Supreme Court Issues Landmark Directive on RTE Act Implementation, Seeks Reports by March 31

New Delhi: In a historic ruling emphasizing educational equity, the Supreme Court of India has directed the Centre and all state governments, including Andhra Pradesh, to ensure strict compliance with the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009. The bench mandated that governments submit detailed reports on actions taken by March 31, 2026, underscoring that education is not merely literacy but a tool for social integration. The verdict, delivered on Tuesday, reinforces the constitutional right to education under Article 21A, aiming to bridge socio-economic divides in classrooms. Chief Justice D.Y. Chandrachud, leading the bench, stressed that children from diverse backgrounds—be it a rickshaw puller's child, a

millionaire's offspring, or even a judge's ward—must sit on the same bench and study together. "True social change happens only when a poor child and a rich child grow up together," the court observed, echoing the Act's vision of inclusive education. Key Mandates for RTE Compliance At the heart of the ruling is the mandatory 25% reservation of seats in private unaided schools for children from economically weaker sections (EWS) and disadvantaged groups. The court clarified that this is not an act of charity but a fundamental, enforceable right. Schools must fill these seats without fail, ensuring no discrimination based on caste, religion, or wealth. The judgment highlights how early integration fosters brotherhood, mutual respect, and societal unity. "Walls of prejudice must not divide young minds," the bench noted, warning against segregating students. Non-compliance

could invite contempt proceedings, with the court monitoring progress closely. Implications for Andhra Pradesh and Beyond For Andhra Pradesh, where private schools dominate urban education, the directive poses a fresh challenge amid ongoing debates on school fees and infrastructure. Parents' groups like the Parents Association of Andhra Pradesh (PAAP) a registered body (No. 6/2022) advocating for affordable education hailed the ruling as a "wake-up call." PAAP Secretary, reachable at +91 63053 13558 or parentsassociationap@gmail.com, urged immediate audits of RTE seat allocations in districts like Ongole and Vijayawada. State Education Minister Botsa Satyanarayana's office has yet to respond, but officials indicated compliance reviews starting next week. Nationally, the Ministry of Education must coordinate with states to verify admissions, reimbursements

to schools, and anti-discrimination measures. Past reports show uneven implementation: only 60-70% of reserved seats filled in many states, per 2025 data. Broader Social Impact The ruling revives the RTE's original intent, enacted in 2010 to guarantee free education for ages 6-14. Critics argue commercialization has diluted it, turning schools into "profit packages for rulers." The court rejected such trends, prioritizing children's futures over business interests. Legal experts predict this could spur policy reforms, including better funding for reimbursements and teacher training. As PAAP puts it: "Education is not a business or a begging bowl it's the right of tomorrow's generations." With the March 31 deadline looming, governments face pressure to act. This verdict not only safeguards RTE but rekindles hope for a more equitable India, one classroom at a time.

NTR Vijayawada Commissionerate Achieves Breakthroughs with AI-Powered Policing

Vijayawada: The NTR (Vijayawada) Police Commissionerate is setting new benchmarks in law enforcement by leveraging artificial intelligence (AI)-based technologies. Over the past year and a half, these tools have transformed crime control, investigations, detection, traffic management, public safety, and crowd control. City Police Commissioner SV Rajasekhara Babu spearheaded their introduction, yielding impressive results across multiple domains. A flagship initiative is 'ASTRAM' (Actionable Intelligence for

Sustainable Traffic Management), an AI system deployed to tackle urban congestion. It monitors traffic in real-time across the city, pinpointing peak-hour bottlenecks, their causes, and affected areas. Alerts are instantly sent to traffic personnel, enabling swift diversions and management. Dramatic Traffic Decongestion Since its rollout in October 2024, ASTRAM has slashed average daily traffic congestion from 97 kilometers across 83 key junctions to just 48 kilometers by November last year a 50% reduction. "This real-time intelligence has made our roads smoother and safer," Commissioner Babu noted. Com-

plementing this, the commissionerate partnered with the public to install 10,000 CC cameras within its jurisdiction. These have proven game-changers in cracking thefts, robberies, and related crimes. Record Recovery Rates Last year saw 816 such cases registered, with 596 (73%) solved a testament to the cameras' efficacy. Victims lost Rs 13.89 crore, but police recovered Rs 11.21 crore (80.70%), hailed as a national record. No other unit in the country matches this recovery figure. Criminals are now captured on at least four to five cameras per incident, boosting detection and restitution. AI extends to crowd

management through real-time mounting cameras that count vehicles and people at temples, prayer halls, festivals, and fairs. This allows proactive measures to prevent stampedes. Seamless Festival Security During last year's Durga Temple Dasara celebrations and Bhavani Deeksha conclusion, the system ensured no untoward incidents. It tracked devotee influx, vehicle counts, queue lengths for darshan, and wait times with pinpoint accuracy, averting overcrowding. Similar success marked Vaikuntha Ekadashi, with live crowd estimates at one temple providing vehicle and pilgrim tallies for

optimal flow. Plans are underway to extend this to over 200 temples citywide, enhancing safety during peak events. Commissioner Babu emphasized holistic integration: "AI isn't replacing police but amplifying our capabilities. From predictive policing to data-driven decisions, we're building a smarter Vijayawada." These innovations have not only curbed crime but also fostered public trust, with citizens actively contributing cameras and data. As Andhra Pradesh pushes digital governance, the NTR Commissionerate's model could inspire state-wide adoption, proving AI's potential in proactive policing.

Chandrababu Naidu Pushes for Youth-Led Future with AP FIRST Research Hub in Tirupati

Amaravati: Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu on Friday emphasized the Andhra Pradesh government's commitment to empowering the youth by identifying future job sectors and building skills from now onward. In a key meeting at his Undavalli camp office, Naidu greenlit the establishment of "AP Futuristic Innovation and Research in Science and Technology" (AP FIRST), a massive research center centered in Tirupati, poised to become the state's innovation powerhouse. The discussions involved Aero Space Defence advisors, IT-Digital Transformation consultants, and senior officials from the Drone Corporation of Andhra Pradesh. Naidu outlined the government's comprehensive plans to drive development across all sectors, noting that companies are eager to invest. He highlighted emerging fields like aerospace, defence, space technology, AI-cyber security, semiconductor devices-sensors, quantum technology, healthcare, biotechnology, green energy, and rural area technology as critical for the future. A standout announcement was India's first green ammonia plant in Kakinada, marking a milestone in green energy. To support this, AP FIRST will operate at full capacity to skill youth, combining the strengths of Tirupati's premier institutions IIT Tirupati and IISER Tirupati. "This will be a prestigious initiative; execute it with excellence," he directed officials, instructing them to engage the central government for effective implementation. Naidu's vision aligns with his long-standing focus on technology-driven growth. Since assuming office, his administration has prioritized futuristic sectors to position Andhra Pradesh as a national leader. The AP FIRST hub, envisioned as the largest of its

kind, will bridge academia, industry, and government, creating job opportunities for the state's young population. Officials revealed that the center will focus on research in cutting-edge domains, from quantum computing to biotech, ensuring Andhra Pradesh stays ahead in the global innovation race. Speaking to the media in Amaravati, Lokesh highlighted ambitious plans to export green energy from Kakinada to major international markets including Germany, Singapore, and Japan.

sunny days annually, and strong wind resources along its 974-km coastline. Kakinada, a key industrial port city in the Godavari delta, is being developed as the epicenter of these efforts. Plans include large-scale solar farms, offshore wind projects, and green hydrogen production facilities, all integrated with export-oriented infrastructure. Lokesh detailed that the projects would involve cutting-edge technologies like floating solar panels and electrolyzers for hydrogen, sourced from global partners. "Billion-dollar investments from international firms will not only generate employment but also drive ancillary industries in manufacturing, logistics, and R&D," he added. The jobs spanning engineers, technicians, and skilled laborers—promise to uplift local communities, particularly in East Godavari and neighboring districts. A key highlight is the upcoming green energy export corridor from Kakinada. High-voltage direct current (HVDC) lines and undersea cables will facilitate

shipments to energy-hungry nations. Germany, aiming for 80% renewable energy by 2030, Singapore's net-zero goals by 2050, and Japan's hydrogen society push make them ideal partners. Lokesh noted ongoing memorandums of understanding (MoUs) with firms from these countries, signed during recent investor summits. The minister promised a major update on Friday evening at 6 PM, where specifics on investment commitments, timelines, and partnerships will be unveiled. This could include details on the first phase, targeting 5 GW of capacity within three years. Andhra Pradesh's green push aligns with India's national targets of 500 GW non-fossil capacity by 2030. Under Naidu's Vision 2050, the state aims for 50 GW renewables, with incentives like single-window clearances and land banks accelerating projects. Critics from the opposition YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) have questioned feasibility, citing past delays, but Lokesh dismissed them, pointing to TDP's track record in IT and electronics. If realized, this could transform Andhra Pradesh's economy, reducing carbon emissions and boosting GDP. As the world races toward net-zero, the state's gambit positions it as a leader in the green economy.

Visakhapatnam: At just 28, Alexander Wang has not only become a billionaire but risen to the role of Chief AI Officer at tech giant Meta. Recently, he shared intriguing advice for children, forecasting that a 13-year-old mastering “vibe coding” with AI tools could become the next Bill Gates. “If you’re 13, spend all your time on vibe coding. Live your life through it,” Wang urged, emphasizing its potential to give the next generation a massive edge in future job markets.

What is Vibe Coding? This emerging trend revolutionizes program-

ming by relying on natural language and AI-assisted tools, bypassing traditional coding languages. Unlike conventional coding, which demands expertise in syntax-heavy languages like Python or Java, vibe coding lets anyone describe ideas in plain English via simple prompts. AI platforms such as Replit or Cursor then convert these into functional code, enabling users to build apps effortlessly. In essence, users just say what they want, and AI does the heavy lifting.

