

KCR Attacks Revanth Reddy Government, Vows to Fight for Telangana's Water Rights and Projects

Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) president and former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekhar Rao (KCR) made a significant public appearance on Sunday after a long hiatus, sharply criticizing the incumbent Telangana Congress government led by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy and setting out his party's opposition strategy ahead of the next electoral battle.

Addressing the media at Telangana Bhavan, Rao branded the current state administration a "useless regime" that has failed to protect the interests of the people of Telangana, especially regarding irrigation and water rights. He accused the government of betraying the state by failing to exert sufficient pressure on the Central government to approve and expedite key irrigation projects, most notably the stalled Palamuru-Rangareddy Lift Irrigation Scheme.

Rao alleged that the detailed project report (DPR) of the Palamuru-Rangareddy initiative was returned by the Centre due to poor handling by the state



government. He claimed that both state and central governments were neglecting Telangana's water needs, disadvantaging farmers and weakening agricultural growth in large parts of the state.

"This government has not done justice to Telangana's water rights," KCR stated emphatically. "We will now fight for the rights of our farmers and people. We will expose the failures of both the state and central leadership through public meetings and mass agitation."

Rao also indicated that the BRS will organize public movements to mobilize voters and highlight what he de-

scribed as ongoing injustices. His comments come amid growing political tensions in Telangana, where the Congress government has been in power for nearly two years following the defeat of the BRS in the 2023 assembly polls.

The former chief minister's remarks drew an immediate reaction from the state's Irrigation Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy, who dismissed KCR's claims as "90 percent false." Reddy noted that most major irrigation schemes either collapsed or were incomplete when the BRS was in power for ten years, questioning Rao's credibility on water infrastructure and project

execution.

Reddy also challenged KCR to explain why certain long pending irrigation works, including the SLBC and Dindi projects, remained unfinished despite significant financial allocations and political control during his tenure.

Beyond water and irrigation, Rao's speech reflected broader frustration with the state administration's governance record.

He accused the Congress leadership of failing to meet several promises made to the electorate and questioned why Telangana's development had slowed under their stewardship.

The political opposi-

tion has reacted strongly. The Telangana unit of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) mocked Rao's return to active politics, with the state party chief characterizing him as a "one-time password (OTP)," suggesting KCR's influence had waned and that the BRS lacked credibility due to alleged corruption during its previous rule.

As both parties prepare for intensified politicking ahead of the next state elections, Rao's press meet is likely to reignite debates over governance, regional development, and the management of Telangana's critical water resources.

RTC Turns Profitable with Mahalakshmi Scheme: Deputy CM Bhatti Vikramarka Reviews Key Initiatives

Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka has announced that the Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (RTC) has turned profitable, thanks to the success of the Mahalakshmi Scheme, which provides free bus travel for women. Addressing a review meeting at Praja Bhavan on Sunday with RTC and BC Welfare Department officials, the Deputy CM highlighted several initiatives taken by the people's government to strengthen RTC and improve public services.

The meeting was attended by Transport Minister Ponnambal Prabhakar, Finance Principal Secretary Sandeep Kumar Sultania, Special Principal Secretary Virendra Raj, RTC MD Nagireddy, MJP Secretary Saidulu, and senior officials from the BC Welfare and Transport Departments.

Speaking at the meeting, Bhatti Vikramarka said that the Mahalakshmi Scheme has not only benefited women by ensuring safe and free travel but also contributed significantly to RTC's financial turnaround. He added that the government's support, along with loans from women's self-help groups, enabled the corporation to introduce new buses and develop bus depots and stations. Officials were instructed to explore ad-



ditional revenue streams independently to further strengthen RTC operations.

The Deputy CM stated that under the Mahalakshmi Scheme, RTC has facilitated 25.5 crore free journeys, marking a significant step towards women's empowerment.

He noted that the previous government left RTC with 1,400 crore in PF dues and 600 crore in CCS dues, which have now been reduced to 660 crore and 373 crore respectively under the current administration.

Bhatti Vikramarka also directed officials to enter into an agreement with the Centre for Good Governance to distribute special Mahalakshmi cards, ensuring that every woman in Telangana can avail the benefits. He highlighted the PM e-DRIVE initiative, under

which 2,800 electric buses are being introduced in Hyderabad, and 100 electric buses will serve Nizamabad and Warangal. Adequate charging stations and infrastructure are to be provided for these buses.

In addition to transport initiatives, the Deputy CM emphasized the timely distribution of school uniforms, books, and shoes at the start of the academic year. He instructed officials to ensure that free electricity dues for Rajaka and Nai Brahmin community associations are cleared monthly without delays.

Bhatti Vikramarka also stressed the government's focus on education, mentioning approval for 100 integrated schools with corporate-style buildings and the release of 152 crore for Gurukul schools cover-

ing rent, mess, and cosmetic charges. For the protection of Geeta workers, 30,000 Katamayya protection kits have been distributed so far.

During the review, Transport Minister Ponnambal Prabhakar requested approvals for recruitment of Assistant Traffic Managers, temporary and regular conductors, Chief Accounts Officers, and permission for user charges to address issues in driving license issuance.

He also sought approvals for new vehicles to strengthen enforcement and tablets for tax collection.

Deputy CM Bhatti Vikramarka assured that the government is committed to RTC's growth, women's empowerment, and strengthening education and public services across Telangana.

