

Alipiri Temporary Shops Removed for Devotee Safety and Traffic Convenience

Tirupati, June 02 | TPN Bureau

District Collector S. Venkateswar met with local shopkeepers who lost their livelihoods due to the recent removal of temporary shops in the Alipiri area. The collector explained that Alipiri, serving as the main gateway to Tirumala, faces immense traffic congestion and crowding from lakhs of visiting devotees. The situation is further complicated by the presence of a pedestrian luggage counter and heavy traffic heading towards local educational and medical institutions.



Furthermore, safety concerns have escalated due to frequent road accidents and the rising movement of wildlife from the adjacent forest area, including recent leopard sightings near S.V. University. Following joint discussions, the forest, police, municipal corporation, and revenue departments decided to remove these roadside encroachments to

prevent mishaps. However, the collector assured the victims that the district administration would sympathetically examine their issues and work toward providing alternative employment opportunities. District Collector S. Venkateswar assured that justice would be done to the affected shopkeepers through alternative arrangements.

Kurnool Municipal Corporation Orders Shop Auctions, Encroachment Removal

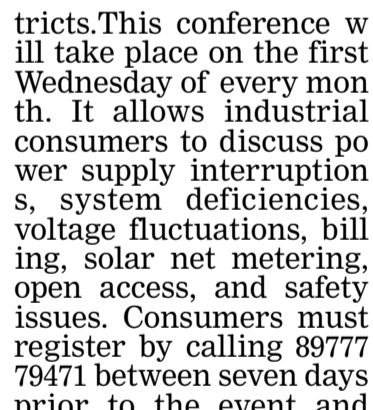
