CM Revanth Reddy Launches Rs.50-Crore Assistive Devices Programme for Persons with Disabilities

Hyderabad, January 12, 2026— TPN Bureau

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Monday reaffirmed that the Telangana government is working with a strong humanitarian approach to ensure that persons with disabilities (Divyangs) live with dignity, self-respect, and equal opportunities in society. Addressing a programme organised at Praja Bhavan, the Chief Minister launched the free distribution of retrofitted motorised vehicles, battery-operated tricycles, battery wheelchairs, laptops, hearing aids, mobile phones, and other advanced assistive devices to persons with disabilities under the aegis of the Divyan-

gula Sahakara Samstha. For the first time in the State's history, the government has allocated a massive 50 crore for this initiative. Revanth Reddy said the government had earmarked 50 crore with the resolve to stand by persons with disabilities like a family member and provide them confidence and support. He asserted that Divyangs would be provided their rightful reservation in education and employment and announced that the government had decided to extend financial assistance of 2lakh for the marriage of persons with disabilities. Highlighting the government's commitment to inclusivity in sports, the Chief Minister said that a girl who excelled at the Paralympics was given a government job as encouragement. He

stressed that the government was creating opportunities in all fields so that persons with disabilities do not feel left behind in a competitive world. He urged beneficiaries to make full use of government schemes and move forward in life with self-confidence. The Chief Minister recalled former Union Minister Jaipal Reddy, who emerged as one of the best parliamentarians in the country, as an inspiration to persons with disabilities, stating that he rose to great heights without letting disability define him. Revanth Reddy also proposed nominating a transgender person as a co-option member and corporator in the upcoming municipal corporation elections, to ensure their issues are directly voiced in local bodies. On social welfare ini-

tiatives, he said the government was establishing "Pranam" day-care centres for senior citizens and proposed a law to ensure that 10 per cent of the salary of government employees who neglect their parents is directly credited to their parents' accounts based on complaints. Reiterating the government's broader vision, the Chief Minister said Telangana aims to provide 100 per cent healthcare coverage and would introduce a comprehensive health policy in the upcoming budget session. He said Telangana has emerged as a model State in social justice by conducting a caste census and implementing SC sub-categorisation, and concluded by calling upon all sections to work together to make Telangana an ideal welfare State in the country.



Revanth Reddy Betrayed Telangana's Water Rights on Polavaram–Nallamala Sagar Issue: Harish Rao

Former Minister and senior BRS leader T. Harish Rao on Sunday launched a sharp attack on Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, alleging that the Telangana government had deliberately weakened the state's legal position in the Supreme Court on the Polavaram-Nallamala Sagar project, thereby facilitating Andhra Pradesh's interests at the cost of Telangana's water rights. Harish Rao said the "true face and betrayal mindset" of Revanth Reddy had been exposed before the Supreme Court after the state government filed what he described as a "legally unsustainable and weak petition." He contrasted the present government's approach with the past, recalling that during the Palamuru-Rangareddy project dispute, effective legal action, including writ petitions filed with the support of farmers, had secured a stay against Andhra Pradesh projects. "Didn't the govern-

ment's legal team or senior advocate Abhishek Manu Singhvi advise the Chief Minister that such a petition was not even maintainable?" Harish Rao asked. He questioned the need for the Irrigation Minister to travel to Delhi in formal attire merely to defend a flawed legal strategy. The former minister alleged that by withdrawing the writ petition and stating that a civil suit would be filed instead, the Telangana government was effectively granting Andhra Pradesh crucial time to complete the Nallamala Sagar project. He warned that involving multiple states—Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Maharashtra, and Karnataka—in prolonged hearings would only delay justice, during which Andhra Pradesh could finish construction and divert water irreversibly. Harish Rao termed the weak petition filed in the Supreme Court as a "Sankranti gift" from Revanth Reddy to Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu. He alleged

that the Congress government had been consistently cooperating with Andhra Pradesh, citing instances such as attending Delhi meetings despite claiming no agenda, discussing controversial projects like Banakacharla, signing agreements after initially denying them, and forming committees that allegedly legitimized Andhra Pradesh's water diversion. "After tenders were finalized, the government approached the Supreme Court, indirectly signalling consent to the Nallamala Sagar project," he charged. He accused Revanth Reddy of misleading the people by promising to block the project and fight legally, only to file a weak case that harmed Telangana's interests. Harish Rao warned that the BRS would not remain silent, asserting that the party would take the issue to the public domain and wage a determined fight to protect Telangana's rightful share of Krishna and Godavari waters.

Telangana Government Boosts Welfare for Divyang Couples and Persons with Disabilities

Telangana Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka emphasized the government's strong commitment to the welfare of persons with disabilities during a distribution program for assistive devices held at Praja Bhavan on Monday. Addressing the gathering, he highlighted the state administration's progressive policies under Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's leadership, noting that the government has expanded support for Divyang couples, providing 2 lakh as financial assistance for marriages. Deputy CM Vikramarka stated that unlike previous governments, which allocated funds to a limited number of welfare schemes, the current administration

ensures financial support across all departments while giving special focus to the needs of persons with disabilities. "We promised during the election campaign that once our government came to power, we would significantly increase funding for Divyang welfare programs," he said. He pointed out that in the last ten years, the previous government spent 60 crore on disability welfare, whereas the present government has allocated 100 crore in just two years. As part of this initiative, the government provides retrofitted motorized vehicles, battery-operated tricycles, battery wheelchairs, and other assistive devices at no cost to the beneficiaries. "These tools are meant to empower persons with disabilities and

help them achieve greater independence," the Deputy CM said. Highlighting inclusive employment measures, Vikramarka noted that the government has issued GO 34, which ensures that persons with disabilities are posted in locations where they are currently employed, enabling continuity and convenience. He stressed that the government actively identifies the specific needs of Divyang individuals and takes proactive steps to meet them. Deputy CM Bhatti Vikramarka reiterated that the Telangana government's policies are designed to strengthen the dignity, self-reliance, and opportunities for persons with disabilities, reflecting the administration's commitment to inclusive development and social justice.

Telangana Govt's Integrated Residential Schools: A Role Model and Game Changer

Telangana Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu on Monday emphasized the state government's flagship Integrated Residential Schools project as a "dream initiative" and a game changer in the education sector. Addressing a video conference with district collectors and Chief Secre-

tary, he reviewed the construction progress and set clear directives to ensure timely completion of these schools. The Deputy CM stressed that district collectors hold full responsibility for completing the construction of Integrated Residential Schools in their jurisdictions. He instructed that groundbreaking and foundation ceremonies be conducted with ministers or local MLAs

present once tenders are finalized, and a strict construction calendar must be fixed. Collectors were also asked to conduct weekly progress reviews and to visit the school sites at least once a month for on-site inspections. Vikramarka clarified that funding is not a constraint, with payments being released every 15 days to contractors. He highlighted that historically sepa-

rate SC, ST, BC, and Minority residential schools will now be integrated, sending a powerful message of social unity to the nation. These schools are envisioned to meet international standards, enabling students from Telangana to compete globally. To ensure accountability, the Deputy CM directed that if contractors do not begin work within 15 days of sign-

ing agreements, appropriate action must be taken. He also instructed that local land and administrative issues should be resolved by engaging with MLAs, CCLA, or the Chief Secretary. Additionally, a third-party quality check agency will monitor construction at the site, with weekly progress reports submitted to the Chief Secretary. The Deputy CM emphasized that the aim is to make the maximum number of schools operational by the next academic year, ensuring quality infrastructure and holistic education for all students. The video conference was attended by Minister Aturi Lakshman, MP Balaram Naik, Chief Secretary Ramakrishna Rao, Principal Secretary of Finance Sandeep Kumar Sultanya, TG WDC MD Ganapathi Rao, and other senior officials. The initiative positions Telangana's Integrated Residential Schools as a national role model in inclusive education and social integration, combining resources to provide world-class facilities under one roof.



Minister Seethakka Launches Three Landmark Welfare Initiatives for Disabled, Children and Elderly

Hyderabad, January 12, 2026 (TPN Bureau): State Minister Seethakka on Monday described the launch of three major welfare programmes as a “historic and deeply humane initiative” aimed at strengthening social security and dignity for vulnerable sections of society. Acting on the directions of Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, the government has rolled out a comprehensive package focusing on persons with disabilities, children, and senior citizens.

Addressing the gathering, the Minister announced the launch of three flagship initiatives: distribution of as-

sistive devices to persons with disabilities with an outlay of 50 crore, the “Bala Bharosa” programme for children, and “Pranam” day care centres for senior citizens. She said these programmes reflect the government’s commitment to inclusive growth and compassionate governance.

Explaining the Bala Bharosa scheme, Seethakka said the government would take full responsibility for identifying and treating health and developmental issues among children at the Anganwadi level itself. “Children’s physical and developmental challenges will be identified early, and



complete treatment, including surgeries wherever required, will be provided free of cost,” she said. The initiative aims to ensure timely intervention and holistic development of children from economically weaker backgrounds.

Highlighting the government’s focus on the

welfare of persons with disabilities, the Minister said unprecedented priority was being accorded to their empowerment and self-reliance. She recalled that during her earlier tenure as minister, job portals were introduced to improve employment opportunities for the disabled, and a cash incentive of 1 lakh was provided for marriages between persons with disabilities.

“Our objective is not charity, but dignity. We want persons with disabilities to stand on their own feet and live with self-respect,” Seethakka said. She noted that the government was providing tricycles, scooters,

and three-wheeler vehicles free of cost to enable mobility, livelihoods, and small business opportunities for persons with disabilities.

The Minister pointed out that in the past, only around 1 crore was allocated annually for assistive devices. “For the first time ever, the Chief Minister has shown great compassion by increasing this allocation to 50 crore,” she said, thanking CM Revanth Reddy for the decision. She also expressed gratitude to Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka for allocating a special budget for the welfare of persons with disabilities in line with the Chief Minister’s

vision.

Turning to senior citizen welfare, Seethakka said the government had launched “Pranam” day care centres to ensure that elderly parents do not have to spend their lives in loneliness. “These centres will help senior citizens remain active, socially engaged, and emotionally strong,” she said, adding that the facilities would promote joy, companionship, and mental well-being among the elderly. The Minister concluded by stating that these initiatives marked a new chapter in Telangana’s welfare governance, placing humanity, dignity, and care at the centre of public policy.

Minister Seethakka, MLAs Meet DGP Shivadhar Reddy; Discuss Issues of Tribal Police Battalion

During the meeting, the Minister and the

MLAs brought to the notice of the DGP the various challenges being faced by personnel of the Tribal Police Battalion, particularly in matters related to new recruitments, promotions, postings, transfers, and local cadre issues. They explained that the lack of timely recruitment and promotions was affecting morale among the tribal police personnel and urged the police de-

partment to address these concerns at the earliest.

Minister Seethakka emphasized the need to resolve the long-pending issues of the Tribal Police Battalion in a comprehensive and time-bound manner. She said the battalion was playing an important role in maintaining law and order in sensitive areas and deserved special attention. The MLAs ech-

oed her views and requested the DGP to take necessary administrative steps to ensure justice to the personnel serving in the battalion.

Responding to the representations, DGP Shivadhar Reddy reportedly reacted positively and assured the delegation that the issues raised would be examined carefully. He stated that the police department would take appropriate measures

within the framework of rules to address genuine grievances related to recruitment, promotions, and transfers.

The meeting also focused on security arrangements for the upcoming Medaram Maha Jatar. Minister Seethakka requested the DGP to ensure strong and fool-proof security for the massive tribal festival, which attracts lakhs of devotees from across the State and neighbouring regions. CM Revanth Reddy Highlights Road Safety Awareness at “Arrive Alive” Program

The Chief Minister lauded the police department for devising effective plans to curb road accidents, noting that every minute, a road accident occurs somewhere in India. He stressed that road safety education should begin at the student level to cultivate awareness early and foster responsible behavior on roads.