Jagga Reddy Slams Kishan Reddy Over Letter to Sonia Gandhi, Defends Congress Governance

Hyderabad: Telangana Pradesh Congress Committee (TPCC) Working President Jagga Reddy on Friday launched a sharp attack on Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy over his letter to Congress leader Sonia Gandhi, questioning the BJP leader's moral authority and political credibility. Addressing the media at Gandhi Bhavan, Jagga Reddy said Kishan Reddy had no justification to write to Sonia Gandhi when he failed to question Prime Minister Narendra Modi over unfulfilled promises made to the nation.

Raising a pointed question, Jagga Reddy asked why Kishan Reddy never wrote a letter to Prime Minister Modi regarding the assurances given by the BJP during the 2014 and 2019 elections.

tions. "If Kishan Reddy had questioned Modi on his guarantees, only then would he have had the eligibility to write a letter to Sonia Gandhi," he remarked, dismissing the Union Minister's letter as having "no value."

Jagga Reddy recalled several promises made by Prime Minister Modi, including bringing back black money from abroad, depositing 15 lakh into the accounts of every poor citizen, and creating two crore jobs annually. He alleged that even after 11 years in power, the Prime Minister failed to deliver on these assurances. "In Telangana and Andhra Pradesh, Modi's performance is zero," he asserted, adding that BJP leaders have no moral right to question Sonia Gandhi.

He further said the Congress government has already implemented farm loan waivers up to 2 lakh under Rythu Bharosa and is providing a 500 bonus per quintal for paddy. Schemes to provide 12,000 assistance to agricultural labourers are under process, while ef-

orts are underway to identify tenant farmers.

Jagga Reddy also listed welfare initiatives such as 200 units of free electricity under Gruha Jyothi, allocation of Indiramma houses to constituencies, expansion of Aarogyasri coverage to 10 lakh, steps to enhance pensions to 4,000, and distribution of fine rice and ration cards. He claimed that nearly 70 percent of Congress promises have been implemented within two years.

Challenging Kishan Reddy to a public debate, Jagga Reddy asked whether the BJP was ready to compare Modi's unfulfilled promises with Congress's implemented guarantees, asserting that Congress has delivered 10 out of 13 assurances made to the people.

Protest in Rangareddy Against Removal of Gandhi's Name from National Employment Guarantee Scheme

Rangareddy, December 21, 2025: A strong protest was held in Azinagar, Moinabad Mandal, Rangareddy district, following the All India Congress Committee's (AICC) call against the removal of Mahatma Gandhi's name from the National Employment Guarantee Scheme. TPCC President and MLC Mahesh Kumar Goud actively participated in the demonstration, joined by AICC Secretary Vamsi Chand Reddy, district president Challa Narasimha Reddy, several MLAs, former

MPs, sarpanches, MPTC and ZPTC members, and leaders of affiliated organizations.

Addressing the gathering, Mahesh Kumar Goud emphasized the vital role Mahatma Gandhi played in India's struggle for independence. "Gandhi dedicated his life entirely to the service of the nation," he said, highlighting that during his visits to villages, statues of Gandhi, Nehru, and Subhash Chandra Bose were installed and revered as symbols of dedication and leadership. He called

Goud strongly criticized the BJP government, asserting that it has politicized welfare and employment schemes along caste and religious lines since coming to power in 2014.

He reminded the public that the BJP promised two crore jobs annually, yet in twelve years, no credible records exist to support the creation of even a fraction of the expected 24 crore jobs. He

also condemned the privatization of public sector institutions and the government's failure to provide meaningful employment opportunities, which, he argued, undermines the vision of long-term national development.

The TPCC Chief noted that historic leaders like Jawaharlal Nehru had implemented farsighted policies to ensure equality and fair opportunities for all citizens. "The present central government, under Modi, has not only failed to implement proper employ-

ment measures but is also fostering divisions among communities under the pretext of religion," Goud added.

Goud expressed strong opposition to replacing Gandhi's name from the employment scheme, stressing that such actions erase the legacy of freedom fighters who sacrificed their lives for India's independence. He called on citizens and officials to support inclusive employment programs and maintain the spirit of equality, justice, and national service.

The protest also highlighted the Congress party's broader concern over central government bias against states, emphasizing that regional development and welfare initiatives must be protected from politicization. The event concluded with a demand for the immediate reinstatement of Mahatma Gandhi's name in the National Employment Guarantee Scheme, reflecting the party's commitment to preserving the principles of equality, fairness, and social justice for all.



Gandhi Bhavan: Rohtak MP Deepender Hooda Criticizes BJP Policies

Hyderabad:

In a strong statement at Gandhi Bhavan, Rohtak MP Deepender Hooda criticized the BJP government for politicizing welfare schemes and undermining programs named after Mahatma Gandhi.

Hooda alleged that the central government seeks to dismantle MNREGA (Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act), affecting over 13 crore poor citizens nationwide who depend on it for livelihood, especially during crises like COVID-19 when food and work schemes were crucial.

Hooda said that unlike the UPA era, where schemes such as the Rozgar Yojana were fully funded by the center, the current BJP government is shifting the financial burden onto states while keeping powers centralized.

"States report workdays, but the central government now determines workdays and controls funds, leaving Panchayati Raj institutions powerless," he noted.

Hooda emphasized that the central government is gradually attempting to dilute or remove MNREGA, a move the Congress cannot accept.

He further criticized the BJP for renaming schemes initiated under Congress leaders, such as Indira Gandhi's welfare programs, under the BJP banner, claiming the party seeks to replace iconic names and symbols with its own political identity. Hooda also condemned attempts to change national symbols and songs, alleging efforts to replace "Vande Mataram" with RSS-aligned tunes.