No deep technical knowledge required. Wang envisions this democratizing software



creation, allowing kids and non-engineers to innovate rapidly. Echoes of Tech Pioneers Wang draws parallels to leg-

ends like Bill Gates and Mark Zuckerberg, who rose to billionaire status by tinkering with early computers in their

youth. “They gained a huge advantage playing with first-generation machines,” he noted. In today’s AI era, he

predicts the same: those experimenting with AI tools early will dominate. “The next Bill Gates will emerge from

kids vibe coding instead of gaming or sports,” Wang advised youth, warning that AI will reshape products and services. Who is Alexander Wang? Wang’s meteoric rise is legendary. At 19, he founded Scale AI, a startup revolutionizing data labeling for machine learning.

By 24, he became a billionaire, setting records. Now 28, he leads Meta’s AI division as Chief AI Officer and heads its Superintelligence Lab, the highest-paid executive there. His insights carry weight in Silicon Valley. Google CEO Pichai Weighs In Google CEO Sundar Pichai echoed Wang’s enthusiasm.

“People without engineering backgrounds are now building apps they dream up using vibe coding,” Pichai said. He compared it to bloggers turning the early internet into careers, creating new job opportunities. “These technologies will evolve further—what people ultimately build with them excites me,” Pichai added.

Wang’s call to action underscores a shift: in an AI-driven world, early adoption of tools like vibe coding could define tomorrow’s leaders. As Meta and Google bet big on AI, will a 13-year-old’s prompts spark the next tech empire?

Visakhapatnam Crime Police Crack Bag Theft Case in 24 Hours on Sankranti Day

Visakhapatnam: In a swift display of efficiency, Gajuwaka Crime Police resolved a brazen theft at a popular shopping mall on Sankranti festival day, recovering stolen cash and gold worth lakhs within just 24 hours. The incident, which unfolded amid festive shopping frenzy, has been hailed as a testament to vigilant policing, earning praise from Visakhapatnam City Police Commissioner Shankhabrata Bagchi. The theft occurred at Vizag Shopping Mall in Gajuwaka, where organizers had launched a massive sale offering items for just Rs 180 to attract crowds during the harvest festival. A woman, excited by the bargains, deposited her bag at the security counter before entering the mall. Seizing the opportunity, an unidentified man not only took her bag but also grabbed another one left nearby.

The stolen bag reportedly contained Rs 50,000 in cash and 11 tolas of gold jewellery valuables the owner had carried for fes-

tival purchases. Realizing her bag was missing upon return, the distraught woman immediately lodged a complaint at Gajuwaka Crime Police Station. “It was a nightmare on what should have been a joyous Sankranti,” she later recounted, her voice trembling with relief after the recovery.

Police registered a case and dove into the investigation, poring over CCTV footage from the mall. The grainy videos proved pivotal. Investigators identified the suspect and traced the vehicle he used to flee the scene. Within a day, a dedicated team apprehended the culprit. During interrogation, the accused confessed to hiding the stolen bag at a nearby crematorium grounds a desperate bid to evade capture. Officers rushed to the location, retrieved the bag intact, and verified that the gold ornaments and cash remained untouched. In a heartwarming handover, Gajuwaka Crime Police returned the bag to the victim, restoring her faith in law enforcement. The festival theft had initially plunged her into panic, es-

pecially with unidentified crowds milling about during peak Sankranti celebrations. But the police’s meticulous work from footage analysis to vehicle tracking and confession extraction turned despair into delight. Commissioner Shankhabrata Bagchi commended the team’s prowess in a public statement. “This rapid resolution underscores our commitment to public safety, particularly during festivals when crowds surge and opportunists lurk,” he said. “Gajuwaka Crime Police’s alertness has set a benchmark for proactive policing. “The case highlights vulnerabilities at high-traffic venues like shopping malls during holidays. Security experts urge enhanced protocols, such as biometric bag checks and real-time CCTV monitoring.

Meanwhile, the arrested suspect faces charges under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code for theft. As Visakhapatnam gears up for post-Sankranti festivities, this success story reassures residents that crime won’t dampen their spirits.



Tirupati-Secunderabad Vande Bharat Train Shines in Unique Orange Livery with Expanded 20-Coach Capacity

Tirupati: The Tirupati-Secunderabad Vande Bharat Express, a flagship semi-high-speed train connecting two key pilgrimage and commercial hubs in Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, has undergone a striking transformation. Now operating in a vibrant orange color scheme, this train stands out as the only one among India’s 102 Vande Bharat services painted in this distinctive hue, marking a bold departure from its previous white livery. Launched on April 9, 2023, by Indian Railways, the service initially ran with eight coaches to gauge passenger demand. It quickly gained popularity for its speed, comfort, and reliability, covering the 570-

km route in about 7-8 hours at an average speed of 80 kmph. Encouraged by overwhelming response, the train was upgraded to 16 coaches within months.

As demand surged further fueled by pilgrims heading to Tirupati’s sacred Tirumala Venkateswara Temple and business travelers between Secunderabad and South India Railways expanded it to a full 20-coach configuration. The newly revamped orange train boasts a seating capacity of 1,440 passengers, making it one of the largest Vande Bharat trains passing through Tirupati.

Equipped with modern amenities like automatic doors, bio-vacuum toilets, Wi-Fi, and onboard entertainment, it offers three

classes: AC Chair Car, Executive Class, and a dedicated Chair Car for women and seniors. This expansion aligns with Indian Railways’ push to enhance connectivity in South India, reducing travel time compared to conventional trains on the same route. What makes this train special? Out of the 102 Vande Bharat trains operational across India as of early 2026, this is the sole service in orange, symbolizing perhaps a regional branding initiative or maintenance upgrade. Previously in the standard white-and-blue livery, the color change has sparked curiosity among frequent commuters, with many praising the fresh look on social media. Railway officials attribute the upgrades to sustained pas-

senger footfall, which has consistently exceeded expectations.

“The Tirupati-Secunderabad Vande Bharat has become a lifeline for devotees and professionals alike,” said a South Central Railway spokesperson. Daily occupancy often hits 90-100%, prompting calls for additional services or extensions to other destinations like Visakhapatnam.

This development underscores Indian Railways’ commitment to modernizing rail travel, with Vande Bharat trains now forming the backbone of premium short-haul connectivity. As Andhra Pradesh ramps up tourism and infrastructure under state initiatives, expect this orange beacon to play a pivotal role in boosting regional mobility.

BJP MLA Sujana Chowdary Assures Amaravati Farmers of Coalition Government’s Support

Amaravati: BJP MLA Sujana Chowdary has assured farmers in the Amaravati capital region that the coalition government is committed to resolving their issues definitively. Speaking at a meeting with farmers in Mandadam village on Thursday, she emphasized that farmers should unite as an association to bring their problems to the government’s attention and monitor progress collectively.

During the gathering, farmers presented their grievances directly to the MLA. Chowdary advised them against approaching issues individually, instead urging them to select four representatives to act on behalf of the group. “I have explained to them how to choose these representatives effectively,” she stated.

To aid in tracking application statuses and resolutions, she promised to provide software mechanisms from her side if needed.

Chowdary highlighted the strength of local leadership, noting that the area’s MLA, Union Minister, Guntur MP Pemmasani Chandrasekhar, and Municipal Administration Minister Narayana are all capable leaders. She encouraged farmers to coordinate with them for swift action.

On the critical issue of the capital, she expressed confidence that the Amaravati Capital Act would soon become law, with technical processes underway at the center. “The central government will certainly enact this legislation,” she affirmed. Farmers used the platform to voice deep frustrations. Several complained that officials’ attitudes were complicating their problems, turning simple matters into protracted disputes.

Women from the capital region pointed out that unresolved issues for a few farmers were creating a perception of widespread problems across the community. One farmer illustrated



the escalation: “Earlier, we had issues related to 14 points; now, due to officials’ inaction, they’ve crossed 20. “Chowdary acknowledged these concerns, stressing the need for organized advocacy.

She reiterated the coalition government’s comprising TDP, BJP, and JSP pledge to prioritize Amaravati as the sole capital, reversing previous uncertainties under the YSRCP regime. The meeting un-

derscored ongoing tensions in the region, where land pooling and compensation disputes have lingered since the capital project’s revival post-2024 elections. This interaction reflects the NDA alliance’s grassroots outreach in Andhra Pradesh, where farmer discontent remains a key political flashpoint.

Chowdary’s proactive steps, including tech-enabled tracking, signal a structured approach to

grievance redressal amid expectations for the Amaravati Capital Bill in the upcoming assembly session. Local leaders have welcomed the initiative, with sources indicating follow-up meetings involving Pemmasani and Narayana. Farmers expressed cautious optimism, hoping for tangible progress on compensation, land titles, and infrastructure reimbursements.

TDP Leader Somireddy Chandramohan Reddy Hits Out at Jagan Over Bhogapuram Airport Remarks

Pamaravathi: TDP senior leader and MLA Somireddy Chandramohan Reddy has strongly criticized YSRCP president Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy for making what he described as “false and unethical” claims regarding the Bhogapuram International Airport project in north Andhra Pradesh. Speaking to reporters at Amaravati, Somireddy said Jagan should refrain from spreading misinformation aimed at misleading the public about the airport’s development and its origins.

The TDP leader reminded that when the Bhogapuram airport was originally proposed and initiated during the Telugu Desam Party govern-

ment’s tenure, Jagan had mocked the idea, questioning, “Why an Airbus for a region where even red buses don’t reach?” Somireddy said that such remarks had once ridiculed the aspirations of the people of Uttarandhra, but now Jagan was shamelessly claiming credit for the same project.

“Today, without any moral responsibility or sense of shame, he is trying to appropriate the efforts and vision of the previous government,” Somireddy remarked. He accused Jagan of political hypocrisy, stating that when the airport’s groundwork was being laid, the YSRCP leader attempted to obstruct progress through criticism and misinformation.

Somireddy went on to ridicule Jagan’s



tendency to make exaggerated claims, saying that if left unchecked, Jagan might one day go so far as to declare that his family had brought India’s independence, conducted the Pokhran nuclear tests, or even designed the military’s ‘Operation Sindoor’. He said such exaggerated self-glorification diminishes the seriousness of political discourse and erodes the credibility of public leaders.

The TDP MLA emphasized that the Bhogapuram project’s

progress was the result of years of planning and administrative groundwork carried out during the tenure of former Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu. He cautioned that attempts to misrepresent facts for political mileage would only mislead voters and create unnecessary divisions among the public.

