WHY VANGAVEETI MOHANA RANGA REMAINS A POLITICAL WEAPON IN AP

More than three decades after his assassination, Vangaveeti Mohana Ranga continues to occupy a powerful, and often controversial, space in Andhra Pradesh politics. Every year, on his death anniversary, leaders across party lines line up to pay floral tributes at his statues. The ritual has become routine, almost ceremonial. In election years, it turns into a political spectacle, with intensified visits, emotional speeches, and loud promises to "follow Ranga's ideals." Once the elections pass, however, little changes on the ground.

The enduring political relevance of Ranga is rooted largely in caste dynamics. Over the years, Ranga has come to be projected as an iconic Kapu leader, representing a community that is numerically strong but has long felt politically marginalised. While his supporters argue that Ranga fought for all backward sections, including Kapus, critics point out that these agitations also helped consolidate his own political base. In contemporary Andhra Pradesh politics, his legacy has been reduced to a powerful symbol used to mobilise Kapu sentiment, especially during politically



sensitive moments.

Despite frequent invocations of his name, Ranga's ideological followers have steadily diminished. Many of those who stood with him during turbulent times did not rise as political leaders or accumulate wealth. Several lost their livelihoods, and some even lost their lives. A large section of these followers still believe they were abandoned after Ranga's death, left without representation or recognition. The promise of empowerment that once inspired them remains largely unfulfilled.

A few political figures who were associated with Ranga in their younger days did go on to achieve prominence. Former MLA Malladi Vishnu and sitting MLA Bonda Umamaheswara Rao are often cited as examples. However, critics within Ranga's support base allege that these leaders, now well-entrenched in mainstream

politics, are more focused on safeguarding their own careers than addressing the concerns of Ranga's original followers. This perceived disconnect has further deepened the sense of betrayal among grassroots supporters.

After Ranga, the only leader who has managed to attract significant support from the Kapu community is Jana Sena Party chief Pawan Kalyan. His rise revived hopes among sections of Kapu youth who saw in him a potential mass leader capable of challenging established political structures. Yet, even Pawan Kalyan's appeal operates in a vastly different political context, and comparisons with Ranga often remain emotional rather than ideological.

Attention has also consistently turned to Ranga's family, particularly his son, Vangaveeti Radha Krishna. Despite carrying a powerful po-

litical legacy, Radha Krishna struggled to establish himself as a mass leader. He won an Assembly election only once and subsequently moved across parties, from Praja Rajyam Party to YSR Congress, and later to the Telugu Desam Party, where he currently remains. His political journey has been marked more by transitions than by consolidation. Even his supporters admit that his style of functioning and political aggression do not mirror his father's. Associates often claim that Radha Krishna lacks the hunger for power or wealth that typically drives political success, which, while admirable, may have limited his rise.

Interestingly, Radha Krishna's inability to fill his father's political vacuum has opened the door to renewed speculation around Ranga's daughter, Aasha Kiran. She recently returned to the public eye by organising and participating in Ranga's death anniversary events in Visakhapatnam. Her appearance has triggered political buzz, with reports suggesting that she is exploring opportunities within a "safe" political party. The YSR Congress Party and Jana Sena are being seen as possible options, though no decision has been finalised so far.

Ultimately, Ranga remains a political weapon on because his legacy still carries emotional weight, particularly among Kapus who continue to seek political power and recognition. For political parties, invoking Ranga is less about ideology and more about electoral arithmetic. Until his ideals translate into concrete policies and genuine leadership for his followers, Ranga's name is likely to be remembered more as a symbol to be used than a vision to be fulfilled.

Chandrababu Naidu Urges Parents to Promote Indian Mythology Over Western Superheroes

Tirupati, Andhra Pradesh: Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu called on parents and teachers to instill pride in India's heritage among children by teaching them about heroes from Indian epics instead of Western comic characters. Speaking at the Indian Science Congress held in Tirupati, he said that promoting the values embedded in Indian culture is essential to shaping morally conscious future generations. Naidu remarked that children are increasingly exposed to characters like Spiderman, Superman, and Batman, but often grow up unaware of the great personalities from India's own traditions. "Hanuman is mightier than Superman, and Arjuna is a far greater warrior than Batman or Iron Man," the Chief Minister told the audience, stressing that Lord Rama remains the ultimate embodiment of

virtue and human excellence.

He said that parents and teachers have the responsibility to teach children about Ramayana and Mahabharata, which are far more profound than modern movies like Avatar. The Chief Minister reminisced about the late N.T. Rama Rao (NTR), recalling how he brought mythological stories to life through cinema and reawakened cultural consciousness among people. "At a time when society was forgetting myths and traditions, NTR used his films to revive spirituality and ethics," he said, describing him as a great leader who upheld values in both cinema and politics.

Naidu also praised former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee for laying the foundations of India's development and commended Prime Minister Narendra Modi for advancing those efforts. He encouraged young inno-

vators to pursue original ideas that contribute to national progress, asserting that India is on track to become a superpower by 2047, the centenary of independence.

Highlighting the state's upcoming initiatives, Naidu announced that Tirupati will soon host a Space City. Kurnool will house a Drone City, Anantapur will develop an Aerospace City, and Visakhapatnam will become a hub for a Medical Equipment Park.

He also cited his earlier efforts in promoting the IT sector in Hyderabad, which had empowered Telugu professionals to earn high salaries globally. "Now, we are encouraging quantum computing in Amaravati and have attracted a \$15-billion investment from Google in Visakhapatnam," he added.

Union Minister of State for Science and Technology Dr. Jitendra Singh, who also spoke at the

event, highlighted India's rapid strides in science and technology. He said India's position in the Global Innovation Index has risen from 81st to 38th in a decade. The country now ranks eighth in the global space economy and has made remarkable progress in defense exports.

"There is massive global demand for India's

BrahMos missiles, and we have become a major exporter of COVID-19 vaccines," Singh said. He credited the Modi government for increasing budget allocations to science and encouraging private participation in space and critical minerals sectors.

Naidu concluded that forums like the Indian Science Congress serve as vital platforms to discuss India's progress, reinforce cultural pride, and unite innovation with tradition for the nation's holistic growth.



Velugonda Project to Be Completed by 2026, Says Minister Nimmala Ramanaidu

Amaravati: Andhra Pradesh Irrigation Minister Nimmala Ramanaidu has reaffirmed the government's commitment to completing the long-pending Velugonda Project by 2026. The minister conducted a video conference on Thursday to review the current status of ongoing construction works and instructed officials to expedite the execution process to meet the set deadline. The meeting was attended by Irrigation Advisor Venkateswara Rao, Engineer-in-Chief Narasimharao Murthy, Project Chief Engineer, Superintending Engineers, Executive Engineers, repre-


sentatives of the executing agencies, and other senior officials.

Reviewing the progress, Minister Ramanaidu said that significant headway had been made in the lining works of Tunnel 2, a key component of the multi-district irrigation project. "So far, 3.2 kilometers out of the 7-kilometer-long Tunnel 2 lining works have been completed," the minister informed. "Against the December target of 450 meters, we successfully completed 432 meters of lining.

The remaining 3.6 kilometers will be completed by June 2026 as per the revised schedule," he added. Addressing a major technical hurdle, the minister said that the

Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu is personally monitoring the progress of the Velugonda Project and has instructed the irrigation department to ensure timely execution.

"Under the Chief Minister's guidance, we are intensively supervising every stage of the project to achieve the goal of completing the Velugonda scheme by 2026," he said. The Velugonda Project, once fully operational, is expected to provide irrigation and drinking water to several drought-prone regions of Prakasam, Nellore, and Kadapa districts, significantly boosting agricultural productivity and easing water scarcity in southern Andhra Pradesh.

Coalition Govt Extending Strong Support to Fishermen: Minister Dola Sri Bala

T A N G U T U R U U (Prakasam District): Andhra Pradesh Minister for Fisheries, Dola Sri Bala Veeranjaneya Swamy, reaffirmed the state government's commitment to the welfare of fishermen, stating that the coalition government is determined to uplift the fishing community through a series of welfare and livelihood programs.

Speaking at a programme held at his camp office in Turpunayudupalem of Tanguturu mandal on Friday, the minister distributed traditional fishing nets to several fishermen. He said each unit's cost amounted to 2,43,700,



and nets were handed over to seven beneficiaries in the mandal. Swamy

announced that the government would soon provide motorized boats

along with engines to fishermen across the coastal region.

