

Minister Anam Distributes NTR Bharosa Pensions

Minister AnamRaman araryana Reddy distributed NTR Bharosa social pensions in a festive atmosphere across Marripaduman dal's DC Palli village. Going directly to the houses of the beneficiaries, the Minister enquired about their welfare and personally handed over the amounts. Speaking on the occasion, Minister AnamR amanarayana Reddy stated that a state-wide



pension festival is being celebrated on the 1st of every month. Across the state, 62,47,538 beneficiaries are receiving pensions. In Nellore district, a

distribution program of Rs. 128 crore 30 lakh 21 thousand is underway for 2,90,009 beneficiaries. Furthermore, pensions worth Rs. 16 crore 22 lakh 81 thou-

sand 500 are allocated to 36,354 beneficiaries in Atmakuru constituency, while Rs. 16 lakh 29 thousand 500 are being given to 376 beneficiaries in DC Pallimandal. He emphasized that public representatives and the government machinery will visit houses every month to stand by the poor. The Minister noted that beneficiaries expressed full satisfaction with this initiative. Minister Anam Ramanarayana Reddy led the distribution program.

tions are underway alongside canal construction. Kishore Gunukula affirmed that Jana Sena works continuously to solve public

issues with the support of Deputy Chief Minister PawanKalyan and Municipal Administration Minister Ponguru Narayana.

Collector to Conduct Village Visit in Kullur

AP Number 1 in Country with NTR Bharosa Pension Scheme

ately, while shops hitting the 25-year mark must renew leases under the new government order or face legal action. Operation Clean Sweep Launched in Tirupati
