CM Revanth Reddy Calls for Stronger Sanitation, Tech-Driven Urban Reforms

Hyderabad, Telangana – Friday

Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy has directed officials to intensify sanitation measures and mosquito control efforts across urban areas, stressing the need for improved public health management. The instructions were issued during a high-level review meeting with senior officials of the Municipal Administration and Urban Development Department at the State Secretariat on Friday.

The Chief Minister emphasized that sanitation must remain a top priority, particularly in densely populated urban zones. He instructed municipal authorities to create awareness among citizens about disposing of garbage only at designated and marked locations. Public cooperation, he said, is essential to maintaining cleanliness and preventing the spread of diseases.

The meeting was attended by senior officials, including the Chief Minister's Advisor Vem Narender Reddy and Chief Secretary Ramakrishna Rao. Discussions focused on measures to be implemented within the Core



Urban Region (CURE) to enhance civic services and infrastructure.

Highlighting the importance of technology in governance, Revanth Reddy advised officials to adopt digital tools for faster and more efficient service delivery. He proposed assigning a unique identification number to every streetlight in the Core Urban Region and connecting them to a centralized dashboard. This system would allow authorities to quickly detect faults and address complaints in real time.

Food safety was another major focus of the review. The Chief Minister directed officials to give top priority to monitoring hygiene standards in hotels and res-

taurants within CURE limits. He suggested installing CCTV cameras in hotel kitchens and linking them to the Command and Control Centre to ensure continuous oversight. He also called for frequent inspections and the establishment of a special monitoring wing to track compliance.

Revanth Reddy further recommended exploring a rating and certification system for hotels based on hygiene, safety, and service standards. Such a system, he said, would promote accountability and encourage establishments to maintain better quality control.

On fire safety, the Chief Minister instructed officials to utilize ad-

vanced equipment and modern firefighting technologies to improve emergency response capabilities.

In addition, he proposed setting up water harvesting wells at major signal junctions and traffic circles to capture rainwater and improve groundwater levels. He directed officials to identify select areas and implement the initiative as a pilot project before expanding it further.

The Chief Minister reiterated that effective monitoring, technological integration, and proactive civic planning are essential to building a cleaner, safer, and more sustainable urban environment in Telangana.

Hyderabad, Telangana – Friday

In a significant development, Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy held a meeting with senior Maoist leaders at the State Secretariat on Friday. The discussions primarily focused on the government's surrender and rehabilitation policy for Maoists, marking what officials described as an important step toward peace and reintegration.

During the meeting, the Chief Minister personally greeted each of the Maoist leaders and inquired about their well-being. He assured them that the state government is committed to implementing a fair and transparent surrender policy. Emphasizing rehabilitation and social reintegration, Revanth Reddy promised that those who have laid down arms would be provided support in accordance with the law.

The Chief Minister also assured that monetary rewards announced on surrendered Maoist leaders would be released without delay. He directed officials to take immediate steps to ensure that all eligible benefits under the surrender policy are provided promptly.

The Maoist leaders expressed their willingness to cooperate with the government's peace initiatives. They stated that, subject to government permission, they would like

to meet Maoists currently lodged in prisons to encourage them to consider surrendering and joining the mainstream.

According to sources, the leaders described the discussions with the state government as constructive and positive.

Senior Maoist leader Devji conveyed his appreciation to the Chief Minister, stating that the Telangana government's surrender policy is progressive and practical. He thanked the government and Revanth Reddy for initiating dialogue and creating an environment conducive to peaceful resolution.

During the interaction, the Chief Minister also sought details about the welfare of those who had already surrendered. He reiterated that the government would ensure rehabilitation, protection, and necessary assistance to help them rebuild their lives. "Our government stands by its commitment to provide legal protection and comprehensive rehabilitation support," he reportedly said.

The Maoist leaders thanked the Telangana government for taking proactive steps to facilitate their surrender. They acknowledged the administration's efforts in creating an atmosphere of trust and dialogue. Officials present at the meeting indicated that discussions also covered future plans of the former Maoist leaders

and ways to integrate them into society productively.

Revanth Reddy further stated that he would make a formal announcement in the Telangana Legislative Assembly regarding the Maoists' surrender and the government's policy framework. He emphasized that lasting peace in the region requires dialogue, development, and inclusive governance.

The meeting is seen as a notable development in Telangana's internal security landscape. For years, Maoist activities have posed challenges in certain regions, and successive governments have attempted various strategies to address the issue. Observers believe that sustained engagement and effective rehabilitation measures could play a crucial role in reducing extremism and promoting stability.

Officials described Friday's meeting as a confidence-building measure and expressed optimism that more Maoist cadres may come forward under the revised surrender policy. The state government is expected to release detailed guidelines soon to ensure transparency and smooth implementation.

The development marks a renewed effort by the Telangana government to resolve long-standing security concerns through dialogue and structured rehabilitation initiatives.

CM REVANTH TACTICAL MOVE ON MAOISTS; MEETING WITH LEADERS



COURT DISMISSES DELHI LIQUOR SCAM CASE

- RELIEF FOR KEJRIWAL AND MANISH SISODIA
- BIG TURNING POINT FOR KAVITHA

New Delhi – Friday

In a significant legal and political development, Delhi's Rouse Avenue Court on Friday acquitted AAP leaders Arvind Kejriwal and Manish Sisodia in the alleged corruption case linked to the 2021/22 Delhi excise policy. The verdict brings to an end a prolonged legal battle that had cast a shadow over the former Chief Minister and his deputy for nearly two years.

Special Judge Jitendra Singh, while pronouncing the judgment, held that there was no evidence of an overarching conspiracy or criminal intent in the formulation and execution of the liquor policy. The court observed that the prosecution had failed to establish essential elements required to prove corruption charges.

The ruling offers major relief to the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), which had repeatedly maintained that the case was politically motivated. The verdict is expected to have far-reaching political implications, particularly with key elections on the horizon, including next year's Assembly polls in Punjab, the only other state currently governed by AAP.

An emotional Kejriwal, speaking to reporters outside jail, said, "I always used to say that the truth is with us." He later left to meet his family, marking a personal moment of relief after months of intense political and legal scrutiny. Sisodia, too, expressed satisfaction over the court's findings.

However, the judgment did not merely acquit the two senior leaders. It also contained sharp observations about the handling of the case by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), the federal agency that had investigated the matter.



One of the most striking aspects of the ruling was the court's criticism of the term "South Group" or "South Lobby," repeatedly used in the chargesheet to describe a set of accused individuals. Judge Singh termed the label arbitrary, regionally prejudicial, and without legal foundation.

"I was concerned that terms like 'South Group' were used. This is not correct," the judge observed, questioning whether the CBI would have employed the same terminology had the chargesheet been filed in a southern city like Chennai. The court also noted that no equivalent expression such as "North Group" was used, raising concerns about selective labeling.