“Politicians have a duty to uphold truth and dignity in public life,” Somireddy asserted. “When leaders like Jagan resort to

false propaganda and selective amnesia, public respect for politics itself declines.” He urged the people of Andhra Pradesh to recognize the facts behind key infrastructure projects and not to be swayed by “temporary political narratives crafted for election season.” Somireddy reiterated that the TDP remains committed to completing the Bhogapuram International Airport and to ensuring balanced development across all regions of the state.

MLA Somireddy Chandramohan Reddy Slams Jagan, KCR Over Rayalaseema Lift Irrigation ‘Sabotage’

Ongole: YSRCP dissident and Addanki MLA Somireddy Chandramohan Reddy unleashed a scathing attack on former Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister YS Jagan Mohan Reddy and his Telangana counterpart K Chandrashekar Rao (KCR), accusing them of colluding to derail the Rayalaseema Lift Irrigation Project. Speaking to the media on Thursday, Reddy alleged that Jagan, swayed by KCR’s influence, deliberately stalled the project, which is vital for drought-prone Rayalaseema districts.

Reddy mocked the “inseparable brotherhood” between the two leaders during their overlapping tenures as chief ministers. “When KCR was CM in Telangana, his brother Jagan was CM in AP. They couldn’t be separated,” he quipped, claiming Telangana’s 2020 complaint led to the National Green Tribunal (NGT) imposing a stay on the project’s lift works. The stay persisted for nearly four years until 2024, while both



held power, Reddy pointed out. “AP people have understood their crooked politics,” he asserted.

Turning to current politics, Reddy ridiculed accusations from YSRCP leaders that Andhra Pradesh CM N Chandrababu Naidu is now in cahoots with Telangana CM A Revanth Reddy. “Is this hypocrisy not absurd?” he asked, firing a barrage of questions: “Did Chandrababu impose an NGT stay when he was CM? Did he halt NGT works? Did NGT impose penalties then?” He accused Jagan’s regime of never starting actual lift construction, limiting efforts to mere earthworks to siphon off hundreds of crores.

“They raised bills only for soil work; the

NGT stay conveniently blocked only the lift construction,” Reddy lampooned, suggesting it was a ploy to loot public funds. Reddy warned YSRCP leaders to “keep their mouths shut,” insisting people no longer believe Jagan’s “cinema-like stories” of boldly standing up to KCR for Rayalaseema. “The public has seen through it all,” he declared, urging an end to such open sabotage narratives.

The remarks come amid ongoing debates over the Rayalaseema Lift project, a long-standing poll promise aimed at irrigating 1.2 lakh acres by lifting water from Krishna River backwaters. Naidu’s TDP-led government has vowed to revive it, blaming previous delays on legal hurdles and mismanagement.

YSRCP has countered that environmental clearances and funding were priorities under Jagan. Reddy, who quit YSRCP last year citing internal issues, has emerged as a vocal critic, often targeting party leadership on governance lapses.

TDP Leader Zakir Succumbs to Injuries in Tragic Road Accident Near Medarametla

Ongole: In a heartbreaking incident, Nellore TDP leader and cluster in-charge Zakir (42-43) lost his life after a car he was traveling in veered off control and collided with a divider near Medarametla. The accident, which occurred earlier today, has sent shockwaves through the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) ranks and the local community. Eyewitnesses reported that the vehicle suddenly lost control on a stretch of road near Medarametla, slamming into the central divider with significant force. Zakir, a prominent TDP figure from Nellore serving as the in-charge for clusters 42 and 43, sustained severe injuries in the crash. Local police rushed to the scene upon receiving information and swiftly transported him to Ongole Government Hospital for emergency treatment.

Tragically, despite the medical team’s best efforts, Zakir suc-

cumbed to his injuries while undergoing treatment. Hospital authorities confirmed his death, attributing it to the critical nature of the trauma sustained in the accident. The loss of the dedicated party worker has left his family, colleagues, and supporters in deep mourning. News of the accident reached Minister Ponguru Narayana promptly, who hurried to Ongole Government Hospital. Upon arrival, the minister inquired in detail about the sequence of events leading to the crash and the treatment provided to Zakir. Hospital doctors briefed him on the patient’s condition and the intensive care administered, reiterating that Zakir had breathed his last during treatment. Expressing profound shock and sorrow over the untimely demise, Minister Narayana paid his last respects by visiting Zakir’s mortal remains at the hospital.

TDP leaders and cadres across the re-

gion have poured in their condolences, remembering Zakir as a committed activist who worked tirelessly for the party’s cause and community development in Nellore. “His sudden departure is an irreplaceable loss to the TDP family,” said a senior party functionary.

Meanwhile, police have registered a case and launched an investigation into the accident’s cause. Preliminary reports suggest high speed or a possible mechanical failure, but a detailed probe, including forensic analysis of the vehicle, is underway. Authorities have urged motorists to exercise caution on highways, especially during evening hours.

The incident underscores ongoing concerns about road safety in Andhra Pradesh, with calls for improved infrastructure and stricter enforcement of traffic rules. Zakir’s funeral arrangements are being finalized, with TDP leadership expected to attend in strength.

Launched on January 15, 2001, by Jimmy Wales and Larry Sanger, the free online encyclopedia has grown into a monumental platform boasting over 71 million articles in English alone and more than 66 million across 342 languages worldwide.

Now spanning 353 languages, it serves as an open gateway to information, available for free viewing or download by anyone, anywhere. What started as a collaborative experiment has become the internet's go-to destination, outshining search engines for everything from mango pickle recipes (avakaya) to atomic bomb history. Volunteers from across the globe numbering in the lakhs have digitized for-



gotten archives, dusty manuscripts, local folklore, and cutting-edge science papers.

They've unearthed knowledge trapped in village lofts, ancient scrolls, and obscure servers, making it accessible to the masses. On average, 15,000 new articles are added monthly, covering hyper-local histories, population data, and cultural treasures. The "Wiki" name, de-

rived from the Hawaiian word for "quick," embodies its rapid, democratic ethos: anyone can contribute text or photos.

No formal credentials required just passion, curiosity, and a willingness to edit. This crowd-sourced model has propelled Wikipedia from a single-language site to a multilingual powerhouse, preserving endangered traditions and bridging knowledge

gaps. In India, the Telugu Wikipedia (TeWiki) shines brightly. Launched in December 2003, it now hosts 118,322 articles, climbing from seventh to fourth among Indian languages.

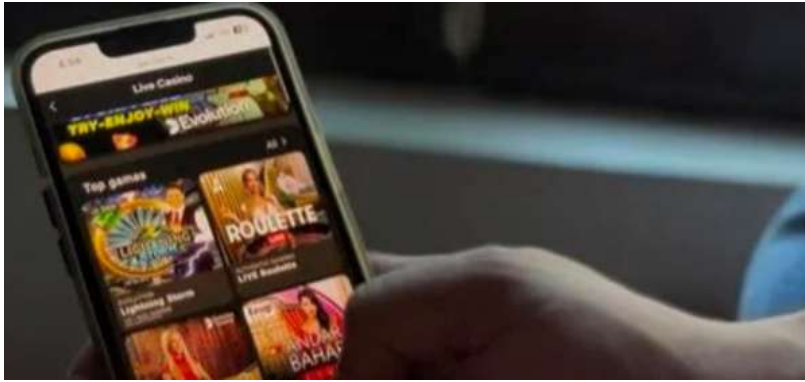
TeWiki safeguards Telugu heritage, customs, and local histories, ensuring the next generation inherits its cultural richness alongside global insights. As Wikipedia completes 25 years, its impact is undeniable. It democratizes education, empowers underserved communities, and fosters a culture of shared learning.

Yet challenges persist: sustaining quality amid rapid growth and countering misinformation. Founders and volunteers urge more contributions, especially in regional languages. In an era of paywalls and algorithms, Wikipedia remains a beacon of openness. As Jimmy Wales once said, it's "the sum of all human knowledge" built by the people, for the people.

Central Government Blocks 242 Betting Sites, Cracks Down on Online Gambling to Protect Youth

Vijayawada | New Delhi: The Central Government is taking a firm stand against illegal betting and online gambling, blocking 242 betting and gambling websites to curb activities that are luring youth into addiction. In addition, the government has acted against nearly 8,000 websites promoting betting and gambling so far, as revealed by official sources. The move comes amid growing concerns over the devastating impact on young people.

Authorities have noted a surge in youth falling into financial ruin due to these vices, leading to families crumbling under debt. "These activities pose a severe threat to society, with families facing economic collapse and mounting debts," officials stated, emphasizing that stringent measures are essential to safeguard the future generation. This crack-



down builds on recent legislative efforts.

In October last year, the government enacted the Online Gaming Act, 2025, which bans real-money gaming, imposes strict regulations on such games, and introduces policies to restrict illegal betting and gambling. The Act has already forced major platforms like WinZO and Nazara Technologies to discontinue real-money games. Under the leadership of the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), authorities have identified and targeted

websites, foreign servers hosting illegal platforms, and those promoted via social media.

Approximately 8,000 such sites have faced action to date, with the latest blocking of 242 sites marking a significant escalation. The primary goal is to protect youth from mental and financial harm, curb online addictions, and foster a safer digital environment. The government has clarified that surveillance on illegal betting apps will intensify, with actions planned against social media promotions.

Organizations violating the law will face severe penalties. This initiative aligns with broader efforts to regulate the digital space, following the prohibition on real-money gaming apps. Officials urge citizens to report suspicious platforms and promote awareness to prevent youth from falling prey to these traps.

As online vices proliferate, the government's proactive steps signal a zero-tolerance policy, aiming to preserve social stability and youth well-being in an increasingly digital India.

Eyewitnesses described the roar of the crowd as deafening, with bets pouring in from all corners.



"This is by far the grandest cockfight we've seen in years," said a local resident, speaking on condition of anonymity. "The energy is unmatched during Sankranti, and this one sets a new benchmark." Organizers noted that participants meticulously consulted astrologers for auspicious timings, horoscopes, and muhuratams before entering their prized birds into the fray.