Highlighting broader law enforcement initiatives, CM Reddy said that the police system is being strengthened in line with evolving social challenges, including the rise of cyber crimes and drug-related offenses. He noted the state’s proactive measures, such as establishing a dedicated cyber crime control framework and the Eagle Force to address drug threats, which has earned Telangana Police recognition



nationally and internationally.

CM Reddy also cited the state’s environmental initiatives, including the protection and restoration of lakes, ponds, and canals under the HYDRA program, linking community awareness events such as the kite festival to ecological conservation.

Addressing the severity of road accidents, he

remarked that fatalities from road crashes surpass those in wartime, affecting both ordinary citizens and public figures. He underscored the importance of automatic penalties for traffic violations, suggesting fines should be deducted directly from the vehicle owner’s account.

CM Reddy called for modernizing the traffic

system using technology and skill development, pointing out that while cyber-crime, drug abuse, and violent crimes are serious concerns, violations of traffic regulations have emerged as a major public safety issue. He stressed the need for awareness campaigns, better traffic signal management, and reinforcement of traffic po-

lice systems as top priorities.

Talasani Has No Standing to Speak on CM Revanth Reddy: Saikumar

Hyderabad, January 12 — TPN Bureau: Hyderabad, January 12, 2026 (TPN Bureau): Telangana Fisheries Corporation Chairman Mettu Saikumar launched a sharp attack on former minister Talasani Srinivas Yadav, accusing him of corruption, intimidation politics, and acting as an agent of the KCR family. Addressing the media at Gandhi Bhavan on Monday, Saikumar said Talasani lacked the stature and credibility to comment on Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy. Referring to Talasani as “Vasool Raja,” Saikumar alleged that the former minister was

known for illegal collections and strong-arm tactics during his tenure. “Before making allegations against the Chief Minister, Talasani should first remember his own history of extortion and questionable dealings,” he said. Saikumar questioned Talasani’s political and moral standing, remarking that he was not “Talasani Srinivas Yadav but Talasani Srinivas Rao,” and accused him of functioning merely as a “gumasta” of former chief minister K. Chandrashekar Rao’s family. “He blindly executed their orders and protected their interests. Such a person has no right to lecture others,” he asserted. Strongly



condemning Talasani’s remarks against Revanth Reddy, Saikumar said the former minister did not even have the courage to touch the Chief Minister; “not even his cutout.” He added that Revanth Reddy was not a leader who resorted to threats and intimidation like KCR. “Revanth Reddy confronts challenges boldly and is committed to rebuilding Telangana,” he said. Praising the Chief Minister’s leadership, Saikumar stated that Revanth Reddy was focused on correcting the damage caused by the previous regime and steering the State towards transparent and people-centric governance. “Telangana is witnessing reconstruc-

tion and renewal under his leadership,” he said. Challenging Talasani, Saikumar asked him to explain what development he had brought to Secunderabad and Sanathnagar. He alleged that Sanathnagar suffered due to Talasani’s actions and termed him a curse to the constituency. Reacting to Talasani’s provocative statements, Saikumar demanded that the police take suo motu cognisance and arrest him for issuing threats. “Such irresponsible and violent language has no place in a democracy,” he said, adding that the people of Telangana would decisively reject politics driven by fear and abuse of power.



Congress Leaders Strengthen Education and Local Administration in Nagar Kurnool

These initiatives reflect the continued focus of Congress leaders on education, infrastructure development, and citizen welfare, ensuring that rural communities in Nagar Kurnool receive better facilities and administrative services.



BRS Alleges Large-Scale Irregularities in ‘Bhu Bharati’, Demands Probe

Hyderabad, January 12, 2026 (TPN Bureau): Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) leader Dudimetla Balaraju Yadav on Monday alleged that a real estate mafia was operating across Telangana under the guise of the newly introduced ‘Bhu Bharati’ land management system. Addressing a press conference at Telangana Bhavan, he accused the Congress government of facilitating large-scale irregularities despite claiming that Bhu Bharati would usher in transparency. Balaraju Yadav said the government, which had earlier levelled several allegations against the Dharani portal, had now turned Bhu Bharati into a hub for illegal transactions. “The government boasted that Bhu Bharati would bring transparency. Today, it is clear what is actually happening across the State,” he alleged.



Raising serious questions over financial transactions, the BRS leader claimed that while 52 lakh slots were booked, the money corresponding to around 4,300 slots had allegedly been diverted. “Where did this money go? Into whose bank accounts was the government money transferred? The State government

must give clear answers,” he demanded. He further alleged that illegal land transactions had taken place in Yadadri, Rangareddy, and Jangaon districts, and sought details of the beneficiaries of these transactions. Balaraju Yadav asked Revenue Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy to explain why funds

meant to be credited to the treasury were allegedly being diverted to private accounts. The BRS leader also alleged that in Rangareddy district, lakhs of acres of land were placed under the prohibited list and later subjected to illegal registrations. He claimed that farmers were suffering due to these is-

sues and pointed out that several farmers had approached the courts after failing to receive promised loan waivers. “Courts have issued notices to the Yadadri district collector and agriculture department officials. This reflects the gravity of the situation,” he said, adding that farmer suicides were continuing across the State due to mounting distress. Questioning the government’s intent, Balaraju Yadav asked why Bhu Bharati had gone “off track” after replacing Dharani, which the Congress had previously criticised for causing hardships to people. He alleged that in the proposed Future City area, assigned lands were being taken away from the poor: “This is not a Future City, but a Real Estate City. Assigned lands are being grabbed by those in power,” he charged.

Key Reforms Implemented in Stamps and Registration Department: Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy

Hyderabad, January 12, 2026 (TPN Bureau): The Telangana government has initiated far-reaching reforms in the Stamps and Registration Department to make it fully transparent, corruption-free, and citizen-centric, State Revenue, Housing, Information and Public Relations Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy said on Monday. The reforms are being implemented in line with the vision of Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, with a strong focus on protecting government and poor people’s lands and cracking down on illegal encroachments. The Minister laid the foundation stone for an Integrated Sub-Registrar Office being constructed by SSR Builders at Kukatpally in Medchal-Malkajgiri district. Speaking on the occasion, he said the government was developing modern, corporate-standard integrated sub-registrar offices across the State in a phased manner to ensure public convenience and smooth administration. According to the Minister, the first phase of construction will cover areas within the Outer Ring Road (ORR), the



second phase will focus on district headquarters, and the third phase will extend to constituency headquarters. In the initial phase, 39 sub-registrar offices across Hyderabad, Rangareddy, Medchal-Malkajgiri, and Sangareddy districts are being grouped into 12 clusters for integrated building construction. He noted that the foundation stone for another integrated sub-registrar office was already laid at the Telangana Academy of Land Information and Management (TALIM) building in Gachibowli by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, and the fa-

cility is expected to be inaugurated by June. Significantly, these integrated buildings are being constructed without imposing any financial burden on the State exchequer. Builders are undertaking both construction and maintenance, with a mandatory provision requiring them to maintain the buildings for at least five years. Minister Ponguleti emphasized that the new facilities would be fully equipped to cater to the needs of newly married couples registering marriages, mothers visiting with young children, and economically weaker sections,

ensuring a comfortable and inclusive environment. He clarified that the government views the Registration Department not merely as a revenue-generating entity, but as a public service center. Highlighting the government’s pro-poor approach, the Minister said several reforms introduced over the past two years were aimed at safeguarding lands allotted to the poor as well as government lands. Illegal activities and land grabbing would be dealt with firmly. He added that if the government ever needs to reclaim assigned lands, it would ensure fair compensation

or alternative land for the affected beneficiaries. The Minister also appealed to people to participate in the upcoming Medaram Jatara, stating that extensive infrastructure development had been undertaken to modernize the venue. Several public representatives and officials, including Malkajgiri MP Eatala Rajender, Kukatpally MLA Madhavaram Krishna Rao, Legislative Council Chief Whip Patnam Mahender Reddy, senior officials of the Stamps and Registration Department, and representatives of the construction agency, were present at the event.

Telangana Prisons Department Leads in Prisoner Reformation: DG Soumya Mishra

Hyderabad, January 12, 2026 (TPN Bureau): The Telangana Prisons Department is emerging as a national leader in prisoner reformation and rehabilitation, Director General of Prisons Soumya Mishra said on Monday. Releasing the department's Annual Report at the Chanchalguda Jail premises, she highlighted several transformative initiatives aimed at reforming inmates and enabling their reintegration into society. Soumya Mishra revealed that as part of literacy and educational programmes, nearly 23,220 illiterate prisoners were made literate

across Telangana prisons. Emphasising the department's focus on skill development and economic empowerment, she said that 212 prisoners employed at prison-run outlets, petrol bunks, and "My Nation" units were paid wages amounting to 3 crore 79 lakh 70 thousand during the year 2025. Providing details of the prison population, the DG said that a total of 42,566 prisoners are currently lodged in various jails across the State. Among them, 36,627 are undertrial prisoners, while 5,856 are convicted prisoners. The inmate population



includes 4,176 prisoners booked under the POC-SO Act, 7,040 under the NDPS Act, 1,784 involved in cyber crime cases, and 2,833 in drunk-and-drive cases. Compared to the previous year, the

number of offenders increased by 11.8 per cent in 2025, she noted. Highlighting alternative dispute resolution efforts, Soumya Mishra said that 44 Jail Adalats were conducted during

2025. As a result, 985 prisoners were released on personal bonds out of 1,558 cases taken up for hearing. She added that the department was actively focusing on vocational training, with

prisoners being trained in 28 different skill-based trades, including bakery units, bangle making, and fashion designing. So far, 4,615 prisoners have completed such training, with

arrangements made to support them after release through employment linkages and bank loans. The DG said special emphasis was also being placed on technical training. Expert-led classes are being conducted in IT skills, reception portal management, and prison website portal development to equip inmates with modern, job-oriented capabilities. On infrastructure, she informed that the under-construction Siddipet jail, once completed, would accommodate an additional 415 prisoners, though barracks construction is still pending. A new firing range has also been

made available for prison staff at Vikarabad. Addressing healthcare, Soumya Mishra said special focus was being given to prisoners' health, with monthly medical camps organised in coordination with Osmania Hospital, along with regular in-house health camps. She concluded by stating that products made by prisoners were receiving a positive response at exhibition stalls, and efforts were underway to expand "My Nation" stalls and petrol bunks across Telangana, further strengthening rehabilitation and self-reliance initiatives.

Rajasthan-to-Hyderabad Opium Smuggling Busted; 6.5 Lakh Contraband Seized



TPN Bureau Hyderabad, January 12, 2026: The Secunderabad Detective Task Force (DTF) busted an interstate opium smuggling racket involving transportation of contraband from Rajasthan to Hyderabad and seized 2.22 kilograms of opium (OPM) worth 6.50 lakh. Two persons were taken into custody in connection with the case. According to officials, while Rajasthan-based traders are traditionally known for their presence in various businesses across Telangana, some individuals have allegedly ventured into illegal activities by smuggling opium from Rajasthan and selling it to Rajasthan families residing in Hyderabad. Acting on specific intelligence, the Secunderabad DTF team led by CI Soujanya conducted a special operation and successfully unearthed the racket.

In the first incident, the police apprehended a suspect identified as Sunil near Mahaveer Plaza in the Begumpet area while he was allegedly selling opium. During the search, officials recovered 20 grams of opium from his possession. Based on the information provided by Sunil during interrogation, the DTF team intensified surveillance and traced the supply chain. Subsequently, near Shanti Theatre in the Narayanguda area, the police intercepted another accused, Ashok Kumar, who had arrived from Rajasthan carrying opium on a motorcycle. From his possession, the DTF seized 2.020 kilograms of opium, along with the motorcycle and mobile phones used to co-ordinate the illegal trade. Investigations revealed that the accused procured opium worth approximately 1.50 lakh in Rajasthan and

transported it by buses to Hyderabad, where it was sold for prices ranging between 3 lakh and 4 lakh. The total value of the opium seized at both locations was estimated at 6.50 lakh. The accused, along with the seized contraband, motorcycle, and mobile phones, were handed over to the Narayanguda Excise Station for further legal action, said Assistant Excise Superintendent Srinivas Rao. Officials clarified that while opium may not be prohibited in certain contexts in Rajasthan, its possession, sale, and consumption are strictly banned in Telangana under the NDPS Act. Deputy Commissioner Anil Kumar Reddy and Excise Superintendent Panchakshari commended CI Soujanya and the DTF team for their swift and effective action in cracking the smuggling racket.