In a detailed remark placed on record, the court stated that descriptors rooted in regional identity have no place in a constitutional order founded on equality before law and national unity. Such terminology, it reasoned, serves no le-

gitimate investigative or prosecutorial purpose and risks introducing bias into criminal proceedings.

The CBI defended the usage, arguing that "South Group" functioned as a convenient collective term for several accused. However, the court rejected this justification and even referred to a landmark 2000 judgment by a United States appeals court that overturned a conviction because prosecutors had used racially or ethnically loaded language irrelevant to the charges.

The "South Group" was alleged to include Hyderabad-based politicians and businessmen accused of influencing the Delhi liquor policy to generate illegal financial gains. Among those named were K Kavitha, a former leader of the Bharat Rashtra Samithi, and Magunta Srinivasulu Reddy, a Lok Sabha MP from the YSR Congress Party. Kavitha, who spent several

months in jail during the investigation, welcomed the verdict and described the case as driven by "political vendetta."

Legal experts believe the court's remarks could have broader implications beyond the acquittal itself. The observations may fuel ongoing political debates about federal agencies and alleged regional bias, especially in southern states that have frequently voiced concerns about central overreach.

With Assembly elections due in Kerala and Tamil Nadu in the coming weeks, the court's strong comments on the "South Group" label may also add momentum to discussions surrounding federalism and regional identity in Indian politics.

For now, the verdict marks a decisive legal victory for Kejriwal and Sisodia, while raising serious questions about investigative standards and the language used in high-profile corruption cases.

Kavitha Says Faith in Judiciary Upheld

Kavitha, president of Telangana Jagruthi and former Member of Parliament, said her faith in the judiciary has been vindicated after a court dismissed the Delhi Liquor Policy Case in which she had been named as an accused.

Addressing the media in Hyderabad after the verdict, Kavitha expressed relief and described the outcome as a triumph of truth. "From the beginning, I have been telling the people of Telangana that I would come out clean like a washed pearl. Today, that has

happened," she said.

She reiterated that the case was politically motivated and filed out of vendetta. "I have said many times that this case was driven by political hostility. That has now been proven," she asserted. Kavitha added that she and her family went through months of emotional distress due to the allegations and prolonged legal proceedings.

The former MP also alleged misuse of investigative agencies to target opposition leaders. She said some individuals made inappropriate remarks against her even before the court delivered its judgment. "I

had complete faith in the judicial system, and that trust has stood firm," she stated.

Kavitha thanked party workers, supporters, and well-wishers who stood by her during difficult times. "I am grateful to everyone who supported me when I needed strength the most," she said.

Soon after the verdict, she posted "Satyameva Jayate" on social media platform X, emphasizing her belief that truth ultimately prevails.

With the case now dismissed, Kavitha said she would continue serving the people with renewed energy and commitment.

Deputy CM Bhatti Meets AP CM Ahead of Son's Wedding

CORRUPTION AND ANARCHY BECOME INSEPARABLE IN ADMINISTRATION: KTR

BRS Working President KT Rama Rao on Friday delivered a scathing critique of the current Congress government in Telangana, asserting that corruption and anarchy have become inseparable elements of its administration. Speaking at a felicitation program held at Telangana Bhavan for newly elected BRS councillors from the Alampur constituency, Rama Rao contrasted the current governance with the tenure of former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekhara Rao, emphasizing that under the BRS rule, development and welfare moved hand-in-hand, reflecting a balanced and people-centric administration.

Rama Rao criticized specific actions by the Congress government, citing environmental degradation as a glaring concern.

He noted the widespread felling of trees in the Palle Prakhruhi Vanams and the blasting of check dams, describing these acts as emblematic of the government's disregard for both ecological sustainability and the welfare of local communities. According to him, such measures have now become routine, reflecting a governance model that prioritizes short-term gains over long-term development and environmental protection. Rama Rao emphasized that these activities not only harm the natural landscape but also adversely affect the lives of farmers and rural communities dependent on these natural resources.

In his address, Rama Rao also highlighted the sustained grassroots strength of the BRS despite Congress holding power in the

state. He cited the party's performance in recent elections in Alampur, Aija, Gadwal, and Vaddepalli as proof that the public continues to place its confidence in the BRS. "From sarpanch to municipal polls, the results show where the people's confidence lies," he remarked, attributing this trust to the inspiration and leadership of Nadigadda, which has reinforced the party's strong organizational presence across rural and urban constituencies.

Rama Rao further drew attention to alleged administrative failures of the Congress government, pointing to sensitive incidents such as the tragic death of a two-month-old baby in Nagarkurnool and the alleged lockup death of Dalit youth Karla Rajesh in Kodad. He also condemned

the demolition of houses in Velugumatta, Khammam, calling it a cruel act that left thousands of families homeless and destabilized entire communities. According to Rama Rao, these events reveal a government disconnected from the public and incapable of safeguarding the basic rights and welfare of its citizens.

In addition to these criticisms, Rama Rao accused the Congress of failing to implement its six guarantees and of disappointing farmers, particularly regarding the disbursement of Rythu Bharosa financial assistance and timely fertilizer distribution. He urged BRS cadres to remain vigilant against attempts by the ruling party to lure away elected representatives, emphasizing the need for party unity and organizational discipline to counteract such tactics.

Concluding his speech, Rama Rao expressed confidence in the people of Telangana, stating that voters have clearly recognized the shortcomings and false promises of the Congress government. He reiterated that under the leadership of Chandrashekhara Rao, the BRS would return to power, with a renewed focus on welfare, sustainable development, and the protection of citizens' rights. His address underscored the growing political tensions in the state, highlighting governance failures, environmental concerns, and public dissatisfaction as key issues ahead of upcoming elections, while reinforcing the BRS's commitment to addressing these challenges effectively.

Konda Surekha Conducts Surprise Inspection at Balkampet Ellamma Temple

Konda Surekha, Minister for the Telangana Endowment Department, carried out a surprise inspection at the Balkampet Ellamma Temple on Friday, expressing serious concern over staff negligence in carrying out temple duties. Accompanied by senior officials from the Endowment Department, the minister scrutinized the temple premises, maintenance routines, and staff performance.

During the two-hour inspection, Minister Surekha found several lapses in the administration and upkeep of the temple. She expressed her displeasure over poor hygiene and inadequate management of daily rituals and temple operations. Four staff members, who were found to have neglected their responsibilities, were suspended immediately. Officials noted that the suspension was intended to serve as a strict warning and reinforce accountability among all temple personnel.

The minister also reviewed records pertaining to the temple's administration, including financial deposits and inventories of gold and silver ornaments belonging to the deity. She sought detailed explanations from the officials regarding asset management, emphasizing the importance of transparency and proper documentation of all temple-related resources. The minister stressed that any negli-

gence in record-keeping or asset management would not be tolerated.