Highlighting the attacks on the Gandhi family, Hooda recalled how Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi faced harassment over the National Herald case. Despite repeated claims of money laundering by

private complainants, and multiple agencies registering cases for political motives, the courts ultimately dismissed them, proving the Congress leaders' innocence. Hooda praised Rahul Gandhi for his legal struggle and insisted that truth eventually prevailed over political vendetta.

In conclusion, Hooda reaffirmed that India continues to follow Mahatma Gandhi's principles and that the Congress party will oppose any attempts to undermine welfare schemes designed for the poor. He urged the government to focus on strengthening social security programs rather than politicizing them for electoral gains.

This statement underscores ongoing political debates about centralization of powers, the future of rural employment schemes, and the protection of legacy welfare programs in India.

STF Cracks Down on Ganja Peddling in Hyderabad, Two Accused Held with Over 1.2 kg of Contraband



Hyderabad: In a major crackdown on illegal narcotics trade, the Special Task Force (STF) teams conducted two separate operations in Hyderabad on Friday, December 20, 2025, and seized more than 1.2 kilograms of ganja from two individuals involved in illegal drug peddling. The operations were carried out in Kukatpally Housing Board Colony and the Musheerabad Excise Station limits based on credible information.

In the first incident, an STF team led by Circle Inspector Nagaraju apprehended a man near the Missamma Handloom Shop in Kukatpally Housing Board Colony. Acting on specific inputs that ganja was being sold in the area, the STF personnel conducted a raid and caught the accused red-handed while allegedly selling the contraband. During the search, the police seized 862 grams of ganja from his pos-

session. A scooter used for transportation of the drug was also confiscated.

Following the seizure, the accused, along with the recovered ganja and seized vehicle, was handed over to the Kukatpally Excise Station for further legal action. Officials stated that a case has been registered and an investigation is underway to ascertain the source of the ganja and identify any possible links to a larger drug network.

In a second operation conducted on the same day, STF Team 'C', along with Sub-Inspector Manju and staff, apprehended another accused in the Sitaphal Mandi area under the limits of Musheerabad Excise Station. The accused was identified as V. Ganesh, son of Habibabu, aged 33 years, a resident of Sitaphal Mandi, Secunderabad.

According to police, Ganesh was found in possession of 415 grams (0.415 kg) of dry

ganja, which was seized during the operation. The STF team arrested the accused and handed him over to the Station House Officer (SHO) of Musheerabad for further investigation. Relevant documents and the seized contraband were also submitted to the excise authorities.

Police officials stated that these operations are part of ongoing efforts to curb the sale and distribution of narcotics in the city. They warned that strict action will be taken against those involved in drug trafficking and urged the public to share information related to illegal activities.

The STF reiterated its commitment to maintaining law and order and ensuring that Hyderabad remains free from the menace of drugs, emphasizing that surveillance and enforcement measures will be intensified in the coming days.

Congress Government Gives Top Priority to Sports Development: Adam Santosh Kumar

Registering Cases for BC Reservations Rally Is Shameful: Left Parties

Qutubullapur, December 21:

Leaders of the Left parties strongly condemned the registration of police cases against participants of a peaceful rally taken out in support of Backward Classes (BC) reservations, calling the move "shameful" and reflective of anti-BC attitudes. They demanded the immediate withdrawal of all cases filed in connection with the BC Bandh.

Addressing the media after appearing before the Medchal court on Saturday, CPI district secretary Uma Mahesh, CPI mandal secretary K. Swamy, and CPM mandal secretary Keelukani Laxman said a rally was organized on November 18 at Shapur Nagar in Qutubullapur as part of the statewide BC Bandh call. The rally, held under the leadership of Left parties, aimed at mobilizing public support and ensuring the success of the bandh.

The leaders asserted that the rally was conducted in a completely peaceful manner without any untoward incidents, violence, or damage to public or private property. Despite this, police cases were registered against the organizers and participants, which they described as

highly unjustified and condemnable.

They questioned the contradiction between the government's stated support for BC reservations and the actions of local authorities. "On one hand, the government claims to extend complete support to BC reservations and even endorses the BC Bandh. On the other hand, officials are registering cases against those who organized a peaceful rally. This is a serious and un-

fortunate development," the leaders said.

The Left leaders alleged that the filing of cases during a protest in support of BC rights amounts to suppressing democratic voices and reflects an anti-BC mindset. They demanded that the government demonstrate sincerity and commitment toward BC welfare by immediately withdrawing all cases registered during the BC Bandh.

The leaders further

stated that peaceful protests and rallies are a democratic right and should not be criminalized. They warned that continuing such actions would deepen mistrust among BC communities and fuel resentment against the authorities.

Earlier in the day, CPI

district secretary Uma Mahesh, CPI mandal secretary K. Swamy, and CPM mandal secretary Keelukani Laxman appeared before the Med-

chal court in connection with the cases. Following their court appearance, they issued a joint statement reiterating their demand for justice and withdrawal of the cases.

They called upon the state government to take corrective measures and ensure that democratic movements in support of social justice and BC

reservations are encouraged rather than discouraged.



Mother Tongue Is Not a Barrier, It Is the Bridge India's Education System Needs



The State of the Education Report for India 2025 makes one truth unmistakably clear: language lies at the heart of India's learning crisis as well as its solution. Titled "Bhasha Matters: Mother Tongue-Based Education in India", the report challenges a long-standing assumption in Indian schooling—that early education delivered in dominant or "aspirational" languages automatically improves learning outcomes. Instead, it presents compelling evidence that the continued neglect of mother-tongue instruction has deepened learning gaps, reinforced inequality, and weakened foundational education across the country.