Multiple Cannabis Seizures Across Telangana: Seven Arrested, Cases Filed

TPN Bureau Hyderabad, January 12, 2026: The Special Task Force (STF) teams have conducted a series of successful cannabis busts across Telangana, seizing large quantities and arresting multiple suspects involved in illegal drug sales. At Nampally Railway Station and Manguru Bastion, STF A Team apprehended three individuals—Kamble Ratna, Kasab Karan, and Upadhya Amar—who were allegedly selling cannabis. Authorities recovered 2.11 kilograms of cannabis from the suspects, along with a bike and mobile phones. Additional suspects, including Kamble Vandana, Ajay, U. Madhu, and another Ajay, have also been named in the case. The arrested individuals and the seized contraband were handed over to the Nampally station. In another operation near Fathenagar, under the Balanagar Excise Station, STF A Team arrested Sa-



karthi Sayiraj, recovering 1.4 kilograms of cannabis. The investigation revealed links to another individual, Kalawala Ravinder, who has also been named in the case. The recovered drugs and the accused were taken to the Balanagar Excise Station. At Maredapalli Excise Station, STF C Team, led by SI Manju, arrested Masuku Aravind Kumar and MD Paij, seizing 620 grams of cannabis from them. Similarly, STF B Team, under SI Balara, arrested three individuals from Maharashtra, Mahesh,

Roshan, and Vignesh, near Alwal Excise Station, recovering 354 grams of cannabis. The seized drugs were secured and handed over to the Alwal Excise Station. These coordinated actions by the STF teams reflect Telangana police's continued commitment to curbing illegal drug trafficking and ensuring public safety across the state. Authorities have assured strict legal action against the accused and further investigations are ongoing to dismantle the network involved in cannabis sales.

TPN Bureau Hyderabad, January 12, 2026: A 38-year-old resident of Asifnagar, Hyderabad, has reportedly lost 27,05,000 in a sophisticated online trading scam involving a fake mobile application and a WhatsApp group. The victim came across a trading page on Facebook and was subsequently added to a WhatsApp group managed by fraudsters. The group admins convinced him to invest by promising high returns and showing fabricated profit screenshots. The victim was asked to download a trading app called ADVPMA, where he initially invested 10,000. Gradually, he invested a total of 27,05,000. The app falsely displayed a balance of 81,69,600, which included supposed profits. However, when he tried to withdraw the funds, access was denied, and the scammers demanded an additional 50 lakh. It was at this stage that the victim realized he had been defrauded and reported the incident to authorities. The Hyderabad Cyber Crime Police have issued a public advisory, urging citizens to verify the authenticity of any online trading platform

before investing. They cautioned against promises of quick or guaranteed profits, emphasized the importance of protecting personal banking information, and warned against paying extra "processing" or compliance fees. Citizens are advised to report suspicious activity immediately to the National Cybercrime Helpline (1930) or via cybercrime.gov.in. Updates and awareness campaigns are also available through the official social media channels of Hyderabad Cyber Crimes. The Dy. Commissioner of Police, Cyber Crimes, Hyderabad, stressed that such cases highlight the increasing sophistication of online frauds and the need for vigilance among investors. This incident serves as a reminder to carefully assess online investment opportunities and to avoid sharing sensitive information with unknown individuals. The authorities confirmed that steps are being taken to investigate the case and apprehend the perpetrators, while also urging the public to remain alert and report any suspicious online activity.

Congress to Hoist Its Flag Across Telangana in Upcoming Municipal Polls: TPCC Chief Mahesh Kumar



Nizamabad, January 12, 2026 (TPN Bureau):
Telangana Pradesh Congress Committee (TPCC) president Mahesh Kumar Goud on Monday expressed confidence that the Congress party would achieve a sweeping victory in the upcoming municipal elections, not only in Nizamabad district but across the entire State.

Addressing a media conference in Nizamabad, he said the recent Panchayat election results reflected growing public support for the Congress under the leadership of Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy.
Mahesh Kumar Goud stated that Congress had won a majority of sarpanch positions in Nizamabad district, making it one of the first five districts in the State to achieve this milestone.

He asserted that the party was well-positioned to capture the Nizamabad Municipal Corporation and several other municipalities in the forthcoming elections, likely to be held in February.
Describing Revanth Reddy as a visionary leader, the TPCC chief

said the State was moving from “destruction to development” under his leadership, with active cooperation from all ministers. He alleged that during the decade-long BRS rule, people from all sections of society faced discrimination, while former chief minister K. Chandrashekar Rao pushed the State into a debt trap and later confined himself to his farmhouse.
Mahesh Kumar Goud admitted that the Congress had suffered limited losses in the Panchayat elections due to rebel candidates but said the party had drawn lessons from the experience. “With a clear strategy, we will coordinate old and new leaders and ensure that tickets are given to those who are constantly active in public life,” he said, adding that Congress would secure a strong majority in municipal bodies, including Nizamabad municipality. Highlighting governance achievements, he said people would once again support Congress after witnessing its development and welfare initiatives. He claimed Telangana had set a national example in welfare schemes, citing free bus travel for women, distribution of fine rice, ration cards, Indiramma houses for the homeless poor, and free electricity benefiting nearly 80 per cent of households in the district. He also pointed to large-scale investments secured through global summits and the Davos visit led by CM Revanth Reddy and Minister Sridhar Babu, stating that investments worth several lakh crores had flowed into the State. Special focus was being given to education, healthcare, sports, roads worth nearly 600 crore, and the establishment of long-pending engineering and agriculture colleges in the district.

Criticising the BJP, Mahesh Kumar Goud accused it of indulging in religious politics during elections and asked what the party had achieved in its 12 years of rule at the Centre. He said people should teach a fitting lesson to those seeking votes in the name of religion and reaffirmed that Congress was committed to changing the lives of the poor beyond caste and religion.

MP Chamalaa Kiran Kumar Reddy Distributes Subsidized Agricultural Machinery to Farmers in Aleru

Domestically, constitutional checks and balances have steadily eroded, leaving him virtually unconstrained. Internationally, his actions face little effective resistance. The result is a presidency marked by unprecedented unilateralism and a profound disregard for international law and institutions.

Despite the rise of China and the re-emergence of Russia as a major power, the United States under Trump has reverted to a starkly unilateral posture. He has imposed sweeping tariffs on virtually all countries, in blatant violation of World Trade Organization rules. These tariffs are not merely economic instruments; they are weapons deployed to extract political and strategic concessions. India has been a notable target, facing an additional 25 per cent penalty tariff for purchasing discounted Russian oil.

Trump’s disdain for multilateralism is neither subtle nor selective. While earlier US administrations also bypassed multilateral frameworks when convenient, Trump has done so openly and contemptuously. During his first term, he withdrew the US from the Paris Climate Agreement, the World Health Organization, UNESCO and the UN Human Rights Council. Now, he has gone much further, announcing the US exit from 66 international organisations, including key UN bodies. Among them are institutions central to climate governance, such as the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), as well



as trade and development bodies like UNCTAD and ECOSOC.

His hostility to climate action is ideological as well as commercial. Trump dismisses climate change as a “hoax,” ignoring overwhelming scientific consensus and global concern. This posture aligns closely with the interests of the US oil industry, a major financial and political backer of both Trump and the Republican Party. It explains his embrace of the slogan “Drill, baby, drill” in his January 2024 inaugural address, his pressure on Europe and India to buy American LNG, and the tightening of sanctions on Russian oil.

Most dramatically, it underpins his recent military action against Venezuela, including the abduction of President Nicolás Maduro, with the

declared intention of taking control of the country’s oil reserves—the largest in the world. Trump has advanced the legally absurd claim that Venezuelan oil belongs to the United States because American companies originally developed parts of the infrastructure. According to this logic, Venezuelan oil would be extracted, shipped and sold by the US, with revenues allocated at Trump’s discretion. Venezuela, in turn, would be permitted to spend only what Washington allows, and only on American goods.

This aggression represents a “Trump Corollary” to the revived Monroe Doctrine outlined in the National Security Strategy 2025. Secretary of State Marco Rubio has questioned why Venezuela should sell oil to China,

Russia and Iran, ignoring the fact that US sanctions forced Venezuela to turn to China, which now buys roughly half of its oil exports. China has also emerged as Venezuela’s largest lender since the Chávez era, with outstanding loans of around \$10 billion.

Trump’s contempt for international norms was laid bare in a recent interview with The New York Times. Asked whether international law constrained his actions, he replied bluntly: “I don’t need international law.” When pressed on what limits his power globally, he answered: “My own morality. My own mind.” Given his transactional worldview and erratic decision-making, such statements raise serious concerns.

As part of this power projection, Trump has

signalled that he will allow the New START Treaty to lapse, effectively ending decades of US–Russia arms control efforts. Combined with plans for a nationwide Iron Dome-style missile defence system and a projected \$1.5 trillion defence budget by 2027, this points toward a renewed arms race and heightened strategic instability.

Yet Trump continues to insist that he deserves the Nobel Peace Prize. His aggression against Venezuela, the kidnapping of its president, and his repeated threats to seize Greenland by force have not tempered this sense of entitlement. He has even complained publicly that Norway made a “big mistake” by not awarding him the prize and claimed he would accept Venezuelan

opposition leader María Corina Machado’s offer to hand over her 2025 Peace Prize—an offer the Norwegian Nobel Institute has rightly ruled invalid. Trump has further asserted, without evidence, that he has resolved eight conflicts, including the India–Pakistan standoff, and therefore merits multiple Nobel Prizes. His resentment that Barack Obama received the award clearly continues to rankle.

Trump’s attitude toward India has become increasingly patronising and, at times, openly offensive. He has claimed that Prime Minister Narendra Modi sought to “make him happy” by stopping purchases of Russian oil and deferentially asking for an audience—an assertion firmly rebutted by India’s

Ministry of External Affairs, which has reiterated that both leaders engage with mutual respect.

The situation has worsened with the proposed Russia Sanctions Bill, strongly backed by Senator Lindsey Graham, who publicly congratulated Trump for endorsing it. The bill envisages punitive tariffs of up to 500 per cent on countries such as India, China and Brazil that continue to buy Russian oil. Trump’s casual remark that it was “easy” to impose tariffs on India underscores how lightly he treats a matter of great sensitivity for bilateral relations.

The bill, which has broad bipartisan support and is likely to pass, also seeks to expand CAATSA sanctions, including restrictions on uranium

trade with Russia—even though the US itself continues to import Russian uranium. One clear objective is to obstruct Russia’s cooperation with other countries in building nuclear power plants, a move that could theoretically affect India’s Kudankulam project. While presidential waivers are предусмотрен, they merely serve as leverage to extract unrelated concessions.

Adding to the strain, US Commerce Secretary Howard Lutnick has reignited controversy by claiming that a trade deal with India had been finalised at his level but fell through because Modi was reluctant to call Trump. He further alleged that India “missed its slot” after the US–UK agreement and that when New Delhi was ready to sign, the opportunity had passed. India has dismissed these claims as inaccurate, noting that Modi and Trump spoke by phone eight times in 2025 alone.

This cavalier handling of a crucial economic issue reveals how deeply Trump’s approach to India is shaped by personal ego rather than strategic calculation. Modi’s decision to avoid a direct call without a finalised deal was prudent, preventing Trump from applying direct pressure to extract further concessions or from prematurely declaring victory, as he has done with other leaders.

India–US relations have undoubtedly entered a difficult phase under Trump, but India is far from alone. Even longstanding US allies are grappling with similar challenges. No American president since the Second World War has disrupted the global order as profoundly as Trump has managed to do in just one year. With three more years remaining in his term, the turbulence may only intensify.