According to the Endowment Department, the surprise inspection was aimed at ensuring that temples under the department's jurisdiction maintain high standards of administration and cleanliness. Minister Surekha instructed officials to implement corrective measures immediately and to conduct regular checks to prevent further lapses. She also emphasized that proactive monitoring is necessary to ensure the smooth functioning of temple services and the proper care of devotees.

The inspection reflects the Telangana government's commitment to strengthening governance in religious institutions. By taking decisive action against negligent staff and reviewing operational procedures, the minister aims to improve accountability, enhance the sanctity of temple services, and ensure that all rituals and daily operations are performed efficiently.

Officials stated that such inspections will continue across other prominent temples in the state to reinforce the importance of proper management, cleanliness, and adherence to established protocols. The minister's proactive approach is expected to serve as a model for better administration and transparency in Telangana's temple network, ultimately benefiting devotees and the wider community.

Rajendranagar Landowners Protest Gandhi Sarovar Project Acquisition

In a recent notification, Rajendranagar revenue authorities declared that 19.10 acres of land in Kismatpur village, Gandipet mandal, would be acquired for the Gandhi Sarovar Project. The acquisition will affect not only private land parcels but also the Dargah Khaliz Khan area at HMBS Colony in Kismatpur, stirring unrest among local residents and landowners.

Historically, these lands were fertile and cultivated with paddy, supporting the livelihoods of families in the region. However, due to scanty rainfall over the past decade, cultivation had stopped, and the land has largely remained fallow. Despite lying unused for years, the land holds emotional and historical significance for the families who have safeguarded it for generations.

Aslam Bin Abdullah, a local landowner, expressed deep anguish over the acquisition, stating that he would lose nearly 10 acres of ancestral property in the Dargah Khaliz Khan area. "Losing my ancestors' property for this project causes unbearable pain. We have been protecting it for the past five decades, and it has fed our entire family. Now, the government's action is heartbreaking," he said.

The project impacts over 150 families who rely on small land parcels for their livelihoods. Another affected resident highlighted the economic vulnerability of the locals. "We are a very poor family and have been protecting this land from encroachers for years. Now, the Revanth Reddy government is forcibly taking it for the project, which is unacceptable," he said. Local residents also criticized the Congress govern-



ment for allegedly deviating from the approach of the previous BRS administration. Kismatpur resident A. Santosh Goud said, "The then BRS government did not propose any project that would affect hundreds of families. But the current Congress government is forcibly acquiring land, claiming it is for a buffer zone. Land worth crores of rupees is being taken from us under the guise of development."

Tensions escalated a few weeks ago when revenue authorities arrived to conduct a Grama Sabha to discuss the acquisition. Local landowners resisted the proceedings, preventing the officials from holding the meeting. Since then, revenue officials have reportedly refrained from visiting Kismatpur, leaving the issue unresolved and the locals' anxieties unaddressed.

The Gandhi Sarovar Pro-

ject is seen as a major developmental initiative by the Telangana government. However, the lack of adequate dialogue with local residents and landowners has raised questions about the approach toward displacement and compensation. Residents argue that while the project may serve broader public interests, the government must consider the economic and emotional stakes of families who

have preserved these lands for generations.

As the situation unfolds, it remains unclear how authorities plan to proceed with the acquisition and address the growing protests. For now, Kismatpur residents continue to resist what they see as a forced appropriation of their ancestral lands, demanding fair treatment, adequate compensation, and transparency in the project's implementation.

Kavitha Criticizes KTR Over 'Delhi Liquor Case' Comments, Calls Out BRS Leadership

K Kavitha, president of Telangana Jagruthi, stated that her reputation was unfairly tarnished even before the conclusion of the Delhi Liquor Policy Case. Speaking after the Delhi Rouse Avenue Court's verdict, which gave her a clean chit, she criticized Telangana Rashtra Samithi (BRS) leaders for using the case to attack her personally.

Kavitha referred to a social media post by BRS working president K. T. Rama Rao on X, in which he appeared to suggest that her involvement in the liquor case was linked to the party's electoral defeat. She rejected this characterization, saying the BRS loss in the Assembly elections was due to internal party issues, not her actions.

"I have directly questioned BRS leaders. The defeat was caused by not providing houses to people, not generating employment, giving tickets to opportunistic candidates, and above all, an arrogant leadership style," she said. "It is not correct to put the blame for the party's loss on my shoulders. KTR must still respect the people's mandate."

Kavitha's statement highlighted that she faced personal and political attacks throughout the case, even though the

court ultimately cleared her of all charges. She emphasized that the case had been politically motivated and used to harass opposition leaders.

Responding to the court verdict, KTR had posted on X that the Delhi liquor scandal had undermined the AAP government in Delhi, which contributed to BRS's electoral setbacks in the Assembly and Parliament elections. He acknowledged that the court ruling in Kavitha's favor was a matter of justice and reiterated that politically motivated cases are common against leaders. "We continue to see disinformation campaigns from Congress and BJP until the facts are fully revealed," KTR wrote.

Kavitha, however, maintained that using the court verdict to portray her as a cause of BRS's electoral losses is inappropriate. She urged BRS leaders, especially KTR, to respect voter decisions and focus on addressing the real issues that led to the party's defeat rather than targeting individuals unjustly.

This exchange underscores continuing tensions between Kavitha and BRS leadership, even after her legal vindication, highlighting how high-profile cases can intersect with political narratives in Telangana.

Kishan Reddy Accuses Congress of Splitting GHMC to Favor MIM in Hyderabad



Hyderabad:

Union Minister and Telangana BJP president G. Kishan Reddy has strongly criticized the Congress government for trifurcating the 150-ward Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) into three separate corporations, creating a total of 300 divisions. Reddy alleged that the move was politically motivated to weaken the BJP and hand over core areas of Hyderabad to the MIM. He further accused Congress, MIM, and BRS leaders of prioritizing mutual benefits over addressing citizens' issues.

Speaking to reporters after conducting a 'basti bata' outreach in Boudhanagar, Sitaphalmandi, Mettuguda, and surrounding slums with officials, Reddy highlighted severe neglect of basic infrastructure in the city. He noted that while Hyderabad is rapidly transforming every six months, the existing drainage network is unable to cope with the fast-growing number of apartments and residents. Additionally, the government has not taken adequate steps to augment water supply from the Go-

davari, leaving many areas facing drinking water shortages even before the onset of summer.

Reddy also criticized the failure to desilt stormwater drains ahead of the summer season. He alleged that contractors were being paid for incomplete work, resulting in foul odors and health risks for residents. The Union minister, who represents Secunderabad in Parliament, held Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy accountable for the civic issues and demanded an urgent meeting with elected representatives to devise a plan to resolve pending infrastructure problems.

With the GHMC council's term having expired, Reddy called for immediate municipal elections, asserting that timely elections and improved governance are essential to restore civic infrastructure and public confidence. The minister's remarks have intensified political debate over the Congress government's urban administration policies, particularly regarding the future of core Hyderabad areas and the welfare of its residents.

