Mudigubba Land Removed from Prohibited List: Collector Shyam Prasad

A long-pending issue affecting 250 families in Mudigubba mandal center was resolved through the initiative of Dharmavaram TDP in-charge Paritala Sriram. District Collector Shyam Prasad issued orders removing 3.28 acres of land under survey number 905-A in Gunjapalli field from the 22-A prohibited list during the 'One Month-One Constituency-Four Visits' program held at the Dharmavaram RDO office on Friday. Sriram stated that the program provides permanent solutions, reduces court disputes, and increases citizen trust. Additionally, responding to local water scarcity grievances brought by the residents, Sriram directed the Mudigubba MPDO and RWS Engineer to resolve the water problem immediately. Devastating Fire Destroys Temple Guard's House

A devastating fire broke out in a house at Water House Colony on Friday, leaving a poor family completely homeless. The house belonged to Selvi, who works as a security guard at the Srikalahasti temple. No one was present inside the residence when the accident occurred. Thick smoke and flames suddenly erupted from the house, spreading rapidly before locals could intervene. An electrical short circuit is suspected to be the cause of the fire. The mishap destroyed all furniture, clothes, household appliances, and vital documents. Tragically, the cash and jewelry saved by Selvi for her daughter's wedding-including Rs 1 lakh in cash, half a kilo of silver, and five sovereigns of gold-were entirely reduced to ashes. While no loss of life occurred, the locals have requested the government and temple authorities to support the displaced family. The police have registered a case.

Elaborate Arrangements Underway for CM's Kurnool Visit: Collector Siri

Alongside Pattikonda MLA KE Shyam Babu and District SP Vikrant Patil, the Collector inspected the helipad, mining viewpoint, processing plant, and public meeting venue at the Geo Mysore Gold Mines Plant in Jonnagiri, Pattikonda constituency. Siri directed all departments to coordinate seamlessly to provide basic amenities like transportation, drinking water, and



food for the attendees. The Jonnagiri Gold Mine is a pioneering private-sector project processing 1,000 tons of ore daily, yielding around 30 kilograms of gold annually, with expansion underway. by the current government. The mine currently employs hundreds and aims to create up to 1,000 jobs for local youth, driving regional economic growth. Collector Explains PMDS Model Benefits for Drought Resilience

District Collector Shyam Prasad described the 'Pelitised PMDS' (Pre-Monsoon Dry Sowing) model as an excellent solution for farmers to ensure sustainable yields despite climate change and El-Niño effects. He attended a dry sowing demonstration on Friday in Basampalli village, Chenn ekothapalli mandal, hosted by farmer C. Srinivasulu. Organized under the leadership of CT&IO and DPM Lakshma Nayak, the event saw the Collector actively participate in preparing seed pellets. Prasad assured farmers that this innovative approach enables seeds to germinate safely even during harsh droughts. The demo utilized about 25 biodi-



versity seed variants alongside major crops like castor oil, anumula, kandu, sajjia, alasandalu, and goruchikkudu. The process involved treating seeds with 'beejam-rutham', encasing them in clay, solid bio-ambrosia, and ash to create pellets, which were subsequently mixed with additional bio-ambrosia and sown.