"Each boat with an engine is worth nearly 52 lakh. The government is taking steps to ensure these reach fishermen through transparent allocation procedures," he said. Highlighting the government's enhanced financial support, he compared the new policy with previous assistance. "Earlier, fishermen's families were given 4,500 as aid. Now, the new coalition government will provide 20,000 to active fishermen who go out for fishing," he said, describing the increase as a clear reflection of the government's pro-fishermen stance.

He further added that the government would extend pensions to fishermen from the age of

50, ensuring social security for those who dedicate their lives to the profession. "This measure will not only help retired fishermen sustain their livelihoods but also recognize their lifelong contribution to the state's marine economy," Swamy said. The minister also announced an upcoming subsidy scheme aimed at diversifying the income base of fishermen's families. Under this initiative, fishermen will be provided with auto-rickshaws at a 40% subsidy rate to help them generate alternate income during the non-fishing season.

"The fishing community forms an essential part of our economy and our society. Fish is a vital

source of nutrition and plays a major role in maintaining public health. The state government is fully committed to expanding the fisheries sector and adopting modern practices to enhance fish wealth (Matysa Sampada) in the state," he said.

Swamy emphasized that only the coalition government could deliver substantial support to fishermen. "Any meaningful economic and social assistance to fishermen's families is possible only through the coalition government led by our alliance. We work with sincerity and responsibility to improve their living standards," he stated, assuring continued support for infra-

structural development in the coastal fisheries sector. He reiterated that the Fisheries Department was implementing several welfare schemes and modernization projects to improve equipment, cold storage, processing, and export infrastructure to benefit fishermen directly. During the distribution programme, senior Fisheries Department officials, including District Joint Director Srinivas Rao and Fisheries Field Officer Ravi Kumar, were present.

Local leaders, TDP functionaries, and several fishermen attended the event and expressed their gratitude to the minister for his proactive initiatives.

New developments in parakamani case

Amaravati: A major development unfolded on Friday in the Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD) Parakamani theft case, as the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) submitted an interim report to the Andhra Pradesh High Court. The report, prepared by the ACB Director General, contains detailed findings on the assets of the key accused, Ravi Kumar, and his family members.

According to sources, the ACB's findings outline significant financial irregularities linked to the accused, who was earlier identified in the alleged misappropriation of funds and valuables from the revered Parakamani, the TTD's temple treasury counting centre.

The interim report was formally handed over to the bench hearing the ongoing case in the High Court. Upon

receiving the report, the Andhra Pradesh High Court stated that it would examine the contents thoroughly before issuing any directives. The court further clarified that appropriate orders would be passed after a detailed review of the ACB's observations and evidence. During Friday's hearing, the bench also directed the state's Criminal Investigation Department (CID) to examine whether the circumstances merit the registration of a fresh First Information Report (FIR) in connection with the case.

Citing earlier Supreme Court verdicts, the High Court observed that based on the evolving circumstances, another FIR could be justified if new evidence or dimensions emerge in the investigation. The court emphasized that while most of the probe has already been

Amaravathi: In a major administrative reshuffle, the Andhra Pradesh Government has issued transfer and posting orders for 11 key officials in the Municipal Administration Department. The coalition government released official proceedings on Friday evening, announcing new appointments for several Municipal Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners across the state.

The transfer exercise aims to strengthen urban governance, enhance administrative efficiency, and accelerate ongoing development projects in municipalities and municipal corporations. With the latest postings, several urban local bodies will witness new leadership taking charge, marking a shift in local-level management and policy execution. According to official sources,

D. Pavani has been appointed as the new Municipal Commissioner of Parvathipuram, while M. Anjaiah has been posted as Deputy Commissioner of Anantapur Municipal Corporation. In Tirupati, U. Sharadadevi has been given charge as the Additional Municipal Commissioner.

Similarly, D. Kondayya has been appointed as the Municipal Commissioner of Chirala. In another key

posting, S. Baby, the Municipal Commissioner of Nandikotkur, has been moved to the Department of Fisheries and Revenue.

G. Venkataramireddy has been appointed as the new Municipal Commissioner of Nandikotkur. The government has also posted P. Sridhar as the new Municipal Commissioner of Kanigiri. The present Kanigiri Commissioner, P.

Krishnamohan Reddy, has been directed to report to the General Administration Department (GAD) for further posting.

Officials in the Municipal Administration Department stated that these changes are part of the government's larger effort to improve accountability and ensure smooth implementation of urban development schemes under the new

coalition administration. The reshuffle also reflects the government's focus on bringing in dynamic officers to critical urban centers to speed up infrastructure, sanitation, and civic service delivery initiatives. The new officers are expected to assume charge immediately, with the changes likely to reflect on field-level administration in the coming weeks.

AP Government Announces Relief for Medically Unfit RTC Employees

Amaravati: In a major relief to Andhra Pradesh State Road Transport Corporation (APSRTC) employees declared medically unfit, the state government has issued fresh orders providing alternative employment opportunities. The decision, aimed at protecting the livelihoods of affected workers, comes as part of the coalition government's broader employee welfare initiative following the merger of APSRTC with the state government. According to an order

issued by Special Chief Secretary M.T. Krishna Babu, those who were declared medically unfit after January 1, 2020, will be offered alternative jobs either within the APSRTC or in other government departments, depending on their qualifications and eligibility. Until now, such provisions were limited only to drivers who were rendered medically unfit before the merger. Under the revised policy, employees falling under 21 categories in APSRTC who become medically unfit will now be eligible for redeployment in equivalent or suitable posi-

tions. The new scheme covers conductors, drivers, mechanics, record

tracers, assistants, and

other staff categories. Officials said that if an employee does not meet the qualifications required for alternative posts within APSRTC, they would be considered for placement in other departments through the respective district collectors. The collectors have been instructed to identify suitable roles matching the educational or technical qualifications of these employees. Those who are not eligible for any alternative employment will receive additional monetary benefits as compensation. Further

more, employees who choose voluntary retirement due to medical unfitness will also be granted additional financial benefits. The government has directed the APSRTC Managing Director and the Commissioner of Public Transport Department to take immediate follow-up action and ensure the new policy's uniform implementation across all districts. The decision has been widely welcomed by employee unions. Leaders from the APSRTC National Mazdoor Union (NMU), Employees Union (EU), and Labour

Council expressed their gratitude to Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu for addressing the long-pending issue of medically unfit staff. They hailed the move as a humane decision that recognizes the service of RTC employees who lost their fitness while performing their duties. Union leaders stated that the decision would not only improve morale among operational personnel but also ensure financial security for those who can no longer continue in physically demanding roles due to health conditions.

Farmer Dies of Heart Attack During Minister Narayana's Public Meeting in Amaravati

Amaravati: A tragic incident occurred on Friday when a farmer attending a public meeting with Andhra Pradesh Minister P. Narayana collapsed and died of a suspected heart attack. The meeting, held in Mandadam village of the Amaravati capital region, was organized to address local farmers' grievances regarding land acquisition for road widening and other development projects.

The deceased, identified as M. Ramulu, a farmer in his late 60s, had attended the meeting to raise concerns about compensation and the return of plots under the state's land pooling scheme. Eye-witnesses said Ramulu appeared highly distressed over the allocation of plots near the seed access road, which he and other farmers considered critical for their livelihoods. Short-



ly after presenting his concerns to Minister Narayana and local MLA Tenali Sravan Kumar, Ramulu suddenly collapsed. Villagers and officials immediately attempted cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and rushed him to a nearby hospital in Tadepalli. Doctors declared him dead on arrival. The unexpected death sent shockwaves through

the local community. Residents said Ramulu had been under immense stress due to ongoing land disputes and was worried about the future of his family's land and compensation. Many described the atmosphere in the village as one of grief and disbelief. The public meeting had been convened to address growing unrest among villagers concerned about losing

their homes and fields to infrastructure projects associated with Amaravati's development. Authorities are reportedly reviewing plans for the acquisition of nearly 100 households and several places of worship in the region, pending further consultations.

Minister Narayana expressed condolences to Ramulu's family and assured that the government remains committed to addressing farmers' concerns. He emphasized that all decisions regarding land pooling and plot allocations would be made after careful consideration of local opinions and in compliance with existing guidelines.

Authorities have launched an investigation to determine the exact cause of Ramulu's death, though preliminary indications suggest it was a cardiac event triggered by stress during the emotionally charged discussion. Farmer groups have called for more transparent and empathetic engagement from the government regarding land and compensation matters.