Bandi Sanjay Criticizes Revanth Over Delayed Rythu Bharosa

Karimnagar - Friday

Bandi Sanjay Kumar, Union Minister and Telangana BJP leader, has sharply criticized the state government for delaying disbursement of the Rythu Bharosa Scheme funds, accusing Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and his administration of failing to honor promises made to farmers ahead of elections. According to Sanjay, the delay not only undermines farmers' trust but also highlights the ruling party's "habit of making promises before polls and breaking them afterward."

In an open letter to CM Revanth Reddy, Sanjay raised concerns about the pending payments, questioning why the government has not credited the promised funds even after two months have passed since municipal elections. "You promised to release the Rythu Bharosa funds immediately after the municipal elections during the Miryalaguda public meeting on February 4. If the government itself forgets the promise, how can farmers trust you?" he asked. The minister emphasized that more than 67 lakh farmers across the state are awaiting their entitled investment support.

Sanjay highlighted that the total pending amount, including the third installment, is approximately 27,000 crore. He criticized the government for repeatedly claiming that 9,000 crore had already been released over the past nine months, calling it "misleading and deceptive," and said that farmers are left in uncertainty and frustration. He demanded that the pending Rythu Bharosa payments be deposited into farmers' accounts immediately. "If the government continues to delay, the BJP will organize large-scale protests across the state to demand accountability," he warned.

Beyond the Rythu Bharosa issue, Sanjay also accused CM Revanth Reddy of prioritizing political theatrics over public welfare. Speaking to the media in Karimnagar, he claimed, "The government is focusing on demolishing poor people's



houses and engaging in election-driven stunts rather than addressing real problems. Ahead of elections, they give promises and then backtrack, surpassing even KCR in political deception."

He also criticized the Congress and Majlis alliance, alleging that both parties are "staging dramas" together to mislead the public. Sanjay highlighted corruption concerns in major projects such

as the Kaleshwaram irrigation scheme, stating that the Congress government lacks the courage to conduct proper investigations. "The people will make their judgment in the next elections. Congress will face the consequences for its failures," he added.

Sanjay's statements underscore the intensifying political tension in Telangana ahead of upcoming polls. By

highlighting delays in welfare schemes, administrative failures, and alleged corruption, the BJP is positioning itself as a vocal critic of the ruling Congress government. The focus on the Rythu Bharosa Scheme, a key farmer welfare initiative, highlights the party's strategy of holding the government accountable for unfulfilled promises and attempting to galvanize public opinion on

issues directly affecting livelihoods.

The minister concluded by urging immediate action from the government and signaling that the BJP is prepared to escalate its response if the pending funds are not released without further delay, emphasizing the importance of fulfilling commitments made to farmers.

AKBARUDDIN OWAISI LASHED OUT AT REVANTH



AIMIM floor leader Akbaruddin Owaisi has sharply criticized both the BJP and the Congress, claiming that the two parties show no difference in their treatment of Muslims and accusing them of targeting the community under the pretext of demolition drives. Speaking in Hyderabad, Owaisi stated, "There is no real difference

between the BJP and the Congress. In Uttar Pradesh, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath demolishes dargahs, mosques, and Muslim homes, and in Telangana, Chief Minister Revanth Reddy follows the same pattern with equal severity. Their opposition is not to illegal encroachments but to Muslims themselves."

Owaisi alleged that the demolition campaigns are not general measures to curb unlawful encroachments but are selectively targeting properties owned by Muslims. The remarks mark a strong break from previous positions, as AIMIM had historically supported the Congress government, including backing in recent Jubilee

Hills Assembly by-elections and various local body polls. Despite this political alliance, the party has now openly opposed the state government over what it views as discriminatory actions.

Highlighting local cases, Owaisi pointed to incidents in Hyderabad, where residents of Madhu Park Ridge Apartments expressed fears

of displacement due to the proposed Musi River Front project. Telangana BJP President N Ramchander Rao visited the site under the "Musi Gosa - BJP Bharosa" initiative and interacted with affected families, many of whom were distressed and fearful of losing their homes. Rao criticized the state government, suggesting that the project's alignment with the Gandhi statue construction could result in widespread demolition. He emphasized that several ex-servicemen were among the residents, calling the situation "shameful" and vowing support to those threatened.

The controversy comes amid broader political tensions in Telangana, where both the BJP and Congress have been accused of prioritizing political gains over community welfare. Owaisi's comments have heightened scrutiny on demolition drives, particularly in minority-dominated areas, and are likely to influence public opinion ahead of upcoming local and state elections. Observers note that the criticism reflects increasing pressure on state authorities to ensure that urban development projects are implemented without bias and with adequate safeguards for vulnerable communities.

The situation underscores the political and social sensitivities surrounding urban redevelopment in Hyderabad, particularly as minority communities voice concerns over equity, safety, and preservation of heritage sites.

KPHB Housing Board Auction Sets New Record in Hyderabad Real Estate Market

Hyderabad, Telangana

A recent auction conducted by the Housing Board in Hyderabad has created a buzz in the real estate sector after land prices touched a record high in the Kukatpally Housing Board Colony (KPHB). The auction witnessed intense bidding, with the price per square yard soaring to ₹2.65 lakh, marking one of the highest rates ever recorded in the locality.

The Housing Board had fixed the upset price at ₹1.30 lakh per square yard for open plots. However, strong competition among bidders drove the prices sharply upward. Officials stated that the ₹2.65 lakh per square yard mark is the highest ever achieved in the area, reflecting the growing demand for premium residential property in KPHB.

A total of 40 bidders participated in the auction, leading to fierce competition for both plots and flats. In particular, four open plots located in Phase 1 and Phase 2's Dharam Reddy Colony attracted significant interest. With limited plots available, bidders were willing to offer premium prices, underlining the area's investment appeal.

Apart from open plots, eight flats in Sampurnam



Apartment in Phase 15 were also auctioned. A 1,400 square feet flat fetched a maximum price of ₹1.10 crore. The upset price for these flats had been fixed at ₹90 lakh, but competitive bidding pushed the final prices well above the base rate. Notably, all flats were sold at prices exceeding their respective upset prices.

Through this auction, the Housing Board generated to-

tal revenue of ₹24.26 crore. Officials described the outcome as a major boost to government revenues and a clear indication of sustained demand in Hyderabad's real estate market.

Real estate experts attribute the sharp rise in prices to KPHB's well-developed infrastructure and strategic location. The area offers excellent connectivity through metro rail services and ma-

major road networks. Additionally, reputed educational institutions, hospitals, shopping malls, and commercial hubs are located nearby, making it a preferred residential destination.

KPHB Colony has long been considered one of Hyderabad's most developed and sought-after neighborhoods. With rapid urban expansion and rising property values across the city, inves-

tors continue to show keen interest in established areas with strong civic amenities.