When Cinema, Silence and Strategy Collide in Tamil Nadu Politics

For more than three decades in Tamil cinema, Thalapathy Vijay has built a carefully honed screen persona: street-smart, instinctive, always thinking three steps ahead, adept at reading the opponent’s mind and unafraid to speak his truth. From youthful rebellion to mature authority, almost every adult character he has played over the last 33 years has embodied these traits. It is therefore striking—almost disorienting—that in his political avatar, Vijay has chosen silence as his primary response to a moment tailor-made for confrontation.

When the Censor Board’s actions effectively ensured that his supposed farewell film, Jana Nayagan, would not secure the Pongal release it was aiming for, Vijay did not utter a word. No public statement. No political charge. No attempt to frame the move as institutional pressure. This silence is intriguing, especially given the timing. Tamil Nadu goes to the polls in just three months. Jana Nayagan is widely seen as Vijay’s campaign vehicle. And Vijay himself has claimed that his fledgling party, Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK), will win the election. If there was ever a moment to seize political momentum, this was it. Instead, the opportunity slipped by.

Ironically, the develop-

ments of the past 48 hours have turned into a political windfall—not for Vijay, but for the ruling DMK. With Jana Nayagan effectively pushed out of the Pongal frame until at least January 21, unless the Supreme Court intervenes, Parasakthi now has a clear, uninterrupted run across nearly 1,000 screens in Tamil Nadu. Pongal 2026 was initially billed as a cinematic and political showdown—Jana Nayagan versus Parasakthi. That clash has evaporated. Parasakthi has emerged as the sole major festival release, giving it unprecedented visibility and recall.

This is no ordinary film. The DMK has, quite literally, “owned” Parasakthi. The title itself evokes an unmistakable Karunanidhi connection; the late chief minister wrote the screenplay and dialogues for the original Parasakthi in 1952, a film that reshaped Tamil cinema and politics alike. The subject—rooted in the anti-Hindi agitations of the mid-1960s—is inseparable from DMK ideology. The party has also backed the project financially, with Red Giant Movies, run by the DMK’s first family, acting as distributor. In every sense, Parasakthi is a cultural extension of the DMK’s political narrative.

Where Vijay chose silence, Chief Minister MK Stalin chose speed and



timing. Demonstrating why he remains the undisputed “Thalapathy” of realpolitik, Stalin moved quickly to condemn the Censor Board’s actions, branding it a “political tool” of the Union government. In one stroke, he turned the controversy into a weapon against the BJP. Ideally, this should have been Vijay’s moment—to accuse the BJP of subterfuge, to allege pressure tactics, to frame himself as a victim of institutional overreach. By not doing so, Vijay allowed the Congress—and then the DMK—to seize the

narrative.

For a political start-up like TVK, this is not a trivial lapse. Electoral politics in Tamil Nadu demands constant signalling, narrative control and rapid response. If Vijay believes that charisma and scripted dialogue alone—however powerful on screen—can win over one of India’s most politically aware electorates, he may be badly mistaken. The episode underscores the urgent need for TVK to build a professional team of political strategists who understand timing as much as messaging.

Stalin’s intervention also had a secondary, subtler effect. By indirectly backing Vijay on the Jana Nayagan issue, he blunted the Congress’s attempt to position itself as Vijay’s principal political sympathiser. Until now, a perception had been building of DMK versus Congress in their attitudes toward Vijay. Stalin deftly reframed it as DMK plus Congress standing with Vijay—at least in the specific context of the film controversy.

In most Indian states, Jana Nayagan and Parasakthi would be dismissed

as mere movies. In Tamil Nadu, especially with elections just months away, they are campaign dynamite. Cinema and politics have long been intertwined here, and these two films are loaded with ideological messaging. That is why the manoeuvring around them in Chennai has been so intense, with wheels turning within wheels.

The Congress, in particular, finds itself deeply divided. MPs like Manickam Tagore and Jothimani have openly supported Jana Nayagan, a move widely interpreted as

more than cinematic solidarity. For one faction within the party, Vijay represents a potential alternative to a continued alliance with the DMK. Even if a formal break does not occur, this group hopes that visible support for Vijay will strengthen the Congress’s bargaining position—more seats, and perhaps even a share in power, should the alliance return to office in May 2026.

On the other side is the pro-DMK faction within the Congress, which believes that disturbing the status quo would be politically suicidal. For them, the DMK–Congress alliance remains the most viable path forward. The irony, however, lies in the content of Parasakthi itself. The film reportedly portrays the Congress in an unflattering light. Historically, this is accurate: the anti-Hindi agitations were directed against a Congress-led government at the Centre. In today’s political shorthand, anti-Hindi sentiment is often equated with anti-BJP politics. In the world of 1960s Parasakthi, however, the Congress is unmistakably the antagonist.

Yet the DMK’s objectives extend beyond a single movie release. With Parasakthi now the sole Pongal attraction, the party sees an opportunity to forge an emotional and ideological bond with a

younger generation that is largely disconnected from events that unfolded six decades ago. The film becomes a context-setting device, placing pride in Tamil language, history and culture within a contemporary political framework. In the months leading up to the election, the DMK ecosystem is expected to amplify this narrative through social media, reels, memes and storytelling.

Finally, there is the question of whether the Jana Nayagan controversy helps or hurts the BJP. If the party’s intention was to gently nudge Vijay toward the NDA, this episode appears counterproductive. Even as the BJP denies any role in the Censor Board’s decision, the opposition is certain to amplify the perception that institutional power was weaponised against a political rival.

For Vijay and TVK, however, there is a silver lining. Even if Jana Nayagan misses the Pongal window, the film—reportedly a remake of the Telugu hit Bhagavanth Kesari—is now surrounded by unprecedented hype. Commercially, it is well-positioned to become a blockbuster. Politically, though, the episode stands as a reminder: in Tamil Nadu, silence can be louder than dialogue—and not always to one’s advantage.

PM Modi Strengthens Diplomatic Ties Through Informal “Car Diplomacy” with World Leaders

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has increasingly embraced informal car rides as a unique form of diplomacy, using them to signal warmth and personal connection with visiting world leaders. Following rides with Russian President Vladimir Putin and British Prime Minister Keir Starmer, PM Modi continued the tradition today by sharing a car ride with German Chancellor Friedrich Merz.

Chancellor Merz is on his first official visit to India, which included attending a traditional kite festival and visiting the historic Sabarmati Ashram, the spiritual retreat of Mahatma Gandhi, leader of India’s independence movement. A German government spokesperson in Berlin noted that Merz’s choice of India for his first trip to Asia as chancellor “demonstrates how India, the world’s largest democracy, is an important strategic partner for Germany.”

Highlighting the growing friendship between the two countries, PM Modi shared a picture on X of the car ride with Chancellor Merz. “The friendship between India and Germany continues to grow through shared values, extensive cooperation and mutual understanding,” he wrote.

The Rise of PM Modi’s Car Diplomacy

In recent years, world leaders meeting PM Modi have increasingly shared informal car rides or personally driven him, gestures widely seen as symbols of friendship and trust.



- Russia: In September 2025, PM Modi and President Putin rode together in a car during a major bilateral meeting at the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Summit in Tianjin, China. In December 2025, Modi personally received Putin at Palam Airport, and the Russian President travelled with him in a white Toyota Fortuner to 7 Lok Kalyan Marg.
- Jordan: During a two-day visit in December

- 2025 marking 75 years of diplomatic relations, Jordan’s Crown Prince Al Hussein bin Abdullah II personally drove PM Modi to a museum in Amman, with Modi later sharing images from the passenger seat of the Prince’s BMW.
- Ethiopia: PM Modi was greeted with a hug at the airport by Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed Ali, who then drove him to his hotel in Addis Ababa.
- United Kingdom: In Oc-

tober 2025, PM Modi shared a car ride with British Prime Minister Keir Starmer before attending the Global Fintech Fest 2025 in Mumbai, calling the ties between India and the UK “on the move” and “filled with great vigour.”

These informal interactions highlight PM Modi’s distinctive diplomatic style, where personal gestures and shared experiences complement formal talks, fostering trust and closer international ties.

Delhi Political Row Escalates as BJP Challenges AAP Over Controversial Atishi Video

New Delhi: The controversy surrounding a video of Delhi Assembly Leader of Opposition Atishi intensified on Sunday, with senior BJP leaders daring Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) national convener Arvind Kejriwal to take legal action against them. As BJP leaders and workers began widely sharing the Assembly clip on social media, the hashtag #KejriwalMaafiMaango trended online.

The flashpoint is a video from Delhi Assembly proceedings, initially shared on X by Delhi minister Kapil Mishra. The Punjab Police in Jalandhar registered an FIR after allegations emerged that the clip had been “doctored” to falsely attribute derogatory remarks against Sikh Gurus to Atishi. This sparked a sharp backlash from the BJP, which questioned both the FIR and the police’s jurisdiction.

BJP Issues Direct Challenge

At a Delhi press conference, BJP Delhi unit president Virendra Sachdeva posted the same video on X, challenging Kejriwal to act.



“Thousands of BJP workers and I are posting Atishi’s video. If Kejriwal has the courage, he should get FIRs registered against all of us,” Sachdeva said.

Rejecting claims that the video was manipulated, Sachdeva said the clip was authentic and under examination. “The Speaker of the Assembly has ordered an investigation. Once the report comes, the truth will be clear,” he added. He also accused the AAP of using intimidation tactics against BJP workers and said the party was

not afraid of legal action.

FIR in Punjab and the Delhi Fallout

The FIR against Kapil Mishra followed AAP’s claim that the video had been altered. Punjab Police later said a forensic review found that a specific word attributed to Atishi was not part of the original audio, and captions had been added.

The BJP countered that proceedings inside the Delhi Assembly fall under the Speaker’s jurisdiction, not an

external police force. “Arvind Kejriwal knows that only the Speaker can examine such incidents. Yet, an FIR was registered in Punjab before the forensic report was even released,” Sachdeva said. He also alleged that Atishi did not respond to the Speaker’s notices following the incident.

BJP MPs Join the Fray

Several BJP MPs joined the challenge, sharing the video and demanding an apology from the AAP leadership. BJP MP Praveen Khandelwal tweeted that the alleged remarks were “condemnable” and questioned how many FIRs Kejriwal would register against those sharing the clip. BJP MP Kamaljeet Sehrawat described the comments as “a direct attack on the faith of crores of devotees” and called out the Punjab Police to take action against all sharers of the video.

With the hashtag trending and leaders doubling down on their stance, the controversy shows no sign of abating, setting the stage for further escalation in the coming days.

ED Moves Supreme Court Against “Wrongful Restraint” During I-PAC Raids in Kolkata

New Delhi: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Monday filed a second writ petition in the Supreme Court, challenging what it called the “wrongful restraint” of its officers during raids at the I-PAC office and its director’s residence in Kolkata last week.

The petition, filed by ED Assistant Directors Nishant Kumar, Vikram Ahlawat, and Prashant Chandila, names West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, DGP Rajeev Kumar, Kolkata Police Commissioner Manoj Verma, and Deputy Commissioner Priyoboto Roy.

The agency alleged that during searches on December 8 in connection with an alleged coal pilferage scam, state authorities “illegally and unauthorisedly” intervened. According to the petition, the Chief Minister and police officers entered the residence of I-PAC director Pratik Jain at 6:20 AM while the search was ongoing, restrained the officers, and removed seized documents, laptops, and mobile phones.



“The laptop of an ED officer was also taken and returned only after two hours, which amounts to theft,” the 160-page petition claimed. It added that the backup of computer systems and emails was halted midway, storage devices of security cameras were seized, and mobile phones of I-PAC employees were taken, leaving the ED unable to seize any data or documents.

The petition also seeks a stay on four FIRs filed by the West Bengal Police against ED officials following the high-voltage face-off during the raids.