The incident has highlighted the mental and physical toll of prolonged land disputes and underscored the urgent need for better support mechanisms for farmers affected by development projects in the Amaravati region.

Union Minister Nadda Urges Andhra Pradesh to Adopt PPP Model for Healthcare Expansion

Amaravati: Union Health and Family Welfare Minister J.P. Nadda has sent a detailed letter to Andhra Pradesh Health Minister Y. Satya Kumar Yadav, urging the state government to intensify its adoption of the Public Private Partnership (PPP) model to expand healthcare infrastructure and improve medical services across the state. The communication comes amid political debate in Andhra Pradesh over the best approach to develop new medical colleges and strengthen public health services. In his letter, Minister Nadda outlined the significant role that PPP projects have played in building critical infrastructure in India over the past two decades. He emphasized that the healthcare sector offers similar potential, where

collaboration between the government and private entities can accelerate the construction of new medical colleges, modernize existing hospitals, and enhance diagnostic, dialysis, and technology driven healthcare services.

The Union minister highlighted that the Centre is ready to provide substantial financial support through the Viability Gap Funding (VGF) scheme. Under this framework, up to 60 percent of the total project cost can be supported for setting up medical colleges and related healthcare infrastructure. For pilot projects, the support could extend up to 80 percent of capital expenditure and 50 percent of operational costs during the initial five years. The VGF assistance would be shared equally between the Central and state governments, helping to reduce the



financial burden on Andhra Pradesh while encouraging private participation.

Minister Nadda also drew attention to the India Infrastructure Project Development Fund (IIPDF) scheme, which offers financial assistance of up to 5 crore per project for feasibility studies, technical advice, and project preparation. He recommended that the state government establish a dedicated PPP

sharing responsibilities and risks, the model aims to deliver faster completion of health sector projects, optimize the use of existing facilities, and ensure higher standards of patient care.

Health Minister Saty Kumar Yadav responded by thanking the Union minister for his guidance and assured continued efforts to develop healthcare infrastructure. The Andhra Pradesh government has plans to build multiple medical colleges under the PPP model and will work closely with the Centre to secure necessary approvals and support.

The Union minister's letter reflects the Centre's broader push for innovative financing mechanisms in social sectors and underscores the potential of PPPs to bridge gaps in health infrastructure while enhancing service delivery for the public.

YSRCP's Vellampalli Srinivas Slams Chandrababu Naidu Government Over Governance Issues

Amaravati: Senior YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) leader Vellampalli Srinivas has launched a strong attack on the Chandrababu Naidu-led Andhra Pradesh government, accusing it of failing on multiple fronts, including public welfare, employment, and equitable development across the state. In a statement to the media, Srinivas said the government's policies had disappointed large sections of the population and widened existing socio-economic disparities.

Addressing reporters in Amaravati, Vellampalli Srinivas alleged that despite assurances of good governance and development, the ruling Telugu Desam Party (TDP) had not delivered tangible benefits to ordinary citizens. He claimed that unemployment remained high and that youth in the state were increasingly frustrated due to lack of job opportunities and adequate support from the government. Srinivas also criticised the state administration for its handling of farmers' issues, particularly those related to land pooling and compensation in the Amaravati capital region. He argued that promises made to land-donating farmers had not been fulfilled, leading to ongoing distress in rural communities.

According to him, the

government's apparent neglect of agricultural concerns was creating unrest among farming families who had sacrificed land for the state's development goals. The YSRCP leader further charged the government with neglecting the welfare of workers and marginalised communities. Srinivas claimed that social welfare schemes were either delayed or poorly implemented, failing to reach the intended beneficiaries. He highlighted that the lack of effective outreach and monitoring had weakened the impact of several flagship programmes.

In his critique, Srinivas appealed to the people of Andhra Pradesh to hold the government accountable for its shortcomings. High Court Takes Up Tirumala Parakamani Theft Case, Seeks Detailed Probe

Amaravati: The Tirumala Parakamani theft case has once again come under judicial scrutiny, with the Andhra Pradesh High Court reviewing the progress of investigations into the alleged misappropriation of foreign currency donations at the Tirumala temple's Parakamani, the sacred counting centre for offerings made by devotees.

During a recent hearing, the High Court examined an interim report submitted by the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) detailing the assets and financial background of the prime accused, C. V. Ravi Kumar, and his family members. The court observed that the report would be carefully examined before

issuing further directions and stressed the need for a thorough and transparent investigation given the sensitive nature of the case.

The court also asked the Crime Investigation Department (CID) to clarify whether a fresh First Information Report is required, considering developments in the case and earlier legal proceedings. Judges noted that while significant portions of the probe had progressed, certain aspects still required closer examination to ensure no procedural lapses.

The case dates back to April 2023, when Ravi Kumar, an employee associated with Parakamani operations, was allegedly caught attempting to steal foreign currency

from the donation counting area. An initial theft case was registered at Tirupati police station. However, the matter later became controversial after it was reportedly settled through a Lok Adalat compromise, under which the accused agreed to donate properties to the temple trust.

This settlement triggered widespread concern and legal challenges, with petitioners questioning how a serious theft involving temple donations could be closed without a comprehensive investigation. Acting on these petitions, the High Court directed both the CID and ACB to conduct parallel probes into the theft and the circumstances surrounding the compromise. The agencies

were also instructed to coordinate with central authorities where necessary.

Adding to the gravity of the case, a police inspector who was a key complainant in the matter was found dead under suspicious circumstances earlier this year. The incident raised fresh questions and intensified calls for an impartial and exhaustive inquiry.

Legal observers say the case has far-reaching implications for accountability, transparency, and the handling of public donations in religious institutions.

Devasthanams must be protected and that any wrongdoing related to temple funds must be dealt with firmly. The matter has been posted for further hearing in early January, with the court expected to review additional findings and decide on the next course of action.

Representation submitted to AP government for timely payments

AVijayawada: A formal representation has been made to the Government of Andhra Pradesh seeking immediate intervention to ensure the timely payment of tribal allowances to doctors serving in Primary Health Centres (PHCs) located in notified tribal and agency areas across the state.

The representation, submitted on Tuesday to Mrs. S. Jhansi, IAS, Commissioner, Tribal Welfare Department, highlights long-standing delays in the disbursement of tribal allowances, despite clear government orders already in force.

The memorandum was personally handed over by Dr. Ambati Naga Radhakrishna Yadav, Chairman of the YSRCP NTR District Doctors Wing, accompanied by

Tanubuddi Sekhar Reddy, Chairman of the YSRCP NTR District Trade Wing, at the Commissioner's office in Vijayawada.

Highlights of the representation

According to the representation, as per G.O.Ms.No.411 of the Health, Medical and Family Welfare (A2) Department dated November 5, 2001, doctors working in notified tribal PHCs are entitled to receive a tribal allowance as an incentive for rendering medical services in difficult, remote, and underserved areas. This provision was later revised through G.O.Ms.No.296 dated November 18, 2022, fixing the allowance at 3,500 per month for male doctors and 4,000 per month for female doctors. However, despite these clear directives, field-level im-

plementation remains inconsistent. Many doctors posted in tribal belts reportedly face months-long delays or complete non-payment of allowances. "The government's intention to

motivate and retain doctors in challenging tribal areas is being undermined by the irregular implementation of these sanctioned incentives," the memorandum observed.

A continuing concern amid protestsThis issue has been repeatedly raised by PHC doctors during recent demonstrations across the state in 2025. Their demands included the

clearance of pending tribal allowances, regularization of transfers in agency areas, and timely release of other service benefits. Doctors claim that while policy measures have

served at the grassroots," he said.

He also expressed confidence that the Commissioner, known for her proactive engagement in welfare administration, would look into the matter and issue necessary directions to streamline the payment process. Illicit Liquor Case in Annamayya District: Court Grants Three-Day Custody for Five Accused

Annamayya District: A major development has taken place in the ongoing illicit liquor case that has grabbed attention across the region. The Excise Department has secured three-day police custody of five key accused, following a petition filed before the Thambalapalle Court seeking custody of seven individuals connected to the case. According to sources, the court held a detailed hearing on the Excise Department's petition and subsequently granted custody of five persons while rejecting the request for the remaining two.

The court's decision allows investigators to continue examining the alleged nexus and operations behind the illicit liquor racket that has been under investigation for several weeks. The five accused who were granted custody include A1 Addepalli Janardhan Rao, A26 Jaganmohan Rao, A28 Tandra Ramesh, A27 Tirumala Shetty Srinivasa Rao, and A29 Shaik Alabakh.