Market observers believe that if such auctions continue in the future, land prices in KPHB and surrounding areas could rise further. The latest auction has once again highlighted the robust demand for quality residential property in Hyderabad and reinforced KPHB's position as a prime real estate hotspot.

Flyover Construction Begins at Road No. 2; Traffic Restrictions Imposed



Hyderabad, Telangana - Friday

Construction of a new flyover at Road No. 2 near the Park Hyatt Hyderabad has commenced as part of the ambitious H-CITI infrastructure initiative. The project is being executed by Megha Engineering and Infrastructures Limited. Following the launch of works, traffic restrictions have been imposed in several stretches starting Friday.

C V Anand, Commission-

er of Police, Hyderabad, inspected the construction site along with Joel Davis, Joint Commissioner of Police (Traffic), and representatives of the construction firm. Speaking to the media, the CP stated that the flyover is part of the H-CITI (Hyderabad City Innovative and Transformative Infrastructure) project.

He explained that under H-CITI, seven flyovers and seven underpasses are being

constructed around Kasu Brahmananda Reddy National Park (KBR Park) to ease congestion and make key arterial roads signal-free. The works officially began on Friday, and authorities have planned to complete the construction within two years.

The CP noted that traffic advisories had already been issued to motorists. Efforts have been made to minimize inconvenience to the public,

and construction agencies have been requested to carry out most of the work during night hours. He added that traffic restrictions may be revised once basement works are completed. Upon completion of all seven flyovers and seven underpasses, the surrounding corridors are expected to become signal-free, significantly reducing travel time.

Meanwhile, Traffic Joint CP Joel Davis stated that

construction of the underpasses has also commenced simultaneously. He confirmed that traffic diversions have been implemented keeping public safety in mind.

According to the advisory, vehicles traveling from Panjagutta towards Jubilee Hills Check Post are advised to take alternate routes via Srinagar Colony and Indira Nagar Basti. Motorists heading from Masab Tank towards Jubilee Hills via KBR Park are suggested to use Road No. 45.

Officials clarified that pillar construction works will continue for nearly two and a half months on Banjara Hills Road No. 2, during which some traffic congestion is expected. Diversions may be adjusted depending on ground conditions. Commuters have been urged to plan their travel accordingly, especially during peak hours, and to cooperate with traffic police personnel.

Authorities expressed confidence that once completed, the project will significantly improve traffic flow and enhance urban mobility in one of Hyderabad's busiest corridors.

Young Man Survives Attempted Murder Over Love Marriage in Yadadri Bhuvanagiri



Yadadri Bhuvanagiri - Friday

A young man narrowly escaped death after an alleged premeditated attack reportedly linked to a love marriage dispute in Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district. The victim, identified as Ajay from Neredmet, Hyderabad, is currently undergoing treatment at Gandhi Hospital in critical condition.

According to police sources, Ajay had been in a relationship with a young woman from Ramalingampally for some time, and the couple recently got married three days ago. The attack is believed to have been orchestrated by the woman's brother, who was reportedly angered by the marriage.

Police reports suggest that on Wednesday, the woman's brother sent a message to Ajay via her phone, asking him to come to Ramalingampally. Believing that the call was from his wife, Ajay went to the outskirts of the village, where he was ambushed.

Eyewitnesses and preliminary investigations indicate that the attackers used chilli powder to temporarily blind Ajay before launching a brutal assault with knives. The victim was reportedly stabbed 14 times. Believing he had died, the assailants fled the scene.

Local police, alerted to the incident, arrived at the site shortly afterward and found Ajay se-

verely injured and unconscious. He was immediately transferred to Gandhi Hospital, where doctors reported that his condition remains critical. Authorities confirmed that his injuries were life-threatening and that he is receiving intensive medical care.

The Hyderabad Police have registered a case and launched a search operation to trace and apprehend the accused. Investigators are examining CCTV footage from surrounding areas, collecting witness statements, and coordinating with local patrol units to ensure swift action.

This incident highlights the increasing risk of violent escalation in disputes over personal relationships and marriages in the region. Police officials have urged community members to assist with information regarding the suspects and emphasized that legal channels must be used to resolve conflicts, rather than resorting to violence.

Authorities have assured that the assailants will be brought to justice, while also increasing security around the victim's family to prevent further incidents.

The investigation is ongoing, and Ajay continues to fight for his life as authorities work to apprehend those responsible for the attack.

BJP Flags Poor Quality in Double Bedroom Housing Scheme in Qutbullapur



Qutbullapur - February 27

Leaders of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) conducted a surprise inspection of ongoing Double Bedroom Housing Scheme constructions in Bourampet and Gagillapur villages under Duddigal Circle, raising serious concerns about construction quality and safety.

The inspection was led by Duddigal Circle BJP president Pisari Krishna Reddy, along with district in-charge president Dr. S. Mallareddy, and other BJP leaders from the three divisions in the circle. The team alleged that contractors were using sand superficially for display purposes, while the actual work relied on dust or rubble-like material. At Survey Number 214 in Gagillapur, the inspectors observed that the plastering work contained almost no sand. When questioned, masons admitted that dust was being used for plastering, raising serious doubts about the durability and safety of the houses.

Local residents voiced strong concerns, noting that earlier houses built under the same scheme in Duddigal and Gandhi Maisamma had already faced structural issues. During the rainy season, walls of two- and three-story buildings reportedly developed cracks, and in some cases, collapsed. Benefi-

ciaries expressed frustration, saying, "We feel like we are living in shacks rather than proper homes."

BJP leaders questioned who would take responsibility if these substandard constructions led to injuries or loss of life. They warned against putting citizens' safety at risk for the financial gain of contractors and ruling party officials. The leaders demanded that senior authorities conduct a thorough investigation, cancel contracts of low-quality builders, and reassign the projects to reputable contractors capable of delivering durable and safe housing.

The inspection saw participation from senior BJP leaders including A. Mallesh Yadav, Dasari Shyam Rao, Embari Anjaneyulu, Dhammagari Prabhakar Reddy, Narasimha Chari, Turai Bhanu Goud, Nadikattu Roja, Venkatesh Nayak, Bal Reddy, and youth leaders including Akula Vijay, Namala Srikant, Raj Kumar, Akula Yashwant Patel, Chinna Mudiraj, and Naveen Mudiraj.

The inspection highlights growing public concerns about the quality of government housing projects in Telangana, raising questions about contractor accountability and the need for urgent corrective measures to protect beneficiaries from potential hazards.

BEE Gears Up to Celebrate 25th Foundation Day; LED Streetlight Programme Saves ₹5,400 Crore

Hyderabad, February 27:

The Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE), under the Ministry of Power, is set to mark its 25th Foundation Day with a grand national event in New Delhi on March 1, 2026. The celebration will bring together State Designated Agencies (SDAs) from across India, including active participation from Andhra Pradesh and Telangana.