India's linguistic diversity is unparalleled. Thousands of languages and dialects are spoken across its regions, yet the classroom remains stubbornly monolingual or narrowly multilingual. For millions of children, the language of instruction is not the language of thought, home, or community. This disconnect, the report argues, is not a marginal issue—it is a systemic failure that undermines comprehension, participation, and confidence during the most critical years of learning.

The Cost of Ignoring the Child's First Language

The SOER 2025 highlights a sobering reality: a significant

proportion of Indian children enter school without familiarity with the language used for teaching. When young learners are forced to decode unfamiliar words before understanding concepts, learning becomes mechanical rather than meaningful. This results in poor foundational literacy and numeracy, learning deficits that accumulate over time and often culminate in dropout or disengagement.

The report emphasizes that language disadvantage disproportionately affects children from tribal communities, rural areas, migrant families, and economically weaker sections. While privileged students may overcome early language barriers through home support or private schooling, marginalized children bear the brunt of a system that treats linguistic diversity as an inconvenience rather than an asset.

Education systems are meant to level the playing field. When language itself becomes an entry barrier, schooling risks reproducing social inequality instead of dismantling it.

Mother-Tongue Instruction: Evidence, Not Emotion

The argument for mother-tongue education is often dismissed as sentimental or politically motivated. The SOER 2025 firmly counters this per-

ception by grounding its recommendations in cognitive science and global evidence. Children learn best when taught in a language they understand. Concepts introduced in a familiar language are grasped faster, retained longer, and applied more effectively.

Crucially, mother-tongue instruction does not hinder the acquisition of additional languages. On the contrary, the report stresses that strong foundational learning in the first language accelerates second- and third-language acquisition. Multilingual education, when well designed, produces learners who are cognitively flexible, culturally grounded, and linguistically confident.

Thus, the debate is not about choosing between local languages and global competitiveness. It is about sequencing and pedagogy—ensuring that children first learn how to learn before being pushed to learn in unfamiliar languages.

Policy Promise vs Classroom Reality

India's National Education Policy 2020 acknowledged the importance of mother-tongue education, particularly in the early years. However, the SOER 2025 notes that implementation remains uneven and largely symbolic. Many states lack trained teachers fluent in local languages.

Teaching-learning materials are scarce or poorly developed. Teacher education programmes rarely equip educators with multilingual pedagogical skills.

As a result, the idea of mother-tongue instruction often remains confined to policy documents rather than classrooms. English-medium education continues to be equated with quality, despite evidence to the contrary. Parents, driven by aspirations for social mobility, frequently opt for schools that promise English proficiency, even if it compromises comprehension in the early years.

The report argues that without systemic support, parental choice alone cannot drive meaningful change. What is needed is a coordinated national mission that aligns curriculum design, teacher training, assessment methods, and community engagement around multilingual education.

Language, Identity and Dignity

Beyond learning outcomes, the report makes a powerful case for the cultural and social value of mother-tongue education. Language is inseparable from identity. When children see their language excluded from formal education, it signals that their culture is inferior or irrelevant. This silent message erodes self-worth and belonging.

India's linguistic heritage is not merely a cultural artefact—it is living knowledge embedded in oral traditions, local histories, and indigenous wisdom systems. Education that sidelines these languages risks severing children from their communities and erasing invaluable knowledge traditions.

By contrast, schools that embrace linguistic diversity become spaces of inclusion and respect. They affirm that education is not about assimilation into a dominant culture, but about empowering learners where they are.

The Way Forward

The SOER 2025 proposes clear and actionable steps: a national mission on mother-tongue and multilingual education, sustained investment in teacher recruitment and training, development of quality learning materials in local languages, and active community participation in curriculum development.

Technology, the report notes, can play a transformative role—by enabling digital content creation in multiple languages and supporting teachers in multilingual classrooms. But technology must complement, not replace, strong pedagogical foundations.

Most importantly, political will is essential. Language policy in education must rise above ideological debates and



electoral calculations. The question is not which language should dominate, but how every child can be given a fair start.

Conclusion

The State of the Education Report for India 2025 does more than diagnose a problem—it challenges India to rethink the very foundations of its education system.

Mother-tongue instruction is not a step backward into parochialism; it is a step forward toward equity, quality, and meaningful learning.

If India is serious about improving learning outcomes, reducing dropouts, and achieving true educational inclusion, it must begin where learning begins—

with the language of the child. Anything less would be an abdication of responsibility to millions of young learners whose potential remains locked behind a language they do not yet understand.



BJP Dominance In Maharashtra Local Polls



The ruling Mahayuti alliance registered a sweeping victory in the Maharashtra local body elections, with the Bharatiya Janata Party emerging as the single largest party. Results declared for 288 Nagar Parishads and Nagar Panchayats showed the BJP winning 129 seats, consolidating its dominance across urban local bodies after nearly a decade-long gap in such elections. The outcome marked a major setback for the opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi, particularly the Congress and Shiv Sena UBT factions, which conceded defeat soon after results became clear.

Polling was conducted on December 2 for 264 municipal councils and nagar panchayats, followed by elections in over 20 additional bodies on December 20. Vote counting began at 10 am and quickly indicated a decisive trend in favour of the ruling alliance. Despite expectations of a tough contest due to agrarian distress, partial implementation of welfare schemes for women, and farmer dissatisfaction over financial aid, the opposition failed to capitalise on these issues electorally.

