

Unemployed Protest at Indira Park, Accuse State Government of Failing Job

A large group of unemployed youth staged a massive demonstration at Indira Park in Hyderabad on Monday, demanding immediate implementation of employment notifications and accusing the state government of failing to fulfill its promises of providing jobs. The protest, organized under the banner of the Unemployed JAC (Joint Action Committee), drew attention from leaders of several organizations who expressed solidarity with the demonstrators. Key participants included Jajula Srinivas Goud, National President of the BC Welfare Association, and Hem Sudarshan Jilloju, Tel-

angana state convener of the Aam Aadmi Party, who attended the protest to support the cause of unemployed youth. The demonstrators alleged that the state government, like its predecessors, has repeatedly misled job seekers with false assurances.

Speaking at the event, JAC leaders criticized both the previous and current governments for failing to provide the promised employment opportunities. They highlighted that the government had assured two lakh jobs for unemployed youth but failed to deliver even a fraction of that promise. "Despite assurances during election campaigns and meetings with leaders like Rahul



Gandhi, unemployed youth continue to be neglected," the protestors said. The demonstrators

pointed out that although political leaders often promise jobs to gain votes, these commitments rarely trans-

late into tangible results. They specifically criticized the state government for announcing 100,000 jobs without

taking concrete steps to implement them, calling the announcements "empty promises" that have only heightened

frustration among job seekers.

JAC members warned that unless the state government takes immediate action to address unemployment, they will actively mobilize support to demonstrate their strength in the upcoming municipal elections. "If the government continues to ignore unemployed youth, we will show our political strength in the next elections," they stated. The protest also called for greater accountability and transparency in the recruitment process, urging the government to ensure that eligible candidates are not deprived of opportunities due to bureaucratic delays or political neglect.

The massive turnout at Indira Park reflects growing frustration among Telangana's unemployed youth, who demand swift and fair action from the state government. The protest underscored the urgent need for concrete measures to provide jobs, improve employment notifications, and rebuild trust between the government and job seekers. Leaders and demonstrators collectively urged the state administration to prioritize youth employment and take immediate steps to fulfill promises made during election campaigns, warning that continued inaction could lead to intensified protests and political repercussions.

Supreme Court Advocate Pitta Srinivas Reddy Demands Strict Action Against Youth Lawyer's Murderers

Supreme Court advocate and BJP Legal Cell national leader Pitta Srinivas Reddy on Wednesday urged the authorities to take strict action against those responsible for the murder of young lawyer Swapna, who was killed in the Moinabad Police Station jurisdiction. Speaking on behalf of the legal community, he called for urgent measures to ensure justice is served and to prevent such incidents in the future.

Addressing the press, Pitta Srinivas Reddy emphasized the need for both the central and state governments to implement strong protective legislation for lawyers. He requested that the Advocate Protection Act be introduced and enforced in the Assembly and Parliament to safeguard legal professionals against threats, harassment, and attacks while performing their duties. The Supreme

Court advocate highlighted that the welfare, protection, and security of lawyers must be taken seriously. "Lawyers are pillars of the justice system, and incidents like the brutal murder of Swapna not only harm the legal fraternity but also undermine public confidence in the rule of law," he said. He appealed to bar councils, bar associations, and other legal bodies across the state to take immediate action to protect the interests and safety of their members. Reddy emphasized that preventive measures, legal safeguards, and timely intervention are critical to ensuring that legal professionals can work without fear.

"Strict action must be taken against the perpetrators. Justice must be delivered swiftly and transparently to send a strong message that such crimes will not be tolerated," he asserted. The advocate also called upon the



government to set up mechanisms for rapid response whenever threats are made against members of the legal community. He suggested that coordination between the police, legal authorities, and bar associations is essential to provide round-the-clock protection to lawyers, especially those involved in sensitive or high-risk cases. Pitta Srinivas Reddy's appeal comes amid growing concerns among lawyers in Telangana regarding safety and

security while carrying out their professional duties. Legal professionals have increasingly voiced the need for stricter laws, enhanced protection, and proactive monitoring to prevent attacks on advocates. He concluded by urging all stakeholders, including government authorities, legal bodies, and the judiciary, to prioritize the safety and welfare of lawyers and ensure that justice is delivered swiftly in the case of Swapna's murder.