Established in 2001 under the Energy Conservation Act, BEE has been at the forefront of India's energy-efficiency movement, promoting sustainable development and green economic growth. Reviewing the arrangements for the event, Shri K.C. Panigrahy, Director General of BEE, announced that Hon'ble Union Minister Shri Manohar Lal Khattar will grace the occasion as Chief Guest, delivering the keynote address. Shri Shripad Naik, Minister of State for Power and New & Renewable Energy, and Pankaj Agarwal, Secretary, Ministry of Power, will attend as Guest of Honour.

Boong and the Memory of a Vanishing Town: How a Small Manipuri Film Reached the Global Stage

The global success of *Boong* is not just a cinematic achievement—it is a cultural moment that has brought long-overlooked stories from India's northeast into international focus. Its recognition at the BAFTA Awards marks a turning point, signaling that deeply local narratives can resonate across borders when told with sincerity and emotional depth.

At its heart, *Boong* is a coming-of-age story seen through the eyes of a young boy navigating a fragile world. His simple wish—to reunite his broken family—drives the narrative forward. Yet beneath this seemingly straightforward journey lies a complex exploration of identity, loss, and belonging. The child's innocence becomes a lens through which audiences witness the subtle yet profound impact of socio-political realities on everyday life.

The film is set in Manipur, a region rich in culture but often marginalized in mainstream discourse. By placing this setting at the center of its story, *Boong* challenges the invisibility that has long surrounded the northeast in Indian cinema. Instead of presenting the region through stereotypes or conflict-driven headlines, the film offers a nuanced portrayal of its people, traditions, and emotional landscapes.

What makes *Boong* particularly powerful is its restraint. It avoids dramatic exaggeration and instead embraces quiet storytelling. Moments of silence, everyday interactions, and small gestures carry significant emotional weight. This understated approach allows the audience to engage deeply with the characters and their world, making the narrative feel authentic and immersive.

The town depicted in the film is more than just a backdrop—it is almost a character in itself. Gauhati High Court Seeks Assam CM's Response Over 'Miya' Remarks

The development marks a significant legal turn in an ongoing political and social debate that has drawn national attention.

The court's notice came after a plea alleged that the Chief Minister's statements were discriminatory and amounted to hate speech directed at a particular community. The petitioners have argued that such remarks could deepen divisions and undermine communal harmony in the state. They have sought legal action, including appropriate directions from the court to address the issue.

The controversy stems from statements made by Sarma in recent months during public addresses and political discourse. His use of the term "Miya," which has historically been associated with Bengali-origin Muslims in Assam, triggered criticism from opposi-

tion parties, activists, and civil society groups. Critics contend that the term, in the context it was used, carries derogatory connotations and reinforces social stigma.

On the other hand, Sarma has defended his remarks, maintaining that the term is not unconstitutional and has been used historically within certain communities. He has also argued that his comments were being misinterpreted for political purposes. The issue has since evolved into a broader debate over language, identity, and freedom of expression in Assam's politically sensitive environment.

The matter had earlier reached the Supreme Court of India, where petitioners sought immediate intervention and legal action against the Chief Minister. However, the apex court declined to entertain the plea directly and advised the petitioners to approach the appropriate high court. Following this direction, the case was brought before the Gauhati High Court, which has now formally taken cognisance

and sought a response from Sarma.

Legal experts note that the case could have wider implications for how political speech is interpreted under Indian law, particularly in relation to hate speech and constitutional protections. The court's eventual ruling may help clarify the boundaries between free expression and statements that could be deemed harmful or divisive.

The timing of the controversy is also politically significant, as Assam is heading toward a crucial electoral cycle. Political observers believe that such issues may influence public discourse and electoral narratives in the state.

For now, the High Court's notice signals the beginning of judicial scrutiny into the matter. The Chief Minister is expected to present his response in due course, after which the court will decide the next steps. The proceedings are likely to be closely watched, given their potential impact on both legal precedent and the state's political landscape.

Ministers, Academics Rally Behind PM Modi's Call for Decolonising India's Mindset

A growing chorus of Union ministers, scholars, and public intellectuals has endorsed Prime Minister Narendra Modi's renewed push for "decolonisation" of India's intellectual and cultural frameworks, arguing that the country must shed lingering colonial influences to fully realise its civilisational identity.

The call, made recently by Modi, emphasises the need to revisit how history, education, and governance have been shaped by colonial-era thinking. According to supporters, many of India's institutions and narratives still reflect perspectives imposed during British rule, which may not align with indigenous traditions and knowledge systems.

Union ministers strongly backed the Prime Minister's vision, highlighting that decolonisation is not merely symbolic but necessary for policy-making and nation-building. They argued that reclaiming India's intellectual sovereignty would help create systems rooted in local realities rather than inherited Western frameworks. This includes re-examining textbooks, legal structures, and academic



discourse.

Academics participating in discussions on the subject noted that colonial influence persists in disciplines such as history, sociology, and political science. They pointed out that many curricula continue to prioritise Eurocentric interpretations, often sidelining India's own intellectual traditions. For them, decolonisation involves not just rewriting history but also restoring balance by incorporating indigenous perspectives, regional histories, and traditional knowledge.

Some scholars stressed that this process must be rigorous and evidence-based rather

than ideological. They cautioned against replacing one form of bias with another, urging that academic freedom and critical inquiry remain central to any effort at reform. The aim, they said, should be to expand understanding rather than narrow it.

Supporters also linked the decolonisation initiative to broader cultural confidence. They argued that a nation's progress is closely tied to how it perceives itself, and that rediscovering India's historical achievements in science, philosophy, and governance could inspire future generations. In this context, the push

aligns with efforts to promote Indian languages, traditional practices, and local knowledge systems.

At the same time, the conversation has sparked debate. Critics have raised concerns about the potential politicisation of education and the rewriting of history. They argue that while revisiting colonial narratives is valid, it must not come at the cost of historical accuracy or pluralism. Ensuring diverse viewpoints, they say, is essential in a country as complex as India.

Despite differing perspectives, there is broad agreement that colonial legacies continue to shape modern India in subtle ways. Whether in legal codes, institutional structures, or academic frameworks, these influences are deeply embedded. The current push for decolonisation has therefore opened up a wider national conversation about identity, knowledge, and the direction of future reforms.

As the debate evolves, the challenge lies in balancing pride in India's heritage with a commitment to inclusivity, critical thinking, and global engagement.

Jagdeep Dhankhar Breaks Silence on Resignation, Says He Was 'Prioritising Health'



Former Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar has addressed speculation surrounding his sudden resignation, stating that his decision was driven by the need to prioritise his health rather than any external pressure.

Clarifying his stance, Dhankhar said he never claimed to be seriously "unwell" but chose to step down as a precaution to maintain his overall well-being. He emphasised that focusing on health was a responsible decision, especially while holding a demanding constitutional position.