Congress state chief Harsh Vardhan Sapkal accused the State Election Commission of

facilitating the Mahayuti's victory and sarcastically congratulated it for its role. He also issued a warning to BJP allies Eknath Shinde and Ajit Pawar, claiming that the BJP would eventually sideline them after consolidating power. Senior Shiv Sena UBT leader Ambadas Danve echoed similar sentiments, alleging that the ruling parties relied on money and muscle power to secure their win.

On the other hand, BJP leaders attributed the success to positive campaigning and public trust. Union Home Minister Amit Shah described the result as a blessing from the people

for the welfare-driven vision of the NDA governments at both the Centre and the state, led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis emphasised that he avoided negative campaigning, focusing instead on explaining development plans, which he said resonated with voters.

The victory strengthens the BJP's grassroots presence and reinforces its political momentum in Maharashtra. It also raises questions about the opposition's organisational strength and strategy ahead of future state and national elections.

Modi And Kharje Clash Over Infiltration Issue



The political confrontation between the BJP and Congress intensified over the issue of illegal immigration, with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge exchanging sharp remarks. Speaking in Assam's Namrup, where he inaugurated development projects including a major fertiliser plant, PM Modi accused the Congress of indulging in anti-national activities by encouraging illegal Bangladeshi immigrants to settle in Assam for vote-bank politics.

The Prime Minister alleged that the Congress opposed voter list revisions to protect illegal settlers and claimed that his government was committed to safeguarding the identity, land, and cultural pride of the Assamese people. He further stated that despite correcting many historical mistakes made by Congress over the last 11 years, significant work remained to restore the country fully.

Illegal immigration from Bangladesh remains a highly sensitive issue in Assam, with authorities deporting over 400 illegal infiltrators, including Rohingya, in the past year.

The BJP has repeatedly highlighted this as a governance and national security concern.

Congress chief Mallikarjun Kharge strongly rejected the Prime Minister's accusations,

double-engine government. According to Kharge, responsibility for border security and infiltration prevention rests entirely with the ruling party.

Kharje condemned PM Modi's statements, saying the Prime Minister habitually shifts blame to the opposition whenever his government fails to deliver. He clarified that the Congress does not support infiltrators or anti-

national forces and would back any genuine action taken in the national interest.

The exchange reflects the deepening polarisation between the two major parties ahead of upcoming elections. Immigration, identity, and national security continue to be key political flashpoints, especially in border states like Assam, where public sentiment remains sharply divided on the issue.

Terror Search Operations Intensify In Udhampur



Security forces and Jammu and Kashmir Police launched extensive search operations in Udhampur district after reports emerged that two unidentified terrorists had visited a village house for food. The incident occurred in Chor Motu village of Majalata tehsil, located around five kilometres from the site of a recent encounter between terrorists and security forces.

According to official sources, the terrorists visited the house of a local resident, Mangtu Ram, on Saturday evening and took food before disappearing into nearby forested areas. This development raised serious security concerns, prompting authorities to cordon off the village and initiate intensive searches.

The visit followed a deadly encounter earlier in the week in which a police officer was killed. Two of the three terrorists involved in that encounter were believed to have been injured but managed to escape under the cover of darkness and dense forest terrain. Security agencies suspect that the same group may be responsible for approaching villagers for food and

shelter.

In response, a large-scale joint operation was launched, stretching from the international border to mountainous regions along the Line of Control. The operation forms part of a broader area domination exercise aimed at preventing infiltration and eliminating hiding militants.

Intelligence inputs suggest that terrorists may be exploiting foggy weather conditions


to infiltrate across the border. Officials have noted a resurgence of activity at terror launch pads in areas opposite Jammu, Samba, Kathua, and Rajouri districts.

A senior BSF officer recently revealed that Pakistan has reactivated around 72 terror launch pads near the border, months after suffering damage to its infrastructure during India's Operation Sindoora. Of these, 12 are active near

the international border in Sialkot and Zafarwal sectors, while about 60 are located across the Line of Control.

The incident underscores the persistent security challenges in the region and highlights the role of villagers, terrain, and weather in counter-terrorism efforts. Authorities continue to appeal for public cooperation while maintaining heightened vigilance.

Pilot Assault Case Sparks Controversy



A controversy erupted after an Air India Express pilot, Captain Virendra Sejwal, was accused of assaulting a passenger at Delhi Airport's Terminal 1 following a dispute over queue jumping.

The incident quickly gained traction on social media, prompting public outrage and official action by the airline.

Captain Sejwal, through a statement issued by a law firm, denied wrongdoing and claimed the incident had been misrepresented as a professional conflict. He clarified that he was traveling as a passenger, not on duty, and that the matter was purely personal between two individuals. The statement alleged that the other passenger, Ankit Dewan, initiated the confrontation and used abusive and casteist language, along with threats against the pilot's family.

Ankit Dewan, however, alleged that Captain Sejwal physically assaulted him after a verbal argument over the use of a staff security queue. Dewan claimed he was travelling with his family, including a four-month-old child, and was advised by airport staff to use the staff queue. He said the pilot insulted him and later beat him, leaving him injured. Dewan also alleged that he was coerced into signing a statement agreeing not to pursue legal action to avoid missing his flight and losing expensive holiday bookings.

Captain Sejwal's statement countered these claims, asserting that both

parties voluntarily signed a mutual statement in the presence of CISF personnel, who offered them the option to file complaints. The CISF later confirmed that the matter was resolved mutually and without coercion.

Despite the pilot's defence, Air India Express took swift action, removing him from duty pending an internal investigation. The airline condemned any form of violent behaviour and stated that disciplinary action would follow based on inquiry findings.

The case highlights the growing impact of social media narratives, workplace accountability, and the fine line between personal disputes and professional conduct, especially when public figures are involved.