The searches, conducted across 10 premises — six in West Bengal and four in Delhi — are linked to a 2020 CBI case against a coal-smuggling syndicate led by Anup Majhi, alias “Lala,” accused of illegally

excavating coal from Eastern Coalfields in Paschim Bardhaman district.

The ED further alleged that a hawala operator connected to the coal scam facilitated tens of crores of rupees in transactions to Indian PAC Consulting Private Limited, the registered company of political consultancy firm I-PAC, linking the firm to alleged hawala dealings.

Ahead of PMC Elections, Leaders Clash Over Crime, Minority Representation and Party Unity



Pune: As the Pune Municipal Corporation (PMC) elections approach, NCP (Sharad Pawar faction) MP Supriya Sule on Monday dismissed claims of any family rifts, emphasizing unity within the party. Addressing reporters, she questioned the Mahayuti government over rising crime in Pune.

“I have written to the Chief Minister multiple times regarding the surge in crimes in Pune. I want to ask what has been done about it. There have never been issues within our family—we are all here to serve the public,” Sule said.

Her remarks come after the NCP (SP) joined hands with the Ajit Pawar-led NCP ahead of the PMC elections. Sule also highlighted her party’s pro-

gressive manifesto, expressing confidence that voters in Pune and Pimpri-Chinchwad Municipal Corporation (PCMC) would support them.

Meanwhile, Shiv Sena (UBT) MP Sanjay Raut targeted the ruling BJP and Ajit Pawar’s faction, accusing them of promoting “hooliganism” to win elections. Speaking at a public rally, Raut claimed that Pune, once celebrated for its beauty, has now become a “city of goons.”

“Whether it is the BJP or Ajit Pawar’s party, there is hardly any gang whose relatives have not received election tickets from these parties. I once said, if they had met Dawood Ibrahim, they would have given tickets to his brother or relatives, including Chhota Shakeel and Chhota Rajan.

These people cannot win elections without hooliganism,” Raut said.

In a separate rally in Jalna, AIMIM chief Asaduddin Owaisi urged the Muslim community to “develop their own political agency” rather than rely on parties that have historically opposed minority leadership. Criticizing both the Mahayuti and MVA alliances, Owaisi said, “Congress, NCP, Shiv Sena, Shiv Sena (UBT) or BJP, none of them supports the rise of leaders from the Muslim minority community.”

The State Election Commission of Maharashtra has announced polls for 29 municipal corporations, including the BMC, PMC, and PCMC. Voting is scheduled for January 15, with counting on January 16.

Three Months After Karur Stampede, Actor-Politician Vijay Appears Before CBI



New Delhi: Three months after the tragic Karur stampede that claimed 41 lives, Tamilaga Vetttri Kazhagam (TVK) president and actor-politician Vijay appeared before the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in New Delhi on Monday, January 12, for questioning.

Vijay was interrogated on several key aspects of the incident, including his decision to leave the venue as the situation worsened, and the delay in his arrival. Investigators asked him to narrate the sequence of events leading to the stampede, as he understood them, and whether he was aware of the overcrowding and anticipated footfall at the event.

The CBI also questioned Vijay on specific developments during his speech, including whether an announcement regarding a missing child had been made and if he noticed the ensuing commotion. Additionally, he was asked whether he knew that the

police had resorted to lathi charges to control the crowd.

Authorities are also summoning other key TVK officials. DGP Armed Police Davidson Devasirvatham appeared before the CBI on Monday, while TVK general secretary for elections Adhav Arjuna, joint general secretary Nirmal Kumar, and producer Jagadish Palanisamy have all been issued summons in connection with the case.

The Karur stampede occurred on September 27, when thousands of TVK supporters and Vijay fans gathered at Velusampuram in Karur town to attend a public event. Vijay was scheduled to arrive at 12:45 PM but reached only at 7 PM, a delay of more than six hours. During this time, the crowd grew restless, suffering from heat exhaustion and dehydration.


When Vijay finally arrived, approximately 5,000 supporters who had been following his campaign bus

merged with the waiting crowd, creating a chaotic situation. The resulting stampede led to the deaths of 41 people, including nine children. Eyewitnesses and reports indicate that the delay and mismanagement at the venue significantly contributed to the tragedy.

Following the incident, Vijay left for Chennai from Trichy on a chartered flight as the death toll reached 30, reportedly ignoring questions from the press at both airports.

Investigations into the stampede were transferred to the CBI on October 13, following a Supreme Court ruling. The central agency has since been probing the sequence of events, crowd management failures, and the role of event organizers and authorities in the disaster. Vijay’s questioning marks a critical step in the CBI’s inquiry, as investigators seek to establish accountability for one of Tamil Nadu’s deadliest stampedes in recent years.

Trump’s “Acting President of Venezuela” Claim Sparks Global Attention



A social media post by US President Donald Trump declaring himself the “Acting President of Venezuela, Incumbent January 2026” has ignited widespread debate about America’s role in the ongoing crisis in Venezuela. The image, styled to resemble an edited Wikipedia page and shared on Trump’s Truth Social platform, featured his official portrait and listed him as both the 45th and 47th President of the United States, as well as Venezuela’s current head of state—an assertion not supported by any official record or international recognition.

The unusual declaration comes in the wake of a dramatic US military operation in Venezuela earlier this month that resulted in the capture of Venezuelan President Nicolás Maduro and his wife, Cilia Flores. In the early-January raid, which involved strikes around Caracas, US forces took Maduro into custody and flew him to New York, where he has been arraigned on federal drug-trafficking and narcoterrorism charges.

In several public statements, Trump said the United States would “run” Venezuela temporarily to ensure stability and oversee what he described as a secure and orderly transition of power. He also suggested that Venezuela’s rich oil resources could be managed in a way that benefits both Venezuelans and the US, including plans for US energy firms to help rebuild the country’s battered oil industry.

Despite Trump’s online proclamation, international law and diplomatic practice do not recognise him as Venezuela’s acting president. Instead, Venezuela’s Supreme Tribunal

of Justice invoked constitutional succession provisions and on January 5, 2026, swore in Delcy Rodríguez—Maduro’s former vice president and oil minister—as the interim President to provide administrative continuity.

Rodríguez, however, has rejected US assertions of authority. She has demanded Maduro’s release and reaffirmed his legitimacy as Venezuela’s rightful leader. Many other countries and legal experts have criticised the US intervention, calling it a violation of international law and national sovereignty. Nations including China, Russia, and Spain have publicly condemned the operation.

Trump’s social media post has fueled intense discussion around the nature of US involvement in Venezuelan affairs. Critics argue the claim blurs established norms of sovereignty and diplomatic recognition, while supporters frame it as part of a bold strategy to displace a regime accused by Washington of corruption and drug trafficking.

In addition to the political controversy, Trump has pursued policies aimed at reshaping Venezuela’s energy landscape. He has issued directives to US oil companies regarding investment opportunities and signed an executive order protecting revenues from Venezuelan oil sales held in the United States. He has also warned that Venezuela’s interim authorities must cooperate, suggesting consequences for non-compliance.

The situation remains fluid and continues to draw global scrutiny, as debates over legality, legitimacy and the future of governance in Venezuela play out on the world stage.

Himachal Merchant Navy Officer Detained After US Seizes Russian-Flagged Tanker; Family Appeals to PM Modi



A 26-year-old merchant navy officer from Palampur in Himachal Pradesh’s Kangra district has been detained by United States authorities after a Russian-flagged oil tanker he was serving on was seized in the North Atlantic, his family said. Rikshit Chauhan was preparing to return home for his wedding next month when the vessel was intercepted by US forces following a prolonged maritime pursuit.

Chauhan, who joined the merchant navy on August 1, 2025, was on his first sea assignment aboard the tanker Marinera—formerly known as Bella 1—operated by a Russian company. The ship had been sailing toward Russia after stopping near Venezuela when US Coast Guard units intercepted and seized it on January 7 amid broader efforts to enforce sanctions on vessels believed to be linked to sanctioned oil shipments.

The seized tanker was carrying 28 crew members, including three Indians, 20 Ukrainians, six Georgians and two Russians. All of the crew are currently detained by US authorities pending legal and diplomatic procedures, although the two Russian crew members were reported released by US officials recently.

In Palampur, Chauhan’s family has made an emotional appeal to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar to secure his safe return. Reeta Devi, the officer’s mother, told reporters that her son’s wedding is scheduled for

February 19 and the family is praying he will be back in India before then. “We talked to Rikshit for the last time on January 7 and are praying to God for his safe return,” she said. She urged the government to facilitate the repatriation of her son and the two other Indian crew members from Goa and Kerala who were also on board.

Chauhan’s father, Ranjit Singh Chauhan, explained that his son had been sent to Venezuela to load oil as part of the ship’s assignment but the vessel was stopped at the border. After waiting for about 10 days, the Russian firm instructed the ship to return, but the US seizure occurred before it could complete the journey. The family last heard from Rikshit just hours before the interception.

Local officials have also expressed concern. Palampur MLA Ashish Butail has sought details about Chauhan’s whereabouts and said he will raise the matter with the Chief Minister of Himachal Pradesh. The state’s Deputy Commissioner said they are coordinating with the Indian embassy to follow developments and assist the family.

The incident has highlighted the risks faced by merchant navy personnel caught up in geopolitical tensions and international maritime disputes. With no direct communication from government authorities so far, Chauhan’s family remains anxious and hopeful for swift diplomatic action to bring him home safely.

Trump Weighs ‘Strong Options’ as Iran Faces Widespread Protests and Mounting Death Toll

US President Donald Trump has said that Washington is closely monitoring the escalating unrest in Iran and is considering “very strong options” as the country enters its third week of nationwide protests—the largest since 2022—against the Islamic Republic’s ruling establishment led by Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei.

Speaking to reporters on Sunday as he returned to Washington from his Mar-a-Lago residence, Trump said the situation was under serious review at the highest levels of the US government. “We’re looking at it very seriously. The military is looking at it, and we’re looking at some very strong options. We’ll make a determination,” he said.

The protests, triggered by a severe currency crisis and worsening economic collapse, have rapidly evolved into a broader challenge to Iran’s political system. Demonstrations have spread across all 31 provinces, making the unrest the most serious threat to the Islamic Republic since the 1979 revolution. According to the US-based Human Rights Activist News Agency, more than 540 people have been killed, and over 10,000 arrests have been made since the protests began.

Tracking the full scale of the unrest has become increasingly difficult due to a near-total communications blackout. Iran’s internet shutdown entered its 84th hour on Monday, severely limiting information flow from within the country. While President Masoud Pezeshkian has called for dialogue and restraint, other senior officials have taken a harsher stance, warning of swift trials and even the death penalty as unrest and fatalities mount.

Trump’s Open Backing for Protesters

Trump has openly voiced support for Iranian protesters and issued re-



peated warnings to Tehran, unsettling both US allies and adversaries. On January 2, he said the US was “locked and loaded” and warned Iranian authorities against killing peaceful demonstrators. On Friday, he went further, stating that the US would “start shooting” if Iranian forces opened fire on protesters.

“Iran is looking at FREEDOM, perhaps like never before. The USA stands ready to help!!!” Trump wrote on social media on Saturday.

At the same time, Trump revealed that Iran’s leadership had reached out to seek negotiations following his threats. “The leaders of Iran called yesterday. A meeting is being set up... They want to negotiate,” he said. However, he added that US action could precede any talks. “We may have to act before a meeting.”

Any US military strike on Iran would mark the second such action authorised by Trump. In August, US B-2 stealth bombers struck three Iranian nu-

clear facilities, significantly setting back Tehran’s nuclear programme.

Options Under Consideration

According to The Wall Street Journal, US military and diplomatic officials are expected to brief Trump on Tuesday on a range of options, including cyber operations and possible military action. One proposal under discussion involves sending Starlink satellite internet terminals—owned by Elon Musk—into Iran to help protesters bypass the government’s internet shutdown. Trump said he plans to speak with Musk about the idea.