All five accused were in judicial remand at



Madanapalle Sub-Jail before being handed over to the Excise officials. Following the court's orders, the Excise police took custody of the accused on Friday. They were first taken to a local government hospital for mandatory medical examination as per protocol. Once the medical procedures were completed, the officials transported them to the Madanapalle Excise Station for further questioning. Excise officials, along with the Special Investigation Team (SIT), are expected to interrogate the accused intensively over the next three days to trace the supply chain and identify other individuals suspected of involvement in the production and distribution of illicit liquor within the Annamayya region. Preliminary investigations have revealed that the accused played

significant roles in the procurement of raw materials, transportation, and distribution network of the illegal liquor operation.

The police aim to gather more evidence regarding financial transactions, production locations, and possible political or business links associated with the case. Authorities have also stepped up enforcement in nearby villages to prevent recurring instances of illicit liquor manufacture.

The Excise Department reiterated that strict action would be taken against anyone found participating in or facilitating such unlawful activities. The three-day custody period is expected to provide crucial leads to the investigation team as they continue their efforts to dismantle the network behind the illicit trade.

Pemmasani Clarifies ROV works

Guntur: Union Minister Pemmasani Clarifies ROV Works Progress Continues. Work on the much-awaited Shankar Vilas Road Over Bridge (ROB) in Guntur is continuing without interruption. Union Minister for State for Railways, Dr. Pemmasani Chandra Sekhar, has clarified. Addressing a press conference in Guntur on Friday, the minister said reports and rumours suggesting a halt in construction were incorrect.

He assured that the project was progressing as planned and nearing another crucial phase. Dr. Pemmasani said that the process of removing the old bridge structure over the railway

track would begin within the next two to three weeks. Once that phase is completed, work would proceed on the second half of the bridge to ensure smoother traffic flow.

He emphasised that the ROB project had already achieved good progress on one side, and after its completion, work would move to the opposite side with equal momentum. The minister also addressed local business concerns and clarified that the demand from some traders for constructing an iconic bridge design at the location was not feasible at this stage. "Constructing an iconic structure in this area would cause more displacement and losses to many traders and residents," he said.

Three killed, three injured as private bus rams into stationary car near Guntur

Guntur: In a tragic road mishap late Thursday night, three people lost their lives and three others sustained injuries after a private travel bus rammed into a stationary car on the national highway near Ankireddypalem in Guntur district. The accident occurred under the jurisdiction of Nallapadu Police Station, leaving behind a scene of devastation and panic among motorists passing through the route.

According to police reports, the victims were returning from Tirupati when the accident took place. Their car had apparently stopped by the roadside due to a technical issue when a private travel bus, heading in the same direction, crashed into it at high speed. The impact was so severe that the car was completely man-

ged, killing three passengers instantly and injuring the other three occupants.

The deceased were identified as Sushila (64), Venkayya (70), and Mahesh (28), all belonging to Suryapet district in Telangana. The injured victims were immediately shifted to Guntur Government General Hospital for treatment. Police stated that their condition is stable but critical medical attention is being provided. Preliminary investigation suggests that overspeeding and driver negligence might have caused the accident.

Eyewitnesses told police that the bus was moving at a high speed and the driver tried to overtake another vehicle when it hit the stationary car. Nallapadu police arrived at the scene soon after being informed by passersby

and launched a rescue operation with the help of local residents. The bodies of the deceased were moved to the government hospital in Guntur for postmortem examination.

Police have registered a case and taken the bus driver into custody for questioning. Efforts are underway to determine whether the bus com-

pany followed safety regulations and if the vehicle had the necessary permits and maintenance clearance. This incident has once again raised concerns about road safety on national highways, particularly during the night hours when heavy commercial traffic and private tour vehicles dominate the roads. Local authorities

have urged transport companies to ensure proper driver rest hours, vehicle maintenance, and adherence to speed limits to prevent such tragic accidents. Police have advised motorists to remain vigilant while parking or halting vehicles along busy national highway stretches, especially during night travel.

Techie Turned Ganja Smuggler Arrested in Anakapalle

Police in Anakapalle district have arrested a gang involved in illegal marijuana trafficking, including a former software professional who allegedly abandoned her IT career to join the drug trade. The operation, conducted by the Nathavaram police, led to the seizure of a large quantity of cannabis and vehicles used in the smuggling network. The key suspect has been identified as Gadi Renuka, a B.Tech graduate and former software employee. Police said Renuka, along with seven others, was apprehended following intelligence on their involvement in transporting cannabis across regions.

During the raid, officers recovered approximately 74 kilograms of dry marijuana, a car, and two motorcycles from the possession of the accused. The estimated value of the seized contraband is

around 33 lakh, according to authorities.

Officials said the gang included individuals from various localities who were allegedly coordinating to move cannabis to different markets. They reportedly used local transport routes through Anakapalle district to supply marijuana and may have been distributing it beyond state borders.

Speaking to the press, Nathavaram Deputy Superintendent of Police Srinivas Rao said the arrests came after a sustained investigation and surveillance of the gang's movements. He warned that narcotics trafficking would be dealt with strictly under the law and urged anyone involved in similar activities to cease immediately.

Renuka's transformation from a professional IT worker to an alleged smuggling operative has shocked the local community. Relatives and neighbors expressed



surprise, noting that she had pursued higher education and a respectable career before reportedly choosing to engage in illegal activity.

A formal case has been registered against all the arrested individuals, and police are continuing the investigation to uncover the full extent of the net-

work and identify possible collaborators. Authorities are also examining whether the gang had links to larger narcotics trafficking rings operating in other states.

The arrests and seizure underscore the growing challenge law enforcement faces in combating drug distribution networks, including those involving educated and formerly legitimate professionals who may be drawn into illegal enterprises for financial gain. Officials emphasized that such activities will continue to be met with strict legal action to curb the spread of narcotics in the region.

High Court Issues Key Orders in Tirumala Parakamani Theft Case

Amaravati: The Andhra Pradesh High Court has issued several significant directives in the high-profile Parakamani theft case, which involves alleged irregularities at the currency counting centre of the Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD). The case first drew attention in 2023 after a clerk was accused of misappropriating foreign currency offerings at the temple.

On Friday, the High Court reviewed a mid-term asset report submitted by the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) regarding the properties of the key accused, C.V. Ravi Kumar, and his family. The court accepted the report and said it would study the findings before issuing further directions, highlighting the need for a thorough examination of the accused's asset holdings.

In addition, the court directed the Crime Investigation Department (CID) to investigate



whether a fresh FIR should be registered in connection with the case. While much of the investigation appears nearly complete, the judges noted there remain critical unanswered questions about asset accumulation, alleged illegal transactions, and the possible involvement of other individuals. The court emphasized the necessity of a deeper inquiry before proceeding further.

The next hearing in the case has been scheduled for January 5, 2026, providing investigators additional time to present detailed evidence and clarifications on unresolved matters. The court's order underlines its commitment to ensuring a comprehensive and transparent probe rather than a superficial investigation.

Earlier, the High Court had directed both the CID

and the ACB to register FIRs and investigate the 2023 theft case, following a petition challenging a Lok Adalat settlement that had previously ended formal proceedings. The court also authorized cooperation between the two agencies and encouraged information sharing with national enforcement bodies to strengthen the investigation.

The Parakamani case involves the alleged mis-

appropriation of foreign currency offerings at the Tirumala temple, raising concerns over procedural lapses and the legality of the settlement reached in Lok Adalat. The High Court's recent orders signal a renewed judicial push to uncover the full facts and determine accountability in what has become one of the most closely watched corruption-related probes in Andhra Pradesh.

KIMS Clarifies Position on Adoni Medical College Tender Confusion in Andhra Pradesh

Amaravati: Amid growing debate over the Public-Private Partnership (PPP) model for new medical colleges in Andhra Pradesh, KIMS Hospitals has issued a statement clarifying that it has no involvement in the tender process for the proposed Adoni Medical College and Hospital project. The announcement came following confusion about a bidder allegedly linked to the hospital network.

The Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences (KIMS), Hyderabad, stated that it did not participate in or submit any bid for the Adoni medical college tender.


As a publicly listed company, KIMS noted that any significant engagement in such projects would have required formal disclosure, which has not occurred.

The misunderstanding reportedly arose from the participation of Dr. Prem Chand, a former director at KIMS, who submitted a bid independently through his own private entity.