Infant Death Highlights Healthcare Failure



A deeply disturbing incident from Jharkhand's West Singhbhum district exposed serious gaps in the state's healthcare and emergency transport systems. An Adi-vasi Ho family was forced to carry their four-month-old child's body home in a vegetable bag after being unable to secure a mortuary van from the district hospital.

Dimba Chatomba and his wife Roybari, residents of a remote village near Chaitabasa, had taken their infant to the Sadar Hospital after the child developed severe illness.

Despite receiving treatment, the baby died on December 19. Hospital records confirmed the death but did not mention the cause.

Following the death, the

family requested a mortuary van but were allegedly told that none were available.

According to Dimba, hospital staff warned that transporting the body openly would not be allowed on public buses. Eventually, hospital staff reportedly pooled Rs 400 to purchase a vegetable bag and bus tickets, placed the infant's body inside the bag, and instructed the parents to travel nearly 80 kilometres back to their village.

The incident sparked widespread outrage, with locals and activists condemning the indignity faced by the grieving family. Neighbours stated that the unavailability of mortuary vehicles was common, often due to poor road conditions or drivers demanding extra

payment. In response, Jharkhand Health Minister Irfan Ansari announced corrective measures, including the procurement of four mortuary vehicles for every district hospital at a cost of Rs 15 crore. He also claimed that an internal inquiry found that the family left without waiting for the ambulance and that one vehicle was non-functional while another was already in use.

The incident highlights systemic failures in healthcare access, especially for tribal and rural communities. It has reignited discussions on poverty, infrastructure neglect, and the urgent need for dignified healthcare services, even after death.

Saudi Arabia Records Execution Surge



Saudi Arabia has carried out a record number of executions for the second consecutive year, prompting widespread condemnation from human rights groups. According to UK-based organisation Reprieve, at least 347 people have been executed this year, surpassing last year's total of 345. The group described this as the bloodiest year since it began monitoring executions in the kingdom.

The latest executions involved two Pakistani nationals convicted of drug-related offences. Reprieve reports that roughly two-thirds of those executed this year were convicted of non-lethal drug crimes, a practice the United Nations considers incompatible with international human rights standards. More than half of those executed were foreign nationals, raising concerns that migrant workers are disproportionately affected.

Among those executed were women, a journalist, and individuals who were minors at the time of their alleged crimes. Human rights organisations have highlighted cases involving torture, forced confessions, and lack of legal representation. Reprieve described the Saudi justice system as one where abuse is endemic and ac-

countability is absent.

The surge in executions follows the lifting of an unofficial moratorium on drug-related executions in late 2022. Since then, families of death row inmates have spoken of living in constant fear, with executions often carried out without prior notification. Relatives are typically not informed in advance, not given the bodies, and not told burial locations.

Saudi Arabia's de facto ruler, Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, has overseen significant social reforms, including easing restrictions on women and opening the country to global tourism and entertainment. However, human rights groups argue these changes mask an increasingly harsh crackdown on dissent and civil liberties.

Despite international criticism, Saudi authorities maintain that the death penalty is imposed only after exhaustive judicial processes and only for the most serious crimes. The UN and multiple rights organisations have called for an immediate moratorium on executions, warning that Saudi Arabia's current approach undermines global human rights norms.

Kate Winslet On Fame And Intrusion



Kate Winslet has reflected on the intense media scrutiny she faced after rising to global fame as Rose in *Titanic*, describing the experience as frightening and overwhelming. Speaking on BBC Radio 4's *Desert Island Discs*, the actor said paparazzi intrusion reached extreme levels, including phone tapping, surveillance, and even people rummaging through her bins to speculate about her diet.

Winslet said her life was turned upside down after *Titanic*'s release in 1997. While the filmmaking experience itself was positive, she admitted she was not emotionally prepared for the sudden global attention. Media coverage frequently focused on her body, using what she described as abusive language and unrealistic, digitally altered images.

She revealed that negative comments about her appearance began long before fame. As a child, she was mocked by peers and discouraged by authority figures who suggested she would only be cast in stereotypical roles. These experiences led to unhealthy dieting dur-

ing her teenage years.

During periods of intense media pressure, including her divorce from director Sam Mendes, Winslet relied on small comforts and close friendships to cope. She spoke candidly about how everyday routines and support from neighbours helped her survive emotionally challenging times.

Winslet also criticised the media's manipulation of her image, recalling moments when she saw heavily edited magazine covers that bore little resemblance to her real appearance. She said she spoke out because she did not want young women to chase unattainable standards based on false representations.

Now preparing for her directorial debut, Winslet noted that gender bias persists in the film industry. She said women are still spoken to differently than men in leadership roles, often receiving patronising advice that would never be directed at male directors. Her response to such remarks today, she said, is simple and confident, reflecting the self-assurance she has gained over time.

US Seizes Venezuelan Oil Tanker Again



The United States has seized a second oil tanker that recently departed from Venezuela, escalating tensions between Washington and Caracas. The operation, confirmed by the US Department of Homeland Security, comes just days after President Donald Trump announced a blockade targeting sanctioned oil tankers entering and leaving Venezuela. The vessel was intercepted in international waters by the US Coast Guard, following a similar seizure earlier in the month.

According to US officials, the tanker was carrying oil belonging to PDVSA, Venezuela's state-run oil company, which is under US sanctions. Although the ship itself was not listed as a sanctioned vessel, the White House clarified that its cargo was sanctioned, describing the tanker as part of Venezuela's so-called shadow fleet. The US claims such fleets are used to covertly transport oil and generate revenue for President Nicolás Maduro's government.

