out a record number of executions for the second consecutive year, prompting widespread condemnation from human rights groups. According to UK-based organisation Reprieve, at least 347 people have been executed this year, surpassing last year's total of 345. The group described this as the bloodiest year since it began monitoring executions in the kingdom.

The latest executions involved two Pakistani nationals convicted of drug-related offences. Reprieve reports that roughly two-thirds of those executed this year were convicted of non-lethal drug crimes, a practice the United Nations considers incompatible with international human rights standards. More than half of those executed were foreign nationals, raising concerns that migrant workers are disproportionately affected.

Among those executed were women, a journalist, and individuals who were minors at the time of their alleged crimes. Human rights organisations have highlighted cases involving torture, forced confessions, and lack of legal representation. Reprieve described the Saudi justice system as one where abuse is endemic and ac-

countability is absent.

The surge in executions follows the lifting of an unofficial moratorium on drug-related executions in late 2022. Since then, families of death row inmates have spoken of living in constant fear, with executions often carried out without prior notification. Relatives are typically not informed in advance, not given the bodies, and not told burial locations.

Saudi Arabia's de facto ruler, Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, has overseen significant social reforms, including easing restrictions on women and opening the country to global tourism and entertainment. However, human rights groups argue these changes mask an increasingly harsh crackdown on dissent and civil liberties.

Despite international criticism, Saudi authorities maintain that the death penalty is imposed only after exhaustive judicial processes and only for the most serious crimes. The UN and multiple rights organisations have called for an immediate moratorium on executions, warning that Saudi Arabia's current approach undermines global human rights norms.

Kate Winslet On Fame And Intrusion



Kate Winslet has reflected on the intense media scrutiny she faced after rising to global fame as Rose in *Titanic*, describing the experience as frightening and overwhelming. Speaking on BBC Radio 4's *Desert Island Discs*, the actor said paparazzi intrusion reached extreme levels, including phone tapping, surveillance, and even people rummaging through her bins to speculate about her diet.

Winslet said her life was turned upside down after *Titanic*'s release in 1997. While the filmmaking experience itself was positive, she admitted she was not emotionally prepared for the sudden global attention. Media coverage frequently focused on her body, using what she described as abusive language and unrealistic, digitally altered images.

She revealed that negative comments about her appearance began long before fame. As a child, she was mocked by peers and discouraged by authority figures who suggested she would only be cast in stereotypical roles. These experiences led to unhealthy dieting dur-

ing her teenage years.

During periods of intense media pressure, including her divorce from director Sam Mendes, Winslet relied on small comforts and close friendships to cope. She spoke candidly about how everyday routines and support from neighbours helped her survive emotionally challenging times.

Winslet also criticised the media's manipulation of her image, recalling moments when she saw heavily edited magazine covers that bore little resemblance to her real appearance. She said she spoke out because she did not want young women to chase unattainable standards based on false representations.

Now preparing for her directorial debut, Winslet noted that gender bias persists in the film industry. She said women are still spoken to differently than men in leadership roles, often receiving patronising advice that would never be directed at male directors. Her response to such remarks today, she said, is simple and confident, reflecting the self-assurance she has gained over time.

US Seizes Venezuelan Oil Tanker Again



The United States has seized a second oil tanker that recently departed from Venezuela, escalating tensions between Washington and Caracas. The operation, confirmed by the US Department of Homeland Security, comes just days after President Donald Trump announced a blockade targeting sanctioned oil tankers entering and leaving Venezuela. The vessel was intercepted in international waters by the US Coast Guard, following a similar seizure earlier in the month.

According to US officials, the tanker was carrying oil belonging to PDVSA, Venezuela's state-run oil company, which is under US sanctions. Although the ship itself was not listed as a sanctioned vessel, the White House clarified that its cargo was sanctioned, describing the tanker as part of Venezuela's so-called shadow fleet. The US claims such fleets are used to covertly transport oil and generate revenue for President Nicolás Maduro's government.

Homeland Security Sec-

retary Kristi Noem shared footage of the operation on social media, showing US helicopters landing on the Panamanian-flagged ship named Centurias. Records indicate the ship has previously sailed under Greek and Liberian flags, a practice often associated with efforts to evade tracking and sanctions.

Venezuela strongly condemned the seizure, calling it an act of theft and kidnapping. The Maduro government accused the Trump administration of attempting to steal Vene-

zuelan resources and vowed to take the matter to the United Nations Security Council and other international bodies. Maduro has repeatedly denied US allegations that his government is linked to drug trafficking or terrorism.

The seizure follows increased US military activity in the Caribbean, including deadly strikes on alleged Venezuelan drug-smuggling boats. These actions have drawn scrutiny from US lawmakers, as the military has not publicly

provided evidence linking the targeted vessels to drug trafficking. US officials argue the operations are necessary to dismantle criminal networks and restore regional security.

Venezuela, which holds the world's largest proven oil reserves, relies heavily on oil exports to fund government operations. The repeated tanker seizures and the announced blockade further strain its already fragile economy and deepen geopolitical tensions between the two countries.