ACP Shankar Reddy Solves Quthbullapur Murder Case in 24 Hours

Police have solved the murder of an elderly woman in Quthbullapur within 24 hours, arresting her domestic help in a swift investigation led by Medchal ACP Shankar Reddy. Addressing a press conference at the Dundigal Police Station, ACP Shankar Reddy said the victim, Sushilamma (85), a resident of Church Gagillapur, was brutally killed inside her home on Monday. What initially appeared to be a mysterious death was quickly identified as a planned murder motivated by theft.

According to police, the prime accused Kavitha (36), who worked as a domestic help at Sushilamma's house, closely monitored the elderly woman's routine. On the day of the incident, after confirming that Sushilamma was alone, Kavitha allegedly attacked her with a stone, striking her on the head and killing her on the spot.

After committing the



crime, the accused reportedly stole gold earrings, a gold ring, and a mobile phone belonging to the victim before fleeing the scene. The murder shocked local residents, as the crime occurred inside the house and involved a person trusted by the family. ACP Shankar Reddy said police teams used technical surveillance and CCTV footage from the surrounding area to trace the accused's movements. Cameras installed in Church Gagillapur played a crucial role in identifying Kavitha and tracking her escape route. Based on this evidence, police apprehended her within 24

hours of the crime. "The accused took advantage of the trust placed in her. This was a crime driven purely by greed," the ACP said. He added that the accused was produced before the court and remanded to judicial custody.

ACP Shankar Reddy appreciated the coordinated efforts of the Dundigal Police, Quthbullapur Special Operations Team (SOT), and Central Crime Station (CCS) personnel for their prompt action and effective use of technology. He also highlighted the importance of community participation and surveillance systems in preventing and solving crimes. Police

officials noted that CCTV cameras installed in the locality by a resident under the "Nenu Saitam" initiative proved instrumental in cracking the case quickly. Several senior officers attended the press conference, including Dundigal Police Station SHO P. Satish, DI M. Bal Reddy, CCS Inspector P. Dali Naidu, Medak CCS SI T. Shankar, Quthbullapur SOT Inspector Shyam Sunder Reddy, SOT SI Rajesh, and other police personnel. Police have advised residents to remain cautious while employing domestic workers and to ensure proper verification to prevent such tragic incidents in the future.

CITU Condemns HYDRA Officials' Harassment of Small Traders

The CITU Bachupally Mandal Committee strongly condemned the alleged harassment of small traders by HYDRA officials near Ambir Cheruvu in Pragati Nagar, under Nizampet Circle. These vendors, who sell meat, fish, and prawns on small plots to earn a livelihood, were reportedly removed without any alternative arrangements.

Speaking on the issue, CITU Bachupally Mandal Secretary Rathod Santosh criticized the authorities for taking direct action to evict traders instead of providing alternate spaces on vacant government land adjacent to the lake. "If roadside vending is a concern, there are empty government lands near the lake that can be allocated to these small traders. Evicting them directly without alternatives is unfair and threatens the livelihood of their families," he said.

Rathod highlighted that these vendors contribute to meeting public demand for daily necessities while sustaining their house-



holds, often risking their own health in the process. He expressed concern that harassment by HYDRA officials not only disrupts the workers' means of living but also undermines the support that authorities should provide to laborers.

The CITU official urged both the state government and HYDRA authorities to allocate the vacant lands next to the lake to the small traders and provide necessary facilities to help

them continue their work. Additionally, he demanded proper waste management systems to ensure that garbage from the trading activities does not pollute the lake. "Environmental protection and safeguarding workers' livelihoods must go hand in hand," Rathod said.

The union emphasized the need for balanced solutions that protect both public health and the livelihood of small vendors, calling for immediate interven-

tion to prevent further distress among these workers. The CITU also warned that failure to act responsibly could have social and economic consequences for the local community.

This statement comes amid growing concerns over the treatment of small traders in urban areas, highlighting the need for authorities to create inclusive and sustainable arrangements that support both local businesses and environmental conservation.