Politico reported that the administration is also examining non-kinetic measures, such as cyber and covert operations, rather than deploying US ground forces. There has been no major movement of American military assets toward the region so far.

Other options include tightening sanctions, launching cyberattacks

against Iranian military or civilian infrastructure, and amplifying anti-regime messaging online.

Why Military Action Remains Risky

Despite his rhetoric, Trump has stopped short of committing to military action. Analysts say heightened security around senior Iranian leaders, including Revolutionary Guard commanders and Ayatollah Khamenei, has complicated any potential “decapitation” strategy.

Experts have warned that even limited strikes could spark a wider conflict. “The dilemma is at its peak,” said Danny Citrinowicz of the Institute for National Security Studies. “A strong strike could weaken repression, but it could also unify the regime and trigger a much broader escalation. Without organised opposition leadership, a strike may succeed operationally but fail strategically.”

Several US lawmakers have urged caution. Republican Senator Rand

Paul said bombing Iran may not achieve the intended outcome, while Democratic Senator Mark Warner warned that an attack could rally Iranians against an external enemy rather than weaken the regime.

By contrast, Republican Senator Lindsey Graham advocated a far more aggressive approach, urging Trump to “embolden the protesters and scare the hell out of the regime,” even calling for targeting Iran’s leadership.

Adding to the political dimension, Reza Pahlavi—the US-based son of Iran’s last shah—said he is prepared to return to Iran to help guide a democratic transition. “I’m already planning on that,” Pahlavi said, claiming he would oversee a transparent process allowing Iranians to freely choose their leaders.

As protests continue and international pressure mounts, the coming days may prove decisive for both Iran’s leadership and US policy in the region.

India Is the US’s Most Essential Partner, Says Ambassador-Designate Sergio Gor as Trade Talks Resume

Calling India the United States’ most essential global partner, US ambassador-designate Sergio Gor on Monday announced that Washington and New Delhi are set to resume the next round of negotiations on a long-pending bilateral trade deal starting Tuesday, January 12. Gor also indicated that US President Donald Trump may visit India by next year, underscoring the importance both countries attach to the relationship.

Speaking at the US Embassy in New Delhi following his arrival, Gor—who also serves as the US Special Envoy to South and Central Asia—emphasised the strength of ties between the two democracies and highlighted the personal rapport between President Trump and Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

“The United States and India are bound not just by shared interests, but by a relationship anchored at the highest levels,” Gor said. “Real friends can disagree, but they always resolve their differences in the end.”

Describing India as a critical partner on the global stage, Gor acknowledged the complexity of trade negotiations between two large economies but expressed confidence that progress would be made. “India is the world’s largest nation. It’s not an easy task to get this across the finish line, but



we are determined to get there,” he said.

Trade, Security and Strategic Cooperation

While trade remains a key pillar of the India-US relationship, Gor stressed that cooperation between the two countries extends far beyond commerce. He noted that New Delhi and Washington work closely together in areas such as security, counter-terrorism, energy, technology, education and healthcare.

Responding to questions about the stalled trade agreement, Gor confirmed that both sides remain actively engaged. “Many of you have asked for an update on the trade deal negotiations. Both sides continue to engage, and the next call on trade will take place tomorrow,” he said, adding that reaching an

agreement would require persistence and mutual understanding.

Trump-Modi Relationship and Possible India Visit

Gor repeatedly highlighted the personal bond between President Trump and Prime Minister Modi, calling it genuine and enduring. “I have travelled all over the world with President Trump, and I can attest that his friendship with Prime Minister Modi is real,” he said.

He also suggested that a presidential visit to India could be on the horizon. “During my last dinner with him, President Trump recalled his previous visit to India and spoke warmly about his friendship with the Prime Minister,” Gor said. “I hope the President will be visiting India soon, hopefully in

the next year or two.”

In a lighter moment, Gor joked about the time difference between Washington and New Delhi, noting that Trump’s habit of making early-morning phone calls might work well for India.

‘No Partner More Essential Than India’

Emphasising the strategic importance of the relationship, Gor said his mission as ambassador would be to take India-US ties to the next level. “No partner is more essential than India,” he declared. “In the months and years ahead, my goal is to pursue an ambitious agenda. We will do this as true strategic partners, each bringing strength, respect and leadership to the table.”

India to Join Pax Silica

Alliance

In a significant announcement, Gor revealed that India will be invited to join the Pax Silica alliance as a full member next month. The Pax Silica initiative is a US-led strategic framework aimed at building a secure, resilient and innovation-driven global silicon and semiconductor supply chain.

“I am pleased to announce that India will be invited to join this group of nations as a full member,” Gor said, signalling deeper technological and supply-chain cooperation between the two countries.

The announcement comes at a time when India and the US are seeking to strengthen strategic trust and economic collaboration amid evolving global challenges.

Dollar Slides, Gold Hits Record as Trump–Powell Clash Raises Fears Over Fed Independence

The US dollar weakened sharply, Wall Street futures slipped, and gold surged to a fresh record on Monday after Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell disclosed that the Trump administration had threatened him with a criminal indictment linked to the refurbishment of the central bank’s headquarters.

The revelation has intensified concerns over the independence of the Federal Reserve, adding to an already volatile start to 2026 that has seen the United States capture Venezuela’s President Nicolás Maduro and escalate rhetoric about potentially taking control of Greenland.

S&P 500 futures fell more than 0.5 per cent, while gold — a traditional safe-haven asset — soared past \$4,600 an ounce, its highest level ever. Investors rushed to hedge against political turmoil and inflation risks, as money markets priced in a slightly higher probability of near-term US interest rate cuts.

European equities also opened lower, with regional indices dipping about 0.2 per cent from record highs. Safe-haven currencies strengthened, with the Swiss franc rising 0.6 per cent to 0.796 per dollar, while the euro gained 0.4 per cent to trade at \$1.168.

“The latest development marks a significant escalation in the fight between President Trump and Fed Chair Powell,” said Lee Hardman, senior currency analyst at MUFG. He added that the administration’s repeated attacks on the Fed’s autonomy continued to pose downside risks for the dollar.

Fed funds futures reflected a modest shift, adding roughly three basis points of expected rate cuts for 2026 — a small move,



but one that underscored concerns that political pressure could push the Fed toward a more accommodative stance.

Gold Rally, Oil Steady

Gold’s rally was also supported by mounting geopolitical tensions surrounding Iran. However, oil prices showed little immediate reaction. Brent crude slipped 9 cents to just over \$63 a barrel, while US West Texas Intermediate eased 10 cents to \$59.02 in early London trading.

Both benchmarks had gained more than 3 per cent last week — their strongest weekly rise since October — as Iran intensified its crackdown on nationwide protests.

While oil markets have built in a modest geopolitical risk premium, analysts warn that prices may still be underestimating the potential fallout. “The market is

saying, ‘Show me the disruption to supply,’ before materially responding,” said Saul Kavonic, head of energy research at MST Marquee, noting that any escalation affecting the Strait of Hormuz could have far-reaching consequences.

On Sunday, President Trump said he was considering a range of “very strong” responses, including military options, following Iran’s violent suppression of protests — the most serious challenge to the country’s clerical leadership since the 1979 Islamic Revolution. Iran’s Foreign Minister Abbas Araqchi insisted on Monday that the situation was “under total control.”

Trump vs Powell

The coming week is packed with key events, including US inflation data, Chinese trade figures, and the start of the US

earnings season led by JPMorgan Chase and Bank of New York Mellon. But for markets, the confrontation between the White House and the Federal Reserve has taken centre stage.

Powell, whose term ends in May, described the threat of criminal charges as a “pretext” designed to pressure the Fed into cutting interest rates. “This unprecedented action should be seen in the broader context of the administration’s ongoing threats,” he said.

Economists say the dispute marks a dramatic escalation in a long-running conflict dating back to Trump’s first term. “Trump is pulling at the loose threads of central bank independence,” said Andrew Lilley, chief rates strategist at Sydney-based Barrenjoey. “Investors won’t like it, but it also suggests the administration has few levers left to influence monetary policy.”

The dollar bore the brunt of the reaction, falling even against typically risk-sensitive currencies such as the Australian and New Zealand dollars. The dollar index dropped 0.4 per cent in European trading, putting it on course for its biggest one-day fall since mid-December.

The greenback had a bruising 2025, losing more than 9 per cent against major peers amid narrowing interest rate differentials, rising fiscal deficit concerns, and growing political uncertainty.

“This open warfare between the Fed and the US administration is clearly not a good look for the dollar,” said Ray Attrill, head of currency strategy at National Australia Bank.

Sensex, Nifty Rebound Sharply After Five-Day Rout on India–US Trade Optimism



Indian equity benchmarks staged a strong recovery on Monday, snapping a five-session losing streak as positive comments from US Ambassador to India Sergio Gor on ongoing trade negotiations buoyed investor sentiment. Bargain hunting in banking, energy and metal stocks further supported the rebound from intraday lows.

The BSE Sensex climbed 301.93 points, or 0.36 per cent, to close at 83,878.17, after plunging as much as 715 points earlier in the day and slipping below the 83,000 mark. Similarly, the Nifty 50 gained 106.95 points, or 0.42 per cent, to settle at 25,790.25, recovering sharply from an intraday low of 25,473.40.

Markets reversed course after Gor said that India and the United States remain actively engaged in trade discussions. “Both sides continue to engage actively, and the next call on trade will take place tomorrow,” he said, lifting hopes of progress on a bilateral trade agreement. Investor confidence also improved after Gor indicated that US President Donald Trump may visit India in the next one to two years.

Key Drivers Behind the Market Recovery

1) India–US Trade Deal Optimism:

Gor’s remarks underscored the strategic importance of India to Washington. Calling India the most essential partner for the US, he said real friends may disagree but always resolve differences. He highlighted the strong personal relationship between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Trump, adding that both nations remain committed to finalising the trade deal despite its complexity. Gor also announced that India would be invited to join the US-led Pax Silica alliance, aimed at strengthening global semiconductor supply chains.

Ajit Mishra, Senior Vice President (Research) at Religare Broking, said the rebound was largely driven by short-covering in heavyweight stocks following six straight sessions of losses. However, he cautioned investors against reading too much into the bounce, noting that a sustained move above the 25,600 level on Nifty is required to confirm a meaningful recovery.

2) Value Buying After Sharp Correction:

Value buying emerged after markets suffered a steep decline last week amid foreign fund outflows, profit-taking, concerns over potential additional US tariffs, and geopolitical uncertainties. Over the past five sessions, the Sensex had dropped 2,185.77 points (2.54 per cent), while the Nifty had fallen 645.25 points (2.45 per cent).

Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Investments, said improved sentiment around trade talks and expectations of stronger December-quarter earnings encouraged investors to selectively accumulate beaten-down stocks, particularly in banking and consumer segments.

3) Strong Buying in Banking Stocks:

The Nifty Bank index led the recovery, rebounding sharply from its day’s low to rise about 677 points intraday, hitting 59,540.95. Banking stocks gained on expectations of solid quarterly earnings. IndusInd Bank emerged as the top gainer, rising over 2 per cent, followed by ICICI Bank, which gained more than 1 per cent. Shares of SBI, AU Small Finance Bank, Yes Bank, and Union Bank of India also posted gains of nearly 1 per cent each.

Overall, the market rebound reflected a mix of trade optimism, value buying, and sector-specific strength, though analysts remain cautious about the sustainability of the recovery.

BSE Warns Investors Against Deepfake Video Falsely Showing CEO Giving Stock Tips



Leading stock exchange BSE Ltd on Monday issued a strong advisory urging investors to remain alert against a fraudulent deepfake video circulating on social media platforms that falsely portrays its Managing Director and CEO, Sundararaman Ramamurthy, offering stock recommendations and investment advice.

In a statement, the exchange said it had become aware of an unauthorised and fabricated video that uses deepfake technology to impersonate Ramamurthy and mislead the public. “The video is fraudulent and has been created to deceive investors by falsely claiming to provide stock recommendations and investment guidance,” BSE said.