State health officials acknowledged that the Andhra Pradesh Medical Services & Infrastructure Development Corporation (APMSIDC) mistakenly associated Dr. Chand's bid with KIMS Hospitals, leading to the circulation of incorrect information. Authorities clarified that Dr. Chand's entity will be evaluated on its own merits, independently of KIMS Hospitals. Should the bidder meet all technical and financial requirements, the project may be awarded accordingly.

In response to the confusion, state officials and health authorities emphasized that the tender evaluation process would proceed transparently, ensuring that all qualified bidders are assessed fairly. KIMS Hospitals' clarification is intended to dispel misinformation and allow the focus to remain on the proper evaluation of bids under the PPP framework. The statement has helped clear misconceptions in public discourse and reinforced the government's commitment to ensuring a transparent, accountable process for developing medical infrastructure in Andhra Pradesh.

Cinema Meets Politics: Jana Nayagan vs Parasakthi and Tamil Nadu's Political Pulse



The Pongal season in Tamil Nadu — traditionally a time for families to celebrate cinema — is poised to be unlike any other in recent memory. This year, two of Kollywood's most anticipated films, Jana Nayagan and Parasakthi, are not just competing for box-office supremacy; they have become proxies in a burgeoning political battleground that may foreshadow the contours of the 2026 Tamil Nadu assembly elections.

At first glance, the Pongal face-off between these films fits within a familiar cinematic ritual: big stars, big releases, and fervent fandom jostling to decide which film will triumph. But this year's clash carries an added layer of symbolic significance. The timing, titles, and associated personalities are shaping what might be the most politically freighted box-office rivalry in recent Tamil cinema

history.

The Set-Up: A Star Turned Politician

Jana Nayagan carries extraordinary weight even before it hits theaters. It stars Vijay, one of Tamil cinema's most bankable and beloved stars, whose recent decision to step into politics has shaken up a political landscape long dominated by the Dravidian parties — primarily the DMK and AIADMK. Vijay's transition from mass entertainer to political figure has blurred the lines between reel and real.

Vijay has declared that Jana Nayagan will be his "last film" before dedicating himself fully to his political aspirations. The film's narrative, reportedly involving a righteous hero confronting systemic corruption and injustice, aligns closely with the larger political narrative Vijay is cultivating: that of a people's champion willing to challenge entrenched power structures.

Commercially, Jana Nayagan is expected to be a massive draw. Vijay's recent track record and fervent fan base make him arguably one of the most bankable stars in India, and all indications point toward strong box-office performance. In the context of 2026, however, the film is far more than a commercial product; it is an early test of Vijay's political capital and public resonance.

The Counterpunch: Parasakthi and Historical Resonance

Waiting in the wings is Parasakthi, a film that evokes historical and ideological gravitas through its title alone. The original 1952 Parasakthi is a cornerstone of Tamil cinema and Dravidian politics: scripted by M. Karunanidhi and starring Sivaji Ganesan, it featured powerful critiques of social inequality, religious orthodoxy, and moral hypocrisy. Its courtroom monologues

became rallying cries in the Dravidian movement and helped shape the political culture of the state.

While the 2026 Parasakthi, starring Sivakarthikeyan, is unlikely to recreate the original's groundbreaking political rhetoric, the choice of title is strategic. The name carries historical weight and an unmistakable connection to the ideological roots of Dravidian politics — a claim the DMK has long cultivated for itself.

Adding to the resonance, the film's release date was deliberately set immediately after Jana Nayagan, ensuring direct competition during the lucrative Pongal festival period. Many observers interpret this timing as a calculated maneuver rather than mere commercial scheduling.

Why the Clash Matters

The collision of Jana Nayagan and Parasakthi is about more than box-office numbers. For Vijay and his

supporters, a smashing opening for Jana Nayagan would not just affirm the film's commercial power but also signify broader cultural and political momentum. It would suggest that Vijay's transition from cinema to politics resonates deeply with audiences — a vital early indicator for the 2026 elections.

For the DMK and its allies, Parasakthi carries a different set of stakes. By invoking a film intertwined with the party's ideological heritage and positioning it to challenge Vijay's blockbuster at a critical moment, they are asserting that the Dravidian legacy remains politically and culturally relevant. A strong performance by Parasakthi, even if not eclipsing Jana Nayagan in pure numbers, could blunt the narrative of Vijay's inevitability and reinvigorate support among key demographics.

The strategic maneuvering around release dates

also reflects a tactical duel. Advancing Parasakthi to coincide with Jana Nayagan is a bold competitive gesture — designed not only to compete for screens and attention but to signal that the DMK is unafraid to confront Vijay head-on.

Industry and Public Reaction

The industry itself will feel this tension in the scramble for screens. Exhibitors must decide how to allocate limited theater space between two colossal releases, while producers of smaller films may find themselves caught between powerful interests, pressured to choose sides or reposition their releases. On social media, fans of both films have already engaged in heated debates. Vijay supporters see Parasakthi's release timing as an attempt to undermine their hero's final cinematic outing, while defenders of Parasakthi argue the clash is a legitimate business deci-

sion. Online discourse highlights both fan loyalty and frustration with the politicization of what should ostensibly be entertainment.

Beyond the Numbers: Cultural and Political Symbolism

The clash between Jana Nayagan and Parasakthi may be the most explicit example yet of film functioning as a political tool. The era when cinema shaped political identity is now intersecting with an era where political identity shapes cinema.

The stakes are not confined to ticket sales. The Pongal box-office battle may foreshadow broader electoral dynamics — from the appeal of charismatic outsiders to the resilience of established ideological narratives. Vaibhav Suryavanshi: Too Exceptional to Be Sheltered — India's Youngest Cricketing Conundrum

At just 14, the Bihar born left hander has accomplished feats that most professional cricketers spend their entire careers chasing. His rapid rise has sparked a profound conversation within Indian cricket: is he too good to be protected, or is his meteoric ascent exactly why protection — thoughtful nurturing rather than cautious restraint — is essential?

The boy from Samastipur has burst onto the cricketing landscape at a pace that defies conventional development pathways. Over the past year, Suryavanshi has accumulated records, accolades, and headlines. He became the youngest centurion in men's T20 cricket, smashing an astonishing century at the age of 14 years and a few days in the Indian Premier League. He followed that with the fastest century in youth One Day Internationals, and went on to set new benchmarks in List A cricket, even breaking established players' records in domestic matches. His performance statistics — an average and strike rate that rival seasoned professionals — suggest a talent far beyond his years.

Yet it is precisely this brilliance that presents Indian cricket with a complex dilemma. Suryavanshi's early success has led to frantic debate on how best to handle a player who seems destined for stardom. Should he be fast tracked

into the senior national team, or should his growth be tempered with caution and patience? Supporters of acceleration argue that his performances merit immediate elevation, especially in formats where his explosive batting style could be transformative. After all, his prowess against high quality bowlers in competitive environments demonstrates a rare composure under pressure.

But the question of whether India should "protect" him takes on a deeper meaning. Protecting a young prodigy is not about shielding him from competition; it is about safeguarding his long term development — mentally, physically, and technically. Cricket history offers cautionary tales of prodigies whose early promise fizzled under the weight of fame and expectation. The twin stories of Vinod Kambli and Prithvi Shaw are often cited: immense talent, early success, but careers that stumbled due to a combination of pressure, inconsistency, and psychological strain. These cases underscore that talent, even extraordinary talent, is not a guarantee of sustained success without the right environment.

The case for protection therefore isn't rooted in skeptics' doubt of Suryavanshi's abilities, but in the very real challenges faced by young athletes thrust into the spotlight. At 14, he is still maturing — physically and emotionally. His cognitive development, his ability to process complex experiences, and his personal

identity are still taking shape. When fame arrives before the foundation is fully formed, the risk is that it overshadows growth rather than fosters it. This is where the notion of protection needs nuance. Protection should mean nurturing rather than sheltering, and it must be thoughtful, structured, and holistic.

For Indian cricket administrators, selectors, coaches, and mentors, the task is clear but difficult: design a pathway that allows Suryavanshi to flourish without overwhelming him. This means exposing him to the best competition available while ensuring that the focus remains on learning, resilience, and adaptability rather than just performance outcomes. It means integrating him into red ball cricket — the traditional format that tests skill, temperament, and endurance — even as he pursues success in white ball formats. Because while T20 cricket has transformed the sport and captured global audiences, a player's longevity and adaptability are often forged in the longer game.

