

Minister Narayana Expresses Deep Condolences Over Death of Nellore Residents

A wave of grief swept through Nellore district following a horrific road accident in Bihar that claimed the lives of three local pilgrims. The victims were on a pilgrimage tour when the mishap occurred. Upon receiving the tragic news, Andhra Pradesh Municipal Administration and Urban Development Minister Narayana



responded immediately. Expressing profound shock and grief, Narayana extended

his deepest condolences to the bereaved families, stating that losing lives during a sacred journey is immensely painful. The minister swiftly initiated emergency consultations with high-ranking Bihar state officials, Andhra Pradesh authorities, and the local district administration to assess the situation and expedite necessary procedures. Narayana assured that the state government stands

firmly by the grieving families and will provide all possible support during this difficult time. Arrangements are underway to assist the affected families and facilitate the return of the victims. Municipal Administration and Urban Development Minister Narayana reconfirmed that every logistical and financial aid will be extended to the kin of the deceased.

Special Flight to Evacuate Victims of Bihar Bus Crash - Minister Anam

Three pilgrims from Nellore district died and 15 others were injured after a private bus collided with a lorry near Aurangabad in Bihar, prompting immediate, war-based relief measures from the Andhra Pradesh government. Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu has ordered a special flight to evacuate the deceased from Gaya to Renigunta, while officials arrange



specialized medical care and transportation for the injured. State Endowments Minister Anam Rama Narayana assured full support, noting that relief operations are being monitored by a special control room and on-site officials including Rajender Kumar and Vivek. The government stands with the families of the victims during this tragedy, providing comprehensive assistance to all those affected.

thaya, and Padma vati, wife of Soma Penchala Prasad. Nellore Member of Parliament Vemireddy Prabhakar Reddy expressed deep shock over the incident and is coordinating with Aurangabad district authorities to ensure the 15 injured receive immediate, improved medical services. The MP promised full assistance to the affected families.

Chittoor to be Developed in Stages: Collector

Collector Sumit Kumar and MLA Gurajala Jagan Mohan announced that Chittoor city will undergo a phased development, with a primary focus on upgrading road infrastructure to transform it into a smart city. Key projects inaugurated include the upgraded Gandhi Road for Rs. 245 lakhs and a new divider/lighting system at Kongareddy Palli for Rs. 61 lakhs. Major road developments are progressing rapidly, with the Kattamanchi-Sambayyakan di bypass set to open within a month and significant funds



sanctioned for four-lane expansions, including a Rs. 37 crore project for the Kattamanchi to MSSR Circle route. Officials emphasized that despite past delays, the administration is committed to overcoming obstacles to complete the city's main road network within nine months. Action Demanded Against Private School Fee Racket

Telugu Nadu Students Federation (TNSF) District President Bojja Tirumalesh submitted a formal complaint to District Education Officer (DEO) Shamshuddin in Kadapa city on Monday, demanding immediate action against private and corporate educational institutions exploiting parents with exorbitant fees. Bojja Tirumalesh stated that

several schools are openly flouting government norms and the Right to Education Act by illegally charging an additional Rs. 10,000 to Rs. 15,000 as admission fees. He alleged that institutions are forcing parents to buy textbooks, notebooks, and uniforms directly from them at inflated prices under the guise of specialized IIT, JEE, and NEET coaching. He urged the department to identify unapproved schools and make their details public to protect citizens from financial distress. The student body stressed that commercializing education must stop to ensure justice for families. A large delegation backed the protest to curb these illegal operations. TNSF District General Secretary Chetan Kumar Reddy, TNSF Vice President Siddhartha Royal, and TNSF Official Spokesperson Sandeep participated in the program to press for swift regulatory intervention.

Alliance Government Postpones Public Meeting

The alliance government's proposed public meeting in Tirupati, scheduled for the 9th of this month, has been postponed following a major accident at the Visakhapatnam Steel Plant. Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu took the decision in view of the incident, prioritising the situation arising from the acci-



dent. According to alliance sources, the move was made after consultations with key leaders, including Pawan Kalyan and Madhav. The meeting was originally planned as a large-scale public gathering to mark the completion of two years of the alliance government in office. It was also intended to highlight the administration's achievements under a "welfare" theme.

However, in light of the unfortunate developments at the steel plant, the government decided to defer the event. Further details regarding the rescheduling of the meeting are expected to be announced at a later date. Officials indicated that the decision reflects the government's focus on addressing pressing concerns and standing in solidarity during the aftermath of the industrial accident.
