

Government Assures Full Support and Remunerative Prices to Tobacco Farmers

Nellore, May 31 | TPN Bureau

State Endowments Minister AnamRamanarayana Reddy assured tobacco farmers that the government prioritises their issues and will secure remunerative prices. Farmers met the Minister at his Nellore camp office to submit a petition highlighting severe losses from slowed purchases and falling auction prices. Cultivation spans 45,000 acres in the district, support-

ing 4,000 farmers who saw prices drop from last year's Rs 280-360 per kilo to Rs 190 at DCPally and Kaligirice nteres. The Minister telephoned District Collector Himanshu Shukla to resolve warehouse shortages and prevent unfair treatment. He stated that Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu has written to Union Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu on Commerce and Finance Ministers regarding the crisis. A comprehensive meeting with farmer representa-



tives, Tobacco Board officials, and public representatives will be held soon to address the situation. Agriculture Minister Kinjarapu Atchannaaidu, Energy Minister Gottipati Ravi Kumar, and Minister DolaBalaveeranjaneyaswamy have already brought this critical issue to the Chief Minister's attention.

TNSF Protests YCP's False Allegations Against Mega DSC

Telugu Nadu Students Federation (TNSF) staged a protest at Kotireddy Circle, burning an effigy of Jaganmohan Reddy to condemn YCP allegations against the Mega DSC recruitment process. TNSF District President Bojjatirumalesh, State General Secretary RevuriVenugopal, and Unemployed JAC Convener Sheikh Siddique maintained that the 16,000-post recruitment was conducted with full transparency under the direction of Minister

Nara Lokesh following Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu's initial sign-off. Leaders argued that YCP's allegations, made months after the transparent, online examination process, aim to unjustly damage the reputation of the appointed teachers. TNSF warned of intensified statewide agitations alongside unemployed youth if the allegations are not immediately withdrawn. PawanKalyan Spearheads Rs 100 Crore Swachh Godavari Initiative- MLA Arani

MLA AraniSrinivasulu announced that Deputy Chief Minister PawanKalyan is actively working to make the Godavari river completely pollution-free. Speaking to the media at his office on Sunday evening, the MLA revealed that Rs 100 crore has been allocated to prevent waste from panchayats, industries, and the aqua sector from mixing into the river ahead of the Godavari Pushkaras in June 2027. Under the instructions of PawanKalyan, officials have identified vulnerable zones, installed CCTV cameras, and established dedica-



ated control rooms operating like Real-Time Governance Society (RTGS) systems to stop sewage from 262 catchment panchayats and municipal limits from entering the water.