Roosters, bred and trained for months, were paraded with utmost care, their handlers whispering encouragements amid the chaos. Cockfighting, a traditional rural sport deeply embedded in Andhra Pradesh's Sankranti celebrations, draws massive crowds despite ongoing debates over animal welfare. In West Godavari, known for its fertile

deltas and festive fervor, these events double as social gatherings where farmers, traders, and villagers bond over the thrill.

This year's edition shattered records, with total transactions estimated in the crores, fueled by rising stakes and enthusiastic participation. Authorities monitored the event for compliance with local regulations, ensuring no major incidents occurred. As the sun set on the second day of Pongal, winners like Ramesh celebrated their windfalls, while losers vowed comebacks for next year's showdowns.

For Tadepalligudem, Sankranti 2026 will be remembered not just for sweets and kite-flying, but for this epic cockfight that united the community in pulsating anticipation.

Srikalahasti Hindu Cremation Ground Lies Neglected: Residents Urge Commissioner Anjuru Taraka Srinivasulu for Immediate Cleanup

Srikalahasti: Revered as the "Southern Kashi," the sacred pilgrimage town of Srikalahasti has been thrown into dismay as its Hindu cremation ground remains uncleaned this Sankranti season, denying families the chance to honor their ancestors. Every year, municipal workers meticulously clean the site, allowing sons, daughters, and relatives to visit family tombs, offer prayers, and perform rituals in remembrance of departed parents. This year, however, officials have completely overlooked their duties.

Overgrown with thorny bushes, the cremation ground has become inaccessible, preventing any family from approaching the samadhis (memorial tombs) for worship. The neglect has shattered a cherished tradition, leaving residents heartbroken during the festive Sankranti period. Yesterday, the poignant scene at the site underscored the disparity. Srikalahasti MLA Bojjala Sudheer Reddy, accompanied by family



members, peacefully conducted prayers at the samadhis of his father, Gopal Anna, and Baba Hari Anna.

This ritual, a hallmark of Sankranti, symbolizes reverence for forebears. Yet, while the MLA upheld the custom, ordinary citizens of Srikalahasti found themselves barred from similar observances due to the site's deplorable state. Local voices express frustration over municipal authorities' failure to fulfill responsibilities. "This is a yearly tradition that binds our community to its roots," said one resident, speaking on condition of anonymity. "Overgrown weeds and thorns make it impossible to even reach the tombs. Even those unable to visit on Sankranti plan to come on Tai Amavasya or Ratha Saptami now that's not feasible either. "The

lapse highlights a broader accountability gap. Elected representatives like MLA Sudheer Reddy are urged to intervene, issuing directives to municipal staff. "Authorities show no response, so leaders must step forward," the resident added. As a media conduit, we echo this plea: Commissioner Anjuru Taraka Srinivasulu must ensure immediate cleanup to restore the sacred space. This negligence is deeply distressing, especially in a town synonymous with piety. With festivals like Tai Amavasya approaching, prompt action could salvage the rituals for grieving families.

Municipal inaction not only disrespects traditions but erodes public trust in governance. Residents await swift measures to reclaim their right to ancestral homage.

India–Taliban Engagement Marks a Strategic Shift in South Asian Geopolitics

For the first time since the Taliban returned to power in Kabul in August 2021, an officially appointed Taliban diplomat has assumed charge in New Delhi. Noor Ahmad Noor, the Taliban's newly designated ambassador to India, took over the Afghan Embassy in the Indian capital last week. Shortly thereafter, he met Anand Prakash, Joint Secretary in charge of the Pakistan–Afghanistan–Iran Division at India's Ministry of External Affairs (MEA). According to a statement issued by the Taliban's embassy, discussions focused on strengthening political and trade ties, including easing visa procedures.

This development marks a significant milestone in the evolving relationship between India and the Taliban-led Afghan government. It also reflects a broader recalibration of regional alignments, particularly as relations between the Taliban and Pakistan continue to deteriorate.

From Reluctance to Engagement

India's engagement with the Taliban has been cautious but steadily progressive. Nearly a year ago, on January 8, India's Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri met Taliban Foreign Minister Mullah Amir Khan Muttaqi in Dubai. That meeting, described as involving "detailed discussions" on bilateral relations, was the first high-level interaction between the two sides since the Taliban takeover, coming after a four-year gap in

formal engagement.

Following the Dubai talks, the Taliban described India as a "significant regional partner," a notable endorsement at a time when tensions between Kabul and Islamabad were rapidly escalating. Pakistan had launched airstrikes in Afghanistan's border regions, ostensibly to target militants. The Taliban, however, accused Islamabad of causing civilian casualties. India publicly criticised Pakistan's actions and expressed concern over the loss of innocent lives, further widening the diplomatic gap between Pakistan and the Taliban.

A Spate of High-Level Visits

Since then, India–Taliban relations have gathered momentum. Over the past year, three senior Taliban officials have visited New Delhi in quick succession. These include Taliban Foreign Minister Muttaqi in October, Trade Minister Haji Nooruddin Azizi soon after, and Acting Health Minister Noor Jalal Jalali in December. Parallely, New Delhi announced its decision to upgrade its representative office in Kabul to a full-fledged embassy.

The arrival of Noor Ahmad Noor as the Taliban's official envoy in India is thus part of a broader pattern of deepening engagement rather than an isolated event.

Pakistan's Anger and Accusations

Noori's appointment coincided with sharp criticism from Islamabad.



Pakistan's Information Minister Attaulah Tarar publicly questioned the nature of India–Taliban cooperation, accusing Kabul of allowing Afghan soil to be used for attacks against Pakistan under "foreign designs." In a particularly provocative remark, he asked, "What kind of Islam is this where you take money from India to carry out explosions here?"

Pakistan has long accused both India and the Taliban of supporting Baloch separatists and the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP). These accusations come amid a sharp surge in militant violence inside Pakistan, with more than 5,000 terror incidents reported in 2025

alone.

However, blaming India for Pakistan's internal security crisis reflects Islamabad's longstanding tendency to externalise its failures. Historically, Pakistan has found itself at odds with every regime in Kabul, regardless of ideology. The Taliban, once considered Pakistan's strategic asset, are no exception.

Regional Consensus on Taliban Engagement

The appointment of Noor Ahmad Noor also highlights the Taliban's broader effort to expand their diplomatic footprint and gain international legitimacy. India is neither the first nor the only country to accept an official Taliban envoy. China was the earliest to do so, fol-

lowed by Russia, Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan, Indonesia, and Pakistan itself.

In that sense, India's move aligns with an emerging regional consensus that pragmatic engagement with the Taliban is preferable to isolation, particularly when it comes to humanitarian assistance, regional stability, and economic connectivity.

Trade Dynamics: India Gains, Pakistan Loses

Pakistan's frequent closure of border crossings and its weaponisation of trade and transit routes have forced Afghanistan to seek alternative pathways. India has emerged as a major beneficiary of this shift. Afghan trade has increasingly been rerouted through Central Asia and Iran, particularly via the Chabahar port, bypassing Pakistan entirely. Afghanistan has also begun substituting goods previously imported from Pakistan with supplies from other countries, notably India.

India's Strategic and Humanitarian Calculus

From New Delhi's perspective, Afghanistan stands out as a rare foreign policy success in an otherwise volatile neighbourhood. As Bangladesh deepens its engagement with Pakistan—where the military and intelligence agencies are increasingly influential—India's grow-

ing presence in Afghanistan offers strategic depth and leverage in the region.

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar has repeatedly emphasised India's "people-centric" approach to Afghanistan. This includes humanitarian aid, medical assistance, food supplies, and vaccines—efforts that have sustained India's goodwill among ordinary Afghans even amid political upheaval.

At the same time, engagement with the Taliban opens significant economic opportunities. Afghanistan requires massive investment across sectors, from healthcare and textiles to infrastructure and mining. The country is home to mineral reserves estimated to be worth trillions of dollars, and India has prior experience implementing large infrastructure projects there under the previous Afghan government.

Bilateral trade fell to \$594 million in the first half of FY 2025–26, down from \$1.26 billion during the same period the previous year.

Timing Is Everything

India's strategy goes beyond merely filling supply gaps. Alongside increased use of the Chabahar port, New Delhi has moved to activate air corridors between Indian cities and Kabul. These initiatives reduce Afghanistan's dependence on Pakistan while incentivising the Taliban to ensure stability for Indian trade with Central Asia—a region Pakistan has historically sought to block India from accessing.

Over time, Afghanistan could emerge as a vital regional trade hub, linking South Asia, Central Asia, and the Middle East—without Pakistan as a gatekeeper.

Conclusion

The recalibration of relations between India, Afghanistan, and Pakistan is increasingly being shaped by economics rather than ideology. In this evolving equation, India has positioned itself as a reliable partner, Afghanistan as a pragmatic actor seeking alternatives, and Pakistan as the principal loser—largely due to its own inability to maintain stable and constructive relationships with its neighbours.

What began as a diplomatic shift has now become a strategic realignment, one in which timing, trade, and trust are redefining regional power dynamics.

Iran on the Brink: Why a US Strike Would Shake the Gulf and the World

As reports of mass protests and nationwide violence in Iran appear to have eased, the immediate sense of urgency surrounding a direct US military intervention has somewhat diminished. But this lull should not be mistaken for de-escalation. The military option remains very much alive. As recently as Tuesday, White House press secretary Karoline Leavitt reiterated that President Donald Trump was keeping "all options on the table," explicitly naming airstrikes among them. Diplomacy, she insisted, remained the president's preferred route.

That reassurance, however, rang hollow when set against Trump's own actions. At the very moment his administration was speaking of diplomacy, the president was cancelling meetings with Iranian officials, threatening severe punishment, urging Iranian protesters to continue their uprising, and promising American assistance—in emphatic capital letters—on Truth Social. When rhetoric and policy diverge so starkly, the region listens not to the caveats, but to the threats.

Unsurprisingly, the Gulf is now bracing for a period of dangerous uncertainty. When a US president openly encourages protesters in another country to seize institutions, freezes diplomatic channels, and adopts an opposition slogan as his own, the implications are profound. Trump's slogan—"Make Iran Great Again"—is not merely rhetorical flourish. It signals that the White House now sees itself as an active participant in Iran's internal political crisis, not a distant observer.