Dhankhar resigned from the post of Vice President in July 2025, submitting his resignation to Droupadi Murmu. The move came as a surprise and sparked widespread political discussion, with many questioning the reasons behind his abrupt departure.

Responding to these doubts, Dhankhar reiterat-

ed that there was no hidden agenda behind his decision. He stressed that high constitutional offices require sustained physical and mental fitness, and stepping aside when necessary should be seen as a responsible act rather than a matter of controversy.

During his tenure, Dhankhar also served as Chairman of the Rajya Sabha, where he was actively involved in managing parliamentary proceedings. His time in office was marked by strong participation in debates and efforts to ensure discipline in the House.

At the time of his resignation, there had been reports of health-related concerns, though no detailed information was officially disclosed. His recent remarks aim to put an end to speculation by clearly stating that his decision was personal and based on medical advice

and self-assessment.

Following his resignation, the constitutional process to elect a new Vice President was initiated to ensure continuity in governance. The position, which plays a crucial role in India's parliamentary system, requires stability and consistent leadership.

Dhankhar's statement highlights the importance of balancing public responsibilities with personal well-being. He suggested that acknowledging health needs and acting accordingly is essential for anyone in a position of responsibility.

His clarification is likely to settle ongoing debates and provide closure to questions surrounding his exit. At the same time, the episode stands out as a rare instance of a mid-term resignation from one of India's highest constitutional offices, drawing attention to the pressures associated with such roles.

Justice Ajai Lamba Resigns as Manipur Probe Chief, B.S. Chauhan to Take Over

In a key development in the investigation into violence in Manipur, Ajai Lamba has resigned as the chairperson of the inquiry commission probing the unrest. The Union government has appointed former Supreme Court judge B. S. Chauhan as his successor.

Justice Lamba, who previously served as Chief Justice of the Gauhati High Court, had been leading the commission since its formation in June 2023. His resignation will take effect at the end of February. However, no official reason has been publicly disclosed for his decision to step down.

The commission was established by the central government to examine the causes and course of the ethnic violence that broke out in Manipur in May 2023. The clashes, primarily involving different communities in the state, resulted in significant loss of life, widespread destruction, and the displacement of thousands of people.

Following Lamba's resignation, Justice Chauhan will take charge of the panel from



early March. His appointment has been made to ensure continuity in the investigation. With his experience as a judge of the Supreme Court, he is expected to guide the inquiry through its next phase without altering its scope or objectives.

The commission includes other members who will continue their roles, ensuring that the transition in leadership does not disrupt the ongoing investigation. The panel has been working to collect evidence, record testimonies, and review official responses to

the crisis.

Its mandate includes identifying the sequence of events that led to the outbreak of violence, assessing whether there were any lapses or failures on the part of authorities, and evaluating the adequacy of measures taken to control the situation. The commission is also tasked with examining complaints submitted by individuals and groups affected by the unrest.

The violence in Manipur has been one of the most serious internal security challenges faced by the state in recent

years. The scale of the crisis, along with its complex social and political dimensions, has made the investigation particularly demanding.

Due to the extent of the violence and the volume of evidence to be reviewed, the commission has required additional time to complete its work. Deadlines for submitting its report have been extended to allow for a thorough and comprehensive inquiry.

Justice Chauhan's appointment is seen as an effort to maintain momentum and ensure that the investigation proceeds without delay. The findings of the commission are expected to play a crucial role in determining accountability and shaping future policy responses.

As the inquiry continues under new leadership, there is significant public interest in its outcome, especially among those directly affected by the violence. The final report is anticipated to provide clarity on the events and contribute to efforts aimed at restoring stability and preventing similar incidents in the future.

US Urges Embassy Staff to Leave Israel Amid Escalating Iran Tensions



Amid rising tensions in the Middle East, the United States has advised its embassy personnel in Israel to consider leaving the country immediately, signaling growing concern over a possible escalation involving Iran.

The warning was delivered by US Ambassador Mike Huckabee, who issued a direct message to embassy staff urging those considering departure to act without delay. The communication emphasized urgency, advising personnel that if they were planning to leave under authorized conditions, they should do so "today," reflecting uncertainty about how long current travel options may remain available.

Officials indicated that while commercial flights are still operating, the situation could change rapidly. There is concern that air travel could be disrupted if tensions escalate further, making immediate departure a safer

option for those wishing to leave. The advisory is seen as a precautionary move rather than a response to a specific imminent threat, but it underscores how volatile the situation has become.

This development comes as relations between Washington and Tehran continue to deteriorate. Diplomatic efforts aimed at addressing concerns over Iran's nuclear program have stalled, increasing fears of a broader confrontation. While no direct military action has been announced, the lack of progress in negotiations has contributed to heightened anxiety across the region.

In parallel, the United States has increased its military readiness in the Middle East. Reports suggest that additional assets, including aircraft and naval forces, have been positioned strategically to respond quickly

if needed. This buildup is widely interpreted as both a deterrent and a preparation for potential conflict, further intensifying the already tense atmosphere.

The advisory to embassy staff is part of a wider strategy to safeguard American personnel. Non-essential staff and family members have already been authorized to leave, a step typically taken when there is a credible risk of instability. Similar precautions have been observed in other parts of the region, indicating a broader reassessment of security conditions.

The situation has also prompted reactions from other countries, some of which have issued travel warnings or advised their citizens to avoid certain areas. Airlines have begun reviewing their operations, and there are concerns that flight cancellations or route changes could complicate travel plans if the

crisis deepens.

Despite the rising tensions, diplomatic channels have not been completely shut down. There are indications that indirect discussions are still ongoing, although no significant breakthroughs have been reported. For now, both diplomatic and military tracks appear to be moving simultaneously, reflecting the complexity of the situation.

Overall, the US directive to its embassy staff highlights the fragile nature of the current geopolitical climate in the Middle East. While it does not confirm that conflict is imminent, it clearly indicates that the risks are increasing and that conditions could change rapidly. The emphasis on immediate action suggests that authorities are prioritizing preparedness and caution in the face of uncertainty.

US Deploys F-22 Raptors to Israel for First Time Amid Iran Tensions



In a significant military development, the United States has deployed its advanced F-22 Raptor fighter jets to Israel for the first time, as tensions with Iran continue to rise.

The deployment marks a notable shift in US military strategy in the Middle East. These stealth combat aircraft have reportedly been stationed at Israeli air bases as part of preparations for a potential conflict scenario. The move is intended to strengthen both American and Israeli defense capabilities against possible threats and retaliation.

tioning its most sophisticated fighter jets close to Iran, the United States is sending a clear message aimed at discouraging aggressive actions and maintaining strategic balance.

Pakistan Declares 'Open War', Launches Strikes on Kabul and Kandahar

Pakistani forces reportedly targeted multiple sites believed to be linked to the Taliban. These included military headquarters, weapons storage facilities, and logistical bases. Officials in Pakistan stated that the strikes caused significant damage to Taliban infrastructure, describing the operation as a decisive response to escalating threats.

source of friction between the two countries. Islamabad maintains that its latest strikes are aimed at neutralizing such threats and ensuring national security.