According to the exchange, the video contains misleading claims promising extraordinary or super-normal profits, including suggestions of lucrative stock investments for 2026. It also urges viewers to join a WhatsApp channel, with fabricated statements such as, “You will have Rs 8 million by 2027,” being used to lure unsuspecting investors.

BSE clarified that neither Ramamurthy nor any official of the exchange is authorised to provide stock tips, investment advice, or operate WhatsApp, Telegram, or similar groups in either an official or personal capacity. The exchange stressed that any such claims should be treated as false and malicious.

“The video being circulated is fake, unauthorised, doctored and fabricated using deepfake technology,” the exchange said, adding that it is taking necessary steps to have the content removed from social media and messaging platforms. BSE also said it is initiating appropriate legal action against those responsible for creating and circulating the fraudulent material.

The exchange advised investors and the general public not to rely on or act upon such videos, messages or links. It urged market participants to seek information only through BSE’s official communication channels and from SEBI-registered intermediaries for any market-related guidance.

This is not the first instance of such fraud. Earlier in April, both BSE and the National Stock Exchange (NSE) had issued similar warnings after deepfake videos falsely depicting their CEOs offering stock tips surfaced online.

Deepfakes are manipulated videos, images or audio clips created using artificial intelligence to convincingly depict individuals saying or doing things they never did. Regulators and exchanges have flagged such content as a growing threat, as it can spread misinformation, facilitate financial fraud and severely damage public trust and reputations.

BSE reiterated its commitment to investor protection and urged vigilance against such evolving digital scams.

TCS Headcount Falls by Over 11,000 in Q3FY26 Amid Workforce Restructuring

India’s largest IT services firm, Tata Consultancy Services (TCS), reported a net decline of 11,151 employees during the December quarter of FY26 as the company continued with workforce restructuring and role realignment initiatives.

According to TCS’ quarterly factsheet released on January 12, the company’s total employee strength stood at 5,82,163 at the end of Q3FY26, down from 5,93,314 in the September quarter. The sequential decline extends the contraction seen in the previous quarter, highlighting a broader organisational reset underway at the Mumbai-headquartered IT major.

The headcount reduction coincided with a quarter marked by significant exceptional charges related to restructuring efforts and statutory changes following the implementation of India’s new labour codes. These developments underline the scale of the company’s realignment as it adapts to shifting client demand, evolving skill requirements and rapid technological changes.



While restructuring continues, one-time restructuring expenses eased considerably in the December quarter, falling by over 77 per cent to Rs 253 crore, suggesting that the bulk of major realignment costs may now be behind the company.

Despite the workforce reduction, voluntary attrition remained elevated at 13.5 per cent on a last-twelve-month basis within IT services. This indi-

cates that the decline in headcount was driven largely by planned workforce optimisation measures rather than a sudden spike in employee exits.

The latest contraction adds to a longer-term shift in TCS’ employment trends. In FY24, the company reported a decline in employee numbers for the first time since its listing in 2004, breaking a long-standing pattern of consistent workforce

expansion.

On the financial front, TCS reported a 14 per cent year-on-year decline in consolidated net profit to Rs 10,657 crore for the October–December quarter of FY26. The drop was primarily due to exceptional items totalling Rs 2,128 crore, even as the company posted sequential revenue growth.

Of the exceptional charges, Rs 1,816 crore was attributed to the incremental cost of gratuity, while Rs 312 crore related to long-term compensated absences. TCS said these costs arose largely due to changes in wage definitions under the new labour laws, adding that the assessment was based on legal opinion and the best available information.

Despite near-term pressures, TCS highlighted continued momentum in its artificial intelligence business, which is now running at an annualised revenue rate of \$1.8 billion, underscoring the company’s focus on next-generation growth areas amid ongoing structural changes.

Stock Market Holiday 2026: BSE, NSE to Remain Closed on January 15 for Maharashtra Civic Polls

Indian stock exchanges BSE and NSE will remain closed on Thursday, January 15, 2026, due to municipal corporation elections in Maharashtra, according to a circular issued by the National Stock Exchange (NSE). The decision follows the Maharashtra government’s declaration of a public holiday to facilitate voting across the state.

“In partial modification to an earlier exchange circular, the Exchange hereby notifies Thursday, January 15, 2026, as a trading holiday in the Capital Market segment on account of Municipal Corporation Elections in Maharashtra,” the NSE said in its notification.

Earlier, the exchange had indicated that trading would remain open on January 15, with only a settlement holiday in place. However, the revised circular confirms a complete trading holiday across key segments.

As a result, trading in equities, equity derivatives, securities lending and borrowing (SLBs), currency derivatives, and interest rate derivatives will remain suspended for the day on both the NSE and the BSE. In addition, the commodity derivatives segment will remain closed



during the morning session, with no trading activity scheduled.

The market closure follows the Maharashtra government’s decision to declare January 15 a public holiday under the Negotiable Instruments Act, 1881, to ensure smooth conduct of elections across 29 municipal corporations, including those in Mumbai City and Mumbai Suburban districts, which fall under the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC).

The holiday notification was

issued under Section 25 of the Negotiable Instruments Act, using powers delegated to the state government by the Ministry of Home Affairs in 1968. In a statement released on Saturday, the BMC said the public holiday was announced through an order issued jointly by the state’s General Administration Department and Industries and Labour Department.

“The public holiday will apply across Mumbai, including the city and both eastern and western suburbs. Government and

semi-government offices, public sector undertakings, banks, and other establishments will remain closed. The order also applies to voters registered in Mumbai but working outside the city, enabling them to exercise their voting rights,” the BMC said.

Vote counting for the civic polls is scheduled to take place on January 16. Notably, stock markets were also shut during the previous municipal corporation elections held in 2017.

Stock Market Holidays in 2026

In total, Indian stock markets will observe 16 holidays in 2026, although four of these fall on weekends, when markets are already closed. The highest number of market holidays will occur in March, with closures for Holi (March 3), Shri Ram Navami (March 26) and Shri Mahavir Jayanti (March 31). Meanwhile, February, July, and August will see no effective trading holidays, as national holidays during these months coincide with weekends.

Investors are advised to plan their trading and settlement schedules accordingly.

Makar Sankranti 2026: Date, Significance, Rituals and Regional Celebrations




Makar Sankranti is one of India's most widely celebrated harvest festivals, observed across the country with great enthusiasm and regional diversity. In 2026, Makar Sankranti will be celebrated on Wednesday, January 14. The festival marks the Sun's transition into the zodiac sign of Capricorn (Makara), an event of immense astronomical and cultural importance in Hindu tradition. It symbolises gratitude for a bountiful harvest and reverence for the Sun God, believed to be the source of life, prosperity and well-being. Unlike most Hindu festivals that follow the lunar calendar, Makar Sankranti is based on the solar cycle, making it one of the few festivals with a fixed date each year. Astronomically, it marks the Sun's northward journey, known as Uttarayan, and signals the end of the winter solstice. The gradual lengthening of days is seen as a transition from darkness to light, ignorance to

knowledge, and hardship to abundance. Historically, Makar Sankranti is deeply rooted in India's agrarian culture. Closely tied to the harvest season, the festival reflects the intimate relationship between human life and nature. Ancient texts and folklore link the day to auspicious beginnings and mythological narratives, including Lord Vishnu's victory over the demon Sankarasura, symbolising the triumph of good over evil. Religious rituals form an essential part of Makar Sankranti celebrations. Devotees take holy dips in sacred rivers such as the Ganga, Yamuna, Godavari, Krishna and Cauvery, believing it cleanses sins and brings spiritual merit. The Punya Kaal, considered the most auspicious time for rituals, typically begins early in the morning and lasts till late afternoon, though exact timings vary by region. People offer Surya Arghya (water to the Sun), chant

prayers, and engage in acts of charity by donating sesame seeds, jaggery, food, clothes and blankets to the needy. Makar Sankranti is celebrated under different names across India, each reflecting local traditions. In Punjab, it coincides with Lohri, marked by bonfires, folk songs and energetic dances. Gujarat and Rajasthan host vibrant kite-flying festivities during Uttarayan, filling the skies with colour. In Tamil Nadu, the festival is celebrated as Pongal, a four-day thanksgiving ritual centred on cooking a sweet rice dish. Maharashtra observes the day by exchanging sesame and jaggery sweets with the greeting, "Tilgul ghya, god god bola." In Assam, Magh Bihu is celebrated with community feasts, games and bonfires. Together, these diverse traditions make Makar Sankranti a festival that unites India through shared gratitude, renewal and joy.

Viral Video of Foreigner Cleaning Air Purifier Filter Sparks Fresh Alarm Over Delhi's Air Pollution



A viral Instagram video featuring a foreign resident in Delhi cleaning his air purifier filter has once again brought the capital's worsening air quality into sharp focus. The clip, shared by Andy Evans—popularly known on social media as "Aussie Bhai"—has garnered thousands of views and reactions, with users expressing shock at how polluted the air has become in just two months. In the video, Evans is seen removing the filter from his air purifier and showing it to the camera. Typically, such filters remain white or light grey after regular use. However, the filter in Evans' purifier was almost entirely black, caked with thick layers of dust, soot and pollutant particles. The striking visual served as a stark illustration of the level of air contamination residents are breathing daily in the national capital. Evans explained that he had been thinking throughout the night about cleaning his air purifier and decided to do so first thing in the morn-

ing. "Look at this, brother," he says in the video. "This is a filter from just two months in Delhi. It's completely filled with dust and pollution." His candid reaction underscored the alarming speed at which pollutants accumulate indoors, even in homes equipped with air purification systems. Adding a touch of dark humour, Evans pointed out that the filter was from only one of the three air purifiers running in his house. He joked that the thick layer of dust collected on the filter was so dense it could be spread across the floor like a carpet or even used to keep the house warm. While light-hearted, the comment only reinforced the seriousness of the underlying issue. The video quickly triggered widespread reactions on Instagram, with many users expressing disbelief and concern over Delhi's air quality. Several commenters shared their own experiences of frequently cleaning air purifier filters, while others called for urgent steps to tackle

pollution levels in the city. "Don't touch it, lol," one user commented, reacting to the visibly grimy filter. Another wrote, "Recycling pollution won't be a bad idea," highlighting the scale of the problem. A third user added, "That is why I try to check it every two weeks—it's crazy." The viral clip has reignited conversations around Delhi's chronic air pollution problem, particularly as winter approaches and air quality often deteriorates further. Environmental experts have repeatedly warned about the health risks associated with prolonged exposure to polluted air, including respiratory and cardiovascular diseases. While Evans' video was shared in a casual, personal tone, its impact has been far-reaching—serving as a visual reminder of the urgent need for sustained policy action, improved urban planning and greater public awareness to address one of Delhi's most pressing environmental challenges.

National Youth Day 2026: Honouring Swami Vivekananda and Empowering India's Youth

Magh Bihu 2026: Significance, Rituals and Celebrations in Assam

Magh Bihu, one of the most important festivals of Assam, marks the joyous conclusion of the harvesting season and celebrates abundance, community and renewal. Observed in the Assamese month of Magh, which falls between January and February, the festival is also known as Bhogali Bihu or Maghor Bihu. In 2026, Magh Bihu will be celebrated on Thursday, January 15. The festival coincides with Makar Sankranti and symbolises a subtle shift in the Earth's cycle that signals the end of harsh winter and the gradual arrival of spring. Magh Bihu is one of the three major Bihu festivals of Assam, the others being Rongali Bihu in April and Kati Bihu in October. The name Bhogali is derived from the word bhog, meaning enjoyment and feasting, which aptly reflects the spirit of the celebration. After months of hard agricultural labour, people



come together to indulge in food, music, dance and social bonding. Preparations for Magh Bihu begin a day earlier on Uruka, the last day of the month of Pausa. This night is dedicated to grand community feasts. Young men build temporary huts known as Bhelaghar using bamboo, straw, grass and banana leaves. Large bonfires, called Mejhi, are also constructed in open fields. Women prepare traditional Assamese delicacies in the Bhelaghar, including rice-based sweets such as til pitha, sunga pitha, narikel ladu (coconut laddus) and other seasonal dishes. On the night of Uruka, families and villagers gather around the Bhelaghar and Mejhi, singing folk songs, performing traditional dances, and sharing meals. The atmosphere is filled with warmth, joy and togetherness. People customarily bathe before participating in the festivities, symbolising physical and spiritual purification. The following morning marks the main day of Magh Bihu. Devotees take an early bath and

Viral Video of Mahindra Thar Driver Boasting About Breaking Traffic Rules Sparks Outrage

A video circulating widely on social media has triggered public outrage after showing a man openly boasting about flouting traffic rules while driving a Mahindra Thar on the wrong side of the road. In the self-recorded clip, the driver claims that owning the popular SUV gives him immunity from consequences, asserting that "the biggest advantage" of driving a Thar is that "no one will bother you even if you drive on the wrong side."