Tehran's Immediate Response

Iran's leadership reacted swiftly and sharply. Mohammad Bagher Qalibaf, Speaker of Iran's parliament, warned that any attack on Iran would render American military bases, ships, and assets across the region legitimate targets. More strikingly, he said Iran would not wait to retaliate after an initial strike but would act upon what it perceives as clear indicators of an imminent threat.

Whether this was bluster aimed at domestic audiences or a genuine operational warning remains unclear. What is certain is that such statements dramatically raise the cost of miscalculation. They suggest that Tehran is prepared to abandon strategic patience in favour of preemptive action—an alarming prospect in an already volatile region.

Why the Gulf Is Nervous

To understand the anxiety sweeping through the Gulf, one must understand the scale of the American military footprint in the region. Iran does not lack for visible targets.

In Qatar lies Al Udeid Air Base, the largest US air base in the Middle East and the forward headquarters of US Central Command. It is critical for American air operations across the region. Bahrain hosts the US Navy's Fifth Fleet, responsible for overseeing operations in the Persian Gulf, Red Sea, Arabian Sea, and parts of the Indian Ocean. Kuwait houses tens of thousands of American troops and functions as a major logistics and staging hub. Saudi Arabia once again hosts US personnel and

air defence systems. The United Arab Emirates provides access to ports and airfields regularly used by American forces. US warships patrol Gulf waters continuously.

Whether these steps signal preparation for conflict or merely heightened caution is difficult to determine—but the message to regional capitals is unmistakable.

This is the typical response of authoritarian systems under external attack. Space for reform shrinks, not expands.

This approach has been refined over decades of sanctions, isolation, and proxy

Military Options, Strategic Dilemmas

The United States has no shortage of military options—long-range bombers, cruise missiles, cyber operations, and covert action among them. All are feasible. None are easy.

Iran is large, militarised, and battle-hard-

Regional and Global Fallout

The regional consequences would be immediate. Shipping lanes could be threatened. Insurance premiums would soar. Energy markets would react violently. Gulf states would publicly call for restraint while privately preparing for worst-case scenarios. Iran-aligned militias, weakened but not eliminated by Israeli strikes, remain capable of disruptive action. They would not require direct orders. A single drone attack or misjudged response could trigger an escalation driven more by momentum than strategy.

Globally, the ripple effects would be profound. Russia would quietly welcome the distraction, hoping it eases pressure on its war in Ukraine. Moscow has already warned Washington that military action against Iran could destabilise the world. China would position itself rhetorically as a stabilising force while exploiting economic opportunities, potentially accelerating non-dollar energy trade with Tehran and reinforcing its narrative of American-driven instability.

India would once again find itself walking a diplomatic tightrope. With longstanding ties to Iran and deepening strategic relations with the United States, New Delhi would oppose military escalation without directly confronting Washington. Rising energy prices would be particularly damaging for India's economy.

What the Protesters Actually Want

It is crucial to remember why protests erupted in Iran in the first place. Years of sanctions have crippled the economy. In-

flation, unemployment, and declining living standards pushed people onto the streets in December. These are fundamentally domestic grievances. External attempts at regime change would only complicate the protesters' objectives.

Change, if it comes, must come from within. Outside intervention has historically made that harder, not easier.

President Trump is undoubtedly aware of Iran's history with the United States. The 1979 Islamic Revolution, the seizure of the US embassy, and the 444-day hostage crisis left deep scars. President Jimmy Carter watched diplomacy collapse and his presidency unravel after a failed rescue mission in the Iranian desert. Those images—burning helicopters and blindfolded hostages—became symbols of American humiliation. Carter never recovered politically.

The world is different today, but memories linger.

An Uncertain Road Ahead

Iran's protests are now inseparable from geopolitics. Diplomacy is becoming harder. Escalation looms closer. President Trump has the power to strike Iran. His military is unmatched. What remains elusive—just as it was four decades ago—is certainty over outcomes.

History is instructive. Intervention in Iran has never delivered the control or transformation Washington seeks. It has delivered instability, resentment, and consequences that far outlast any presidency. Afghanistan in 2021 should serve as a final reminder: overwhelming power does not guarantee strategic success.

BJP Set for Another Landslide in Nagpur Civic Polls, Congress Stagnant



The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) appears set for another emphatic victory in Nagpur, the ideological stronghold of the Rashtriya Swamsevak Sangh (RSS), as counting trends for the Nagpur Municipal Corporation (NMC) elections point to a near-repeat of its dominant 2017 performance. As of 5 pm, the ruling alliance is comfortably ahead in the

151-member civic body, leaving the Congress once again struggling to translate an aggressive campaign into electoral gains. According to the latest trends, the BJP is leading on 109 seats, while its ally, the Eknath Shinde-led Shiv Sena, is ahead on three seats. The Congress, despite mounting a “Mission Hundred” campaign, is leading on

only 27 seats—almost identical to its 2017 tally of 28. If these trends hold, the BJP could equal or even surpass its previous performance, when it won 108 seats and secured a clear majority in the civic body. Nagpur holds immense symbolic and political importance for the BJP. The city is the birthplace and headquarters of the RSS,

founded in 1925 by KB Hedgewar, and is regarded as the ideological and administrative nerve centre of the organisation. It is also the home turf of senior BJP leaders, including Union Minister Nitin Gadkari and Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, both of whom have deep roots in the RSS. While municipal elections are typically driven by hyper-local civic issues, Nagpur remains a prestige battle for the BJP due to its ideological significance. Polling for the Nagpur Municipal Corporation was held on Thursday alongside elections for 28 other municipal corporations across Maharashtra. The results also indicate a shifting political landscape in the city. Ajit Pawar’s Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) is poised to enter the NMC for the first time, with one of its candidates leading in her ward. Meanwhile, the All India

Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM) appears to be gaining a foothold, with four of its candidates currently leading. These include Alisha Khan, Reshma Nandgawli, Sofia Sheikh, and Pawan Koye, all of whom are ahead in ward number 3 in the Asinagar zone, an area with a significant Muslim population. This development suggests a fragmentation of the minority vote bank that the Congress has traditionally relied upon, further weakening its prospects in the city. In terms of seat-sharing, the BJP contested 143 seats, with eight allotted to the Shiv Sena. Ajit Pawar’s NCP fielded candidates in over 90 seats, while the Congress chose to contest all 151 seats independently, without any alliance. The Sharad Pawar-led NCP (SP) contested 79 seats, and the AIMIM fielded candidates in six wards.

Those who do not use FASTag should prepare to pay via UPI on their smartphones to avoid inconvenience or penalties at toll plazas. Supreme Court Directs Karisma Kapoor to Respond to Priya Kapur’s Divorce Records Application



New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Friday directed actor Karisma Kapoor to file her objections within two weeks regarding a fresh application submitted by Priya Kapur, seeking access to details of Karisma’s 2016 divorce proceedings with late businessman Sunjay Kapur. The matter was listed before a bench headed by Justice AS Chandurkar. In a closed-chamber hearing, Karisma Kapoor’s legal team opposed Priya Kapur’s application, arguing that it was not maintainable. Her lawyers contended that the consent terms and the divorce decree had already been filed in another matter involving Karisma Kapoor’s two children in the Delhi High Court. They described the new application as unnecessary and potentially intrusive into confidential family court proceedings. Priya Kapur’s lawyers, however, stated that the application aims to obtain certified copies of pleadings, documents, and orders

from the divorce proceedings to provide the full factual background in an ongoing estate dispute. This dispute revolves around the Rs 30,000 crore estate left behind by Sunjay Kapur, with Karisma Kapoor’s children alleging that the will attributed to their father was forged by their stepmother, Priya Kapur. Maninder Singh, representing Priya Kapur, emphasized that clarity on the divorce settlement is crucial to determine whether the issues currently raised by Karisma Kapoor’s children were already addressed and resolved during Sunjay Kapur’s lifetime. The application was originally filed by Priya Kapur in November 2025, seeking access to court documents related to the matrimonial settlement between her and Karisma Kapoor. Karisma’s lawyers, Ravi Sharma and Apoorv Shukla, countered that the application was “frivolous” and intended solely to extract personal information from a private

family law matter. During the hearing, the Supreme Court directed Karisma Kapoor to submit her objections in the form of a reply within two weeks. No formal notice has yet been issued in the matter. The 2016 divorce between Karisma Kapoor and Sunjay Kapur had been resolved amicably, with mutual consent. The consent terms recorded by the court granted custody of their two children to Karisma Kapoor, while Sunjay Kapur was granted visitation and access rights. At that time, the Supreme Court had acknowledged that all disputes between the couple had been amicably settled following a hearing before Justices AK Sikri and RK Agrawal. The case now highlights the intersection of family law and high-profile estate disputes, with the Supreme Court’s intervention emphasizing the need for procedural clarity and protection of sensitive personal records.

BMC Setback Signals Existential Crisis for Raj Thackeray’s MNS

Mumbai’s evolving political landscape is posing an existential challenge for Raj Thackeray and his Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS), once known for its aggressive, street-level politics inspired by the late Bal Thackeray. The party’s underwhelming performance in the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) elections has underlined the steady erosion of its support base and raised serious questions about its future relevance in Maharashtra politics. As counting continues for the 2026 BMC elections, the MNS is leading in just 10 wards, a modest presence in India’s richest civic body. In contrast, the Shiv Sena (UBT), led by Raj Thackeray’s cousin Uddhav Thackeray, has managed to remain competitive, leading in around 75 seats by successfully holding together its alliance. However, even this alliance has fallen well short of challenging the dominant BJP-Shiv Sena



(Eknath Shinde) combine, which is together leading in approximately 118 wards. The results are particularly damaging for Raj Thackeray, who mounted an intense campaign marked by fiery speeches and a renewed emphasis on Marathi identity. His recent rapprochement with Uddhav Thackeray had briefly sparked hope among supporters that a reunited Thackeray brand could reshape Mumbai’s political equations. Instead, the elec-

torate appears unconvinced, signalling waning appetite for the confrontational politics that once defined the Thackeray legacy. Perhaps the most serious consequence of this poor showing is the growing threat of derecognition for the MNS as a state party. The party’s vote share had already plummeted to just 1.55 per cent in the 2024 Assembly elections, where it failed to win a single seat. The BMC setback only deepens its crisis.