Additionally, support structures around Suryavanshi must be robust. Coaches attuned to psychological development should work alongside technical trainers. His family and close mentors should play a central role in his career decisions, not merely as cheerleaders but as stabilizing influences. Education, life skills training, and opportunities outside of cricket should not be sidelined. For every cricketing achievement, there should

be a parallel emphasis on emotional well-being and personal balance.

Critics of protection might argue that exceptional talent — by definition — demands exceptional opportunities. If Suryavanshi is ready for international competition, then he deserves to be tested at the highest level. This perspective holds merit: some athletes indeed thrive when challenges are presented early. History is not bereft of youthful champions who rose quickly and carved out legendary careers. But each success story also embeds the invisible hand of careful management behind it — mentors who recognized that exposure without support can be damaging.

It is here that the debate should shift from the binary of protect versus promote to a more nuanced model that blends ambition with care. Rapid advancement need not be sacrificed at the altar of safety; rather, advancement should be guided, calibrated, and accompanied by supportive infrastructure.

Suryavanshi's journey also calls Indian cricket to broaden its imagination. Traditionally, youth development pathways have been structured, but often rigid. The arrival of a prodigy at such a young age tests those structures. It forces administrators to ask whether established protocols are adequate to nurture talent of this caliber. Are age group tournaments, training academies, and coaching curricula equipped to handle these outliers? Are policies in place to

ensure that players like Suryavanshi do not burn out or become prey to external pressures from media, fans, and commercial interests?

This conversation extends beyond one individual. It touches on the very fabric of how India nurtures its sports talent. Should the focus remain solely on performance statistics and match results, or should there be equal emphasis on long term career sustainability and emotional resilience? A balanced approach recognizes that the two are not mutually exclusive but in fact synergistic.

As selectors contemplate whether to integrate Suryavanshi into senior squads — especially in upcoming T20 series and global events — they must weigh both his readiness and the potential consequences. Accelerating his exposure to top tier international cricket could fast track his growth, but without a safety net, it could equally expose him to setbacks that a more measured approach might have avoided.

What is certain is that Vaibhav Suryavanshi has already redefined expectations. At an age when most teenagers grapple with studies, friendships, and identity, he is rewriting records and challenging cricketing conventions. He stands as a symbol of modern sport's capacity to surprise, to disrupt, and to elevate talent in astonishing ways. His rise is a reminder that brilliance can emerge from the most unexpected corners — a small town in Bihar becoming the birth



place of a global cricketing sensation.

But brilliance alone is not enough. What follows brilliance — the support system, the development pathway, the psychological grounding — will determine whether Suryavanshi's name becomes enshrined among cricket's greats or becomes another cautionary tale of unfulfilled potential.

In the end, the question is

not whether Vaibhav Suryavanshi is too good to be protected — it is whether Indian cricket is ready to protect him in a way that enables greatness without compromising growth. The true measure of a sporting ecosystem is not how it discovers talent, but how it nurtures and sustains it through the inevitable trials ahead. In that task lies the future of one of cricket's most extraordinary young talents.

Ankita Bhandari Murder Case Sparks Fresh Controversy in Uttarakhand



The high-profile Ankita Bhandari murder case in Uttarakhand has once again stirred political and legal turmoil, as new FIRs (First Information Reports) have been filed and audio-video clips circulating on social media have reignited public debate over alleged links to political figures. The case, which originally involved the 2022 killing of 19-year-old Ankita Bhandari, a receptionist in Rishikesh, continues to draw intense scrutiny.

The latest developments center on viral audio and video clips that appear to implicate senior political leaders in connection with the murder. In response, Uttarakhand police have registered two new

FIRs against individuals alleged to have disseminated misleading content. Those named in the complaints include a former BJP legislator and a woman who reportedly shared the snippets widely.

Among the figures mentioned in the viral material is BJP national general secretary and state in-charge Dushyant Kumar Gautam. Gautam has strongly denied any wrongdoing, calling the clips "misleading and malicious" and asserting that they are part of a deliberate attempt to tarnish his reputation. He has requested the state home department to remove the controversial material from online platforms and take action against those spreading false-

hoods. Gautam also stated that if any allegations against him were proven true, he would resign from public life, reflecting the pressure and seriousness with which he is addressing the controversy.

The resurgence of the case has prompted political backlash, with opposition leaders calling for an investigation by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) under Supreme Court supervision. They argue that only an impartial inquiry can resolve lingering doubts and ensure justice. Protests and political exchanges have intensified across Uttarakhand, with critics alleging that the viral clips point to a larger cover-up involving influential individuals.

The original murder case itself shocked the public. Ankita Bhandari was killed in September 2022 at the Vanantra Resort in Rishikesh, where she worked. Three men, including the resort owner's son, were convicted for her murder in 2025, igniting nationwide debate about women's safety and political influence.

As investigations into the new FIRs and viral content proceed, the case continues to stir emotions, highlighting the complex intersections of crime, politics, social media, and public trust in the justice system in India. The renewed focus may open new avenues for legal scrutiny while also deepening political tensions ahead of future elections.

India Reaffirms Commitment to Extradite Lalit Modi and Vijay Mallya



India's government has reaffirmed its resolve to bring back high-profile economic offenders Lalit Modi and Vijay Mallya to face legal proceedings in the country, following a viral video of the two men in London. The footage shows the former IPL commissioner and the fugitive businessman together at a celebration, with Modi jokingly referring to them as "the two biggest fugitives of India," sparking public criticism and renewed scrutiny of long-running extradition efforts.

The video, reportedly from Mallya's birthday party, shows both men in good spirits. Modi introduces himself and Mallya with a light-hearted tone, a moment that quickly spread across social media. Critics said the clip trivialized serious allegations against them, reigniting debate about India's ongoing efforts to secure their return.

Responding to the video, a spokesperson for the Ministry

of External Affairs (MEA) stated that the government remains fully committed to bringing back fugitives who have fled Indian justice. Officials noted that discussions are ongoing with foreign governments and legal authorities to facilitate their return so they can face trial for the charges pending under Indian law.

Lalit Modi, aged 62, left India in 2010 amid allegations of

large-scale tax evasion, money laundering, and irregularities linked to the Indian Premier League, which he helped establish. He was declared a fugitive economic offender in 2019 after failing to return to face investigations. Vijay Mallya, 69, fled India in 2016 following allegations of fraud and default on loans tied to the now-defunct Kingfisher Airlines and was also branded a fugitive economic offender in 2019. He

owes Indian banks an estimated thousands of crores of rupees in defaulted loans.

The MEA emphasized that the passage of time or public posturing abroad does not diminish India's pursuit of justice. Officials highlighted that legal and diplomatic processes involving extradition and cooperation with foreign legal systems are complex, requiring due process. Nevertheless, they stressed that efforts to bring the fugitives back remain active.

The viral video has reignited public debate on social media and among commentators about the pace of legal action and the challenges India faces in securing extraditions. While the government's reaffirmation aims to reassure citizens of its commitment, observers note that international legal hurdles and diplomatic negotiations will continue to influence the trajectory of these high-profile cases in the months ahead.

Pawar Factions Move Toward Reunion Ahead of Key Maharashtra Municipal Elections



A surprising political development is unfolding in Maharashtra as the two rival factions of the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) — led by Sharad Pawar and his nephew Ajit Pawar — appear to be moving toward an electoral alignment, significantly altering the dynamics ahead of the Pune Municipal Corporation elections and influencing wider civic contest strategies across the state. This shift comes just weeks before local body elections in 29 civic bodies, including major contests in Pune and the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC).

The two sides, long divided following Ajit Pawar's split from Sharad Pawar's faction in 2023 to ally with the BJP-led Mahayuti government, have been in seat-sharing talks for the Pune civic polls. Leaders from both factions are reported to have met to discuss a possible reunion in the municipal elections, potentially contesting together against the BJP

and other rivals. The possible alliance reflects a strategic recalibration after recent local election performances where the NCP factions found themselves on different footing politically. Sharad Pawar's NCP faced challenges in some local body results, while Ajit Pawar's separate faction has been asserting its independent strength within the state's political landscape.

Despite public speculation about a reunion, the Sharad Pawar-led faction has been cautious. Party working presi-

dent Supriya Sule stated that alliance talks are still preliminary and will not proceed until concerns among party workers are fully addressed. She emphasized that there is no final decision yet and that clarity is needed on strategy and seat distribution before any formal agreement is reached.

The potential rapprochement has prompted reactions among other parties, too. The Congress, observing the talks between the NCP factions, has reportedly prepared to contest the Pune civic polls independently if a reunited NCP joins

forces, indicating the fluid nature of opposition alliances in the state.