Homeland Security Sec-

retary Kristi Noem shared footage of the operation on social media, showing US helicopters landing on the Panamanian-flagged ship named Centurias. Records indicate the ship has previously sailed under Greek and Liberian flags, a practice often associated with efforts to evade tracking and sanctions.

Venezuela strongly condemned the seizure, calling it an act of theft and kidnapping. The Maduro government accused the Trump administration of attempting to steal Vene-

zuelan resources and vowed to take the matter to the United Nations Security Council and other international bodies. Maduro has repeatedly denied US allegations that his government is linked to drug trafficking or terrorism.

The seizure follows increased US military activity in the Caribbean, including deadly strikes on alleged Venezuelan drug-smuggling boats. These actions have drawn scrutiny from US lawmakers, as the military has not publicly

provided evidence linking the targeted vessels to drug trafficking. US officials argue the operations are necessary to dismantle criminal networks and restore regional security.

Venezuela, which holds the world's largest proven oil reserves, relies heavily on oil exports to fund government operations. The repeated tanker seizures and the announced blockade further strain its already fragile economy and deepen geopolitical tensions between the two countries.

Epstein Files Leave Survivors Uneasy



The partial release of documents related to convicted sex offender Jeffrey Epstein has left many survivors disappointed and concerned. Although US law required the Department of Justice to release all Epstein-related materials by the end of the week, many documents were released with heavy redactions, and others were briefly published before being removed.

Survivors and advocacy groups fear that the incomplete disclosures may obscure the full extent of Epstein's crimes. Epstein survivor Liz Stein accused the justice department of undermining the transparency law, warning that a slow and fragmented release could distort the truth. Another survivor, Marina Lacerda, said many victims remain nervous

and sceptical about whether meaningful information will ever be fully disclosed.

The released materials include photographs of Epstein with prominent figures, images of his

properties, and documents referencing high-profile individuals. Authorities have stressed that being named or pictured does not imply wrongdoing, and many individuals mentioned

have denied any involvement in Epstein's crimes.

The Department of Justice has defended the redactions, citing legal obligations to protect victim identities, ongoing investigations, and national se-

curity concerns. Officials said more than 1,200 victims or relatives were identified, necessitating careful handling of sensitive material.

However, legal experts argue the extensive redactions risk fueling conspiracy theories rather than dispelling them. Lawmakers who pushed for the release have criticised the justice department for failing to explain the redactions adequately, with some threatening legal consequences for non-compliance.

Human rights advocates acknowledge the importance of protecting victims but say survivors themselves are eager for accountability and transparency. Many believe full disclosure is essential not only for justice but also to prevent similar abuses in the future.

Deadly Tavern Shooting Shocks South Africa



A mass shooting at a tavern in Bekkersdal near Johannesburg has left nine people dead and ten injured, triggering a large-scale manhunt. Police said around 12 armed attackers arrived in two vehicles during the early hours of Sunday morning and opened fire indiscriminately on patrons.

Seven men and two women were killed in the attack, which authorities described as unprovoked. Some victims were shot while trying to flee, including a taxi driver who had stopped nearby. Residents described scenes of chaos, with injured people being transported to medical facilities using wheelbarrows due to the severity of the situation.

South Africa continues to struggle with extremely high levels of violent crime. Police statistics show an average of 63 murders per day between April and September this year. While motives for the Bekkersdal shooting remain unclear, gun violence is often linked to gangs, alcohol-related dis-

putes, and illegal firearms.

Local officials and residents expressed frustration and fear, saying gunfire has become a nightly occurrence in the area. Community leaders blamed understaffed po-

lice forces and called for military intervention to restore safety.

Experts estimate that alongside three million legally owned firearms, South Africa has at least an equal number of illegal weapons in circulation.

Advocacy groups warn that mass shootings have increased significantly since 2020, particularly at taverns and informal drinking spots.

The attack has reignited national debate on gun control, policing resour-

ces, and community safety. As authorities search for those responsible, residents are left mourning the victims and questioning whether enough is being done to protect ordinary citizens from escalating violence.

Vivo V70 and X Series India Launch Plans Surface



Multiple Launches Planned

Vivo is reportedly gearing up to introduce several smartphones in India in early 2026. These include the Vivo V70 series, Vivo X200T, and Vivo X300 FE.

Launch Timeline

According to tipster Abhishek Yadav, Vivo may launch the V70, V70 Elite, and X200T models in late January 2026. The

X300 FE is expected to arrive later.

Pricing Expectations

Starlink Satellite Anomaly Triggers Controlled Reentry



Incident in Orbit

A SpaceX Starlink satellite suffered a failure shortly after launch and has since been tumbling uncontrollably in low Earth orbit. The satellite lost contact at an altitude of around 418 kilometres.

Cause of Failure

SpaceX confirmed that the satellite's propulsion system was likely damaged, leading to fuel venting and loss of control. This caused the

spacecraft to alter its orbit and release small debris fragments.

Debris and Safety Measures

The released debris is described as slow-moving and trackable, posing no threat to the International Space Station or its crew. SpaceX is coordinating with NASA and the US Space Force to monitor the situation.

OnePlus 15T Emerges as Compact Flagship Contender



Upcoming Addition

OnePlus is reportedly preparing to expand its flagship 15 series with a new model called the OnePlus 15T. Leaks suggest this device will be positioned as a compact flagship, balancing powerful hardware with a relatively smaller form factor. Trial production of accessories has reportedly begun, indicating that the launch cycle may already be underway.