Loss of state party status would mean forfeiting its election symbol, a blow that would further weaken the MNS’s organisational identity and electoral viability. Without control or influence in the BMC, Raj Thackeray also loses access to patronage networks that traditionally keep party workers motivated and loyal. This raises the risk of cadre erosion, with defections to the BJP or Eknath Shinde’s Shiv Sena increasingly likely as work-

ers seek political security. The results also reveal that the attempted consolidation of the Marathi vote through identity politics failed to materialise. The “Thackeray nostalgia” factor appears insufficient to counter the BJP’s superior organisation and ground-level machinery. With diminishing institutional relevance, Raj Thackeray may increasingly turn to street politics, language agitations, and media-centric activism to stay visible. In the long term, the MNS could even be forced to consider aligning with the BJP-led Mahayuti as a junior partner, though no such talks have surfaced yet. Compounding the party’s troubles is the lack of a clear succession plan. Amit Thackeray’s third-place finish in Mahim during last year’s Assembly elections has raised doubts about his ability to revive the party. As Maharashtra politics crystallises into a bipolar Mahayuti versus MVA contest, the MNS now

Congress at a Crossroads in Tamil Nadu: DMK Deadlock, TVK Temptation and High-Stakes Talks Ahead

The Congress leadership has begun a series of high-level consultations ahead of the five Assembly elections scheduled for April–May, with Tamil Nadu emerging as one of the most sensitive and closely watched battlegrounds. Later today, Rahul Gandhi and Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge are set to meet senior Tamil Nadu Congress leaders, a discussion that could finally clarify the party’s alliance strategy in the state. For nearly two decades, the Congress has been allied with the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) in Tamil Nadu. However, internal divisions have surfaced within the state unit, with some leaders now pushing for a potential alliance with actor Vijay’s newly launched party, Tamilaga Vetttri Kazhagam (TVK). Whether the Congress is willing—or able—to break away from its long-standing partnership with the DMK remains uncertain. At the heart of the current deadlock is both seat-sharing and power-sharing.



ing. Traditionally, the DMK has restricted its alliances with Congress and other partners to electoral arrangements, keeping governance firmly under its own control. This time, however, Congress is demanding a share in the government if the alliance returns to power. Sources say the party is seeking at least six ministerial berths in Chief Minister M.K. Stalin’s cabinet. DMK leaders, however, have categorically ruled out any such arrangement, insisting there is no scope for Congress to join the

government. Seat-sharing talks have been equally fraught. In the 2021 Assembly elections, Congress contested 25 seats as part of the DMK-led alliance. For the 2026 polls, the party had expected an expanded presence. Instead, sources indicate the DMK is offering only 19 seats. Congress, citing its historical performance, is demanding around 35 seats. In earlier elections, the party contested 41 seats in 2016, 63 in 2011, and 48 in 2006. Negotiations, which were supposed to conclude by mid-December,

remain unresolved more than a month later. The emergence of TVK has added a new dimension to the talks. Senior Congress sources claim Vijay’s party is willing to offer Congress more than 60 seats and even include it as a partner in government. Internal Congress surveys reportedly show TVK commanding close to 30 per cent vote share, prompting the party to view Vijay’s popularity as a way to loosen the DMK’s dominance. Congress leaders also believe Vijay’s appeal, particularly among Christian voters,

could have spillover benefits in neighbouring Kerala. Rahul Gandhi’s recent gestures have further fuelled speculation. He publicly supported Vijay’s film “Jana Nayagan” amid censorship issues and spoke to the actor after the Karur stampede. Rahul aide Praveen Chakravarty has also met Vijay and openly criticised the DMK government’s financial management, signalling growing warmth towards TVK. Despite this, many Tamil Nadu Congress leaders favour sticking with the DMK for reasons of electoral practicality. Analysts suggest the Congress may be using TVK as leverage to extract better terms from its traditional ally rather than seriously planning a break. Given the DMK’s importance to the INDIA bloc and Congress’s weak independent base in Tamil Nadu, the high command may ultimately prioritise national considerations over state-level ambitions. With Congress having failed to produce a chief minister in Tamil

One Year In, Trump Dominates U.S. Politics — But Questions Loom Over How Long His Hold Will Last

One year after Donald Trump returned to the White House, his influence over American politics and global affairs remains unmistakable — but an increasingly uncertain future raises questions about how long his dominance will last.

Since being sworn in for a second term in January 2025, Trump has stamped his imprint on the presidency with an assertive, highly personal leadership style that critics say has weakened traditional checks and balances. Observers note that ordinary presidential norms have given way to an approach driven more by impulse and individual will than by established institutional processes.

The past year has been marked by a flurry of headline grabbing actions. Early in his term, Trump issued sweeping pardons to hundreds of pro-Trump rioters involved in the Capitol attack, a move that symbolised his readiness to reshape legal and political norms. On the international stage, he ordered military action against Venezuela and pursued controversial policies on tariffs and foreign relations — dramatic gestures that have unsettled allies and rivals alike.

Legal and political analysts say Trump's presidency has often operated as if the usual constraints of governance do not apply. A law professor in New York described the current era as one in which the presidency has been “personalised” like never before, reflecting Trump's

own approach to power and public messaging.

Yet experts also stress that Trump's grip on leadership is not unassailable. The United States faces several key tests this year that could reshape his influence. Midterm elections in November loom large, with control of Congress at stake. Historically, these elections act as a referendum on the sitting president, and low approval ratings coupled with public discontent over economic pressures could spell trouble for Republicans if voters shift their support.

Political observers warn that a significant loss in Congress could leave Trump in a weakened position, effectively a “lame duck” leader for the final two years of his term. Legal challenges also present hurdles: the Supreme Court may limit the administration's use of tariffs, and Congress might push back against executive orders seen as bypassing legislative authority. Foreign policy, a major focus of Trump's agenda, has also drawn mixed reactions. Some supporters applaud his bold moves abroad, but critics argue that focus on international interventions has distracted from domestic issues that matter deeply to many voters.

As 2026 unfolds, the central question facing Trump and his allies is whether a media dominating, personality driven presidency can withstand electoral realities and institutional limits — or whether the moment of Trump will soon wane.



Pakistan Expands Defence Footprint in the Arab World with “Islamic NATO” and Major Arms Deals



Pakistan is significantly expanding its military and defence presence across the Arab world, pursuing major arms deals and exploring a trilateral security partnership with Saudi Arabia and Turkey, which analysts have termed an “Islamic NATO.” These moves highlight Islamabad's growing ambition to play a more prominent role in regional security beyond its traditional sphere of influence.

At the centre of this expansion is Pakistan's effort to formalise a defence cooperation framework with Saudi Arabia and Turkey. Officials say the proposed pact would commit all three countries to collective security measures similar in principle to NATO's mutual defence clause. Although negotiations are ongoing, the agreement reflects a shared interest in closer military collaboration among Muslim-majority nations. In parallel, Pakistan is negotiating multi-billion-dollar arms deals with several countries. Reports indicate that Islamabad is close to finalising a \$1.5 billion contract to supply weapons and aircraft to Sudan's military, including light attack aircraft, drones, and air-defence systems. Discussions with Saudi Arabia could result in a fighter jet agreement worth around \$2 billion, further strengthening defence ties between the two countries.

These developments signal a shift in Pakistan's role from primarily providing military training and support to becoming a significant exporter of

defence equipment in the Middle East. The JF-17 Thunder fighter jet, co-produced with China, has attracted interest from nations such as Iraq and other states seeking cost-effective military platforms. Analysts note that Pakistan's expanding clientele enhances its strategic influence but also requires careful diplomatic navigation.

Experts caution that Islamabad must manage complex regional dynamics, as conflicts in countries like Sudan, Libya, and Yemen involve rival factions backed by different powers. Selling similar weaponry to opposing sides could complicate Pakistan's relations with key partners and affect its long-term credibility as a defence supplier.

Pakistan's increased engagement comes amid intensified geopolitical competition, with several countries reassessing military procurement strategies. As Islamabad strengthens its strategic agreements and expands its defence exports, the regional security architecture could evolve, reflecting new patterns of cooperation outside traditional Western-led alliances. Overall, Pakistan's push into the Arab defence market marks a notable chapter in its foreign policy and military diplomacy. With the combination of high-profile arms deals and proposed security partnerships, Islamabad is positioning itself as a key player in Middle Eastern security, potentially reshaping regional power balances in South and West Asia.

India and EU Poised for Landmark Trade Deal Amid Republic Day Visit

India is preparing for a historic diplomatic engagement as top leaders of the European Union (EU) arrive in the country for the 77th Republic Day celebrations, with a potential trade deal expected to be a highlight of their visit. European Council President António Costa and European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen are scheduled to be chief guests at the Republic Day parade in New Delhi. Their visit will be followed by the 16th India-EU Summit, where officials aim to finalise negotiations on a comprehensive Free Trade Agreement (FTA).

The proposed Broad-based Trade and Investment Agreement (BTIA) has been in discussion since 2007 but faced several delays over the years. Talks gained renewed momentum in 2022 amid shifting global economic dynamics and strategic interests. Sources say that most chapters



of the agreement have been concluded, with only a few sensitive issues pending resolution, including matters related to agriculture and the EU's carbon tax policies. Indian and EU officials are optimistic that these remaining

concerns will be addressed ahead of the leaders' summit.

Alongside the formal summit, an India-EU Business Forum is expected to take place, emphasising economic cooperation and showcasing opportunities

for bilateral trade and investment. The potential agreement is expected to cover sectors including manufacturing, technology, clean energy, pharmaceuticals, and services, paving the way for stronger economic ties and

greater market access on both sides.

If signed, this FTA would mark one of India's most significant trade agreements to date and would represent a milestone in EU engagement in Asia. Both sides have high-

lighted their shared commitment to a rules-based international order and sustainable economic growth, reinforcing the strategic and economic importance of the partnership.