The backdrop to these developments includes evolving alliances ahead of the BMC elections, where other regional players — including the Shiv Sena factions — are also negotiating partnerships and seat shares. This complex electoral landscape reflects broader shifts in Maharashtra politics, where local body contests often become testing grounds for larger state and national strategies.

As political leaders fine-tune their electoral blueprints, the notion of the Pawar family reconciling their respective NCP factions for the Pune municipal polls has captured public and pundit attention. Whether this tentative coordination will translate into a formal alliance remains to be seen, but it is already reshaping how parties are preparing for what could be a defining moment in Maharashtra's civic elections.

India Condemns Lynching of Dipu Chandra Das in Bangladesh, Calls for Minority Protection



India's government has strongly condemned the brutal killing of Dipu Chandra Das, a 25-year-old Hindu factory worker who was lynched by a mob in Mymensingh, Bangladesh earlier this week. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) described the incident as a matter of grave concern, urging Bangladeshi authorities to bring the perpetrators to justice and ensure the safety of minority communities.

MEA spokesperson Ranbir Jaiswal emphasized that reports of violence against religious minorities — including Hindus, Christians, and Buddhists — cannot be dismissed as media exaggeration or isolated events. He cited documentation of thousands of incidents of minority violence in Bangladesh in recent years, saying that the pattern of hostility is a serious concern. The ministry reiterated that maintaining law and order and protecting all citizens is ultimately the responsibility of the Bangladeshi government.

The lynching of Dipu Chandra Das — who was assaulted by a mob, tied to a

tree, and later set on fire following unverified allegations of blasphemy — has triggered widespread outrage both within India and internationally. At least ten suspects have been arrested in Bangladesh in connection with the murder, and Bangladeshi officials are investigating the case.

Indian authorities and rights groups are pressuring for a thorough and transparent judicial process.

In India, the killing has sparked significant protests. Hundreds of people demonstrated near the Bangladesh High Commission in New Delhi, condemning the lynching and demanding justice and protection for minority communities. Similar protests have taken place in other Indian cities, with demonstrators calling for accountability and increased diplomatic pressure on Dhaka.

The incident has also drawn reactions from public figures and civil society, who described the act as barbaric and called for stronger safeguards against communal violence. Veteran actress Jaya Prada urged people to break their silence

Severe Rainstorms in California Cause Floods, Mudslides, and Three Fatalities



Heavy rainstorms across large parts of California over the Christmas period have caused widespread flooding, mudslides, and the deaths of three people, officials confirmed on Thursday. The severe weather, expected to persist through Friday, has brought heavy rainfall, forcing evacuations, road closures, and widespread disruption across the state.

Some areas of Los Angeles County recorded up to 11 inches of rain, triggering flash floods and mudslides that damaged homes, vehicles, and infrastructure. Emergency services have been working around the clock to rescue residents trapped by rapidly rising waters, including individuals stranded in vehicles on flooded roads. Several communities remain cut off as local authorities assess damage and clear blocked routes.

California's Governor Gavin Newsom declared a state of emergency on Wednesday, covering Los Angeles and other southern counties, to mobilize state resources and expedite relief efforts. The declaration allows for quicker deployment of emergency personnel, National Guard units, and critical supplies to the affected areas.

Power outages have compounded the disruption, with approximately 100,000 residents reported without electricity as of Thursday evening. Utility companies are working to restore service, but officials warned that repair efforts could be slowed due to ongoing severe weather.

conditions.

Authorities have urged residents to exercise caution, avoid travel in affected areas, and follow evacuation orders when issued. Emergency shelters have been opened to provide temporary accommodation for displaced residents, and local agencies continue to monitor river levels, mudslide risks, and other hazards.

Meteorologists have described the storm as part of a larger atmospheric pattern bringing heavy rainfall to the U.S. West Coast, emphasizing that further rainfall could exacerbate flooding and landslide risks. United States Launches "Powerful and Deadly" Strikes on Islamic State in Nigeria



In a dramatic escalation of international counter-terrorism operations, the United States military has carried out a series of airstrikes against Islamic State (ISIS/ISIL) militants in northwest Nigeria, U.S. President Donald Trump announced on Christmas Day. The strikes, described by Trump as "powerful and deadly," underscore Washington's renewed willingness to project military force abroad in pursuit of extremist groups, eliciting reactions from governments and analysts around the world.

President Trump stated that the strikes targeted ISIS elements accused of "viciously killing, primarily innocent Christians" in the region. He pledged that the United States would not tolerate such violence and hinted at the possibility of additional military action if extremist attacks continue. The operation marks one of the most significant U.S. air campaigns in Africa in recent years.

According to U.S. Africa Command (AFRICOM), the operation was conducted in Sokoto State, a northwest region of Nigeria where ISIS-linked groups have been active. While U.S. officials initially stated the action was carried out "at the request of Nigerian authorities," that claim was later clarified. Nigerian officials confirmed cooperation with the United States aimed at countering terrorism. Zelenskyy confirmed that both leaders have agreed on a high-level meeting, with hopes that significant progress — potentially even before the New Year — could emerge from direct engagement. He emphasized that "a lot can be decided before the New Year," underscoring the urgency felt by Kyiv and Washington to make tangible headway after protracted negotiations and lingering battlefield



stalemates.

This announcement follows productive sessions between Zelenskyy and U.S. special envoys, including top advisers connected to Trump's administration. Discussions have revolved around diplomatic frameworks, innovative peace proposals, and formats for future negotiations, even as territorial disputes and control of key regions remain contentious points with

Moscow.

While the exact date and venue for the Trump-Zelenskyy meeting have not yet been confirmed, officials from both sides have signaled optimism. U.S.-Ukraine negotiators have reportedly been working on a comprehensive peace plan intended to create security guarantees, freeze frontline hostilities, and remove structural barriers to a sustainable resolution.

Zelenskyy's willingness to meet directly with Trump reflects both the complexity of the issues at hand and the belief that leadership-level dialogue is critical to bridging gaps that lower-level talks have struggled to close.


However, the path to peace remains fraught. The Kremlin has so far shown reluctance to abandon its demands, particularly over territorial control in eastern Ukraine.

Simultaneously, military engagements continue on the ground, with ongoing clashes and strikes reminding the world that diplomacy must contend with realities on the battlefield.

International observers view the planned meeting as a potential diplomatic milestone. If successful, it could mark a shift from protracted negotiations to tangible breakthroughs in resolving one of the most consequential conflicts in recent decades. Yet analysts caution that a comprehensive peace deal will require sustained negotiation efforts, compromise from both Kyiv and Moscow, and continued engagement from global stakeholders.

As the world watches closely, the Trump-Zelenskyy meeting represents both a symbol of hope and a test of diplomatic resolve in resolving a war that has reshaped the geopolitical landscape and inflicted profound human suffering across Eastern Europe.

Inside Cutting-Edge Brain Surgery: A Glimpse at Alzheimer's Research



In a rare glimpse behind the curtain of modern neuroscience, researchers in Edinburgh are taking bold steps to explore whether Alzheimer's disease can ever be cured. The initiative involves collecting tiny sections of human brain tissue during surgeries, which would normally be discarded, to study the disease at its most fundamental level.

At Edinburgh Royal Infirmary, the atmosphere in the operating theatre is tense but controlled. Medical staff move with precision, while machinery hums and beeps around them. The patient, sedated and covered, lies on the operating table as a MRI scan illuminates the tumor deep within their brain. The cancer, originating in

the colon, had metastasized to the central nervous system. Surgeons must cut through the cortex — the outer layer of the brain responsible for memory, language, and thought — to reach the tumor below.

Professor Paul Brennan, leading the neurosurgery team, explains the delicate balance required: the opening must be large enough to reach the tumor but minimal to protect surrounding healthy tissue.

With surgical drills, the team removes a flap of skull, revealing the pink, pulsing surface of the brain beneath. The operating theatre is a mix of scientific intensity and clinical calm, where every movement matters.

Standing nearby, Dr.

Claire Durrant, an Alzheimer's researcher at the University of Edinburgh, prepares a container of ice-cold artificial cerebrospinal fluid. This fluid mimics the natural environment of the brain, keeping the tissue alive for research after it is removed. Unlike most surgeries where such tissue is considered medical waste, Edinburgh is among the few centers worldwide where it is preserved for dementia research.