Display and Design

According to tipster Digital Chat Station, the OnePlus 15T is expected to feature a 6.3-inch flat display with 1.5K resolution. The panel is likely to be AMOLED and could support a high 165Hz refresh rate, placing it among the smoothest displays in the premium segment. The phone is also tipped to come with a metal frame, enhancing durability and premium appeal.

Performance and Security

The device is rumoured to be powered by the Qualcomm Snapdragon 8 Elite Gen 5 processor, making it a top-tier performer. For security, OnePlus may include a 3D ultrasonic fingerprint sensor embedded under the display, a feature generally reserved for flagship smartphones.

Camera Capabilities

front, the OnePlus 15T is said to feature a dual-camera setup on the rear, comprising a 50-megapixel primary sensor and a 50-megapixel telephoto lens. The inclusion of a telephoto sensor indicates a focus on optical zoom and portrait photography.

Battery and Extras

One of the most striking rumours is the battery size, which is said to exceed 7,000mAh. If

accurate, this would be exceptional for a compact flagship. Reports also mention a magnetic snap-case accessory in white or grey colour options.

Launch Timeline

The OnePlus 15T is expected to debut in China in the first half of 2026. It may later arrive in India under the name OnePlus 15s, though official confirmation is still awaited.

Oppo Reno 15 Pro Mini India Launch Details Leak

Compact Flagship Strategy

Oppo appears to be entering the compact flagship space with the Reno 15 Pro Mini. Recent leaks indicate that the company is planning to launch the device in India, marking a shift toward premium yet smaller smartphones in its Reno lineup.

Expected Launch Window

According to tipster Gadgetsdata, the Oppo Reno 15 Pro Mini could launch in India by late December 2025 or January 2026. The device reportedly carries the model number CPH2813.

Display and Performance

The smartphone is said to feature a 6.32-inch flat OLED display with 1.5K resolution and a 120Hz refresh rate. Under the hood, it is expected to be powered by the MediaTek Dimensity 8450 processor, positioning it as a high-performance device.

Advanced Camera Setup

Camera hardware appears to be a major highlight. The Reno 15 Pro Mini is tipped to sport a triple rear camera system, including a 200-megapixel primary sensor, a 50-megapixel

Samsung Galaxy Z Flip 8 May Debut Exynos 2600

New Chipset Integration

Samsung is reportedly considering equipping its upcoming Galaxy Z Flip 8 with the newly launched Exynos 2600 processor. This would mark another generation of Samsung's flip phone using an in-house chipset.

Reason Behind the Move

Industry sources suggest that rising memory and component costs may be driving Samsung to rely more on Exynos processors. Using its own chipset could help the company better control production costs.

Exynos 2600 Highlights

The Exynos 2600 is built on a cutting-edge 2nm fabrication process using Gate-All-Around technology. It features a powerful multi-core CPU configuration, with clock speeds reaching up to 3.8GHz, and an Eclipse 960 GPU based on ARMv9.3 architecture.

AI and Camera Support

The chip includes a 32K MAC NPU for en-



hanced AI processing. It supports up to 320-megapixel single-camera sensors and high-resolution

displays with refresh rates up to 120Hz.

Launch Expectations

The Galaxy Z Flip 8 is expected to be unveiled in July 2026, alongside the Galaxy Z Fold 8. Unless

major issues arise with the chipset, the Exynos 2600 is likely to power the device.

Shubman Gill Dropped from T20 World Cup Squad

Surprise Omission

Shubman Gill's exclusion from India's T20 World Cup 2026 squad came as a major shock, especially since he was India's T20I vice-captain and a regular opener alongside Abhishek Sharma. Officially, the BCCI cited poor form and team combination issues, but reports suggest deeper strategic reasons behind the decision.

Decision Taken in Advance

According to reports, Gill was not informed in advance about his omission and only found out once the squad was announced. The Ajit Agarkar-led selection committee had reportedly decided on his exclusion a few days earlier after closely evaluating conditions and team balance.

Pitch Conditions a Key Factor

The nature of pitches expected during the T20 World Cup 2026 played a crucial role. With India scheduled to play matches at multiple venues, pitches are likely to slow down as the tournament progresses. This increases the importance of explosive powerplay batting, an area where selectors felt Gill lagged behind others.



Selectors placed greater faith in Sanju Samson, Abhishek Sharma, and Ishan Kishan for aggressive starts. Their ability to score quickly during the powerplay was considered more suitable to the expected conditions than Gill's relatively steady approach.

Preference for Explosive Openers

India's heavy dependence on Hardik Pandya as a finisher was another concern. To ease that

burden, Rinku Singh was recalled, strengthening the lower-middle order. This further reduced room for Gill in the final squad.

Official Explanation

Chief selector Ajit Agarkar clarified that Gill's omission was purely due to combinations and not a reflection of

his talent. He stressed that selecting only 15 players inevitably means tough calls.

Overall Picture

While Gill remains a key figure in India's Test and ODI plans, the T20 setup appears to be moving toward a more power-hitting template, costing him a spot for now.

Suryakumar Yadav Faces Pressure After Gill Exit

Poor Run of Form

India's T20I captain Suryakumar Yadav is under increasing scrutiny following Shubman Gill's omission. In 19 T20I innings this year, Suryakumar has managed just 218 runs at a strike rate of 123.2, his weakest performance phase since his international debut.

Captaincy Shield

Reports suggest that Suryakumar retained his place largely due to his leadership role. Despite his prolonged dip in form, the selectors showed faith in him as captain, while Gill paid the price for similar struggles.