The Republic Day invitation reflects the growing significance of India-EU relations, which have expanded across technology, security, sustainability, and trade. The EU leaders' visit also follows increased diplomatic and commercial engagement in recent years, including previous high-level visits and the establishment of new economic initiatives.

As India welcomes its European guests, attention is focused on the potential announcement of the landmark trade agreement, which could redefine bilateral economic relations and create a new chapter of cooperation between the world's fifth-largest economy and one of its major trading blocs.

Trump Accepts Symbolic Nobel Peace Prize Medal from Venezuelan Opposition Leader in Unprecedented Gesture

In a highly unusual diplomatic moment at the White House on Thursday, former U.S. President Donald Trump was presented with the Nobel Peace Prize medal by Venezuelan opposition leader Maria Corina Machado — a gesture he described as “wonderful” but which has sparked controversy and clarification from Nobel officials.

Machado, who was awarded the 2025 Nobel Peace Prize for her efforts to promote democracy and human rights in Venezuela, presented the medal to Trump during a private meeting. She said the act was in recognition of his perceived support for Venezuelan freedom and democratic transition, describing the transfer as a “symbol of mutual respect” and gratitude on behalf of the Venezuelan people. Trump took to his social media platform to thank Machado, calling her “a wonderful woman who has been through so much” and praising the gesture as one of respect and honour.

A framed version of the Nobel Peace Prize medal was



handed to Trump inside the White House, and a senior White House official confirmed that he intends to keep it. The meeting, which lasted more than an hour, also included discussions between Machado and lawmakers on Capitol Hill. However, the Norwegian

Nobel Institute has been equivocal in stressing that Nobel Peace Prizes cannot be transferred or shared. Under the rules of the Nobel Foundation, once a prize is awarded, the title of laureate is permanent and non transferable, even if the physical medal changes hands. The commit-

tee's clarification underscores that Machado's gift does not make Trump a Nobel laureate. The extraordinary exchange comes amid a backdrop of political upheaval in Venezuela. U.S. forces recently captured long time Venezuelan leader Nicolás Maduro, a move that re-

shaped the nation's leadership landscape. Machado, once a leading figure of the Venezuelan opposition and expected to lead the country, has struggled to maintain political momentum after Trump's administration chose to back Vice President Delcy Rodríguez as interim leader, a decision that disappointed many of Machado's supporters. Critics have described Machado's action as symbolic and lacking institutional significance, while analysts say the gesture illustrates broader political manoeuvring rather than a substantive recognition of Trump's global peace efforts. Nobel officials reiterated that while the physical medal may be possessed by someone else, the honour and status of Nobel Peace Prize remain solely with the original laureate.

The controversy has reignited debate about the meaning of prestigious international awards, political symbolism, and the boundaries between personal admiration and official recognition.

British MP Raises Alarm Over Violence Against Minorities in Bangladesh Ahead of Elections



A senior British lawmaker has sounded the alarm over escalating violence against religious minorities in Bangladesh, describing the situation as “disastrous” and urging urgent international attention ahead of the country's upcoming national elections.

Conservative Member of Parliament Bob Blackman, speaking in the House of Commons, highlighted reports of attacks targeting minority communities, particularly Hindus. He said individuals are being murdered, homes and temples destroyed, and other reli-

gious groups are facing similar persecution. Blackman's remarks have intensified concerns among Western lawmakers about human rights conditions in the South Asian nation.

During his speech, Blackman called on the British government to take decisive

action to protect minorities and ensure that the upcoming elections are free, fair, and inclusive. He noted that he had raised the matter in parliamentary discussions and urged the Foreign Secretary to outline concrete steps to address the crisis.

The lawmaker also linked the rise in violence to the tense political climate ahead of the February 12 national elections. He pointed out that one of Bangladesh's major political parties has been barred from contesting under the current interim government, raising concerns about the credibility of the electoral process. Blackman warned that exclusion of significant political forces, combined with the rise of extremist rhetoric, could further destabilise the country.

In his address, Blackman stated: “Hindu men are being murdered on the streets; their houses are being burned; the temples are being desecrated; and other religious minorities are suffering similar fates.” He emphasised that the UK must use its diplomatic influence to encourage Bangladesh to uphold democratic norms

and protect vulnerable communities.

Other British MPs from multiple parties have expressed similar concerns, stressing that credible elections cannot take place if major political groups are excluded. They supported Blackman's call for Parliament to receive a clear action plan from the government on promoting inclusive elections and safeguarding minority rights.

The UK government has reiterated its longstanding commitment to human rights and stated that it continues to engage with Bangladeshi authorities to support peaceful and credible elections. Officials condemned all acts of violence based on religion or ethnicity and stressed the importance of ensuring the safety and dignity of all citizens.

As Bangladesh approaches a pivotal electoral moment, the issue of minority rights and political inclusivity remains under intense international scrutiny, highlighting the challenges the country faces in maintaining social stability and democratic norms.

Indian Markets Set for Cautious Trade as Global Cues Remain Mixed



Indian equity markets are expected to begin the trading session on a muted note, with early indicators pointing to a flat to marginally positive opening. Signals from the Gift Nifty suggested limited movement at the start, reflecting cautious investor sentiment amid mixed global cues and ongoing assessment of corporate

earnings.

Overnight, U.S. markets ended on a positive note, supported by selective buying in technology and financial stocks. Improved confidence around the U.S. economic outlook and expectations of policy stability helped Wall Street close higher. However, this optimism was only partially reflected across Asian

markets, where trading trends remained mixed in early hours. While some Asian indices registered modest gains, others traded lower, weighed down by concerns over regional growth and currency movements.

Back home, domestic benchmarks have been showing resilience but remain largely range-

bound. In the previous session, the Sensex and the Nifty witnessed intraday volatility, trimming gains after touching higher levels. The Nifty managed to hold above key psychological and technical levels, indicating underlying support, though profit-booking at elevated valuations capped further upside. Market par-

ticipants continue to remain selective, preferring stock-specific opportunities over broad-based buying.

Sectorally, trends have been mixed. Information technology stocks have shown relative strength, supported by recent quarterly results and improved outlook commentary from major companies. Banking and financial stocks, which carry significant weight in benchmark indices, have been trading cautiously as investors assess asset quality trends, credit growth, and margin outlooks. FMCG and other defensive sectors have provided stability, while metal and energy stocks have reacted to fluctuations in global commodity prices.

Investor focus is now firmly on the ongoing earnings season, which is expected to play a decisive role in shaping near-term market direction. Quarterly results from large corporates are being closely tracked for insights into demand conditions, cost

pressures, and margin sustainability. Any earnings surprises could trigger sharp stock-specific movements, even as the broader indices remain confined within a narrow range. In addition to earnings, global macroeconomic developments, foreign institutional investor activity, crude oil prices, and currency movements are likely to influence market sentiment. The rupee's trajectory against the U.S. dollar and trends in global bond yields will also be monitored for cues on capital flows. Overall, market experts believe that while the near-term outlook points to consolidation, the broader trend remains supported by domestic fundamentals. Investors are advised to remain cautious, focus on fundamentally strong companies, and avoid aggressive positions until clearer signals emerge from global markets and corporate earnings.

Global Bond Index Snub Raises Odds of RBI Expanding Debt-Buying Program



The unexpected deferral of Indian government bonds' inclusion in a major global index has triggered market speculation that the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) may expand its record debt-buying program in the current fiscal quarter. Investors and analysts say the central bank could step up purchases to stabilize yields and support liquidity amid subdued foreign inflows.

Bloomberg Index Services recently postponed the inclusion of Indian debt in its flagship Global Aggregate Index, disappointing market participants who had anticipated significant foreign capital inflows. Analysts had estimated phased investments of roughly \$10-\$20 billion had the integration proceeded as planned. The postponement has heightened uncertainty in the bond market, pushing up yields on India's benchmark 10-year government securities by nearly 10 basis points. This comes at a time when the market is already grappling with heavy government borrowing and weaker overseas demand.

Since December, the RBI has been aggressively intervening in the sovereign debt market through open market operations (OMOs), purchasing around 2.54 trillion of government securities to anchor yields and support market liquidity. Additional purchases of roughly 500 billion are scheduled in the coming week. Market participants had largely expected such in-

terventions to wind down as the financial year approaches its close in April. However, the global index snub has revived expectations that the RBI may continue buying government bonds, potentially adding another 1.5-2 trillion between February and March.

Market experts note that the central bank's actions are critical to maintaining investor confidence. Treasury officials have emphasized the importance of targeting liquid benchmark securities to send clear signals to the market. Traders, meanwhile, have expressed concern that purchases of less liquid securities may limit the effectiveness of yield management and constrain activity in the secondary market.

The bond market's reaction underscores the influence of global index inclusion, which is widely viewed as a catalyst for passive foreign investment flows into local debt markets. With the postponement, domestic liquidity and RBI intervention are expected to remain the primary support mechanisms for stabilizing yields.

As the fiscal year progresses, all eyes will remain on the RBI's next moves and how the market responds to evolving supply-demand dynamics. Analysts suggest that continued central bank support may be essential to offset the impact of heavy government borrowing and to maintain orderly functioning of India's sovereign bond market.

SEBI's Mutual Fund Regulation Revamp to Reshape Industry from April 1



Mumbai, January 16 — The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has notified a comprehensive overhaul of mutual fund regulations, set to come into effect from April 1, marking a major step toward strengthening investor protection and improving transparency in the fast-growing

asset management industry. The revised framework is expected to significantly impact how mutual fund houses operate, disclose costs, and maintain governance standards.

A central feature of the new regulations is tighter control over expenses charged to investors. SEBI has clear-

ly defined which costs can be included in the Total Expense Ratio, ensuring that only legitimate and essential expenses are passed on to unitholders. Any costs falling outside the prescribed list will have to be borne by the asset management companies, sponsors, or trustees themselves. This

move is aimed at preventing hidden charges and ensuring that investors have a clearer understanding of what they are paying for.

The regulatory overhaul also places greater responsibility on trustees and independent directors. They will be required to actively monitor fund management agreements, compensation structures, related-party transactions, and overall fee reasonableness. Trustees must identify regulatory lapses, ensure timely corrective measures, and formally report compliance issues.