Epstein Files Leave Survivors Uneasy



The partial release of documents related to convicted sex offender Jeffrey Epstein has left many survivors disappointed and concerned. Although US law required the Department of Justice to release all Epstein-related materials by the end of the week, many documents were released with heavy redactions, and others were briefly published before being removed.

Survivors and advocacy groups fear that the incomplete disclosures may obscure the full extent of Epstein's crimes. Epstein survivor Liz Stein accused the justice department of undermining the transparency law, warning that a slow and fragmented release could distort the truth. Another survivor, Marina Lacerda, said many victims remain nervous

and sceptical about whether meaningful information will ever be fully disclosed.

The released materials include photographs of Epstein with prominent figures, images of his

properties, and documents referencing high-profile individuals. Authorities have stressed that being named or pictured does not imply wrongdoing, and many individuals mentioned

have denied any involvement in Epstein's crimes.

The Department of Justice has defended the redactions, citing legal obligations to protect victim identities, ongoing investigations, and national se-

curity concerns. Officials said more than 1,200 victims or relatives were identified, necessitating careful handling of sensitive material.

However, legal experts argue the extensive redactions risk fueling conspiracy theories rather than dispelling them. Lawmakers who pushed for the release have criticised the justice department for failing to explain the redactions adequately, with some threatening legal consequences for non-compliance.

Human rights advocates acknowledge the importance of protecting victims but say survivors themselves are eager for accountability and transparency. Many believe full disclosure is essential not only for justice but also to prevent similar abuses in the future.

Deadly Tavern Shooting Shocks South Africa



A mass shooting at a tavern in Bekkersdal near Johannesburg has left nine people dead and ten injured, triggering a large-scale manhunt. Police said around 12 armed attackers arrived in two vehicles during the early hours of Sunday morning and opened fire indiscriminately on patrons.

Seven men and two women were killed in the attack, which authorities described as unprovoked. Some victims were shot while trying to flee, including a taxi driver who had stopped nearby. Residents described scenes of chaos, with injured people being transported to medical facilities using wheelbarrows due to the severity of the situation.

South Africa continues to struggle with extremely high levels of violent crime. Police statistics show an average of 63 murders per day between April and September this year. While motives for the Bekkersdal shooting remain unclear, gun violence is often linked to gangs, alcohol-related dis-

putes, and illegal firearms.

Local officials and residents expressed frustration and fear, saying gunfire has become a nightly occurrence in the area. Community leaders blamed understaffed po-

lice forces and called for military intervention to restore safety.

Experts estimate that alongside three million legally owned firearms, South Africa has at least an equal number of illegal weapons in circulation.

Advocacy groups warn that mass shootings have increased significantly since 2020, particularly at taverns and informal drinking spots.

The attack has reignited national debate on gun control, policing resour-

ces, and community safety. As authorities search for those responsible, residents are left mourning the victims and questioning whether enough is being done to protect ordinary citizens from escalating violence.

SpaceX confirmed that the satellite's propulsion system was likely damaged, leading to fuel venting and loss of control. This caused the

Preference for Explosive Openers

Selectors placed greater faith in Sanju Samson, Abhishek Sharma, and Ishan Kishan for aggressive starts. Their ability to score quickly during the powerplay was considered more suitable to the expected conditions than Gill's relatively steady approach.

Finishing Concerns

India's heavy dependence on Hardik Pandya as a finisher was another concern. To ease that burden, Rinku Singh was recalled, strengthening the lower-middle order. This further reduced room for Gill in the final squad.

Official Explanation

Chief selector Ajit Agarkar clarified that Gill's omission was purely due to combinations and not a reflection of his talent. He stressed that selecting only 15 players inevitably means tough calls.

Overall Picture

While Gill remains a key figure in India's Test and ODI plans, the T20 setup appears to be moving toward a more power-hitting template, costing him a spot for now.

India's T20I captain Suryakumar Yadav is under increasing scrutiny following Shubman Gill's omission. In 19 T20I innings this year, Suryakumar has managed just 218 runs at a strike rate of 123.2, his weakest performance phase since his international debut.

Reports suggest that Suryakumar retained his place largely due to his leadership role. Despite his prolonged dip in form, the selectors showed faith in him as captain, while Gill paid the price for similar struggles.

Clear Warning Issued

According to a PTI report, Suryakumar has effectively been given an ultimatum. If he fails to rediscover form soon, he



could lose not only his influence in the dressing room but also his place in the side.

Gambhir's Influence

The report highlights head coach Gautam Gambhir's strict approach, where results matter above all else. The message is clear that reputation and captaincy will not guarantee selection if performances do not

improve.

Samson's Retention

While Gill was dropped, Sanju Samson retained his spot and was included in the Playing XI for the final T20I against South Africa. His quick 37 off 22 balls strengthened his case as a dynamic top-order option.

Selection Philosophy

The selectors appear to be backing impact over stability, especially at the top of the order. Suryakumar's ability to adapt and deliver match-winning innings will be crucial in the coming months.

Bigger Implication

Gill's omission may signal a tougher selection environment where even senior players are not immune to being dropped if form does not justify their place.