Afghanistan, however, has strongly condemned the airstrikes, calling them a violation of its sovereignty. Afghan officials argue that their own actions were defensive in nature, taken in response to earlier aggression. They have also alleged that the strikes affected not only military targets but also civilian areas, raising concerns about collateral damage.

Reports from the affected regions indicate widespread panic among civilians, particularly in Kabul, where explosions were heard in multiple areas. Casualty figures remain unclear, with both sides presenting differing accounts. Pakistan claims to have inflicted heavy losses on Taliban forces, while Afghan sources suggest that their countermeasures have also caused damage to Pakistani positions.

The escalation follows weeks of mounting tension along the border, including intermittent clashes, airstrikes, and militant activity. What initially appeared to be isolated incidents has now evolved into a broader and more dangerous confrontation.

SIFs and Category III AIFs Serve Distinct Roles in Evolving Investment Landscape

On the other hand, Category III AIFs cater primarily to high-net-worth individuals and institutional investors. These funds employ complex and often aggressive strategies aimed at generating absolute returns, including leveraging, short-selling, and dynamic portfolio allocation. They can invest across asset classes such as equities, debt instruments, and structured

products, making them more versatile but also inherently riskier. Fund managers emphasize that the choice between SIFs and Category III AIFs should not be viewed as an either-or decision. Instead, both serve distinct purposes within a diversified portfolio. SIFs are positioned as a more accessible entry point into advanced investment strategies, offering a bal-

ance between risk and regulatory oversight. In contrast, Category III AIFs provide seasoned investors with opportunities to pursue higher returns through sophisticated and often less constrained approaches.

The growing popularity of Category III AIFs reflects increasing investor appetite for strategies that can hedge against market volatility. Data indicates

strong inflows into these funds, driven by investors seeking diversification beyond traditional equity and debt products.

Meanwhile, SIFs are gaining traction as a democratizing force in the investment landscape, enabling a broader segment of investors to access strategies previously reserved for ultra-wealthy individuals. Industry experts believe this new category could reshape how investors allocate capital, particularly in volatile or uncertain market conditions.

Ultimately, both SIFs and Category III AIFs are expected to coexist and grow, each fulfilling a unique role. While SIFs offer accessibility and structured flexibility, AIFs deliver depth and sophistication. Together, they expand the spectrum of investment options available, helping investors better align their portfolios with their financial goals and risk tolerance.

Bharat Biotech Considers \$500 Million IPO to Fuel Expansion Plans

Hyderabad-based vaccine manufacturer Bharat Biotech is reportedly evaluating plans to launch an initial public offering (IPO) that could raise over \$500 million, marking a potential entry into the public markets.

from Abhishek's natural attacking style. Because the young opener hits the ball with such power and timing, it can sometimes give the impression of uncontrolled aggression. In reality, Ashwin argued, his strokeplay is based on sound fundamentals rather than mere brute force.

At the same time, Ashwin did acknowledge an area where Abhishek could improve. He noted

that the batter sometimes tries to attack every delivery, especially when under pressure to score runs. This tendency, he suggested, can be refined with experience and better game awareness.

The timing of Ashwin's defence is significant. Abhishek recently silenced critics with a match-winning knock against Zimbabwe, scoring a quickfire 55 off 30

balls. The innings marked a turning point in his campaign after a disappointing start and played a key role in keeping India's semi-final hopes alive.

The episode reflects the intense scrutiny young players face on the international stage, particularly during high-profile tournaments. It also underscores the ongoing rivalry between Indian and Pakistani cricketing voices, where comments often spark strong reactions across borders.

For Abhishek Sharma, the support from a senior figure like Ashwin could prove crucial. As the tournament progresses, his ability to balance aggression with composure will be closely watched, especially after turning early criticism into a statement performance.

With form regained and backing from experienced players, the young opener now has an opportunity to further establish himself as a key part of India's T20 setup.

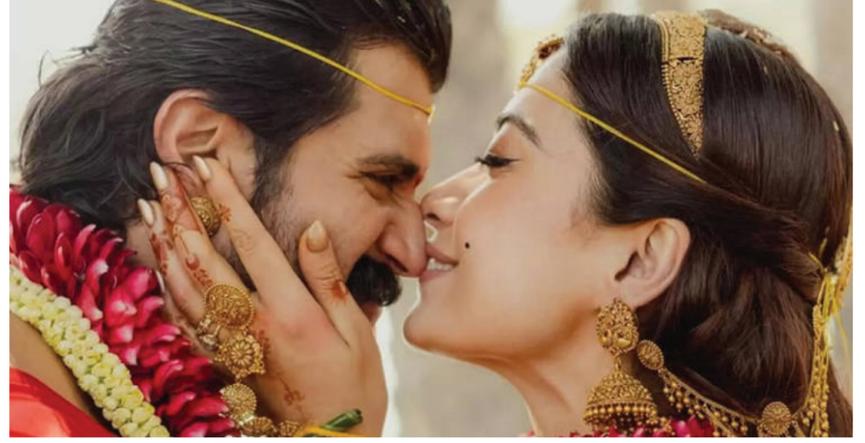

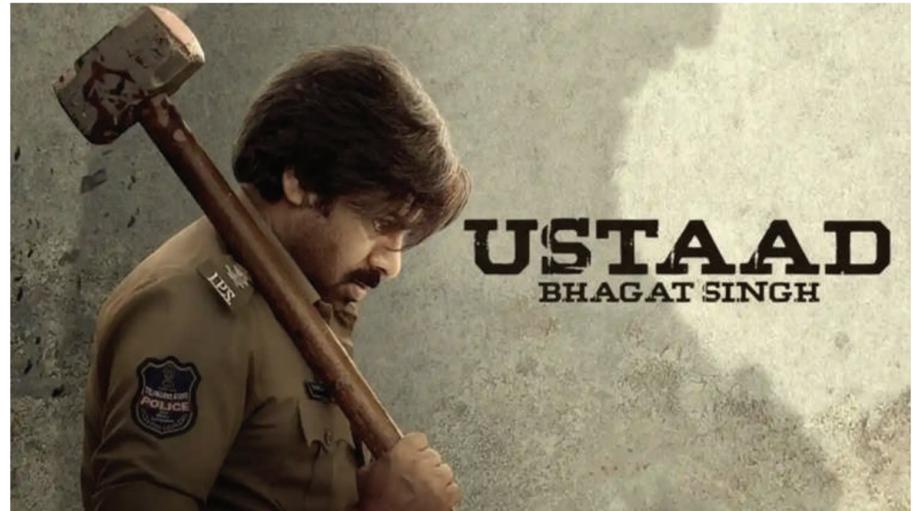