When the time comes, a small section of cortex, about the size of a thumbnail, is carefully placed into the container. This tissue provides scientists with a unique opportunity to study human neurons directly, rather than relying solely on animal models or artificial cells. Such research could reveal how Alzheimer's develops at a cellular level, opening doors to new treatments or even preventive strategies.

This approach highlights the intersection of cutting-edge surgery and pioneering neuroscience, where life-saving medical procedures simultaneously fuel efforts to understand one of humanity's most challenging diseases. While a cure for Alzheimer's remains elusive, initiatives like this represent a promising path toward breakthroughs, offering hope that one day, the devastating effects of dementia might be slowed, halted, or reversed.

The collaboration between neurosurgeons and dementia researchers in Edinburgh demonstrates that in the battle against Alzheimer's, every piece of insight — no matter how small — could be a critical step forward.

Arkansas Powerball Jackpot Winner Nets Record-Breaking Prize on Christmas Eve



A Powerball lottery player in Arkansas has won an estimated \$1.817 billion prize in the Christmas Eve drawing, marking one of the largest jackpots in U.S. lottery history. The staggering prize — among the top four in Powerball's history — has reignited interest across the country, as thousands of players eagerly checked their numbers in the final major draw of the year.

The winning ticket matched all five white balls along with the red Powerball number, beating odds of roughly one in 292 million. While the winner's identity and exact location have not been disclosed, organizers confirmed that the ticket was sold in Arkansas, making this only the second time such a massive Powerball prize has been claimed in the state.

The jackpot grew over several months due to repeated rollovers when no player matched all six numbers. The allure of a life-changing sum drove widespread ticket sales, with the game played across 45 U.S. states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Powerball remains one of the nation's most popular lotteries and frequently captures national attention with its enormous prizes.

Winners of large Powerball jackpots can choose between two payout options: an annuity spread over 29 years or a lump-sum cash payment at a reduced amount. In this case, the lump sum is expected to be approximately \$834.9 mil-

lion before federal and state taxes. Historically, most winners have opted for the immediate cash payout, giving them access to a substantial sum upfront.

The last larger Powerball jackpot was in 2022, when a California player won \$2.04 billion, the largest in both Powerball and U.S. lottery history. The Arkansas win now ranks just below that record, highlighting the growing scale of lottery prizes in recent years.

Lottery officials have emphasized that winners often remain anonymous in many states to protect privacy, and it is unclear whether the Arkansas ticket holder will reveal their identity. Additionally, winners face federal tax withholdings of 24%, along with possible state taxes, which can reduce the total amount ultimately received.

News of the win has sparked widespread excitement and speculation across the U.S., as people imagine how such a monumental fortune could transform someone's life. The enormous prize serves as a reminder of the extreme odds of winning, yet also underscores the enduring appeal of lotteries as a vehicle for big dreams and hope during the holiday season.

Tragic Deaths of Two Indian Students in Canada Raise Safety Concerns



Two Indian nationals have been killed in separate incidents in Canada within a span of two weeks, leaving the Indian community and authorities deeply concerned about the safety of international students abroad. Canadian police have confirmed that the two cases are being treated as unrelated, with investigations ongoing in both.

The most recent incident occurred on December 23, 2025, when 20-year-old Indian student Shivank Avasthi was shot dead near the University of Toronto Scarborough campus. Police responding to reports of gunfire found Avasthi with fatal injuries in the Highland Creek Trail and Old Kingston Road area. He was pronounced dead at the scene, and investigators believe the suspects fled before authorities arrived. The motive for the shooting remains unclear, and authorities are actively pursuing leads.

Avasthi, who was pursuing a PhD, lived in Toronto and had been part of the local academic community. The Consulate General of India in Toronto expressed deep anguish over the loss and is in close contact with his family, working with Canadian authorities to provide support.

Just days earlier, another Indian national, 30-year-old Himanshi Khurana, was found dead inside a residence in downtown Toronto. Police initially responded to a missing person report for Khurana, and the following morning discovered her body. The case has been declared a homicide, and a first-degree

murder warrant has been issued for a suspect believed to be known to the victim. Canadian law enforcement is conducting a manhunt in connection with the killing.

The back-to-back tragedies have alarmed the Indian student community in Canada, prompting calls for greater focus on the safety of international students who form a significant part of the country's academic and cultural fabric. Social media reactions from students and community groups reflect a mix of grief, outrage, and worry about personal safety on and off campus.

These incidents also come amid broader concerns about violence affecting foreign nationals. While Toronto remains one of Canada's largest and most diverse cities, police say both deaths are being treated as individual cases with no evidence linking them to each other or to any specific group. The Indian government has reiterated its commitment to supporting its citizens abroad, urging Canadian authorities to conduct thorough investigations and ensure justice. Families of both victims are receiving consular support as they navigate the aftermath of their loved ones' untimely deaths.

As investigations continue, these tragic events have sparked wider discussions on the safety protocols for international students and the responsibilities of host nations to protect those who travel far from home in pursuit of education and opportunity.

Now, Samsung has tried to outdo itself with a phone that folds not once, but three times. The Galaxy Z Trifold arrived wrapped in futuristic promise, whispering about a future where your phone could turn into a tablet, a mini-laptop, or something in between. But in a dramatic twist fit for an offbeat tech tale, the phone's biggest party trick turned out to be its biggest weakness.

The trouble began during a popular online durability test, where phones are scratched, burned, and bent in the name of science and spectacle. While Samsung's earlier foldable phones had survived such trials with only minor bruises, the Trifold chose a more theatrical exit. When pressure was applied from the back, the sleek device bent in a way no engineer would ever want to see. Moments later, the display failed, the frame cracked, and the futuristic dream quite literally folded in on itself.

What makes this episode especially ironic is Samsung's long campaign to convince users that foldable phones are tougher than they look.

The Trifold was designed with multiple hinges, ultra-thin glass, and a complex internal structure meant to distribute stress evenly. On paper, it sounded like a marvel of modern engineering. In practice, however, three folds meant three stress points, and the phone simply couldn't handle

being flexed the "wrong" way.

Social media quickly turned the incident into comedy. Some joked that the device had "folded under pressure" just like a nervous intern. Others imagined users accidentally breaking it while pulling it out of a tight pocket or sitting down too fast. Memes flourished, sympathy was scarce, and the Trifold became an unexpected symbol of technology trying to run before it

could walk. To be fair, no one bends their phone with both hands in daily life. Samsung has pointed out that extreme durability tests don't reflect real-world usage. And that's true. But such tests tap into a deeper fear consumers have about experimental gadgets: what happens when innovation out-runs practicality?

The Galaxy Z Trifold's failure doesn't mean foldable phones are doomed. Instead, it highlights the delicate balance between ambition and reliability. Sometimes, pushing boundaries leads to breakthroughs. Other times, it leads to a cracked screen and a viral video.

For now, Samsung's trifold experiment stands as a reminder that while the future may be flexible, it still has limits. And occasionally, even the smartest technology learns the hard way that folding too much can be one fold too far.

iQOO Z11 Turbo: A Mid-Range Phone with Main-Character Energy

While megapixels don't always guarantee magic, iQOO seems keen to attract users who want their phone to double as a pocket photography tool.

Selfie lovers aren't ignored either, with a capable front camera tipped to handle video calls and content creation with ease.


Visually, the phone is expected to feature a sharp OLED display with vibrant colours and smooth motion. Whether it's gaming, movies, or doom-scrolling at mid-

night, the screen is designed to look good while being easy on the eyes. Adding to its tough-guy persona, the device is also said to come with strong water and dust resistance, making it surprisingly rugged for a phone that also wants to look stylish.

Pricing is where the Z11 Turbo becomes especially interesting. Despite its heavyweight specs, it is expected to sit in the mid-range bracket, undercutting many premium rivals. That makes it feel like an overqualified candidate applying for an entry-level job.

If the final product lives up to the early buzz, the iQOO Z11 Turbo could be one of those rare phones that feels slightly rebellious—too powerful, too bold, and too ambitious for its own category. And in a market that often feels predictable, that's exactly what makes it worth watching.

The idea behind lecture mode seems simple but powerful: not everyone learns best by reading. For students, researchers, and professionals juggling packed schedules, listening to a detailed explanation while commuting, exercising, or

doing household chores could be a game-changer. Instead of skimming through dense PDFs, users could let an AI narrator guide them through the logic, context, and key arguments at a comfortable pace.

There is also a subtle shift in how AI is being positioned here. NotebookLM is no longer just a smart assistant that answers questions; it is edging closer to the role of a tutor. By offering