The exact location where the video was filmed has not been independently verified. However, the clip has drawn sharp criticism online, with users tagging traffic authorities, including the Delhi Traffic Police, and demanding strict legal action against the driver. Several users have also called for the suspension or cancellation of his driving licence, arguing that such behaviour poses a serious threat to public safety. The video has become a lightning rod for broader anger over reckless driving and perceived entitlement on Indian roads. One user on X shared the video with a scathing comment, comparing the behaviour to a spreading "epidemic." "COVID ended, but another epidemic took over our roads—the Thartards mentality virus," the user wrote, accusing some Thar owners of abandoning basic civic sense after purchasing the vehicle. "How does buying a vehicle suddenly delete common sense? It's honestly shocking and dangerous," the post added. The term "Thartard mentality" trended briefly as users debated what they see as a pattern of aggressive and irresponsible driving associated with certain owners of high-powered SUVs. Virat Kohli’s recent surge in form has reaffirmed his dominance in the ODI format, where centuries and half-centuries continue to flow off his bat at a remarkable pace. After returning to international cricket following a seven-month break and enduring successive ducks in his first two matches in Australia, the former India captain

appeared primed for a struggle. Yet, true to his reputation, Kohli bounced back emphatically, delivering match-winning performances and collecting Player of the Match awards along the way. On Sunday, the 37-year-old achieved a milestone, earning the 71st Player of the Match award of his 558-match international career spanning 18 years.

Kohli’s ODI exploits have been particularly outstanding, contributing to over half of his total awards. In the series opener against New Zealand in Vadodara, he registered a brilliant 93, securing his 45th ODI Man of the Match award in 309 appearances—placing him second only to the legendary Sachin Tendulkar. Tendulkar leads

with 76 awards, 62 of which came in ODIs, while Sri Lanka’s Sanath Jayasuriya ranks second in ODIs with 48, just three ahead of Kohli. Kohli shared a personal insight, revealing that he sends most of his awards home to his mother in Gurugram. Player of the Match awards have been officially recorded in interna-

tional cricket since the 1980s, leaving out performances from nearly a century of matches prior. Nonetheless, Kohli’s tally places him firmly among the sport’s all-time greats. Kohli’s relentless consistency and match-winning prowess continue to cement his place among cricket’s elite, and his record suggests that the best may yet be ahead.

Virat Kohli: “Living My Dream” as India Star Reaches 28,000 International Runs



India batting stalwart Virat Kohli on Sunday described his cricketing journey as “nothing short of a dream come true,” saying he feels blessed to bring happiness to fans through the sport he loves. The 37-year-old reached another milestone in the first ODI against New Zealand, becoming the fastest player to 28,000 international runs and the second-highest run-scorer in the world, behind Sachin Tendulkar. Kohli achieved the feat in his 624th innings, hitting a four off New Zealand leg-spinner Adithya Ashok. Tendulkar had crossed 28,000 runs in 644 innings, while Sri Lankan great Kumar Sangakkara did so in 666 innings. Reflecting on his career, Kohli said, “Honestly, if I look back at my journey, it’s nothing short of a dream come true. God has blessed me with way too much. I feel nothing but gratitude. I feel proud and grateful that I can give so much happiness to so many people by just playing the sport I’ve always loved as a child.” Kohli’s 91-ball 93 in Vadodara guided India to victory and earned

him the Player of the Match award for the 45th time in his career. On his approach to batting, he explained, “I wasn’t thinking about milestones. I had to play according to the situation. When you come in at number three, you back yourself to counter-attack, put the opposition under pressure, but still play to your strengths. That strategy ended up being the difference today.” He also shared a personal note about his trophies, saying he sends them to his mother in Gurugram, who enjoys keeping them. Kohli reflected on the crowd’s excitement as he came to bat after Rohit Sharma’s dismissal, noting the challenge for the outgoing batter. “It’s part of the game. I try to focus on what I need to do and stay in the present,” he said. India captain Shubman Gill praised Kohli’s effortless batting, saying, “It’s tough to start on these pitches. What he does is hard to replicate. Hope he keeps piling on runs.” Kohli’s blend of skill, composure, and situational awareness continues to make him one of the most dependable players in world cricket.

ICC Set to Respond to Bangladesh’s Request to Shift T20 World Cup 2026 Matches from India

The International Cricket Council (ICC) is expected to respond to the Bangladesh Cricket Board’s (BCB) request to move their T20 World Cup 2026 matches from India between Monday and Tuesday this week. The BCB cited “security concerns” in its official plea, requesting that the games be shifted to Sri Lanka. The request followed the release of Bangladesh fast bowler Mustafizur Rahman by IPL franchise Kolkata Knight Riders, reportedly on the suggestion of the BCCI. However, sources indicate that the ICC is unlikely to approve a move out of India. Instead, Chennai and Thiruvananthapuram have been suggested as alternative venues. Bangladesh is currently scheduled to



play their group stage games in Kolkata and Mumbai. Earlier, BCB president Aminul Islam stated that while Chennai had been proposed as an option, the board would need govern-

ment approval before making any decision. “Since you know that we are not taking decisions alone regarding this World Cup, we will discuss it with the government and we are still

where we stood,” he said in Sylhet. The Bangladesh government also expects direct communication from the Indian authorities regarding the security concerns. Bangladesh umpire

Sharfuddoula Saikat officiated in the first ODI between India and New Zealand in Vadodara on Sunday. Both Saikat and fellow Bangladeshi umpire Gazi Sohel are expected to feature as match officials during the T20 World Cup, a point the ICC may cite when responding to the board’s security concerns. With less than four weeks remaining until the tournament begins and teams scheduled to arrive in India in the first week of February for practice, the ICC is keen to resolve the venue issue promptly. The governing body is expected to provide clarity on the matter this week, bringing an end to the uncertainty that has dominated headlines over the past few days.

KL Rahul’s Role at No. 5/6 Continues to Pay Dividends for India in ODIs



Questions about whether KL Rahul is batting too low in India’s ODI order have surfaced frequently since head coach Gautam Gambhir took charge in mid-2024. Yet the Karnataka wicket-keeper-batter remains unfazed, consistently delivering match-winning performances from the crucial No. 5/6 spot. Rahul has been entrusted with this “floating” role because of his proven ability to handle the pressure of death overs. Former India all-rounder Irfan Pathan praised Rahul’s composure, especially under the new ODI rules that allow only one new ball after the 34th over, which has challenged many batters.

In India’s 301-run chase against New Zealand in Vadodara on Sunday, Rahul took his time to settle but eventually guided the team to a four-wicket victory. He finished the game in style with a winning six—only the sixth time in his career—joining MS Dhoni, who has achieved it nine times in ODIs for India. “When KL Rahul bats, people often ask why he is batting so low. But with the new rule, the ball behaves differently after the 34th over. Other batters struggled, but Rahul stayed in control. A technically correct batter at this stage can make a huge difference,” Pathan said on his YouTube channel. Rahul has excelled in

this role ever since taking it up during the previous ODI World Cup year in 2023, maintaining an average close to 60 in the positions. His reliability is evident in India’s record—every time Rahul has remained unbeaten in a chase, India have won, a streak that now stands at 13 victories. Pathan also highlighted Rahul’s strategic approach, noting how he rotated the strike early, paced the innings perfectly, and targeted the final overs to finish the game with two boundaries followed by a six. Rahul’s blend of patience, timing, and power continues to make him one of the most dependable finishers in world cricket today.

Michael Carrick Emerges as Favourite for Manchester United Interim Manager Role, Wins Ronaldo’s Backing



Michael Carrick has emerged as the leading candidate for Manchester United’s interim managerial position, reportedly winning the endorsement of club legend Cristiano Ronaldo. The Red Devils are currently without a head coach following a 1-2 FA Cup defeat to Brighton, which added pressure after the club recently parted ways with Ruben Amorim. Carrick, a former United midfielder, has overtaken Ole Gunnar Solskjaer in the race for the role. He brings experience at Old Trafford, having served as assistant coach between 2018 and 2021, and is now considered the frontrunner to steady the club during this transitional period. The Englishman also enjoys the backing of Ronaldo, who played alongside him during the late 2000s. In 2021, the five-time Bal-

lon d’Or winner praised Carrick on X (formerly Twitter), writing: “Michael Carrick was a class act as a player and he can become a great coach as well. Nothing is impossible for this guy. Personally, I’m proud to have played with him by my side as well as with him as a manager on our bench.” Carrick’s appointment would mark a return to Old Trafford after being replaced by Ralf Rangnick, whose brief stint as caretaker manager ended after just three games. Meanwhile, Darren Fletcher has been temporarily overseeing first-team duties. According to reports, Carrick was interviewed on Thursday and is expected to take over soon, giving Manchester United a familiar and steady presence as they navigate a turbulent period on and off the pitch.

Washington Sundar Ruled Out of ODI Series Against New Zealand; Ayush Badoni Earns Maiden Call-Up



India’s spin-bowling all-rounder Washington Sundar has been ruled out of the remainder of the three-match ODI series against New Zealand due to a rib injury, confirmed the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) on January 12. Sundar sustained the injury during the series opener in Vadodara, where he displayed signs of discomfort while batting, walking cautiously between the wickets during India’s run chase. “India all-rounder Washington Sundar reported an acute onset of discomfort in his left lower rib area while bowling during the first ODI against New Zealand at the BCA Stadium, Vadodara, on Sunday. He will undergo further scans, following which the BCCI Medical Team will seek expert opinion,” the BCCI said in an official statement. With Sundar unavailable, the selection committee led by Ajit Agarkar has handed Delhi all-rounder Ayush Badoni his maiden call-up to the Indian ODI squad. Badoni, 26, will join the team in Rajkot ahead of the second ODI. The all-rounder, who plays for Lucknow Super Giants (LSG) in the Indian Premier League (IPL), has previously worked with India head coach Gautam Gambhir, who was a mentor at LSG. Badoni has showcased consistent

performances in domestic cricket and the IPL. In 27 List A games, he has scored 693 runs from 22 innings at an average of 36.47, including a century and five fifties. With the ball, the off-spinner has claimed 18 wickets at an average of 29.72, maintaining an economy rate of 4.54 runs per over. His balanced skill set as a batting and bowling all-rounder makes him a versatile option for India in the middle overs. The Indian ODI squad for the remainder of the New Zealand series has now been updated as follows: Shubman Gill (c), Rohit Sharma, Virat Kohli, KL Rahul (wk), Shreyas Iyer (vc), Ravindra Jadeja, Mohammed Siraj, Harshit Rana, Prasidh Krishna, Kuldeep Yadav, Nitish Kumar Reddy, Arshdeep Singh, Yashasvi Jaiswal, Dhruv Jurel (wk), and Ayush Badoni. Sundar’s absence will be a significant blow to India, particularly in the spin department, given his ability to provide crucial breakthroughs and stabilize the middle order with the bat. Badoni, on the other hand, brings fresh energy and an aggressive approach that could prove valuable in the high-pressure ODI encounters. As India prepare to face New Zealand in the second ODI in Rajkot, attention will now be on Badoni to make a strong impression in his maiden international outing.