This enhanced oversight framework is designed to strengthen accountability and reduce conflicts of interest within the mutual fund ecosystem. Another important change relates to the treatment of transaction-related costs. Expenses incurred directly for trade execution, such as brokerage and exchange fees, have been clearly segregated from the base expense ratio. This distinction is expected to improve cost transparency and allow investors to make more accurate comparisons across different mutual fund schemes.

Disclosure norms have also been significantly strengthened. Mutual funds will now be required to provide more detailed and standardized reporting in their annual disclosures. Trustees will need to include comprehensive commentary on scheme performance, justification for expense levels, historical unit data, and detailed expense break-ups. These reports must be shared with investors in a timely digital format, enhancing accessibility and investor awareness.

From an industry perspective, the new rules may lead to high-

Budget 2026: Making the New Tax Regime a Clear Winner

As preparations intensify ahead of India's Union Budget 2026, tax experts and financial planners are focusing on ways to strengthen the new personal income tax regime so it appeals more broadly and becomes the preferred choice for taxpayers. While previous reforms have simplified the structure and offered significant relief, analysts believe targeted tweaks could further boost adoption and make the system more equitable and practical.

The new tax regime, redesigned in recent budgets, has already delivered notable benefits to taxpayers. By widening tax slabs and enhancing rebates, especially for middle income earners, the overhaul has reduced tax liabilities for many and simplified compliance by removing most deductions and exemptions. This shift has encouraged a growing number of taxpayers to opt for the new regime over the older, more complicated structure.

Still, there are concerns about gaps that could be addressed to "clear the runway" for the new regime to become a clear winner. One of the biggest criticisms is the absence of commonly used deductions such as house rent allowance and medical insurance, which many argue should be reintroduced in a limited form. Experts point out that allowing essential deductions would improve the regime's appeal without undermining its core objective of simplicity.

Another key suggestion is to increase the standard deduction, which has become the main source of relief under the new regime after most exemptions were removed. Raising this deduction could help offset the loss of other benefits and better reflect inflation and rising living costs, particularly for



salaried individuals.

Experts also urge extending loan linked tax benefits to the new regime. Deductions for education loan interest and home loan interest, currently only available under the old regime, could be incorporated since they are administratively straightforward and tied to formal financial records.

There is a strong case for improving provisions for senior citizens, who currently receive fewer benefits under the new regime despite facing higher health related expenditures. Revisiting basic exemption limits and offering targeted relief for older taxpayers could make the system more inclusive.

Finally, observers note that tax policy should not stop at compliance ease but also support long term financial planning. Introducing capped incentives for retirement savings, health insurance, or first home purchases could strike a balance between simplicity and financial security, encouraging responsible financial behaviour without adding undue complexity.

With these refinements, Budget 2026 has an opportunity to deepen the new tax regime's appeal, helping it transition from a simplified alternative into the mainstream choice for a broader cross section of India's taxpayers.

Foreign Fund Rebalancing Triggers Equity Stake Changes in Aavas Financiers and IndiaMART

Institutional portfolio rebalancing by global investors has led to notable shifts in shareholding patterns of two prominent Indian listed companies, signalling dynamic flows in equity markets. Small Cap World Fund Inc, a global investment vehicle managed by Capital Group, exited its entire holding in Aavas Financiers and trimmed its stake in IndiaMART InterMESH through open market transactions on January 14. This move reflects active allocation strategies by foreign funds in response to evolving market conditions and investment outlooks.

Small Cap World Fund sold its entire 2.48 percent stake in Aavas Financiers, offloading 19.64 lakh shares at around 1,440 apiece for approximately 282.8 crore. Aavas Financiers, a housing finance company focused on retail and affordable housing segments, has been a favorite among institutional investors



due to its consistent growth in net sales and strong asset quality. The exit by the fund underscores shifting priorities among global small-cap investors, potentially influenced by valuation considera-

tions and broader macroeconomic signals.

Stepping in to acquire these shares, HDFC Mutual Fund purchased 19.5 lakh equity shares, amounting to a 2.46 percent holding in Aavas Financiers for

nearly 280.9 crore, reiterating domestic institutional appetite for quality financial stocks. The transaction suggests confidence among Indian mutual funds in the long-term prospects of the housing finance

segment, even as foreign portfolios recalibrate exposures.

Simultaneously, Small Cap World Fund reduced its stake in IndiaMART InterMESH, selling 6.26 lakh shares — roughly a 1.04 percent holding — for around 132.2 crore. Prior to the sale, the fund held about 1.83 percent in the B2B online marketplace company. This repositioning by a global fund highlights active risk management and profit-booking behaviour after periods of stock-specific or sectoral gains.

Acquiring the trimmed stake in IndiaMART, Nalanda India Equity Fund, managed by Singapore-based Nalanda Capital, bought 11.18 lakh shares, representing nearly a 1.86 percent stake valued at about 236 crore. The participation of another foreign institutional player indicates sustained interest from global equity investors in India's digital and technology-enabled ser-

vice providers, albeit within recalibrated risk frameworks.

The stock market responded to these bulk deals with modest price movements. Shares of Aavas Financiers saw a slight dip, while IndiaMART's stock fluctuated due to the change in major shareholdings. Such block transactions — particularly when involving foreign funds — often influence short-term liquidity and price discovery, as domestic and global institutions adjust portfolios in line with shifting investment priorities.

Market watchers view these developments as part of broader trends in institutional investing, where global funds periodically rotate holdings across sectors and geographies to optimise returns. The active participation of domestic mutual funds as buyers in these deals reflects robust local demand for solid growth stories in the financial and digital commerce arenas.

A Sewing Mistake Creates an Unlikely Mascot for the Year of the Horse

A minor production error at a toy factory in eastern China has unexpectedly given birth to a viral sensation, turning what was once considered a defective product into an internet favourite. Toy ponies with unusually sad, weeping expressions have captured public imagination online and are now being celebrated as unlikely mascots for the Year of the Horse.

The unusual toys first gained attention in January when a social media user shared an image of a pony with tearful eyes and a sorrowful expression. What appeared to be a deliberate design choice was, in fact, the result of a simple sewing mistake. The toys were produced in Yiwu International Trade City in Zhejiang province, widely regarded as the world's largest wholesale market for small commodities, according to a report by the *South China Morning Post*.

Standing about 20 centimetres tall and priced at 25 yuan, the toy pony was originally designed as a festive symbol of the Year of the Horse. It features a bright red body—traditionally considered an auspicious colour in Chinese culture—and is embroidered with a golden message meaning “wealth will arrive soon.” However, a technical error during production caused the toy's mouth and nostrils to be stitched incorrectly, giving it a downturned, tearful expression.

Initially, the crying face was viewed as a flaw. But instead of rejecting the product, internet users found the pony's emotional appearance oddly endearing. Nicknamed the “Crying Horse,” the toy quickly went viral, with

photos and videos spreading across social media platforms.

Many buyers related deeply to the pony's expression. One user, known online as Tuan Tuan Mami, said the toy looked sad and helpless—much like how she feels at work. She shared that keeping the Crying Horse during the Year of the Horse gives her hope of leaving behind workplace frustrations and embracing happiness.

The toy has resonated especially with young professionals who refer to themselves as “New Ma,” a slang term meaning “Ox and Horse,” commonly used to describe overworked employees. For them, the Crying Horse has become a humorous yet heartfelt symbol of modern office life.

Another buyer remarked that the crying pony felt more authentic than cheerful toys, saying that imperfections reflect real life and give people something they can truly connect with.

Factory owner Zhang Huoqing revealed that when the toy was first launched in October last year, sales were modest, averaging around 400 units per day. Following its viral success, daily orders surged into the thousands, prompting the factory to add more than 10 new production lines.

Although the worker responsible for the sewing error remains unknown, Zhang said the entire production team would be rewarded. The company has also applied for an appearance patent and is expanding the design to other products, including keychains and travel neck pillows.



Couple Uncovers Secret Rooms in 130-Year-Old Home After Receiving Eerie Letter



What began as the purchase of a charming 130-year-old home quickly turned into a real-life mystery for a millennial couple, who uncovered secret rooms, hidden compartments, and long-forgotten spaces after receiving an eerie handwritten letter. Courtney and her husband Matt were drawn into the house's hidden past when a message addressed simply to “Purchaser” arrived at their doorstep, promising to reveal secrets about the historic property they had just bought.

Courtney later shared the entire experience in a TikTok video that quickly went viral, amassing more than 1.5 million views. Nebraska Grandmother's 40-Year-Old Porch Pot Sells for 29 Lakh on Her 91st Birthday



What began as an ordinary plan to hold a garage sale turned into a once-in-a-lifetime moment for Lois Jurgens, a 91-year-old Nebraska resident, when a stone-ware crock she had kept on her porch for four decades sold at auction for an astonishing 29 lakh (around \$32,000).

Jurgens had originally intended to sell the 30-gallon Red Wing crock for no more than \$50, unaware that it was a rare collector's item. Just before finalising her garage sale plans, she noticed that Bramer Auction and Realty was hosting an auction featuring antique crocks. tioner Bramer decided to visit Jurgens' home to inspect the crock. When he turned it around, he immediately noticed a set of distinctive blue butterfly markings—an extremely rare feature among Red Wing stoneware.

What truly stunned him, however, was that the crock was stamped twice, something collectors consider a “once-in-a-lifetime” find. The markings instantly elevated the pot from a household item to a prized collector's piece.

Jurgens, meanwhile, modestly estimated the crock might fetch about \$100. Bramer reportedly laughed and told her she was “going to be surprised.”

On auction day, nearly 300 bidders gathered, with intense competition driving the price upward. By the time bidding crossed \$19,000, only three bidders re-

mained—hailing from Texas, Kansas, and Iowa—locked in a fierce bidding war.

Jurgens couldn't attend the auction initially, as she was spending her 91st birthday volunteering at her local church. When she later arrived at the fairgrounds, the bidding had ended.

“We did a little better than \$100,” Bramer joked before revealing the final price: \$32,000.

Overwhelmed by the news, Jurgens reportedly felt weak in the knees and was helped onto the stage to sit beside the crock that had changed her life. She later said that in her 91 years, nothing had been more exciting than the sale of that humble porch pot.
